Russia- Ukraine war shaking global & Indian economy

Kolkata (KCN): Merchants' Chamber of Commerce & Industry hosted a Special Session on Current Macroeconomic Situation and Busi-



ness Outlook with Mr. Luis Breuer, Senior Resident Representative India, International Monetary Fund in Kolkata. Russia- Ukraine conflict has triggered a costly humanitarian crisis over the last three months. Hence, the economic damage from the conflict is contributing to a significant slowdown in global growth in 2022 and adding to inflation. Prices of crude oil and gas, food grains such as wheat and corn and several other commodities have shot up, hitting vulnerable populations in lowincome countries in a hardest way.

Mr. Namit Bajoria, Vice-President, MCCI in his Welcome Address said that the last two years are a saga of our determined fight against the daunting challenges posed by the pandemic and India has come out of it more resilient. India now stands at a crucial juncture once again. Mr. Bajoria added, "Indian economy is facing high inflation, widening trade deficit and foreign portfolio investment outflow".

Luis Breuer said that the Ukraine war is an economic earthquake. The Conflict between Ukraine and Russia has escalated the disruptions to the commodity markets (crude oil, food grains, etc,) supply chains and refugee crisis. India has witnessed 7.8 percent of inflation due to this geo-political unrest.

Bhubaneswar (KC-N): Around 69 per cent polling was recorded till 5 PM in the by-election to Brajrajnagar assembly segment in Jharsuguda district, where voting was completed peacefully with no untoward incident.

The voting for the bypoll to Brajrajnagar assembly segment in Jharsuguda district was started at 7 AM and continued till 6 PM. The polling was conducted through EVMs.

"The election was conducted peacefully. The final voters' turnout in the by-poll will be known after polling parties returned from the booths," said Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Sushil Kumar Lohani.

No untoward incident reported from any booth in the constituency till 5 PM. However, due to some technical glitches, four EVMs have been replaced, he said.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The four nominees of Governing Biju Janata Dal (BJD) on Tuesday filed their nomination papers for the election and by-poll to Rajya Sabha (RS) scheduled for June 10 and 13, respectively.

BJD Spokesperson Sulata Deo, Media Advisor to Government Manas Mangaraj and Present RS member Dr Sasmit Patra have filed their nominations for the full-term RS seats while recently joined tribal leader Niranjan Bishi submitted his papers for the RS by-poll.

Sulata Deo is a woman face in the party. She had started her career Sarpanch and became Jajpur Zilla Parishad President. Deo also worked in the Social Welfare Board. She had vast experience. So, she has been nominated, said senior BJD leader and Minister Arun Sahoo. "This gives a message to the women that those who have dedicated their life for social service, he/ she will be selected for such a crucial position," he said.

Similarly, Dr Patra has already proved himself as a good Parliamentarian in the Upper House. So, he has been re-nominated by the party, Sahoo stated.

Manas Mangaraj has started his career as journalist and he is also having vast political experience, said the BJD leader. Besides, Niranjan, who is a strong tribal leader, has also been selected for the RS seat, he added.

The poll for full term seats is being held as the tenure of three Rajya Sabha members from Odisha – N Bhaskar Rao, Prasanna Acharya and Sasmit Patra will

end on July 1. Out of the three, the BJD Supremo has renominated Patra considering his loyalty for the party and his performance in the Upper House. Moreover, he was elected to RS in a by-poll held following the as Subash Singh had resigned from the seat in April after he was elected as Cuttack Mayor.

The BJD is set to win all the four RS seats with a strength of 113 in an Assembly of 147. The BJP and Congress with 22 and 9 seats in the Assembly do not have the numbers to win a seat. So, the opposition parties are also not filing any candidate for the election.

Fragile family atmosphere and the school shootings in America

Gruesome, horrific and bone-chilling- I know, the vocabulary to describe the massacres in schools across America



cannot be limited to these three words. But the level of animosity that the young generation in this country is growing

with is harrowing and I really believe that this gut-wrenching killing spree cannot be addressed with gun control alone. Much more needs to be done with respect to bring the young minds to sensitize the gravity of chaos their brains are enmeshed in. It should be unbelievable to know that America has more guns than the actual population of the state. The richest and the most developed country in the world has more than 400 million guns circulating among a population of nearly 332 million. Despite making economic affluence, America is largely a society stooping towards a complete moral decline. This appears to be a crude observation but on ground the situation is worsening with every passing day. The children who walked into the Robb Elementary School in Uvalde in Texas on 24 May 2022 would not have thought that the morning leisure time in their school would witness a bloodbath killing at least 19 of them and two adults in their lovely campus. Before taking his assault rifle to the school campus, the young killer Salvador Ramos checked the efficacy of the weapon that he procured a few days before his 18th birthday on his grandmother, shooting in her face. The reason behind this barbarity is yet to be uncovered but this is not the first of its kind the U.S witnessed - a mass shooting in a school. There have been such horrific massacres across the country and the one that happened in Stockton, California in 1989 was the first which killed five children. On De-

cember 14, 2012 in the Sandy Hook

School of Newtown, Connecticut, the young shooter Adam Lanza was 20 years old and fearless when he pointed his assault rifle taking the lives of 20 children and 6 adults. 17 children were mercilessly gunned down by the young shooter at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida and the list continues. Imagine the trauma of the parents who, on that day, sent their children off to the school by the school bus and waited for their homecoming with jubilant faces. Shockingly, statistics reveal that hundreds of children were killed in

mass shootings in the state of America

in between 1989 to 2022. As per the studies carried out by different agencies, most of the cases of mass murder by the youngsters in the schools had a common feature which is staggering. Almost everywhere, before the mass killing, the shooters attempted to either kill someone at their homes or attempted at least an assault. It is indeed distressing to notice that most of the school shooters were either current or former students of those schools where they tested the precision of their weapons. There may be various reasons that provoked these young minds to carry out such terrible atrocities. A child, from his formative days would be influenced by various factors. The depth of influence that his parents are capable of having on him matters the most at this stage. As a society, America has been witnessing a rise of non-marital cohabitation and frequent divorce and the family life that a child is forced to grow through would find him totally distressing and wobbly. What we experience in India is totally different. In India, we have been focussing on strengthening family relationships from all possible dimensions. The values that we cherish as a family surely reinforce the bond among its members.

The Pew Research Center, in its study reports share some interesting facts which probably can substantiate focusing on the reasons that push the young Americans to become atrocious at a young age. It reveals the speed with which the American families are breaking from two-parent households to single parent households or children growing without parents. The country is witnessing a rapid rise in divorce, remarriage and cohabitation and forcing the families to shrink. In a tumultuous family atmosphere, parenting is challenging and the children trapped in this volatility live in fear, horror and uncertainty and mostly with hatred for their parents. According to the Pew Research Report, 16% of children are living in "blended families" with a stepparent, step siblings or half sibling. A new estimate states that about one in five children born within a marriage will experience the breakup of the parents by age 9 and half of the children born within a cohabiting union will experience the breakup of their parents at the same age. These data are evident enough to unearth the reason, which is mainly the lack of moral values that the families are sailing with. A family without parents, siblings, cousins, aunts, uncles, grandparents at the family table and the whole family organ trimmed to an atom size, devoid of the beauty and the lovely mischief that a family, a replica of a society would have; would mostly be a volcano inside. The loneliness and the squabbles that the child finds as part of the family's parental discourse and the absence of mutual respect amid affluence and a morality in decline contribute to his volatile behaviour. Broken families are mushrooming in India too; but of course, the trend is yet to gain momentum.

A satisfactory assessment is that India has the lowest divorce in the world. It is almost lower than 1% in India. This may not be an awesome achievement, as many families are silent with the atmosphere inside them terribly obnoxious, and many of the upsetting issues never break open the walls or are concealed tight. In comparison to America's 50% marriage breakups, India's 1% is really praiseworthy. With Sweden ranking the highest in divorce rates followed by America, India is still in a better position. It is quite unlikely for India to face the situation that America does. But families should become more resourceful and centers of magnanimity and care where children can grow with self-respect and generosity. Violent family atmosphere ignites self-hate and despair among children as it did in the case of most of the school shooters in America. The solution to what we call an epidemic of gun violence in America is basically a course correction that every family needs to get ready to go for. A ban on assault rifles will be an initial administrative step that the country can take but it is for the people of the country to set their houses alright. To a large extent, India is a good example for value based families and happy parenting.

Bodies of all 22 victims of Nepal plane crash brought to Kathmandu for post-mortem

KATHMANDU: The bodies of 22 people, including four Indians, killed in the plane crash in Nepal's mountainous Mustang district on Sunday, have been brought to Kathmandu where the mortal remains would be handed over to their families after the post-mortem on Tuesday.

The Canadian-built turboprop Twin Otter 9N-AET plane was carrying four Indians,

According to a preliminary investigation carried out by the Civil Aviation Authority of Nepal (CAAN), bad weather was the reason behind the crash of the plane.

According to Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA) General Manager Prem Nath Thakur, the bodies of 10 victims were brought on Monday evening and the bodies of the remaining 12 were brought here by a Nepal Army helicopter on Tuesday. All the bodies have been sent to the Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospital for post-mortem examinations.

The bodies will be handed to the families Oof the victims after the post-mortem, the official said.

The government has formed a five-member commission of inquiry headed by senior aeronautical engineer Ratish Chandra Lal Suman to find out the cause of the Tara tional and national mountain guides from the crash site on Tuesday and it will be transported to Kathmandu.

The black box, also known as the cockpit voice recorder, records radio transmissions and other sounds in the cockpit, such as conversations between the pilots, and engine noises.

The modern planes have two black boxes that includes the flight data recorder which records more than 80 different types of information such as speed, altitude and direction, as well as pilot actions and performance of important systems.

The black box could offer vital clues about the crash in which all 22 people on board were killed.

Due to the geographical remoteness and adverse weather conditions, the search and the recovery mission were delayed.

The plane was found scattered at an altitude of 4,200 metres, a four-hour uphill hike from the centre of Thasang Village Municipality.

Bishnoi faces charges under the Arms Act and other sections related to assault on a public servant in the

"Since Bishnoi has been taken into police custody, we will also be questioning him in connection with the killing of Moosewala in Punjab," he added. The development comes a day after a Delhi court refused to entertain a plea filed by Bishnoi seeking a direction to the jail authorities not to give his custody to Punjab police, which suspects that he had plotted the singer's killing.

Bishnoi has moved the Delhi High Court which will hear on Wednesday his plea claiming apprehension of a fake encounter by the Punjab Police.

The plea has sought direction to the Tihar Jail authority and the Delhi Police to ensure necessary safeguards are taken for his Sharma for hearing on Wednesday.

Punjab Police had on Sunday said the killing of Moosewala seemed to be the result of an inter-gang rivalry and that the Lawrence Bishnoi gang was involved in

it. "On Tuesday, gangster Bishnoi was questioned for a few hours by the Special cell unit and then was arrested in a different case. He was then taken to a Delhi Court to get his police custody," a jail official said.

When contacted, Bishnoi's advocate Vishal Chopra told PTI that "Lawrence Bishnoi has been taken into three days of police remand in a different case. It has nothing to do with the Moosewala killing case."

Bishnoi has been taken into police custody in connection with an old case of firing and Arms Act wherein the arrested Moosewala was shot dead on Sunday by unidentified assailants in Punjab's Mansa district, a day after the state government curtailed his security cover.

Moosewala's cousin and a friend, who were travelling in a Mahindra Thar jeep with him, were also injured in the attack. According to police, Bishnoi has been arrested in FIR NO.83/ 22 in which three prime sharpshooters of the dreaded 'Gogi Gang' - Mukesh (32), Harvinder (29) and Shakti (22) - were involved in different incidents of firing on rival gang members, their family members, the house of Assistant Superintendent of TiharJail and killing prime eyewitness of a murder case. Three sophisticated pistols and 11 live cartridges along with one motorcycle, were recovered from their possession, police

Over 6,000 artistes to perform at Odisha's Sital Sasthi Yatra, rituals to begin on Tuesday

SAMBALPUR: With the historic Sital Sasthi Yatra scheduled for June 4 after a gap of two years, a conglomeration of over 6,000 artistes from across Odisha as well as neighbouring states is expected to perform at the cultural extravaganza.

During the week-long festival, rituals for the marriage of Lord Shiva with his consort, goddess Parvati will begin from Tuesday. The divine marriage will take place on June 4. The homecoming procession of the divine couple to their temple, which witnesses footfall of lakhs of devotees, would start on June 5 night and continue till June 6 afternoon.

Due to Covid outbreak, the festival was a low key affair for two consecutive years. However, this year, the Nandapara, Jharuapadra and Mudipara Sital Sasthi Yatra committees have drawn up a budget of more than Rs 1 crore for the festival. The joint coordination committee (JCC) of Sital Sasthi Yatra committees and members of the organising committees informed that since the carnival will be organised in a grand way this year, people will get the opportunity to witness some of the age-old dance forms which are on the verge of extinction, like Gourbari, Kalas dance, Paika Akhada, Samparda and Ghumra.

Sources said, this year, Mudipara Sital Sasthi Committee will spend around Rs 35 lakh on the festival and nearly 2,500 artistes will take part in the procession. Similarly, Jhaduapada Committee and Nandapada Committee will also spend `35 lakh each for performance of more than 1,900 and 1,500 artistes, respectively.

Working president of Sital Sasthi Yatra JCC, Susanta Purohit said, artistes from at least 12 districts in Odisha besides from four other states have been invited this time. Ukraine war: EU leaders agree to ban 90 per cent of Russian oil by year-end

BRUSSELS: European Union leaders agreed Monday to embargo most Russian oil imports into the bloc by year-end as part of new sanctions on Moscow worked out at a summit focused on helping Ukraine with a long-delayed package of new financial support.

The embargo covers Russian oil brought in by sea, allowing a temporary exemption for imports delivered by pipeline, a move that was crucial to bring landlocked Hungary on board a deci-

EU Council President Charles Michel said the agreement covers more than two-thirds of oil imports from Russia. Ursula Von der Leyen, the head of the EU's executive branch, said the punitive move will "effectively cut around 90% of oil imports from Russia to the EU by the end of the year."

Michel said leaders also agreed to provide Ukraine with a 9 billion-euro (\$9.7 billion) tranche of assistance to support the war-torn

"More than ever it's important to show that we are able to be strong, that we are able to be firm, that we are able to be tough," he added.

Michel said the new sanctions, which needed the support of all 27 member countries, will be legally endorsed by Wednesday.

The EU had already imposed five previous rounds of sanctions on Russia over its war. It has targeted more than 1,000 people individually, including Russian President Vladimir Putin and top government officials as well as pro-Kremlin oligarchs, banks, the coal sector and

But the sixth package of measures announced May 4 had been held up by concerns over oil

The impasse embarrassed the bloc, which was forced to scale down its ambitions to break Hungary's resistance. When European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen proposed the package, the initial aim was to phase out imports of crude oil within six months and refined products by the end of the year.

Both Michel and von der Leyen said leaders will soon return to the issue, seeking to guarantee that Russia's pipeline oil exports to the EU are banned at a later date.

Hungarian Prime minister Viktor Orban had made clear he could support the new sanctions only if his country's oil supply security was guaranteed. Hungary gets more than 60% of its oil from Russia and depends on crude that comes through the Soviet-era Druzhba pipeline. Von der Leyen had played down the chances of a breakthrough at the summit. But leaders reached a compromise after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy urged them to end "internal arguments that only prompt Russia to put more and more pressure on the whole of Europe."

The EU gets about 40% of its natural gas and 25% of its oil from Russia, and divisions over the issue exposed the limits of the 27-nation trading bloc's ambitions.

In his 10-minute video address, Zelenskyy told leaders to end "internal arguments that only prompt Russia to put more and more pressure on the whole of Europe."

He said the sanctions package must "be agreed on, it needs to be effective, including (on) oil," so that Moscow "feels the price for what it is doing against Ukraine" and the rest of Europe. Only then, Zelenskyy said, will Russia be forced to "start seeking peace."

It was not the first time he had demanded that the EU target Russia's lucrative energy sector and deprive Moscow of billions of dollars each day in supply payments. But Hungary led a group of EU countries wor ried over the impact of the oil ban on their economy, including Slovakia, the Czech Republic and Bulgaria. Hungary relies heavily on Russia for energy and can't afford to turn off the pumps. In addition to its need for Russian oil, Hungary gets 85% of its natural gas from Russia.

Likewise, the Q4 output is lower than the government's initial estimate of 4.8% growth made in February, but higher than private estimates, which pegged growth at about 2-3.5%.

French 32-year-old journalist is killed in Ukraine

"Aboard a humanitarian bus, alongside civilians forced to flee to escape Russian bombs, he was fatally shot," Macron tweeted.

Macron expressed condolences to his family, relatives and colleagues and spoke of "France's unconditional support" to "those who carry out the difficult mission of informing in theaters of operations." French Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna said the journalist's death was "deeply shocking." She tweeted that he was killed "by Russian bombing."

"France demands that a transparent inquiry be launched as soon as possible to shed full light on the circumstances of this tragedy," she said in a written statement. Colonna, who was on a planned visit to the Ukrainian's capital Kyiv on Monday, later called the tragedy "a crime" to reporters.

She said she talked to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and asked him to do "everything" to allow the journalist's body to be returned to France as soon as possible. She said the investigation on the circumstances of the death in the war zone will be led by Ukrainian authorities.

BFM TV said Leclerc-Imhoff was accompanied by a male colleague who was lightly injured. A Ukrainian woman who was working with them was not hit.

Earlier Monday, the governor of the Luhansk region, Serhiy Haidai, announced Leclerc-Imhoff's death in a Telegram post, saying that Russian forces fired on an armored vehicle that was traveling to pick up people for evacua-

"Shrapnel from the shells pierced the vehicle's armor, fatally wounding an accredited French journalist in the neck who was reporting on the evacuation. The patrol officer was saved by his helmet," he wrote. As a result of the attack, the evacuation was called off, Haidai

He posted an image of Leclerc-Imhoff's Ukrainian press accreditation, and images of what he said was the aftermath of the attack. Haidai said Leclerc-Imhoff's body was evacuated to the nearby Ukrainian-held city of Bakhmut and will be taken to the central city of Dnipro for an autopsy. He said the patrol officer accompanying the vehicle was hit by shrapnel in the head and taken to a military hospital.

The head of Ukraine's National Journalist Union, Serhiy Tomilenko, speaking to AP, said officials are discussing how to repatriate his body to France, "which in the conditions of military activity and constant shelling is not so easy to do."

"Journalists are paying with their lives for the right to know the truth about what is happening in the war in Ukraine," he said. The head of Reporters Without Borders, Christophe Deloire, said that "from the beginning of the war we have noticed that the journalists, and other citizens of course, civilians, are targeted by Russian forces."

According to Deloire, Leclerc-Imhoff was heading to the Donbas region on a humanitarian bus which was going to pick up people and evacuate them. Several Ukrainian and foreign journalists have been killed since February, including another French national, veteran videographer Pierre Zakrzewski, 55.

Zakrzewski, who also had Irish citizenship, and 24-year-old Ukrainian journalist Oleksandra "Sasha" Kuvshynova, both working for Fox News, were killed when their vehicle came under fire outside of Kyiv on March 14.

India's growth projection being revised, might be lower than earlier forecast: IMF official

KOLKATA(KCN): The IMF is in the process of revising India's growth projection for 2022, which could be lower than its earlier forecast of 8.2 per cent, amid risks of global stagflation, a senior official of the international organisation said on Tuesday.

In April, the International Monetary Fund had lowered India's growth projection to 8.2 per cent as compared to 9 per cent estimated in January. By 2023, the country is expected to grow at 6.9 per cent, it said.

IMF is currently revising India's growth forecast for 2022, which may be lower than 8.2 per

"This is a work in progress at the moment," IMF Senior Resident Representative in India Luis Breuer said at an interactive session on 'World Economic Outlook' organised by the MCC here. He said the country is facing high inflation with low employment, which will not augur well for job opportunities.

Breuer also called for stabilising the debt at higher levels, which was a result of the impact on public finances due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the need to protect vulnerable sections of the society.

India is being seen as an emerging economy, which is recovering at the moment, he said.

The IMF official said central banks across the US and Europe have started to increase interest rates to fight growing inflation caused by a surge in commodity prices and supply disruptions.

"The US Federal Reserve is expected to hike interest rates in future and the world economy is likely to plateau at 3.6 per cent," he said, adding, the increased cost of borrowing will have its impact on growth rates. Real interest rates may rise and a hike in US rates will suck in capital from the rest of the world due to high re-

turns," Breuer said. Stagflation is defined as a situation of high inflation and stagnant growth.

He also said the pandemic is not over, and the lockdown in Beijing is yet to be withdrawn unlike in Shanghai.

"China, being the factory of the world, the shutdown will disrupt global supplies. There is a risk of China facing a slowdown, which will have a negative impact on India," he said.

"A one per cent drop in China's GDP growth will reduce India's by 0.6 per cent, more than the combined decline of the UK and US tobruises.

Consumption, which accounts for 56% of the GDP, fell in Q4 over Q3, while it barely kept up last year's momentum. Given the rapid onset of infections in January, the setback in consumption is understandable.

The good news though is, investments are exhibiting signs of healing with gross fixed capital formation rising sequentially and annually. Investments grew, albeit at a weaker pace, all through FY22. Having crossed past the pre-pandemic level in Q3, any slip up here or even stagnation would deliver a huge

held the fort during the tough pandemic years of FY20 and FY21, too maintained the spirit of spending in Q4 and throughout FY22.

Meanwhile, the eight sub-components of the national output are a mixed bag with some doing well, but others struggling.

Agriculture and allied sectors saw a sequential growth of 4.1% in Q4, but over the previous year, it barely moved a muscle. The big disappointment is manufacturing that slipped back into negative territory, though it did register growth on a sequential basis.

The BJD president's visit to Delhi and his meeting with Modi and Shah, though, assumes significance as the BJP-led NDA needs support of the regional party to make up the numbers needed to win the presidential election.

At present, the NDA has 48.8 per cent of the total votes of the electoral college against the necessity of at least 50 per cent of the total vote value.

Even as the BJP won four of the five states where Assembly elections were held in recent months, the numerical strength of the saffron party has reduced considerably in Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand compared to its earlier strength.

The BJD has three per cent vote value, which can tilt the scales in BJP's favour. As support from regional parties like Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Trinamool Congress (TMC), Telangana Rastra Samithi (TRS) to the NDA nominee is unlikely due to ideological differences, the BJP is banking heavily on BJD and YSR Congress Party.

The two regional parties have avoided an adversarial stance to the Centre and have extended their crucial support to the BJP on many issues including the passage of contentious bills like Citizenship Act Amendment and scrapping of Article 370.

This is despite the claim of the BJD of maintaining equidistance from BJP and Congress. The BJD had extended its support to the NDA nominee Ram Nath Kovind in the 2017 Presidential election. Earlier, the Chief Minister had said that his party would take a call on its course of action only after candidates for President post get nominated.

The BJD has 12 MPs in Lok Sabha, six members in Rajya Sabha and 113 MLAs in the Odisha Assembly. It is all set to win the four seats in the Upper House election, which will be held on June 10.

The concerned Ministries and Departments of the Government of India has already issued Office Memorandums giving approval for the Shri Lingaraj Temple Ordinance.

As regards clarifications on the comments of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India is concerned, the Chief Secretary said he has replied to all clause-wise queries.

Therefore, Mr.Mahapatra urged the Union Home Secretary to take appropriate steps in obtaining kind instruction of the President so as to enable the Odisha Governor to promulgate the Ordinance for smooth management of the Seva Puja Deity Shri Lingaraj Mahaprabhu.

In December 2020, the State Cabinet had approved the Ordinance to bring Lingaraj Temple, the largest temple in Bhubaneswar and 8 other associated temples, under the control of Lingaraj Temple Managing Committee, similar to the one for Jagannath Temple in Puri.

The Lingaraj temple is now covered under the Odisha Hindu Religious Endowment Act.

The Jagannath temple was the first temple in Odisha to have a special law enacted in 1955 after being under British control for a long time. The Ordinance provided an administrator, quite like the Jagannath temple and servitor system with hereditary rights.

However, MHA had objected to the Ordinance saying it feels the proposed law is outside the competence of the state legislature as it could conflict with the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1958 (AMASR Act).

As certain clauses of the ordinance seek to conserve and repair the temples or tanks, the Centre feels it will be in conflict with the Cen-

In India the private sector has maintained stabilized debt at the high level, the balance sheet of the private entities in the banks has been strengthened over the last 5 years. Mr. Breuer also assured that economic crisis of the neighboring countries of India will not affect Indian economy much.

Mr. Breuer said that the change in interest rate of China would affect Asia in the same way as the combined effect of changing the interest rate of USA and Europe. However, a rise in US real rates can have significant spillovers effect on Asia.

While speaking about the global economy, Mr. Breuer said that economy isn't fully recovered; there exist an output gap which may lead to a combined effect of higher inflation and lower employment.

Over the last 15 years, World economy has witnessed 3 major crisis such as Global Financial Crisis, COVID pandemic and Russia-Ukraine Conflict. It is expected that the economy will bounce back.

Mr. Breuer mentioned that China has very high presence in global economy. China shifted its economy to be less dependent on export to and concentrating on increasing purchasing power of domestic market.
