Russia-Ukraine talks resume via video link; Australia to send armoured vehicles to war-torn country

LVIV(KCN): Talks between Russia and Ukraine have resumed via video link.

Russian delegation head Vladimir Medinsky published a picture of the talks under way Fri-

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's of-



fice confirmed to The Associated Press that the negotiations had resumed.

Friday's talks came three days after the last meeting, in Turkey, between Russian and Ukrainian delegations.

Medinsky, the Russian lead negotiator, said "our positions on Crimea and the Donbas are unchanged."

Russia annexed the Crimean Peninsula in southern Ukraine in 2014.

Morrison told reporters the vehicles will be flown over on Boeing C-17 Globemaster transport planes.

He didn't specify how many would be sent or when.

"We're not just sending our prayers, we are sending our guns, we're sending our munitions, we're sending our humanitarian aid, we're sending all of this, our body armor, all of these things and Russia-Ukraine talks resume via video

End Ukraine violence, India ready to contribute to peace efforts, Modi to Lavrov

NEW DELHI(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday reiterated his call for early cessation of violence in Ukraine during a meeting with Russian foreign minister Sergey Lavrov, and conveyed India's readiness to contribute in any way to peace efforts.

The Indian side has repeatedly called for respecting the UN Charter and the sovereignty and territorial integrity of all states. In his phone conversations with Russian and Ukrainian presidents in recent weeks, PM Modi has called for an end to the hostilities and a return to the path of dialogue and diplomacy.

Modi repeated his call for an end to violence when Sergey Lavrov met and briefed him on the situation in Ukraine, including the ongoing peace negotiations, according to an official statement. "Prime Minister reiterated his call for an early cessation of violence, and conveyed India's readiness to contribute in any way to the peace efforts," it said.

Ukraine crisis:?India secured its interests Lavrov met PM Modi after his talks with his Indian counterpart S Jaishankar. The interaction with the prime minister was significant as Modi

has not met any of the Western leaders or senior officials who have travelled to New Delhi in the past two weeks for consultations on the Ukraine crisis.

Addressing a news conference, Lavrov said no pressure can affect Russia's partner-

ship with India, whose foreign policy reflects the country's independence and focus on legitimate national interests. He said his talks with Jaishankar too reflected the specially privileged

strategic partnership forged with India over many decades and bilateral cooperation in many areas, ranging from defence to investments. "I believe that India's foreign policy is

characterised by independence and the concentration on the real na-

tional legitimate interests," he said, adding that Russia has a similar policy and "this makes us...good friends and old partners". The two countries always respect each other's interests and try to accommo-

date such interests, he said. "I have no doubt that any pressure will affect our partnership, but you know that others have been trying to suppress the relationship between

India, Russia and China...and they are forcing others to follow their politics," he added.

Earlier, in his opening remarks at his meeting with Jaishankar, Lavrov said: "Our Western colleagues like to reduce any meaningful international issue to the crisis in Ukraine. You know our position, we do not hide anything and we appreciate India is taking this situation in the entirety of facts and not just in a one-sided way." India has so far abstained on all Ukraine-related votes at UN bodies and has not joined the West in condemning the Russian invasion. Most of the Western leaders who visited India in recent days have strongly criticised Russia's actions and emphasised the need for democracies to stand together against challenges to the rulesbased international order.

mum on motive behind Manas' murder

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Even as Crime Branch continued to interrogate the four accused in cameraman Manas Swain's murder on Wednesday, it is tight-lipped about the motive behind his killing and the contents of the memory chip that he was in possession of. Crime Branch officers interrogated accused prime Sarmistha Rout and

her three associates Jhuna Bhoi, retired Odisha Information Service (OIS) officers Niranjan Sethi and Ranjan Nayak on the day. They were questioned together.

Sarmistha, the editor of Bhubaneswarbased web-channel Sampurna and her associate Jhuna revealed before the investigators that to evade arrest they

frequently changed their locations. They might also be taken to Dayal Ashram, a shelter home for elderly people in the Capital city run by Sarmistha, before their four-day remand period ends. Meanwhile, Manas' postmortem report revealed that he was thrashed with blunt objects and his ribs were fractured due to the brutal assault.

"The doctors at SCB Medical College and Hospital's Forensic Medicine and Toxicology Department have opined that Manas died due to thoracic injuries (chest trauma) and the complications thereon," said a senior Crime Branch officer. His autopsy report has also revealed he sustained other external and internal injuries.





Government spending on innovation has contributed to some of the world's most used applications across a range of fields, including technology and healthcare. For instance, most



of the promising new drugs we see today are a result of research done by the National Institutes of Health. The internet actually originates from ARPANET, a programme funded by the Defence Advanced Research

Projects Agency (DARPA). The current global positioning system (GPS), originally Navstar GPS, began as a 1970s US military project. The iPhone's touchscreen technology was created by a professor and his doctoral candidate at the publicly funded University of Delaware. Even Siri, Apple's digital personal assistant, is a spin-off of DARPA's project PAL (Personalised Assistant that Learns).1 The Satellite Instructional Television Experiment by ISRO and NASA made available 2,400 black-and-white community TV sets across several villages in six Indian states for the first time in 1975 (when most urban homes didn't have a television).

Since the 1970s, a multitude of factors—including the rise of capitalism, targeting of public debt in the wake of the global financial crisis, and calls to spur private investment by cutting down government spending—have increasingly reduced the government's role in facilitating the private sector. In India, the R&D spending as a percentage of GDP has been decreasing. It is now approximately 0.66 percent of the GDP, almost equal to what it was in the 1990s (it spiked from 0.8 percent in 2004 to its highest— 0.86 percent—in 2008, after which there's been a continuous decline).

The trend has more or less been the same in many countries. For instance, budget sequestration in the US (which entails the withdrawal of funding in certain areas) has led to cuts worth USD 95 billion in the federal R&D spending between 2013 and 2021, and the European fiscal compact is squeezing educational and R&D spending.2 These moves are based on the assumption that market forces, when facilitated, regulated, and administered by governments, will themselves efficiently allocate resources. However, as

we have seen over the years, market forces are blind to societal and environmental concerns. Governments need to reconsider their role when it comes to public interest innovations and move beyond just facilitating.

Therefore, governments cannot afford to remain facilitators when it comes to addressing challenges such as climate change, hunger, and inequality; they must go beyond fixing market failures, and create markets. Because, these deeprooted multidimensional issues require longterm risky investments, innovation, and equitable solutions that neither give good returns in the short term nor yield the kinds of profits that venture capitalists seek. Therefore, governments need to fundamentally reconsider their role when it comes to public interest innovations and move beyond just facilitating.

The government must step up efforts to reap rewards on taxpayers' money through public investments. In this era powered by technological advancements, it means envisioning tech interventions for the public good and creating markets for their sustainability; it means looking beyond evaluating public spending by mere disbursement, and taking an active role to measure the impact.

Though in its infancy, public interest technology broadly means advancing equitable techenabled interventions for the common good. If not done well, these tech-enabled interventions will fall short of addressing equitability. For instance, VI-SPDAT, a data tool designed to help homeless people find housing facilities, ended up unintentionally improving white people's chances of getting housing over people of colour in the United States. This happened because many of the questions this application asks the users do not reflect vulnerabilities that people of colour are likely to say they experience. The United States Electronic Immigration System had similar faults. Software designers failed to collaborate with civil servants while developing the programme, and as a result they could not tailor the technology to make it accessible for all.3

Further, Aarogya Setu, the Government of India's digital COVID-19 surveillance application, though well intentioned, doesn't consider constitutional rights to data privacy and usage. The application, which was rolled out to help the government formulate a policy response and operational measures, was only accessible to the 550 million people who have mobile internet. Also, the fabric of the application—which encourages users to self-validate symptoms of a stigmatised disease and contacts—puts a question mark on the credibility of its data.

This puts into perspective a key element—those developing public interest technology solutions should interact and engage meaningfully with those who are intimately familiar with the situation to produce interventions that address common good. This could be local nonprofits and/ or the people that the tech seeks to benefit. This is not impossible to do, and there are many examples where doing this has had successful results.

Public interest technologies have citizens as participants and co-creators of the intervention.

For instance, Bangalore-based nonprofit Janaagraha created the online networking platform ichangemycity, wherein people from a neighbourhood can discuss and vote on civic issues such as garbage and water supply, and find a resolution through a complaint redressal mechanism. Reap Benefit, another nonprofit in Bangalore, employs gamification tools such as badges while empowering the youth to solve civic problems by developing their skills. The application enables youngsters to identify problems in their communities, and supports them with the skills needed to solve the problem through training.

These examples of public interest technologies have citizens as participants and co-creators of the intervention. The process is particularly slow, long, and iterative at a larger scale if it aims to promote detailed deliberation, sincere societal engagement, and inclusion. For example, the seeds for the hugely successful unified payments interface (UPI) that powers instant real-time peer-to-peer and person-to-merchant money transfers were planted way back in 2009 when the RBI formed the National Payment Corporation of India to integrate all the payment mechanisms available in the country another great example of public investment in technology for good. The UPI pilot was launched only in 2016. This process doesn't suit the aspirations of venture capitalists and entrepreneurs, which is why the government must take a more active role in this area.

How can the government create a market for public interest technology?

Creating a market for public interest technologies requires looking beyond adding tech solutions to tackle government and nonprofit problems. The government needs to establish systems that seamlessly integrate technology-based solutions, design new academia for technologists that enable them to understand the ethical, social, economic, and political ramifications of new technology, create jobs for public interest technologists, train civil servants and nonprofits to become a part of the movement, and establish networks of various stakeholders.

Understanding the current problems communities are facing, applying appropriate technologies, and iterating the solutions continuously by understanding the pulse of the public is a timeconsuming process, which necessitates setting up an entire ecosystem that nurtures this process and rewards the stakeholders. By taking an active part as investors eager to maximise their returns, we believe that governments have tremendous potential to develop sustainable markets for public interest technologies.

Wine, Foreign Liquor Cheaper

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Foreign Made Foreign Liquor (FMFL) and Wine became cheaper in the State as the government has reduced excise duty on these products in its new Excise Policy for the year 2022-23.

According to official sources, the Excise Policy 2022-23 formulated to improve the efficiency of process associated with manufacture, import, export, transport and sale of alcoholic beverages while attaching due priority to health and well being of the citizens of the State.

In order to reduce disparity in MRP with neighbouring states and also to promote high quality FMFL and low strength wine, the duty on wine and FMFL has been reduced. However, Excise Duty for Indian Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) & Beer has been kept unchanged.

There has been nominal increase in license fee, MGQ, application fee for manufacturers, suppliers as well as retailers in this year's Policy.

In view of encouraging response of premium "OFF" shops opened in BMC &

22, some more Premium "OFF" shops have been proposed in Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, Berhampur, Sambalpur, Rourkela Municipal Corpora-

The Excise Department said it will strengthen the enforcement activities through improved intelligence collection, better infrastructure and resources, enhanced deployment of enforcement staff as well as use of technology for monitor-

ing and supervision. In order to restrict entry of inexperienced suppliers or brands with unverified credentials in the Odisha market, certain qualifying criteria for Brand Registration has been introduced in this year's Policy.

As per the Policy document, no license shall be granted to a liquor shop having the name of deities / eminent personalities (living or dead) which can hurt the sentiments of the people.

It is also observed that some liquor shops are using the word 'sarkari' in the name of the shop. So, the Department has clarified that No OFF shop should use 'sarkari or Government' in their name. The license holder may use 'Licensed FL OFF shop' signage.

Home delivery of liquor shall continue in addition to counter sale. All guidelines issued earlier relating to social distancing to contain the spread of COVID-19 virus shall be observed. All other features of existing Excise Policy will continue as it was, it said.

DMK moves Bill in Rajya Sabha to fix twomonth time limit for Governors to decide on Bills

CHENNAI: A day after Chief Minister MK Stalin strongly took up the delay being caused by Governor RN Ravi in forwarding the Bill seeking exemption from NEET for medical admissions in Tamil Nadu to the President, DMK MP P Wilson on Friday introduced a private member's Bill in the Rajya Sabha to amend Article 200 of the Constitution setting a two-month

time limit for Governors to decide on Bills. "Some of the Governors are impeding the functioning of democratically elected Governments by acting as stumbling blocks in processing the Bills passed by the Legisla-

tive Assemblies. They sit over the Bills indefinitely and some Governors are even usurping the powers of the President, passing unwarranted comments while returning the Bill to the Legislatures. The returning of the NEET Bill in our state is one such act of a Governor," Wilson told The New Indian Express.

The Bill introduced by the DMK MP said the absence of a time limit in Article 200 gives the Governor unbridled power to delay the fate of the Bill. Thus, non-prescription of a time limit is an impediment to the welfare of the people. Governors taking a long time to decide on the Bills defeat the will of the people since the State Legislature represents the mandate of the people. Pointing out that as the Constitutional Head of the State, the Governor owes a responsibility to the people of the state, the Bill said, "It is trite in law that any constitutional authority must perform its duties within a reasonable time frame. However, in the recent past, we have seen several instances of Governors sitting over Bills passed by the State Legislatures for an inordinate amount of time, without deciding one way or the other," the Bill explained.

"All Bills passed by the State Legislature are for the welfare of the people of the state. The

state government's functioning cannot indirectly be curtailed and rendered inutile by the actions of the Governor, a Union appointee. That infringes the balance of power between the Union and states established by

the Constitution," the Bill added.

Meanwhile, DMK mouthpiece Murasoli, in its editorial, took exception to a further delay being caused by Governor RN Ravi in forwarding the NEET Bill to the President. "The State Assembly has passed this Bill for the second time and it is pending before the Governor nearly for around two months. When Chief Minister MK Stalin called on him on March 15 and urged him to forward the Bill to the President, the Governor had assured him that it would be done. However, till now, it has not been forwarded to the President," the editorial said.



lieves inflation would come down, and that 3.1% GDP deflator is feasible in 2022-23. The FM was responding to questions on credibility of budget estimates in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday.

She said that the GDP deflator, which is the difference between nominal and real GDP growth rate, has been 3.15% over the past five years and the estimate for 2022-23 is close to the five-year estimate.

She said that deflator is neither consumer inflation (CPI) nor is it wholesale inflation (WPI) and that it has components of both. She admitted that the wholesale inflation is much higher than the retail inflation, but reiterated that the government believes the wholesale inflation would shrink in 2022-23. The Wholesale Inflation in February was 13.11% while the retail inflation was 6.1% during the month.

She was responding to Congress Rajya Sabha MP and former finance minister P Chidambaram's question on budget estimate of 11.1% nominal GDP growth even as the Economic Survey puts the real GDP growth rate at 8-8.5%. Chidambaram had, therefore, questioned the government's inflation (deflator) estimates in 2022-23.

Asked about a possible role for India in mediating between Russia and Ukraine, Lavrov said he hadn't heard "about such talks", though India – which is not under the influence of "US dictates" and is "an important and serious country" – can support efforts to find a resolution. India is Russia's partner and has a "just and rational approach towards international problems", and no one would be against it if India seeks to play a role that provides a resolution of the problem, Lavrov added.

During their meeting, Jaishankar and Lavrov considered the implications of recent developments on trade and economic ties, according to a statement from the external affairs ministry. Jaishankar said that India, as a developing economy, is concerned by global volatility in different domains.

"It is important for both countries that their economic, technological and people-to-people contacts remain stable and predictable," the statement said.

Like the prime minister, Jaishankar emphasised the importance of cessation of violence and resolving disputes through dialogue, diplomacy and respect for international law, the UN Charter, sovereignty and territorial integrity of states. The ministers also discussed the situation in Afghanistan, Iran and the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPoA).

Zelenskyy has been tailoring his message to individual countries through video appeals like the one shown to legislators in the Australian Parliament.

Lawmakers gave him standing ovation at the start and end of his 16-minute address.

Zelenskyy also called for tougher sanctions and for Russian vessels to be banned from international ports.

"We need more sanctions against Russia, powerful sanctions until they stop blackmailing other countries with their nuclear missiles," Zelenskyy said through an interpreter.

Zelenskyy specifically asked for Bushmaster vehicles.

"You have very good armed personnel vehicles, Bushmasters, that could help Ukraine substantially, and other pieces of equipment," Zelenskyy said.

While the Ukrainian capital Kyiv is 15,000 kilometers (9,300 miles) from the Australian capital Canberra, Zelenskyy said Australia was not safe from the conflict which threatened to escalate into a nuclear war.

He suggested that a Russian victory over Ukraine would embolden China to declare war on Taiwan.

"The most terrible thing is that if we don't stop Russia now, if we don't hold Russia accountable, then some other countries of the world who are looking forward to similar wars against their neighbors will decide that such things are possible for them as well," Zelenskyy said.

Zelenskyy also said Russia would not have invaded Ukraine if Moscow had been punished for the 2014 downing of a Malaysia Airlines plane in Ukraine.

Two weeks ago, the Australian and Dutch governments launched a legal case against Russia at the International Civil Aviation Organisation to hold Moscow accountable for its alleged role in the missile strike that killed all 298 people on MH17.

Of the victims, 196 were Dutch citizens and 38 were Australian residents.

Prime Minister Scott Morrison had earlier told the president that Australia would provide additional military assistance including tactical decoys, unmanned aerial and unmanned ground systems, rations and medical supplies.

He later said the additional help would cost 25 million Australian dollars (USD 19 million).

"You have our prayers, but you also have our weapons, our humanitarian aid, our sanctions against those who seek to deny your freedom and you even have our coal," Morrison said. Australia has already promised or provided Ukraine with 91 million Australian dollars (USD 68 million) in military assistance, 65 million Australian dollars (USD 49 million) in humanitarian help and 70,000 metric tons (77,200 US

tons) of coal. Earlier Thursday, the government announced Australia was imposing an additional 35 per cent tariff on all imports from Russia and Belarus starting April 25.

Oil and energy imports from Russia will be banned from that date.

Exports to Russia of Australian aluminum ore will also be banned.

Sanctions have been imposed on more than 500 individuals and entities in Russia and Belarus. The sanctions cover 80 per cent of the Russian banking sector and all government entities that handle Russian sovereign debt.
