Naba Das was immediately rushed to District BHUBANESHWAR(KCN): Odisha's Health and Family Welfare Minister Naba Kishore Headquarters Hospital in Jharsuguda and was Das died of bullet injuries on Sunday, Apollo later airlifted to Bhubaneswar for further

Hospital officials said.

Earlier in the day, Das was shot and grievously injured when he got out of his car, allegedly by a police officer who was captured. "The injuries were repaired, and steps were taken to improve the pumping of the heart. He was given urgent ICU care. But, despite best of efforts, he could not be revived and succumbed to his injuries," a statement issued by the hospital said.

Naba Kishore Das was shot at by an assistant sub-inspector (ASI) of police near Gandhi Chowk in Jharsuguda district's Brajrajnagar at about 12:15 pm on Sunday.

He was stepping out of his vehicle when bullets hit the left side of the minister's chest. He immediately collapsed into the seat of his vehicle. A police inspector and a youth who were standing near the minister sustained minor injuries.

Sources said the accused ASI Gopal Das who was posted at Gandhi Chowk police outpost fired at least four rounds at Naba Das when he stepped out of his car to attend a party function in Brajarajnagar.

Renowned litterateur Hussain Rabi Gandhi passes away at 75 BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Eminent Odia writer, former president of Odisha Sahitya Akademi and politician Hussain Rabi Gandhi passed away at Cuttack on Saturday. He was 75 and undergoing treatment for old age-re-

lated ailments at SCB Medical College and Hospital.

Author of several Odia books including 'Mukta Purbasa', 'Hajijaithiba Manisa' and 'Punsacha Salabega', Hussain had also translated the Hindi novel 'Rani Laxmi Bai' into Odia which was later pub-

lished by the National Book Trust in 2012. His story 'Galpa Samaraha' was included in the Odia syllabus of Plus II.

At the Odisha Sahitya Akademi, he served as the vice-president from 2005 to 2008 and then as the president of Akademi from 2008 to 2010. Hussain was also the former editor of the state government's 'Utkal Prasanga'. Inspired by the legendary Biju Patnaik, Hussain had joined the undivided Janata Dal in 1988 and was appointed its general secretary. He served as the general secretary of Biju Janata Dal from 1998 till 2005 and the ruling party's observer for Deogarh and

Sambalpur elections.

He was conferred the title of Biplabi Loka Kabi by the mayor of Cuttack in 1994. He was also awarded Utkala Jyoti and Gangadhar Meher Kabita awards for his notable contributions to the field of Odia poetry.

People from all walks of life condoled his

death. Expressing grief at Husain's demise, Governor of Odisha Prof Ganeshi Lal said Odia literature will forever be in debt for his contributions.

Mourning his death, Chief Minister

Naveen Patnaik said Gandhi had a long association with Biju Patnaik and later with BJD. "He has contributed immensely in strengthening the Biju Janata Dal and promoted the values of Biju Babu and BJD." An established writer, who contributed immensely to Odia literature, his death is a great loss to the state, Naveen added. "I am saddened to hear the news of the passing away of Hussain Ravi Gandhi, a prominent literary figure of Odisha and former president of the Odisha Sahitya Akademi. May the immortal soul rest in peace," Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan tweeted.

New Delhi(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday cautioned against attempts to sow differences and create divisions in the country and asserted that such efforts will not succeed.

Addressing a rally of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) at the Cariappa Ground in Delhi Cantonment, Modi said the mantra of unity

was the only way for India to achieve grandeur.

The prime minister said that the entire world was looking towards India because of the youth of the country. Modi said his government had un-

leashed digital, start-up and innovation revolutions which are benefiting the youth.

"This is the time of new opportunities for the youth of India. Everywhere it is evident that India's time has arrived," he said addressing the NCC cadets who took part in the Republic Day celebrations.

At the same time, the prime minister urged caution against attempts to divide the coun-

## SER's freight loading performance creates a record

Kolkata(KCN): The 74th Republic Day was celebrated at South Eastern Railway (SER)'s Headquarters, Garden Reach with great enthusiasm on Thursday. Ms. Archana Joshi, General Manager, SER unfurled the National Flag and took salute at the ceremonial parade presented by the contingents of Railway Protection Force (RPF), Civil Defence and St John Ambulance.

Highlighting the achievements of SER in recent times, General Manager said that SER, popularly known as the Blue Chip Railway, is among the top three highest freight loading zones of Indian Railways. During the period from April to December 2022, SER achieved a commendable loading of 149.23 million tonnes of freight which is about 4.1% higher than the corresponding period of 2021-22. To ensure availability of coal for power plants, the best ever coal loading was achieved by SER this year with a loading of 41.24 million tonnes of coal which is an increase of 24.78% over last year.

The General Manager added that in order to increase operational capacity, 114.05 km of doubling / third line work has been completed so far this year, including the super critical project of Kharagpur-Narayangarh and Coal Link Project of Rourkela-Jharsuguda. Keeping in view the importance of road safety, altogether eight Road Over Bridges have been commissioned this year. In addition, the work of o-ne Road Over Bridge at Jugsalai, Tatanagar has been completed and is ready to be commissioned.

General Manager said, with a view to provide more amenities to the passengers, 11 lifts and three escalators have been commissioned at various stations during the current financial year. Moreover, completed this year so far. These apart, 22 platforms at 21 stations have been raised and 32 new toilets have been provided where facilities are also available for Divyangjan. During the current financial year, 155 special trains have been run to clear the extra rush of the passengers. Till December 2022 of the current fiscal, 150 coaches have been permanently augmented and 4568 coaches have been temporarily augmented in 83 trains. Mentioning the special efforts of RPF, General



# Waiver or reduction of Interest u/s 220(

13. Whether interest u/s 220(2) may be waived or reduced u/s 220(2A): As per section 220(2A) such interest may be reduced



or waived by the Chief Commissioner or Commissioner if he is satisfied that -

payment of such amount has caused or would cause genuine hardship to assessee,

(ii) default in the payment of the amount

was due to circumstances beyond the control of the assessee, and

the assessee has co-operated in any enquiry relating to the assessment or any proceeding for the recovery of any amount due from him. Calcutta High Court in the case of Apeejay Industries Ltd. v. CIT [2002] 120 Taxman 440 (Cal.) held that section 220(2A) gives the assessee the right to apply for waiver and further to get the interest amount waived if the conditions mentioned therein are fulfilled. All the trappings of substantive law are to be found, therein. Therefore, it cannot have retrospective operation.

Kerala High Court in the case of G.T.N. Textiles Ltd. v. Dy. CIT 217 ITR 653 (Ker.), Patna High Court in the case of Metallurgical and Engineering Consultants (India) Ltd. v. CIT & Ors. [2000] 242 ITR 547 (Pat.) and Kerala High Court in N. Gopalakrishnan v. CIT & Another [2006] 280 ITR 592 (Ker.) have held that interest payable u/s 220(2) cannot be waived/reduced unless all the three conditions mentioned in section 220(2A) are satisfied.

The Apex Court in Kishan Lal v. Union of India 97 Taxman 556 (SC): 230 ITR 85 (SC) held that when an application is filed u/ s 220(2A) the authority concerned is called upon to take a quasi-judicial decision. If it is satisfied that the reasons contained in the application would bring the case under clauses (i), (ii) and (iii) of section 220(2A), then it has the power either to reduce or waive the amount of interest. Mere fact that the assessee is a wealth tax assessee is not a relevant

consideration at all for providing that payment of interest

would not cause any genuine headship to assessee - J. Jayalalitha v. CIT & Ors. [2000] 244 ITR 74 (Mad.).

Even though in the said sub-section, it is not stated that any reasons are to be recorded in the order deciding such an application, it is implicit that whenever such an application is filed, the same should be decided by a speaking order and a proper application of mind - J. Jayalalita v. CIT & Ors. [2000] 244 ITR 74 (Mad.); Auro Food Ltd. v. CIT [2005] 276 ITR 658 (Mad.); Mani v. CIT [2010] 320 ITR 472 (Mad); World Vision India

v. CIT (Exemptions), Chennai [2018] 89 taxmann.com 193 (Madras).

Principles of natural justice in this regard would be clearly applicable. A decision which is taken by the authority u/s 220(2A) can be subjected to judicial review, as was sought to be done in the instant case by filing a petition under article 226; this being so and where the decision of the application may have repercussions with regard to the amount of interest which an assessee is required to pay, it would be imperative that some reasons are given by the authority while disposing of the application.

The application for waiver of interest should be construed liberally. Partial waiver may also be given. An application for stay of recovery proceedings cannot be construed as non-cooperation by the assessee - Arun Sunny v. CCIT [2013] 350 ITR 147 (Ker.).

14. Whether an application for waiver of interest can be rejected only on the ground that assessee owns large assets and it can pay tax by selling those assets, therefore question of genuine hardship **does not arise:** The condition that the delay should have occurred because of "genuine hardship" is crucial. It is difficult to conceive of non-genuine hardship, since a hardship, if not genuine, is not a hardship at all. The expression "genuine hardship" displays the anxiety of the Legislature to spare penalty only in cases of real hardship. In the case before the Supreme Court in B.M. Malani v. CIT [2008] 306 ITR 196 (SC), reversing the decision of the High Court had appreciated

genuine difficulty on the part of the assessee in payment of tax. The fact that the assessee has large liquid assets by itself, does not mean that there is no difficulty in selling the assets and paying the tax and interest levied. What is meant by genuine hardship is to be understood primarily in the sense that a person cannot take advantage of his own wrong as decided in a number of precedents from the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court allowed the waiver of Interest.

- 15. Time limit for disposal of application u/s 220(2A) for waiver or reduction of interest: As per section 220(2A) w.e.f. June 1, 2016, an application for waiver or reduction of interest u/s 220 has to be disposed off by the Principal Chief Commissioner, Chief Commissioner, Principal Commissioner or the Commissioner within 12 months from the end of the month in which application is made. All the pending applications as on June 1, 2016 are also to be disposed of on or before May 31, 2017. It is further provided that before rejecting such application, an opportunity of being heard to the assessee is to be granted. It may be noted that upto 31.5.2016 there was no time limit for disposing of application 220(2A) for waiver or deduction of interest u/s 220.
- **16.** Whether TRO can go ahead with the sale of property pending application for waiver of interest u/s 220( $\bar{2}A\bar{)}$ : Where only interest is outstanding and assessee makes an application for waiver of the same u/s 220(2A), sale of property pending such application will vitiate the object and spirit of sec. 220(2A) -Kings Infra Ventures Ltd. v. TRO [2019] 107 taxmann.com 132 (Mad).
- **17.** Request for extension of time for payment of demand: As per section 220(3), assessee can make an application to A.O. before the due date for the payment of demand for extension of time or he can also apply for payment of demand in instalments. On receipt of such application A.O. may grant the extension of time for payment of demand or he may allow the payment of demand in

installments subject to the conditions as he may deem fit. In case the relief is to be denied, the principles of natural justice would require that an opportunity of hearing be given to the assessee - Kuku Rice Mills v. Assessing Authority-cum- I.T. Authority [1992] 196 ITR 326 (P&H).

Steps for stay of payment of disputed tax **demand:** Assessee should write to the A.O. in case he has filed an appeal, requesting him not to treat him in default. The petition for stay u/s 220(6) should be well formulated keeping in mind the following points:

The petition should state the prima facie merits of the appeal. The test of merit of appeal lies much upon the grounds of appeal, which should be strong enough.

The hardship involved in the recovery of the disputed demand should be clearly and precisely stated. The petition should state why and how the balance of convenience is in favour of the stay, e.g., bad effect on the liquidity position of the business, jeopardy of the employment of workmen through possible closure of business and possibility of deadlock in wage payment etc. as the case may

c) Copy of the grounds of appeal as well as statement of facts and acknowledge of filing Appeal should accompany the petition to show the prima facie merit of the appeal.

Further this petition should be submitted before the A.O. within 30 days of receipt of demand

Section 220(6) empowers the A.O. not to treat the assessee in default and allow stay for payment subject to the conditions, which he may impose. For example, he may ask for part payment of disputed demand or may allow payment by instalments.

CBDT vide its Office Memorandum No. F.NO.404/72/93-ITCC, dated 31-7-2017 has modified its earlier Instruction and directed that under normal circumstances, stay should be granted till the disposal of first appeal on payment of 20% [Earlier it was 15% as per Office Memorandum dated 29-02-2016] of the total demand.

Martyrs' Day is commemorated on January 30 to mark the death




anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi assassinated on 30 January 1948 by Nathuram Godse and his death was followed by epic public

### Chill weather hits late night, early morning flights

Chennai: The bone-chilling cold, persisting even after January has come almost to a close, has started affecting flight services in Chennai and other places as air passengers were not prepared to travel in the early morning and late night hours in the inclement weather conditions, impelling airlines to cancel flights citing low occupancy.

Between late Friday night and early Saturday morning alone, six flights were cancelled at the Chennai airport. The Indigo Airlines flights to Hyderabad (9 pm) and Kolkata (10 pm) were suddenly cancelled on Friday night and similarly Indigo Airlines services to Chennai from Hyderabad, which was to land at 1.15 am, and the Sri Lankan Airlines flight from Colombo, which normally lands and 2 am and then leaves for Colombo at 3.30 am, were cancelled.

Since large-bodied aircraft with seating capacity of 168 passengers are operated in these sectors, the airlines are reluctant to fly just 20 or 30 passengers in a trip. So they make alternative arrangements for the booked passengers to reach their destinations and cancel the scheduled flights, sources

When asked if they could switch to smaller aircraft like the ATR variety on the days when the passengers were few, airlines authorities claimed that it was easily said than done as several agencies like the Directorate General Civil Aviation (DGCA) and Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) would have to clear such moves. Besides, operating small aircraft at night that too in misty weather conditions was not safe, they said

However, sources in the weather office said that the weather recorded in Chennai was 22 degrees Celsius on Friday night and 23 degrees Celsius on Saturday early morning, when the visibility was four km. Flights could land and take off without any hitch in such weather conditions but it was only because of passengers' perception that many avoid travelling in those hours.

In other airports like Hyderabad, Colombo and Kolkata, too, the weather has dropped of late putting off people from venturing out of their homes during the cold spell and that had contributed to the many flight cancellations.

As per the Odisha Electricity Regulatory Commission (Terms and Conditions for Determination of Wheeling Tariff and Retail Supply Tariff) Regulations, 2022, the distribution licensee is required to file business plan not less than 120 days before the commencement of the first year for approval of commission and determination of MYT for a period of five years commencing from 2023-24.

# Adani confident of FPO sailing through; SEBI, other regulatory bodies probing sell-off

NEW DELHI: Richest Asian Gautam Adani's group on Sunday expressed confidence that the Rs 20,000 crore follow-on share sale of its flagship firm will sail through despite a massive hammering of the conglomerate's stocks following a scathing report by a US-based short seller.

Group CFO Jugeshinder Singh said no change in offering price or schedule is being considered due projects it is doing, in the data centre business and in the mining business. All these businesses are

All seven Adani group companies' stocks fell sharply over the last two trading sessions, wiping out Rs 10.7 lakh crore of investor wealth after Hindenburg Research alleged that the ports-toenergy-to-cement conglomerate had engaged in "brazen stock manipulation and accounting fraud" for decades.

The sell-off is being looked into by market regulator SEBI and stock exchanges.

In an interview with PTI, Singh said the group will release a comprehensive response to the Hindenburg report, "providing documentary evidence" to "clearly outline that there was no research done and that there wasn't any investigating reporting. Only pure baseless misrepresentation of factual situations, if not lies."

He cited an example of the Hindenburg report alleging that inflation in revenue was visible from an asset transferred to a private company and the private company immediately writing down that asset.

"That is a pure misrepresentation of our disclosures. Adani Enterprises Ltd (AEL) had already written down that asset and AEL had already booked a loss, after which that asset went over to the private side. It was disclosed as a related party transaction. They (Hindenburg) simply took half of it and therefore it is deliberate misrepresentation and falsehood. And the (Hindenburg) report is full of such points," he said.

"They deliberately misled."

The FPO of AEL will go on as scheduled, he said, expressing confidence that it will be fully subscribed by the end of the offer period on January 31.

The share sale -- the second largest in India -- got subscribed just 1 per cent on the opening day on Friday. Against an offer of 4.55 crore shares of AEL, only 4.7 lakh were subscribed, according to information available from the BSE.

AEL fell almost 20 per cent to trade below the offer price of its secondary sale as all the seven listed companies of the conglomerate took a beating in the aftermath of the Hindenburg report.

The firm is selling shares in a price band of Rs 3,112 to Rs 3,276.

On Friday, its share price closed at Rs 2,762.15 on the BSE.

"All our stakeholders including bankers and investors have full faith in the FPO. We are extremely confident about the success of the FPO," he said.

On Wednesday, Adani Enterprises raised Rs 5,985 crore from anchor investors.

Asked why would an investor subscribe to the FPO when the same share is available in the open market at a lower price, Singh said AEL has a very limited free float and so while retail investors looking for 50-100 shares can buy from the market, a strategic institutional investor would not find the chunk of shares they need.

"For an institutional investor who likes larger chunky holding, that option is not available as the free float is not there," he said.

"One of the primary aims of the FPO is to increase the liquidity of shares and increase the free float." He further said strategic long-term institutional investors are not investing in AEL for just the value of its shares.

"They are investing in AEL as an incubator. The value of AEL sits more in the airports business it holds, in the road business it is doing, in new energy performing very well."

#### India to have comprehensive look at global debt situation in G20 Working Group meeting

The meeting will discuss ways to enhance the stability and cohesion of international financial architecture, as well as address the global challenges of the 21st century. The meeting will also focus on exploring ways to provide maximum support to

poor and vulnerable countries.
Talking to the media Anu P Mathai Adviser, Trade Policy Division, Department of Commerce said, "this working group deals with issues related to international financial architecture such as global financial safety net (GFSN), matters related to development finance, managing debt vulnerabilities and enhancing debt transparency, capital flow management and promoting local currency bond markets."

"Debt is a big part of the agenda of this working group and especially with the pandemic the debt distress has got aggravated so during the pandemic one major step that was taken so to defer the debt re-payment of the very poor countries so that was something called the debt suspension service initiative so that was intimated during the Saudia Arabia presidency of the G-20 in 2020 from that it moved on to the common treatment of debt repayment that was extended and it was attempted how to restructure the debt of the very poor countries along with it the transparency of debt has also become very important that is another aspect which is being looked into," she said.

She added, "Under the Indian presidency how to deal with debt and how to handle debt treatment in a better way, some of these initiatives have not worked well as they were supposed to. So under the Indian presidency, there will be a comprehensive look at the global debt situation and the idea is to bring out a report on what has worked and what has not worked and how it can be improved. Debt continues to be a major part of the agenda."

"The International Financial Architecture Working Group is one of the important work streams under the G20 Finance Track with a focus on strengthening international financial architecture. It also aims to address multiple challenges faced by vulnerable countries. Approximately 100 delegates from across the G20membership, Invitee countries and International Organizations will be arriving in Chandigarh to participate in the two-day meeting," said Mathai. She said, "During the course of India's G20 Presidency, this Working Group will meet again in March, June, and September to continue discussions on the priorities set under the Indian Presidency. Discussions from the International Financial Architecture Working Group meeting will further inform the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors (FMCBG) on the key deliberations on related priorities under India's G20 Finance Track. The first meeting of the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors is scheduled to be held on February 24 and 25 in Bengaluru."

On the sidelines of this meeting, on January 30 a G20 side event titled 'Central Bank Digital Currencies (CBDCs): Opportunities and Challenges' will also be held. The event is aimed at sharing country experiences and developing a deeper understanding of the macroprudential implications of CBDCs.

In the run-up to this meeting, a number of events have been held across the city of Chandigarh for increasing 'Jan-Bhagidari' and generating interest in the G20 events under the Indian Presidency. A seminar on "Central Bank Digital Currencies: The Indian Story" was also held on January 25, 2023, in Chandigarh. These events are aimed at creating awareness of the G20 Indian Presidency in 2023 and its theme "VasudhaivaKutumbakam" or "One Earth - One Family - One Future."

The meeting will be inaugurated by Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Narendra Singh Tomar, and Minister of Food Processing Industries, Pashupati Kumar Paras.

The discussions during the two-day meeting will be jointly steered by the Ministry of Finance and the Reserve Bank of India along with France and Korea who are the Co-chairs of the International Financial Architecture Working Group.



Borussia Dortmund in a deal, including add-ons, worth 147 million euros (then \$175 million).

But a series of injuries limited his playing time and never let him reach the

level of play that Barcelona expected until last season when he started playing well on a consistent basis. The club did not give

an estimate on how long he would be out. Barcelona leads the Spanish league. It has league games against Real Betis, Sevilla Villarreal and the first leg of the Copa del Rey semifinals (rival to be determined) before it plays Manchester United in the Europa League on February 16.


