



Sun Temple



Like Pattachitra, appliqué work also originated as temple art, essentially limited to umbrellas and canopies to be used in the annual Rath Yatra. Nowadays, its usage is more in the household, decorative and fes-

> tival products. The craft involves embroidery and stitching with occasional mirror work.

Brass and Dhokra Works

A 4000-year old craft form, Dhokra is a casting method that combines metallurgical skills with wax techniques. It is a bell metal tribal craft that uses an alloy of tin and copper or brass and zinc. Various utility items including utensils, pots and pans, lamps and even tribal jewellery are fashioned out of it.



That's perhaps why during a conversation between Maara and a thief (Alexander Babu), you can see a neon sign in the background that reads 'White Rabbit'. The usual response to such a call is to cite a lack of financial security, and while that is a reason to be empathetic about especially given the enviably cushy workfree existence Paaru seems to be leading

magic of life in you, it seems to be saying... notice the almost mystical beauty of existence. It's also likely that this is why the film's many shots are lit as they are, with many faces often aglow, as though in the presence of a halo.

This is why the coincidences in this film become palatable. The central idea at the heart of this film is of two lonely souls in search of each other. Take note of that inexplicable attraction little Paaru feels as she sees a speeding train from within her bus. Or take note of that instinctive smile from Maara as he

to whoever he meets. Maara himself, as he does many times in this film, underplays this notion that he's a mystical being. It's his understanding and you will see it from his eyes when he's engaged in conversation with every single characterthat each of us is magical, as are our stories.

In this film with performances that range from great to over-the-top, I loved Mouli in particular, who plays Vellaiya, an old man consumed by his unrequited love. Watch him in that scene with Paaru as he brings to her an old

stead. Watch him in another scene with Paaru as she tells him about Meenakshi; watch his eyes grow wide in surprise, and almost well up under the weight of decades of mourning. Ghibran's background music and Thamarai's evocative lyrics add so much to such scenes as well. It's wonderful that films like Maara are able to offer elderly characters like Mouli's as much purpose and are able to see them for the individuals that they are, instead of simply as a crutch for a lead character. Of course, much of this credit must go to the original film, Charlie.

In a world that is in a tearing hurry, at a time when films and stories are designed to be rapid for fear of making audiences impatient, films like Maara come as a welcome relief. In this film, at least two important exchangesbetween Vellaiya and Paaru, and later, between Maara and Kani-happen as wood slowly burns to ember, as tender faces are lit by the warm glow of a fire-place. It's for such moments that I'll remember this film, even if some inconsistent performances and some synthetic moments stop it from being truly great. 

RBI to go for 35 basis points hike in rates at next week's monetary policy meeting: Report

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank of India's rate-setting panel will go for a 0.35 per cent hike in the key repo rate at its meeting next week, an American brokerage said on Wednesday.

The hike will be accompanied by a change in the policy stance to "calibrated tightening", Bofa Securities said in a report published ahead of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) resolution which is set to be announced on August 5.

RBI has hiked the rate by a cumulative 0.90 per cent in two tightening moves in May and June, responding to the runaway headline inflation which has consistently overshot the up-

for the central bank for many months. Referring to policy actions since April, when RBI introduced the standing deposit facility, the brokerage said the

central bank has effectively hiked rates by 1.30 per cent. "In our base case, we

OJEE 2022 results: 47,729 candidates secure ranks, counselling from August 10

OJEE committee chairman SK Chand said candidates who secured ranks will be able to take part in OJEE counselling scheduled to start from August 10 for admission into different technical and professional courses in government and private colleges of the State. The OJEE was conducted between July 4 and July 8 in 61 centres within the State and four centres outside. A total 57, 898 students had registered for the exam of which 47,761 turned up for the computer-based test.

Meanwhile, Chand said the special OJEE for admission into vacant BTech seats, that had been merged with OJEE main in the previous two years due to Covid-19 pandemic, is likely to be conducted towards the end of August or the first week of September. Form fill up process for the test will commence from August 1, he said.
