Taiwan, China hold opposing military drills amid tensions

TAIWAN(KCN): Taiwan is staging military tary wing of China's ruling Communist Party. exercises to show its ability to resist Chi-



nese pressure to accept Beijing's political control over the self-governing island, following new rounds of threatening drills from China.

The exercises Wednesday off the southeastern county of Hualien follow days of Chinese missile firings and incursions into Taiwan's sea and airspace by ships and planes from the People's Liberation Army, the mili"We strongly condemn Communist China's

continuous military provocations around Taiwan's sea and air that undermine regional peace," Taiwan Defense Ministry spokesperson Sun Li-fang told reporters at Hualien Air Force Base.

"Communist China's military operations just provide us with

the opportunity for combat-readiness training," Sun said.

Taiwan's Foreign Ministry spokesperson Joanne Ou said China was using recent visits by U.S. Congress members including House Speaker Nancy Pelosi as a pretext for escalating its attempts to intimidate Taiwan into accepting what it calls its terms for "peaceful reunification." CONTINUED ON: P-7

Odisha flood situation remains grim, 2 lakh affected

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Flood situation in the Mahanadi river system remained unchanged despite a fall in the water flow at the Mundali barrage near

Cuttack. The water level at Mundali barrage has reduced to 11.28 lakh cusec and is likely to reduce further within the next 24 hours. The inflow and discharge of flood water from Hirakud reservoir has remained almost constant at 6.42 lakh cusecs and 6.80 lakh

cusecs respectively even as flood water have entered many low lying areas in coastal districts.

Around 2 lakh people in 1,366 villages and nine ULBs in 10 districts along Mahanadi basin have so far been affected by the flood triggered by back-to-back low pressure. As many as 337 villages with more than 20,000 people remained marooned in Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur and Puri districts of the state. Floodwater inundated Nimapada-Bhubaneswar road at Garapada and Nimapada-Balanga road near Dhamra on Wednesday. Road communication was disrupted with water overflowing on Khurda-Balangir NH-57 near Baghamari. The floodwater of the Mahanadi have also entered low lying areas in Banki NAC.

Fresh low pressure may worsen flood situation in Odisha

Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) Pradip Kumar Jena told mediapersons after a review meeting that floodwaters breached two more river embankments, Kushabhadra near Tendiakuda in Puri and Mahanadi near Teramanapur in Jagatsinghpur on Wednesday. The SRC said this is the first time after 2011 Bhadrak, and Jajpur to remain alert. NATO says 'urgent' need to inspect Ukraine nuclear plant

that so much water flow is seen at Mundali. He, however, said that within the next 24 hours, water flow at Mundali will reduce to



9 lakh cusecs. "The next 24 hours are crucial when the peak flood will pass through and reach the sea. Following which, the water level will further recede," he added.

Water flow at Mundali is reducing by 17,000 cusecs every hour now and within the next few hours the flow per hour will further reduce to 25,000 cusecs. The SRC said water level of Devi river is also receding. The water level of Devi river was 12.04 feet as against danger level of 11.76 feet.

Several localities of Narsinghpur, Banki, Badamba, Damapada, Tigiria and Athagarh blocks marooned after different connecting roads cut off by flood water in Cuttack district. "District administrations and engineers of the Water Resources department are working round-the-clock to tackle the situation and rescue operations are also underway by ODRAF, NDRF, and Fire Service personnel," Jena said.

Odisha floods: Water receding, farmlands still inundated

Around 150 residents of villages under Ambabhona block in Bargarh district located on the fringes of Hirakud dam reservoir were evacuated to safer places on Sunday after backwater flooded the area following the release of water from the dam. While the situation of Chikhli village remains grim, the situation of nearby villages is returning to normal.

Sources said, as soon as 34 gates of Hirakud dam reservoir were opened on Saturday night, water started entering Chikhli village in the early hours of Sunday and continued to increase continuously. Reportedly, at 3 pm on Monday, the inflow of water to the reservoir reached 9,85,060 cusec against the outflow of 4,45,924 cusec through the gates affecting Chikhli, Ghugrapali, Benipali, Antradi, Baugapali and Dunguri.

Currently, Chikhli remains inundated in around 4 ft water and electricity has also been disrupted in the village. Tehsildar of Ambabhona, Sitaram Patel said, four relief centres are currently operational. "However, the situation of Chikhli continues to be grim," he added.

After massive disruptions owing to intermittent heavy rainfall in Sundargarh district for three days, life is slowly returning to normalcy with no rainfall reported since Monday evening. Sources in Sundargarh District Emergency Office (DEO) said as per preliminary reports, about 300 houses suffered partial to heavy damages under Rajgangpur, Tangarpali, Hemgir, Balishankara, Bisra and Sadar tehsil limits, while report of property loss from 12 other tehsil areas is pending. They, however, claimed no human injury or death was reported from across the district, adding compilation of property damages was underway.

one GP under Balasore Sadar block heaved a sigh of relief as the water level in river Jalaka started receding from Monday night. With water flowing at 6.40 meter against danger level of 5.50 meter, there was a flood-like situation in the low-lying areas.



Sources said Hemgir block on Saturday and Sunday received 340.4 mm rainfall damaging many houses. Sundargarh town bore the brunt of heavy rainfall as water entered the District Headquarters Hospital (SDHH) on Sunday. At Panposh and Balughat and other low-lying areas of Rourkela too, rainwater entered houses.

In Balasore, residents of low-lying areas under four gram panchayats in Basta block and

As many as four kutcha houses collapsed in Gothagadigoan in Rashalpur GP and the families along with their livestock were shifted to safer places. Presently, hectares of land remain inundated due to poor disposal of water while roads have been cleared. Block Agriculture Officer of Basta, Harihar Nayak who visited the sites said that as many as 1830 hectares of paddy lands are submerged owing to the flash flood in river Jalaka.

The flood situation in Tikarpara and Athamallick sub-division improved on Tuesday with water levels receding at both the areas. In Athamallick, only two panchayats have been affected by flood water. Local administrative officials have rescued 157 people from Kudagaon and put them in local primary schools at a higher location.

"Situation has started improving with only two panchayats flooded now. We have geared up our official machinery to tackle the impeding flood in Athmallick," said Sub-Collector Tarani Suna.

Similarly flood situation at Tikarpara has improved as well even as it is flooded along with Majhipada. Ramimunda and Behera Sahi areas. Meanwhile, relief and rescue operations for people of Tikarpara area are on. About 36 hours after rainfall stopped, paddy fields in the banks of Hati, Tel and Sandool rivers continue to be submerged in Jaipatna, Junagarh, Kalampur , Dharamgarh, Golamunda and Narla blocks of Kalahandi district. According to preliminary assessment of the Agriculture department, 4141 hectares of agriculture land including 4018 paddy land in 362 villages of Narla, Jaipatna, Kalampur, Junagarh, Dharamgarh and Golamunda blocks are still under water. After water recedes, details of the damages to crops can be ascertained, said Chief District Agriculture Officer Pradeep Kumar Sahoo said.



Culture-of-Odisha-Architecture

The Sun Temple in Konark is the crowning achievement of the Orissa style. It is the last phase of temple construction in Orissa. It was constructed in the 13th century A.D. by



Narsingha Deva of the Ganga Dynasty. It is known as the Black Pagoda and is dedicated to Surya, the Sun God. It portrays Time – the Sun God moving across the sky, shaped like a Ratha or chariot drawn by seven gorgeously caparisoned horses in motion. The temple's outer walls are adorned with magnificent sculptures of dancers in various stances, musicians, lions, horses, elephants, and other animals depicting all aspects of life.

Architecture of Odisha Jagannath Temple Puri

A ruler of the Ganga Dynasty built the Lingaraja temple in the 11th century AD. It has all of the characteristics of an Orissa temple. It has a vimana and a Garbha Griha and is enclosed in a quadrangular enclosure. The shikhara, a lofty ribbed curvilinear spire

Music and Dance of Odisha

The Odissi dance, which is choreographed to the best music of Odisha, is claimed to be an attempt to approach God and experience ultimate happiness. As a result, the devadasis, who used to dance to the recital of hymns and bols of talas, kept this dance alive. The Odissi

The Rath yatra is the state's most well-known festival, during which a massive chariot or rath is driven across the state, particularly in Puri, where devotees worship Lord Jagannath. Durga Puja is celebrated all around the state, but especially in Cuttack. Kali Puja, also known as Diwali, is observed in many parts of Odisha. Cuttack's Bali Yatra, held on the full moon day of Kartika, recalls the splendor of Odishan traders in the past. At Baripada, the Chaitra Parva, a Chhou dance festival, is held.

The vegetable and spice-laden Dalma, the plain and uncomplicated Dali, and the delectable and flavorful Besara are just a few of the mouthwatering lentil meals. Santula is a vegetable stew made with onion, garlic, and green chilies in a skillet. Khajuri khata, Amba khatta, Ouu khatta, dhania-patra, and pudinapatra chutneys are some of the state's wellknown chutneys used as condiments in Odishan cuisine. Dahi baigana, a curd and brinjal dish, is a delicious side dish with a tangy, flavorful, and sweet-sour flavour. **Cuisine of Odisha** When it comes to sweets, Odisha has a wide variety of desserts, including cheese-based Chhena Poda, Chhena Jhili, Rasamalai, and Chhena Gaja, as well as flour-based Pheni, Jilapi, Malpua, and Kheera Gaja. Pitha, or indigenous cakes, are popular in Odisha. The kitchen of Puri's famous Jagannath Temple is said to be the world's largest, with a thousand chefs working around 752 woodburning clay hearths known as chulas to feed over 10,000 people every day. Offerings are made to the presiding deities in temples around the region. The Jagannath Temple's prasad is well-known, and it is known as Maha Prasad, which means "largest of all prasads." It is known as chhappan bhog since it has 56 recipes.

Journey of Rupee from 4 to 80

India is celebrating its 75th year of In-



dependence and is at the crossroad of understanding a strong monetary development for its people during the following 25 years - what the government terms the

country's "Amrit Kaal".

Keeping different parts of the economy to the side, let us have a look at how the Indian Rupee fared against other worldwide benchmark peers starting around 1947.

The worth of a country's cash is a critical marker for measuring its economic pathway. A great deal has occurred on the macroeconomic front starting around 1947 remembering economic stress in the 1960s drove by a downturn in food industrial creation. Then, at that point, came the Indo-China and Indo-Pakistan which enlarged spending and gave birth to the balance of payments crisis. Confronted with high import charges, India was near default as the unfamiliar trade holds had nearly dried up.

Aa per reports, the then Indira Gandhiled government needed to go for a steep devalue of the rupee. The worth of the rupee devalued from Rs 4.76 against the US dollar to Rs 7.5.

Then in 1991, India again ended up in a serious monetary emergency as the na**Pradeep Kumar Panda**

pay for its imports and service its external debt obligation commitments. Once again, India was nearly on the verge of default, which required the genuinely necessary changes which opened the nation's economy.

To negate the emergency, the Reserve Bank of India allegedly degraded the rupee in two sharp tranches - 9% and 11%, separately. Post the downgrading, the worth of the rupee against the US dollar was around 26.

From Rs 4 during Independence against the then benchmark Pound sterling to around Rs 79 to Rs 80 against the US dollar now, the rupee has devalued by Rs 75 in the beyond 75 years.

Weakness for the rupee in these years has been contributed by many factors with trade deficit now rising to record highs of USD 31 billion from almost no deficit at the start of independence mainly contributed by high oil import bill.

It is expected that rupee could continue to fall against the US dollar going ahead but the pace of depreciation could be getting slow following a massive war chest build by the RBI in the reform of foreign exchange reserves.

Despite the fact that the falling rupee may not help the whole economy, a cheapened cash unquestionably has its benefits as it supports in boosting trades.

Since the economic reforms of

1991, the rupee has been depreciating at the pace of 3.74 percent on CAGR (compound annual growth rate) against the US dollar as a result of inflation and interest rate differential between the US and India.

Somewhere in the range of 2000 and 2007, the rupee settled to a degree drove by significant unfamiliar ventures streaming into the nation yet to later downfall during the economic slump of 2008.

Further looking at the past, we see major depreciation started from 2009 onwards, from 46.5 to now at 79.5, 4.3% CAGR as compared to almost unchanged from 2000 to 2009, from 46.7 to 46.5. The US dollar being the reserve currency of almost all countries is detrimental to other currencies, especially in times of sharp volatility in financial markets as it weakens peer currencies. Since the cost of imports becomes higher, domestic inflation may be triggered, which in turn may reduce purchasing power in the economy.

Rising costs of imports may also increase the current account deficit (CAD). For April-July 2022 period, India's trade deficit stood at USD 100.01 billion. A widening trade deficit is also a contributing factor to the weakening of the rupee.

For the record, the Indian rupee in July

slipped below the psychologically important level of 80 against the US dollar for the first time as high crude oil prices amid tighter global supplies boosted demands for the US dollar. There is, however, a silver lining.

SBI Research said in its latest report said an interesting development is taking place in the global currency market as there has been a significant jump in trade in oil and other commodities in currencies such as the Renminbi, Hong Kong Dollar, and Arab Emirates Dirham at discounted rates.

"Dollar Distancing is finally happening and it is time for India to pitch Rupee as a credible, secular alternative in the changing world order?" SBI Research questioned in its report.

Coming to the share of the US dollar in global foreign exchange reserves, it has been shrinking since the start of the twenty-first century, falling close to 59 per cent as of the end of December 2021, from above 70 per cent two decades back.

The RBI also seems keen to reduce the dominance of the US dollar as it earlier this year announced a mechanism to settle payments for international trade in rupees, especially for India's exports. The mechanism if fructified may go a long way in internationalizing the rupee in the long run.

Call it history revisited or something else! As India celebrated "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav" (75th year of Indian Indepen-



dence) with much fanfare, a new book published on that day and on the occasion, digs out so many unknown parts of India's pre-

Independence and post-Independence history that are still interesting, relevant and thought-provoking.

Very few would have possibly known that the first national flag in pre-Independent India with 'Vande Mataram' written on both sides of a thunderbolt (Bajro of Lord Indra) was weaved by Sister Nivedita. Nivedita herself explained: "It is for this that the Thunderbolt (Bajro) is multiplied, that it may be the symbol, not of a hero, but of a nation of heroes." And Vande Mataram was described as the mantra of 'nation of heroes'.

The book titled "Vande Mataram- Rup Rupantar" written by Dr Devajit Bandyopadhyay and published by Patrabharati, also offers answers (with well documented facts, figures and records) to some vexed questions like:

- Why and how 'Vande Mataram' was replaced with 'Janaganamanaadhinayaka..'?
- * What was Mahatma Gandhi's take on 'Vande Mataram'?
- How Pt Jawharlal Nehru approached Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose to get Tagore's feedback on 'Vande Mataram'?
- How Bose had actually approached

Tagore on the same issue days before Nehru's letter?



- What was Mahatma Gandhi's take on the convention of standing up when the National Anthem is sung and what he himself used to do?
- Which was the first and only time HMV released a music record without the company logo on the disc and why was that?
-And many more.

In what can spark off a fresh controversy, the book quotes Gandhi's biographer (Ibid, page 99): "He (Gandhiji) himself purposely kept seated, because he has learnt that the Indian culture did not require standing as a mark of respect when

or Bhajan was sung. It was an unnecessary importation from the West." This refers to Gandhi's prayer meeting in Kolkata on August 29, 1947, which started with 'Vande Mataram'.

The book delves at length on how style of tune of singing Vande Mataram changed and evolved over the years in theatre, jatra, movies and other performances. Research done by the author reveals that 'Vande Mataram' has been sung in as many as 146 different styles and tunes. This is notwithstanding what Mahatma Gandhi said. "There should be one uni-

versal notation for 'Vande Mataram' if it was to stir millions; it must be sung by millions in one tune and one mode. After all, national songs could only be two or three. But they should all have their common notation. It was upto the Shantiniketan authorities or some such authoritative society to produce an acceptable notation," says Gandhi.

The book also touches upon how different political parties used 'Vande Mataram' -either in its pure form or with a dash of sarcasm to lash out at political oppo-

any national song nents.

"This is one of my dream projects and I had worked on it for long. Each and every fact presented in the book are well documented, recorded and cannot be challenged. 'Vande Mataram' was initially part of Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay's masterpiece-Ananda Mutt (first revolu-



tion of the Sannyasis). It was first sung by music guru Jadu Nath Bhattacharjee. From Jadu Nath Bhattacharjee to A R Rehman and Jeet Ganguly- Vande Mataram has traversed a long way and passed the test of time, still maintaining its acceptance, recognition and vibes, despite the controversies. My endeavour has been to trace this long and most fascinating journey of 'Vande Mataram' between the two covers," says Bandyopadhyay.

The opening up of the TKDL is also envisaged to inculcate thought and knowledge leadership through Bharatiya Gnana Parampara, under the New Education Policy 2020.

Indian traditional knowledge (TK) offers immense potential to serve national and global needs, therewith providing societal benefits as well as economic growth. For example, the traditional systems of medicine and wellness from our country, namely Ayurveda. Siddha, Unani, Sowa Rigpa, and Yoga are serving the needs of people from India and abroad even today. The recent COVID-19 pandemic has also been witnessing extensive use of Indian traditional medicines whose benefits range from immune-boosting to symptoms-relief to antiviral activity. Earlier this year in April, the World Health Organization (WHO) established its first offshore Global Centre for Traditional Medicines (GCTM) in India. These demonstrate the continued relevance of traditional knowledge in address the current and emerging needs of the world.

The approval of the Cabinet to widen the access of the database beyond patent offices lays emphasis on integrating and co-opting traditional knowledge with current practices towards enhancing innovation and trade. The TKDL will act as an important sources of TK information for advancing knowledge and technology frontiers. The current contents of TKDL shall facilitate wider adoption of Indian traditional medicines, while also propelling new manufacturers and innovators to gainfully build enterprises based on our valuable knowledge heritage.

The TKDL can cater to a vast user base that would include businesses/companies {herbal healthcare (AYUSH, pharmaceuticals, phytopharmaceuticals, and nutraceuticals), personal care, and other FMCG}, research institutions: public and private; educational institutions: educators & students; and others: ISM practitioners, knowledge holders, patentees and their legal representatives, and government, among several others. The access to the TKDL database would be through a paid subscription model with a phase-wise opening to national and international users.

In future, more information on Indian traditional knowledge from other domains will be added to the TKDL database from the perspectives of the "3P-Preservation. Protection and Promotion". While catering to its primary mandate of preventing grant of wrong patents on Indian traditional knowledge, the TKDL database will also push creative minds to innovate for better, safer and more effective solutions for a healthier and technology endowed population. India's rich heritage shall lay a strong foundation for newer socio-economic developments.

Do we need to worry about the new China virus?

MELBOURNE: A new virus, Langya henipavirus, is suspected to have caused infections in 35 people in China's Shandong and Henan provinces.

It's related to Hendra and Nipah viruses, which cause disease in humans. However, there's much we don't know about the new virus known as LayV for short including whether it spreads from human to human. Here's what we know so far.

How sick are people getting?

Researchers in China first detected this new virus as part of routine surveillance in people with a fever who had reported recent contact with animals. Once the virus was identified, the researchers looked for the virus in other people.

Symptoms reported appeared to be

mostlymild fever, fatigue, cough, loss of appetite, muscle aches, nausea and headache although we don't know how long the patients were unwell.

A smaller proportion had potentially more serious complications, including pneumonia, and abnormalities in liver and kidney function. However, the severity of these abnormalities, the need for hospitalisation, and whether any cases were fatal were not reported.

Where did this virus come from?

The authors also investigated whether domestic or wild animals may have been the source of the virus. Although they found a small number of goats and dogs that may have been infected with the virus in the past, there was more direct evidence a significant proportion

Does this virus actually cause this disease? The researchers used a modern technique known as metagenomic analysis to find this new virus. Researchers sequence all genetic material then discard the known sequences (for example, human DNA) to look for unknown sequences that might represent a new virus.

This raises the question about how scientists can tell whether a particular virus causes the disease.

We have traditionally used Koch's postulates to determine whether a particular micro-organism causes disease: 1) it must be found in people with the dis-

people with the disease and not in well people

2) it must be able to be isolated from people with the disease

3) the isolate from people with the disease must cause the disease if given to a healthy person (or animal)

4) it must be able to be re-isolated from the healthy person after they become ill.

The authors acknowledge this new virus doesn't yet meet these criteria, and the relevance of these criteria in the modern era has

What can we learn from related viruses?

This new virus appears to be a close cousin of two other viruses that are significant in humans: Nipah virus and Hendra virus. This family of viruses was the inspiration for the fictional MEV-1 virus in the film Contagion. Hendra virus was first reported in Queensland

> in 1994, when it caused the deaths of 14 horses and the trainer Vic Rail.

Many outbreaks in horses have been reported in Queensland and northern New South Wales since, and are generally

thought to be due to spillover infections from flying foxes.

In total, seven human cases of Hendra virus have been reported in Australia (mostly veterinarians working with sick horses), including four deaths.

Nipah virus is more significant globally, with outbreaks frequently reported in Bangladesh. The severity of infection can range from very mild to fatal encephalitis (inflammation of the brain).

The first outbreak in Malaysia and Singapore was reported in people who had close contact with pigs. However, it is thought more recent outbreaks have been due to food contaminated with the urine or saliva of infected bats.

Significantly, Nipah virus appears to be transmitted from person to person, mostly among household contacts.

What do we need to find out next?

Little is known about this new virus, and the currently reported cases are likely to be the tip of the iceberg.

At this stage, there is no indication the virus can spread from human to human.

Further work is required to determine how severe the infection can be, how it spreads,

According to Housing Price-Tracker Report 2022, brought out by realtors' apex body Credai, real estate consultant Colliers India and data analytic firm Liases Hyderabad, Pune and Ahmedabad—the sales momentum that started in the latter part of last year continued in April-June as well, led by pentup dem-and and attractive pricing. Among the top cities, prices in Ahmedabad rose 9 per cent yearon-year to Rs 5,927 per square foot. Bengaluru saw a 4 per cent price appreciation to Rs 7,848 per square foot, while Chennai witnessed only 1 per cent increase to Rs 7,129 per square foot. Housing rates in Hyder-abad stood at Rs 9,218 per square feet, up 8 per cent from the yearago period.

Prices of residential properties in Kolkata too increased 8 per cent to Rs 6,362 per square foot. MMR, the costliest the Delhi-NCR property market saw the highest annual increase of 10 per cent to Rs 7,434 per square foot.

Pune reported a 5 per cent rise in housing prices to Rs 7,681 per square foot during the June quarter. The prices are based on carpet area.

Residential prices in major cities have moved up compared to the previous quarter as well. Ahmedabad saw the highest quarterly rise of 4 per cent, followed by Bengaluru and Pune at 3 per cent each. Chennai residential prices remained stagnant sequentially.

"The housing prices have increased across cities, as materials and labour costs continue to remain high. We may see a marginal dip in

from September, as we enter the festive season," said Harsh Vardhan Patodia, president of Credai National.

According to Pankaj Kapoor, managing director, Liases Foras, going forward prices will largely remain range-bound. Colliers India CEO Ramesh Nair said the festive season is likely to keep the market sentiment high, resulting in higher sales despite the hike in interest rates.

Meanwhile, unsold inventory in the June quarter saw a dip in most of the cities despite rising prices and an increase in new launches in the last few quarters. Bengaluru witnessed the steepest yearly drop in unsold inventory at 21 per cent. The UN Security Council last week held an emergency meeting over the situation and warned of a "grave" crisis unfolding in Zaporizhzhia.

On Thursday, UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres will hold talks in western Ukraine with Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelensky and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan. The discussions were expected to include Zaporizhzhia.

Ukraine counted on four nuclear power stations to supply it with around half of its electricity supply before Russia's invasion. Its call for a demilitarised zone around the Zaporizhzhia facility has been backed by Western allies.

"China launched military provocations on these grounds. This is absurd and a barbaric act, which also undermines regional stability and interferes with shipping and commercial activities in the Indo-Pacific region," Ou said. China sees the island as a breakaway province to be annexed by force if necessary, and considers visits to Taiwan by foreign officials as recognizing its sovereignty.

Alongside its military threats, China imposed visa bans and other sanctions Tuesday on Taiwanese political figures. China exercises no effective legal authority over Taiwan and it's unclear what effect the sanctions would have. China has refused all contact with Taiwan's government since shortly after the 2016 election of President Tsai Ing-wen of the pro-independence Democratic Progressive Party. Tsai was overwhelmingly reelected in 2020. The DPP also controls the legislature, while the vast majority of Taiwanese favor maintaining the status quo of de facto independence along with strong economic and social connections between the sides.

China accuses Washington of encouraging the island's independence through the sale of weapons and engagement between U.S. politicians and the island's government. The U.S. says it does not support independence and has no formal diplomatic ties with the island, but it is legally bound to ensure Taiwan can defend itself against threats from China, including a blockade.

Aside from putting its military on alert, Taiwan has largely played down the threat from the Chinese exercises and life has continued as normal among a population of 23 million that has lived under the shadow of bellicose rhetoric and saber rattling from China for more than seven decades.

Neymar leads Paris Saint-German to big opening win in French league

PARIS: An unplayable Neymar notched a goal and three assists to lead defending champion Paris Saint-Germain to a 5-0 win at Clermont in the French league on Saturday.

Lionel Messi also made a big contribution with two goals and an assist.

Neymar troubled Clermont with his movement and skills. In the seventh minute, he pounced on a low cross from Achraf Hakimi to have a first-time effort deflected out by Alidu Seidu.

Two minutes later, Pablo Sarabia squared the ball back for Messi, who flicked it toward Neymar. The day and lacked match fitness.

PSG left out of its matchday squad some high-profile players it reportedly wants to move out: Mauro Icardi, Julian Draxler, Ander Herrera, Idrissa Gueye, Rafinha, Thilo Kehrer and Layvin Kurzawa.

Meanwhile, Krepin Diatta and Sofiane Diop scored for a weakened Monaco to prevail at Strasbourg 2-1.

PSG capitalized on a fast break in the 26th when Neymar found Achraf Hakimi, who fired into the top corner.

Neymar set up the third goal with a pinpoint free kick for Marquinhos, who headed home in the 39th. On the stroke of halftime, Neymar fed Messi, whose shot was saved by goalkeeper Mory Diaw. PSG slowed down a bit in the second half against a Clermont side which narrowly avoided relegation last season.

Messi still made it 4-0 in the 80th. He played a one-two with Neymar before netting with a low strike.

"Leo reacts very quickly when possession is lost, and Ney has also made efforts in his defensive positioning to help the team stay very compact and win the ball." Chasing a record 11th league title, PSG missed Kylian Mbappe, who is nursing a groin problem, and Renato Sanches, who was signed on Thurs-

winger could have added another goal in the 48th but Strasbourg goalkeeper Matz Sels saved his chip.

Diop, a France Under-21 international, doubled the lead by converting a rebound in the 53rd after Sels palmed away a deflected cross from Gelson Martins.
