UK PM Rishi Sunak defends PM Modi over controversial BBC series

Sunak has come out in defence of Prime Min-

LONDON(KCN): Prime Minister Rishi knew the "extent of Narendra Modi's involvement", then Gujarat chief minister, in the com-

munal clashes that claimed hundreds of lives.

Pakistani-origin Imran Hussain, member of Parliament for Bradford East, asked Sunak if he agreed with claims in the BBC programme that some UK Foreign Office diplomats believed that "Modi was directly responsible".

"The UK government's position on that is clear and long-standing, and it has not changed," Sunak responded. "Of course, we do not tolerate persecution anywhere, but I am not sure that I agree at all with the characterisation that the honourable gentleman has put forward," the British prime minister said.

BJP rejects Odisha govt's project execution claims

BHUBANESWAR(KCNB): As the state government is taking comfort under the latest report of Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE) for having the lowest unemployment rate in the country, the BJP on Wednesday said the latest Handbook of Statistics on Indian States published by the Reserve Bank of India gives a contrary picture.

According to the RBI report, the unemployment rate of rural India is 33 per 1,000 people while it is 50 per 1,000 population in Odisha. While the unemployment rate among the urban population of the country was 67 per 1,000 people, it was 78 per 1,000 people in Odisha. According to CMIE, Odisha registered the lowest unemployment rate of 0.9 per cent against 8.3 per cent at the national

BJP govt's policies 'create fear' among people, alleges Rahul Gandhi at Pathankot rally PATHANKOT(KCN): Congress leader Rahul

Gandhi on Thursday launched a scathing attack on the BJP-led Centre, alleging that its policies "create fear" among the people.

He also accused the BJP and the RSS of creating an atmosphere of hatred, violence and fear in the country.

The former Congress chief took on the Narendra Modi government over demonetisation, "faulty" Goods and Services

Tax (GST) and the Agnipath defence recruitment scheme. Addressing a rally here on the last day of Bharat Jodo Yatra's Punjab-leg, Gandhi

alleged that the BJP was making one religion fight against another, creating a wedge, pitting one caste against another and one language against another.

"They (BJP) create fear. All of their policies cause fear to one or the other," he alleged. Pointing towards the policies of the previous UPA government, Gandhi said it brought MGNREGA, waived farm loans, urban renewal mission, green revolution and white revolution.

"Whatever we do is to wipe out fear. And whatever they do they (BJP) do is to spread fear. Look at their policies -- farmers get up at 4 am in the morning and they toil hard daily and feed the nation. Farmers do not want anything in return, they only want respect," he said. He targeted the Centre over the now-repealed three agri laws and said these created fear in the minds of farmers.

"But what did BJP do for them -- they brought 'black' farm laws. These laws created fear among farmers," he said.

Speaking about the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima

Yojana, the Congress leader claimed that farmers were not getting compensation for their crop damage caused due to the vagaries of weather.

"Not even a single farmer told me that

they got insurance compensation when they suffered crop loss due to natural calamities," he claimed.

He targeted the Centre over the Agnipath defence recruitment scheme, saying it has shattered the dreams of those aspiring to join the defence forces.

He said lakhs of youths aspire to join the armed forces and protect the nation.

"Has the Agniveer scheme lessened their fear or increased it?" Gandhi asked the gathering, and after their reply, said, "hasn't this scheme increased their fear".

In India different herbs and spices like Tulsi (Ocomum), ginger, garlic, cardamum, honey ect are integral part of our culture and religion and are used in daily life be it for cosmetic purpose, part of rituals or for prevention and treatment of diseases. Among all these spices the most common household name is turmeric. In Hindu communities, turmeric is used in festive occasions like weddings as a marker of fertility and prosperity. The pre-wedding haldi ceremony, for instance, involves family elders applying turmeric paste on the faces of the bride and the groom in a blessing-meets-beauty ritual. The taali or mangalsutra (a thread tied around the bride's neck by the groom to formalise the marriage) is often a thick woven thread dipped in turmeric water; and even now, clothes worn on auspicious occasions (including weddings) have a touch of turmeric powder in some corner. Also, Indian women have always added a pinch of turmeric to their homemade face packs, believing that it leaves the skin clear and glowing. From applying a turmeric paste over sprained ankles to sniffing a smoked rhizome clump to ward off a cold, many Indians use turmeric as a home remedy, and it has been used in the traditional medical system of Ayurveda for centuries. As per Ayurveda, turmeric is the only medicinal ingredient that is used to treat all the doshas, to balance vata, pitta and kapha referring to the three energies

family, has been used for over 5,000 years as a medicinal herb and flavoring agent. Milk is a complete food that provides a high level of essential nutrients. Milk promotes good health and protect us against various diseases. With references across ancient schools of medicines such as Ayurveda, Unani and Siddha, various herbs and spices are being infused with milk and its byproducts since time immemorial for prevention and treatment of various diseases like inflammation, depression and even to induce better sleep. Among all these preparations that are used for prevention and treatment of various ailments the most common household name in India is "Turmeric milk". "Turmeric milk" or our own "haldi doodh" is all the rage in the West, but back home, it's an ancient 'nuskha' for almost every seasonal health problem. Be it cough, cold, fever, upset tummy or constipation, every desi mother in India insists their child have a cup of lukewarm haldi doodh. Turmeric gets both its bright yellow colour and its purported health benefits from the chemical component called curcumin. One theory is that curcumin's efficacy is boosted by the way it is fried in oil in Indian cooking. There is a lot of research findings which suggest that Curcumin is a fat-soluble compound, combining turmeric with fats enhances the absorption of curcumin than eating it in a water-soluble form. Since milk is also a rich source of fat, it means one can go for haldi doodh without any second thought. Indian haldi doodh or golden milk is

warm milk mixed with turmeric powder and sweetened with sugar but most of the time other ingrediants like ginger, cinnamon, clove, black pepper ect are used to enhance its favour, taste and so also functionality. In India the prepartion of haldi doodh varies from region to region but a standard version of its recipe which is most popular across the country is mentioned here. For a single serving of golden milk or about one cup, simply take 1/2 cup (120ml) of an unsweetened milk of your choice, 1 tsp of turmeric, 1 small piece of grated fresh ginger or 1/2 tsp of ginger powder, 1/2 tsp of cinnamon powder, 1 pinch of ground black pepper, 1 tsp of honey (optional). To make the golden milk, simply mix all these ingredients in a small saucepan or pot and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat and simmer for about 10 minutes or until fragrant and flavorful. Strain the drink through a fine strainer into mugs and top with a pinch of cinnamon. Your golden milk is ready, golden milk can also be made in advance and stored in your refrigerator for up to five days. Simply

reheat it before drinking. The key ingredient in golden milk is turmeric, Curcumin, the active component in turmeric, has been used in Ayurvedic medicine for centuries due to its strong antioxidant properties. Antioxidants are compounds that fight cell damage, protecting your body from oxidative stress. They're essential to the functioning of your cells, and studies regularly show that diets rich in antioxidants may help lower your risk of infections and disease. Most golden milk recipes also include cinnamon and ginger, both of which have impressive antioxidant properties as well. Chronic inflammation is thought to play a major role in chronic diseases, including cancer, metabolic syndrome, Alzheimer's and heart disease.

inflammatory compounds may reduce your risk of these conditions. Research shows that ginger, cinnamon and curcumin, the active ingredient in turmeric have potent anti-inflammatory properties. Studies even suggest that the antiinflammatory effects of curcumin are comparable to those of some pharmaceutical drugs with none of the side effects. Heart disease is the worldwide leading cause of death. Interestingly, cinnamon, ginger and turmeric, the key ingredients in golden milk have all been linked to a lower risk of heart disease. What's more, curcumin may improve the function of your blood vessel linings known as endothelial function. Proper endothelial function is important for a healthy heart. The ingredients in golden milk, particularly ginger and cinnamon, may help lower blood sugar levels. Cinnamon seems to reduce how much glucose is absorbed in your gut after a meal, which can further improve blood sugar control. Similarly, regularly adding small amounts of ginger to your diet may help lower fasting blood sugar levels by up to 12%. It's worth noting that most golden milk recipes are sweetened with honey or maple syrup. Blood sugar lowering benefits, if any, are likely only present when drinking unsweetened varieties. In India, golden milk is often used as a home remedy against colds. In fact, the yellow drink is touted for its immune-boosting properties, studies suggest that curcumin has antibacterial, antiviral and antifungal properties which may help prevent and fight infections, moreover, compounds in fresh ginger may inhibit the growth of some bacteria. Ginger extract may fight the human respiratory syncytial virus (HRSV), a common cause of respiratory infections. Chronic indigestion, also known as dyspepsia, is characterized by pain and discomfort in the upper part of your stomach. Delayed stomach emptying is a potential cause of indigestion. Ginger, one of the ingredients used in golden milk, may help relieve this condition by speeding up stomach emptying in people suffering from dyspepsia. Research further shows that turmeric, another ingredient used to make golden milk, may help reduce indigestion symptoms. Turmeric may also improve the digestion of fat by increasing your production of bile by up to 62%. Finally, studies show that turmeric can help maintain proper digestion and prevent flare-ups in individuals with ulcerative colitis, an inflammatory digestive disorder resulting in ulcers in the gut. Golden milk can be rich in calcium and vitamin D depending on the milk you use. Both of these nutrients contribute to a strong skeleton, reducing your risk of bone diseases, such as osteopenia and osteoporosis. These anti-inflammatory effects may reduce joint pain from osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis. The study, published in the American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry, noted that turmeric improves memory and mood. Though exactly how curcumin exerts its effects is not certain, but it may be due to its ability to reduce brain inflammation, which has been linked to both Alzheimer's disease and major depression. Daily consumption of turmeric milk helps to have a good night's sleep. In the wake of the Covid 19 outbreak, Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India, in its advisery states "Enhancing the body's natural defence system (immunity) plays an important role in maintaining optimum

health. We all know that prevention is better than cure. While there is no medicine for COVID-19 of now, it will be good to take preventive measures which boost our immunity in these times". Along with daily practice of Yogasana, Pranayama and meditation, Ministry of AYUSH, recommends various ayurvedic Immunity Promoting food items and drinks like Chyavanprash, herbal tea / decoction (Kadha) so also Golden Milk (Half tea spoon Haldi, turmeric powder in 150 ml hot milk) once or twice a day.

The gurdian declared golden milk as creamy, and incredibly Westernized variant of traditional Indian haldi doodh, or turmeric milk. The Guardian, suggests that "Golden milk" or turmeric latte, a combination of nut milk and juiced turmeric root is drink of choice. In the West traditionally their cuisines don't use turmeric but with so many recent scientific studies about its benefits now they are eager to include turmeric in their daily diet and what can be more acceptable to present it as a drink, so the golden milk has become a super popular drink in all the leading cafes in the west. The world has understood the potential of golden milk but turmeric is pungent in order to give it a flavoursome spin the west have developed a newfound affection for the Indian drink and are mixing juice from almonds and cashews to golden milk. In fact, Turmeric lattes are now being sold at cafes from Sydney to San Francisco, and the drink is gaining fans in the UK," as per the Guardian reports.

Food industries have high demand for the products that meet the consumer's demand for a healthy life style for which functional food fortified with the plant ingredients plays an important role. Tulsi (Cinnamon), turmeric and ginger are such important medicinal plants whose medicinal usage has been reported in the Indian and British Pharmacopoeias and in the Ayurvedic system of medicine. Dairy products have always been a choice for food investigators to test the consumer's preferences for novelty in the products. Combination of herbs or spices in dairy products with gifted health benefit should conform to the requirements to avoid any side effects with respect to quality testing, safety, efficiency, price and marketing approval procedures. Considering its huge marketing potential, Amul has already launched an affordable and easily accessible immunity booster beverage "Amul Haldi Doodh" so also in 2015, Odisha-based dairy company Milk Mantra started selling haldi-milk under its Moo Milk brand which has got good consumer acceptance. However, there are numerous technological challenges that have to be carried out to develop dairy products enriched with herbs and spices like using nano-form to increase their availability and efficiency. Moreover, more research is needed to improve the existing method and to develop new procedures for optimized extraction and refining separation methods of active components from herbs and spices. As Indians we are well convinced about the superpower of haldi and its health benefits but since Haldi Doodh is associated with an unattractive taste profile, flavour and consumer still perceives it as a kind medicinal rather than a health drink, if we can combine great taste, flavour and an engaging brand then Haldi Doodh can fill the unstated gap in the market for a healthy ready-to-drink, acceptable to consumers of all age group.

Covishield vax at health facilities from January 19

BHUBANESWAR: Amid fear of a possible resurgence of Covid-19, Odisha government on Monday announced availability of Covishield vaccine at select healthcare facilities in the state from January 19.

Officials of Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department said the vaccine will be available in identified district headquarter hospitals (DHHs), sub-divisional hospitals (SDHs), community health centres (CHCs) and primary health centres (PHCs) under the National Covid-19 Vaccination Programme for those who have not taken their second or precaution dose.

The officials requested citizens to avail the

opportunity and get vaccinated. Last month, the state government had urged the Centre to provide necessary guidance and support for recommencement of Covid precaution dose as 59 per cent people in the state were yet to get the precaution dose.

Around 8.14 crore vaccine doses had been administered in the state till last month. Around 3.52 crore people (97 per cent) have been administered the first dose, while 3.3 crore (91 per cent) have received the second dose. However, the vaccination figure stands at just around 1.31 crore (41 per cent) for precaution dose to 18 years of age and above.

HLCA Clears Rs.1.53L CR Projects

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Within just two months of completion of Make in Odisha Conclave, the High Level Clearance Authority (HLCA) led by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Thursday approved 9 mega industrial projects worth Rs 1,53,074.63 crores that would generate over 27,030 employment opportunities for the people of Odisha.

The organizations who had participated at MIO Conclave 2022 and showed investment intent in the state realized the same with the HLCA committee approving 9 such industrial projects worth INR 1,53,074.63 crores that would generate over 27,030 employment opportunities for the people of Odisha.

These projects were proposed during the last MIO Conclave. The State government is working hard towards converting the investment intents into ground reality, an official said.

The approved projects spread across diverse sectors like green energy and equipment, metals and minerals, paper and IT infrastructure. The projects will be set up across various parts of the State namely, Balasore, Dhenkanal, Ganjam, Jagatsinghpur, Kalahandi, Khordha, Koraput, and Mayurbhanj.

The HLCA has given a go-ahead to 4 projects in the Green Energy and Equipment sector, 2 projects in the paper industries, 2 projects in the Metals & Minerals sector and one project

in the IT infrastructure sector.

The Committee approved the proposal of ACME Clean Energy Private Limited, entail-



ing an investment of Rs 58,209.13 crore. It proposes to set up a Green Hydrogen plant and a Green Ammonia plant with a capacity of 1.1 million MT, at Kujanga, Jagatsinghpur and captive Renewable Energy Unit (4500 MW Solar Power Plant) at Koraput &

Kalahandi district. It is expected to provide employment opportunities to about 3,400 people in the State.

The State has also approved the proposal of Avaada Green H2 Private Limited at Ganjam district, which promises an investment of Rs 23,500 crores and is expected to provide employment opportunities to about 1,500 people in the State. Alongside these two Green Energy and Equipment sector projects, HLCA approved two other projects in the Green Energy & Equipment sector namely Renew EFuels Private Limited (REFPL) with an investment of Rs 20,000 crore and Ocior Energy Private Limited 0f Rs 7,200 crore which aim to provide employment to more than 3,300 people of Odisha in total.

While REFPL intends to set up a Green Ammonia Plant with a capacity of 1.09 million MT, the Ocior Energy Private Limited proposal includes installation of Green Ammonia Plant of 1 million MT capacity.

In the Paper sector, the Committee gave a nod to two projects, namely Bank Note Paper Mill India Private Limited and Deevyashakti India Private Limited. With an investment of Rs 2,500 crore, the Bank Note Paper Mill India Private Limited, (JV between Govt. of India and RBI) proposes to set up a bank note paper unit at Balasore, which will provide employment opportunities to more than 800

people of Odisha.

On the other hand, Deevyashakti India Private Limited proposes to set up an Integrated Pulp and Paper Mill at Dhenkanal, which includes an investment worth Rs 1,000 crore, is expected to furnish employment opportunities to around 3000 people of the state. In terms of the Metals & Minerals sector, the

authority approved two large projects which are expected to provide employment to a total of around 12,500 people of Odisha. The proposal of ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel India Ltd includes the setting up of 7 MTPA Steel Plant in Jagatsinghpur with an investment of Rs 38,000 crore, and is expected to churn employment opportunities for more than 11,000 people in the State.

The second project in the sector, from Rungta Metals Private Limited (RMPL) is for the expansion of its Integrated Steel Plant from 0.5 MTPA to 1 MTPA in Rairangpur of Mayurbhanj district with an investment of Rs 1,140 crore.

In the IT & Infrastructure sector, the proposal by My Home Constructions Private Limited has been approved by HLCA, which involves the development of IT infrastructure with modern amenities at Bhubaneswar, in Khordha. With an investment of Rs 1,525.50 crores, the project is expected to provide employment opportunities to 2500 people.

"Rescue operations continue. The fate of more than 40 people remain unknown," regional governor

Valentyn Reznichenko said.
The strike destroyed dozens of flats in the apartment block leaving hundreds of people homeless, said Kyrylo Tymoshenko, a senior official at the presidency.

"What is needed for this? Those weapons that are in the warehouses of our partners," Zelensky said.

On Saturday, British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak pledged to provide Challenger 2 tanks to Ukraine, the first Western country to supply the heavy tanks Kyiv has been demanding.

The tanks would arrive in Ukraine in the coming

weeks, Downing Street said, adding that Britain would also train the Ukrainian Armed Forces on how to use them.

Russia's embassy in Britain warned that "bringing

including among the civilian population". Moldova, Ukraine's southwestern neighbour, said it had found Russian missile debris on its territory

"Russia's brutal war against Ukraine directly impacts Moldova again," President Maia Sandu tweeted, posting photographs of the wreckage.

Ukraine's energy facilities were still reeling Sunday from what was a 12th wave of large-scale Russian attacks on energy infrastructure in recent months. The attacks targeted power infrastructure in the Kharkiv, Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Zaporizhzhia, Vinnytsia and Kyiv regions, Energy Minister German Galushchenko said.

On Sunday, operator Ukrenergo said energy infrastructure was "being restored" but that the attacks had "increased the energy deficit".

Rivalries over Soledar
"Unfortunately, energy infrastructure facilities have been also hit," he said, adding that the regions of Kyiv and Kharkiv, home to the country's eponymous second city, were suffering the most.
The strikes came amid uncertainty about the fate of Soledar, a salt mining outpost that Russia claimed to have captured, despite denials from Ukraine.
Both sides have conceded heavy losses in the battle for the town, which had a pre-war population of about 10,000.

On Sunday, the US-based Institute for the Study of War said that "Ukrainian forces are highly unlikely to still hold positions within the settlement of Soledar itself".

Soledar itself".

On Friday, Russia's defence ministry announced that it had "completed the liberation" of Soledar. Russian paramilitary group Wagner first claimed victory over the city on Wednesday, although the defence ministry initially made no mention of Wagner, only later praising the "bravery" of Wagner's troops in Soledar.

Late Saturday, Wagner head Yevgeny Prigozhin praised his mercenaries in a veiled jab at Russian army command, which has been criticised for poor coordination and being too far removed from the ground.

Prigozhin attributed Wagner's victories to a "perfected system of command".
"Everyone can express his opinion," Prigozhin claimed, "but once a decision has been taken, all tasks are fulfilled. It is our group's strictest discipline that gives us these possibilities."
Wagner, which has been accused of abuses in the Central African Republic, Libya, Mali, Syria and Ukraine, has recruited thousands of convicts to fight in Ukraine.

Green revolutionaries: Meet the founders of Eco Oscars awardee agri-tech startup 'Kheyti'

Sathya Raju Mokkapati was 17 when he saw a farmer eating mud out of hunger in his village in the West Godavari district of Andhra Pradesh. The image stayed with him. Thirteen

years later, in 2015, he co-founded an agritech startup, Kheyti, along with Ayush Sharma, 37, Saumya Sahay, 33, and Kaushik Kappagantulu, 36, to supplement and enhance the income of farmers through their innovative 'greenhouse-in-a-box' method. Kheyti recently won the Earthshot Prize 2022, also called the Eco Oscars.

Sharma and Mokkapati—friends for over a decade—had earlier founded a similar startup, Cosmos Green. The seed for Kheyti was sown when Mokkapati travelled with Kappagantulu to hundreds of villages in India in 2015 as part of Acumen Fellowship, a leadership development programme, to understand the problems faced by small farmers—no rains or unseasonal rains, extreme heat patterns and risks of pests due to the heat.

Kappagantulu, who roped in his former colleague Sahay, says, "Many farmers we met said their aim was to generate extra income each month. With that as a goal, we worked backwards and realised that the answer lay in greenhouses, which could minimise risk from vagaries of climate and regularise incomes." Thus was born Kheyti's 'greenhouse-in-abox', an affordable, modular greenhouse that uses 90 per cent less water than standard greenhouses, grows seven times more food, and gives farmers a steady dependable income. The durable greenhouse also cuts off heat, prevents bugs and saves water, making it easier for the farmers to earn higher

Traditionally, greenhouses were earmarked for exotic vegetables such as broccoli and lettuce, but the startup has adapted them for wider use—almost all Indian vegetables from cabbage to cauliflower, leafy vegetables and other common ones like potatoes can be grown now. Kheyti installed their first greenhouse in 2017 in Siddipet (Telangana) before expanding to seven states, including Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Odisha, benefitting over 1,500 farms.

By bringing down the standard one-acre size of the greenhouse to one-tenth, the startup has managed to bring down the cost from Rs 30 lakh to Rs 60,000, making it accessible and affordable. Mokkapati says, "Agricultural incomes are dependent on climate risk.

Kheyti provides a model of farming which is economically viable and environmentally friendly too."

Helping farmers meet the dual purpose of generating more income as well as creating diversified sources to do it, the 37-year-old says, "Small farmers usually extend their surplus income to buy cattle, which cost Rs 50,000 to Rs 80,000, the same amount Kheyti is helping them earn."

As the award propels Kheyti into muchneeded and well-deserved recognition, they are eager to scale up and expand their operations. This is just the beginning of the greenhouse revolution.

"We strongly condemn the BBC's malicious documentary "India: The Modi Question," said Insight UK, among several diaspora groups who have taken to social media to condemn the documentary.

"Riddled with antisemitism, anti-Hindu and anti-India biases, they have lost many viewers and yet continue spreading their hate without consequence or accountability," it added.

Adani Enterprises FPO price band at Rs 3,112- Rs

MUMBAI: The Rs 20,000 crore follow-on public offer (FPO) of Adani Enterprises will open for subscription on January 27 and will close on January 31. Billionaire Gautam Adani led the company on Wednesday and announced Rs 3,112-Rs 3,276 price band for the country's biggest FPO.

The company, one of India's largest listed business incubators in terms of market capitalisation, will use the proceeds from the FPO to repay debts and to meet its capital expenditure requirements, said the company in its Red Herring Prospectus.

Of the Rs 20,000 crore proceeds of the FPO, Rs 10,869 crore will be used for green hydrogen projects, work at the existing airports and construction of a greenfield expressway. Another Rs 4,165 crore will go airports, road and solar project subsidiaries. "As of September 30, 2022, we had Rs 40,023.50 crore in borrowings from banks and financial institutions, comprising term loans (including foreign currency borrowings), working capital loans and trade/

A look at air crashes in Nepal since 2010

KATHMANDU: An aircraft with 72 people on board crashed in Nepal on Sunday, officials said, the latest aviation disaster to hit the Himalayan nation.

Nepal's air transport sector has been plagued by accidents due to poor maintenance, insufficient training and lax standards.

February 16, 2014

Eighteen people are killed when a Nepal Airlines flight crashes in Arghakhanchi district, with rescuers finding body parts and debris strewn across the mountainous countryside. September 28, 2012



The country also has some of the world's most remote and tricky runways, with approaches flanked by towering mountains that challenge even accomplished pilots.

Here is a timeline of major air disasters to hit the country since 2010:

May 29, 2022 A Twin Otter plane operated by Nepali carrier Tara Air crashes shortly after takeoff from Pokhara in western Nepal, killing 22 people. April 14, 2019

A small plane veers off the runway while taking off near Mount Everest, hitting two helicopters and killing three people. Three people were also injured.

March 12, 2018

A flight from the Bangladeshi capital Dhaka crash-lands at Kathmandu airport, skidding into a football field where it bursts into flames. Fifty-one people are killed in what was the deadliest aviation accident in the country for decades.

February 24, 2016

A Twin Otter aircraft operated by Tara Air crashes into a hillside in Myagdi district, killing all 23 people on board.

Everest goes down in flames on the outskirts of the Nepali capital, killing everyone on board including seven Britons and five Chinese citizens.

May 14, 2012

Fifteen people die when an Agni Air plane carrying Indian pilgrims crashes near the treacherous high-altitude airport of Jomsom in northern Nepal, while six make a miraculous escape.

September 25, 2011

A small plane taking tourists on a sightseeing trip around Mount Everest crashes into a hillside near Kathmandu, killing all 19 people on board.

December 15, 2010

All 22 passengers and crew on board a passenger plane that crashes in eastern Nepal are killed. Most of the victims are pilgrims from Bhutan, with one US citizen also among the dead.

August 24, 2010

A small Agni Air plane crashes in bad weather near Kathmandu, killing all 14 people on board including four Americans, a Japanese and a British national.

Contacted, an official spokesperson said he is unable to share information on the matter at this stage. Asked whether any decision has been taken to withdraw the service from Bhubaneswar, he neither confirmed nor denied it.

BPIA director Prasanna Pradhan said the airport has not received any communication from the airline on its withdrawal plan so far. "Air India has given us its flight schedules till March 31," he added. Chairman of Indian Association of Tour Operators (IATO) Odisha chapter Gagan Sarangi said withdrawal of Air India service from the city will have a negative impact on tourism.

"The airline was the preferred one for both inbound and outbound tourists for its services after Tata Sons took over. Agents hardly face any difficulty while planning with bulk bookings unlike other airlines," he said. Earlier, AirAsia had stopped its service to Kuala Lumpur in 2017 while the operation between Bhubaneswar and Bangkok was discontinued in 2019 after only a year's service.

Netherlands registered a record-breaking 14-0 win over debutants Chile to secure a direct



qualification into the quarter-finals, while Malaysia stunned New Zealand 3-2 to finish second in Pool C at the FIH Men's Hockey World Cup here on Thursday.

With three wins from as many games, Netherlands finished at the top of Pool C with a maximum of nine points, while Malaysia was second with six points from two victories.

In the second match of the day, world No.3 Netherlands toyed with Chile, ranked 23rd, and scored goals at will to register the biggest margin of victory in a World Cup match.

The record for the biggest margin of win in a hockey World Cup match was earlier held by world No.1 Australia, who thrashed South Africa 12-0 in New Delhi.

Jip Janssen (6th, 29th, 34th, 44th minutes) and skipper Thierry Brinkman (25th, 33rd, 58th) scored a hat-trick each, while Koen Bijen (40th, 45th) struck a brace.

Derck de Vilder (22nd), Thijs van Dam (23rd), Terrance Pieters (37th), Justen Blok (42nd) and Teun Beins (48th) were the other goalgetters for the Dutch.

Ruud beaten to boost Djokovic title charge at Australian Open

Casper Ruud on Thursday joined Rafael Nadal in making a stunning second-round exit from the Australian Open, another boost to Novak Djokovic's bid for a 22nd Grand Slam title.

On a bad day for some of the leading men's players, Ruud was always struggling against hard-hitting Jenson Brooksby, the second seed from Norway going down in four sets.

Soon after, Taylor Fritz and Alexander Zverev also became high-profile casualties.

Defending champion Nadal limped out of the tournament on day three in a shock defeat to Mackenzie McDonald and on day four it was another American who ousted Ruud.

The top two seeds are now gone in the first week at Melbourne

Park, with Nadal saying on Thursday he will be out for about six to eight weeks with his hip injury. The 39th-ranked Brooksby, who is on his Australian Open debut, will face Tommy Paul in round three after his fellow American beat Spain's Alejandro Davidovich Fokina in five sets.

"First and foremost, Casper is a warrior, I knew it would be a great battle out there," said Brooksby, 22, having prevailed 6-3, 7-5, 6-7 (4/7), 6-2.

"I'm just really proud of my mental resolve after the third-set battle didn't go my way, and to turn it around."

Ruud, who could have become world number one in Melbourne, refused to blame an abdominal in-

"I gave it my all, but in the fourth set especially it wasn't enough," he said.

Eighth seed Fritz was also on his way home after wildcard local hope Alexei Popyrin beat him 6-7

(4/7), 7-6 (7/2), 6-4, 6-7 (6/8), 6-2. "This is a dream and I don't want to wake up at all," said Popyrin, who was reduced to tears by the crowd chanting his name.

Zverev, the 12th seed, suffered another setback on his return from serious injury as he lost to 107thranked Michael Mmoh.

Safely into round three of a men's draw which was already missing injured world number one Carlos Alcaraz is Russia's fifth-seeded Andrey Rublev and ninth seed Holger Rune.

Serbia's Djokovic will step up his bid for a recordextending 10th Australian Open crown when he faces 191st-ranked French qualifier Enzo

Couacaud in the night session on Rod Laver Arena.

Ominous Sabalenka In the women's draw, Aryna Sabalenka showed why she is a serious contender for the title by powering into the third round.

Also safely through was France's fourth seed Caroline Garcia, a 7-6 (7/5), 7-5 winner over former US Open finalist Leylah Fernandez.

Belarus's Sabalenka swept past 51st-ranked American Shelby Rogers 6-3, 6-1 in an hour and 27 minutes and faces 26th-seed Elise Mertens.

Sabalenka, who reached the semi-finals at the US Open last year, extended her 2023 unbeaten record to six matches. She won the recent Adelaide International without dropping a set.

It is a marked contrast to the start of last season when her serve completely deserted her, reducing her to tears during an Australian Open warm-up event.

Sabalenka served three aces against Rogers but, tellingly, no double faults. She talked openly about the hard work involved in turning her fortunes

"I worked a lot on my serve. You can't even imagine," she told reporters.

"Oh my God, I did, I think, almost everything to trying to fix my serve."
