





Survival of Richest: The Indian Experience

Oxfam India has recently published a report titled "Survival of Richest: The India Story". The title shows alarming situation of widening inequality in India. The journey for Charles Darwin's "Survival of Fittest" to "Survival of Richest" is not fascinating at all.

Inequalities are growing in India – this has been corroborated by scholars and government bodies alike. The impact of inequality is especially stark at the margins of the Indian society, with some communities such as the Scheduled Tribes (STs) suffering from physical remoteness and systematic exclusion from the means to achieve vertical mobility. Furthermore, the concentration of wealth continues to be around primordial characteristics

Recycling of waste glass needed in the country

One of the ways of reducing the consumption of natural sand is to utilise wastes as an alternative material. Recycling of wastes could reduce the demand for virgin natural resources and help to dispose of them effectively. The volumes of wastes generated each year in the country is alarmingly increasing due to a rise in the pollution. When it comes to solid waste the world produces nearly 2.0 billion tonnes of municipal solid waste every year, which is expected to grow to 3.4 billion tonnes by 2050. The increasing price and diminishing reserves of construction sand encourage a need to develop its sustainable and cost-effective replacement, helping the transition towards a circular economy. Traditional construction sand can be replaced by waste glass. Waste glass is a derivative of natural sand and could potentially show similar geotechnical behaviour. Using crushed waste glass as an alternative to traditional sand would potentially offer a double-duty benefit by helping to address the geoenvironmental challenges of natural sand depletion and disposal of ever-increasing waste glass, together.

Natural aggregates are widely used in a range of applications. Presently, the construction industry is the biggest consumer of natural resources in the world. It is a common practice to crush and screen the rock formations to different specifications, producing aggregates suitable for different construction applications. The consumption of aggregates is expected to increase at a rate of 5% per annum in India. Major sources of natural construction aggregates include crushed stone, gravel, and sand. In the country alone, nearly 300 million tonnes of aggregates are extracted each year, which is expected to further increase in the coming years. A key concern for sustainable infrastructure construction is the continuous diminution of readily-available construction aggregates. Environmentally, the extraction and logistics of aggregates release carbon footprint, which is harmful to the ecosystem. Consequently, nowadays, construction materials are increasingly being evaluated by their ecological footprint Natural sand is a widely used raw material and has become the second-most widely consumed natural resource on planet Earth, after freshwater. It is estimated that between 32 and 50 billion tonnes of sand and gravel are extracted globally each year, which is largely used in construction. As an example, the construction of a medium-sized house requires 200 tonnes of sand; a hospital needs 3000 tonnes of sand, and each kilometre of highway construction needs 30,000 tonnes of sand. Studies show that sand is currently being extracted at a rate far greater than its renewal. Indiscriminate mining of sand could endanger animal species and habitats, harm aquatic life and cause biodiversity loss. It could also cause beach erosion, making coastal communities vulnerable to floods and causing loss to the eco-tourism industry. It is, therefore, necessary to find ways to reduce the demand for natural sand and to look for sustainable and low-carbon alternatives. In this regard, research has proven that the potential use of ever-increasing waste glass as a sustainable alternative to depleting natural and manufactured sand in geotechnical construction is feasible. The findings showed that the geotechnical behaviour of crushed waste glass is similar, or sometimes even superior, to traditional construction sands. Overall, the crushed waste glass could potentially serve as an alternative and smart geomaterial, ultimately promoting the recycling of waste glass, reducing the burden on landfill and conserving natural resources, all helping the transition towards a circular economy.

continue to shape power and influence and on the other hand, we see the persistence of marginalization among historically disadvantaged who are trapped in intergenerational poverty.

Oxfam India's 2023 India Supplement reveals some stark findings proving that the gap between the rich and the poor is indeed widening. Following the pandemic in 2019, the bottom 50% of the population have continued to see their wealth chipped away. By 2020, their income share was estimated to have fallen to only 13% of the national income and have less than 3% of the total wealth. Its impact has been exceptionally poor diets, increase in debt and deaths.

This is in stark contrast to the top 30% who own more than 90% of the total wealth. Among them, the top 10% own more than 80% of the concentrated wealth. The wealthiest 10% own more than 72% of the total wealth, the top 5% own nearly 62% of the total wealth, and the top 1% own nearly 40.6% of the total wealth in India.

The country still has the world's highest number of poor at 228.9 million. On the other hand, the total number of billionaires in India increased from 102 in 2020 to 166 billionaires in 2022. The combined wealth of India's 100 richest has touched INR 54.12 lakh crore. The wealth of the top 10 richest stands at INR 27.52 lakh crore – a 32.8% rise from 2021.

Imposing a tax on the wealth of the richest has been advocated over the years. The rationale behind this has been that the wealth accumulation by the creamiest layer of the country is massive and taxing it can generate huge revenue, which can then be redirected for the development of the social sectors of the country. This has the potential to redistribute the resource accumulation by the rich to the poor as well, and can then reduce poverty and inequality

in the country. The wealth tax is likely to be the most direct and

powerful tool to restore tax progressivity at the very top of the distribution. A wealth tax with a high exemption threshold specifically targets the richest and could resolve this injustice.

Revenues from progressive taxation has the capacity to fund the country's health and education system. 3% of wealth tax on the Indian billionaires can fund the National Health Mission, the largest healthcare scheme in India with an allocation of INR 37,800 crores for 3 years. Taxing the top 10 billionaires at 5% will help cover the entire cost of Tribal healthcare for five years.

Taxing all of India's billionaires at 2% would support the requirement of INR 42,033 crores for the nutrition of the malnourished in the country for 3 years. To raise the expenditure on health to 3% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), a total expenditure of INR 1,06,600 crores would be required. This money can be raised by taxing the top 100 billionaires at 2%.

Taxing the wealthiest 10 billionaires at 1% would be enough to cover this shortfall for 1.3 years. Taxing them at 4% would cover the entire amount of funds required for two years. Taxing the top 100 Indian billionaires at 2.5%, or taxing the top 10 Indian billionaires at 5% would cover the entire amount required to bring the children back into school.

The rising wealth inequality calls for immediate interventions to reduce the existing inequalities and enhance the access to public services for the poor. The wealthiest elites have undue influence over policy making and politics, which allow them to accrue even more wealth. We must break this vicious cycle. This means taxing the net wealth of the top 1% on a permanent basis, with higher rates for millionaires, multi-millionaires and billionaires. The government should reduce the GST slabs on essential commodities, which form the majority of the poor and middle classes spending habits, and

hike the taxes on luxury goods. This will lead to revenue generation, which is progressive in nature and reduce the burden on the poor.

Enhance the budgetary allocation for health to 2.5% of GDP by 2025, as envisaged in the National Health Policy, to reinvigorate the public healthcare system, reduce Out-of-pocket (OOP) expenditure and strengthen health prevention and promotion. Establish medical colleges with district hospitals, particularly in hilly, tribal or rural areas where health infrastructure is poor. This would facilitate the availability of medical services and human resources as well as increase the number of medical professionals in the country. Strengthen Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs) and government hospitals with adequate number of doctors, nurses, paramedics, equipment and other infrastructural requirements as per Indian Public Health Standard (IPHS) norms to make quality health service available within kilometers radii of peoples' residence or workplace. Enhance the budgetary allocation for education to global benchmark of 6% of GDP, as committed in the National Education Policy. The government must frame a year wise financial roadmap to achieve the 6% mark. Reduce existing inequalities in education by spending more on programmes (for example: Pre Matric and Post Matric scholarships) meant for improving the educational status of students from marginalized sections (SC/ ST/Girls).

Inflation and, consequently, rise in cost of living hurts the poor and middle class more. 90% of India's labour force in the informal economy is without any safety net to protect them from the heavy blows to the economy. To this end, it is essential to ensure social protection for our workforce, especially those in the informal sector, and strengthen monitoring and tracking mechanisms that ensure protection of the labour class of the country.

of Indian Army has come a long way ahead and at present, stands studded on the brink of changing warfare dynamics. As the cloud of fighting a two-front war is hanging over New Delhi, the diplomats are having a tough time as they are busy buying time. Though,

in the era of Nuclear weapons, it seems far from the reality that either of our adversaries will get involved in a full-blown conventional war. However, the legacy which China owns of being a non-reliable and expansionist country, nothing can be neglected. On the other hand, a ever hostile Islamabad exists, which continuously lurks to find an opportunity to reinforce itself behind Chinese aggression. Thus, it becomes very crucial to understand the preparedness of the Indian armed forces. Although India has the fourth most powerful military power in the world, still the armed forces are facing a huge challenge of modernization. Looking at the threat perceptions of India, it is important to overcome those challenges. In recent times the dimensions of warfare have changed considerably and therefore Defence policy perspectives have to take into account our responses to a short war situations as well as proxy wars. It therefore becomes imperative that arming and modernisation of forces with the right capability and technology cannot be delayed any longer. With this in view, Atma-Nirbharta or Self reliance in defence will have to address two important areas i.e. maintenance of existing assets and acquisition of next generation weapon systems and platforms.

The country cannot have too many dependencies and Indigenous production has to be the Vision. We need to therefore, establish a "Production Eco System", which shall meet our requirements. The key areas which would need our emphasis would relate to design and development of technology and utilisation of all our national resources and capability in terms of the Public sector, Private sector, Academia, Industry and start ups. A lot of programmes are on the roll to acquire a modern rifles, machine guns and protective gears.

The army has already begun the process to acquire the same. The long standing Made in India 'INSAS' rifle is being replaced by the American SIG Sauer rifles, as the standard rifle for the Infantry. Apart from this, 2023 is going to be a milestone year, as the long awaited AK 203 Kalashnikov Rifles will start to arrive, as a result of a joint collaboration between Ordnance Factory Board and Russia. Apart from this, India is reorganizing its mechanized force to achieve strategic mobility for a quick thrust into enemy territory. Further, to add teeth to its firepower India has successfully ordered and inducted M777 howitzers from the USA and inducted new variant of DRDO developed Pinaka Multiple rocket launcher, which can fire a salvo of 12 HE rockets in just 44 seconds and has a range up to 90 km. The system mounted on TATA truck adds a feather to its mobility. Also, the DRDO developed Automated Towed Artillery Gun System(ATAGS) or also known as 'Indian Bofors' is what many believe, a game changer and is looked upon with promising eyes. All other Indigenous developments which the Army is keenly desperate to have hands on, include a wide array of missiles, Small arms ranging from pistols and Sub machine Guns to Sniper rifles, attachments of the same, Armoured vehicles to Main Battle Tanks, High altitude clothing and bullet proof jackets, Melee weapons and further on. However, with all these inductions and many others in the pipeline, the major issue that Indian the army still faces is the availability of funds for future procurement. Since modernization is a continuous process, it cannot be halted once new procurement is made.

Apart from the Arsenal, Army is also on the verge of a major restructurization after necessary approval. The concept of IBG or Integrated battle groups Once introduced in the Structurizational strata, these light brigadelevel all weather formations, which are capable of taking swift action, will be the need of the hour in coming decades. The aim of this reform is to cut the overall strength to about 1,50,000 personnel in 5-7 year span. This ultimate goal is to make the Army leaner and finer as well as stout. Cutting the personnel size will save adequate fund for equipping existing soldiers. In addition, a lot other transformational changes are being implemented organizationally, which is a positive sign. The creation of the Theatre Commands is a work at hand and may take a few years. In addition,

the aspects as discussed above, needs to be deliberated and implemented with meticulous forethought to make the Army leaner but with more agility. The creation of more counter-offensive Formations, which can be deployed at short notice, would become the key issue to raise India's strategic deterrence against China and thus prevent a war.

It is an undisputed fact that countries, which upgrade its military ahead of time, deter the adversary from waging war. Today's soldier needs to be technically savvy, physically and mentally robust. Indian armed forces also need a long term strategy which includes improving teeth to tail ratio, improving command, control, communication, intelligence and developing a large indigenous arsenal. However, over the period of time, Indian armed forces decided to carry out extensive and far-reaching reforms with the aim to enhance its warfighting capabilities. A lot is required to achieve the strategic objective and the military has the key role to play in attaining those objectives. Thus, it becomes crucial for the Indian Armed Forces to look into the loophole in the limited time frame and work to overcome those loopholes in a timebound manner. The process of modernizing the largest standing army in the world is without a doubt, an arduous task. The whole transition remains in the public domain because of the continuous tussle of the army with hostile neighbours.

Unfortunately, what many ignore or do not grasp is the fact that modernization of the armed forces is a time-consuming, tedious process and requires a clear vision, strategy and a shared common National goal. It cannot be something that changes with the change in the government. It is like adding a block to an existing one. National security is not the scenario where one runs for water after seeing the house on fire. It is the timely analysis of threat and building strategies to avert them. Both China and Pakistan are continued to orchestrate its destabilizing design against India. While Indian Army has to defend multiple fronts, either of our adversaries remain far from the threat perception levels as Delhi's. Although, history has it, that, It is not the machine but the man behind the machine that shifts the outcome of the war. However, undermining the adversary's capability itself goes against the basic principle of war.

Nepal plane crash: Search continues for last missing person


Kathmandu: The search for the last missing person in the Nepal plane crash resumed on Wednesday after rescuers on Tuesday pulled out one more body from the crash site where a Yeti Airlines aircraft carrying 72 people, including five Indians, had plunged in a river gorge in the resort city of Pokhara.

Two days after the fatal crash, a woman's body was found deep down in the Seti River gorge on Tuesday. With this, the bodies of 71 people who died in the crash have been retrieved. The search for the missing person started early morning on Wednesday with the help

Bishal Sharma, 22, Anil Kumar Rajbhar, 27, Sonu Jaiswal, 35, and Sanjaya Jaiswal.

As many as 48 bodies of the deceased have been brought to Kathmandu, the report added. The dead bodies except that of the locals and those who could not be identified and those of foreigners were flown to Kathmandu on Tuesday afternoon.

The bodies of the 48 victims have been brought to Kathmandu via Nepal Army helicopters for post-mortem at Maharajgunjbased Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospi-



of divers and four drones, rescuers have given up hope of finding the missing person alive, MyRepublica newspaper reported.

The Yeti Airlines aircraft took off from Kathmandu's Tribhuvan International Airport at 10:33 am on Sunday and crashed on the bank of the Seti River between the old airport and the new airport in Pokhara, minutes before landing.

Fifty-three Nepalese passengers and 15 foreign nationals, including 5 Indians, and four crew members were on board the Yeti Airlines aircraft when it crashed.

The five Indians, all from Uttar Pradesh, have been identified as Abhisekh Kushwaha, 25, Superintendent of Police Dinesh Mainali of Kathmandu Police Range said the bodies will be handed over to the respective families only after the completion of an autopsy.

?Forensics experts are currently working to complete the autopsy of the deceased. After we get the autopsy report, we will hand over the mortal remains of the deceased to the respective family members,? he said.

Meanwhile, a team of experts from France arrived in Nepal on Tuesday to study the ATR plane crash of Yeti Airlines that took place in Pokhara on January 15. A nine-member expert team from the company that manufactures the ATR aircraft has reached Pokhara.


Masterda Surya Sen attained his martyrdom on 12th January 1934 in Chittagong,

Microsoft to lay off staff again from today: Reports

SAN FRANCISCO (KCN): Microsoft is readying to cut more positions from its global workforce as tech giants continue paring headcount to ride out rough economic conditions, according to media reports on Tuesday.

The computer industry stalwart could announce layoffs in its engineering divisions as early as Wednesday, Bloomberg News reported.



A Microsoft spokesperson told AFP that the company would not comment on what it referred to as "rumor."

The Washington state-based company, which industry trackers say has more than 220,000 workers, trimmed its ranks of employees twice last year.

A new layoff announcement would come a week before Microsoft is to report its earnings for the final three months of last year.

"Over the last few weeks we have seen significant headcount cut reduction from stalwarts Salesforce and Amazon," Wedbush analyst Dan Ives said in a note to investors.

Wedbush is expecting staff cuts of another 5 to 10 percent across the tech sector, Ives told investors.

"Many of these companies were spending money like 1980's Rock Stars and now need to reign in the expense controls ahead of a softer (macroeconomic conditions)," Ives wrote.

Amazon announced in early January that it plans to cut more than 18,000 jobs from its workforce, citing "the uncertain economy" and the fact the online retail behemoth had "hired rapidly" during the pandemic.

The job-slashing plan is the largest among recent layoffs that have impacted the once-unassailable US tech sector, including at giants such as Facebook-owner Meta.

Some of the Amazon layoffs would be in Europe, CEO Andy Jassy in a statement to staff, adding that the impacted workers would be informed starting on Wednesday, January 18.

Major platforms with an advertising-based business model are facing budget cuts from advertisers, who are reducing expenses in the face

Meta announced in November the loss of 11,000 jobs, or about 13 percent of its workforce. At the end of August, Snapchat let go about 20 percent of its employees, around 1,200 people.

And in early January, IT group Salesforce announced it was laying off around 10 percent of its employees, or just under 8,000 people

Twitter was bought in October by billionaire Elon Musk, who promptly fired about half of the social media platform's 7,500 employees.

An unknown number more resigned in protest of his policy changes.

belonged to Biju Babu and remaining were hired by him. At least nine were crashed while one is in Indonesia, another brought to Odisha. There is no information available of the remaining three aircrafts of the Kalinga Airlines, he said.

The plane remained abandoned for decades on the premises of the Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata. The aircraft weighed over 8 tonnes and was around 64 feet 8 inches long.

The State Government started the process to bring back the Dakota plane in 2017. On December 13, 2017, the Airports Authority of India (AAI) had written to the State Government and proposed to shift the plane from Kolkata. The AAI had also offered all assistance and support to the State Government in procuring the aircraft.

The State Government again wrote to AAI on January 22, 2020, and informed that it should be displayed near Biju Patnaik's statue outside Bhubaneswar airport. The process was stalled for two years due to the Covid pandemic in 2020 and 2021.

The vintage Dakota aircraft reached temple city during the Men's Hockey World Cup. It is a significant achievement for the State to showcase to visitors, especially foreigners. The Odisha government has engaged a specialised team to reassemble the dismantled parts after the vehicles carrying them arrive at the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA) in Bhubaneswar. The Airports Authority of India (AAI) has allotted 1.1 acres of land for this purpose at the BPIA Bhubaneswar. Now, people will be able to see the symbol of Biju Babu's bravery in the city.

NADA that has apparently been sent to Dutee has said that she tested positive for SARMs. The urine sample apparently was collected out-of-competition in Bhubaneswar on December 5. She tested positive for andarine and its me-

tion of India said it cannot say much on this on technical grounds. But AFI did say that when the antidoping violation occurred (date on which sample was collected) she was not part of a national camp. "She was not with any national camp for some time now and was practicing on her own," said a top official. "She was training outside AFI's jurisdiction and we did not know where she was during that period."

Of late, ligandrol has been detected in quite a few samples in the country. It is a Selective Androgen Receptor Modulator (SARM) that was developed to treat elderly patients suffering from muscle and nerve damage. It is illegal to buy anywhere in the world as the American company developing it has still not approved it for human consumption. But the drug is freely available on the black market especially in eastern European countries, with many online sites selling it. There were even reports that it was being used on race-



ceptor Modulator (SARM). It is banned at all times under S1.2 of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) list of prohibited substances.
