

Chhattisgarh: CRPF sub-inspector killed, constable injured in encounter with Naxalites

Raipur(KCN): A sub-inspector of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) was killed and a constable injured in an encounter between security personnel and Naxalites in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district Sunday, police said. The incident took place in the morning under Jagargunda police station area when a team of the CRPF's 165th battalion was out on an anti-Naxal operation, a police official said. The operation was launched at around 7am from Bedre camp towards Ursangal village, he said.



During the operation, an exchange of fire broke out in which sub-inspector Sudhakar Reddy was killed and constable Ramu sustained bullet injuries, he said. After the exchange of fire stopped, four suspects were rounded up from the spot, he said, adding a joint team of security personnel was carrying out a search in the area. The injured constable was being shifted to hospital for treatment, the official said.

Odisha: Examination postponed over GNM question paper leak

Keonjhar(KCN): The Odisha Nurses and Midwives Examination Board (ONMEB), Bhubaneswar has postponed the annual tests for the ANM and GNM courses scheduled for December 18 and 19 over alleged leak of question papers till further orders, sources said Sunday. ONMEB had earlier announced that it will conduct the examination for auxiliary nursing midwives (ANM) and general nursing midwives (GNM) from December 11 till December 19, this year. It had published the routine August 18, 2023. However, taking all by surprise Sunday the

board issued a notice (No-947/NEB-3/2023) announcing the postponement of examinations scheduled for December 18 and December 19. Exams were to be held for first, second and third-year GNM students December 18 and 19. The sudden postponement of the examinations sparked concern among the students. When contacted, ONMEB secretary Basanti Behera confirmed the development. She said that the examination has been postponed due to question paper leaks. The matter came to the fore after a staff of nursing



college informed her. The staff had received the sample question paper in his WhatsApp and promptly informed Behera. The matter was reviewed and a decision was taken to issue the notice for postponement of the exams. A meeting of ONMEB committee will be held Monday and decision will be taken on the further course of action.

Behera said that the question papers are in the custody of 35 sub-collectors offices in the state. She said that a decision will be taken to hold the examination as soon as possible in view of the future of the students. BJP state executive member Alok Sethy said that the question paper leak has exposed the inefficiency of the

department officials. He alleged the involvement of a big racket in the question paper leak. Sethy said many persons are minting money by playing with the future of the students. Sethy raised doubts on the claim of ONMEB officials about the leak of only two question papers. He alleged that the leak has taken place in all subjects of ANM and GNM examinations and demanded an inquiry by the state Vigilance department to unravel the truth. He asserted that stringent action must be taken against the persons involved in the wrongdoing.

Odisha: Capital Hospital Restricts Conducting MRI And CT Scans Sans Valid Prescription

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) and Computed Tomography (CT) scans of patients coming to Capital Hospital here will not be done sans a valid prescription, said Deputy Director of the government-run health facility Dr Dhananjaya Das today. "We have taken a strong stance in this regard.



Accordingly, proper verification of prescriptions will be carried out before conducting the tests free of cost. Allegedly, some middlemen have been making use of fabricated

prescriptions and are trying to avail the benefit," the deputy director asserted. Even to the extent, some middlemen are using prescriptions of private doctors to get the tests done and are in turn taking money from the patients, the deputy director expressed. "We took this step to prevent middlemen from exploiting patients," Dr Das added.

Picnic Turns Tragic: 5 Killed In Road Mishap In Odisha's Sundargarh

Bhubaneswar(KCN): At least 5 persons, including four members of two families, were killed in a road mishap in Odisha's Sundargarh district today. A 14-year-old girl was also critically injured in the mishap that occurred near Telendihi village in Sundargarh in the afternoon. place while they were returning home in an auto-rickshaw in the afternoon, sources said. A speeding truck hit the auto-rickshaw near Telendihi and the two vehicles fell into the roadside field following the collision, sources added. "The truck and the auto-

rickshaw fell around 20 feet down into the agricultural field due to the collision. At least five persons died on the spot and a minor girl sustained critical injuries in the mishap," said a local. The deceased have been identified as Munsan Khatoon (48) and her

granddaughter Inayat (4), Ishrat Khatoon (42) and her daughter Muskan (19), and auto-rickshaw driver M u h a m m a d Sajjad. Soni, another daughter of Ishrat, sustained critical injuries in the mishap. She has been admitted to Sundargarh District Headquarters Hospital (DHH), sources said. Soon after the mishap, the locals staged a road blockade at Balijari Square at Sundargarh seeking compensation for the families of the deceased persons.

PM Modi inaugurates Surat Diamond Bourse in Gujarat



Surat(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi Sunday inaugurated the Surat Diamond Bourse, the world's largest and modern centre for international diamond and jewellery business. The Surat Diamond Bourse (SDB) building, the world's largest office complex with more than 67 lakh square feet of floor area, is located at Khajod village near Surat city. It will be a global centre for trading of both rough and polished diamonds as well as jewellery, as per an official statement. It will comprise a state-of-the-art 'Customs

Clearance House' for import and export, jewellery mall for retail jewellery business and facility of international banking and safe vaults, it said. Several diamond traders, including those based in Mumbai earlier, have already taken possession of their offices, which were allotted by the management after auction, SDB's media convener Dinesh Navadiya said in a statement recently. The SDB is part of the Diamond Research and Mercantile (DREAM) City.

Former Gujarat chief minister Anandiben Patel in February 2015 performed the ground-breaking ceremony of the SDB and DREAM City project. With 67 lakh square feet of floor space, the SDB is now the world's largest office building having nearly 4,500 diamond trading offices, a release said. The megastructure, built on a plot of 35.54 acres inside the DREAM City, has nine towers of 15 floors with office spaces ranging from 300 sq ft to 1 lakh sq ft.

700 CR Plan For Barabati Stadium



Cuttack(KCN): For complete transformation of the Iconic Barabati Stadium, the State Government and Odisha Cricket Association (OCA) have joined hands and decided to develop the cricket stadium as a world-class stadium with an investment of Rs 600 to Rs 700 crore. Speaking to media persons after the meeting, OCA Vice-President Pankaj Lochan Mohanty said, "It was decided during the meeting to prepare a detailed projects report (DPR) for complete development of the Barabati Stadium with an investment of about Rs 600 to Rs 700 crore."

We can get more than Rs 150 crore from BCCI (Board of Control for Cricket in India) Infrastructure Development Fund while the State Government with active support from corporate through their CSR fund, can get the remaining fund required for the mega project, he said. This decision was taken during the Annual General Meeting of the Odisha Cricket Association (OCA) held at the Stadium premises on Sunday. The meeting was held under the chairmanship of OCA President Pranab Prakash Das while Vice-President Pankaj Lochan Mohanty, OCA Secretary

Sanjay Behera and other office bearers of the Association attended the crucial meeting. The Detailed Project Report (DPR) will be prepared by January 2024. However, the association will take a final decision either to demolish the stadium completely or partially. Meanwhile, the process to give a new look to three galleries of the Stadium has already been started. The meeting also decided to apprise the BCCI regarding the exclusion of the stadium from hosting international matches. The association, however, is hopeful that the Barabati stadium would get matches in

future on rotation basis. This apart, the junior and senior inter-club matches being held at the venue annually will now be organised once in two years, informed OCA Secretary Sanjay Behera. To promote grassroots level players, various competitions like inter-school, and inter-district schools will be organized by the OCA in a regular interval, he added. The OCA President has accepted almost all proposals given by the members at the meeting and informed the general body that he has been elected to the post for development of cricket sports in the State.

The pomp and discipline with which the national celebrations are celebrated in Jammu and Kashmir these days gives us the gist of transformation that the present union territories have come across. Jammu and Kashmir's journey as a terrain of terror to a destination that people would prefer to land as a tourist was an affirmative ascent in its recent history. This was possible with the effective involvement of the Indian army that went out on a hunting expedition tracking the terror hideouts and brilliantly eliminating them. People's support for a positive change could catapult the momentum of its makeover further. But the Supreme Court's upholding the abrogation would exacerbate the dilemma of people and parties that stood for divisiveness and their disenchantment seems to help the government to expose their double standard and hypocrisy and corruption. Whatever, the court came up with its pronouncement at a time when the ruling party and its leadership are in high spirits after winning elections in three crucial states and the national elections almost at a hand-

stretch distance. Critical decisions and drastic transformative changes have been becoming talking points since 2014. The general election that year witnessed the rise of a true nationalist and statesman. The Modi factor came as a sweeping generational change and the impact of its gaining hold on the national arena was unprecedented. Having decimated decades of Congress rule, his rise to the top job was not only an aspirational moment for a huge number of voters who voted for his party but with that began a fresh and defining chapter of nationalism in India with a majoritarian thrust capturing the imagination of a new version of vote bank politics. This had been subdued and pushed hard to insignificance ever since the country jumped into freedom and its Nehruvian Socialism holding its reigns for decades. And the Modi rise had given India a meaningful mandate, the largest one that any political party managed to win from outside the Congress bandwagon. For the Congress, the landslide victory of Rajiv Gandhi in 1984 was the last humongous people's

verdict. The national election after the assassination of Indira Gandhi was principally an exercise of sympathy that the nation remorsefully executed. People voted on the loss that the untimely death of their leader caused but the vacuum was not effectively filled by her son though he enjoyed a landslide victory. The party was later reduced almost to a nominal player that won meager seats and its dominance came clattering down with the saffron storm in 2014. India's enormous exercise of casting the franchise is an example of democracy celebrating its principles with greater assertion of values. Modi's victory in 2014 was criticized as a calamity for India and a blot on its democratic values. This was mainly due to his being cornered with indescribable malignity by a section of the media in India and abroad. A deliberate accusation further castigated him to be the monster ruler who had intentionally given permission for the butchery of Muslims in his home state Gujarat during the post Godhra riots. It

was almost predicted and conceded that Modi by no means would ascend to the top of world's largest democracy. I still remember my conversation with an eccentric traveler from California to India's northeast in 2014. A T-shirt designer, as he introduced him to me during my travels to this area, was on a cycling expedition to one of the most strategically important locations in the state of Arunachal Pradesh along the India-China border. He was firmly convinced of the reasons that he thought would defeat Modi. For him there was not even a microscopic chance for Modi to win the popular mandate. The hate-mongering was deafeningly resolute and potty mouthed sociopaths continued to dehumanize him until the judiciary gave him a clean chit. But Modi's party won 282 of the 543 seats in parliament, reducing its principal opposition the Congress to a mere 44 seats, practically trimming its right to lead the opposition. Probably, Modi's experiment to bank on the

majority sentiments towards the remodeling of a state took an unusual turn. India's clueless colonial masters had decided to divide the country between its Muslim population and the gargantuan Hindu population which the former was terribly intolerant to. But an anglicized Jawaharlal Nehru remained culturally lenient to the colonialist impudence for India's civilizational ethos and had chiseled a secular nation out of an amputated landscape which accommodated Hindus and other Indic religions and a section of the undecided Muslims that refused to migrate to an Islamic Pakistan. The Modi rise in India's electoral spectrum was principally accentuating a fundamental sentiment, a discontent that continued to consume the essential readiness of its electorate to democratically take a revenge on the animalization of a polytheistic religious framework called Hinduism. Aggressively subduing the essential cultural vigor of generations of a subverted Hindu majority, the successive ruling class that followed the

Nehruvian secularism had ruthlessly distorted the values that it preserved for centuries. There has always been a tribe of insinuator successively working to distort, dismantle and disgustingly strangulate its existence in the name of secularism, liberalism and free press. That was the moment when Modi came to the national stage, essentially gaining accolades for the Hindu unity that the post Godhra riots had blessed him with. His performance as a futuristic Chief Minister with development as his mission had further made him electorally unassailable in the Sangh Parivar cohort. Modi's success has multifaceted implications. He facilitated the country with greater quality of development but he did not forget to cement its civilizational existence with universal values that the landscape once projected and propagated. This combination of nationalistic spiritual values with the latest count of scientific temperament was a perfect combination. The values enshrined in India's spiritual texts have found global acceptance with the government officially launching them for international platforms. In his yet another surprising

move, Modi had launched the party's most prominent saffron clad Yogi as the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh. Probably, that was one of the trump cards that Modi's political brilliance exerted with futuristic calculations. Yogi, being voted to power for the second term, has transformed the state into an investment destination and its social ambience of febrile callousness and corruption seem to have almost been rooted out. Modi has not only managed to culturally unite the scattered sentiments of a huge section of the country's population, but he could also help it survive irrespective of dividing factors such as castes and outcries for a head-counting in the name of castes sprung from across the opposition camp. The recent election results could further enhance his image as an ultimate unifier of nationalistic sentiments rising above the pulpit of caste arithmetic.

"False, Baseless": Industrialist Sajjan Jindal On Rape Charge Against Him

Mumbai (KCN) :

Industrialist Sajjan Jindal has been accused of rape by a 30-year-old doctor in Mumbai. The First Information Report -- filed recently following an order by the Bombay High Court -- has accused the JSW Steel chief of rape, criminal intimidation and assault, shows a copy in possession of NDTV. Sajjan Jindal has called the allegations "false and baseless". He told NDTV that he is "committed to providing full cooperation throughout the investigation" but will not comment further since the investigation is on.

The FIR says the doctor had met Mr Jindal in Dubai during a match of the Indian Premier League in October 2021. They had shared a VIP box at the Dubai International Stadium. Later, they had started exchanging phone calls and messages on Whatsapp.

The woman has alleged that Mr Jindal had then insisted on meeting her at a restaurant or some other public place. He expressed a romantic interest in her and sought to spend time with her. He even offered her his credit card details for



personal use, which she had refused. According to the FIR, on December 24, 2021, Mr Jindal had booked a suite in her name at the Taj Lands End hotel in Bandra West. When they met, he had shared his problems with wife Sangeeta Jindal. He also made physical advances, which she had refused. He also promised her help in getting a bungalow, car and business. But when the doctor asked him to legalise their relationship with a registered marriage, Mr Jindal had allegedly refused, citing social norms. Instead, he proposed that live together abroad as husband and wife.

The woman had rejected the illicit proposal. On January 24, 2022, Mr Jindal had sexually assaulted her in the bathroom of the penthouse of JSW Tower and later, he threatened her, she has alleged. The woman also alleged that she suffered emotional and mental pain due to sexual abuse, following which she went to file a complaint in February 2023. But the police had refused to file an FIR, and finally she had to approach the court, she said. She has also alleged that after the complaint with the police was filed, Sajjan Jindal's employees had asked her to withdraw it and offered her money.

New Delhi(KCN): China followed "wolf-warrior diplomacy" and "salami-slicing" tactics with impunity browbeating smaller neighbours and it took the Indian Army to show to the world that "enough is enough" and challenge the "neighbourhood bully", says Gen Manoj Mukund Naravane, the 28th Chief of Army Staff, recounting the Indian response to the Chinese aggression in Eastern Ladakh in 2020.

In his memoirs 'Four Stars of Destiny', Naravane, providing a rare insight into the deadly Galwan Valley clashes, says Chinese President Xi Jinping will not forget June 16 any time soon as China's People's Liberation Army suffered "fatal casualties" for the first time in over two decades in the fighting. Naravane, one of the foremost Army Generals, provided a gripping account of the India-China confrontation before and after the deadly Galwan Valley incident, India's overall response to the Chinese action and how it served as a catalyst to firm up the Army's combat readiness along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). "It was one of the saddest

days of my entire career," says Naravane recalling the death of 20 Army personnel in the Galwan Valley clashes in June 2020.

His tenure as the Army Chief from December 31, 2019 to April 30, 2022 was primarily marked by the Chinese challenges along the contested border as well as the rolling out of long-term reform measures to enhance the combat capabilities of the force. "June 16 is (Chinese President) Xi Jinping's birthday. This is not a day he will forget any time soon. For the first time in over two decades, the Chinese and the PLA had suffered fatal casualties," Naravane writes.

"They had been following wolf-warrior diplomacy and salami-slicing tactics everywhere with impunity, browbeating smaller neighbours like Nepal and Bhutan, while staking their ever-increasing claims in the South China Sea, without having to pay any costs, especially in terms of human lives." "It took India and the Indian Army to show to the world that enough is enough and to challenge the neighbourhood bully." Delving into the overall situation along



the frontier, Naravane, at the same time, suggests having a "non-aggression" pact between the two countries pending the settlement of the overall boundary dispute, saying it would go a long way in restoring confidence and pave the way for de-escalation and de-induction of forces. 'Four Stars of Destiny' published by Penguin Random House India will hit the stands next month. On the Galwan Valley incident, Naravane says it occurred in view of the Chinese PLA refusing to remove two tents that it had erected in Patrolling Point 14 (PP-14), adding following the adversary's refusal, the Indian Army decided to pitch its own tents in the same general area.

The eastern Ladakh border row began in May 2020. Naravane says flag-level meetings had

been continuing at other locations then, including at PP-15 and PP-17A, where troops fell back over agreed distances, thereby reducing the chances of violent face-offs.

"At PP-14, however, whenever we asked the PLA to remove their tents, they kept changing their stance. From 'some more time was needed', to 'we will check with our superiors', to it 'being beyond the mandate of the talks'." "From this stonewalling, it became evident that there had been no intention of removing those tents in the first place. To counter this, we also decided to pitch our own tents in the same general area," he writes.

Naravane says when Indian Army personnel went to pitch the tents, there was a violent reaction from the Chinese side. "Col Santosh Babu,

Commanding Officer of 16 BIHAR, went forward with a small party of troops to attempt to defuse the situation but the PLA were in no mood to relent and attacked the CO's party too," he says. "Thereafter, it became a free-for-all. With darkness setting in, both sides rushed in additional troops and a see-saw engagement continued throughout the night," he recounts.

Although armed, neither side opened fire, instead using batons or clubs and throwing or rolling down stones on each other's positions, he says. The former Army Chief says due to better connectivity on their side, the PLA were able to move troops forward in armoured personnel carriers which changed the balance in their favour.

Naravane says he told then Northern Army Commander Lt Gen YK Joshi during a phone call at 1:30 am on June 16 that the Army must hit back and make the PLA pay the price for their misadventure. "Daylight revealed a not-so-favourable situation." "Few jawans who could not make it back at night or who had been separated started trickling back.

Keonjhar district turns into open-air elephant safari

Keonjhar (KCN): Keonjhar district has turned into an undeclared open-air elephant safari as loss of natural habitat and shortage of food force elephants to stray into human habitats. Marauding elephant herds are wandering in the villages, crossing the roads at their will and destroying crops and properties giving people sleepless nights. They are becoming violent and killing people whenever a face-off occurs. All these have become a regular affair in Keonjhar district. People are gathering in hordes to

drive away pachyderms and watch them crossing the roads. The scenes of elephant herds wandering in villages and crossing the highways have turned Keonjhar district into an open-air elephant safari. Sources said over 150 elephants divided in herds are roaming in various parts of the district after leaving their natural habitats in jungles. The villagers drive away the animals from one village to another or to a jungle to protect their crops and properties. The scene of elephants



running from the villages while being driven away has turned into a spectacle for many. The craze to watch elephants is such that people in urban areas often rush to

villages after learning about the presence of jumbo herds. Many also overlook the risks involved and do not hesitate to click photographs or shoot

videos with the animals in order to post them on their social media handles to garner short-lived fame and appreciation. People also rush to see the elephants

bathing in water bodies. The elephant calves in the herd have become the cynosures of all eyes. The scene of mother elephants walking with their calves with other herd members is another added attraction. The Forest department is keeping track of the movement of the herds and trying to alert the people where there are presence of elephants. The forest officials have urged commuters to allow safe passage to elephant herds when they notice them crossing the highway. They have also been warned not to go near the

elephant and endanger their lives. Without heeding to the warnings, however, people often invite danger and end up losing life by venturing closer to the herd. On the other hand, farmers and people have alleged of inadequate compensation after suffering losses to their crops and properties. An affected farmer and sarpanch Bhagirathi Singh of Maidankel panchayat said crops in several acres of farmland have been destroyed due to elephant menace in Sadar block. The Forest department has been informed but they

have failed to give adequate compensation due to improper assessment. ACF Ashok Das said people are being sensitised not to go near, tease or hurt the elephants. People are compensated after making assessment of their losses. The movement of elephants is regularly being tracked, he said. Durjyodhan Patra of Padmapur village said that earlier they had to visit Nandankanan to watch an elephant but now the giants can be seen on road and various parts of the district.

Odisha: Bid to shut down GEC Mineral Engineering course draws flak



Keonjhar(KCN): A move to shut down the Mineral Engineering course at Government Engineering College in the mineral-rich district of Keonjhar has drawn criticism from various quarters. In view of the interest of Keonjhar district's residents, the state government had launched the degree course in Mineral Engineering at the Government Engineering College in Keonjhar. However, the course is soon going to

be discontinued due to incapability of the college authorities. The decision to drop the course has been taken by the board of governors in the college. This has sparked resentment and tension in the district. Mineral Engineering is a one-of-its-kind course with Keonjhar Government Engineering College being the lone institute in the entire country to provide the degree. No other engineering college in the country has facility for study in this

specialisation. Sources said that the board of governors in the college does not have any member from Keonjhar district. Taking advantage of the situation, the board has sent a letter to the state government urging to shut down the course. The Government Engineering College in Keonjhar has been declared as a centre of excellence. Many students after studying Mineral Engineering course from the college have got into many

established companies in senior positions. Keonjhar, being a mineral-bearing district, must have facility for study in Mineral Engineering, Observers said. The college authorities have decided to shut down the course instead of attracting and encouraging students to enroll in the course. When contacted, Keonjhar Sadar MLA Mohan Majhi said he would complain against the college authorities before the state government.

7% Seek Dental Help



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Barely six to seven per cent of India's population seek the help of a dentist when faced with any dental problem, Dr. Ashok Dhable, Secretary General of the Indian Dental Association (IDA), said. Pointing out that the percentage of people seeking help for dental issues was abysmally low, Dr. Dhable said it needed to be improved to at least 15 per cent. Dr. Dhable, who was speaking at the inaugural program of the 39th state conference of the IDA at Siksha 'O' Anusandhan (SOA) here on Friday,

said children should be taught the need for proper dental care at an early age. Therefore, there is the need for a national school oral health program, he said. Dr. Dibyendu Mazumdar, President of Dental Council of India (DCI), who was the chief guest at the event, said there were 370 dental colleges in India which had more than three lakh dental surgeons. He stressed on the need for a national task force for proper implementation of the dental curriculum. He congratulated SOA for the fine performance of

BCB likely to make changes to selection panel

Dhaka: The Bangladesh Cricket Board is planning to make two changes in the men's selection panel with Abdur Razzak expected to retain his post, Cricbuzz understands. The current national selection panel which includes Minhajul Abedin (chief selector), Habibul Bashar (selector) and Abdur Razzak (selector), will complete its tenure on December 31. Razzak joined the committee in 2021 after Sazzad Ahmed decided to step down from his post and is expected to get another term. Minhajul has been in the selection panel since 2011 but was appointed the chief selector in 2016 while Habibul was previously with the women's selection team but later took the post in the men's panel in 2016. BCB president Nazmul Hasan held an impromptu press conference where he insisted that they are expected to bring changes in the selection panel and that is not due to their performance but considering they've been holding the post for a



Several names came up for discussion in the recent past including renowned cricket coach Nazmul Abedin among others, though his chance looks very slim. Many inside the board argued that national selectors need to be members of the national team, although the BCB president begs to differ. "There is nothing like that (selectors will have to be members of the national team)," Nazmul told reporters at the Sher-e-Bangla National Cricket Stadium. "I will be busy with my election (parliamentary election)

but after the 8th (January), I will return and following my return, there will be a board meeting where we are expecting to make a call on the selectors.

"The change is a natural process because they (selection panel) have been around for a long time. People say a lot of things (about the selection panel) but why they are saying this, they don't know. But it seems all the national selection panel will be responsible for everything."

In the recent past, former skipper Mohammad Ashraful had shown interest to be a part of the

selection panel but it is understood that many members of the board are against it considering his past involvement in fixing. Interestingly, the BCB had earlier appointed Shakib Al Hasan as their all-format skipper although he was banned by the ICC for not reporting multiple corrupt approaches. A member of the board while talking to Cricbuzz on Saturday insisted that Ashrafu's fixing scandal was way bigger than Shakib's case and probably that was the reason for going against him from entering the national selection panel.

A journalist asked Nazmul whether they would consider Ashrafullah and the BCB boss suggested he held the same sentiment as his board members before stating, "We have a committee and that committee will submit names (for the selection panel). They will see who are interested and what their preferences are and later have a discussion with the board and after that, we will select. "To be honest, it is difficult to say who will come but if anyone wants to, he can express his interest and there is no problem with that," he said. Meanwhile, it was learnt that a junior selector claimed TK 3 lakh monthly salary if he has to take up the post of the national selection panel since he will have to give up on his coaching job. The BCB is also planning to bring a former national batter and a former national pacer to the selection panel along with Razzak though a final decision in this regard will be taken in the next board meeting following the approval of the board directors.

New Delhi: Heather Knight, the England skipper, claimed that her team's inability to adapt to the turning conditions on offer at the DY Patil Stadium played a massive role in their defeat in the one-off Test against India. The visitors were bundled out for 136 and 131 respectively in the two innings to hand the hosts the biggest victory in women's Tests - by a margin of 347 runs. Barring Nat-Scieve Brunt, who scored 59 in the first innings, there were no noteworthy contributions with the bat for the visitors in the match which capped off England's tour of India on a rather one-sided note after having started with victories in the first two T20Is on the more batting-friendly conditions at the Wankhede stadium. "It (the pitch) probably deteriorated a bit faster than we expected. It was reasonably good in the first innings to bat on," Knight said on Saturday (December 16) following England's loss. "I think today, they bowled outstandingly and showed us how to bowl in these types of conditions... I think the spin was quite extreme. We learnt a lot from how India played in their first innings and the balance they maintained between attack and defence and trying to put pressure back on the bowlers. We tried to carry that into today but they bowled outstandingly and suited the conditions in how they executed their plans."

Barring the first hour of play on the opening day when the England bowlers managed to dismiss the Indian openers cheaply, the momentum of the match went only one-way away from England through the course of the Test. Four batters stroked

half-centuries on the opening day, ensuring India's dominant start to the home Test - the first in nine years. However, Knight defended the performances of the bowlers and credited the Indian batters for applying themselves well in the conditions. There were a few dropped chances and several balls flying past the fielders which helped India's cause as England could never find their way back in the contest.

"I think we bowled pretty well on the first day and even got those two wickets. We got a few nicks that didn't carry which can be quite soul destroying for the fast bowlers, when your best ball doesn't carry to the slip. We then identified that the wobble ball was more effective and we tried to get as much out of that as we can.

"The pitch deteriorated but our main learning especially for the seamers was to consistently execute. Pooja was an example of that. She was tricky with her wobble ball on a good length and didn't give us too many opportunities to score. The wicket didn't bounce as much as the game went on. Most of the seamers' wickets were lbw or bowled apart from a couple of nicks. Trying to bat out of your crease, trying to counter the seam movement and hit down the ground. For Renuka for example getting onto off stump and dabble outside the line if it doesn't get back in. So yeah, a lot of learning.

"This is the first time we've bowled in a Test match in these conditions. Maybe if we had a two or three match series, we'd be able to

use these lessons and get better. But yeah, I guess we're pretty philosophical on what's happened around this Test match."

Knight believes that even as there is a need for the batters to play spin better in these conditions, which could prove useful in the next year's T20 World Cup, there are unlikely to get such 'extreme conditions'.

"Watching Test match cricket in India is exciting. Things happen very quickly. India is very strong in these conditions. We'll personally take a lot of positives from this tour especially from the T20s with the World Cup coming. We did so well in T20I series, and exposed our youngsters to these kind of conditions in this format. Conditions were super extreme in the Test match. T20s are the main cricket coming up for us and what the world event will be based in so, that takes precedence. She further added

"We've got the T20 World Cup in Bangladesh. The way we played those first two T20Is was brilliant from us. The T20 side is coming together really well. In the last T20, we exposed a few younger players to the mix having won the series and with the Test match coming up. Being in India is a different touring experience. You're spending more time in the hotel because of the humidity. The T20 World Cup in Bangladesh is our next assignment in conditions like this.

"We want to get better. We have a big tournament in Bangladesh and the conditions we might face there and we haven't been there in forever.

Collective effort helps Haryana lift maiden Vijay Hazare title

New Delhi: Abhijeet Tomar's 106 off 109 balls went in vain as Haryana rode on a collective effort with both bat and ball to lift the Vijay Hazare Trophy for the first time. Ankit Kumar's 88 and Ashok Menaria helped them post 287/8. Rajasthan recovered from early wickets to be well placed in the chase but a flurry of wickets meant that they were bowled out for 257 to lose by 30 runs. Sumit Kumar (3-34) did the early damage and then Harshal Patel made amends for an expensive



Sumit bowled a lovely spell with the new ball in the second innings, moving the ball both ways to trouble the Rajasthan top order. He ended up bagging three

wickets in his first three
overs - having Ram
Mohan Chouhan bowled
with an inswinger,
Mahipal Lomror caught-
behind off an outswinger
and then trapping Deepak
Hooda in front with a
straight one - to leave

Rajasthan struggling at 12/3. A 68-run stand between Tomar and Karan Lamba ensued, as Rajasthan looked to get back on track. But Rahul Tewatia broke the partnership with one that sneaked through Lamba and struck timber. Tomar went past fifty and was supported by Kunal Singh Rathore in another promising partnership that raised Rajasthan's hopes. Both batters also struck maximums as they tried to transfer the pressure onto Haryana. Harshal Patel ended up conceding 15 in an over,

which included a six for Rathore and two fours for Tomar. Rajasthan went past 150 in the 31st over but the required rate rose over seven. Rajasthan, though, made good progress in the next few overs, with the pair raising a century partnership. Tomar reached three-figures with a six off Sumit in the 36th over and in the same over, Rathore brought up a 45-ball fifty with a four. Rajasthan reached 200 by the end of the 37th, bringing the equation down to 88 off 78.

Not a lot will change about how we want to play ODI cricket: KL Rahul

New Delhi: After a heartbreaking loss in the 2023 World Cup final, KL Rahul was spotted on his haunches as the Australian team celebrated amidst the sound of silence at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad. Cut to the present and he enters a seemingly contextless ODI series as captain since that fateful night in Ahmedabad. Speaking on the eve of the first ODI against South Africa in Johannesburg, Rahul was adamant that India's way of playing ODI cricket would not change. He also acknowledged that the new faces would take time to find their feet, and it was unrealistic to expect them to perform like proven stalwarts did at the World Cup. "I don't think a lot will change in terms of how we want to play ODI

cricket. There are new faces, so to expect them to play the role that Rohit Sharma or Virat Kohli played in the World Cup will be too soon," said Rahul, protective of the youngsters' headspace. "You have to give them time and make them feel comfortable so there's no added pressure. "How we played in the World Cup was very good and very exciting. We need to figure out what works for this Indian team in these conditions, to try and adapt. It's important for me to give them the confidence that their game is good enough even at this level and enjoy their cricket, and not really worry about the results. "I think it's too early to look at the bigger picture when it comes to ODI cricket. The focus

on the T20 World Cup, which is round the corner and there's not a lot of cricket left. The focus for the last 2-3 years was the ODI World Cup. Now it has shifted to T20 cricket and Test cricket always remains very important for our country, so the focus is on the Test matches as well."

Rahul showed confidence in the ability and skill set of the pace bowling attack, terming them as "proven performers" under pressure, against world-class talent in the IPL and first-class cricket, and that they only lacked international experience in foreign conditions.

"They are young in terms of international cricket but they have played first-class cricket and IPL. They have played under pressure and have been able to handle pressure," said Rahul, in



defence of the tag of 'inexperience'. "They aren't an inexperienced bowling attack. They are skilled and proven performers. Arshdeep and Mukesh have done well in the T20s. They'll be keen to take this opportunity and be the senior bowler whenever they get the chance."

Asked about his role as a wicketkeeper and middle-order batter, Rahul was positive that it was the way forward for him in ODI cricket, and that he was happy to play the role in other formats too, if that is what the team required of him.

"My focus is on this ODI

series, and yes I'll be keeping and batting in the middle order," said Rahul. "I'll be happy to take up that role in Test matches. I've always been hoping to accept new roles. I'm happy to do whatever the coach and captain ask of me, and if that's the role that the team sees me in."

during the Tests, I'm happy to do that. "Unfortunately I have missed a lot of cricket because of injuries and I'd like to make the most of my time and play as many games in whatever role is expected of me. For me the team comes first, and when we started playing the game, one of the first things taught to us was, 'This is a team game'. Your position is yours and you have to be flexible and adaptable and do your best for the team." With regard to the hectic schedule, Rahul admitted that it was the reality of the times we live in and that the focus remains on the Test series. "The schedule is such that not every player is available for every format and unfortunately the coach also has a bigger responsibility with the Test series being

the focus," said Rahul. "But that gives some of our players a good opportunity to take up extra responsibility, to try and play our best cricket. Everyone in the squad is deserving of the call-up to the national team. The selectors have shown faith and given them this opportunity to compete hard and win the series."

The next ODI World Cup is in South Africa, and for India, it would be ideal that the best of the youth in the country get a taste of the conditions where they will play at World Cup, four years from now. It could be a mere coincidence that India's first ODI after the World Cup final loss is in the country where the next ODI World Cup is to be held. However, it does confirm one thing - it's not just another bilateral ODI series.
