Odisha SRC Asks Collectors For Assessment Of Damage To Crops Due To Cyclone Michuang-Induced Rain

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) on Wednesday asked the District collectors for an immediate assessment of damage to crops due to rain triggered by Cyclone Michuang.

SRC Satyabrata Sahu, IAS has written to all Collectors regarding the submission of a report on crop damage due to Cyclone "MICHAUNG".

According to the SRC, widespread rain has been observed across that state during the last couple of days under the influence of Cyclone "MICHAUNG", which might have caused damage to standing Kharif crops & horticulture crops.

To ameliorate the sufferings of the affected farmers, Agricultural Input Subsidy (AIS), as per norms of the State Disaster Response Fund, will be provided to farmers sustaining crop loss of 33% and above. The SRC urged the District Collectors to conduct field-level crop loss assessment through a joint inquiry by the officials of the Revenue & DM Department and Agriculture & FE Dept through eye estimation to ascertain the crop area damaged of 33% & above and submit ULB/ Block/ GP/Village wise report as per the format enclosed by 12.12.2023 positively.

While assessing the extent of crop loss, the land schedule/RoR of affected farmers should be verified by Bhulekh. Collectors will accord approval of crop loss (farmer-wise extent of crop area damaged as assessed) and intimate requirement of funds for disbursement of AIS as

admissible. "Geo-tagged and time-stamped photographs of the damaged crop area must be taken during assessment and preserved in the Case Records. The Supervising Officers (Sub-Collector/ Tehsildar/ Addl. Tehsildar/ DAO/ BAO) shall conduct test checks to ensure the correctness of the assessment and shall append a certificate to that effect on the damage reports submitted to Collectors for approval. It is made clear that the crop loss/ area of crop loss already reported as affected by floods & heavy rain during the current year shall not be included in the current assessment," the letter further read.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to visit Tamil Nadu Thursday to assess flood situation

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will visit Tamil Nadu Thursday to assess the flood situation in the state and hold a meeting with Chief Minister M K Stalin, sources said.

Singh, who will travel to Tamil Nadu as a representative of the central government, will conduct an aerial survey of the flood-hit areas. The defence minister will visit Tamil Nadu to see

the damage caused by the recent floods besides holding a meeting with the chief minister, the sources said.

Officials from the Union Home Ministry will accompany the defence minister during his trip.



Jallianwala Bagh Massacre

INTRODUCTION

The Jallianwala Bagh massacre marked a turning point in India's struggle for Independence. A memorial was set up by the Government of India in 1951 at Jallianwala Bagh to commemorate the spirit of Indian revolutionaries and the people who lost their lives in the brutal

the events preceding it. The Indian National Congress had assumed self-governance would be granted once WWI ended but the Imperial bureaucracy had other plans.

WHAT LED TO THE JALLIANWALA BAGH MASSACRE

The Rowlatt Act (Black Act) was passed on March 10, 1919, prohibiting Gandhi from entering Punjab and to arrest him if he disobeyed the orders.

Sir Michael O'Dwyer, the Lieutenant Governor of Punjab (1912-1919), suggested that Gandhi be deported to Burma but this was opposed by his fellow officials as they felt it might instigate the public.

Commission and highlights the mindset of the British authorities: "He (Irving) was directed by the Government of Sir Michael O'Dwyer to deport Dr Kitchlew and Satyapal. He knew that such an act would lead to a popular outburst. He also knew that none of these popular leaders favoured violence. He invited the two gentlemen to his house on the morning of April 10th and they unsuspectingly responded to the call no doubt relying on his honour as an Englishman. But after they had been under his roof for half an hour as his guests, they were caught hold of, and removed towards Dharmasala under police escort! Mr Irving told this story without showing any sign of having done an act which very few Englishmen would care to do."

On April 10, 1919, the infuriated protesters marched to the Deputy Commissioner's residence to demand the release of their two leaders. Here they were fired upon without any provocation. Many people were wounded and killed.

The protestors retaliated with lathis and stones and attacked any European who came in their way.

However, a counter-narrative is provided by the 'Lokasangraha', a weekly published out of Bombay, which denies claims of severe harm, stating instead that the wounds inflicted were infact minimal.

APRIL 13, 1919 - JALLIANWALA BAGH MASSACRE
After passing the Rowlatt Act, the Punjab Government set out to suppress all opposition. On April 13, 1919, the public had gathered to celebrate Baisakhi. However, the British point of view, as seen from the documents present in the National Archives of India, indicates that it was a political gathering.

Inspite of General Dyer's orders prohibiting unlawful assembly, people gathered at Jallianwala Bagh, where two resolutions were to be discussed, one condemning the firing on April 10 and the other requesting the authorities to release their leaders.

Udayagiri of Jajpur city are world visible. Where many tourists and Buddhist monk also come from every corner of the world. 





Is Artificial Intelligence a danger to humanity?



research. The other term I wish to briefly introduce is the Turing test, named after Alan Turing, who postulated that if a machine can engage in a conversation with a human without being detected as a machine, it has demonstrated human intelligence. The development of devices like Alexa and software such as ChatGPT are probably a result of researchers trying to meet the criteria for the Turing test.

First, a little understanding of AI is in order. AI, in its current avatar, is nothing more than sophisticated pattern recognition. The programs look for patterns in consumer behaviour, in speech, in text, in photographs, in medical diagnostic scans, etc. The software is "trained" to recognise patterns using a very large database of words, pictures, numbers, and scans. For example, if a customer tends to purchase certain products from a retail outlet on a regular basis, AI will be able to detect this purchasing pattern and the customer can be sent customised mailings/ ads that match his/her preferences. When it comes to facial recognition, the

picture is divided into a number of dots or pixels. The software analyses the pixels to determine patterns which give information about facial features. Then the software would

make mistakes due to gaps and shortcomings in the data used in the training. These mistakes have occurred in facial recognition in the US

used by the program. This does not allow us to have an audit trail. Second, people place very great faith in output from software and do not question it, assuming that

would free the human to add greater value by providing inputs that computers cannot. A good example of this is the use of auto pilot in airplanes. The longest, and the

automobile, or even the computer. Each innovation has resulted in the elimination of the drudgery of repetitive human tasks, whether physical, or mental. In 1870, agricultural workers comprised half of all workers in the US; in 1900, about one-third of all workers; and in 1950, less than a fifth of all workers. Today the number of agricultural workers is around one percent of all workers. The reason for this reduction is an increase in mechanisation and farm sizes over this period.

The question that

ought to be asked is

not whether technology displaced people; it certainly did. Rather we should be asking whether people would like to do the work being done by machines today for what consumers would be willing to pay for it. The answer, arguably, would be a no. Similar scenarios have been observed in non-physical work situations such as calculating, accounting, etc. where computers have effectively replaced humans, and rightly so. How many people today would enjoy adding numbers all day long?

There are several

human jobs that are ripe for automation. One of the most denigrating and dangerous jobs in India is that of manual scavenging. Would an AI powered solution not be a great way to eliminate the risk of death that manual scavengers face today. There can be many other such jobs which should not be done by humans. The rule that Japanese companies, such as Toyota, use is if a task is dirty, difficult, or dangerous, it is a good candidate for automation. To this list we can also add boring and repetitive, with no value added.

In conclusion, I feel that both the hype and the fear attributed to AI is overdone. If the test of AI is that it should be able to mimic a human, we need to remember that humans can make mistakes and computers cannot. At the same time humans can find an opportunity failure or mistake, such as the discovery of penicillin. A computer cannot do that because it has to be told what to look for. Ultimately, humans decide what AI should be used for, not the other way around. Let us do this judiciously.

compare the pattern it has been trained on with the pattern on a photograph to determine if the two photographs are of the same individual. The accuracy, or correctness of the answers developed by AI is dependent on the data used to train it. Training is done by feeding a large amount of data into the software, then letting the software answer the question that is being asked. By providing human feedback regarding the accuracy of the answer, the software gets "trained" so that it can improve its ability to decipher the pattern on its next attempt. There is ample evidence of AI

where the program has incorrectly identified an individual as a suspect in a crime not committed by him/her. There are several examples of AI programs showing clear bias based on race, gender, age, etc. when the database used to train the software has been deficient or biased. Irrespective of the sophistication of the software, none of them are 100% reliable. Some people may say that neither are humans. There are two major dangers in letting a software make decisions. First, most AI software is like a black box. It is not possible to question the logic

computers cannot make mistakes like humans. But as I have mentioned, there have been several instances where AI has made an error. It would be incorrect to completely hand over the responsibility of an entire human task to a computer program, especially when we are not sure of the reliability of the program. If the error results in a wrong conviction of a person, the consequences are huge from a human perspective. Any technological development has led to reduction in human labour. Whether it was the steam engine, the tractor, the

CBI CONDUCTS SEARCHES AT AROUND 13 LOCATIONS IN WEST BENGAL & KARNATAKA IN AN ON-GOING INVESTIGATION OF A CASE RELATED TO ALLEGED IMPS TRANSACTION WORTH Rs. 820 CRORE (APPROX) IN UCO BANK ACCOUNTS

Kolkata, (KCN): The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has conducted searches at around 13 locations including Kolkata (West Bengal) & Mangalore (Karnataka) at the premises of accused & others including private persons/bank officials. During searches, electronic evidence including mobile phones, laptops, computer systems, email archives, and debit/credit cards were recovered. A case was registered on complaint from UCO Bank, against two Support Engineers working with UCO Bank and other unknown

persons on the allegations of suspicious Immediate Payment Service (IMPS) transactions amounting to approximately Rs. 820 crore. It was alleged that between November 10, 2023 and November 13, 2023, IMPS inward transactions originating from 14000 account holders across seven private banks were directed to 41000 account holders within UCO Bank through the IMPS channel. It was further alleged that this intricate network involved a staggering 8,53,049 transactions and these transactions were mistakenly posted in the UCO Bank account-holders' records, despite the originating banks registering failed transactions. Consequently, an approximate sum of Rs. 820 crore was allegedly found its way into UCO Bank accounts without proper debits from the originating banks' account holders. It was also alleged that several account holders exploited this situation, illicitly withdrawing funds from UCO Bank through various banking channels, thereby benefiting wrongfully from the transaction. Investigation is continuing.

Hilsa Spawn Ranching in river Ganga at Maldah under Hilsa Ranching Programme



Kolkata, (KCN): As a part of Hilsa spawn ranching activity, under Namami Gange programme a spawn ranching was conducted on 2nd December, 2023 at Shilmulata Char, Maldah, West Bengal, near West Bengal-Jharkhand border.

During the event more than ten thousand spawn (10025) of Hilsa, breed in Hilsa ranching station at Farakka were ranched in river Ganga under third phase of NMCG project. Dr. B. K. Das, Director, CIFRI highlighted the significance of the

ranching program and informed that, till date CIFRI have ranched more than 26 lakhs Hilsa and 92568 adult Hilsa in different region of middle stretches of river Ganga covering West Bengal, Jharkhand, since last four years. He also said that due to this continuous ranching programme fisher of Maldah, W.B. to Gajipur, Uttarpradesh is getting Hilsa during their regular fishing activities. These activities are adding new horizon to "Arth Ganga" concept of NMCG. It will in turn help the poor fisherman

in near future and also improve their livelihood simultaneously.

He also added that rise in Hilsa fish population through ranching will aid in increase of other aquatic animals in river Ganga including the Gangetic Dolphin. He also aware the fishermen not to indulge in destructive fishing methods like use of small mesh size net for juvenile Hilsa catch, poisoning the river bed for fishing etc. The overall program was successfully conducted with the whole hearted support from the CIFRI-NMCG team.

TRAI Seeks Rule Response

New Delhi: Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) today released draft Telecom Regulatory Authority of India Repealing Regulations, 2023; for inviting comments of stakeholders.

The TRAI notified regulation on quality of service of dial-up and leased line internet access service, 2001 (4 of 2001) on 10th December 2001.

This regulation is applicable to all the Basic Service Operators and Internet Service Providers, including the incumbent operators viz. BSNL, MTNL and VSNL.

The purpose of laying down Quality of Service Parameters was to ensure customer satisfaction by laying down norms of network performance, which the service provider is required to achieve by proper dimensioning



of his network; measure the Quality of Service from time to time and to compare that with the specified norms so as to monitor the level of performance, provided by various service providers and to protect the interests of subscribers of the Internet services. It has been noticed that these regulations were issued when the dial up service was the only service available for accessing low speed internet. With the

passage of time, the telecommunication networks both wireline as well as wireless have evolved to offer high speed broadband service on xDSL, FTTH, LTE, etc, technologies.

Whereas the leased line access services are generally offered by Internet Gateway Service Providers (IGSPs) holding an ISP licence to enterprises, is a Service Level Agreement (SLA)



I'll play IPL until I can't walk anymore: Maxwell

New Delhi: In news that will come as music to the ears of Royal Challengers Bangalore fans, Australia allrounder Glenn Maxwell has said that he will play in the IPL until he 'can't walk anymore.'

"The IPL will probably be the last tournament I ever play, as I will play the IPL until I can't walk anymore," Maxwell said on Wednesday (December 6).

Maxwell has been associated with the IPL for more than a decade now, starting out at Delhi Daredevils (now Capitals) in 2012. In 2013, he became the first million-dollar player after Mumbai Indians snapped him up for that amount in the auction.

Yet his breakthrough season came in 2014 when he featured for Kings XI Punjab (now Punjab Kings) and scored 552 runs at a strike rate of 187.75. By his lofty standards, he had only one decent



season in the next five years before turning up for RCB following the 2021 auction.

Maxwell has repaid the faith (and INR 14.25 Crore) invested in him by RCB with season tallies of 513, 301 and 400 in 2021, 2022, and 2023 respectively - with strike rates improving each year. Just last season, he scored at a blistering 183.49 - his best since that incredible 2014 season.

"I was talking about how good the IPL has been to me throughout my career; the people I've met, the coaches I have played under, the international players that you get to rub shoulders with, how beneficial to my whole career that tournament has been," Maxwell said.

"You're rubbing shoulders with AB [de Villiers] and Virat [Kohli] for two months, talking to them while

watching other games. It's just the greatest learning experience that any player could ask for."

With the IPL set to be played just ahead of next year's T20 World Cup - in West Indies and USA - Maxwell hopes that more Australian players get an IPL gig in order to get used to conditions that they could possibly encounter at the showpiece event. Seven members of Australia's

50-over World Cup winning squad - Travis Head, Josh Hazlewood, Pat Cummins, Josh Inglis and Steve Smith - will go under the hammer with the maximum base price of INR 2 Crore in the auction on December 19.

"Hopefully a lot of our Australian players can get over to the IPL and get to work in slightly similar conditions to the West Indies, where it is a little bit drier, it will spin."

Maxwell, who will lead Melbourne Stars in the BBL opener on Thursday, also opined that Australia have already retrained their focus on the next big prize - the T20 World Cup title.

"As soon as we won this World Cup, we all talked about refocusing towards the next one. I'm hoping it's going to be a really exciting summer for the BBL, with what is just around the corner," he said.

New Delhi: After an underwhelming start to their Test Championship campaign, a 150-run loss against Bangladesh in Sylhet, New Zealand captain Tim Southee gave his assessment on the Kiwis' performance, citing consistency as a problem in both departments. He does, however, expect another surface that will aid spin when the two teams face off in Dhaka.

"First and foremost, obviously a different surface. Again, we're expecting obviously spin-friendly conditions," remarked the New Zealand captain, in anticipation. "After the last game, we spoke about being more consistent for longer as a bowling group. And then, obviously, partnerships as a batting unit. We've had a great couple of days of

training. So looking forward to getting into another Test match." Assessing the younger crop of players who haven't played too much cricket in Asian conditions, Southee backed them to trust their methods, and work on sustaining them for longer. "We expected the pitch to be pretty much what it was. It was a pretty good surface, and what we sort of expected in this part of the world," Southee admitted. "Some of the

guys that haven't played in this part of the world would've learned from that. And all the guys have got different methods and different ways to go about it. It's just about trusting that those ways are enough. "We saw, obviously, Kane, his brilliance, in the way that he goes about it compared to the likes of Daryl Mitchell and Glenn Phillips who go about it slightly differently. So, it's just about trusting your way and doing it for longer."

With the tall left-arm Mitchell Santner, and the prodigious Rachin Ravindra who had a prolific World Cup, New Zealand have even more spin options - something that they might leverage, given that the pair had a long session in the nets on the eve of the second Test. "All fifteen (players) have got a pretty good chance, they're here, so yeah, they've got a good chance of playing," said Southee, holding back in his response. "We'll have one final look at the wicket tomorrow morning and then decide. But yeah, I guess all 15 are fit, so they're available for selection. "It's about the whole bowling group just being slightly better than what we were in the first Test match and creating some pressure. We know that spin is going to play a big part in this part of the world. So, I think we just got to be a bit better for longer."

Zimbabwe pick uncapped duo for Ireland T20Is

New Delhi: On expected lines, Zimbabwe ring in multiple changes to their T20I squad ahead of their next assignment, at home against Ireland. After failing to qualify for the T20 World Cup following a poor showing in the qualifiers, Zimbabwe's selectors have axed four players from that squad.

Pacer Tendai Chatara, spinner Wellington Mazakadza and openers Innocent Kaia and Nick Welch are the ones who have been left out. Leg spinner Brandon Mavuta and Tony Munyonga have been recalled and the selectors have also picked two uncapped players. 20-year-old

batter Brian Bennett, who was amongst the runs in List A cricket recently for Mountaineers, has been rewarded and 25-year-old fast bowler Trevor Gwandu has been picked as well.

Sikandar Raza will continue to lead the side and will have the services of veteran Craig Evrline, who missed the majority of the qualifiers with a groin injury. The three-match series kicks off December 7 at the Harare Sports Club. The same venue will host the next two games as well on December 9 and 10.
