According to official sources, Jharsuguda SP Rahul Jain and SDPO Brajraj Nagar, Gupteswar Bhoi have been attached to State Police Headquarters, Cuttack.

Shri Bhoi has been replaced by SDPO of Athamallik, Chintamani Pradhan. Bargarh SP Parmar Smit Parshottamdas has been posted as new SP of Jharsuguda.

The new posting of the Jharsuguda SP and SDPO is being treated as punishment, an of-

The State Government took this action after the Opposition BJP and Congress questioned the silence of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and DGP Sunil Bansal.

Rejecting the Crime Branch probe ordered by the Chief Minister, BJP demanded CBI probe while Congress demanded SIT probe under the supervision of Orissa High Court. Speaking to media persons, BJP State President Samir Mohanty said, "Minister Das was not just a politician, he was an influential and powerful cabinet minister in the state. If such a personality will be killed in broad daylight, one can easily assume the condition of a common man in the state."

Shri Mohanty said it is unfortunate that Naveen Babu, who has been in charge of the



Home department for the last 23 years, has remained silent on the sensitive issue.

Though a cabinet minister was killed, DGP and Home Secretary neither visited the spot in Jharsuguda nor spoke a word on the heinous murder, the BJP president said.

"When a police official has killed the Minister, will the Odisha Police investigate it? People will not accept it," he said.

Bhushan, who was also a senior advocate, served as the law minister from 1977 to 1979 in the Morarji Desai cabi-

Bhushan, whose sons Jayant and Prashant

Bhushan are leading lawyers, was active in the legal profession till recently and had argued on a PIL in the Supreme Court seeking a court-monitored probe into the Rafale fighter jets deal.

Shanti Bhushan appeared in several cases of public importance.

He represented petitioner Raj Narain in the

Allahabad High Court in a famous case in which the election of then prime minister Indira Gandhi was annulled for committing

electoral malpractices.

He was quite vocal on the issue of corruption which led him to his brief association with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP).

### India's Budget will be 'ray of hope' for the world, says PM Modi

NEW DELHI(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said that amidst the global economic turmoil, India's Budget will attempt to meet the hopes and aspirations of ordinary citizens and be a "ray of hope for the world". Mr Modi also said that the BJPled NDA government has always worked with a singular aim of putting "India First" and "Citizens First" and the same spirit will be seen during the Bud-

get Session. Addressing the media ahead of the Budget Session of Parliament, the Prime Minister said recognised voices in the world economy were bringing positive messages from all sides. He noted that the Budget, to be presented by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman

in Parliament on Wednesday, will strive to fulfil the people's hopes, aspirations and also boost the hopes with which the world was looking at India.

"The ray of hope being seen by the world will glow brighter for this, I firmly believe the finance minister will make all efforts to meet these aspirations," Mr Modi said.

He also noted President Droupadi Murmu was delivering her maiden address to the joint sitting of Parliament at the start of the Budget Session. "The President's speech is the pride of the Constitution of India, the pride of India's parliamentary system, and also an opportunity to respect women and the great tribal traditions of the country," Mr Modi said. He mentioned that according to the parliamentary traditions evolved over the past six to seven decades, a parliamentarian speaking for the first time in the House, belonging to any political party, was extended respect and a conducive atmosphere is created to enhance



his/her confidence.

"This is a rich and best tradition. It is the responsibility of parliamentarians to ensure that this moment of the President's first address to Parliament is full of enthusiasm, warmth and energy. I am sure our parliamentarians will pass this test," Mr Modi said.

"There will be arguments as well during the Budget Session and I hope that the Opposition will articulate them well by studying issues closely. The House will deliberate on the formulation of policy which will benefit the nation," the Prime Minister said.

### ASI Gopal Das had "clear intention" to kill minister: FIR

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): The Odisha Police in its FIR in the killing of Health minister Naba Kishore Das said the accused assistant sub-inspector (ASI) Gopal Das had "clear intention" to kill the minister. This was stated by Brajrajnagar Police Station inspector-in-charge (IIC) Pradumnya Kumar Swain, who was present at the site when the ASI allegedly opened fire at the 60-year-old minister, leading to his death after some hours during treatment on Sunday. "All of a sudden, ASI Gopal Das of Gandhi Chowk Police Outpost, who was deployed for traffic clearance duty for the programme, came close

to the minister and opened fire from his service pistol from a very close range aiming at the minister with a clear intention to kill him," the IIC said his complaint at Brajrajnagar Police sta-

Swain, who sustained a bullet injury on his ring finger from the second round allegedly fired by the ASI, said that police officers/ men of different units were mobilised and deployed on January 29, 2023, from 10.30 am onwards to discharge their duties in traffic arrangement, law and order, escort and pilot duty and others for the minister's programme.

"At about 12.15 pm the car of minister Naba Kishore Das stopped near the building and he got down from the vehicle after opening the front side passenger door of the vehicle. All of a sudden, ASI Das who was deployed for traffic clearance duty for the programme, came close to the minister and opened fire from his service pistol from a very close range aiming at the minister".

Swain said that the bullet hit the chest of the minister and he fell down. There was profuse bleeding from the bullet wound on the body of the minister, the IIC said, adding that he along with constable KC Pradhan caught hold of the accused ASI. "During push and pull the ASI fired two more rounds of bullets from his 9 mm pistol. From his second fire, I received injury on my ring finger,"

IIC Swain said. Apart from minister, the IIC wrote in the FIR that another man namely Jibanlal Nayak@Rintu of Kalinagar also received injury. After some struggle, Swain and constable Pradhan overpowered the accused Das and disarmed him.

Meanwhile, ADG Crime Branch, Arun Bothra, who had interrogated the accused ASI said that Das has

"confessed" to the crime of opening fire at the minister. The opposition BJP and Congress raised several questions and saw a "conspiracy" behind the minister's kill-

High Court to monitor CB probe Former Odisha Law minister and Congress Legislature Party leader Narasingha, who is a lawyer by profession said: "As per my reading, it is a part of the deep-rooted conspiracy and needs an impartial probe. It is surprising as to why sufficient police personnel were not deployed and ASI Das engaged in traffic clearance came dangerously close to the minister."

Leader of Opposition Jaynarayan Mishra of BJP said he suspects a conspiracy as the accused ASI was issued the pistol a day before the minister's visit to his area. "There should a CBI probe to ascertain the truth behind the cabinet minister's murder," Mishra said.

Meanwhile, BJP MP from Kalahandi constituency Basant Panda said he would raise the Odisha minister murder issue in Parliament.

By-elections for Bijepur, Brajarajnagar and Padampur were held due to vacancy arising following res-

ignation of elected MLA and death of another two sitting MLAs.

The by-election for Bijepur Assembly seat in Bargarh district was held in October, 2019, after Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik vacated the seat while retaining Hinjili in the last Assembly election after winning from both the

BJD candidate Rita Sahu won the seat in the by-poll. Shrimati Sahu is now Minister of State in Naveen Patnaik's Council of Minis-

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): The kendu leaf division of the Forest department will switch over to a technology-based mechanism for quicker disbursement of claims of kendu leaf workers. This was decided at the second meeting of the kendu leaf coordination committee held here under the chairmanship of chief secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra. Principal chief conservator of forest (PCCF), kendu leaf, Pusa Zhule Mekro said that kendu leaf production of 2.77 lakh quintal has been achieved against the target of 2.78 lakh quintal in 2022. The production achieved is 99.8 per cent of the post collection target. On working fund expenditure till January 2023, she apprised the committee that Rs 409.16 crore has already been utilised and another Rs 12.94 crore is likely to be spent during February and March. She further informed that 2.19 lakh quintal has been sold fetching sale value of Rs 509.98 crore. The anticipated ers, she said.

Similarly, the by-poll for Brajarajnagar seat in Jharsuguda was held in May 2022 due to the death of sitting BJD MLA Kishore Kumar Mohanty in December 2021. Late Mohanty's widow BJD Candidate, Alaka was elected from the seat.

The by-election to Padampur Assembly seat in Bargarh district was held last December following the death of sitting BJD MLA Bijay Ranjan Singh Bariha. Bijay's daughter Barsha Singh Bariha won the by-poll with a huge margin from BJD ticket.



In all the three by-elections, Naba Das had played a pivotal role and ensured smooth victory for the Governing BJD. Now with his demise situation has arisen for a by-poll. And this will be first time in Odisha where in a Lok Sabha segment four by-elections will happen.

Bargarh Lok Sabha MP is Suresh Pujari. While Shri Pujari is from BJP all other seven seats were won by BJD Candidates in 2019. And in all the three by-elections, BJD candidates wrested the seats.

## 603 CR for Fishery

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Union Government has

sanctioned Odisha Rs.603 Crore for implementation of various fisheries related activities in the State.

Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying (MoFAH&D) under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) during the last two financial years and current year has accorded approvals to the fisheries development proposals of Government of Odisha.

This funding will boost overall development and welfare of fishermen in the State including livelihood and nutritional

support for over 20,000 traditional and socio-economically backward fishermen families during the fishing ban period annually, officials said.

As a matter of fact the Fisheries Research Institutes under the aegis of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) have been conducting research regularly for understanding the impacts of climate change in order to develop climate resilient strategies for sustainability of fisheries and aquaculture.

The studies on the impact of climate change undertaken by ICAR institutes under "National Innovation in Climate Resilient Agriculture (NICRA)" include vulnerability assessment of the wetland fisheries in Odisha, Assam, West Bengal, Bihar, and

Studies are taken up on climate trend analysis for major river basins across India; Impact on fish distributional range, catch composition and yield etc. In marine fisheries, studies on climate change modeling, projection on fish catch & marine culture production under climate change scenarios, risk and vulnerability assessment of marine fisheries, wetland mapping, carbon footprint, blue carbon potential, ocean acidification, response of capture and culture species to climate change and adaptive management in response to climate change are carried out under the NICRA Project.

Climate campaigns and awareness programs are also conducted in the states like Odisha, Assam, West Bengal, and Kerala in order to increase preparedness and adaptive capacity of fishers against climate change.

PMMSY has taken steps to intensify and diversify inland fisheries and aquaculture with focus on diversification of species, introduction of new species and peg the critical gaps in the demand and supply of quality broad and seed of cultivable species and species-specific feeds, Adequate number of brood banks, hatcheries, seed rearing units, specific pathogen free or resistant seed, genetically improved brood stock, and feed mills.

As a result, inland fisheries and aquaculture has contributed 74.59% of the total fish production of

India during 2021-22.

Further, the Department of Fisheries under PMMSY is also supporting exposure visits, training and capacity building program of fish farmers and other stakeholders in modern technologies developed in fisheries and aquaculture such as cage culture in reservoir, pen culture in wetlands, biofloc technology, recirculatory aquaculture system, scaling up of freshwater prawn (scampi) culture, promotion of inland saline aquaculture in potential areas to improve farm practices for enhanced production.





#### Sub: Sanctioning Junagarh road-Nabarangpur rail lin

I hope you are doing fine. I may bring your kind attention that in 1962-63 late Kalahandi MP Maharaja Sri Pratap Keshari Deo had raised in the parliament that Mr. Parkers had done a railway line survey from Kesinga to Nabarangpur to join Kothavalasa-Kirandul (KK) line. Subsequently, in 1991, the Lanjigarh road-Junagarh line was approved to connect with the KK line at Ambagura via Nabarangpur. 56 km of Lanjigarh road-Junagarh line rail line took 25 years to get completed, however, a survey of the Junagarh-Ambaguda portion of this route was completed in 2012. This route has a rate of return (RoR) above 14 %, far better than the approved Nabarangpur-Jeypore or Jeypore-Malkangiri route.

Presently Jeypore-Nabarangpur rail line is under progress but the Nabarangpur-Junagarh Road connection has not yet been sanctioned and no budgetary allocation has been made for its construction work. During your visit to Kalahandi, you also promised that this line will pass through Dharamgarh.

For practical purposes, the Nabarangpur-Junagarh Road rail connection would give better service to people of the Nabarangpur district for many practical reasons people in Nabarangpur would use Junagarh road/ Kesinga stations to reach Bhubaneswar, western Odisha and major cities in India to save

As per the initial Railway's proposal, Junagarh rd-Amagura was supposed to be an extension of the Lanjigarh road-Junagadh road rail line, therefore, the extension work should have started as soon as Lanjigarh rd-Junagarh road rail line was completed in 2012-13. Unfortunately, it did not happen. A decade has passed, no solid action has been made and the process is taking a long time, moving in snails' space.

Kindly seriously look into these matters and sanction Junagarh road-Nabarangpur rail line in the coming budget.

#### Will budget boost the Realty sector

## Nirmala Sitharaman: Spare a though for the realty sector

With the Union Budget 2023-24 around the corner, the realty sector is hoping for incentives and benefits that will make it easier to run their businesses. Even though the real estate sector had a



decent run in 2022, overcoming the pandemic-induced rough time of the previous years, there are many critical demands that the sector has put forward ahead of the Budget presentation scheduled for February 1. Strong

healthy consumer demand is the crucial driver of the growth of real estate sector today. The Budget should reflect upon the aspirations of developers who are still tiding over the turbulence caused by the pandemic

The real estate sector is one of the largest employers of both skilled and unskilled labour. Though it has come out of the challenging impact of Covid, the availability of affordable home loans and the importance of owning a home are still the growth drivers of the sector. Says Amit Modi, President, CREDAI, Western UP, "One of the most crucial demands is to accord 'Industry Status to Real Estate Sector', which will allow the sector to avail legitimate finances and low-cost loans from banks and other financial institutions. The cost benefits could then be transferred to the end users and homebuyers. For the benefit of homebuyers, the input credit regime should be reinstated in the GST regime for the residential real estate at least. This will help in making home-buying an affordable and buyer-friendly process."

Meanwhile, the Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman should facilitate a Single Window Clearance to enable faster deliveries and project completions is an age old demand of realty sector. In an effort to provide ease of doing business in the realty sector, there should be some significant changes in the principal repayment of housing loans. To boost the housing markets and bolster realtors' confidence, the deduction for principal repayment of housing loans should be increased from the exist-

ing limit of Rs 1,50,000. This will allow homebuyers who had an askance attitude towards investing in homes due to high mortgage rates will mark a return

Real estate contributes 6-8% to the GDP and employs more than 5 crore people. It has high hopes from the forthcoming budget. To begin with, there should be a separate deduction for principal repayment as currently clubbed under section 80(c). It should be raised from the existing Rs. 1,50,000 limit. According to Manoj Gaur, CMD Gaurs



Group-"There is also a need to redefine affordable housing from the current ceiling of 45 lakhs in urban and 30

lakhs in non-urban to take into account the inflationary factors. Further, the carpet area should also be increased to 90 sqm in the metros and 120 sqm in non-metro cities without any price cap. Long-term capital gains on capital assets should also be taxed at 10%. The holding period should be reduced to 12 months in line with the holding period of other capital assets like listed equity shares and equity-oriented mutual funds."

The sector would also like the FM to extend exemption under Section 80C to REIT investments starting with Rs. 50,000. The period of holding for units of REIT should be reduced to 12 months (as applicable for listed shares) to qualify as a longterm capital asset from the current 3 years. The deduction under Section 24 (b) on housing loan interest in the case of individuals with respect to the first self-occupied property should be allowed without any limit or at least capped at Rs 5,00,000 in respect of the self-occupied property. A single window clearance system should also be introduced in real estate as taking approvals from numerous authorities disproportionately increases the cost and time from concept to commissioning. The rising input costs, specifically cement and steel, should also be controlled. Besides, industry status should also be conferred on real estate.

Says Nayan Raheja, Raheja Developers that "The budget Ministry should take stock of the insolvency debts of realtors and delays in project deliveries. The Budget should introduce tax remissions on the interest rates of home loans levied by banks which have been triggered by the all-time high inflation rates in previous quarters. This will provide relaxation to developers and simultaneously pace up the construction activity on ongoing projects."

"The most crucial demand is to give tax relief to developers to expedite the completion of stalled projects and take a compassionate recourse in times of difficulties. The most recurrent demand is to bestow industry status to the real estate sector and allow players to be at the receiving end of many associative benefits," feels Aman Sharma, Director Spaze Group.

"Reducing GST rates and stamp duty will allow the real estate sector to adopt a policy of price moderation in the pricing of housing units and apartments and give real estate a breather from increasing cost valuation of projects, "demands Kushagr Ansal, Director Ansal Housing.

The realty sector has made a smooth transition from the pandemic-induced turbulences. We believe the sector should further be stabilised by introducing profound measures in the Union Budget. Says Amit Jain, Director, Mahagun Group, "Reductions in GST, circle rates, and stamp duty would be significant fresh-start policies allowing the housing sector to gain an upper-hand advantage right at the year's outset." The Budget should mirror the aspirations of the realty sector and support growthinducing factors. GST rates on construction materials like steel, cement, and tiles should be rationalised, keeping in view the overall health of the sector. Deepak Kapoor, Director, Gulshan Group, "Finally, the government should help distressed developers and allocate funds for the completion of stuck projects. The current stand of RBI on the reporate should also take the views of developers into account. The Budget should offer a premise of agents of development and progress and stamp out hindrances impeding the growth of the sector." One hopes that the Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman would look after the interests of realty world very generously.

## With the civic body having 67 wards, the numRs 2,000 will be given as service fee. Severed head of suicide bomber recovered; Pakistan blames 'security lapse' for mosque blast

PESHAWAR: Pakistani authorities scrambled Tuesday to determine how a suicide bomber was able to carry out one of the country's deadliest militant attacks in years, unleashing an explosion in a crowded mosque inside a highly secured police compound in the city of Peshawar. The death toll from the blast climbed to 100.

Monday morning's bombing, which left at least 225 wounded, raised alarm among officials over a major security breach at a time when the Pakistani Taliban, the main anti-government militant group, has stepped up attacks, particularly targeting the police and the military. Who carried out the bombing was unclear. A commander from the Pakistani Taliban, known by the acronym TTP, claimed responsibility, but a spokesman for the group later distanced the TTP from the carnage, saying it was not its policy to attack mosques. Rescue officials on Tuesday recovered the severed

head of the suspected suicide bomber who they believe blew himself up, causing the roof to collapse on the worshippers, officials said

Capital City Police Officer (CCPO) Peshawar Mohammad Aijaz Khan told Geo TV that the blast appeared to be a suicide attack and the head of the suspected bomber was recovered at the site in Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. More than 300 worshippers were pray-

ing in the Sunni mosque, with more approaching, when the bomber set off his explosives vest, officials said. The blast blew off part of the roof, and what was left caved in, injuring many more, according to Zafar Khan, a police officer.

worked Rescuers through the night and into Tuesday morning, remov ing mounds of debris to reach worshippers still trapped under the rubble. The death toll rose as more bodies were found and several of the critically injured died, said Mohammad Asim, a government hospital spokesman in Peshawar. Most of the victims were police officers, he said. Counter-terrorism police are investigating how the bomber was able to reach the mosque, which is inside a walled-off police headquarters compound called Police Lines. The compound is located in a heavy security district of Peshawar that includes other government buildings.

"Yes, it was a security lapse," said Ghulam Ali, the provincial governor in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, of which Peshawar is the capital.

Akhtar Ali Shah, a former regional interior secretary once based in Peshawar, said it "was not a

spur-of-the-moment attack."
"It was the handiwork of a well-organised group,"

he told The Associated Press. He said those behind the attack must have had inside help to gain access to the compound and probably entered it several times for reconnaissance or even to plant explosives ahead of time. 'Pakistan paying the price

for suing for peace with terrorist group'
"It's not a security lapse, it's a security breach," he said. "From all entry points, there are multiple layers of security you have to cross" with ID checks. Talat Masood, a retired army general and senior security analyst said Monday's suicide bombing showed "negligence." "When we know that Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan is active, and when we know that they have threatened to carry out attacks, there should have been more security at the police compound in Peshawar," he told the AP, using the official name of the Pakistani Taliban.

The military's media wing declined an Associated Press interview request for the chief of army staff. Asim Munir, who took office in November, has yet to do any media appearances. Kamran Bangash, a

provincial secretary-general with the opposition Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party, called for an investigation and blamed the instability on the government of Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif.

The government "has failed to improve the economy and law and order situation, and it should resign to pave the way for snap parliamentary elections," he said. The party's leader, former Prime Minister Imran Khan, denounced the attack.

The bombing comes as Pakistan is contending with political and economic crises from a disputed election and from unprecedented floods last summer that killed 1,739 people, destroyed more than 2 million homes, and at one point submerged as much as a third of the country. Sharif visited a hospital in Peshawar after the bombing and vowed "stern action" against those behind the attack. On Tuesday he dismissed criticism of his government and called for unity. "My message to all political forces is one of unity against anti-Pakistan elements. We can fight our political fights later," he tweeted.

Shortly after the explosion, Pakistan Taliban commander Sarbakaf Mohmand claimed responsibil-

ity for the attack in a post on Twitter. But hours later, TTP spokesperson Mohammad Khurasani said it was not the group's policy to target mosques, seminaries and religious places and

that those taking part in such acts could face punitive action under TTP's policy. His statement did not address why a TTP commander had claimed responsibility for the bombing.

Peshawar mosque blast that killed 100 was 'targeted revenge attack':

Pakistan police Pakistan, which is mostly Sunni Muslim, has seen a surge in militant attacks since November when the Pakistani Taliban ended a cease-fire with government forces.

The Pakistani Taliban are the dominant militant group in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, and Peshawar has been the scene of frequent attacks. In 2014, a Pakistani Taliban faction attacked an army-run school in Peshawar and killed 154, mostly schoolchildren. But the Islamic State in Khorasan Province, a regional affiliate of the Islamic State group and a rival of the Taliban, has also been behind deadly attacks in Pakistan in recent years. Overall, violence has increased since the Afghan Taliban seized power in neighbouring Afghanistan in August 2021 as U.S. and NATO troops pulled out of the country after 20 years of war.

The TTP is separate from but a close ally of the Afghan Taliban. It has waged an insurgency in Pakistan in the past 15 years, seeking stricter enforcement of Islamic laws, the release of its members in government custody and a reduction in the Pakistani military presence in areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province it has long used as its base. Earlier this month, the Pakistani Taliban claimed one of its members shot and killed two intelligence officers, including the director of the counterterrorism wing of the Inter-Services Intelligence spy agency. Security officials said Monday the gunman was killed in a shootout near the Afghan border.

The Taliban-run Afghan Foreign Ministry said it was "saddened to learn that numerous people lost their lives" in Peshawar and condemned attacks on worshippers as contrary to the teachings of Islam. US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, who is on a visit to the Middle East, tweeted his condolences, saying the bombing in Peshawar was a "horrific attack." "Terrorism for any reason at any place is indefensible," he said.

### Boeing bids farewell to an icon, delivers last 747 jumbo jet

SEATTLE: Boeing bids farewell to an icon on Tuesday: It's delivering its final 747 jumbo jet.

Since its first flight in 1969, the giant yet graceful 747 has served as a cargo plane, a commercial aircraft capable of carrying nearly 500 passengers, a transport for NASA's space shuttles, and the Air Force One presidential aircraft. It revolutionized travel, connecting international cities that had never before had direct routes and helping democratize passenger flight.

But over the past 15 years, Boeing and its European rival Airbus have introduced more profitable and fuel-efficient wide-body planes, with only two engines to maintain instead of the 747's four. The final plane is the 1,574th built by Boeing in the Puget Sound region of Washington state.

A big crowd of current and former Boeing workers is expected for the final send-off. The last one is being delivered to cargo carrier Atlas Air.

"If you love this business, you've been dreading this moment," said longtime aviation analyst Richard Aboulafia. "Nobody wants a four-engine airliner anymore, but that doesn't erase the tremendous contribution the aircraft made to the development of the industry or its remarkable legacy.'

Boeing set out to build the 747 after losing a

contract for a huge military transport, the C-5A. The idea was to take advantage of the new engines developed for transport — high-bypass turbofan engines, which burned less fuel by passing air around the engine core, enabling a farther flight range and to use them for a newly imagined civilian aircraft. It took more than 50,000 Boeing workers less than 16 months to churn out the first 747 — a Herculean effort that earned them the nickname "The Incredibles." The jumbo jet's production required the construction of a massive factory in Everett, north of Seattle — the world's largest building by volume.

The plane's fuselage was 225 feet (68.5 meters) long and the tail stood as tall as a six-story building. The plane's design included a second deck extending from the cockpit back over the first third of the plane, giving it a distinctive hump and inspiring a nickname, the Whale. More romantically, the 747 became known as the Queen of the Skies.

Some airlines turned the second deck into a firstclass cocktail lounge, while even the lower deck sometimes featured lounges or even a piano bar. "It was the first big carrier, the first widebody, so it set a new standard for airlines to figure out what to Syon, a history professor at Pennsylvania's Albright back in the air.

College who specializes in aviation and mobility. "It became the essence of mass air travel: You couldn't fill it with people paying full price, so you need to lower prices to get people onboard. It contributed to what happened in the late 1970s with the deregulation of air travel."

The first 747 entered service in 1970 on Pan Am's New York-London route, and its timing was terrible, Aboulafia said. It debuted shortly before the oil crisis of 1973, amid a recession that saw Boeing's employment fall from 100,800 employees in 1967 to a low of 38,690 in April 1971. The "Boeing bust" was infamously marked by a billboard near the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport that read, "Will the last person leaving SEATTLE -- Turn out the lights."

An updated model — the 747-400 series — arrived in the late 1980s and had much better timing, coinciding with the Asian economic boom of the



early 1990s, Aboulafia said. He recalled taking a Cathay Pacific 747 from Los Angeles to Hong Kong as a twentysomething backpacker in 1991.

"Even people like me could go see Asia," Aboulafia said. "Before, you had to stop for fuel in Alaska or Hawaii and it cost a lot more. This was a straight shot — and reasonably priced."

BJP unhappy with CB probe, seeks CBI investi-

With many loose ends and unanswered questions linked to the broad daylight killing of minister Naba Kishrore Das by an on-duty police officer, the Opposition parties have demanded a probe into the incident independent of the state police.

Expressing shock over the manner in which a cabinet minister of a state was shot dead, leader of Opposition Jaynarayan Mishra said if the assailant Gopal Das, an assistant sub-inspector of police, was mentally unsound why he was put on minister's

What comes as a surprise that the ASI was issued the service pistol a day before the incident. All these things create suspicion in the mind of the people which required a thorough investigation. The state government should hand over the case to the CBI for an impartial probe and the same cannot be expected from the Crime Branch of Odisha police, Mishra said.

"We don't have faith on the Crime Branch of Odisha

Police which is a puppet in the hands of the ruling BJD. The Crime Branch is like Sankat Mochan (troubleshooter) for the government. Starting from Pari to Mamita Meher case, the CB gave clean chit to ministers involved in the murder cases," Mishra said. Targeting Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik over the deteriorating law and order situation in Odisha,

state BJP general secretary Prithiviraj Harichandan said the state government has been claiming that the law and order situation of Odisha is far better than many other BJP ruled states. However, the Sunday incident exposed the government's tall claims, he added.

"If the state government is unable to give protection to its ministers one can imagine the safety of the common people of the state," he said. Harichandan said, "We have been hearing about such incidents in other states. Never before such incident occured in Odisha which is now turned to be the grazing ground of criminals."

CM should take responsibility for the incident: Congress

Alleging deep-rooted conspiracy behind the murder of minister Naba Kishore Das, the Congress on Monday stepped up its attack on the state government asking Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik to take full responsibility for the incident.

Either the government has failed to provide proper security to people's representatives or there was gross negligence, leader of the Congress Legislature Party (CLP) Narasingh Mishra said and held the chief minister accountable for the killing.

"The chief minister should now ask his conscience to decide whether he should continue," he said. Stating that the incident has shown that the law and order situation has completely collapsed in the state, MIshra said that people do not feel the presence of police.

"It shows that law and order machinery has completely collapsed and the state is witnessing jungle rule. There is no rule of law. That is why a minister has been killed by a policeman with his service weapon," he added. Demanding an impartial probe into the incident, Mishra said there seems to be a deep-rooted conspiracy behind the killing and it is not a simple murder.

Stating that he does not believe the claim of the government that the ASI was having some mental issues, the Congress leader said if at all it is true, how was he given a weapon. His party colleague Santosh Singh Saluja raised questions on the functioning of the Home department. He asked whether SOP was followed as a minister was touring the place. Saluja said intelligence should have been collected whether anybody is opposing the minister, or there are any plan of showing black flag or any other suspicious activities ahead of the minister's visit. "The way the ASI shot the minister, it clearly shows there is absolutely no law and order in Odisha. People are being killed inside jails and minister on road. Hence, the chief minister should resign," he added.

## India's economy projected to grow at 6.5 per cent in 2023-24: Economic Survey

India's economy is projected to grow 6.5 per cent in 2023-24, compared to 7 per cent this fiscal and 8.7 per cent in 2021-22, according to India's Economic Survey (2022-23), which was tabled by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday.

The RBI's 6.8% inflation projection for the current fiscal is not high enough to deter private consumption



nor is it low enough to weaken investment, Sitharaman said.

The minister also stated that India's recovery from the pandemic was relatively quick, and that the growth in the next fiscal would be supported by solid domestic demand, and a pick up in capital

India withstood an extraordinary set of challenges better than most economies, she said, adding that India's economic resilience has helped it withstand the challenge of mitigating external imbalances caused by the Russia-Ukraine conflict without losing growth momentum.

Speaking of the inflation problem, the minister said that it did not "creep too far above" the tolerance range compared to several advanced nations.

The Finance Minister warned that the challenge of rupee depreciation persists with the likelihood of further interest rate hikes by the US Fed. However, India has sufficient forex reserves to finance CAD and intervene in forex market to manage rupee volatility, she added.

The Economic Survey document, prepared by the Economic Division of the Department of Economic Affairs in the Ministry of Finance and formulated under the supervision of the chief economic adviser V Anantha Nageswaran, gives insights into the state of the economy and various indicators in the current financial year 2022-23 (April-March) and outlook for the next year.

Meanwhile, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Tuesday said it is expecting some slowdown in the Indian economy next fiscal year and projected the growth to 6.1 per cent from 6.8 per cent during the current fiscal ending March 31.

The IMF released the January update of its World Economic Outlook, according to which the global growth is projected to fall from an estimated 3.4 per cent in 2022 to 2.9 per cent in 2023, then rise to 3.1 per cent in 2024.

The Economic Survey tabled in 2022 projected India's GDP growth of 8.0-8.5 per cent in 2022-23, which the government felt will be supported by widespread vaccine coverage, gains from supplyside reforms and easing of regulations, robust export growth, and availability of fiscal space to ramp up capital spending.

The first economic survey reportedly came into existence in 1950-51, when it used to be a part of the budget documents. In the 1960s, it was separated from the Budget documents and presented a day prior to the Union Budget.

Budget 2023, to be presented on Wednesday, is likely to be the last full Budget of the Modi government in its second term with the next Lok Sabha election due in April-May of 2024.

The Budget documents will be available on the 'Union Budget Mobile App' on both the Android and Apple OS platforms after the completion of the Budget Speech by the Finance Minister.

### UK retail giant Tesco to axe over 2,000 jobs

Supermarket group Tesco, the biggest retailer in Britain, announced Tuesday plans to slash about 2,100 jobs, as sky-high inflation hikes costs.



Tesco plans to cut about 1,750 management roles. It will also axe around 350 jobs with the closure of some pharmacies, all

remaining hot food counters and other restructuring. The group said it would do "more of what works and stopping or simplifying where we need to, so that we're running our business as efficiently as possible". The losses will be offset by the creation of 1,800 "leader roles". Tesco recently posted bumper revenue for the key Christmas season, even as customers switched to less expensive rivals as prices soar during a cost-of-living crisis.

Tesco has benefitted from passing on some of its own rising costs to consumers, many of whom appear willing to stay loyal to the group even as UK inflation sits around the highest level in decades. At the same time, Tesco is keen to match the prices of some similar goods offered by supermarkets run by German discounters Aldi and Lidl to retain business from cash-strapped shoppers.

The elder sister's case was transferred to Ahmedabad police and a trial was conducted in the Gandhinagar court, which found Asaram guilty on Monday, The trial against Asaram's son is underway in a Surat court.

Shri Mishra also questioned why the Police DG is silent on this case. "As per information available with us, the Minister died on the spot. What was the necessity to airlift him from Jharsuguda to Bhubaneswar. Whether the Jharsuguda hospital authority had certified that Das was fit to airlift for further treatment?," he asked.

Claiming that the Crime Branch probe cannot reveal the truth, he demanded a CBI investigation into the incident.

Alleging there is a deep rooted conspiracy behind the killing of Minister Das, Congress spokesperson Sudarshan Das demanded a probe by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) under the supervision of a sitting judge of Orissa high court.

Though 48 hours passed to the incident, no action has been taken against any official, who is responsible for it, Das said.

"There was a total failure of intelligence. But no action was taken till now. Why is the DGP and Home Minister (CM) not speaking up?" he questioned.

Alleging that a conspiracy is being made to suppress the truth behind the crime, the Congress leader said the Chief Minister should leave his home portfolio on moral ground. Reacting to the allegations made by the Opposition, senior BJD Vice President and senior Lawmaker Debi Prasad Mishra said, "As questions will be raised if the police will investigate the case in which a cop is the accused, a crime branch probe was ordered. To ensure transparency, the government has requested the Orissa high court to monitor the investigation by a sitting/retired judge."

On the demand for CBI and SIT probe, Shri Mishra said, "Let's wait till the findings of the crime branch investigation has come up." The Health Minister was killed by a bullet fired by dismissed ASI Gopal Krushna Das on January 29. The police ASI fired a single round of bullet from his service revolver at the chest of Das. The Ex Cop was arrested and sent to judicial custody. Crime Branch has sought a seven-day remand of the police official from the local court in Jharsuguda

MUMBAI: The next financial year is likely to keep banks busy as the demand for loans is expected to

According to the Economic Survey, the credit growth in the Indian banking sector is expected to be 'brisk' in the next financial year. The accumulation of deposits in the past few years has enabled banks to fund the growing credit demand. The well-capitalised banking system with a low NPA ratio and more robust corporate sector fundamentals will continue to enhance the flow of bank credit into productive investment opportunities, notwithstanding the rising interest

"Increase in the overall bank credit has also been influenced by the shift in borrower's funding choices from volatile bond markets, where yields have increased, and external commercial borrowings, where interest and hedging costs have increased, towards banks. If inflation declines in FY24 and if the real cost of credit does not rise, then credit growth is likely to be brisk in FY24," noted the survey.

The banking sector in India has also responded in equal measure to the demand for credit as the Yearon-Year growth in credit since the January-March quarter of 2022 has moved into double-digits and is rising across most sectors.

The recovery in economic activity in FY22, along with the enhanced financial soundness of banks and

corporates, has bolstered the expansion of nonand investment.



food bank credit since June 2021.

"The YoY growth in non-food bank credit accelerated to 15.3 per cent in December 2022. This not only shows an acceleration in the growth of current economic activities but also an anticipation of continued momentum in economic activity in future," noted the survey.

Credit growth has been broad-based across sectors, with retail credit driving the growth primarily owing to rising demand for home loans. An increase

Credit to agriculture and allied activities gained momentum supported by Government's concessional institutional credit and higher agricultural credit target. Farah last ran in London in 2019, coming fifth, having finished third the year before. "So it's been a little while," he said. "But I'll be preparing well, I'll head out to Ethiopia and put in a lot of solid training and see what I can do when it comes to April."

AHMEDABAD: New Zealand pacer Lockie Ferguson empathised with his fellow players giving up central contracts for lucrative T20 league deals but said there is still enough "pull" to represent the country in big-ticket events, such as the World Cup. Three New Zealand players -- Trent Boult, Martin Guptill and Jimmy Neesham -- gave up their central contracts last year to play in different T20 leagues across the

world. Asked if it would affect the future of T20 cricket in New Zealand, Ferguson said: "I don't think I have the answer. And it's certainly above my pay grade but, from our point of view, you can understand players when they're at the sort of back end of their careers."

But at the same time, I

know they will still want to play for New Zealand. So finding the balance, I'm not sure what that might be. Certainly, as I said, people above the chain to me will work that out. But I think, from a player's point of view, we love playing for the Black Caps.' 'Certainly since I've been playing such a rich history of being very successful, and that's enjoyable to play and seeing the young talent come through and do well as well is very rewarding. So, I think, from a player's point of view, we want to play for New Zealand in World Cups. That's sort of what kids dream of, and I think there's still a lot of pull for that."

The 31-year-old, who played under Hardik Pandya as part of the Gujarat Titans side in IPL last year, heaped praise on the India T20 skipper.

"Hardik, I have a very high regard certainly from day one, playing underneath him in Gujarat (Titans), he is a clear leader within the group and demands the audience very quickly. But, at the same time, I guess, similar to Kane (Williamson) he has time for everyone in the group," Ferguson said.

"He's done well with India. You can see his body language has been fantastic with the group and I think, he is an exceptional leader for the country. But certainly, I enjoyed my time playing under him.' New Zealand suffered a 3-0 loss against India in the ODI series and are currently tied 1-1 in the three-match T20 rubber after losing the second game in Lucknow by six wickets.



The pitches used for the two T20 games favoured the spinners a lot with India skipper Pandya criticising the Lucknow track, which saw New Zealand post just 99 in 20 overs.

Ferguson, however, said low-scoring games are good for cricket since T20 is mostly dominated by

"We play a lot of T20s here in India, and around the world and we have those high-scoring games. And as a bowler, I think sometimes those sort of lower scores, probably not the 100, but lower score games actually are just as exciting and bring a good battle between bat and ball," he added.

"So I think for the game, it's great. Certainly, I'm sure fans prefer the big, high-scoring matches but, as a cricket player, that can be pretty exciting."
