Former Koraput MP Jayaram Pangi Joins Congress



Bhubaneswar, (KCN): Former Koraput MP Jayaram Pangi today joined the Congress party in the presence of OPCC President Sharat Patnaik at Congress Bhawan in Bhubaneswar.

Senior Congress leaders including Bijay Patnaik, Niranjan Patnaik and Prasad Harichandan were present on this occasion.

A prominent Tribal leader, Jayaram Pangi said that he joined this party to strengthen the Congress and overthrow the BJD government. To save the state, he urged the people of the state to oust BJD in the

upcoming elections. After joining Congress the ex-MP said, "Congress will come to power in Odisha & Congress is also the most preferred party of the tribal people of the State". Pangi also said the BRS couldn't take shape in Odisha. Earlier, Jayaram Pangi was in Telangana Chief Minister KCR's Bharat Rashtra Samiti (BRS). Before that, he was in BJP, BJD and Janata Dal. He was elected to the Legislative Assembly four times and once to the Lok Sabha. In 1977, Jayaram Pangi was first elected to the Legislative

Assembly from Pottangi on a Janata Dal ticket. In 1990, he went to the Assembly for the second time on a Janata Dal ticket from Pottangi Assembly Constituency. In 2000 and 2004, he was elected to the Legislative Assembly from the Pottangi seat on the BJD ticket. In the 2009 general election, Jayaram Pangi was nominated by BJD from Koraput Lok Sabha seat and he won the election. In 2017, he left BJD and joined BJP. In the 2019 general election, he was defeated from the Koraput Lok Sabha seat on a BJP ticket.

Earthquake Of 5.6 Magnitude Hits Bangladesh, Tremors Felt In Kolkata

21 Bills To Be Taken Up In Winter Session Of Parliament

New Delhi, (KCN): A total of 21 bills including two financial bills are likely to be taken up during the upcoming Winter Session of the Parliament.

"We are bringing in 19 Bills and two are financial items. There are a total of 21 items. The three bills are from the Home Ministry. There is a bill on Central University, constitutional order," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi said.

The list was released on the day when an all-party meeting was held on Saturday, ahead of the commencement of the

Winter Session on Monday.

The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and the Bhartiya Sakshya Adhiniyam are among the key bills that will be taken up by the Parliament this session.

Other Bills that will be taken up include the Repealing and Amending Bill (as passed by the Lok Sabha), the Advocates (Amendment) Bill (as passed by the Rajya Sabha) and the Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill (as passed by the Rajya Sabha).


Union Minister Pralhad Joshi said that the Winter session will commence on December 4 and will conclude on December 22. "There will be 15 sittings in a period of 19 days," he said. Speaking about the all-party meeting, Pralhad Joshi said, "30 leaders from 23 parties were present in today's all-party meeting under the

chairmanship of Rajnath Singh. We have received several suggestions."

The Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Castes Order (Amendment) Bill, Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Tribes Order (Amendment) Bill, Jammu and Kashmir Reservation (Amendment) Bill and the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation (Amendment) Bill will also be taken up.

Among Financial Business, there will be a Presentation, Discussion and Voting on the First Batch of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2023-24 and the introduction, consideration and passing of the related Appropriation Bill. dropped a shocking photo of her injured face. Her post showed her injured eye, and visibly swollen and discoloured face. The actress, in a series of posts, alleged that she was attacked by a mysterious man in the middle of the night and suspects a 'Bigg Boss Tamil 7' connection. She alleged that the attacker

was apparently unhappy with the fact that she supported the red card issued to Pradeep in the Kamal Haasan-hosted reality show. 'Bigg Boss Tamil' season seven is currently in full swing on Vijay TV and Disney Plus Hotstar. Vanitha's daughter Jovika is also one of the contestants. Vanitha,

who reviews the show on a daily basis, had a late-night dinner and went to park her car at her sister's place when the unfortunate incident happened.

"Ni support vera (You escaped) and hit me hard on my face and fled away. I was in so much pain bleeding in my face and yelling. No one around was around. I am I called my sister to come down she urged me to go report this incident to police but I told her I lost trust in the process (sic)", she further wrote.

She continued, "I took first aid and left home with rage and not able to identify my attacker. He laughed like a lunatic which haunts my ears. Taking a break from

everything as I am not in a physical condition to appear on screen. For those who support disturbed ppl danger is just a feet away (sic)." Vanitha, who has been active on social media, continues to express her thoughts and comments on the controversies around the 'Bigg Boss 7 Tamil'. 

Why the Dream of Violence-free Women's Society Unfulfilled?



'International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women' is celebrated every year on 25 November by the United Nations to eradicate increasing incidents of violence, exploitation and harassment against women all over the world, and this is a serious problem plaguing the entire world. The United Nations organizes many events that highlight the need to do something more to eliminate this type of violence against women. Women's groups and voluntary organizations undertake various initiatives to highlight the worrying situation of women in society, and the resulting adverse effects on women's physical, mental and psychological health. Many women's rights activists and organizations support feminist movements on this day to free the world from violence against women.

The Day also honours Mirabal Sisters, whose three sisters, Patria Mercedes Mirabal, María Argentina Minerva Mirabal, and Antonia María Teresa Mirabal, were brutally murdered on this day in 1960 on the orders

of political activist Dominican ruler Rafael Trujillo (1930–1961). These three sisters had strongly opposed Trujillo's dictatorship. Women's rights supporters and activists have celebrated this day since 1981 to commemorate the death of these three sisters. With the development in the country and the world, instead of subsiding, the violent thoughts towards women have been emerging in newer forms. To overcome this violent social thinking and ideology, International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women is a day related to the existence and identity of women, which gives the message of consciousness of responsibility, a call to develop a new civilized and decent thinking towards women. This day guards those crossroads from where there are possibilities of deviation of life ideals and violence against women; it stops those aspirations whose violent pace is very fast, but which reflects the wild race of society without any aim. One of the objectives of celebrating this day is to make resolutions to control increasing violence against women. This day is a unique medium to make women powerful, progressive and cultured.

Every hour more than five women or girls are murdered by someone in their own families. Nearly one in three women has been a victim of physical and sexual violence at least once in her life. No less than 86 percent of women and girls live in countries without legal protection against gender-based violence. Violence against women and girls is one of the most prevalent and widespread human rights violations in the world. This crisis has intensified in a variety of settings, including workplace and online spaces, which is further exacerbated by after-effects of pandemic, conflicts, and climate change. It is estimated that 35 percent of women worldwide have experienced physical and sexual violence by a non-partner at some point in their lives. However, some national studies show that 70 percent of

women have experienced physical and sexual violence from an intimate partner in their lifetime. Adult women account for 51 percent of all human trafficking victims detected worldwide. These crimes include rape, domestic violence, assault, dowry harassment, acid attack, kidnapping, human trafficking,

cyber-crime and workplace harassment etc. According to NCRB data, a total of 32,559 rapes took place in India in 2017, in which 93.1 percent of the accused were close relatives. According to the report of National Crime



from school by reading and listening to academic lectures. Our intellect makes us what we are. Our rational mind makes us look externally and not internally. When we use intellect, it involves an effort that puts us through a lot of thinking and questioning, which is a functional aspect of intellect. Without this, knowledge would not have flourished. We would not have seen the phenomenal knowledge that has given us many things, including comforts. So, we cannot speak and write spontaneously. We think before we speak and write, having to exert considerable effort and energy.

The second is imagination, another

dimension of the mind that borders on emotion. It is creative and expresses as art. It is also a way of communication, but it occurs through symbols and imagery. Intellect has given us knowledge and the imagination of art. Imagination is more important than intellect, for intellect is limited to knowing and understanding, while imagination embraces the entire world and beyond. The more one imagines, the stronger the mind gets and one can control one's thoughts better. The power of imagination is the key to innovation.

Sometimes, the intellect collides with imagination to invent. This happens in science. Most

inventions in science have happened this way. Pure intellectual inquiry can result in the culmination of ideas. But imagination makes ideas new, hitherto unknown. Our ego and makes us more self-centred. It is the intellect transformed into the ego that

performs the twin functions of speaking and writing through the medium – the body. Similarly, imagination in which there is a presence of ego that prompts creation cannot be ruled out.

But there is another thing also that prompts and guides us

In the realms of intellect and imagination, we have learnt that intellect and imagination are mere prompters and the body performs the twin functions.

This can happen only when we establish perfect harmony with the Prakriti by our Jnana nishta, which refers to self-knowledge that is fully assimilated and established in our living. It brings us closer to Prakriti. Then we become instruments in her hands. It is then that Prakriti speaks and acts through us. Our speaking and writing become spontaneous and natural. We do not exert any effort. For this reason, sages speak spontaneously, without volition. They do not use intellect and imagination, unlike us.

Ayodhya Airport To Be Ready By December 15, In Time For Ram Temple Opening

New Delhi (KCN): Over a month before the inauguration of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday announced that the first phase of the international airport in the city will be ready by December 15. The airport will be called the Maryada Purushottam Shri Ram International Airport and will be able to accommodate Boeing 737, Airbus 319, and Airbus 320 aircraft.

The chief minister, who visited the airport site with Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia and Minister of State for Civil Aviation, VK Singh, said Ayodhya is emerging as "an epitome of New India", aligning with Prime



Minister Modi's vision, according to a statement by the Uttar Pradesh government. After holding review meetings with key officials, Yogi Adityanath said, "Initially, Ayodhya had a modest airstrip spanning

178 acres, but now it is being built as a major international airport." He said the state government has provided 821 acres of land for the project and work is being undertaken on a war footing under the supervision of the

Airport Authority of India. This, he said, was part of his government's commitment to ensuring the development of Ayodhya as well as providing essential infrastructure to the city's residents. Mr Scindia said efforts have been

made to reflect the cultural ethos of Ayodhya in the airport. A 65,000 sq ft terminal is under construction in the first phase, with a capacity to handle 2-3 flights per hour. Work on a 2,200-metre runway is also underway to facilitate the landing of aircraft like the Boeing 737, Airbus 319, and Airbus 320. The minister said the length of the runway will be extended to 3,700 metres in the second phase, allowing wide-bodied aircraft like the Boeing 787 Dreamliner and the Boeing 777 to land directly in Ayodhya. The area of the terminal will be 5 lakh square feet. PM Modi will attend the inauguration of the Ram Temple, which is scheduled for January 22.

After Peace Deal, Manipur's Oldest Armed Group Welcomed At Kangla Palace Grounds

Imphal (KCN): The Manipur government today welcomed members of the state's oldest valley-based armed group that has signed a peace deal, and expressed hope that more groups would lay down arms to join the peace process in the strategic border state. Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh led a ceremony and organised a mass lunch at the grounds of the Kangla Palace - the seat of power of the past Manipur kingdom - in the heart of the state capital Imphal, where every member of the United National Liberation Front (UNLF) of the Pamei faction also shook his hand. "We are



looking forward to other valley-based groups to join the peace process so that a solution towards peace can be brought to Manipur. The UNLF is a 60 years old organisation that never agreed to talk,

but this time they have repented in Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji, so it's a major achievement," Mr Singh said. The UNLF had been fighting a guerrilla war for a sovereign Manipur as the

group - similar to other valley-based banned organisations like the People's Liberation Army (PLA) - considered illegal the merger of the pre-Independence Manipur kingdom with India.

Retired Judges Have A Tight Fist Grip On Arbitral System: Vice-President

Danish Ali Writes To Speaker On Mahua Moitra Ethics Panel Meetings

New Delhi: BSP MP Danish Ali on Saturday claimed that the report of the Lok Sabha Ethics Committee in the "cash-for-query" allegation against Mahua Moitra had a full paragraph that purportedly refers to his conduct during the panel's meetings and urged Speaker Om Birla to get it deleted before its tabling in the House.

The report of the Ethics Committee recommending the expulsion of Trinamool Congress MP Moitra will be tabled in the Lok Sabha on Monday. In a letter to Mr Birla, Mr Ali, who is a member of the ethics panel, cited rules to state that the chairman of the committee is not empowered to mention in a committee report about any individual member or his conduct or the opinion expressed by the member or members in the committee meeting.

"I have noticed that the recent report by the ethics committee named 'cash-for-query' contains some shocking and completely unwarranted facts about me. I would like to draw your kind attention to the fact that there is a full paragraph

in the report which is purportedly referring to my conduct during the meetings..." the BSP MP said in his letter to Mr Birla.



"As a matter of fact and in law that it is completely beyond the jurisdiction of the hon'ble chairman of the committee to have inserted that offending paragraph," he said and demanded that the paragraph about him must be deleted before the report is presented in the House.

Posting his letter to Mr Birla on X, Mr Ali said, "Lok Sabha Ethics panel, while examining cash-for-query allegations, has gone beyond its remit to comment on my objections during meeting. It seems by targeting me a message is being sent that no member should speak out against ruling party. This amounts to throttling opposition voice."

According to the agenda papers circulated by the Lok Sabha Secretariat, Ethics Committee chairperson Vinod Kumar Sonkar will lay on the table of the House

77 People Who Went Missing In Sikkim Flood Presumed Dead



Gangtok (KCN): The 77 people who went missing in the flash flood in Sikkim have been presumed dead as they could not be found even after two months of the disaster, Chief Secretary VB Pathak said on

Saturday. To help their families get various kinds of benefits, including compensation, it has been decided to follow the procedure adopted during natural disasters in Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, and settle the matter, he told reporters.

A total of 77 people went missing in the flash flood that struck the state on October 4. Two bodies were later found, but their identities could not be ascertained, he said. The state government is providing compensation assistance of ₹ 4 lakh, while ₹ 2 lakh is being provided from the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

"We have decided to adopt the procedures followed in Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh to settle the matter of missing persons," VB Pathak said. The families will be able

to avail of the benefits only after the issuance of the death certificates, he said.

"We expect to settle all missing persons' cases by January," he added. The families will first need to file a missing complaint at the police station, and then it will be thoroughly examined at different levels before being published in newspapers, social media and government gazette as per process, VB Pathak said.

In case, a person from outside Sikkim went missing, the family has to lodge a complaint with the police in their state, which will then be transferred here for examination, he said. The flash flood in the Teesta river basin created chaos in the state on October 4, killing at least 46 people, besides the 77 missing persons.

second ten-fer in Tests. New Zealand began the day on 113/7 chasing 332 for an unlikely victory. Mitchell, who got past fifty early in the day, kept the Bangladesh spinners at bay and received some support from Ish Sodhi as they batted together for 15 overs. This was the most deliveries spent at the crease by a pair in this innings as they tried to stonewall Bangladesh's path to victory. But the partnership came to an end when Mitchell, who was happy to sweep and reverse-sweep, found deep backward square leg to give Nayeem Hasan his second wicket.

New Zealand skipper Tim Southee and Sodhi then decided to go on the attack, with the former even coming striking sixes off Taijul and Mehidy Hasan Miraz. Sodhi, meanwhile, took a review to reverse an onfield decision when he was given out caught at bat-pad off Nayeem. The ninth wicket pair added 46 runs in quick time but the association was ended by Taijul who had Southee caught in the deep attempting a pull. The left-arm spinner finished it off with the wicket of Sodhi as Bangladesh wrapped it up inside the first session

Taijul Islam, who dismissed the cream of New Zealand's batting, with the other bowlers complementing the spinner well. Barring some resistance from Mitchell, there was

there was nothing great about the visiting team's batting effort as they wilted under the spin pressure and were reduced to 102/7. Despite the fight from Mitchell on the final day, Bangladesh completed the job in the first session to take a 1-0 lead in the two match series.

Dhaka: Tim Southee, the New Zealand Test captain, pointed out that the ability of the Bangladesh bowlers to sustain the pressure for longer periods, coupled with their accuracy, was the chief reason for the visiting side going down by 150 runs in the opening Test in Sylhet. Needing 332 for victory, the visiting side ended up getting bowled out for only 181 as Bangladesh registered their maiden Test win over New Zealand at home.

"I think you look at the way that the Bangladesh bowlers were able to apply pressure for a long period of time. I think we did it in periods, but we probably didn't do it for

long enough. And then, as a batting unit, you're always looking at partnerships," Southee said at the post-match press conference. "I think the Bangladesh bowlers bowled well, and were very accurate. And in the way they bowl and the style they bowl, we know that over here in this part of the world, as the Test moves on, it tends to get harder to bat, it tends to take a little bit more turn and a little bit more variable bounce. Looking back, you just need a couple of partnerships, and with the ball, we were probably a little bit off in terms of our ability to build pressure for long periods of time." Southee also acknowledged a key role

played by Najmul Hossain Shanto, who struck a century in the second innings which set the platform for Bangladesh to be able to post a steep target for New Zealand. "I think Shanto's innings was a great innings, and one that obviously a very timely one as well, the situation of the game, so, there's many things you can look back on and as a side, you're just looking to improve and hopefully, learn from this and move forward in a few days time," he said. When asked if New Zealand could have counter-attacked to throw the Bangladesh bowlers off their rhythm, Southee said each batters had their own methods and that it was all about placing the

trust in their different styles.

"I think it comes back to the nature of the play. I think Kane Williamson, he likes to absorb pressure in different ways to someone like Daryl Mitchell. So I think it's about trusting your own style and the only way you go about it. If you look at Shanto's method, it is different to someone like Mominul. So, it's about how you go about it and trusting your way."

New Zealand have started their campaign in this World Test Championship cycle with a loss but Southee is confident that New Zealand can put it behind them and come up with an improved performance in the second and final Test which will be played in Dhaka from December 6.

"I think you're just looking to keep learning, keep looking to improve your game. We'll look back on this and we'll reflect on the last five days. And we'll pick ourselves up and we'll go again in a few days' time. We know it's a challenging place to play cricket. And I think we just got to be better for longer and in all areas of the game."

Raipur, (KCN): Matthew Hayden called the fireworks in Raipur "like New Years' Eve" but it was really the venue celebrating an unassailable 3-1 series lead for a young Indian side. Hurricane knocks by Rinku Singh (46 off 29) and Jitesh Sharma (35 off 19) took India to 174/9 before the spinners came to the party in the most bowler-friendly pitch of the series so far as the hosts registered a comfortable 20-run victory over Australia. It marks a winning start for Suryakumar Yadav the captain who's all set to lead India's T20I side in South Africa next month. India's spinners make a difference

Slight grip in the surface, big boundaries and little to no dew. The three factors came together for Axar Patel and Ravi Bishnoi, both of whom returned combined figures of 8-0-33-4. "We didn't play spin very well," was the succinct assessment from Australia captain Matthew Wade at the post-match presentation. The effort by the spinners was in stark contrast with the Australian counterparts,

whose nine overs returned 2 for 76. Three of the four wickets picked by the Indian spinners were by Axar and it included the big wicket of hard-hitting Travis Head, who was foxed by some nice drift away from him. Axar's other two wickets were Aaron Hardie and Ben McDermott, both bowled. As far as Bishnoi was concerned, he was once again called to bowl in the PowerPlay and struck the first blow for India, this time with his first delivery of the match by going past Josh Philippe's sweep. India wobbled... but lower middle-order to the rescue

India, asked to bat once again, were off to another good start, putting fifty runs on the board inside the PowerPlay thanks to Yashasvi Jaiswal's intent and Ruturaj Gaikwad's steadiness. But 50/0 soon became 63/3 when they lost Shreyas Iyer and Suryakumar Yadav in the space of three balls. That's when Rinku walked out to the crease and did his thing, this time a bit earlier than

he's used to. First, he added 48 runs for the fourth wicket with Ruturaj Gaikwad and then put together 56 runs for the fifth wicket with Jitesh Sharma, both partnerships ensuring that India weren't too held back after losing their captain and vice-captain in quick time. Another special innings from Rinku then? 100 percent. A new situation but the same old Rinku. His knock came with some incredible shots as usual, one of the highlights being a switch-hit against Matthew Short. But there was also a massive six over long-on, when he charged and swiped at Ben Dwarshuis like you'd at a spinner. What about Jitesh? Jitesh, who came in for Ishan Kishan and took the gloves, was at his intent best in his first opportunity this series, hitting his fourth delivery for a six and taking heavy toll on the loose deliveries bowled by debutant Chris Green and Aaron Hardie. He got out to a full toss though, his wicket being first of the five wickets that India would lose in the space of nine balls.

Rinku fell to a yorker from Jason Behrenhoff but he and Jitesh had ensured that India had a fighting total on the board. Was it close in the end? Not really. Australia needed 67 runs from the last five overs and the conditions for chasing weren't as easy as the first three T20Is, but that said, Guwahati and what Glenn Maxwell did to India was always looming large. And of course Matthew Wade was still at the crease, needing no invitation to dispatch a no-ball from Mukesh Kumar from a six. It didn't help that Matthew Short was dropped by Mukesh, a catch that was more keeper's than him. But Deepak Chahar conceded only six runs in the 17th over along with picking the wicket of Matthew Short with a slower delivery, setting up the stage for Avesh Khan to come in and bowl two of the last three overs for 1/17.

Dravid contract extended till June; to be revisited after T20 World Cup

NEW DELHI: Rahul Dravid's contract as the head coach of the Indian team has been extended until the conclusion of the Twenty20 World Cup, effective immediately. He will accompany the Twenty20 team to South Africa, departing as early as December 5. Sources familiar with the negotiations between Dravid and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) over the past few days have confirmed the duration of the extension. Dravid has been informed that his contract will undergo a review after the T20

World Cup in the Caribbean and the US. The T20 World Cup is scheduled to commence on June 3 and conclude on June 30. Consequently, Dravid's extended tenure will run until the end of June. Similar terms are expected to apply to other support staff members for now. The extension was never in doubt from the BCCI's perspective, especially following India's commendable performance in the World Cup, where they showcased a distinctive brand of cricket, the primary focus was on

obtaining Dravid's consent.

It is known that Dravid was initially a reluctant coach, requiring some convincing. While there is a possibility that Dravid may not accept an extension post the Twenty20 World Cup, members of his support staff may be considered for further extension. The BCCI has, for now, bought some time on this matter. The selection committee is scheduled to meet on Thursday to finalise the squads for the upcoming South Africa series. The



meeting will take place in Delhi on Thursday morning, with Ajit Agarkar's committee expected to select teams for all formats -- T20Is, ODIs, and Tests. India are set to play three T20Is, three ODIs, and two Tests from December 10 to January 7. It is likely that most players from the current T20I side that is playing against Australia will be retained for the shortest format, and the majority of players who featured in the World Cup, with a few exceptions, will find a

place in the ODIs side. There are speculations that Virat Kohli might skip the ODIs which appear true, but sources close to him have denied suggestions that he will abandon white ball cricket for an indefinite period. The leadership for the ODI side is not clear, and it remains uncertain whether Rohit Sharma will lead; there is a possibility that he might opt out. However, Rohit is expected to lead in the two Tests in India. Currently, the captain is overseas and was unavailable for comment.
