Odisha CHSE Plus II Practical Exams From January 2

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Plus II practical examinations of the Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE), Odisha will begin on January 2. The CHSE has initiated preparations to send examination materials to all the centres. The materials will be dispatched from CHSE head office to all the Examination Centres from December 26 and are expected to reach all centres by December 31. CHSE Controller of Examinations wrote a letter to all the college Principals and Centre Superintendents mentioning guidelines for the practical exams and handling of related materials. CHSE requested them to



remain alert to receive the materials (Practical question papers & blank answer script, other examination related confidential forms etc.) with respect to their H.S. School & tagged H.S. School(s) (if any) on any day between December 26, 2023 and December 31, 2023. In stray cases, the CHSE officials may reach their institution even after normal office hours. CHSE further wrote to acknowledge the receipt

of the materials after careful verification and counting. Any discrepancy/shortfall of items (as per list) is to be reported to the Controller of Examinations instantly. The question paper packets are to be stored securely under the supervision of the Center Superintendent/Principal in the Strong Room/ Examination Section under CCTV surveillance. Two Held For Knife Attack, Loot In Nuapada

Nuapada (KCN): Police have arrested two persons including a minor for attacking two men and looting mobile phones, bike and cash from them in Nuapada. One of the accused has been identified as Sahil Tandi (19) of L.D Pada in Khariar Road, and another is a minor.

According to reports, the two accused had attacked two persons named, Dilar Singh Shabar and Raman Bariha by knife near Mongrapali pond at Khariar road on 9th December and looted



mobile phones, bike and cash over Rs 1,100 from them. Following the incident,

the two injured were admitted to the Community Health Center, Khariar Road. They have lodged a complaint in the Jharkhand police station against the two accused. Based on the complaint, a team of cops led by IIC Gurudev Kami initiated an investigation into this matter.

Today, the police have apprehended the two accused from the Odisha-Chhattisgarh border and seized all the looted things along with the knife from them. The minor has been forwarded to the Juvenile court, Bhawanipatna and another accused Sahil has been forwarded to Nuapada court.

THE INVINCIBLE AND INDOMITABLE SAFFRON SPIRIT



Its spectacular victory in the three key states that went to polls recently has propelled the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) prospects further. Dismantling almost all exit poll predictions, the party had its landslide victory in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. Should the results of the state elections be seen as a signal for the Modi government's hat-trick comeback in 2024? The results must have shaken the entire organizational edifice of the Congress with more murmurs of discontent being heard. Though its Telangana victory came as a relief almost in line with the predictions flung both before and after the polls, its drastic fall in the Hindi heartland that remained its stronghold once, would take some time to sink in. But for the Congress, as usual, to learn lessons from its

failures is a nonexistent and unnecessary etiquette. This has been the approach of the party all through its failures. But the Telangana victory will be seen as historic as ever since the UPA government formed the state in 2014, the party had painstakingly been on its track strategizing to grab power in the state. But the K Chandrashekhar Rao magic continued for two terms winning elections probably gaining from the thanksgiving pattern of voting by the electorate. KCR gained ground for being the master crusader for the formation of the state that had been carved out from Andhra Pradesh. Though Madhya Pradesh was a tough ride, the Congress expected an ascent in Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh was speculated as an easy pass. But the narratives, predictions and myriad speculations could not work. Dismantling Ashok Gehlot's upbeat presumptions and unrealistic estimations, the BJP had its saffron flags flying high almost everywhere in the state. Disgruntled to the core,

the party should spend some time to meaningfully check the factors of failures that have led to its big fall. But its behavior in the parliament the other day was unsurprisingly menacing and the prime minister had to caution its members to restrain from venting frustration in the house. Madhya Pradesh was a turbulent storm. The results have put the Congress in its too little and dwarfish image once again. The BJP government, as had been predicted by its master strategist Amit Shah, came back with its unprecedented numbers, giving a sense of its precise calculation and commitment from the party's grassroots to the apex layer. Chhattisgarh had ultimately shattered the hopes of the Congress. It was known for the party's indomitable hold on the electoral scenario, especially when the entire speculation mechanism mocked the BJP for being a distant shadow. Anti-incumbency was a rare chance, predicted by the media and pundits alike. But the saffron ride had devastated the Congress,

at least in the winning point of view, turning it a mere scarecrow. Resounding, impressive and momentous were the three state victories for the BJP and its most powerful patriarch Narendra Modi. And for the party cadre, Modi, animated like a saintly savior, taught them the lessons of humility and the reasons to remain composed even while scaling the heights of victories. This has been a curious fact that the BJP and its supporters have often been following. Taking every election as a new experiment with new strategies creating an amalgam of winning components, the party and its endless array of supporters including its strong cultural foundation the RSS toil restlessly and this could be a prominent reason that separates the saffron party from the rest of the political groups in India. Excellently carved and beautifully polished narratives have deliberately been placed to meticulously differentiate between the binary - the nationalistic politics of BJP and the divisive anti-national

ways of politicking by the Congress. Mostly, elections in India are battles of narratives. They rarely address key issues that excruciatingly prick and incessantly destabilize the essential ambiance in the country. Of course, the situation began to change ever since the 2014 saffron saga. The tide of expectations it could put into effect was a defining indicator; that India was all set to trace the track of its excellence. Not only internally but globally the attempt was to redefine and redesign the image of India. Undoubtedly, a decade of untiring initiatives by the Modi administration could change the mindset of a large segment of India's electorate, that otherwise was sunk in profound desperation and weary of being carried away by the politics of negativity, malignity and self-defeat. A distraction designed merely to placate the country's journey to success would be efficiently countered and narratives to defame its eminence would be easily toppled. This has been a basic tutoring that the Modi government

could take the country's electorate through. But the BJP's defeat in Telangana would be deliberately termed as the south's reluctance to embrace a party that nibbles on Hindutva and a viable framework of narratives would further castigate it as a Hindi, Hindu and Hindutva party. This would lead to an unsurprising argument, a division of the country into North and South. I am not without sympathy for the Congress or any other party for that matter, as their reluctance to see the pathways that the BJP is creating in the southern states is a blindfolding activity. Exemplifying its efforts and efficiency, the saffron giant had paved inroads in Telangana as well. The result of this state election is a testimony for its ascent from its single seat to the eight seats it won. Though out of power, Karnataka is still its bastion and now stretching further to Telangana, the BJP is expected to credibly increase its tally in 2024. Imagine the irony, the pathos. The disenchanted outcome that the Congress has

landed in should be saying tones of instances of its absolute ineptness. Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra could not impress the voters to the extent of winning votes. The Congress narratives are too skinny, unrealistic and irrationally framed and feeble to successfully counter the formidable threat and existential crisis that the Modi factor and the impact of his welfare schemes could cause to it. Modi has gone farther in heights scripting success stories and the personal rants against him by his opponents have actually helped him earn sympathy and gave him a chance to sharpen his oratory. The Congress meltdown in the Hindi heartland has obviously been a reaction to what the party and its INDI alliance partners have been standing for. A decade of consistent efforts by the opposition to target Modi has backfired almost every time, mainly because the electorate in the country has grown reasonably well intellectually and to assess the government's initiatives was a realistic exercise with greater transparency while their impacts being sustainable and satisfactory. Welfare schemes by the government have meticulously been brought to the last man and an obvious reason for their gaining accolades is that they were far better, transparent and feasible than the UPA regime. The Congress party's arrogant, partial and pessimistic approach on Hindutva and its minority appeasement could be some among the factors that decimated its fortunes in the three key states. Understanding the behavioral defect of the Congress and its leadership, Modi puts it candidly with a slight caution in his recent X one-liner, "Old habits of 70 years cannot go away so easily". Doesn't the Congress have a reason to ponder?

Historic Verdict: Supreme Court Validates Article 370 Revocation, Paving the Path for Jammu and Kashmir's Renewal



In a landmark judgment on 11th December 2023, the Constitution bench of the Supreme Court delivered its verdict on a series of petitions challenging the abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories. 333 players to go under the hammer in IPL 2024 auction

New Delhi: The short-list for the 2024 IPL Player Auction was announced on Sunday (December 11), with 333 players set to go under the hammer. Of those, 214 are Indian players and 119 overseas, including two players from associate countries. The highest reserve price of INR 2 Crore sees 23 players listed in the bracket, three of them being Indian players - Harshal Patel, Shardul Thakur and Umesh Yadav.

The remaining 20 players listed under the highest base price are Harry Brook, Travis Head, Riley Rossouw, Steve Smith, Gerald Coetzee, Pat Cummins, Chris Woakes, Josh Inglis, Lockie Ferguson, Josh Hazlewood, Mitchell Starc, Mujeeb Ur Rahman, Adil Rashid, Rassie van der Dussen, James Vince, Sean Abbott, Jamie Overton, David Willey, Ben Duckett, Mustafizur Rahman.

Australia's World Cup



winning skipper is back in the IPL mix having pulled out last season while Starc will be part of the auction again after a lengthy gap. Hazlewood, who is expecting the birth of his child coinciding with the IPL, might miss out for the first half of the season but he has been listed in the top price bracket. Seven Australians enter the auction with a base price of INR 2 Crore, including 2023 World

Cup hero Travis Head. There are also seven England cricketers, including Harry Brook. Pacer Coetzee, who impressed in the World Cup, is one among three South Africans with the highest base price. New Zealand's Ferguson, Bangladesh's Mustafizur and Afghanistan's Mujeeb are the others in the top bracket. There are 13 players listed in the second highest base price category - of INR 1.5 Crore - all overseas players. Wanindu Hasaranga, Phillip Salt, Colin Munro, Sherfane Rutherford, Tom Curran, Jason Holder, Mohammad Nabi, James Neesham, Daniel Sams, Chris Jordan, Tymal Mills, Jhye Richardson and Tim Southee are listed in the INR 1.5 Crore bracket. There are 14 players in the INR 1 Crore bracket, including Namibia's David Wiese, while 11 are listed in the INR 75 Lakh bracket.

Netherlands' Paul van Mekeren is the other associate player, and has been listed in the INR 20 Lakh base price bracket. Rachin Ravindra, New Zealand's stand-out performer in the World Cup, and Azmatullah Omarzai, who also impressed during Afghanistan's campaign in the multi-team event, are both listed in the INR 50 Lakh bracket.

The IPL auction will be held at the Coca-Cola Arena in Dubai on December 19, and starts at 2:30 PM IST. A maximum of 77 slots are available to be filled for the teams, with a maximum of 30 overseas slots. The total purse available to spend is INR 262.95 Crore. Kolkata Knight Riders (12) have the highest slots to be filled while Gujarat Titans, who traded Hardik Pandya to Mumbai Indians, in an all-cash transaction, have the highest purse (INR 38.15 Crore) heading into the auction

Pant set to return for IPL 2024

New Delhi: Rishabh Pant is poised to make a comeback to the cricket field, and it is highly likely that he will participate in the upcoming season of the Indian Premier League (IPL). The Delhi Capitals management has confirmed that the Indian wicketkeeper-batsman, who has been out of action for nearly a year, will lead the franchise in the 2024 IPL season.

Management officials have stated that Pant, currently undergoing rehabilitation at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) in Bengaluru, is expected to regain fitness by the end of February. His active participation in IPL games will be contingent upon the clearance from the NCA managers. After undergoing surgery on his right knee, performed by Dr. Dinshaw Pardiwala in Mumbai, following a near-fatal accident on New Year's Eve last year, and dealing with injuries



to his back and ankles, there remains uncertainty about Pant's ability to keep wickets during the IPL matches. Franchise officials have indicated that he will take on wicket keeping duties only if cleared by the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI); otherwise, he will focus on batting and fielding. This dispels suggestions that the 26-year-old player might be utilised solely as an Impact Player by the team. "If he is not keeping, he will definitely be on the field and will lead the side," a franchise official stated. Pant missed the entire IPL season last year, and the absence of his contribution was keenly felt by the Delhi Capitals, who finished ninth in the IPL points table. The Capitals are now banking on their inspirational leader to affect a turnaround in their fortunes in the upcoming season.

India have played 62 internationals since January 2023, and among numerous games, Pant has missed the four-Test home series against Australia, the 2023 IPL, the series in the West Indies, Ireland, the Asia Cup, and the World Cup. He is also likely to be unavailable for the upcoming three-match T20I series against Afghanistan and the significant five-Test series against England in February and March. Furthermore, he is already unavailable for the ongoing series against South Africa.

Shakib determined to prioritise international cricket over T20 leagues



Dhaka: Bangladesh's Shakib Al Hasan said on Monday (December 11) that he is looking to sacrifice franchise-based T20 cricket in order to give more time for national duty.

Shakib had not given his name for the Indian Premier League auction while he said that he asked his manager to withdraw his name from the players' draft of Pakistan Super League, where he is platinum category.

"I did not give my name in IPL and so that a window will be opened and when my manager gave my name in PSL I told him to withdraw it. My plan is to give all this time to the national team because I will sacrifice

the franchise tournaments that I used to play," Shakib, who earlier skipped national commitments on several occasions, told reporters during a private programme in the USA. "I am playing in three formats and hope that I can continue that but no one knows about the future and what is in store. But till now I have the desire to play cricket for a long time," he said. Shakib, who is currently nursing an injured finger that ruled him out from the just concluded two-match Test series at home against New Zealand, will also miss the upcoming white-ball tour of New Zealand. Shakib said he is looking to make a comeback to

Asad Shafiq retires from all forms of cricket

New Delhi: Pakistan's middle-order batter Asad Shafiq has announced his retirement from all forms of the game. The 37-year-old, who last played international cricket back in 2020, cited the lack of motivation as the major reason behind his decision. Fresh off leading Karachi Whites to the National T20 Cup title on Sunday (December 10), Shafiq revealed his retirement decision at the post-match press conference.

"I am not feeling the same excitement and passion playing cricket and neither do I have the same fitness levels required for international cricket. Which is why I have decided to say goodbye to all cricket," said Shafiq at the press conference.

Having made his international debut in 2010 across all three



formats, Shafiq went on to represent Pakistan in 77 Tests, 60 ODIs and 10 T20Is. While his white-ball returns were lukewarm at best, Shafiq shone brightly in Test cricket where he was one of Pakistan's most dependable batters in all conditions. The 2014-16 phase was Shafiq's peak

as a Test batter, tallying close to 2000 runs across the three calendar years. Six of his twelve centuries in red-ball cricket came during this period. A dip in form from the 2018-19 season saw Shafiq eventually facing the axe in 2020, after which he was never picked again. "After being

dropped in 2020 I kept on playing domestic cricket for three years in the hope of getting another crack at the Pakistan team. But before the start of this season, I had decided this would be my last season because I felt that closing in on 38 years of age, this was time to

retire instead of people telling me to step down," he said.


Given his clean image off the field and unassuming personality, Shafiq was one of the major contributors when it came to cleansing Pakistan cricket's sanctity after the destructive spot-fixing scandal that rocked the country in 2010. With Misbah-ul-Haq at the helm of the revival, Shafiq was one of the key accomplices in the mission alongside Azhar Ali and Younis Khan.

"After the spot-fixing scandal in 2010 it was a very difficult time for Pakistan cricket and I am happy I was part of that process where we won back the confidence of the people in our team." While one innings of Shafiq has ended in cricket, he's gearing up for the second essay that shall see him in the role of a selector. "I have got the contract from the board and I am looking at it and hopefully it will be processed soon."

India to start U19 World Cup campaign against Bangladesh

New Delhi: Defending champions India will start their title defence in the 2024 U19 World Cup by taking on Bangladesh, the 2020 champions. The tournament, which had to be shifted from Sri Lanka to South Africa, will be played from January 19 onwards. The final will take place in Benoni on February 11. Tournament hosts South Africa will feature on the opening day of the tournament as they take

on West Indies while the inaugural game is set to be between Ireland and West Indies. The tournament format sees the 16 teams split into four groups with the top three teams of each group progressing to the next stage. However, unlike previous editions the progression to the knockouts is a hybrid model. Firstly, the 12 teams that progress are then bunched into two groups of six apiece with

After a 22-year gap between the previous two U19 editions held in South Africa, it has taken only four years for the country to return as the hosting venue for the showpiece event featuring cricket's prodigies. "The relocation of the U19 Men's Cricket World Cup 2024 to South Africa allows us the opportunity to build on this momentum and welcome the best young cricketers on the planet to five notable international venues."
