Bhubaneswar(KCN): President Droupadi Murmu will come to Odisha in the last week of July on a two-day visit. According to officials, President Shrimati Murmu is scheduled to visit Cuttack and Bhadrak on July 26 and 27, respectively. The President will attend several important events during her two-day visit to home State Odisha. As per scheduled




program, Shrimati Murmu will attend three programmes in Cuttack on July 26. Among these are the valedictory

session of the 75th anniversary celebrations of Orissa High Court, the convocation ceremony of National Law University Odisha (NLUO) and the students' union anniversary programme of SCB Medical College. Rashtrapati Bhavan and the Union Ministry of Home Affairs have confirmed Murmu's attendance in these programmes to the respective institutes,

officials said. She is also likely to visit Katak Chandi Temple during the trip, they said. The President will also be gracing the Diamond Jubilee celebrations of Bhadrak Autonomous College on July 27. This will be her third visit to the state after assuming the office of the president in July 2022. She had last visited the State in May on a three-day tour.

Dispose Of Anubhav-Varsha Divorce Case In Time-Bound Manner: Orissa HC

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Orissa High Court today directed a family court in Cuttack to dispose of a divorce case involving actor-turned politician Anubhav Mohanty and his actress wife Varsha Priyadarshini within three months. The HC also directed the family court to finish the cross examination in connection with the case within four weeks,

sources said. Now, it is expected that the family court will dispose of the divorce



case by October 31, said a source. Mohanty had approached the HC on the plea that the hearing

on the divorce case was getting delayed at the family court. Notably, the star couple got married in 2014. Mohanty, who has been elected to the Lok Sabha from Kendrapara, had moved a Delhi-based court in 2020 seeking divorce. The divorce case was shifted to a family court in Cuttack following the Supreme Court's intervention into it.

Odisha's First Endoscopy Unit For Animals Opens At Nandankanan

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha's first endoscopy unit for animals has been made functional at Nandankanan Zoological Park (NZP) here. The endoscopy unit at NZP veterinary hospital is the first-of-its-kind facility in Odisha. No other veterinary hospital in the state has such facility, sources said. “The endoscopy unit at Nandankanan will be a boon to the animals at the zoo. Now, the veterinarians at NZP can conduct endoscopy on

the ailing animals without any difficulty,” said an official. The state government has recently provided several pieces of modern equipment to NZP. The zoo now has thermal imaging cameras, portable X-ray machine, long-range tranquilizer guns and ultrasound machine. Besides, a neonatal ICU, an ultramodern operation theatre and a dental surgery unit have been opened at NZP. It is worth mentioning here that Chief Minister



Naveen Patnaik has recently approved a proposal to develop NZP as a world-class zoo.

The developmental work at NZP will be carried out in two phases. Nandankanan and Botanical Garden

will be developed in the first phase from 2023-25. Night safari, safari complex and other facilities will be developed at nearby Choodanga forest in the second phase from 2025-28, sources said. Nandankanan will have tunnel aquarium, water bird aviary, emersive enclosures, modern frontage, landscaping and other advanced facilities for the visitors as part of the developmental project, they added.

Chandrayaan-3'S Vital Components Manufactured At Bhubaneswar-Based CTTC

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Amid excitement across the country regarding Chandrayaan-3, it has been reported that several essential components for the lunar mission were manufactured at the Central Tool Room & Training Centre (CTTC) in Bhubaneswar. The manufacturing process, which costed approximately Rs 12 crore, involved the production of valves, internal navigation systems, temperature sensors, aerospace components, gyroscopes, RGPD components, and various other crucial



parts. Over the course of two years, more than 150 technicians at the CTTC training center have dedicated their efforts to fabricating these vital components for Chandrayaan-3. The facility has played a pivotal role in meeting

the project's requirements, showcasing its expertise in manufacturing advanced aerospace technology. L Rajasekhar, the General Manager of CTTC, expressed his enthusiasm about the achievements, stating, “CTTC has

manufactured numerous critical components for Chandrayaan-3. To date, we have supplied over 17,000 components to ISRO. We eagerly anticipate the success of Chandrayaan-3, and tomorrow will be a momentous day for CTTC Bhubaneswar.”

Notably, CTTC's collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) extends beyond the Chandrayaan-3 project. For more than 23 years, CTTC has been working in close coordination with ISRO, demonstrating their commitment to contributing to the advancement of India's space exploration endeavors. Moreover, reports suggest that CTTC Bhubaneswar is also actively engaged in the manufacturing of crucial components for Gaganyaan, the country's ambitious manned mission, which is slated for launch either by the end of 2023 or in 2024.

Odisha: Bhubaneswar Market Building To Remain Shut Indefinitely!

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The shopkeepers of Unit 2 Market Building in the Odisha capital here have threatened to close the shopping complex for indefinite period if the civic authorities fail to solve the issues related to makeshift stalls within three days. The shopkeepers have also threatened to stage dharna in front of the residences of city Mayor Solochana Das and Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) Commissioner Vijay Amruta Kulange over the issue. The shopkeepers have alleged that some people have virtually encroached upon the Market Building by opening makeshift vending stalls at the



shopping complex. The owners of permanent shops at Market Building are facing a lot of problems due to the presence of hundreds of makeshift stalls at the shopping complex. This apart, the makeshift stalls are causing unnecessary congestions at Market Building, they alleged. The shopkeepers further alleged that a few officials of the BMC are shielding the owners of

the makeshift stalls at Market Building by collecting money from them. “We have raised the issue of makeshift stalls with the BMC several times. But, nothing has been done in this regard. Now, we have decided to close our shops for indefinite period if the civic authorities fail to solve the issue within three days,” said Unit 2 Central Market Association president Pradyumna Kumar Jena.

Honour Killing: 3 Including Father Arrested For Killing Daughter, Lover

Bhubaneswar(KCN): A man along with two others were arrested for allegedly killing his daughter and her lover in Odisha's Kalahandi district, the police said on Thursday. The arrested individuals are the girl's father — Kaneswar Patel, uncle Debananda Patel and brother-in-law Tankadhar Naik. The three were allegedly involved in killing the couple —

Jemamani Patel (20) and Sunil Patel (22), and hung their bodies near Banjipadar village. After receiving a call on July 9, the police recovered the decomposed bodies of Jemamani and Sunil from a graveyard at Banjipadar village, said Kalahandi Superintendent of Police, Abhilas G. During the investigation, it was found that Jemamani

and Sunil were in a relationship and their family members were opposed to their relationship as both happened to be "distantly" related as niece and uncle, respectively, he said. Therefore, they eloped from homes on June 30 and were hiding in a dense sugarcane field, the police officer said. After getting information about the couple's "hideout", the

accused trio rushed to the sugarcane field and strangled them to death. They then took Jemamani and Sunil to the nearby funeral ground and hung them in a bid to make it look like a case of suicide, the police officer said. Also, on July 2, the girl's father, Kaneswar Patel, had lodged a missing complaint at a police station to misguide the police, he added.

MODI'S US VISIT BOOST UP TECHNICAL COLLABORATIONS

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and United States President Joe Biden have put university and technological collaboration between the two countries firmly on the map after Modi's landmark four-day state visit to the US, which, unusually, emphasised higher education as an important part of the partnership. The two leaders' joint statement included support for a university network of 'Indo-US Global Challenge Institutes' and backed suggestions of diplomatic missions helping to facilitate branch campuses and other joint higher education projects. A special Task Force on Expanding US-India University Partnerships set up earlier this year under the Association of American Universities (AAU), made up of some 71 major research universities in the US, released an interim report on 21 June in advance of the Modi visit. It recommended setting up joint research institutions to tackle global challenges and deepen research collaboration between Indian and US universities. Faculty across multiple disciplines would convene to design and develop joint research projects, according to the report. International agreements with the United Kingdom, France and Australia aimed at creating innovation partnerships, could serve

as models for future collaborations with the US. The US National Science Foundation (NSF) already has experience launching similar efforts to create Global Centers with the United Kingdom, Australia and Canada. Biden and Modi, in their joint statement on 22 June, referred to the prospect of such a university network as "leveraging the talent and ambition of both our countries". The joint statement emphasised research partnerships and people-to-people exchanges in areas such as semiconductors, sustainable agriculture, clean energy, health and pandemic preparedness, and emerging technologies. It will deepen the strategic partnership between Indian and American universities. These are exciting times for higher education in India. With the foreign university campus regulations being given the final touches by UGC for the announcement soon, India is now looking forward to working with the liaison office of the diplomatic outposts to facilitate establishing foreign university campuses in India. Dedicated liaison offices will be assisting universities to navigate the "myriad legal hurdles" to establish non-profit academic centres or satellite campuses in-country and assist on the hosting country's tax and regulatory landscape. The AAU interim report on US-India higher education partnerships is closely linked to a special technology initiative on critical and emerging technologies. This was announced during bilateral talks

between Biden and Modi in Tokyo in May 2022, based on "shared security interests and aims to grow technological and industrial collaboration between the two nations", according to the joint statement at the time. The recently launched India-US initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET) will usher in a new phase of partnership, given the vibrant talent pool in India and the US, particularly in new age technologies and the synergistic research and development centres of excellence in our academic institutes. This formal partnership, with its complementary expertise and incorporation of industry collaboration and startup enablers, will facilitate free flow of ideas, student exchange and joint IPRs [intellectual property rights]. This academic partnership will help in developing solutions for a sustainable and secure future. This is a historic moment when two strong nations are joining hands in education and research that is bound to make a global impact in the coming years. The expansion of internship and apprenticeship opportunities for Indian and US undergraduate and graduate students, as well as for post-doctoral researchers, would be critical to meet the objectives of iCET. This will require a coordinated effort to establish short-term placements in companies and non-governmental organisations for practical training. India's perspective is that it has the need and the opportunity to localise a lot of the expertise. As

part of that entire value chain, a lot of the expertise that feeds into the R&D that then becomes the manufacturing output or the service output or the knowledge output, comes from these university partnerships. India doesn't tend to produce and own much of its own intellectual property, instead, India is now looking at ways of partnering with international universities to bring that expertise into India and to learn from it and emulate and improve on it. Historically, much of the research collaboration and partnerships that are undertaken between US universities and Indian ones are undertaken by NRIs. They are academics that have gone from India to the US and partnered with people they know, or they've gone to the US for a while and come back to a university in India and are now reaching out to colleagues in the US. Now, the University of Denver had very little in the way of partnerships in India but is connecting with the Indian Institute of Management Indore to conduct some research on the urban environment in both countries. One of the key things moving forward with the collaborations would be a shared allocation of resources, or at least some sense that there will be ease in resource availability.

Driving Animal Husbandry Entrepreneurship through "Disruptive Innovations"

Uber, the world's largest urban transportation company owns no vehicles, Facebook, the world's most popular media owner creates no content, Alibaba, the world's most valuable retailer, maintains no inventory and the world's largest accommodation provider Airbnb owns no property. There is a clear message for the entrepreneurs who need to see the whole concept of entrepreneurship from a different perspective and that concept is disruptive innovations.

Clayton Christensen coined the term Disruptive Innovations back in the mid 1990s. According to him, disruptive innovation is the process in which a smaller company, usually with fewer resources, is able to challenge an established business (often called an "incumbent") by entering at the bottom of the market and continuing to move up-market. Talking in the business term, the process of disruptive innovations begins with a small company entering the low end of a market, or creating a new market segment, claiming the least profitable portion of the market as its own. Because the established, incumbent companies own the most profitable market segments, they most likely won't fight the entrant for that market share. The entrant then improves its offerings and moves up market with increasing profitability. Once the incumbents' customers have widely adopted the entrant's offerings in the mainstream market, occurred. In the broader sense, disruptive innovation refers to anything (product, service, technology, or even situation) that shakes up an industry and revolutionizes how previously successful companies operate. It is a unique solution whose application significantly alters the way a market or an industry has been functioning so far.

Let's see how this process of disruptive innovations had helped the Animal husbandry (A.H) and agriculture sector in the past, when the Indian agriculture economy is at dire need and what lesson it gives to the young budding entrepreneurs. Most of us are born at a time when India did not face any major food security crisis but this was not the situation few decades ago. The year was 1965 and 1966, when there was a back-to-back drought and there is acute shortage of foods. The situation was so worst at that time that on every 15 minutes a ship load of grains is leaving from US to feed India. What had happened in China our neighboring country, 30 million people had died in that period because of starvation. This was the time a decision was taken by the then government of India to import high yielding varieties of dwarf

wheat from Mexico and they were distributed in Punjab, Haryana belt and western UP, and within a short span of time that is by 1971 India was talking of self-sufficiency in food grains production, there after we didn't need any assistance from any foreign government including US for our food security and today we are in leading position in the production of grains and pulses in the world. All that happened during this green revolution was history and is an excellent example of what we called as disruption of technology. The technology was imported from outside but we execute it in our own way as per the challenges and opportunity of our own ecosystem.

What happened in 1970s on the dairy sector, the Milkman of India Dr. Verghese Kurian, how he turned around the operation flood, and think about a country which in 1951 was producing just 17 million tons of milk and was nowhere in the map so far as milk production is concerned. Today with a production of 221.06 million tons of milk in the financial year 2022, India is the number one producer of milk in the world. And the most important think about operation flood is that we become number one producer of milk from a laggard, not by commercial dairy enterprise (like US, Brazil and other developed countries). We get this amount of milk produced by small farmers, with two cows or two buffaloes and that is up to in a backyard setup, farmers having their prime focus in crop production and dairy as a secondary business. We prove that it is not the big business, sophisticated, mechanized and highly organized setup, but the small holders, it's just in the backyard, housewife who is doing all ten things at home and she is also milking the cow and feeding the cow and getting business out of that. This is the biggest technological disruption in animal husbandry sector in the world, and this is a model that we are selling to the world.

In the year 2002, India was marginally importing or marginally surplus sometimes more or less self-sufficient in cotton production but there was a big problem in the cotton farming at that time, there was a pest attack on cotton and as we know, cotton as a crop attracts lot of pests and due to this farmers are incurring huge loss and even a lot of farmers commit suicides at that time. Our government at that crucial time, after a lot of debate in the parliament took a major decision and the GM (Genetically Modified) technology was being brought in the country in the cotton sector. Within a span of mere thirteen years by 2015, India becomes second-largest producer marginally just neck to neck with China and second largest exporter of cotton in the world and today, 95% of the cotton area in the country is under BT (Bacillus thuringiensis) cotton, the GM technology. It has never happened anywhere in the world that within such a short span, small holders, big holders, medium holders everybody had opted that technology. As discussed earlier, it has not happened in US, Brazil, China or in any of the

developed countries but India lapped up the technology in its one way and we called it as the disruption.

From all these examples we can well conclude that disruption is the induction of a new idea or product that completely redefines an existing sector, industry or market. Disruptions are not path breaking technologies as we had discussed it earlier, how we had used the dwarf variety of crops in agriculture sector, the Artificial insemination technology, milk co-operative structures for dairy industry or the GM cotton for fiber industry, these are not completely new technologies, they have been used by other countries for years but the way it had changed the Indian agriculture scenario is completely outstanding and is a message to the world. In a sector like animal husbandry in India which is now becoming unattractive particularly for young youths due to multiple factors like high cost of production, high risk, low price of the product and produce, instability of the market, highly perishable nature of the produce and product, non availability of proper storing facilities and supply chain ect, innovative disruption is the need of the hour. They entrepreneurs should come up with new idea or newer version of the available product/service that brings simplicity, affordability and accessibility to a larger population.

If we look in to the disruptive innovations very deeply we will find that, they get started in two types of markets that incumbents overlook. First one is the Low-end footholds, here because incumbents typically try to provide their most profitable and demanding customers with ever-improving products and services, and they pay less attention to less-demanding customers. In fact, incumbents' offerings often overshoot the performance requirements of the latter. This opens the door to a disrupter focused (at first) on providing those low-end customers with a "good enough" product. Take for instance Amul, Mother Dairy, Nestle and many other leading brands are targeting the urban and suburb population with their product segmentation, branding and above all quality of their products neglecting a very large segment of the population who can't afford it and at times these premier products are not available in their marketing eco system. A large numbers of local brands are now cashing upon that by addressing the need of the customer by taking care of the basic four A of rural marketing that is Awareness, Availability, Acceptability and Availability, so also a large number of micro enterprises are emerging in rural areas who prepare local products like Challaha, Khir, Khira, Ravedi, Sweet curd and many other dairy products, brand them and market them as per the requirement of their customers. It's a great lesson to the entrepreneurs who are interested in the A.H sector to cash upon. A huge gap is there, where a majority of consumers are deprived of certain products and produce because the premier brand didn't take

any interest in them.

Second approach in the concept of disruptive innovations is new-market foothold. Here the disrupters create a market where none existed. Put simply, they find a way to turn no-consumers into consumers. For example the way this Reliance JIO had created a completely new consumer base of internet users which was beyond the imagination of any of his competitors. With the increase in popularity of the fast food in the rural and suburbs, meat and eggs have a sky rocketing demand, now the entrepreneurs must think of how to cash upon it and to create a consumer base like Biryaniwala, or Wow Momo, with proper quality control, pricing, branding and marketing. They can create a strong consumer base in a rural set up which didn't exist now. In the dairy sector the local entrepreneurs had already adopted this strategy by popularizing the consumption of Paneer, Lassi and flavored milk and other area specific traditional dairy products among the masses which were completely new to them and the new consumers had shown good interest in them.

Animal husbandry is a key contributor to the Indian economy but continues to be beset with structural drawbacks with non uniform distribution of live stock, lack of stable market, prone to natural calamity and most importantly value chain of most A.H products and produce continues to consist of multiple intermediaries. While production and supply chain inefficiencies abound keeping the livestock farmers small and marginal, at the same time the nation is catching up with global trends of both consumption (organic, healthy, convenience) and calls for sustainability. There is an immediate need for disruption in the sector led by technology. From business perspective, every industry needs fresh ideas from outside the system, every industry needs next-gen, young and bright minds with the clear vision and traits such as grit and perseverance to make a positive contribution to the society. It is important to ensure India's animal-agribusiness sector attracts the best talent, sparking brains and skilled hands from different fields and retains them. Traditional business paradigms, entrenched perceptions and outdated practices must pave way to newer and fresher ideas and concepts that only today's youth can bring in. Only then innovations can sprout and flourish. Then this industry can be seen as one of the preferred career paths by youngsters, who currently lack awareness about the ocean of opportunities available. Every one of us working in the industry must actively step up to create awareness among youths who are aspiring to become tomorrow's professionals, entrepreneurs, and leaders.

The mission of the organization is to build a future in which people shall live in harmony and with pleasure, emphasizing in all spheres of life and on the betterment of mankind. Their vision is ushering for better future with exceptional resourcefulness and commitment to work in the field of Health, Education, Tribal Studies, Elderly Persons, Metaphysical Persons, Women Empowerment and Others for people at large.

The broad objectives of Howrah Suparna are as follows:

To acquire, establish, start, aid, run, maintain or manage – Schools, Colleges, Libraries, Hospitals or any other such work for the benefit of the public, in urban or rural areas along with emphasis on impartation of basic education, setting up of small and cottage industries, and other ancillary provisions to the rural people.

Howrah Suparna has always taken a special initiative to integrate forest conservation and management practices with local tribal welfare. The dedicated staff members and researchers working in the forested belts of South 24 Parganas, East and West Midnapore, Jhargram, East and West Burdhaman, Birbhum, Bankura and Purulia districts of West Bengal and adjoining border areas of Odisha and Jharkhand have collected valuable data on both major and minor forest resources as well tribal socio-cultural and socio-economic life as well as their dependence of forests. Pai stacking date collection over a decade has helped Howrah Suparna to have better understanding of the interaction of forest resources and tribal communities in remote

rural forested areas.

The data collected by the NGO clearly demonstrates improper economic growth and socio-cultural instabilities within various tribal communities that escape the attention of major economic developments and infrastructural projects ran by the government as well as private organizations in the above mentioned biogeographic regions. The sheer lack of medical support, rampant unemployment and poor economic growth in this region has made the local tribal communities severely dependent on the

and over exploitation beyond imagination. The random and unscientific collection (harvest) of edible and medicinal fungi, various species of medicinal, chemurgic and ornamental plant species (herb, shrubs and trees) as well as timber (both legally and illegally), seeds and fruits, flowers, inflorescences, leaves (both dry and fresh), branches and stems. Furthermore, due to insurgency the pressure of various resident rebel groups deep inside buffer zones as well core protected areas of the forests are creating destruction of the local forest with very little changes of

scantly forest resources for their sustainability and survival. The forests are being raided on a daily basis and over exploited by the helpless tribal communities and poor marginal villagers; as they do not have any other viable alternative profession(s) for their survival.

These heavy dependency of the tribal communities and forest residents as well as forest fringe residents on the major and minor forest resources for the supply of food, fuel, fodder, forage and fertilizer (5 FS) including cheap building materials are depleting these forests rapidly due to continuous harvest

regeneration. Based on their field observation, interviews conducted on different key tribal communities as well as the data collected (both primary and secondary), Howrah Suparna is currently working in the development of specific eco friendly protocols and recommendations for the concerned government agencies to follow for the long term future of the tribal communities suffering from abject poverty; as well as the successful conservation and management of the endangered forests. Howrah Suparna believes that it is important to include the human factor in the dynamic equation of forest conservation by making them an

Prof Sanyal Mukherjee said, " Our bigger dream is to reach every districts across all the states of Eastern and North East India with major focus on environmental education and awareness among both urban and rural communities, sustainable life style, organic agriculture and biological conservation, women empowerment and local employment generation, promoting positive mental health and mental well being among school and college students, homemakers, professionals, senior citizens and specially abled individuals as well creation of a better society for our next negenerations.....We are working tirelessly towards improving literacy and building

various employable skills for various SC, ST, OBC groups; and different minority communities across Southern Bengal and parts of Eastern India, namely parts of Odisha, Bihar and Jharkhand bordering West Bengal. Many similar initiatives have also been organized in diffetent parts of North East India like Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura and Sikkim. Our long term objective has been to reach out to these communities in these geographical areas and move beyond these boundaries to further remote localities and isolated groups to help them to the best of our abilities and avaiabke collective resources."

"Currently we are limited to our activities due to lack of sufficient funding and human resources; but, we are determined as a group to overcome these shortcomings and continue in our desored path of providing excellent dedicated services to our target populations and target communities. Our network has been increasing with time, and we have received unprecedented help and support from several individuals, government and non government organizations and institutes in various forms.....We express our sincere gratitude to all our dedicated members, volunteers, supporters, well wishers and sponsors for their dedicated support, continued encouragement and never ending aids during the time of need.....Our humble journey has lead us through both challenges and opportunities and established firmly as an NGO in Eastern India with our roots in Howrah, West Bengal", further added Prof Sanyal Mukherjee.

One of the cornerstone of Howrah Suparna has been their continued support for under privileged children from economically

backward communities or specially abled children or those with special needs. The NGO has been providing dress materials, educational kits, tools, school bags as well as text books to children from needy families or orphan childremn for the past two decades continuously without a break except a short period during the pandemic restrictions in India in the 2020-2021 academic session. This has benefitted toll dare over 20,000+ children across West Bengal. The funding was collected either as donation from wellwishers, NGO savings and sale of NGO products such bok royalty, honorarium collected from participation in various programs and personal investment.

Another important initiative of Howrah Suparna has been telease of over 50,000 fish fries and fingerlings at various natural and artificial waterbodies of North and South 24 Parganas, East and West Midnapore, Jhargram, Howrah, Hooghly as well as East and West Bardhaman. This specific activity has been organized across summer and monsoon seasons for the past three-four years. Only local indigenous and non-predatory fish species that are edible and important for commercial species were selected and released after certified fishlings were bought or collected from recognized and government certified fish fingerling agencies. The objective has been to help regeneration of many indigenous and local fish species in their natural habitats and provide cheap source of proteins for the poor local community members as well as restoration of natural biodiversity of the local ecosystems.

In spite of many challenges, the NGO has grown over time since its establishment

on 23rd May, 2002. Today it has spread across southern, western and eastern Bengal as well as the border areas of the adjoining East India states. From a humble beginning; this NGO has walked miles to create support system for the local people in providing free medical care, education of the children underprivileged SC, ST, OBC communities; including children of the minority communities of the states where applicable. It has raised funds to provide both food and educational resource materials to poor, deserving communities lacking support from other avenues including the local government and/or administration. Howrah Suparna has been active in funding both online and offline conferences, seminars, symposia, colloquium and workshops in different related disciplines under Social Sciences, Life Sciences, Agricultural Sciences, Environmental Sciences, Biodiversity conservation, tribal welfare, rural economic empowerment, women empowerment through education and skill development in providing small loans to encourage start ups with minimal interest to successfully produce entrepreneurs. BHUBANESWAR (KCN): As pending pension related cases of non-teaching employees continue to pile up, the Higher Education department on Wednesday asked heads of all government higher educational institutions to furnish a monthly report on progress of timely payment of pension to such staff.

As per government norms, any delay in payment of pension would lead to payment of 18 per cent interest per annum for the period of delay and the interest would be recovered from the person/s responsible for the delay.

Asking the institutions to adhere to the guideline



and take appropriate action for timely payment of pension, the department said the monthly progress report on disbursement of pension should be submitted on the last working day of every month to the GA department. Earlier this month while reviewing the department's activities, Higher

Education Minister Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak had asked authorities to open a dedicated pension cell to ensure that employees must receive their pension on the day of retirement.

All the pending pension cases should be cleared up within a specific timeline, he had directed the officials concerned.

Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan seeks substations for Parjang, Kankadahada



BHUBANESWAR (KCN): Expressing concern over frequent power disruptions in Parjang and Kankadahada blocks of Dhenkanal district, Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has sought the intervention of Energy Minister Pratap Keshari Deb for installing two 220/33 KV grid substations to

stabilise supply in the areas.

In two separate letters to Deb, the union minister said Parjang block, with a population of more than two lakh, depends on Chainpal grid for power. Owing to long distance and heavy load factor, inhabitants of the area have been grappling with frequent and unnatural power cuts.

“The single sub-station available is insufficient for the significant population in the area, causing regular power outages that gravely hinder day-to-day activities, education, and skill development endeavours. Chainpal to Parjang 33 KV supply frequently faces technical issues affecting steady power supply to

customers,” the letter said. Similar is the problem in Kankadahada block, which with a population of around one lakh, depends on Chainpal grid for power supply. Pradhan said a new 220/33KV grid sub-station each at Parjang and Kankadahada could dramatically enhance the stability and quality of electricity supply.

A plot measuring 8.61 acre has already been sanctioned by the steering committee, chaired by the sub-collector, Kamakhyanagar on January 10, 2020 for construction of the proposed sub-station. “I sincerely hope you will give this matter your utmost attention and extend your support to expedite the construction of the two grid sub-station,” he added.

Can BJP overcome its candidate crisis to take on BJD?



BHUBANESWAR (KCN): As BJP aspires to dislodge the mighty BJD to come to power in the coming Assembly election, the saffron party is staring at a crisis of candidates of substance in about one third of the 147 constituencies in the state.

Such problem is no less in 84 Assembly seats in which the BJP was runner-up in the 2019 election as most of the contestants have, by now, lost connect with their constituents in the last four years. Some of them are not keen to jump into the electoral fray as their age and

physical conditions do not permit the rigorous task of electioneering, while others adopt a wait and watch policy to take a call only after assessing how much the party will back them financially to fight a well-oiled BJD machinery. With an early Assembly election buzz in the state, likely in November or December, the BJP is yet to start its exercise of identifying suitable candidates for the 125 seats where BJD is solidly grounded with 113 seats already in its pocket.

“We are ready for an early election. Winnability will be the criteria for candidate selection.

Those who are in touch with the voters and carrying out party programmes at the ground level will be given preference. Selection of candidates will be done through consultations at all levels and the process will start soon,” said state BJP president Manmohan Samal. Sources in BJP said the 22 sitting MLAs of BJP will get re-nominated and for those constituencies where there is no dispute on candidates, a go ahead has been given to the aspirants for preparing for the polls.


A senior leader of the party on conditions of anonymity said the vital

question before the BJP is under whose leadership the party is going to fight next elections.

As far as election preparedness is concerned, the party is yet to initiate the process of consultation which has completely broken down. If Assembly elections are advanced, the BJP leadership will be left with no time to select candidates diligently. Under such circumstances, the BJD will always have a head-start.

“Those aspiring for BJP tickets are increasingly becoming frustrated as they have neither the time nor the resources to fight the BJD which is flush with funds and administrative support. They know well that the magic of Prime Minister Narendra Modi is not going to work anymore,” party sources said.

Citing the example of Cuttack district which has nine Assembly seats, a party leader said nobody knows the potential candidates to be nominated. The party is yet to find a familiar face for Cuttack-Barabti seat where the BJP was relegated to third position in the last elections.

'It's not been an easy journey': Ashwin reflects after another milestone

New Delhi:It's not easy being Ravichandran Ashwin. To try wrapping your head around the fact that one moment you are the top-ranked bowler in Test cricket but in the very next, you are confronted with the crushing reality that being best in the world does not guarantee a spot in India's playing XI. Since mid-2017, Ashwin has been mostly a one-format player for India (barring the brief comeback in 2021-22), but even his appearances in that format have been sporadic with Ravindra Jadeja, just as good with an improved batting pedigree, getting the lone spinner's spot on tracks designed to keep India from playing both together. And so it proved to be in last month's World Test Championship final that Ashwin watched from the sidelines at The Oval as India struggled for control and incision on the opening day to cede the advantage and subsequently the coveted mace after five

days. The 36-year-old, who returned to play T20 cricket at the TNPL before jetting back to the Caribbean, showed he'd lost none of his red-ball rhythm with a five-fer - his 33rd in Test cricket - on the opening day in Dominica to begin India's next WTC. "I've spoken about it. It's very tough as a cricketer when you have a WTC final and end up sitting out," Ashwin said. "All that is fine. But what is the difference between me and another person if I also end up sulking in the dressing room. When we went to the WTC final, I was mentally prepared to play. I had prepared physically and mentally, planned for the game, everything. But, I was also prepared to not play the game. "If I'm not playing, how do I respond? How do I make sure the dressing room is really up and about. Winning the WTC final is the most important thing, it could be a very high point in my career and I would have played a



good role in it. It was just unfortunate, it didn't pan out. The first day just left us too much behind in the shed. All I'd like to give to my teammates and Indian cricket as a whole is some understanding and my best efforts on the field and I'd like to leave it at that." Here at Dominica, Ashwin was pressed into the attack as early as the ninth over after India lost the toss. With his very first ball, he

drew a nervy inside edge off Tagenarine Chanderpaul and by his third over had joined a very exclusive list of bowlers - Ian Botham, Wasim Akram, Mitchell Starc and Simon Harmer - to dismiss both members of a father-son pair in Test cricket. The ace offspinner added the strike of captain Kraigg Brathwaite before Lunch and then proceeded to dismiss top-scorer Alick Athanaze, Alzarri

Joseph and Jomel Warrican to reach the milestone. "There was some bounce from the wicket, especially from the pavilion end. The wicket had some slope also which gave us bounce. But we utilised the first session very well. The wicket had some moisture and it was coming off it very well. As you saw, they showed a graphic that it was turning more [in the second session], but the turn

was very slow. But in the first session, there was bounce, and pace off was good, there was bite. We utilised it very well. The way [Jermaine] Blackwood got out just before Lunch, the momentum shifted completely to us. I also thought, Jaiswal and Rohit batted very well to give us a very dominant day on Day 1," Ashwin said. The five-fer took Ashwin past Anderson into the sixth place in the list of cricketers with most five-wicket hauls in Test cricket. Rangana Herath (34), Anil Kumble (35), Richard Hadlee (36) and Shane Warne (37) sit immediately above him while Muttiah Muralitharan remains a very distant leader at 67. Along the way, Ashwin also became only the third Indian bowler, behind Kumble and Harbhajan Singh, to take 700 international wickets. All of it was worthy enough for some reflection. "There is no cricketer or human being in this world that has gone through the highs

without the lows," Ashwin philosophied. "When you have the lows, it gives you two choices, either you sulk or talk about it and then complain about it and go along with it and go down. Or you learn from it. So I'm someone who's constantly learnt from my lows. "In fact the best thing that'll happen today after this good day that I've had is that I'll have a good meal, have a good conversation, talk to my family and go to bed and then forget about it. When you've had a good day, you know you've had a good day but there are areas you can work on and get better for tomorrow. This constant search for excellence has held me in good stead all the time, but it's also been incredibly draining. It's not a journey that's been very easy. For me, the journey has been draining, but I'm very thankful for all the lows because without the lows there are no highs. "Actually when I look back at my career, I wonder how it's gone by so fast. It's been literally 14 years on the go and if you include IPL also,

it's been almost a 15-16 years journey. It's just gone like that. All I would tell anybody is... the first time I met Rahul Dravid as a coach, he made this statement: 'It's not about how many wickets you take, how many runs you score. You'll forget about all of them. It is only the great memories you create as a team that'll stick with you.' "I'm totally behind that. I don't know if he's brainwashed me to do that. From my point of view, I definitely think that this journey has gone so fast that I'm not even able to recollect what has happened, and how it has gone through. I've got a lot of gratitude and I'm very grateful for the journey and what the game has given to me. I don't know how many more such moments will come to me, but whatever comes my way, I'll try to enjoy it completely. After Covid when cricket began again, I promised myself that I'll enjoy whatever happens... whether I'm playing, getting dropped or if I'm retiring. Whatever happens, I will enjoy it."

New Delhi:An unbeaten 75 from Heather Knight in what was England's highest successful run-chase helped the hosts inflict a third-consecutive defeat on Australia in the ongoing Ashes series and draw level with them on six points. Knight's effort eclipsed that of Beth Mooney (81 not out) as the home side completed the chase with 11 balls and two wickets to spare. Though Australia lost captain Alyssa Healy in the first over - to Kate Cross - after she opted to bat first in Bristol, the visitors were immediately resurrected by the second-wicket stand worth 61 between Phoebe Litchfield and Ellyse Perry. Once Nat Sciver-Brunt broke that stand in the 13th over with the wicket of the former, out came Beth Mooney to take charge of the innings. England were nervy on the field as catches went down and Mooney herself was a recipient of a couple of reprimands (a dropped catch and a missed stumping), which she fully capitalised on. The Bristol surface wasn't the easiest to bat on and runs didn't come by too easily, with Mooney taking 99 balls for her

unbeaten 81 and Perry needing 51 for her 41, as well as three dropped catches. However, Australia were pushed forward by the cameos of Tahlia McGrath (24 off 36) and Ashleigh Gardner (21 off 24) before Jess Jonassen added 30 off 39 to drag Australia to what appeared to a winning total. Australia's 263/8 looked even more imposing when Sophia Dunkley was cleaned up by Perry in the third over of England's chase. But then came a whirlwind stand between Tammy Beaumont (47 off 42) and Alice Capsey (40 off 34) worth 74 runs off just 55 balls to set the ball rolling for England. In the space of 3.1 overs however, England lost both the set batters and went through a brief stutter until captain Knight took control of the proceedings. She was still quickly running out of partners at the other end as Australia began to dig their heels after breaking the big stand. The hosts threatened to flip the chase around and retain the Ashes with two games to spare when England went from 103 for 1 in the 13th over to 163 for 4 in the 26th. Nat-Sciver

Brunt's dismissal saw England stutter quite a bit as the likes of Danielle Wyatt, Amy Jones and Sophie Ecclestone came and went, much to the chagrin of their captain at the other end who was waging a lone battle. However, from 235 for 8 when the chase was still within England's grasp, out walked Kate Cross to ensure her captain's 28th ODI fifty wouldn't come in a losing cause. She carted four boundaries in a breezy, unbeaten 19 off 20 balls and supported her captain in a stellar effort - 75* off 86 with six fours and a six - to take the team home at the start of the penultimate over. After going 6-0 up with wins in the one-off Test and the opening T20I, Australia have now lost three successive limited-overs games worth two points each to leave the Women's Ashes tantalizingly poised with two ODIs to go. Wimbledon 2023: Rohan Bopanna, Matthew Ebden Storm Into Men's Doubles Semifinal

New Delhi:Indian tennis ace Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden booked their place into the Wimbledon 2023 men's doubles semi-finals on Wednesday. The Indo-Australian pair, seeded sixth, came from behind to overcome the unseeded Dutch team of Bart Stevens and Tallon Griekspoor by 6(3)-7(7), 7-5, 6-2 in a game that lasted for one hour and 54 minutes in the quarter-finals of the grass court Grand Slam. Rohan Bopanna and



Matthew Ebden, ranked 12th and 16th in the ATP rankings for doubles, respectively, went toe to toe in the first set but got bested by world No. 116 Stevens and

Griekspoor, a world No. 31 singles player. The two pairs managed to hold all their serves in the first set. However, Matthew and Bopanna had their serves broken in the

tie-breaker which handed Stevens and Tallon the advantage of 1-0. Bopanna and Ebden kicked off the second set with intensity. They broke Tallon Griekspoor's serve in the first game but were pegged back immediately in the second. A break on the serve of Bart Stevens in the seventh game took the match into the decider. Bopanna and Ebden grew in confidence as the match progressed. They held onto their serves and broke Stevens and Griekspoor's serve twice

to secure a place in the semi-finals of Wimbledon. The 43-year-old Rohan Bopanna has been in top form this season. He reached the Australian Open final with Sania Mirza earlier this year and has won two ATP titles alongside Matthew Ebden in men's doubles. Rohan Bopanna and Matthew Ebden will face top seeds Wesley Koolhof and Neal Skupski in the semi-finals. They will back themselves as they have beaten them in the Indian Wells ATP Masters 1000 final in March this year.
