Odisha collectors told to open more mandis for paddy purchase

BHUBANESWAR (KCN): The State government on Monday, December 20, 2021, directed district collectors to open mandis (paddy purchase centres) as per requirement and engage more women self help groups (WSHGs) for smooth procurement of paddy under the minimum support price (MSP) scheme. Reviewing paddy procurement in districts with collectors and officials of Supplies and Cooperation departments through video conference, Chief Sec-Suresh retary Mahapatra asked them to ensure farmers car-

rying paddy to mandis are not harassed. The Chief Secretary's directive came in the wake of large scale complaints from disdecided at the district level paddy procurement committee meeting chaired by collectors concerned. With cold wave pre-



tricts on mismanagement in the paddy procurement. Reports from western Odisha districts suggest mandis have not been opened in places as

vailing in the State and farmers spending nights in the open to sell their paddy, the Chief Secretary asked the Food Supplies, Cooperation and Agriculture departments to mobilise adequate field staff and engage data entry operators of other departments to monitor the procurement process. He emphasised the need for involving more women SHGs in paddy procurement to address the issue of overcrowding at the mandis. Principal Secretary of

Food Supplies and Cooperation Yadav said paddy procurement is in full swing in the districts Bargarh, Sambalpur, Sundargarh, Sonepur, Kalahandi, Balangir, Nuapada, Rayagada, Boudh, Koraput and Malkangiri. Though procurement was started late in coastal districts, the process has already begun in Balasore. Around 5.13 lakh tonne of paddy have been procured under the price support system from nearly 98,000 farmers till date, he said. Yadav said purchase of paddy under paddy procurement automation system (P-PAS) is being carried out smoothly without any hassles. He offered all assistance to the district administrations for smooth procurement of paddy from farmers.

Odisha are likely to witness a severe cold wave over the next few days of the week. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued cold wave warning for 14

western, central and northern districts with cold wave gripping the north western parts of the country. The caution came on the day when Daringbadi recorded the season's lowest minimum temperature of 4 degree Celsius, followed by Jharsuguda (5.6 degree), Phulbani (6.5 degree) and Sonepur (6.9 degree). The Twin Cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack recorded 13.8 degree Celsius and 12.4 degree respectively.

"Cold wave conditions are expected to continue in some parts of Odisha till Thursday morning under influence of northerly and north-westerly dry and cold winds blowing towards the State," said Scientist of Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre Umasankar Das. Night temperature is likely to remain four to six degree below normal in the State in the next two to three days. The weather office cautioned that dipping mercury levels can lead to runny nose or nosebleed if a person is exposed to cold for a profonged duration. Livestock might also get affected.

It has advised citizens to stay indoors during night and early morning and keep livestock in shaded shelters.A warning has been issued for cold wave to severe cold wave conditions in Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Bargarh and Kandhamal dis-

tricts on Tuesday night and in the wee hours of Wednesday.

IIT Kharagpur is recognised as Post-independence Temple of Learning: Dharmendra Pradhan

Kolkata (KCN): The Union Education Minister Shri Dharmendra Pradhan stated IIT Kharagpur as the first centre of Excellence in the country after independence. While addressing the 67th Convocation on last Saturday (December 18, 2021), the Union Education Minister added that Indian Knowledge system was established on the grounds of Hijli Detention Camp which enriches the historic culture of IIT Kharagpur and is recognized as the post-independence temple of learning.

Shri Pradhan said, IIT Kharagpur will be the epicentre of change that traverses around the world in the coming years as it has a heritage and sacraments of sacrifice. He added that today we need new ideas to originate from India in the global scenario and India will be the fastest growing economy in the coming years. He also lauded the institution, stating that successful 100 crore vaccinations were possible because of the IITs and NITs of this country. In the 21st century, the economy of the world will be run by those who have the market, the qualitative low cost workforce and the critical minds, he stated. He also added that India can produce clean energy at one fourth of the cost compared to European countries which would be made possible by the IITians that is already proven in many verticals. 

Maara Movie Review: A grounded remake of Charlie with quite a bit of heart

If you didn't know that Maara is the reof make the Malayalam film, Charlie, the opening shot of fireflies fluttering about is a strong hint of the magic contained within the universe of this film. Shortly, you see little Paaru in rapt attention, as a nun narrates to her the story of a soldier who's travelling across seas and jungles in a quest to find his soul. This is pretty much the story of this film as well, as Paaru (Shraddha Srinath) grows up to find herself in a similar quest for her soul, well, soulmate, in Maara (Madhavan). There's another quest for a soulmate in this film, one undertaken by Vellaiyan (a wonderful Mouli), one that is later taken over by Maara. The film is a reinforcement of the power of stories, of the stories each of our lives are. This is why there are multiple characters with their own short stories, including those of Selvi (Abhirami), the sex worker, and Kani (Sshivada), the guilt-ridden doctor. The implication is that no one story is necessarily more important than another. I got the sense that Maara doesn't think of himself as a hero or a saviour, even if those around him seem to believe that. He's merely a tool, a person who breezes through life hoping to repay the extraordinary help that Vellaiyan has done to him. I loved this touch because shorn of it, Maara, the character, could have felt

unrelatable—which would have gone against the point of the film itself. This way, there's a reason for why Maara is the way he is, why he can't afford to stay at one place for too long. I quite enjoyed that Madhavan plays this character without

kites, in the sketch-book and its pencil illustrations, in the sculptures... hell, even in the blotches of Maara's acid-wash hoodies. There's a call through this film, through its characters, to refuse to fall into the trap of mundanity and indif-

How Hydras Regenerate Decapitated Heads

From salamander tails to deer antlers, the innate ability of some animals to regenerate lost body parts has captivated scientists for centuries and driven research into the molecular mechanisms of such healing in

the hopes that humans might someday be able to do the same.

Even amongst regenerating organisms, hydras—not the mythical beasts, but aquatic animals

in the genus Hydra—stand out for their ability to regrow any part of their body after it's lopped off, including their heads. Now, a study published last week (December 8) in Genome Biology and Evolution sheds new light on the genetic and epigenetic mechanisms that allow these animals to achieve this regenerative feat.

Hydra vulgaris are 1-to 3--centimeter-long, tube-shaped, freshwater organisms that adhere to objects such as sticks and rocks and, much like their relatives the sea anemone and jellyfish, hunt using stinging tentacles. They are considered to be immortal. Unless something comes along and kills them, they will continuously replenish lost tissues and body parts. They can also clone themselves through an asexual reproduction process called budding in which a new hydra grows out of the original and detaches, "kind of like the way petals would come out" from a flower, University of California, Irvine, cell biologist Ali Mortazavi tells The Scientist.

Mortazavi led a team of researchers who set out to answer a long-standing question in the field: whether the genetic and epigenetic processes guiding reproductive growth and regenerative regrowth are similar. "It's a very interesting question because it's one of the mysteries of cnidarians in general: they have all these fantastic modes of reproduction, and the big question is, are they recapitulating some process? Is regeneration like budding? But we don't really know so much," says Chiara Sinigaglia, a developmental and evolutionary biologist at the Institut de Génomique Fonctionelle de Lyon who didn't work on the study.

This mystery is "a question that people have been trying to address from different angles" for years, Sinigaglia adds. "It's very tricky because you see the same genes used over and over" in both processes.

Typically, researchers studying Hydra vulgaris regeneration have focused on the activity of one specific gene or biological process at a time. For instance, research published in eLife in March highlighted the role of the Wnt signaling pathway in rebuilding a Hydra vulgaris's mouth after decapitation. In contrast, Mortazavi and his colleagues took a more comprehensive approach, mapping out which genes were activated and upregulated at different points in time and in various tissues throughout the budding and regeneration processes.

The scientists conducted multiple experiments in which they decapitated the Hydra vulgaris to determine which genes were expressed as part of the head regeneration process. They also employed ChIP-sequencing, a technique that reveals epigenetic changes in the form of histone modifications, to determine which promoter and enhancer regions were actively upregulating the expression of different genes at various points in time for both regenerating and budding hydra. The team followed that up with ATAC-sequencing, a technique that identifies open-chromatin regions of a genome, to find out which genes were accessible to those candidate transcription factors.

For both reproduction and head regeneration, Hydra vulgaris rely on their head or-

ganizer, a cluster of 50 to 100 cells at the apical tip of the head

that signals nearby cells to differentiate into either part of the head or the tentacles. When the head is cut off, the researchers found, a cascade of genetic and epigenetic activity rapidly triggers the growth of a new head organizer from whatever cells remain, allowing the Hydra to regenerate the rest of its head as well. The study identified hun-

However, the study can only go as far as identifying candidate genes and transcription factors and generating hypotheses about which ones drive regeneration, budding, or both, Srivastava notes. In order to test and confirm the genes' roles, as well as those of the candidate promoters and enhancer regions, researchers will need to conduct functional knockdown or knockout studies, Macias-Muñoz explains.

Some of that work is already underway. Macias-Muñoz says she's nearly completed follow-up research that supplements this bulk analysis with single-cell studies in hopes of learning how cells take on different roles in response to decapitation versus normal development. Single-cell analysis, she explains, will allow her to "better trace these connections that we have identified."

"First you want to look at it one head at a time, and then you want to look at it with thousands of cells per head," Mortazavi says.

Benham-Pyle is particularly interested in seeing single-cell studies that identify how individual cells of different types communicate with one another to contribute to the signaling cascades that set off budding versus regeneration—in particular, which cell types existing head organizers signal and recruit into head development.

Unraveling evolution

The heatmaps and datasets generated by the new study provide an "important part of the story" of how regeneration first emerged in evolutionary history, says Srivastava.

Hydra has been part of that story for a long time: researchers first began studying its regenerative capabilities in 1744, when Abraham Tremblay first discovered the bizarre property. But other organisms have garnered more attention and detailed study, and many questions about Hydra regeneration remain unanswered.

Experts still don't know whether regeneration is a shared ancestral feature that emerged in some ancient organism, or whether creatures such as Hydra, the worms studied by Srivastava and Benham-Pyle, mammals, salamanders, and others that can regenerate some or all of their lost body parts developed the capacity independently. The paper notes that some of the tools necessary for regeneration must have emerged before the phyla to which Hydra belongs, Cnidaria, split off from the rest of the animal kingdom. One likely possibility, Sinigaglia adds, is that both regenerating and nonregenerating organisms inherited a broadly similar toolkit—Wnt3 is expressed during embryonic development even in nonregenerating species, for example which regenerating organisms then independently adapted to their own brands of regrowth.

"It's kind of nice that we're seeing similarities across all these different organisms," says Benham-Pyle, "because it makes it more likely that we might be able to leverage that biology to help humans."

"It is really an incredible resource for the hydra field," agrees Blair Benham-Pyle, a cell biologist studying flatworm regeneration at the Stowers Institute for Medical Research who didn't work on the study. "I think it's great for hypothesis generation."

Emergency reconstruction

As the March eLife paper indicated, a decapitated Hydra will quickly reassemble its mouth as a survival mechanism. Mortazavi speculates that same urgency is what drives the expression of some genes

over others during regeneration. In contrast, a budding Hydra clone undergoing normal development doesn't need to prioritize wound healing or survival, he says, and can progress at its own pace.

"Even though the processes are different, they still use the same developmental factors or genes, just in different ways," lead study author and University of California, Irvine, evolutionary biologist Aide Macias-Muñoz tells The Scientist. "I think that's because it's easier to coopt things that are already doing something. They're already being used in development to develop a head, so why not use similar things to de-

budding.

Those epigenetic changes and the dynamic modeling of enhancers and promoters seem to trigger genes at different points in time depending on which form of head generation the Hydra is undergoing, according to the study. Sinigaglia says one takeaway is "that the two processes converge on the same output—a little hydra complete with tentacles—but the trajectory, the time course, they are not really aligned."

The study produced a dataset of unprecedented scale on the gene expression of Hydra regeneration and development. Harvard University evolutionary biologist

Opposition takes out march to demand sacking of MoS Ajay Mishra in Lakhimpur case

NEW DELHI: Opposition leaders on Tuesday took out a protest march here demanding action against Union Minister Ajay Mishra in the Lakhimpur Kheri violence case, with Congress leader Rahul Gandhi saying they will not rest till the minister is sent to jail.

Gandhi also accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of not taking any action against Mishra, who he alleged is involved in the conspiracy of crushing farmers under his jeep in Lakhimpur Kheri. Leaders of several opposition parties took out the protest march from

Gandhi statue inside Parliament Complex to Vijay Chowk demanding that the minister, whose son has been arrested in the Lakhimpur violence case, be immediately sacked and action taken against him.

They also demanded that the suspension of 12 opposition members of Rajya Sabha be immediately revoked. MPs of various parties raised slogans against the government and held placards and banners demanding the immediate sacking of the minister.

Talking to reporters at Vijay Chowk, Gandhi said the entire opposition was united in raising its demand for the sacking of Union Min-



Referring to the SIT report on the violence which left eight people including four farmers dead, Gandhi said a report has come out that it was a conspiracy and not an isolated incident.

"We will not spare him (Ajay Mishra) and continue our struggle till he is sent to jail, to-day or tomorrow," Gandhi told reporters.

"The prime minister has not done anything on this. Neither the government nor the media is doing its job," he charged.

"The prime minister on the one hand apologises to farmers, but on the other hand he keeps the minister in his cabinet, who is involved in the crushing of farmers in Lakhimpur Kheri. We will not accept what is being done against farmers," Gandhi said. On the minister giving clarifications, Gandhi said he will do so just like a thief or a murderer will never admit to his crime.

"The truth is that the entire country has seen the crushing of farmers and all know whose jeep was it and whose son was involved."

"These clarifications will not help, as on one side is the truth where we are standing and on the other is lies," he said. The former Congress chief also shared a video of his remarks on Twitter saying there is no truth or explanation with the government on Lakhimpur Kheri. "The BJP is trying to divert attention from Lakhimpur issue. The truth is that the Modi government has a hand in protecting the killer, otherwise the minister would have been sacked by now. But remember - we will get justice!" he said in a tweet in Hindi.

"I am telling you today, we will ensure that this man goes behind bars and we will not spare him, today or tomorrow," he said and added it will happen just like the government had to give in to the demand for repeal of farm laws. Opposition leaders said they will continue to raise the demand even if many more of their MPs are suspended.

Tiruchi Siva of the DMK said the government has very cleverly repealed the farm laws as if nothing has happened, but what about the 700 farmers who lost their lives and a minister's son crushing farmers under his jeep in Lakhimpur. "The government has not taken any action and not removed MoS Ajay Mishra from his position. It is a black spot in history of Indian politics," Siva said. Sanjay Raut of the Shiv Sena alleged that even if the government suspends all opposition MPs, they will continue their fight for the farmers of Lakhimpur Kheri who were killed under a jeep. "The home minister comes and asks us questions in Maharashtra. But what is happening in your state -- murder, and you will not even take action," he said. Asserting that the united opposition will continue to ask questions from the government, Raut said, "We will not be silent till the minister is sacked, you may suspend as many MPs of ours."

Earlier in the morning, leaders of several opposition parties met in the chamber of Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge and discussed their further strategy. Opposition parties have been protesting against the suspension of MPs, which they have termed undemocratic and against the rules of the House. Proceedings of the Rajya Sabha have been disrupted repeatedly on the matter. Kharge and Congress MP Deepender Singh Hooda also gave adjournment notices in the Rajya Sabha on the Lakhimpur matter. Congress MP Manickam Tagore gave a similar adjournment notice in Lok Sabha on the Lakhimpur Kheri violence. Eight people, including four farmers, were killed in the Lakhimpur violence on October 3.

"I have given a suspension of business/notice under Rule 267 to discuss the recent SIT report on the manslaughter of Lakhimpur. We demand that MoS Ajay Mishra be immediately removed from his position to ensure a free and fair trial," Kharge said on Twitter.

"In order to ensure a free and fair trial of the murder case of innocent farmers, the Mos, who is father of the accused, must immediately be removed from his position," Kharge said in his adjournment notice under Rule 267.

The notices were, however, disallowed by Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla also did not allow any adjournment notice.

State issues Cold Wave warning

Bhubaneswar: The State Government on Tuesday alerted all the District Collectors and Municipal Commissioners about the cold



wave situation prevailing in several parts of the State and to continue for next three days. As per India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast, the minimum temperature will be below normal by 5 to 6 degree Celsius in the districts of interior Odisha and by 4 to 5 degrees in the districts of coastal Odisha during the next 3 days.

The north westerly/ northerly dry and cold wind at lower levels is penetrating over Odisha and under its influence isolated cold wave to severe cold wave with isolated cold day conditions very likely over some parts of interior and coastal districts of Odisha during next 3

The IMD has also issued an 'Orange warning' for isolated cold wave to severe cold wave conditions for seven districts in the State. These districts are Sundergarh, Jharsuguda, Mayurbhani, Kalahandi, Bolangir, Sonepur and Boudh. Further, the Met department has already issued yellow warning for cold for many districts of Odisha in the next three days. In its letter to the Collectors, Office of the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) advised the people to remain indoors during the night and morning as there is likely to be cold related illness which might be aggravated by continuous exposure to the cold.

The Collectors were requested to ensure that school buildings, community buildings and other available buildings are opened for use as shelter during night by homeless and needy people. Cold wave conditions continued to sweep across the State with the minimum temperature significantly remaining below normal in many places.

Daringbadi in Kandhamal district is the coldest place in the state with a minimum temperature of 3.5 degree Celsius on Tuesday.

As many as 19 places in the State recorded a minimum temperature below 10 degree Celsius. Phulbani registered a minimum temperature of 4 degree Celsius followed by Bhawanipatna (6) Keonjhar (6.2), Sundergarh (6.5), Tititilagarh (6.8), Boudh (7) Bolangir (7.8), Sonepur, Sambalpur, Baripada, Koraput (8.5 each) Anugul (8.6), Baragarh and Talcher (9 each), Chandbali (9.2) and Balasore 9.8 degree Celsius.

The Indian Meteorological Department here clarified that during the last two days frost not snow is seen on the ground in certain pockets of Kandhamal and Sundergarh districts.



nual Christmas stay at Sandringham.
This marks the second year when the pre-Christmas and Christmas get-togethers have been called off due to the COVID-19 pandemic

It comes as the government said it is monitoring data 'hour by hour' on whether legal restrictions need to be imposed on Christmas gatherings as the UK recorded another daily COVID high of 91,743 infections.

"Obviously, there's considerable uncertainty within" the Omicron data -- we're concerned about the increasing growth in cases, particularly in London, said UK Cabinet Office minister Steve Barclay.

With reference to further lockdown measures, he added: "But there is a considerable time lag between those catching the infection and presenting as cases at hospital and of course, that needs to be looked at....alongside the booster campaign, the increase in treatments, the changes in behaviour as a consequence of Plan B, which will also have an impact on those hospital admissions."

"We're balancing that against the wider economic consequences of any further restrictions which also carry health risks....in terms of the mental health consequences, for example, as well as those wider economic consequences." Current Plan B rules for England include COVID vaccine passes for events, face masks in most indoor settings and people being urged to work from home if they can.

Other parts of the United Kingdom have similar rules, with Scotland asking people to limit social contact to three households at a time in the run-up to Christmas and Wales closing nightclubs from December 27.

Meanwhile, London Mayor Sadiq Khan announced that a New Year's Eve celebration event planned at Trafalgar Square will not go ahead because of the surge in Omicron cases in the UK capital.

He said the event, for 6,500 key workers and members of the public, was being cancelled "in the interests of public safety".

"This will be very disappointing for many Londoners, but we must take the right steps to reduce the spread of the virus," said Khan. "I'm proud that we will still have an incredible broadcast spectacular to watch on our screens, which will showcase our great city to the rest of the world," he said.

Khan said more than 65,500 new confirmed cases have been recorded in the capital in the past seven days.

It has caused a 29 per cent increase in London hospital admissions in the last week, while the city remains under the purview of a "major incident" to aid with the increased load.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Varanasi on Thursday and launch multiple development initiatives, including inaugurating and laying the foundation stones of 22 projects worth over Rs 870 crore, his office said on Tuesday.

It has been the constant endeavour of the prime minister to work for the development and economic progress of his Lok Sabha constituency, Varanasi, the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said in a statement.

Moving ahead in this direction, he will visit Varanasi and launch multiple development initiatives at around 1 pm on Thursday, it added.

The prime minister will lay the foundation stone of the "Banas Dairy Sankul" at the Uttar Pradesh State Industrial Development Authority Food Park, Karkhiyaon, Varanasi.

Spread across 30 acres of land, the dairy will be built at a cost of about Rs 475 crore and will have a facility for processing five lakh litres of milk per day, the PMO said.

This will strengthen the rural economy and help the farmers of the region by creating new opportunities for them, it added.

Modi will also digitally transfer a bonus of about Rs 35 crore to the bank accounts of more than 1.7 lakh milk producers associated with the Banas Dairy.

He will lay the foundation stone for a biogasbased electricity generation plant for a Milk Producers' Cooperative Union plant in Varanasi's Ramnagar, the statement said.

It will be a key step towards making the plant energy self-sufficient, the PMO said.

Modi will also launch a portal and a logo dedicated to the Conformity Assessment Scheme of milk products, developed by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) with the help of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB). The unified logo, featuring both the BIS logo and the NDDB quality mark, will simplify the certification process for the dairy sector and reassure the public about dairy product quality.

In another effort to reduce the number of land ownership issues at the grassroots level, the prime minister will virtually distribute the rural residential rights record, "Gharauni", under the Swamitva scheme of the Union Ministry of Panchayati Raj to over 20 lakh resi-

India's oil production continues to slide; down two per cent in November

NEW DELHI: India's production of crude oil, which is refined to produce petrol and diesel, continued to decline in November, with lower output from state-owned firms leading to an over 2 per cent drop, official data released on Tuesday showed. Crude oil production in November was 2.43 million tonnes, down from 2.48 million tonnes a year back and 2.5 million tonnes in October 2021.

Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) produced 3 per cent less crude oil at 1.6 million tonnes in November due to delays in mobilising equipment at western offshore fields. Oil India Ltd (OIL) produced 2,41,420 tonnes of crude oil in November, down from 2,43,200 tonnes a year back and 2,52,990 tonnes in October.

India is 85 per cent dependent on imports to meet its crude oil needs as domestic output is insufficient to meet demand. During April-November - the first eight months of the current fiscal year - India's crude oil production fell 2.74 per cent to 19.86 million tonnes.

ONGC produced 4.18 per cent less oil at 12.94 million tonnes.

Natural gas production was, however, 23 per cent higher at 2.86 billion cubic meters (bcm) in November, mainly due to output from newer fields in the KG-D6 block, operated by Reliance Industries Ltd and BP plc.

ONGC produced 5.28 per cent less gas at 1.72 bcm, while the output from eastern offshore - where KG-D6 is situated - jumped 1,251 per cent to 581.34 million cubic meters. The data did not give individual field output. Reliance-BP last year started gas production from newer fields in the KG-D6 block, and such output has contributed to the overall rise in availability in the country. Delays in the mobilisation of equipment and the start of output from its eastern offshore fields due to COVID impacting supply chains were the main reasons listed for lower output by ONGC.

Gas production in April-November was 21.78 per cent higher at 22.77 bcm. ONGC produced 6.14 per cent less gas at 13.78 bcm, while eastern offshore output jumped 1,163 per cent to 4.46 bcm.

With the economy rebounding from COVID induced slowdown, fuel consumption has been on the rise, leading to higher crude processing at refineries. Refineries processed 3.38 per cent more crude oil at 21.48 million tonnes in November and 11.7 per cent higher in April-November at 155.73 million tonnes. Refineries operated at 102.7 per cent of their capacity in November as compared to 89.81 per cent a year back. During April-November capacity utilisation was 93.23 per cent as opposed to 83.42 per cent a year back.

In the health sector, a project comprising a doctors' hostel, a nurses' hostel and a shelter home, amounting to Rs 130 crore, at the Mahamana Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya Cancer Centre will be inaugurated by the prime minister.

He will also inaugurate a 50-bed Integrated Ayush Hospital at Bhadrasi, the statement said. The prime minister will lay the foundation stone of the Rs 49 crore Government Homeopathic Medical College in Pindra tehsil under the Ayush Mission.

In the road sector, Modi will lay the foundation stone of two "four-to-six lane" road-widening projects for Prayagraj and Bhadohi, the statement said.

This will improve the connectivity of Varanasi and will be a step towards resolving the problem of the city's traffic congestion, it added.
