US official: Russia appoints new Ukraine war commander

show cause notices to Thomas, Jakhar

WASHINGTON(KCN): After its striking post-invasion setbacks, Russia has appointed a new Ukraine war commander, a US official said Sunday. Russia has turned to Gen. Alexander Dvornikov, 60, one of Russia's most experienced military officers and, according to US officials, a general with a record of brutality against civilians in Syria and other war theatres.

The senior official who identified the new commander was not authorised to be identified and spoke on condition of anonymity.



But the White House national security adviser, Jake Sullivan, said "no appointment of any general can erase the fact that Russia has already faced a strategic failure in Ukraine". "This general will just be another author of crimes and brutality against Ukrainian civilians," Sullivan told CNN's State of the Union.

"And the United States, as I said before, is

determined to do all that we can to support

Ukrainians as they resist him and they resist the forces that he commands."

The decision to establish new battlefield leadership comes as Russia gears up for what is expected to be a large and more focused push to expand Russian control in the Donbas and follows a failed opening bid to conquer Kyiv, the capital.

Dvornikov gained prominence while leading the Russian group of forces in Syria, where Moscow has waged a military campaign since 2015 to shore up President Bashar Assad's regime during a devastating civil war.

Dvornikov is a career military officer and has steadily risen through the ranks after starting as a platoon commander in 1982. He fought during the second war in Chechnya and took several top positions before being placed in charge of the Russian troops in Syria in 2015. In 2016, Putin awarded Dvornikov the Hero of Russia medal, one of the country's highest awards.

Dvornikov has served as the commander of the Southern Military District since 2016. Sullivan described the general as having a record of brutality against civilians in Syria and said "we can expect more of the same in this theatre." But he stressed that the US strategy remains the same in providing Ukraine the military and logistical support it needs.

NEW DELHI: The country's fuel demand soared 4.2 per cent to a three-year high in March as petrol and diesel consumption rose above pre-pandemic

Total petroleum product consumption in March stood at 19.41 million tonnes, the highest since March 2019, data from the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell of the oil ministry showed. As the economy continued to rebound from the deep impact of the third wave of the COVID-19 pandemic, demand for transport fuel rose

in March. Diesel, the most used fuel in the country accounting for almost 40 per cent of all petroleum product conup 6.1 per cent at 2.91 million tonnes. Demand for both fuels in March was above pre-pandemic levels.

Diesel consumption was higher due to strong demand from agriculture sector as well as stocking up by consumers and petrol pumps in anticipation of a price hike.

Cooking gas (LPG) demand grew by 9.8 per cent to 2.48 million tonnes in March.

Fuel demand in thefiscal year ending March 31, 2022 was up 4.3 per cent at 202.71 million tonnes, the highest since FY20.

This was mainly because full aviation services resumed only towards the end of the last month.

Petroleum coke consumption fell 9.7 per cent to 14.1 million tonnes while kerosene demand was down 17 per cent at 1.5 million tonnes in FY22 Consumption of naphtha, which is used as a fuel in industries, as well as that of bitumen, used in road construction, were marginally higher at 14.2 million tonnes and 7.7 million tonnes, respectively.

Currently, the markets open at 10 am. The trading hours for various markets regulated by RBI were changed on April 7, 2020 in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic that had resulted in operational dislocations and elevated levels of health risks.

Later, with the easing of operational constraints, the trading hours were partially restored with effect from November 9, 2020.

From April 18, the trading hours of these markets will be from 9 am to 3.30 pm, the central bank said in a release on Monday.

For March this year, the average daily departures were at around 2,588, higher than the average daily departures of around 2,308 in March 2021, and notably higher compared to around 2,023 in February 2022, he said. The average number of passengers per flight during March this year was at 132, against an average of 135 passengers per flight in February, Banerjee said.
