Strong connectivity essential for building developed India, says PM Modi

NEW DELHI(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said that strong connectivity is essential for building a developed India. He was speaking after virtually flagging off the world's longest river cruise, the MV Ganga Vilas, from Varanasi, which will travel 3,200 km in 51 days to reach Dibrugarh via Bangladesh, sailing across 27 river systems.

Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister talked about charity, tapasya and faith in our festivals and the role of rivers in them. This makes the projects related to river waterways all the more significant, he said.

Flagging off the longest river cruise from Kashi to Dibrugarh, the Prime Minister said that the river cruise will put places of tourism in north India on



The Prime Minister also inaugurated the Tent City at Varanasi, on the banks of the Ganga. Developed opposite the famed ghats of the holy city, the Tent City aims to tap the tourism potential of the region. Besides, the PM also inaugurated and laid the foundation stones for several other inland waterways projects worth more than Rs. 1,000 crores in West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Assam during the event.

Odisha taken long strides in foodgrains production: Naveen

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik said on Thursday that the state has taken long strides in foodgrain production which reached 130 lakh tonne in 2021 surpassing all past



records. Addressing an induction programme of 22 assistant agriculture officers and 53 officials of the Odisha Cashew Development Corporation, the chief minister said that food production has doubled in the state during the last 20 years. Stating that Odisha is a top performing state in cashew production, he said it has a huge potential in employment and income generation.

The CM said agriculture holds the key to socioeconomic development in the state and the government has laid emphasis on development of this sector through various interventions supported by a comprehensive, inclusive state agriculture policy. Agriculture and allied sectors contribute nearly 21 per cent to the gross state value added products in the state.

Naveen said services under the sector have been brought under the umbrella of 5T and Mo Sarkar with the objective of enhancing the delivery mechanism and reach out to every farmer. The chief minister also joined an orientation programme of 240 assistant managers and 26 system managers who were inducted into service in different central cooperative banks at the district level. He said the farmers will benefit from this by way of better service delivery under financial inclusion and credit dispensation.

Aparajita Sarangi demands work order on PMAY by Feb-end

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): BJP MP from Bhubaneswar Aparajita Sarangi on Thursday de-

manded that the state government should issue work orders for the construction of houses for the beneficiaries of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana by the end of next month.

Addressing a media conference here, the BJP leader said the Centre has sanctioned 9.59 lakh housing units and granted Rs 7,250 crore for construction of the houses as the Narendra

Modi government is committed towards the welfare of the poor. Out of the houses sanctioned by the Centre 1.42 lakh are meant for people affected by cyclone Fani in May 2019.

Describing the step taken by the Centre as significant, the senior BJP leader said the state government must take immediate steps to issue work orders for construction of houses of all the eligible people. "All the 9.59 lakh beneficiaries should get



the work orders by February and I request the state government to ensure that it is done in a transparent manner," she added.

"Many people do not have a roof over their heads. Therefore, we have to issue work orders as soon as possible," she said.

Pregnant woman dies after being released from Odisha's Rayagada jail

KORAPUT(KCN): A pregnant woman, who was arrested and kept in a jail at Rayagada in Odisha for 16 days, has died due to post-delivery complications a day after her release.

Thirty-year-old Sulabati Naik, a resident of Andrakanch village under Maikanch panchayat and wife of a daily wage labourer, died on the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday, her family

continue, our judiciary has no future. Recently, while I was in the Supreme Court a few lawyers told me that Ms. Jaising is being hypocritical that she's back to wearing the square gown. I did not believe this to be true at all. Like the doubting Thomas, I said I will not believe unless I see it for myself. A day thereafter, I happened to come across, to my total disbelief, you wearing a square gown. I couldn't resist myself from confronting you. I asked you point blank 'Madam, after denouncing the senior gown in the public domain so vocally how can you go back to quietly wearing it'. You were visibly taken aback. I told you honestly that when lawyers had told me that you had started wearing the square gown again after all that noise, I said would not believe it unless I see it with my own eyes. I am reminded of the words of Christ, "you hyprocite, first take out the log out of your own eye, and then you will be able to see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye". The explanation you offered, flimsy as could be, was that your gown was missing. Arranging a gown is hardly a task. I could have only wished that you had a better answer, though I doubt anything would be an acceptable one.

What prompted me to address this letter is the news I came across on social media that you have addressed to the Chief Justice Bombay High Court a letter, speaking on behalf of the underprivileged, minorities and women, that the requirement of the Bombay High court Rules on senior designation that an applicant for designation shall be supported by recommendation by two senior advocates "would create hurdles in female lawyers and minorities being designated" and be dispensed with.

Dear Ms. Jaising, could anything be more hypocritical than your hollow concern for women, minorities and the underprivileged. If you are truly concerned about the underprivileged, then you must support the abolition of the senior designation system which has caused unthinkable damage to the interests of the underprivileged, women and mi-

When we got independence there was no system of senior designation. It all came much later. If you are really concerned about the "old boys club" and the unthinkable damage it has caused to the justice delivery system, you must support us in our cause for total abolition, which will be the first step in bringing a semblance of fairness and equity in the temples of justice. It will be the first step in correcting the damage caused to the institution of judiciary due to nepotism, favouritism, kinship and subjugation of the bar. It will bring an end to the apartheid in the legal profession.

Dear Ms. Jaising, the senior designation system can make even "seniors" like you a slave as we recently witnessed in Oza's case (Gujarat).

I remain in the unstinted hope that you will introspect and realise that you cannot be supporting the designation system and in the same breath be blind to the ill treatment of lawyers and litigants facilitated by the senior designation system and speak against discrimination and injustice.

One Nation, One Medical Treatment

Health care including primary, secondary and

tertiary care system in India has been battling with various issues apart from lower number of medical institutions and adequate human resources. The Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) states that the delivery

of primary healthcare is provided to the rural population through subcentre, Primary Health Centre (PHC), and Community Health Centre (CHC), while secondary care is delivered through district and sub-district hospitals. On the other hand, tertiary care is extended at regional /

central level institutions or super specialty hospitals. Although Public Health is a State subject, the National Health Mission (NHM), a flagship programme of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India with its two Sub-Missions, National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) and National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) supports States / UTs to strengthen their health care systems so as to provide universal access to equitable, affordable and quality health care services.

But, it is a matter of great regret that the common citizens are greatly deprived of the so called various declared health schemes both the by the State Governments and Central Govt. Even, the treatment against Reproductive, Maternal, Neonatal, Child and Adolescent health, National Nutritional Programmes, Communicable and Non-communicable diseases varies from one hospital to other. Most of the time, continuous conflicts are mushrooming in between the Centre and States in this regard to which the innocent patients and their relatives are

Everybody might have witnessed that the cost, quality and procedure of medical treatment to the citizens widely differ from hospital to hospital. More importantly, the behaviour of the private, corporate and Govt. hospitals and health care units towards the patients and their attendants are visible in accordance with the status and paying capacity. Even the common patients are treated separately than the card holders in the same hospital. The treatment for the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) card holder provided by Govt. of India differs from that of a Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY) card holder facilitated by the Govt. of Odisha. Unlike Odisha, different State Governments in India have their own health care facilities. The same facility varies for the card holders under Central Govt. Health Scheme (CGHS) from PMJAY or BSKY. Even under CGHS, it is separate for the employees, pensioners and public representatives. The status and cadre of the employee / pensioner play an important role. Illustratively, under CGHS, officers / officials having basic pay (as per 7^{th} CPC) up to 36500/- are entitled for medical treatment in a General Ward while officers / officials having basic pay of Rs

36501 to 50500/- and **Bruhaspati Samal** Rs. 50501 and above are entitled for treatment

in Semi Private Ward and Private Ward As such, in a welfare country like India, we don't

have uniform treatment facility for the patients. When deceases don't discriminate among rich or poor, beggar or millionaire, peasant or politician, labourer or bureaucrat, employed or unemployed, State Govt. or Central Govt. employees, cardholder or having no card, it is highly unfortunate that the entitlement of treatment highly differs from person to person basing on the social status in India. Observing this pan India gross mismatch of medical treatment to the citizens, a brief analysis of the Right to Equality may be considered proper. The Right to Equality, one of the Fundamental Rights enshrined both in the Preamble and under Article 14 to 18 of the Constitution of India states that the State shall not deny to any person equality before the law or the equal protection of the laws within the territory of India. It guarantees equal rights for everyone, irrespective of religion, gender, caste, race, sex or place of birth. Especially the provisions under Article 15 are very clear and loud that no citizen shall on the above grounds only or any of them be subject to any disability, liability restriction or conditions with regard to access to shop, public restaurants, hotels and places of public entertainment or use of wells, tanks, bathing hats, roads and places of public resort maintained by wholly or partly out of State funds or dedicated to the use of general public. According to the observation and analysis on Indian Constitution by Sir Ivor Jennings, a constitutional critic and an expert on constitutional law, equality before the law means that among equals the law should be equal and should be equally administered, that like should be treated alike. The right to sue and be sued, to prosecute and be prosecuted for the same kind of action should be same for all citizens of full age and understanding without distinctions of race, religion, wealth, social status or political influence. Thus the health care units being the public institutions and mostly maintained by the State funds can't treat the patients separately basing on their social status or otherwise.

The Govt. of India is now giving several clarion calls like; One Nation - One Ration Card, One Nation – One Election, One Nation – One Identity Card, One Nation – One Fertilizer, One Nation – One Uniform, One Nation – One Language etc. In the same analogy, why can't we go for One Nation – One Medical Treatment? Since the law says to treat equally all, now time has come to think in this regard more seriously to provide equal medical treatment to all citizens without distinctions of race, religion, wealth, social status or political influence. Our learned public representatives should floor a bill in the Parliament soon and the Govt. of India needs to discuss arranging an all party meeting to honour the Constitution.

COVID-19 crisis: Celebrity deaths in China spark fears over death toll

public is prompting people to question the official Covid death toll, according to a media report.

The death of Chu Lanlan, a 40-year-old opera singer, last month came as a shock to many, given how young she was, BBC reported. Her family members said they were saddened

by her "abrupt departure", but did not give details of the cause of her death, the report said. China scrapped its strict zero-Covid policy in December and has seen a rapid surge of infections and deaths. There are reports of hospitals and crematoria becoming overwhelmed. But the country has stopped publishing daily case data and has announced only 22 Covid deaths since December, using its own strict criteria. Now, only those who die from respiratory illnesses such as pneumonia are counted.

On Wednesday, the World Health Organization (WHO) warned that China was underrepresenting the true impact of Covid in the country - in particular deaths.

The BBC reported that Chinese media divulged details surrounding the deaths of 16 scientists from the country's top science and engineering academies from December 21 to 26. However, none of these deaths were

But the deaths of Chu Lanlan and others are sparking speculation about greater losses than those reported on official accounts.

According to the specialist news website Operawire, Chu Lanlan was a soprano who specialised in Peking Opera - a theatrical art in which performers use speech, song, dance and combat movements to tell stories - and was also involved in charitable causes.

On New Year's Day, news of the death of actor Gong Jintang devastated many Chinese internet users, BBC reported. Gong, 83, was known to many households for his performance in the country's longest-running TV series, 'In-Laws, Out-laws'.

His portrait of Father Kang had captivated fans for more than two decades since the show first aired in 2000. The cause of his death is unclear, but many social media users linked it to the recent deaths of other older people, BBC reported.



India's forex reserves drop by USD 1.268 billion to USD 561.583 billion MUMBAI: India's forex reserves declined by USD 1.268 billion to USD 561.583 billion for the week ended January 6, the Reserve Bank said on Friday.

The overall reserves had increased by USD 44 million to USD 562.851 billion in the previous reporting week after two consecutive weeks of the slide.

In October 2021, the country's foreign exchange kitty reached an all-time high of USD 645 billion. The reserves had been declining as the central bank deployed the reserves to defend the rupee amid pressures caused by global developments.

Foreign currency assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves, dropped by USD 1.747 billion to USD 496.441 billion during the week to January 6, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI.

'We need Western tanks': Ukraine's crews warn of frontline losses

October that is still near heated battle lines, as Kyiv was repeating pleas for modern armour.

Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba this week again pressed Western allies, which have funnelled military aid, including artillery, air defence systems and infantry fighting vehicles to Ukraine.

A spotlight has been on German-made Leopard battle tanks, which Poland has said it is ready to provide but only with Berlin's green light.

These more advanced tanks have upgrades to their Soviet counterparts, explained Captain Volodymyr Tchaikovsky, 54, but none so important as where ammunition is stored.

"In the Soviet tank, the crew is sitting on the ammunition, so if the tank is hit, it almost means 100 percent of the crew is dead," he said, comparing that with the Leopard, where ammunition is stored behind a protective panel instead of in the compartment.

"We are first and foremost interested in the safety of our crew and their lives are our priority. Equipment can be replaced but not the crew," said Tchaikovsky.

"It's the main reason why we need Western tanks. Everything else: GPS, night vision, thermal vision ... comes second," he said, listing key attributes of armour on his wish list. Last Ukraine doctors offer lifeline in shell-ridden Bakhmut

Not a 'silver bullet'

Mark Cancian, senior advisor for the Center for Strategic and International Studies' International Security Program, underscored this feature as well.

He said that while to some that's "a design defect" because it makes the tank larger and provides a bigger target, it's a "trade off" -- one the Ukrainians appear all for.

Cancian said the newer tanks also have better mechanisms for finding targets and hitting them at longer range compared to those used by Russia and Ukraine.

These controls can be retrofitted onto the T-72, which make up the bulk of the some 700 tanks Ukraine had when Russia invaded in February last year, according to Cancian.

Those refittings might be a better priority for Ukraine, he added, highlighting that the reported number of Leopard tanks that could be sent is "not going to be a silver bullet."

Polish President Andrzej Duda said Warsaw was prepared to send a company of Leopards without specifying the exact number, during a visit to the western Ukrainian city of Lviv on Wednesday.

Ukraine state media reported that the Polish army structure indicates a tank company has 14 tanks.

With that number, and even if tens more are sent, Cancian said, "the symbolism is much more important than the actual military capability."

The Kremlin has argued that further Western donations of weapons would change nothing, and only prolong the fighting.

But for Tchaikovsky, whose 25-year-old son is a first lieutenant in his battalion, the backing means everything.

"If we don't receive foreign support, the conflict will drag on and there will be more losses," he said.

"The complete roll out of 4G service by BSNL across the country is expected by the end of this year. Since BSNL does not have legacy network, the 4G towers can be upgraded to 5G very fast. There will be no issues in faster roll out of 5G service by BSNL in India," he observed.

Vaishnaw and Union Minister for Education and Skill Development Dharmendra Pradhan launched the much awaited 5G service in the twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack.

The service will now be provided by Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel in the state in the first phase. The operators have installed 510 base transceiver stations (BTS) towers, including 410 by Jio, to provide the service.

The 5G service will be available in eight cities and towns, including Berhampur, Rourkela, Sambalpur, Puri, Balasore and Angul by March this year and the 5G network will cover entire Odisha by December 2024.

Vaishnaw said the fifth-generation cellular technology will bring a revolution at the grassroots level as it will not only be available for cell phone users, but also for many public services like health and education.

"The Narendra Modi government has sanctioned Rs 5600 crore for setting up 5000 mobile towers in around 7000 unconnected villages in Odisha. The towers will be installed by August 15, 2024. The state has also been allocated Rs 1080 crore for laying of fibre optics for high speed broadband service under the Bharat Net project," he said.

The union ministers also inaugurated 100 mobile towers set up in Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nabarangpur, Nuapada and Rayagada districts.

Odisha was among the states included in the phase-one roll out of 5G service.

He truly comes alive when he's freestyling. He's known for lifting the ball — a form of 3D skill — and when he displays it in front of his teammates, you can see why he likes 'lifting the ball'. Apart from playing for the national team, he hopes to emulate idol Amit Rohidas (the current India vice-captain also came through this hostel), who enjoys a sort of cult personality in these parts. "He came from so little and look at him now. He's the man (for me)," Barwa, who's a midfielder, says.

Like some of the other parts of the city, the hostel too has got a fresh coat of paint. Two sparkling blue FIH-approved astroturfs were used for sessions for the first time on Monday -- a worn-down green astroturf was in business before it was replaced -- to the delight of the trainees.

Jothikumari Toppo, another of the trainees at the hostel, says her dream is to emulate Vandana Katariya by featuring at the Olympics. "I like Vandana," the 22-year-old forward who has been to the junior India camp in Bengaluru, smiles. "I want to ultimately play at the Olympics. But then for every Toppo and Barwa, there are others who may never even have the opportunity to realise their childhood sporting dreams. For every kid who currently calls this hostel home, there have been countless many who have fallen through because of a want of the required talent to keep performing at this level.

"There is a weeding process in place," Lazarus Barla, one of the coaches at the hostel, explains. "The ones who don't perform lose their place and those slots are taken by the players who come in and this cycle continues." Barla, a former India player and very much of this parish, beams with pride when the conversation shifts to the big event. "Didn't expect this, we are living a dream," he says. Capital infusion in Vodafone Idea under discussion: Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw

BHUBANESWAR: Debt-ridden telecom firm Vodafone Idea has various requirements, including infusion of capital, and discussions on this front are going on, Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Thursday.

Vodafone Idea (VIL), reeling under debt burden of over Rs 2 lakh crore, has opted for converting about Rs 16,000 crore of interest liability payable to the government into equity, which will amount to around a 33 per cent stake in the company while promoters' holding will come down to 50 per cent from 74.99 per cent.

'Vodafone (Idea) has many requirements. It has a particular requirement of capital. How much capital, who will infuse? All those things are under discussion at this point of time," Vaishnaw said. VIL has offered a stake to the government at a par value of Rs 10 per share and the government is waiting for the company's shares to stabilise at Rs 10 apiece.

Independence period, thereby leading to a massive exodus of population from this area.

Elaborating on a twin approach to address the situation, the PM said, "On the one hand, the campaign to clean Ganga was undertaken through 'Namami Gange' and on the other hand, 'Arth Ganga' was taken up. In Arth Ganga steps have been taken to create an environment of economic dynamism in the states from where Ganga passes." Addressing the foreign tourists who are travelling on the maiden voyage of the cruise, the Prime Minister said, "Today India has everything and a lot beyond your imagination. India can only be experienced from the heart, as the nation has welcomed everyone with open hearts, irrespective of region or religion, creed or country and welcomed tourists from all parts of the world."

"One can witness the extraordinary amalgamation of the heritage of India and its modernity on this cruise," the Prime Minister remarked as he shed light on the new era of cruise tourism, where new employment opportunities will be created for the youth of the country.

"Not just foreign tourists but Indians who travelled to different nations for such an experience can head towards North India now," the Prime Minister said. "Strong connectivity is essential for building a developed India," the Prime Minister said and stressed that the rivers of India will give new heights to water power, trade and tourism in the country.

The Prime Minister underlined the low usage of river waterways in the country before 2014, despite the rich history of this mode of transport in the country. Mr Modi said that, post-2014, India is harnessing this ancient strength for the cause of modern India. There is a new law and a detailed action plan for developing waterways in the country's major rivers.

"Similarly, there has been a three-fold increase in cargo transportation via river waterways from 30 lakh metric tonnes eight years ago," he said.

The Prime Minister further noted that waterways are not just beneficial to the environment but also help save money. "The cost of operating waterways is two-and-a-half times lesser than that of roadways, and one-third lesser when compared to railways," he said.

Speaking about the National Logistics Policy, Mr Modi stated that India has the potential to develop a thousands of kilometres of waterway network. He also emphasised that India has more than 125 rivers and river streams, which can be developed to transport goods and ferry people while also giving impetus to further expanding port-led development.

Referring to Ganga Vilas, the Prime Minister said that similar experiences are being planned for other inland waterways in the country in order to boost cruise tourism while keeping both budget and luxury in mind.

The voyage from Varanasi to Dibrugarh on the world's longest river cruise, the MV Ganga Vilas, covering five Indian states and Bangladesh, will cost `50-55 lakhs per passenger.

The 51-day cruise is planned with visits to 50 tourist spots, including world heritage sites, national parks, river ghats, and major cities like Patna in Bihar, Sahibganj in Jharkhand, Kolkata in West Bengal, Dhaka in Bangladesh and Guwahati in Assam.

The MV Ganga Vilas is the first-ever cruise vessel made in India. The luxury cruise has three decks, 18 suites on board, 39 crew members, a capacity of 36 tourists and all the luxury amenities.

On board, the tourists will be served local food and seasonal vegetables. No non-vegetarian food or liquor will be on the menu.

According to Antara Luxury River Cruises, which is operating the MV Ganga Vilas, the cruise is fully booked till March 2024. Most of the tourists who have secured seats are from the US and Europe.

Messi scores in first game after World Cup as PSG wins PARIS: Lionel Messi scored in his first game since leading Argentina to the World Cup title as French league leader Paris Saint-Germain beat Angers 2-0.

Nearly four weeks after the final against France in Qatar, Messi needed only five minutes to make an impact.

He turned neatly near the penalty area and

Messi then started the move that led to his 72nd-minute goal, with Ekitiké and Mukiele combining quickly to put him through before he side-footed home.

His eighth league goal this season was initially disallowed for offside but then awarded following a video review.

It was otherwise a poor performance overall from PSG against a team in last place, but the Parisian club moved six points clear at the top after second-place Lens drew 2-2 at 19th-place Strasbourg.

Messi was given a warm ovation by the crowd at Parc des Princes, who chanted his name when he applauded them back. He scored twice against France in a wild 3-3 draw on

18 and converted his penalty in the shootout. Messi and PSG teammate Kylian Mbappé, who scored a hat trick in the final, are frontrunners to win the next men's Ballon d'Or award.

With Mbappé rested, Messi started in attack with Neymar and Ekitiké. But PSG was asleep for stretches of the game and Angers had two good chances before Messi's goal. PSG's players warmed up wearing T-shirts with Pelé's face on.

The Brazilian great who won a record threeWorld Cups, died in late December at the age of 82.

Elaborating it further, he said, "I was dropped at the last minute while someone from Punjab was picked. I even got my kit bag and everything there in Delhi before being dropped off. Anyway, I was young then and couldn't have retaliated. I came back and played in the 1976 Montreal Olympics with almost the same squad. I went on to play till 1982. Regrets are there but not at the cost of my conscience."

72-year-old Baskaran, however, said it was his exclusion from the 1982 World Cup squad that hurt him more. The event was held in Mumbai, then called Bombay. "The 1975 episode was okay for me as the team had won but 1982 was definitely a heartbreak. The man who replaced me had not even played hockey after 1975. How can it be justified? In 1975, I was young and didn't have any problems but in 1982 I was the most senior player, I was outstanding in my position, outstanding in all departments. But here a man had replaced me who had last played seven years ago. I was there in the Bengaluru camp. There was a public agitation in Bengaluru after I was dropped and open letters were also sent to the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi."

Baskaran then switched to coaching and was given the reins of the junior team in due course of time. Under his coaching, the Indian team reached the final of the Junior



World Cup in 1997 eventually losing to Australia. He also coached the senior team in two World Cups (1998 and 2006) apart from the 2000 Sydney Olympics when a last-minute equaliser by Poland prevented India from reaching the semifinals.

India's chances

Given his exploits as the coach, Baskaran strongly believes that India has a good chance at the World Cup. "India is in Pool D with England, Spain and Wales. All of them are good teams. The hosts should qualify but what matters is them topping the group. The first match against Spain will be crucial. Spain has a good defence and will not allow space to play. The quicker India settle down in the first quarter, the better it will be for them. We need a good and confident start," said Baskaran.

He also feels that this set of players are playing together for the past two-three, which will be an advantage for the team. "We have excellent midfielders like Vivek Sagar Prasad, Nilakanta Sharma, Surender Kumar and Manpreet Singh. Drag-flicker Harmanpreet Singh, who will also lead the side, is the team's strength. Then we have Akashdeep Singh, who can score at any time. And who can forget goalkeeper PR Sreejesh? He obviously will be a very important man for the team. Overall the team is very good," Baskaran said.



Meanwhile goalkeeper PR Sreejesh, midfield ace Manpreet Singh and striker Mandeep Singh are all capable of game-changing moments on their own

England has participated in every edition of the World Cup, and are capable of creating major upsets. They have reached the semi-finals of the last three World Cup competitions but missed the podium on each occasion.
