CM Jagan meets PM Modi over funds for Andhra Pradesh

VIJAYAWADA(KCN): Chief Minister Jagan Reddy on Monday met Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the national capital and sought central reimbursement of funds in 15 days for the Polavaram project and sanction of Rs. 10,000 crore on ad hoc basis to speed up the project works.

The chief minister discussed various issues of the state including the Polavaram project, compensating the resource gap funds, the rationality in coverage of beneficiaries under National Food Security Act, the arrears from Telangana discoms to the state and Special Category Status and submitted memorandums to the Centre to these effects. Jagan requested the

Prime Minister to help in completing the construction of

the Polavaram project at the earliest and urged him to approve the revised cost estimates of 55,548.87 crore. The technical advisory committee had already approved

this, he said. Also, the CM urged the PM to reimburse Rs.2900 crore that was spent by the state government towards the Polavaram Project and requested the Centre to clear the bills in a fortnightly format, like in other national

He explained to the PM that 3 lakh tonnes of the rice quota allotted to the state every month remained unutilized, and asked him to allocate only 77,000 tonnes, which will be sufficient for the distribution without causing any additional burden on the Centre. Discussing the promises given during state bifurcation in 2014, the chief

minister stressed that there was no rationality in the bifurcation, because of which the present AP state suffered a lot. He requested the PM to fulfill the promises given as a parliamentary witness, including Special Category Status to AP

Jagan said an arrear of Rs 6,756 crore receivable by the Andhra Pradesh Generation Corpo-Limited ration (APGENCO) from the Telangana Government has remained unpaid for over eight years. He requested the PM to help settle the dues at the earliest so that the state power sector will be finan-

cially strengthened. The chief minister urged the PM to give approvals for setting up another 12 medical colleges in the state. As for the setting up of an Integrated Steel Plant in the YSR district, he requested the PM to allocate iron mines to APMDC for an uninterrupted supply of iron ore to operate the plant.

Jagan also urged the Prime Minister to give approvals to allot beach sand minerals to the Andhra Pradesh Mineral Development Corporation, which could attract investments of `20,000 crore. He said that 14 approvals were in the 'pending' stage.

VL-SRSAM tested Successfully

Balasore(KCN): The Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Navy successfully flight tested vertical launch Short Range Surface-to-Air Missile

(VL-SRSAM) from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast of Odisha on Tuesday.

The flight test was carried out from an Indian Naval Ship against a high-speed unmanned aerial target for demonstration



of vertical launch capability. The missiles, equipped with indigenous Radio Frequency (RF) seeker, intercepted the target with high accuracy.

The VL-SRSAM system has been indigenously designed and developed by DRDO. During the test launch, flight path and vehicle performance parameters were monitored using flight data, captured by various range instruments such as radar, Electro-Optical Tracking System (EOTS) and telemetry systems deployed by ITR, Chandipur.

The launch was monitored by senior scientists from various DRDO labs involved in the design and development of the system such as Defence Research & Development Laboratory (DRDL), Research Centre Imarat (RCI), Hyderabad and R&D Engineers, Pune. Rakshya Mantri Rajnath Singh has complimented the DRDO, Indian Navy and associated teams on the successful flight trial of VL-SRSAM and said that the missile will prove to be a force multiplier for the Indian Navy.

DRDO Chairman G Satheesh Reddy also congratulated the teams involved in the successful flight test and said that the trial has proved the effectiveness of the weapon system. It will further strengthen the Indian Navy for neutralising various aerial threats at close ranges including sea-skimming targets.

surance money under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) for crop loss during the last Kharif season.

Hundreds of farmers of Deogarh under the banner of Zilla Krushak Sangharsh Sangha staged a road blockade at Nirbeni Sahi, close to the NH-49, affecting vehicular movement on both sides of the highway.

This apart, the agitating farmers also observed bandh in the Deogarh Municipality area due to which normal life was paralysed for more than seven hours.

Due to the bandh, government and private offices, courts, educational institutions, banks and financial institutions besides business establishments remained closed in the town as farmers picketed at several places in Deogarh town.

President of the farmers' outfit, Sam Hembrum said, "during last Kharif, farmers of our district had insured their crop with the HDFC Ergo insurance company after paying



The most important method of preventing malaria is by controlling the spread of its carriers, that is Anopheles mosquitoes. There are around four hundred species of Anopheles mosquitoes, out of which only 30 are potential carriers of malaria parasites.

Mosquitoes, those tiny blood-sucking insects, are responsible for transmitting serious diseases such as malaria. With no vaccine currently available, malaria — an ancient disease that began afflicting humans from the beginning of agriculture and modern civilization — remains a deadly threat to people around the world. According to the last World Malaria Report released on 19th November 2018, an estimated 219 million cases of malaria have been reported in the preceding year, causing nearly half a million deaths globally. African countries were the most affected, by being home to 92% of the global malaria cases and 93% of causalities due to malaria.

Though, India accounts for only 4% of total malaria cases reported globally, unfortunately it also accounts for 52% of the total malaria deaths caused outside the African region. India has set a target of eradicating malaria by the year 2030.

Despite the commendable efforts by the World Health Organization, respective governments and other relevant bodies in fighting malaria, the global campaign against malaria is facing an acute financial crunch. Eliminating malaria is, and should be the top priority. Grand pronouncements are meaningless as long as manipulated data twist our knowledge and bad governance impedes genuine attempts to fight the disease

The request on Monday was included in a federal lawsuit, the first filing by Trump's legal team in the two weeks since the search, that takes broad aim at the FBI investigation into the discovery of classified records at Mar-a-Lago and that foreshadows arguments his lawyers are expected to make as the probe proceeds.

It comes as The New York Times reported that the government has recovered more than 300 documents marked classified from Mar-a-Lago since Trump left office, including more than 150 retrieved by the National Archives in January, a number that helped trigger the criminal investigation.

The lawsuit casts the August 8 search, in which the FBI said it recovered 11 sets of classified documents from Mar-a-Lago, as a "shockingly aggressive move".

It also attacks the warrant as overly broad, contends that Trump is entitled to a more detailed description of the records seized from the home and argues that the FBI and Justice Department has long treated him "unfairly".

"Law enforcement is a shield that protects America. It cannot be used as a weapon for political purposes," the lawyers wrote on Monday.

"Therefore, we seek judicial assistance in the aftermath of an unprecedented and unnecessary raid" at Mar-a-Lago.

In a separate statement, Trump said, "ALL documents have been previously declassified", though he has not produced evidence to support that claim, and described the records as having been "illegally seized from my home".

The Justice Department countered in a terse three-sentence statement pointing out that

Cannon, who was nominated by Trump in 2020 and confirmed by the Senate 56-21 later that year. She is a former assistant US attorney in Florida, handling mainly criminal appeals.

The months-long investigation, which burst into public view with the Mar-a-Lago search, emerged from a referral from the National Archives, which earlier this year retrieved 15 boxes of documents and other items from the estate that should have been turned over to the agency when Trump left the White House. An initial review of that material concluded that Trump had brought presidential records and several other documents that were marked classified to Mar-a-Lago.

FBI and Justice Department officials visited

Several weeks later, the Justice Department subpoenaed for video footage from surveillance cameras at the estate.

After the meeting at Mar-a-Lago, investigators interviewed another witness who told them that there were likely additional classified documents still at the estate, according to a person familiar with the investigation who was not authorised to speak publicly about it.

Separately on Monday, a federal judge acknowledged that redactions to an FBI affidavit spelling out the basis for the search might be so extensive as to make the document "meaningless" if released to the public.

But he said he continued to believe it should not remain sealed in its entirety because of the "intense" public interest in the investigation.

A written order from US Magistrate Judge Bruce Reinhart largely restates what he said in court last week, when he directed the Justice Department to propose redactions about the information in the affidavit that it wants to remain secret. That submission is due on Thursday at noon.

Justice Department officials have sought to keep the entire document sealed, saying disclosing any portion of it risks compromising an ongoing criminal investigation, revealing information about witnesses and divulging investigative techniques.

They have advised the judge that the necessary redactions to the affidavit would be so numerous that they would strip the document of any substantive information and make it effectively meaningless for the public.

Reinhart acknowledged that possibility in his Monday order, writing, "I cannot say at this point that partial redactions will be so extensive that they will result in a meaningless disclosure, but I may ultimately reach that conclusion after hearing further from the government."



In some other high-profile cases, including investigations involving Rudy Giuliani and Michael Cohen, two of Trump's personal attorneys. that role has been filled by a former judge.

"This matter has captured the attention of the American public. Merely adequate' safeguards are not acceptable when the matter at hand involves not only the constitutional rights of President Trump, but also the presumption of executive privilege," the attorneys wrote.

The lawsuit argues that the records, created during Trump's White House tenure, are "presumptively privileged".

But the Supreme Court has never determined whether a former president can assert executive privilege over documents, writing in January that the issue is unprecedented and raises "serious and substantial concerns".

"I know Rakesh Tikait very well, he is a 'do kaudi ka aadmi' (second rate person). He fought elections twice and lost deposit. If this kind of a man opposes anyone, it is of no value and so I do not answer to such people as it is of no relevance," Mishra said.

Led by Tikait, the Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) staged a 75-hour long dharna in Lakhimpur last week to press for various demands, including the sacking of Mishra.

"He (Tikait) is doing politics in this manner and running his livelihood. They will be given a reply at the right time," Mishra is heard telling BJP workers in the video apparently in his Kheri constituency.

According to his disclosure obtained by CNN and The Washington Post, Zatko said that Twitter has "major security problems that pose a threat to its own users' personal information, to company shareholders, to national security, and to democracy".

Zatko, who reported directly to the CEO, was fired by Twitter in January this year over "poor performance".

Last month, he filed a complaint with the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), accusing Twitter of deceiving shareholders and violating an agreement it made with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) to uphold certain security standards.

In his disclosure as a whistleblower, Zatko alleged that Twitter's leadership "has misled its own board and government regulators about its security vulnerabilities, including some that could allegedly open the door to foreign spying or manipulation, hacking and disinformation campaigns".

He also said that Twitter does not "reliably delete users' data after they cancel their accounts".

The whistleblower also said Twitter executives don't have the resources to fully understand the true number of bots on the platform, and were not motivated to.

Tesla CEO Elon Musk has cancelled the \$44 billion Twitter takeover deal over the actual presence of bots on the platform.

Zatko's lawyer told CNN that he has not been in contact with Musk.

An attorney for Musk said that their legal team has already issued a subpoena for Zatko, "and we found his exit and that of other key employees curious in light of what we have been finding".

Twitter said in a statement that security and privacy are both longtime priorities for the company. The company said that it "provides clear tools for users to control privacy, and targeting and data sharing".

Indian EV market to hit annual sales of 17 mn units by 2030: Report

MUMBAI: India's electric vehicle market is expected to expand at a compounded annual growth rate of 49 per cent between 2021-2030, with the segment's volumes set to cross annual sales of 17 million by 2030, a new report said on Tuesday.

This projected growth is expected to be driven by factors such as rising fuel prices, entry of new players, advancement in EV technology, continued subsidy suptery demand is anticipated to increase at a compounded annual growth rate (CAGR) of 41 per cent, reaching 142 GWh, as per the forecast.

It stated that the market is of 6.5 GWh, just like in 2021 and added that the EV segment is anticipated to grow quickly after 2024-2025, as the initial cost of these vehicles are predicted to be comparable to those of internal combustion engine-powered vehicles on the back of

After Wipro, now Infosys reduces average variable pay for June quarter amid margin squeeze

NEW DELHI: India's second-largest IT services company Infosys has scaled back the average variable payout of employees to about 70 per cent for the June quarter amid margin squeeze and high employee costs, according to sources.



Recently, Wipro held back the variable pay of employees mainly due to pressure on margins, inefficiency in its talent supply strategic investchain and investment in technology. Larger rival Tata Consultancy Sevices has report-

edly delayed quarterly variable compensation payout for some employees by a month.

According to the sources, Infosys has reduced variable payout for the June quarter or Q1 FY23 to about 70 up overall costs for Bengaluruthe headquartered firm in the June quarter. As such, an elevated level of attrition leading to higher employee costs is denting the profitability of the Indian

Sensex slumps 1,500 pts in last two sessions

NEW DELHI: The BSE Sensex fell for the second session (872 points) on Monday after falling 652 points on Friday as fear of aggressive rate hikes by central banks has started haunting the participants again. The BSE Sensex and the NSE Nifty have shed 1,524 points and 465 points, respectively, since Friday.

This two-session decline has eroded investors' wealth by more than Rs 6.57 lakh crore and the market capitalisation of all the BSE-listed firms came down to Rs 273.95 lakh crore on Monday from



Thursday. Till last Thursday, the two benchmark indices - Sensex and Nifty - had

rallied nearly 17-18 % from the lows of June 17 on the back of rebound in foreign fund inflows, softening commodity prices and a better-than-expected Q1FY23 corporate earnings. However, after minutes of the US Federal Reserve July meeting indicated a sharp hike in interest rate to curb inflation, investors were on a selling spree.

An increase in interest rates in the US has a negative impact on Indian markets and the economy as foreign investors start pulling out, foreign exchange reserves start depleting, risk of mounting inflation takes over the economy, the rupee falls against the dollar, among other things.

Inspector-in-Charge of Udala Police station Niroj Samal said that the mishap took place at around 11.30 pm. On being informed, police rushed to the hospital and seized the bodies, and sent them for postmortem. Further investigation is underway, he said.

Subarnarekha, where peak flood was witnessed on Monday afternoon, embankments of Mahanadi and its tributaries have been breached in seven places, Mr.Mishra said. The Water Resources Department will immediately undertake temporary repair of the embankments now, and will commence permanent repair after floodwaters recede completely likely in November or December, he said.

Water level in Subarnarekha and Budhabalanga rivers that caused floods in Balasore and Mayurbhanj districts have fallen below the danger mark. Similar is the situation of Baitarani River which inundated several villages in Jajpur and Keonjhar districts. Mr.Mishra said the flood situation in Mahanadi River has improved. "The water level in Hirakud Dam was 623.35 feet at 9 AM. While 1.59 lakh cusecs of water was entering the reservoir, 1.04 lakh cusecs were being discharged through four gates," he added.

However, the Jalaka River that caused flood in the Balasore block was flowing above the danger level. It was flowing at 6.45 metres at Mathani, while the danger level was at 5.5 metres.

Meanwhile, the Balasore district administration, which is dealing with flood situations in Baliapal, Bhograi, Basta, Jaleswar, Balasore Sadar and Remuna blocks, continued to evacuate more affected people to flood shelters.

Balasore District Collector Dattatraya Bhausaheb Shinde said that 40,124 people have been housed in 208 flood shelters, where 149 kitchens are operational while rescue operation is underway in marooned villages.

The tournament was Shastri's last assignment as India head coach. "They should not change the approach (they have shown of late). Even when I was a coach we discussed we were a bit timid at the top considering the players we had down the order.

"It is the right approach. You will lose a few games in between but if you start winning with this approach you can take that confidence in big games and use the same tactics," said Shastri in a press conference organised by Star Sports.

Virat Kohli will come back into the playing eleven after being rested for the West Indies series, while K L Rahul returns after an injury layoff.

Can the two senior batters show the same aggression the younger players have shown in their absence? "Why not? They are very experienced players," said Shastri.

"They have played enough IPL and T20s and it should not be tough for them to adjust. With Rishabh, Hardik, and Jadeja there is enough depth in the middle and lower order to get the innings back on track if the top order falls cheaply. Hardik and Bumrah's workload needs to be observed carefully." The return of Hardik Pandya, the all-rounder, has lent much-needed balance to the Indian playing eleven. "He is one of the most important cogs in India's wheel. You take him out, and the balance goes awry. We missed him last year at the World Cup where he could not bowl. No one is close to the quality that he possesses," Shastri said.


"He will come back with a much calmer mind. He gets 50 in the first game, mouths will be shut. Public memory is very short and works both ways."
