Bhubaneswar: Govt engineer's life snuffed out in freak road mishap

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): A government engineer was killed in a freak accident when his stationary car was rammed by a speeding truck near Palasuni square here on Monday morning. The deceased Sumanta Das (36) of



Aiginia in Bhubaneswar was posted at Barachana in Jajpur district as sub-divisional officer (electrical). He was going to office when the unfortunate incident took place around 9.10 am.

According to police, a truck stopped on National Highway-16 near Palasuni as some people were crossing the road. A car, another lorry and Das' vehicle, which were all in the same lane, also came to a halt. With the lorry ahead halting, Das stopped his car, but a Hyva truck behind him sped on and hit his vehicle.

His car was crushed between the two heavy vehicles. Das didn't survive the impact.

Odisha Fire Service personnel rushed to the spot and recovered his body from the mangled remains of the car. "Cutters were used to cut the car and recover his body. The entire operation lasted for about half an hour," said assistant fire officer, SK Biswal.

The entire incident was captured by a CCTV camera installed in a nearby establishment. The truck could be seen ramming into Das's car, which then dashed into the stationary truck ahead. The truck was pushed with such force that it hit the car in front. However, the persons inside the car escaped unhurt even as the vehicle suffered damages.

The traffic on the road between Bhubaneswar and Cuttack Highway came to standstill for more than an hour after the accident. Normalcy resumed after police and rescue personnel removed the vehicles from the road.

"The truck driver managed to flee the spot after the accident and efforts are on to nab him. Further investigation is continuing," said Mancheswar police station IIC, Sudhir Kumar Sahoo. Das is survived by his wife and a son.

Demand for Odisha Congress chief change intensifies

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): The demand for a change in the State leadership of the Congress has intensified after yet another MLA Adhiraj



Panigrahi of Khariar said that the All India Congress Committee (AICC) should come up with a permanent solution to the problem plaguing the party.

Stating that the president of the Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) Niranjan Patnaik has announced several times that he is a temporary president, Panigrahi said that corrective measures should be initiated to stem the rot. "For how many months, the party will be run with temporary arrangement," he said and added that he should be changed immediately and a permanent president announced. Panigrahi said that he is not opposed to Patnaik, but an alternative leadership should be installed which can pull out the party from the pathetic situation it is in now. Of the nine Congress MLAs in the State, Taraprasad Bahinipati, Santosh Singh Saluja and Mohammed Moquim have expressed concern over the party's present and future situation seeking certain changes in the leadership even as all of them claimed that they are not opposed to the existing president.

Patnaik told mediapersons that he had tendered his resignation from the OPCC chief post after the party's debacle in the 2019 General Elections. However, the AICC is yet to accept it. He said that efforts are on to strengthen the party at the grassroots level. Since 2000, Congress has changed the OPCC president nine times, but all of them failed to revive the organisation. Patnaik has been OPCC chief twice, first from 2011 to 2013 and he continues in the post since April 2018.

Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy at the UN accuses Russian military of war crimes



BUCHA(KCN): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has told the U.N. Security Council that the Russian military must be brought to justice immediately for war crimes. In a video appearance Tuesday, Zelenskyy accused the Kremlin's troops of the worst atrocities since World War II and said they are no different from other terrorists like the Islamic State extremist group.

The Ukrainian leader made his plea via video Tuesday as grisly evidence continued to emerge of civilian massacres carried out by Russian forces on the outskirts of Kyiv.

The images, particularly from the town of Bucha, have stirred global revulsion and led to demands for tougher sanctions and war crime prosecutions against Russia. Zelenskyy showed the U.N.'s most powerful body brief video footage of bloody corpses that ended with the words "Stop Russian Aggression".

Parkinson's disease is a neurodegenerative disorder

Kolkata(KCN): Parkinson's disease (PD) is a neurodegenerative disorder. It is commonly called a movement disorder because it predominantly causes tremors, slowing and stiffening of limbs affecting movement. The severity of each of these symptoms are different from person to person and usually develop slowly over time.

It has been estimated that around 10 million people in the world are affected with PD. 1% of those over 60 years are found to be affected with PD. Although the exact

incidence and prevalence of PD in India is not known, a study conducted by NIMHANS in 2004 showed the prevalence rate of Parkinsonism to be 33 per 100,000 (crude prevalence) and 76 per 100,000 (age adjusted). Rural population had a higher prevalence compared to the urban population (41 vs 14 per 100,000).

Why do people get Parkinson's disease: We do not know exactly what causes Parkinson's disease (PD), but scientists believe that a combination of genetic and environmental factors are the cause. Regardless of how a person gets Parkinson's — through genetic mutation or environmental factors or a combination of both — every person with PD experiences a loss of dopamine in the brain. Dopamine is a chemical messenger (neurotransmitter) that is primarily responsible for controlling movement, emotional responses and the ability to feel pleasure and pain. In people with Parkinson's, the cells that make dopamine are impaired. As Parkinson's progresses, more dopamine-producing brain cells die. The brain eventually reaches a point where it stops producing dopamine in any significant amount. This causes increasing problems with movement.

What are the environmental risk factors **for PD:** Head injury, area of residence (PD is found to be more in certain geographical distribution), pesticide and herbicide exposure, occupational exposure to metals, exposure to industrial solvents like TCE (Trichloroethylene) **PCBs** and (polychlorinated biphenyls).

What are the potential protective factors: Caffeine, medicines like statins (used to lower cholesterol) and ibuprofen (anti-inflammatory drug), Vitamin D and exercise (increased physical activity early in life is associated with lower risk of PD later in life). How a Diagnosis is made: Parkinson's disease begins between 40 and

70 years of age, with the peak age of onset in the sixth decade. Hypo or bradykinesia (slowness of movement), resting tremor, postural instability and rigidity are the core features of Parkinson's disease. Usually the patients have reduced blinking,



expressionless face, slowness of voluntary movements, "resting" tremor, stooped posture, axial instability, rigidity and walking is reduced to a series short steps in order to avoid falling. The bedside examination by a neurologist remains the first and most important diagnostic tool for Parkinson's disease (PD). A neurologist will make the diagnosis based on a detailed history of symptoms, medical problems, current and past medications. A detailed neurological examination during which a neurologist will ask you to perform tasks to assess the agility of arms and legs, muscle tone, gait and balance.

Most commonly, people with PD respond well to dopaminergic medications. Lack of response to medications may prompt the doctor to seek an alternative diagnosis such as atypical parkinsonism and order further testing such as an MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) of the brain. When unsure of a PD diagnosis, neurologists often refer patients to movement disorders specialists and order SPECT imaging, either a DAT scan or 99mTc-TRODAT-1

10 signs that might suggest that you have the disease like Tremor, Small handwriting, Loss of smell, Trouble sleeping, Trouble moving or walking, Constipation, Soft/low voice, Masked face (expression-less face), Dizziness /fainting and Stooping /hunching over. Do not worry if you have any one of these signs, but if you have more than one sign you should consider meeting a Neurologist.

The first step to living well with Parkinson's disease is to understand the disease and the progression. It is possible to have a good to great quality of life with PD. Working with your doctor and following recommended therapies are essential in successfully managing symptoms. 



War not only kills but also pulverizes dreams and hopes

Evil never stops. It has always gained a seat in human minds. Things are more perilous and irrecoverable for those who

MOSCOW: Russia on Tuesday accused Ukraine of staging new civilian deaths in a number of locations in an effort to pin the blame on Moscow.

The Russian defence ministry made the assertion after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky demanded tough new sanctions on Moscow over killings in the town of Bucha that have prompted international condemna-

The Russian defence ministry said on Tuesday that the Ukrainian military recorded a fake video that purported to show "peaceful civilians allegedly killed by the Russian armed forces".

The video was made on Monday evening in the settlement of Moshchun some 20 kilometres (12 miles) northwest of Kyiv and was designed to be distributed through Western media, Moscow said."Similar events are now being organised by the Ukrainian special services in Sumy, Konotop and other cities," the Russian defence ministry said, referring to cities in north-eastern Ukraine.

The ministry did not say how it obtained the information in its statement.

At the weekend, dozens of bodies were discovered in Bucha near Kyiv after the withdrawal of Russian troops. Ukrainian officials said some had their hands bound behind them. Ukraine has blamed Russian forces, with Zelensky describing the killings as "war crimes" and "genocide".

Moscow denies any responsibility, saying that the images are fake or that the deaths occurred after Russian forces pulled out of the area. The Kremlin repeated the denial on Tuesday,

adding the West wanted to "smear" the Russian army. "We still insist that any accusations against the Russian side, against the Russian military

are not just groundless," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said. "This is a well-directed show. Nothing else. A

Sri Lankan lawmakers seek interim government to solve crisis

COLOMBO: group of Sri Lankan governing party lawmakers called Tuesday for the appointment of an interim government, warning that a failure to do so would lead to violence and anarchy, as demonstrators continued to demand the resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa over the

country's worst economic crisis in decades.

The lawmakers urged the speaker of Parliament to lead discussions with all parties to select an interim prime minister with the support of a majority of legislators.

The largest opposition party, however, said it will not support any interim government and insisted that the president resign immediately.

"We must heed the

voices in the streets. The government should go, starting from the president," said Sajith Premadasa, leader of the United People's Force, or SJB.

The SJB has 54 of Parliament's 225 seats. The governing coalition controlled nearly 150 seats before the current crisis but is believed to have lost the support of some lawmakers. Sri Lanka's Cabinet resigned Sunday night after thousands of people defied a state of emergency and curfew and joined street protests denouncing the government.

The president and his older brother, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa, continue to hold onto power, despite their politically powerful family being the focus of public ire.

For several months, Sri Lankans have endured long lines to buy fuel, cooking gas,

Parliament met Tuesday for the first time since protests flared earlier this month.

"The first condition to solve this problem is that this government has to leave. In its place there should be an interim government," said lawmaker Wimal Weerawansa, a former member of Rajapaksa's Cabinet. "We as members of the government and opposition have a responsibility to solve according to coalition instructions, significantly weakening the government.

Lawmakers also asked the speaker on Tuesday to ensure their safety after irate protesters surrounded the homes of several governing party members on Monday shouting slogans and pelting stones.

Police barricaded the area around Parliament, where a few hundred protesters house asking authorities to stop oppression and safeguard the rights of the people.

President Rajapaksa has assumed emergency powers which give him wide authority to protect public order, suppress mutinies, riots or civil disturbances or for the maintenance of essential supplies. Under the decree, the president can authorize detentions, seizure of property and search of premises. He can also change or suspend any law except the constitution.

Rajapaksa invited all parties to join a unity government to resolve the crisis, but the SJB immediately rejected the proposal. The extent of Sri Lanka's economic crisis became clear when it couldn't pay for imports of basic supplies because of its huge debts and dwindling foreign reserves. The country's usable reserves are said to be less than \$400 million and it has nearly \$7 billion in foreign debt obli-

economy is estimated to have contracted by 1.5% in July-September 2021, according to the central bank. The already dire economic crisis has deepened as oil prices have surged above \$100 a barrel with the war in Ukraine. Vehicles are stranded with empty tanks, power cuts deprive students of study time for exams and shopping mall air conditioners are being switched off to conserve energy. Sri Lanka was already so short of hard currency that authorities ordered bans on imports of cars and fertilizer and appealed to the country's expatriates to send money home to help restore its depleted foreign reserves.

Rajapaksa last month said his government was in talks with the International Monetary Fund and had turned to China and India for loans.

Two brothers of the president, Finance Minister Basil Rajapaksa and Irrigation Minister Chamal Rajapaksa, were among the Cabinet members who resigned on Sunday, along with the prime minister's son, Sports Minister Namal Rajapaksa. Those resignations were seen as the family's effort to pacify public anger while retaining executive, defence and

Kuwait's government resigns as political crisis intensifies

DUBAI: Kuwait's government resigned on Tuesday, just months after its formation, opening up new uncertainty as the tiny country grapples with a worsening political crisis that has blocked critical economic and social reforms. Kuwaiti Prime Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al Hamad Al Sabah submitted the cabinet's resignation to the crown prince, staterun KUNA news agency reported, ahead of a no-confidence vote in Parliament later this week that sought to remove him from office.

It marks Kuwait's third collective government resignation in the past year and a half. A host of new faces, including some picks to appease opposition blocs, had been appointed to ministerial posts as recently as December, with their resignation now reflecting their failure to make reforms.

Opposition has been mounting against Sheikh Sabah. Angry lawmakers hauled him in for extensive interrogations last week over his alleged corruption and mismanagement. They publicly declared him "unsuitable" and called for a new prime minister to tackle the country's problems and secure badly needed reforms.

Cabinet's resignation comes after the defence and interior ministers submitted their resignations earlier this year. Exasperated, the two senior ministers decried their inability to make anything happen in oil-rich Kuwait because of Parliament's rowdy opposition. Lawmakers increasingly in recent months have expressed their political frustrations and mistrust by questioning various unpopular ministers and stalling major projects.

Although soaring oil prices amid Russia's war in Ukraine have recently created a windfall for Kuwait, they've also served as a reminder of the nation's utter dependence on oil revenues and need to diversify. Even if the International Monetary Fund now expects Kuwait to run a budget surplus after years in the red and see its gross domestic product increase by 2.7%, it remains politically stuck.

Years of low oil prices, coupled with the coronavirus pandemic, pushed the country's account deficit to 16.6% of its GDP last year. As financial stress worsened, the government couldn't draw from Kuwait's flush sovereign wealth fund or issue debt because lawmakers have blocked a public debt law.

The parliament, a rarity in the autocratic region of Persian Gulf sheikhdoms, is empowered to pass and block laws, question ministers and submit no-confidence votes against senior officials. However, final authority rests with the ruling emir. The financial stagnation over the past two yearshas spread deep disillusionment with the country's political system.

Politics over Oven Breaking

Puri: The twin issues- vandalisation of temple kitchen ovens and digging of pits close to 12th century shrine in Puri, continues to dominate Odisha politics with opposition BJP and Congress demanding immediate arrest of culprits and stop work in prohibited zone of the living monument.

While the BJP has been demanding immediate stop of construction works being carried



out by the state government under Puri Heritage Corridor project allegedly by violating norms under the Ancient Monument and Archeological Sites and Remains Act, 1959, Congress alleged that the vandalisation of kitchen ovens was made to divert people's attention from alleged illegal constructions.

OPCC spokesperson Nishikant Mishra in a press conference here said that over 40 Chullha, earthen oven where Lord Jagannath's Mahaprasad is prepared, were vandalized to divert attention. "How come any outsider enter into the temple kitchen and damage ovens? It appeared that the vandalisation of chullha was intended to divert public attention from illegal constuction near the shrine," Mr.Mishra said.

Meanwhile, the Bhubaneswar unit of BJP Tuesday staged an agitation near Sri Ram Mandir in the state capital demanding immedidate arrest of the culprits involved in temple kitchen vandalisation and stop of Puri Heritage Corridor project work till a clearance by the Archeological Survey of India.

Chief Secretary S C Mohapatra has meanwhile claimed that the Puri Heritage Corridor project work is being done in "coordination" of the ASI. He said there is no danger to the temple BJP leader and Bhubaneswar MP Aparajita Sarangi, however, claimed that the state government carried out earth work and dug big pits in the prohibited zone (within 100 meters

from temple) despite "no work" notice by ASI.BJP national vice-president Baijayyant Panda supporting Sarangi Tuesday in a twitter post said: "A very important revelation indeed. The excuses being given by Odisha's governing party have been demolished."

"The state must now honour every Odia's sentiment and stop its unauthorised destruction of the prohibited area surrounding the temple Mahaprabhu Jagannath," tweeted. Meanwhile, Puri district police expedited investigation into the chullha vandalisation in the temple kitchen on Saturday night. Puri SP KV said CCTV footage has revealed that a person was inside the temple at 1 o'clock on Saturday night.

"In another footage, he is seen accompanied outside the temple by four Jagannath Temple Police (JTP) personnel (JTP do not come under Odisha police and they are engaged dby the temple administration). All the four JTP personnel were interrogated yesterday to find out the discussions they held with the person, under what circumstances was he inside the temple and under what circumstances did he leave the temple," the SP said. In order to identify the person, the CCTV footage is being shown to the temple servitors and staff.

The SP further said that as per instruction of the Chief Secretary and DGP, sufficient police personnel have been deployed since Mondfay for the assistance of JTP to secure the premises at night. More than 40 'chulhas' or earthen ovens were found vandalised at the holy kitchen on Sunday morning, leading to a delay in the rituals of the trinity — Lord Balabhadra, Devi Subhadra and Lord Jagannath, and a scarcity of holy food the 'Mahaprasad' for devotees. Latest report from Odisha Police said that "The suspect identified in CCTV footage has just now been detained. Further interrogation is underway".

Interest Free Advance For e-Vehicle Bhubaneswar: To execute the Electric Vehicle of electric two wheelers (electric motorcycle,

Policy 2021, Department of Finance has issued guidelines for sanction of interest free advance for purchase of electric vehicle by Government employees.

Vishal Kumar Dev, Principal Secretary, Finance has issued the guidelines on Tuesday for this purpose, said official sources.

The State Government has recently introduced the Electric Vehicle

Policy 2021 to encourage purchase of electric vehicles to control the pollution emerging from fossil fuel used in vehicle plying on the road.

One of its incentives under the policy consists of providing interest free advance to the Government employees.

As per the guidelines, the advance for purchase of electric vehicles for the State Government employees will be available only up to 31 December, 2025.

The application received after the expiry of the policy period will not be considered.

The interest free advance for purchase of electric operated motor cars will be available only to Group-A & Group-B category of Government employees. The maximum amount of advance is limited to 75 percent of the cost of the electric vehicle subject to a maximum of Rs 15 lakh. Similarly, interest free advance for purchases

scooter, scooty and invalid carriages etc.), will be available to Group-C and Group D Government employees and above. The advance amount is limited to 75% of the cost of the Electric Vehicle subject to a maximum of Rs 2 lakh. The advance amount is to be recovered in 100 equal installments from the monthly salary of Government employees from subsequent months.

> If the Government employee retires or expires without payment of full amount of loan, the residual amount will be recovered from their arrear salary bill, leave salary bill, pension, commutation pension or gratuity before its disbursements. If he/she resigns from Government service, the amount will be recovered under OPDR Act, as per the guidelines.

If the Government servant so desires he is allowed to repay the installment in advance.

All other conditions as prescribed under Rule-2 of chapter 14 of Odisha

General Financial Rule (Volume-1) and circulars issued there under in force for sanction of Interest bearing advance for purchases of vehicle are applicable in this case mutatis mutandis, it said. Necessary amendment to Odisha General Finance Rule will be affected in due course, the Department of Finance said.

During 2021-22, this scheme has been merged with two other existing schemes of the Department to be known as Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jaati Abhyuday Yojana (PM-AJAY), for which an amount of Rs 1800 core has been allocated for the financial year 2021-22, he said. As per the position uploaded by the Government of Odisha on the portal for PMAGY, as on date, out of a total of 61,554 households found eligible for houses under PMAY-G, in the PMAGY villages of Odisha, 73 households have been allotted houses under PMAY-G.

As per the data, 63 houses have been allotted in Boudh district while four houses have been Bhadrak district. All other 27 districts have reported zero performance on execution of the scheme.

The Union Department has released Rs 81.72 crore to the State Government of Odisha under the scheme in 2021-22. While Rs 28.18 crore allotted in 2018-19, Rs 17.87 crore given in 2019-20. No fund was released by the Centre during 2020-21. Out of the total allocated fund, the State Government has been able to spend only Rs 25.91 crore, he informed.

The principal objective of the 'Adarsh Gram' component of the merged scheme of PM-AJAY is integrated development of SC majority villages: primarily through convergent implementation of the relevant Central and State schemes and to take up identified activities, which do not get covered under the existing Central and State Government Schemes, through 'Gap-filling' funds provided as Central assistance to the extent of Rs 20 lakh per village.

The scheme was started on pilot basis wherein 1000 such villages were selected. In 2014-15, the scheme was further expanded to 1500 more villages. Since 2018-19, 19,080 villages have been selected so far under the scheme. Till 2017-18, all such villages having more than 50 per cent SC population were eligible for selection under the scheme. From 2018-19 onwards, villages having total population 500 or more with more than 50 per cent SC population are eligible for selection under the scheme at present, said Mr.Narayanaswamy. In Odisha, he said, a total of 175 villages were selected in 2014-15 out of which 169 were found eligible. In 2018-19, 946 villages have been selected of which 904 have been found eligible till date.

So far, 2,487 villages have so far been declared as 'Adarsh Gram' on achieving the desired parameters, out of which 83 villages are from Odisha.

According to sources, Buch is also expected to be questioned about the recent National Stock Exchange (NSE) scam. The panel chaired by former minister of state for finance Jayant Sinha has called Buch to deliberate upon regulatory issues related to initial public offerings, international financial services centres and alternate investment fund, according to a notice issued by the Lok Sabha Secretariat.

Memebers in the committee said they would like to know about the investigation being done by the SEBI in the NSE scam in which several of its top officials including former chief executive officpanel to deliberate upon the orderly functioning of the market in the recent volatility and turbulent flow of cash.

This is the second meeting of SEBI officials with the parliamentary panel in the last week, after March 30.

Meanwhile, the income tax department, ED and CBI are investigating the case related to irregularities in co-location facility provided by NSE, Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said on Tuesday.

In a written reply in the Rajya Sabha, the minister said market regulator Sebi, after investigation into the matter involving NSE and other entities, has passed requisite orders.

"CBI, Enforcement Directorate and Intigations are still going on," he said.

To a question on whether further measures are to be adopted to strengthen the stock exchanges in the light of the NSE case, the minister said review of governance norms in Market Infrastructure Institutions (MIIs) is a continuous process and the same is carried out regularly as per the changing dynamics of the securities market.

"Some of key measures undertaken by SEBI are strengthening of governance norms across MIIs and making code of conduct applicable to the Stock Exchanges, Clearing Corporations and Depositories for prevention of fraud or market abuse," he said.



case follows an FIR which was registered in May 2018, amid fresh revelations about irregularities at the country's largest stock exchange.

In February this year, Sebi imposed a monetary penalty on NSE well Ramakrishna and Ravi Narain, and two other officials for lapses in recruitment at the senior level.

Narain was at the helm of affairs at NSE from April 1994 till March 2013, while Ramkrishna was MD and CEO of the stock exchange from April 2013 to December 2016.

Sebi has observed that NSE and its top executives violated norms in appointing Anand Subramanian as Group Operating Officer (GOO) and advisor to the MD.



NEW DELHI: The Competition Commission has slapped penalties totalling around Rs 1.16 crore on 24 entities, including individuals, for indulging in bidrigging and cartelisation in tenders floated by the

Indian Railways. As many as 11 entities and 14 individuals of these entities were found to have violated competition norms. Out of these 25, the regulator did not impose any penalty on one entity. Besides slapping penalties on 24 of them, the watchdog has directed them to cease and desist from anti-competitive practices.

The matter was taken up by the Competition Commission of India (CCI) following a reference filed on behalf of the North-Western Railways.

These entities indulged cartelisation in the supply of High-Performance Polyamide Bushes (HPPA) and Self Lubricating Polyester Resin the Indian Railways by means of directly or indirectly determining prices, allocating tenders, controlling supply and market, coordinating bid prices and manipulating the bidding process, CCI said in a release on Tuesday.

"The evidence in the matter included regular e-mail communications and WhatsApp changes between the parties, quoting of identical/ similar prices by certain par-

ties, filing of bids from same IP addresses by certain parties in close proximity," it noted.

Together, the CCI has imposed penalties to the tune of Rs 1.16 crore on the 24 entities, the release said. Out of the 11 entities, 4 had applied for lesser penalties under the competition law. A cartel member can approach the CCI by way of filing an application seeking a lesser penalty, in return for providing full, true and vital disclosures in respect of the alleged cartel.


