

Overdrive on ganja seizure DeMo Hits Revenue Collection

Bhubaneswar(KCN): With the Department of Excise on overdrive to seize Ganja, there is both quantitative and qualitative improvement in seizure of these narcotic and psychotropic substances in the State.

Bishnupada Sethi, Secretary Excise is continuously harping on curbing the Hemp cultivation and seizing illegal Ganja, being sold in the grey market.

Mr.Sethi is touch with State Police and Directorate of Excise for destruction of hemp Plants in the districts and seizing the illegal Ganja.

Funds support is being extended to State Police in this regard with the active support from the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB).

So the quantity of Ganja seized during the illegal transfer has increased in the State during the year.

While regularly

Hemp Plants are being destroyed by the Police and Excise officials in several districts, large amount of Ganja is also being



seized.

Around 7,156 kg ganja were seized from Odisha during 2011-12, the quantity has been crossed 8,726 kg by 2015-16 December. Similarly, 6606 kg of Ganja

were seized during 2014-15.

According to an official statistics, the Police and Excise are destroying the Hemp

plants in nine districts every year. Angul district records the highest in Hemp cultivation, where 7 lakh Hemp plants were destroyed during 2011-12. The quantity of hemp de-

stroyed was 15.66 lakh in 2014-15. Maoists are allegedly funding the Hemp cultivation and people are lured to cultivate the Psychotropic substances instead of rice and vegetables.

Similarly, the illegal plants are being destroyed in Deogarh, Sambalpur, Boudh, Gajapati, Rayagada, Malkangiri, Kan-dhamal and Nayagarh district.

Total 3.30 lakh Hemp plants were destroyed in Deogarh during 2011-12. It rose to 6 lakh in the district in 2014-15.

While 2.56 lakh Hemp plants were destroyed in Sambalpur district in 2011-12, the quantity increased to 19.75 lakh by December 2015-16. In Malkangiri, 4 lakh plants have been destroyed in 2015-16. The number was 12,47,800 in Kandhamal.

During the month of December collection of Own Tax Revenue collection faced a decline of 11 Percent and it will be more in January as the collection has gone down.

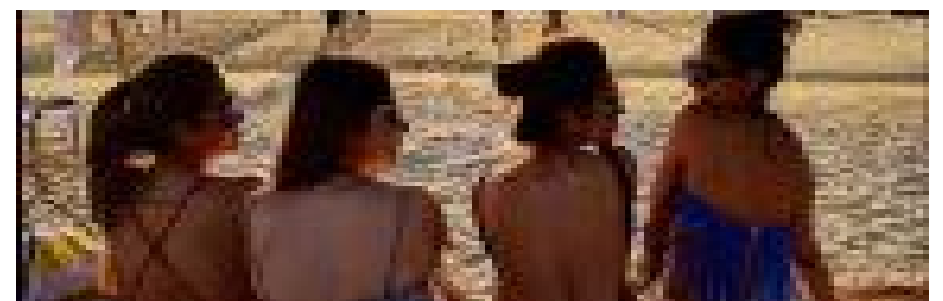

China to ban ivory trade by end of 2017

BEIJING (KCN): China will ban trade and processing of all domestic ivory by the end of 2017 in a bid to save the fast dwindling tusk population in the country, a "historic move" hailed as a "game changer" for African elephants.

The decision came after China had imposed a three-year ban on ivory imports in March this year, in an escalated fight against illegal trading of wild animals and plants.

"China will gradually stop the processing and sales of ivories for commercial purposes by the end of 2017," the official Xinhua news agency said, citing a government statement.

The move will impact China's 34 processing enterprises and 143 designated trading venues, with dozens to be closed by the end of March 2017, state-run Xinhua news agency quoted an official statement as saying.

Before that deadline, law enforcement agencies will continue to clamp down on illegalities associated with the elephant's tusk, an official told the agency.

China's move, if implemented, strictly could be a "game changer", specially the African elephant conservation as hundreds killed every year by poachers to feed into the burgeoning markets in China and Hong Kong.

As a result the numbers of Africa's savannah elephants dropped to 3.5 lakh thousand in 2014.

China's move to ban ivory trade fol-

lowed a resolution at the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (Cites) in South Africa in October.

China has the biggest ivory market in the world - some estimates suggest 70 per cent of the world's trade ends up there. Ivory's price can reach USD 1,100 per kg in China.

Conservation group WWF welcomed the latest news, calling it a "historic announcement", signalling an end to the world's primary legal ivory market and a major boost to international efforts to "tackle the elephant poaching crisis in Africa", BBC reported.

Elly Pepper, deputy director of wildlife trade for the Natural Resources Defence Council, praised China for its "great leadership" on the issue.

"Setting such an aggressive timeline to close - once and for all - the largest domestic ivory market in the world is globally significant, Pepper said.

"It's a game changer and could be the pivotal turning point that brings elephants back from the brink of extinction," she said.

While the international market in ivory has been closed since 1989, legal domestic markets have continued in many countries around the world.

A surge in the killing of elephants over the past seven years has seen populations across Africa shrink by a third, according to the recently published Great Elephant Census.

Mumbai (KCN): Breaking a seven-day losing pattern, the Sensex today reclaimed the key 26,000-mark by recovering 61 points, helped by gains in pharma, auto and capital goods, but both indices registered a weekly drop. For the week, the Sensex lost 448.86 points, or 1.69 per cent, while the broader NSE Nifty dropped 153.70 points, or 1.88 per cent.

This is their biggest weekly in five, which is since the week ended November 18. Domestic investors backed up and covering-up of short positions gave equities a push too. But a weak trend in Asia and a muted opening in Europe cast its shadow.

The rupee appreciated 21 paise intraday against the dollar, to 67.78, which had a positive influence too, brokers said. After a subdued opening, the

Sensex dropped as foreign funds liquidated bets ahead of Christmas. But emergence of value-buying later meant it wiped off early losses before settling higher by 61.10 points, or 0.24 per cent, at 26,040.70.

The 50-share NSE Nifty ended up 6.65 points, or 0.08 per cent, at 7,985.75 points. Intra-day, it shuttled between 7,942.05 and 8,022.60.

"There is no doubt that Rahul and Vijay will be opening the batting for us. These two are batsmen who have not batted at any other positions. They will continue to be our specialist openers for the Mumbai Test," Kohli said.

Rahul returns to the team after missing out on the third Test, which India won in Mohali, due to an injury he exaggerated in the Vizag Test. He had earlier suffered a hamstring injury during the New Zealand series which forced him to miss the last two Tests of the that series and the first Test of the England series.
