North Carolina Jagannath Temple Hosted Car Festival



North Carolina (Sujat Mahapatra): Celebration of Annual Ratha Yatra in North Carolina Indian community with participation of people from different countries, color, religion and beliefs, exemplifies "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam", The world is one big family. This year's celebration was to be grand. The grandeur of the occasion was because the Ratha or Chariot that is used in the festival was newly built. What made the building of the chariot so special was the fact that it was built entirely by volunteers who did not have any professional experience in chariot building work. The volunteers worked as a band of brothers who combined their skills and determination to build something spectacular. A 26 feet Ratha was built in less than 9 months with volunteers working on weekends irrespective of the weather to build one of the biggest chariots in the americas!

On July 9th Rath Jatra was observed in Hindu temple at HSNC Morrisville. The festival schedule was planned in advance with volunteers dividing themselves in various groups such as Food preparation and distribution, Ratha decoration, Puja preparation, Traffic Management among other categories. The volunteer groups coordinated among themselves various details of the festival.

The festival preparation began a day earlier when cooking was done for almost two thousand devotees who were expected at the Ratha Yatra festival. Various volunteers helped cook the prasad items in the HSNC temple's

kitchen. There were certain sweet dishes that were cooked by volunteers at home also. Similarly the Rath decoration team assembled the Ratha and decorated it for the festival.

The festival began at 9:00 AM on 9th July 2022, with Pahandi of Lord Balabhadra, followed by Maa Subhadra and then of Lord Jagannath from the temple to the chariot. HSNC formally recognized the Jagannath Seva Society for building the Ratha and presented them with the memento. This was followed by Odissi Dance and Bhajan singing in front of the chariot. The chariot pulling was started thereafter at 11 AM.

The chariot was pulled by many hundreds which was accompanied by kirtan by ISKCON devotees and Ghanta playing and bhajan singing. The Ratha was pulled to Gundicha temple where the cultural program took place along with the serving of Prasad to all devotees free of cost. The cultural programs included classical dances, skits and devotional songs. The cultural program went on until 4 PM.

Afterwards the lords were returned to the chariot and the Bahuda started, in which they returned to their temple from Gundicha temple. After Lord Jagannath was back in his temple along with his siblings they were decorated with gold ornaments which is known as "Suna Besha" at 6 PM. Morrisville's weather held up just enough for the festival to conclude before torrential rains started. It was as if the rain god Indra himself obliged Lord Jagannath to let him complete his Ratha Yatra.

Conviction for Common Intention & Amp; Common Object

Under the Indian Penal Code, 1860 there are two provisions relating to conviction for common intention un-



der Section 34 and under Section 149 IPC for common object. In the said both sections the "common" word is common. Section

when a criminal act is done by several persons in furtherance of the common intention of all, each of such persons is liable for that act. In the same manner as if it were done by him alone. Section 149 of the Code contemplates that if an offence is committed by any member of an unlawful assembly in prosecution of the common object of that assembly or such as the members of the assembly knew to be liable to be committed in prosecution of that object, every person at the time of committing that offence is a member of the same assembly is guilty of that offence. The Hon'ble Supreme Court for the first time deals with the distinction between Section 34 and Section 149 in the case of Nanak Chand Versus State of Punjab (1955) 1 SCR 1201. In the said judgment the Hon'ble Supreme Court has held that the distinction between the provisions of Sections 34 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code for dispelling the confusion between the two sections. As per the said judgment, the principal element in Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code is the common intention to commit a crime. In furtherance of the common intention several acts may be done by several persons resulting in the commission of that crime/a crime. Under such situation Section 34 provides that each one of them would be liable for that crime in the same manner as if all acts resulting in that crime had been done by him alone.

There is no question of common intention in Section 149 of the Code. An offence may be committed by member of unlawful assembly and the other members also liable for that offence although there was no common intention between the person and the other members of the unlawful assembly to commit that offence provided the condition laid down in the section are fulfilled. Thus if the offence committed by that person is in prosecution of the common object of the unlawful assembly or such as the members of that assembly knew to be liable to be committed in prosecution of the common object. Every member of the unlawful assembly would be guilty of that offence. Although there may be no common intention and no participation by other members in the actual commission of that offence.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court further clarifies that the difference between the object and intention is that the object may be common, the intentions of several members of the unlawful assembly may differ and indeed may be similar only in respect of namely that they all are unlawful while the element of one respect namely that they are all unlawful, while the element of participation in action which is leading feature of Section 34 is recommitting of the offence. Subsequently, a case came before the

Hon'ble Supreme Court under appeal against the order of the Allahabad High Court titled Suraj Pal Versus State of Uttar Pradesh (1955) 1 SCR 1332 wherein a person was charged along with others under Sections 302 and 307 of the Indian Penal Code each read with Section 149 of the Code. The Hon'ble Supreme Court held his convictions and sentences for substantial offences under Section 302 and 307 of the code are erroneous. The Hon'ble Supreme Court has further held that the absence of specific charges under Section 302 and 307 read with Section 149 of the Code is a serious lacuna in the proceedings. In as much as the framing of specific and distinct charge in respect of every distinct head of criminal liability constituting an offence is the foundation for a conviction and sentence therefor. The Hon'ble Supreme Court has clarified the serious lacuna in the judgment of the High Court that the conviction in the circumstances under Section 302 and 307 of the code and sentences of death and transportation for life cannot be maintained unless the court is satisfied on the facts of the case that the accused has not been prejudiced in his trial. Whether or not in such a situation the questioning of the accused during the course of his examination under Section 342 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898 (the new code Section 313 of Cr.P.C. 1973) in relation to the offences under Section 302 and 307 of the Indian Penal Code can be relied upon as obviating the likelihood of prejudice has to be determined with reference to the facts

and circumstances of the case. The above mentioned two cases came before the Constitution Bench of the Hon'ble Supreme Court titled Willie (William) Slaney Vs The State of Madhya Pradesh (1955) 2 SCR 1140 for discussion and further clarification in regard to the framing of the charges under Section 34 and 149 of the Code wherein the constitution bench of the Hon'ble Supreme Court has elaborately clarified that the code does not use the word "illegality" nor define "irregularity" and "illegality". The object of the charge is to give the accused notice of the matter he is charged with and does not touch jurisdiction. The basic object of framing charge in a criminal case is to give an opportunity to the accused a notice of the matter charged with and does not touch jurisdiction. Therefore an object of framing a charge against an accused is the necessary information conveyed to him in other ways and there is no prejudiced the trial is not validated by the mere fact that the charge was not formally reduced to writing. The essential part of law is not a technical formula of words but the reality whether the matter was explained to the accused for defending himself or through his lawyer at the time of trial to explore the veracity of the facts and the law to follow the facts for appropriate punishment under the law. In the case of Willie (William) Slanney Vs The State of Madhya Pradesh, the con-

(1955) 1 SCR 1332 the court does not use the word "illegality" nor defined "irregularity" and illegality can only mean an incurable irregularity, incurable because of prejudice leading to a failure of justice, the question of prejudiced is a question of fact to be decided by the court in each particular case. If both the cases examined and analyzed it would appear that there is no conflict of view between Nanak Chand Vs The State of Punjab and Suraj Pal Vs The State of U.P. In considering whether a defect is illegal or merely irregular then several facts will have to be considered including its gravity to determine if it falls within one class or the other. It was contended that even if no separate charge is necessary when Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code and those under Section 149 of the Indian Penal Code. It is respectfully submitted that for clarifying the distinction between the Section 149 of the IPC and Section 34 of the IPC the Supreme Court referred the following cases: "The following cases afford no difficulty because they directly accord with the view wehave set out at length above. "In Lachman Singh v. The State it was held that when there is a charge under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code read with section 149 and the charge under section 149 disappears because of the acquittal of some of the accused, a conviction under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code read with section 34 is good even though there is no separate charge under section 302 read with section 34, provided the accused could have been so charged on the facts of the case. The decision in Karnail Singh v. The State of Punjab is to the same effect and the question about prejudice was also considered. Pandurang, Tukia and Bhillia v. State of Hyderabad also presents no difficulty because though the point was taken in that case it was expressly left open at page 1093.

From there we come to Suraj Pal v. The State of U.P. That was a case in which a number of accused were charged under sections 307/149 and sections 302/149 of the Indian Penal Code. It was found that there was no common object to kill, so all the accused were acquitted under section 149. But the evidence disclosed that the appellant had himself made an attempt on the life of one man and had himself shot another dead. Accordingly, the High Court convicted him under sections 307 and 302 of the Indian Penal Code respectively, though there was no separate charge under either of those sections. Those convictions were challenged here. This Court held that the omission to rame a charge is a serious lacuna but despite that the real question is whether that caused prejudice. The learned Judges then proceeded to determine the question of prejudice on the facts of that case. The conclusion reached on the facts was

that prejudice was disclosed, so an ac-

quittal was ordered."

In the matter William Versus The State of Madhya Pradesh, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has clarified that Section 149 has a specific offence and without applying its provisions a member of an unlawful assembly could not be made liable for offence committed not by him but another member of that assembly.

Therefore, the case is not similar to the one where there is a charge under Section 302 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code when Section 149 is ruled out the liability of murder ceases to be constructive. In the said Judgment the Hon'ble Supreme Court has categorically observed: Section 34, 114 & amp; 149 of the Indian Penal Code provide for criminal liability viewed from different angles as regards actual participants accessories and men actuated by a common object or common intention and the charge is a rolled up one involving direct liability and constructive liability without specifying who are directly liable and who are sought to be made constructively liable. The facts in each case has to be considered separately after being analyzed in order to decide that which was prima facie invalid is deemed to be valid by virtue of its pro-

In the case of Bikau Pandey & Dikau; Ors. Versus State of Bihar (2003) 12 SCC 616 wherein the Hon'ble Supreme Court has held that the word "object" means the purpose or design or in order to make it common. It must be shared by all. In other words, the object should be common to the persons who composed the assembly, that is to say they should aware of it and they should conquer in it. Common object is different from common intention as it does not require concert and a common meeting of minds before the attack.

In the case of Suresh & Damp; Anr. Versus State of U.P. (2001) 3 SCC 673 the Hon'ble Supreme Court has held that liability of accused who was only present at the scene of the offence. Section 34 of the IPC makes accused liable for ultimate criminal act done by several accused persons in furtherance of common intention of all of them. It does not require separate individual acts by all the accused persons. Therefore, in view of the above analysis of the Supreme Court Judgment common intention and common object in prosecuting the studies, there is no distinction between the Section 34 and 149 of the IPC. The difference can be analyzed taking into the facts entirely the nature and the gravity of the case under Section 34 and Section 149 of the IPC.

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Rail Link for Coal Mine

New Delhi: The first stretch of the Mahanadi Coal Railway Ltd (MCRL), being set up to transport coal from Talcher Coalfields, is expected to be functional in 2022, and ensure faster movement of coal rakes to Paradip and Damra ports, decongest the rail network, and reduce the transportation cost considerably.



To ensure efficient coal evacuation, construction of rail lines started in a phased manner in Talcher Coalfields namely MCRL. The Ministry of Coal has identified construction of MCRL Phase I & II project as a high Impact project under PM Gatishakti.

The MCRL was incorporated on 31.08.2015 with 64 per cent share of Mahanadi Coalfield Limited (MCL), 26 per cent of IRCON and 10 per cent share of Industrial Development Corporation of Odisha (IDCO)

The Alignment of the project traverses through Angul district in Odisha. Angul and Jarapda are existing stations of the Indian Railways network. Balram is an existing loading station in Talcher –Balram private siding of MCL.

Under the MCRL's Phase-I, the 14-km-long Angul-Balram corridor, expected to be blocks, it said.

operationalised by this year, will have movement of 25 MT coal from MCL mines in Talcher Coalfields.

Phase-II, the 54-km-long Balram-Jarpada-Tentuloi span, is expected to be commissioned by December 2025 and provides connectivity to allocated coal blocks on the southern side and central part of Talcher Coalfields.

Work is progressing rapidly, as notification for land acquisition and forestry clearances have been obtained, the Ministry said, adding that this line will cater to evacuation of around 58 MT coal from CIL and non-CIL coal blocks in Talcher.

The Ministry said that shipping routes are much cheaper compared to the rail network and will improve coal availability in the southern and western region of the country.

The rail corridor will improve faster movement of coal rakes to Paradip and Damra ports thereby decongesting the rail network and this will also reduce transportation cost considerably.

Talcher Coal?elds of Mahanadi Coal?eld is one of the largest with about 52 BT of coal resources, which is 15 per cent of total prognosticate coal resources in the country. Of the available resources in Talcher Coalfield, more than 63 per cent (33 BT) lies within 300 metres depth, presenting significant potential for open cast mining, Coal Ministry said in a statement here on Monday.



Bhubaneswar: The State Government is yet to receive over Rs 2739 crore as part of GST compensation from the Government of India.



According to a statement given by State Finance Minister Niranjan Pujari in the Odisha Legislative Assembly, the Centre is yet to release GST companion of Rs 1167.50 crore due for the financial year 2021-22 and Rs 1571.83 crore for the first two months of the current fiscal.

As per the provisions of GST (Compensation to States) Act, 2017, if the states' GST revenue does not grow by at least 14 per cent over the base year (2015-16), the Centre has to pay the shortfall amount, on a bi-monthly basis for the first five years of implementing the GST Act. The Union Government has implemented the Goods and Services Tax (GST) since July 1, 2017.

The Government of India has released GST compensation of Rs 2348.08 crore in the financial year 2017-18 against the protected revenue of Rs 10,769.79 crore, Mr.Pujari said.

Similarly, he said, Rs 4241.08 crore has been sanctioned to Odisha in 2018-19 against the protected revenue of Rs 16,370.08 crore while Rs 5331.91 crore has been released by the Centre during 2019-20 as GST compensation. The protected revenue was estimated at Rs 18,661.89 crore in the year 2019-20. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, the Union Government has sanctioned partial compensation of Rs 4243.42 crore against the protected revenue of Rs 21,274.55 crore during the financial year 2020-21. Moreover, the Government of India has also released Rs 3822 crore to Odisha Government as back-to-back loan to meet the GST revenue shortfall. In total, the State has received Rs 8,065.42 crore in the year 2020-21.

The protected revenue for the year 2021-22 was estimated at Rs 24,252.99 crore, of which the Centre has provided Rs 6,430.20 crore as back-to-back loan and the State Government has been demanding the Centre to release balance Rs 1167.50 crore dues, said Mr.Pujari in his reply.

For the current financial year, the protected revenue is estimated at Rs 27,648.42 crore, of which Rs 4608.07 crore has been earmarked for the first two months. Accordingly, the revenue shortfall for the first two months of the current FY is estimated at Rs 1571.83 crore, which is due till data, informed the Finance Minister.

As per the GST Act, the compensation should be paid till June end. However, the State Government has been demanding the Centre to extend the compensation period for another five years.

During the 47th meeting of the GST Council held on 28-29 June, 2022 at Chandigarh, Minister Mr.Pujari raised the issue of GST compensation.

He stated that, if GST compensation is discontinued after June, 2022, the resource gap in the State would increase and cause large fiscal shocks. It would also lead to reduction in the Capital expenditure and cause contraction of the State economy.

The Minister accordingly requested the GST Council to extend the compensation window by another five years in the interest of revenue resources of the State.

BJP MP Aparajta Sarangi, who is well known for her work as the state's school and mass education secretary, said she was surprised with the directive.

"It is unfortunate and the order should be withdrawn immediately," she said. Senior Congress MLA Suresh Routray said it was not the first time that such restrictions were imposed on journalists.

"They are yet to get entry into the assembly in the name of COVID-19. Journalists have been denied entry to the state secretariat for two years and also the SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack," he said.

Defending the government, School and Mass Education Minister SR Dash said the press has the right to highlight wrongs, but reporters of some web portals were entering campuses without permission and disturbing the atmosphere of the schools. Adani Group's spectrum bidding plans to fuel competition in auctions, enterprise 5G: Analysts

NEW DELHI: The Adani Group's entry into spectrum bidding will intensify competition in upcoming auctions as well as the enterprise

5G space, brokerages said on Monday. "As India prepares to roll out next generation 5G services though this auction, we are one of the many applicants participating in the open bidding process," the company had said, adding its intention is not to be in the consumer mobility space.

On Monday, BofA Securities in a note on the Adani Group's plans to bid in 5G auctions said, "We consider this news flow negative for incumbent telcos as it increases competition in upcoming auction bidding as well as in the longterm opportunity to target the enterprise space."

Brokerage CLSA wondered why Adani would bid in auction versus awaiting a di-

Goldman Sachs observed that while the group has said it does not intend to be in the consumer mobility space, "we believe if the Adani Group does end up buying spectrum in the upcoming auction, it could potentially increase competition in enterprise 5G, in addition to opening the doors for the Adani Group to expand into consumer mobile services over time."

Globally, 5G services have been launched in three bands -- 700MHz (coverage), 3.5GHz (5G coverage and capacity) and 26GHz (capacity and low latency).

"However, with Adani group ruling out offering consumer mobility services, we believe that its participation in 5G spectrum auctions will be limited to 3.5

'space-based' 5G net-

It added that the group's foray to provide standalone 5G enterprise network solutions was a tad "unclear" given that globally, 5G enterprise use cases are still under pilot stages.

Credit Suisse also questioned the rationale behind bidding for 5G spectrum in auctions when the Centre has already allowed private enterprises to set up captive non-public network by acquiring spectrum from the government nominal cost and without any licence fees.

"Whereas, acquiring a 100 MHz block on pan-India basis in 3.5 GHz band is likely to cost Rs 317 billion (Rs 31,700 crore) and 500 MHz in 26 GHz band is likely to cost another Rs 35 billion (Rs 3,500 crore). Of course, these come with comfortable payment terms," it wrote.

Credit Suisse felt that the possibility of Adani Group foraying into consumer mobility in the future is "non-zero".

"While the Adani group has expressly denied intentions of entering the consumer mobility business, we believe that market participants may still view this as a low, distant possibility given the sector's history. However, it would require a meaningfully higher capital commitment," said the report.

A total of 72,097.85 MHz of spectrum worth at least Rs 4.3 lakh crore will be put on the block during the auction, set to commence on July 26, 2022.

The auction will be held for spectrum in various low (600 MHz, 700 MHz, 800 MHz, 900 MHz, 1800 MHz, 2100 MHz, 2300 MHz), mid (3300 MHz) and high (26 GHz) frequency bands.

While the 5G spectrum in nine frequency bands will be auctioned, the Notice Inviting Applications -- the bid-related document issued by the Telecom Department -- said tech firms will be allowed to take the 5G spectrum for their captive non-public network on lease from the telecom companies.

The bid document said direct allocation of spectrum to tech companies will follow a demand study and sector regulator's recommendation on aspects such as pricing and modalities of such allocation.

LONDON: Wimbledon champion Novak Djokovic is hoping US authorities change entry rules in time to allow him to compete at the US Open, even though he refuses to be vaccinated against coronavirus.

The Serbian top seed beat Nick Kyrgios in four sets on Sunday to win his seventh title at the All England Club and 21st Grand Slam crown overall



-- leaving him just one behind Rafael Nadal. Now he is targeting a fourth US Open crown after losing to Daniil Medvedev in the final last year. But as things stand, his unvaccinated status means he will not be allowed into the United States to play in the tournament, which starts next month.

"I'm not vaccinated and I'm not planning to get vaccinated so the only good news I can have is them removing the mandated green vaccine card or whatever you call it to enter United States or exemption," said the 35-year-old.

"I don't think exemption is realistically possible... I think it's just whether or not they remove this in time for me to get to the USA."

The Serb was deported from Australia over his vaccination status in January, preventing him from defending his Australian Open title.

Djokovic admitted it had been a difficult start to the year and it had taken him months to recover.

"It has affected me definitely in the first several months of the year," he said. "I was not feeling great generally. I mean, mentally, emotionally, I was not at a good place.

"I wanted to play, but at the same time when I went out on the court in Dubai, the first tournament of the year, I just felt so much pressure and emotions

"I wasn't feeling myself on the court. I realised at that point that it's going to take some time, that I have to be patient, and sooner or later I will get myself in the state, optimal state, where I would like to be."

'Tough year'

Djokovic's coach, former Wimbledon champion Goran Ivanisevic, said it had been a "tough year" for the player.

But he said he never doubted Djokovic would recover, describing him as "heroic".

"People like him you don't doubt," he said. "He's a great champion. They say maybe took him a long time, but it didn't take him a long time.

"It took him the exact time that he needed to recover and to digest all the things that happened to

Djokovic, whose Wimbledon triumph was his fourth in succession at the All England Club, said he was now taking a much-needed holiday.

"I am on vacation," he said. "Whether or not I'm playing any tournament soon, I'll definitely be resting for the next couple of weeks because it has been quite an exhausting and demanding period for

me the last few months. "A lot of tennis, which I was very happy about. I got what I wanted here. Then I'll wait hopefully for some good news from the USA because I would really love to go there."

The former world number one said he did not feel under pressure to play a certain schedule.

"I achieved that historic No. 1, weeks for No. 1, that I worked for all my life. Now that that's done and dusted, I prioritise Slams and big tournaments really and where I want to play, where I feel good."

Djokovic also said he felt lifted by the Wimbledon crowd on Sunday -- he has often faced an uphill battle to win fans over when he has been playing Roger Federer or Rafael Nadal.

"I did definitely feel support and feel love from the crowd today, so I'm very grateful for that," he said. "Obviously it's not a secret that any player would like to have people backing him during the match because at the end of the day this could make a quite big difference with how you feel mentally.'
