Modi launches revamped distribution sector scheme in RR village



HYDERABAD(KCN): Union minister G. Kishan Reddy said that generation of solar energy has helped reduce imports of 1.65 lakh tonnes of coal. The Centre is keen to set up cost-effective solar energy panels on the surface of waters in Ramagundam, he said. As part of the grand finale of 75th Azadi ka Amruth Mahotsav, Ujjwala Bharat-Ujjwala Bhavishya was organised to commemorate the power sector's progress.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi digitally launched the revamped distribution sector scheme (RDSS) and national solar rooftop portal at Kandukur village in Rangareddy district on Saturday.

Speaking on the occasion, Reddy said that generation of power has increased to four lakh MW from 2.48 lakh MW in 2014. Around 1.63 lakh MW power is being generated through renewable energy sources, he said. It is unfortunate that an urban area in Khammam district was taken up for coal excavation, he said.

Dr. Arundhati Debi receives Veer Baji Rout Award 2022



Don't let monsoon play spoilsport: Tips to ensure your clothes stay moisture and germ free

Kolkata (KCN): Who doesn't need little respite from the terrible summer heat? However, monsoon also brings with its own share of laundry woes. Every year, around this time, our cupboards start to emit a foul, musty, damp smell that is usually a consequence of the monsoon humidity.

Avoid stacking clothing: Most individuals place their everyday clothes in a laundry bag or into the washing machine to wash them all together. However, keeping garments in a confined place during the rainy season intensifies the scent over time i.e., storage of the clothing can result in the growth of bacteria and molds under humid conditions, which persists even after washing. Instead, hang the garments individually on a rope and then wash them in the washing machine.

Always clean your washers: Washing machines are believed to be a significant source of bacteria and fungi that cause malodors in laundry. Many ignore the washer, but it is one area that warrants regular cleaning especially when hygiene is top priority. One can always run the washing machine with a cleaner to remove any contaminants after every few washes. Newer models of washing machines have a dedicated washer cleaning cycle. Make sure you take out any removable dispenser from the washer and disinfect them separately.





Just 'normal' to exclude women in decision making process: Adil Hussain

MUMBAI(KCN): Actor Adil Hussain has offered support to the growing group of female artistes who are asking the reason for women's absence from the Bollywood delegation of producers and actors that recently met Prime Minister Narendra Modi to discuss issues faced by the film industry.

Now a days, in present era, we call these two age old instrument as WILL and GIFT. Further to make an informed decision, it's essential to understand what these two legal routes WILL and GIFT are.

Meaning of 'WILL'

The word 'WILL' in simple way defined as

'WISH IN LAST LIFE'

A Will, as defined under the Indian Succession Act, 1925, clause (h) of section 2 is the written expression of the intention of the Testator (maker of the will) as to the mode and manner of division of his all property/ properties (movable and/or immovable) to such person/persons as he/ she may deem fit. A Will takes effect only upon the death of the Testator and not at any point of time prior thereto. Further according to section 31 of the Indian Penal Code "the words a Will" denote any testamentary document. Apart from being a document to take effect only on the death of the Testator or executants, another essential feature of a Will is that it must be revocable in nature and subject to alteration at any time during the life time of the executants/testator. This characteristic feature of Will is known as ambulatory character of the Will. There are different kinds of Will executed by testator considering the different facts and circumstances. Likewise Joint Will, Mutual Will, Privileged Will, Holograph Will, Contingent Will and in present pandemic Covid Will.

Meaning of 'GIFT'

The word 'GIFT' in simple way defined as-'GET IT FIRST' The essential feature of Gift is possession of property whatsoever gifted by Donor to Donee. As regards WILL, Only after the demise of testator possession

formalities whereas in respect of Gift, it's essential that Donor handover the possession and Donee accepted the same without any consideration.

A Gift is defined under the Transfer of Property Act, 1882 as the 'transfer of certain existing movable or immovable property made voluntarily and without consideration, by one person, called the Donor, to another, called the Donee, and accepted by or on behalf of the Donee.' By implication, Thus Gift Deed is a document that evidences such a transfer and takes effect during the lifetime of the Donor and Donee.

Estate planning is essential for every individual so that he or she can minimise the issues that may arise in future date with regards to both, immovable and movable property, Hence, what's the best way to pass on property to loved ones – Will or Gift Deed - and further what's the pros and cons of both the routes, must be ascertained before executing the same.

In case of bequeath of assets (immovable or movable) through a WILL, An Individual, who is competent can bequeath his/ her asset by making a Will, "While a Will not be a prescribed format, the following ought to be set out therein;

- (1) The name of Testator's legatees/legal heirs/family members, if any;
- (2) Appoint and name the person/ persons as an 'Executor' who will carry out the directions and requests of the Testator in the Will for management and disposition of the assets there under;
- (3) Details of all assets, till then, owned/acquired by the Testator;
- (4) Mode and manner of distribution of the Testator's assets.

Further, a Will is required to be executed by the Testator in the presence of two witnesses. It's not necessary to register a Will to render it enforceable, however, it is advisable to get the same registered to minimise potential disputes amongst the heirs in future. Advantages associated with executing a will are manifold and it's a beneficial tool of estate planning in legal manner. A visionary Testator can plan estate planning as he deems fit for his/ her loved ones and future generation too. Following are the advantages of executing a Will.

a) The beneficiary under a Will is not

liable to pay any income tax in respect of the asset bequeathed upon him/her;

b) As a Will is neither required to be stamped nor is it required to be registered, the assets get passed on to the intended beneficiary with minimum cost;

c) It gives flexibility and control to the TESTATOR over his assets during his lifetime as a Will can be revoked and/ or amended any time by the Testator by executing a codicil or a fresh Will;

d) In case of an individual without any family or relatives, all the possessions get transferred to government in absence of will whereas no such situation arises if a Will executed during lifetime by such individual.

- e) A Will protect the family and helps to avoid unnecessary processes that will cause undue delays thus saves time and money.
- f) In modern digital era, Will helps in formalise digital assets by appointing digital executor.
- g) A will help the executor to give away a part of his/her assets to a noble cause or preserve the family legacy/tradition for charities.

Hindu succession Act, section 8 applies, to Hindus, Buddhists, Sikhs and Jains, in case an individual of these religion dies without making any Will. In such circumstances properties will go by intestate succession. In case of non-Hindu, Parsis, Christians, they are governed by Indian Succession Act and Muslims by their Muslim personal laws. Therefore, it is ones religious background, which determine the applicability of the rules.

A Probate is mandatory in case of a WILL has been made in Mumbai, Kolkata or Chennai, or if the immovable properties is situated therein. The grant of Probate under the seal of jurisdictional court is conclusive evidence against all the validity and the execution of the Will and of the testamentary capacity of the testator. However, Stamp duty is required to be paid on the grant of probate which varies from state to state.

In case someone wants to transfer his/her asset through a Gift Deed (movable or immovable asset), he/ she has to consider first whether the Donee is a family member or relative or otherwise, As all the gift, income taxation ,effects both Donor and

Donee subject to provisions of income-tax Act and rules. The transfer of movable asset can be made by executing a Gift Deed and having the same attested by two witnesses and simply delivering/handing over the movable property by the donor to Donee. A Gift must be without consideration and must be accepted by Donee whosoever. In case of gift of immovable properties, it would have to be registered under the provisions of Indian Registration Act, 1908. A Gift thus gives benefits to Donee instantly after the gifts made during the lifetime of donor. Because a gift is transferred inter-vivos (a transfer made during the lifetime of parties) and takes effect (subject to acceptance and/or delivery etc., as the case may be) immediately upon the registration of the gift deed (immovable property) or acceptance thereof in case of movable property. Therefore, persons looking to pre-empt any possible dispute amongst their heirs, find the gift route more convenient.

Furthermore in case of gift, its added advantage that gift once made cannot be revoked and transfer of immovable property by way of gift to close relatives attracts nominal registration and stamp duty. However, where transfer is made of immovable property other than relatives, it attracts usual stamp duty as per market value of the assets being transferred.

Conclusion- an Individual whether for transfer of movable or immovable asset select Will or Gift Deed, depends on many view points and circumstances connected thereto. A Gift cannot be changed as the Donee acquired the gift immediately whereas in case of Will the beneficiary of Will, can be changed, during the lifetime of Testator and it comes to hand of the beneficiary after the demise of Testator. A Will might create disputes among family members who are not mentioned in the Will, in such a case a gift deed is a better instrument of transfer for the asset. However, considering the pandemic and other good reasons it's advisable that A WILL is must and its better route for estate planning, the best way to pass on your assets to your loved ones.

Indian Army to hold exercises with Oman and Vietnam in August

NEW DELHI: In its bid to bolster military ties, Indian Army soldiers are scheduled to hold exercises with the Army personnel of Oman and Vietnam, the two countries which are strategically significant for India.

As per the Indian Army 4th edition of the exercise AL Najah with the Royal Army of Oman will be held at the foreign training node of Mahajan Field Firing ranges (Rajasthan) from 1 to 13 August in which 60 personnel from Sultan of Oman Parachute Regiment will hold exercise with Indian troops from 18 Mechanised Infantry Battalion.

The Indian Army on Sunday said, "The scope of the exercise includes professional interaction, mu-



tual understanding of drills & procedures, the establishment of joint command & control structures and elimination of terrorist threats. The joint exercise would focus on Counter Terrorism Operations, Regional Security Operations and Peace Keeping Operations under United Nations charter apart from organising joint physical training schedules, tactical drills, techniques and proce-

The exercise aims to enhance defence cooperation and will further manifest in enhancing bilateral relations, added the Indian Army.

These exercises with the two countries will add to the existing strong defence ties.

The Sultanate of Oman is a strategic partner of India in the Gulf and an important interlocutor at the Gulf Cooperation Council (AGCC), the Arab League, and the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) fora.

India-Oman Defence cooperation has emerged as a key pillar of the strategic partnership between the two countries.

The other exercise is with Vietnam which "is an important partner in India's Act East policy and Indo-Pacific policy", the Army said.

The 3rd edition of Vietnam-India bilateral army exercise "Vinbax 2022" at Chandimandir will be held from 1 to 20 August.

A 45-member Vietnam People's Army Contingent comprising Medical and Combat Engineers are scheduled to exercise with Indian Army troops of

the 105 Engineer Regiment. As per sources, "The theme this year is deployment and employment of an engineering company and a medical team as part of UN Contingent for

peacekeeping operations". The exercise is a sequel to a previously conducted bilateral exercise in Vietnam in 2019 and will be a major milestone in strengthening bilateral relations,

the sources added. In June, Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Vietnam's Minister of National Defence General Phan Van Giang in Hanoi had signed the Joint Vision Statement on India-Vietnam Defence Partnership towards 2030', which will significantly enhance the scope and scale of existing defence cooperation. A Memorandum of Understanding on Mutual Logistics Support was also inked in the presence of both the Ministers.

The continuous military exercise between the three nations has developed trust and has brought maturity to the relations, the Army said.

Oman provides operational support to the Indian Navy for anti-piracy missions in the Arabian Sea. India had access to the Duqm port in Oman, which strenghtened India's capability and maritime strategy in the Indian Ocean Region.

The people cited above said Gen Pande held extensive talks with Bhutanese counterpart Lt General Batoo Tshering on all key issues including the overall situation in the Doklam tri-

Gen Pande also met with the Indian officials engaged in capacity-building of the Bhutanese military. India has been significantly extending support to Bhutan's armed forces including in areas of training.

The Army Chief's visit to Bhutan came days after new satellite images emerged showing China constructing a village east of the Doklam plateau on the Bhutanese side, a region that is considered important for India's strategic interest.

After the images came out, the Ministry of External Affairs said India keeps a constant watch on all developments having bearing on national security and takes necessary measures to safeguard its

In the last few years, India has been focusing on strengthening its infrastructure along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) including in the Sikkim sector.

In October last year, Bhutan and China signed an agreement on a "three-step roadmap" to expedite negotiations to resolve their festering boundary dispute.

Bhutan shares an over 400-km-long border with China and the two countries have held over 24 rounds of boundary talks in a bid to resolve the dispute.

The Doklam tri-junction is considered important from the point of view of India's security interests.

The India-China stand-off in the Doklam plateau in 2017 even triggered fears of a war between the two nuclear-armed neighbours.

Bhutan said the area where China attempted to build the road belonged to it and India supported the Bhutanese claim. India had strongly opposed the construction of the road at the Doklam trijunction as it would have impacted its overall security interests.

The India-China faceoff was resolved following several rounds of talks.



A relative Sridhar Das alleged, "Aditya had received severe injuries on the forehead after falling from the slide. By the time we reached the school, the authorities had not given proper medical attention to him so we rushed him to the hospital. He was also bleeding profusely, which the school staff tried to suppress and they had also changed his shirt." The school authorities did not give proper information about organizations including Bargarh Journalists Association, District Bar Association and political parties also extended their support to the bandh.

The agitators were also seen picketing at several places in the town demanding strict inquiry into the death and legal action against the authorities of Vikash First Step Primary School. They appealed the district administration to take steps to ensure implementation of safety measures and security of students in every private school in Bargarh. Prior to the bandh, a group of parents had gone to discuss with the school authorities protesting the death of the child on July 25, but the police reportedly registered a case against nine persons. The agitators also demanded the police to withdraw the case.

MRPL's (Mangalore Refinery and Petrochemicals Ltd) petrol pump network is currently concentrated in Karnataka and Kerala.

The subsidiary of state-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) has forayed into fuel retailing in a limited way, focusing on areas that are close to its oil refinery in Mangalore, Karnataka.

MRPL "is continuously focusing on its retail expansion in the states of Karnataka and Kerala and so far has successfully commissioned 32 retail outlets with another 20 retail outlets under various stages of construction", chairman Alka Mittal said in the firm's annual report for the fiscal ended March 31, 2022.

The number of outlets owned by MRPL has since gone up to 36.

Chinese booster rocket makes uncontrolled return to Earth, says US officials

In a statement posted to its official WeChat profile, the China Manned Space Agency later gave coordinates for an impact area in the Sulu Sea, about 35 miles (57 kilometers) off the east coast of the Philippines' Palawan Island.

"Most of its devices were ablated and destroyed during re-entry," the agency said of the booster rocket, which was used last Sunday to launch the second of three modules China needed to complete its new Tiangong space station.

Malaysia's space agency said it detected rocket debris burning up on re-entry before falling in the Sulu Sea northeast of the island of Borneo.

"The debris of the rocket caught fire while entering the Earth's airspace and the movement of the burning debris also crossed Malaysian airspace and could be detected in several areas including crossing the airspace around the state of Sarawak," it said.

NASA criticism

NASA administrator Bill Nelson criticized Beijing on Twitter, saying the failure to share details of the rocket's descent was irresponsible and risky.

"All spacefaring nations should follow established best practices, and do their part to share this type of information in advance," Nelson wrote, "to allow reliable predictions of potential debris impact risk, especially for heavy-lift vehicles, like the Long March 5B, which carry a significant risk of loss of life and property."

He added: "Doing so is critical to the responsible use of space and to ensure the safety of people here on Earth".

The Tiangong space station is one of the crown jewels of Beijing's ambitious space program, which has landed robotic rovers on Mars and the Moon, and made China only the third nation to put humans in orbit.

The new module, propelled by the Long March 5B, successfully docked with Tiangong's core module on Monday and the three astronauts who had been living in the main compartment since June successfully entered the new lab.

When China launched its first Tiangong module in April 2021, there was a similar frenzy around the possibility of damage caused by an unpredictable booster reentry. Objects generate immense amounts of heat

and friction when they enter the atmosphere, which can cause them to burn up and disintegrate. But larger ones such as the Long March-5B may not be destroyed entirely. In 2020, debris from another Chinese rocket fell on villages in the Ivory Coast, causing structural damage but no injuries or deaths. China has poured billions of dollars into space flight and exploration as it seeks to build a program that reflects its stature as a

rising global power.

"The total domestic sales volume of all products during FY2021-22 has been 1.988 million tonnes with a sales value of Rs 11,033 crore against a turnover of 1.691 million tonnes and sales value of Rs 7,207 crore in FY 2020-21," she said.

It's jet fuel marketing joint venture with Shell, called Shell MRPL Aviation Fuel and Services Ltd, has steadily acquired business for the sale of Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) at Indian airports.

The order added, "I am of the prima facie view that slanderous allegations were made against the plaintiff without verifying actual facts. Grave injury has been caused to the reputation of the plaintiff in view of the tweets and retweets carried due to the press conference of the defendants."

Reacting to the judgment, Ramesh said he will present the facts before the court and challenge the alleged "spin" given by Ms Irani on the matter pertaining to charges against her daughter.


Young weightlifter Jeremy Lalrinnunga wins second gold medal for India

BIRMINGHAM: India's Young weightlifter Jeremy Lalrinnunga wins India's second gold medal at Commonwealth Games with record total lift of 300kg, providing the

bronze with an effort of 290kg (130kg+160kg).

The 19-year-old from Aizwal wrote the Games snatch (140kg) and overall lift (300kg) record in his name but not

weightlifting arena with Mirabai Chanu (gold), Sanket Sargar (silver), Bidyarani Devi (silver) and Gururaj Poojary (bronze) earning podium finishes on Saturday.



"It is my first CWG and I feel very happy about the silver and about the Games record as well," Bindyarani said.
