welfare schemes. Linking of E-Courts with land records and registration data-base would have many benefits. The transparency that is coming from digitization would curb unethical and illegal activities related to land. The President said that access to land related information in a free and convenient manner would have many benefits. For example, it would help in resolving disputes related to ownership and use of land. She stated that a large population of our country is involved in disputes related to land and a lot of time of the administration and the judiciary is consumed in these matters. Through digitization and linkages of information, the energy of the people and institutions, which gets consumed in resolving disputes, would be utilized for development.

Good News For Working Journalists! Odisha Govt Raises Health Insurance Coverage Limit To Rs 5 Lakh

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today escalated the ceiling of health insurance coverage meant for working journalists under the State government's Gopabandhu Sambadika Swasthya Bima Yojana from the present limit of Rs 2 lakh to Rs 5 lakh, informed the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) in Bhubaneswar.

At least 8,717 journalists working in the State will benefit from this announcement. As per the provisions envisaged in the scheme, the insurance coverage is given to five members of a beneficiary journalist's family, including the spouse and three wholly dependent children up to the age of 25 years. It is pertinent to mention, the 'Odisha State Working Journalists Health

Insurance Scheme-2016' which was later implemented as 'Gopabandhu Sambadika Swasthya Bima Yojana' is a welfare scheme.

Beneficiaries of the scheme are renewed every year and it provides for indoor and outdoor treatments. The insurance comes with a cover of an amount as decided by the Government from time to time.

It is high time that Indian town planners make our cities liveable.

India is urbanising rapidly. According to the World Bank, approximately 35 percent of the country's population lives in urban areas. This figure is expected to increase—projections by the UN indicate that by 2050 more than 50 percent of India's population will be urban. However, contemporary Indian cities are plagued by problems such as inadequate housing, unequal access to sanitation and water services, and poor public health. If we expect our cities to adequately serve their residents, they need much better infrastructure.

What sort of

infrastructure do India's cities really need? Surely, we have to create infrastructure in our cities that are long lasting and people's friendly. We do not afford our bridges to crumble within couple of years of inauguration and roads sink in rainy weather. In the last couple of months, we have read news related to collapse of bridges often. Now even yet to be inaugurated bridges are crashing down. A 206-metre-long bridge constructed over river Burhi Gandak came crashing down in Begusarai district couple of month back in Bihar. The bridge, constructed at a cost of over Rs 13 crore. This speaks volumes about corruption that has seeped in our system. One must fight the menace of corruption without any delay. Unless we root out it, we cannot expect to create world class infrastructure. Till then we cannot make our cities worth living.

A JUDGE IS FREE TO ERROR WITHIN HIS JURISDICTION, BUT NOT OTHERWISE



forum for appeal ever existed and, instead of the trial Court and the appellate Court, namely, the High Court, the Supreme Court under Article 136 of the Constitution were to appoint a Committee of, say, three retired High Court Judges, all persons of exceptional integrity, ability and competence, and were to report to the Supreme Court whether Dhananjay had committed murder and assuming that the said Committee, after taking evidence from witnesses, found him guilty and awarded him death sentence, such a judgment is one rendered void ab initio because the Supreme Court had no jurisdiction to substitute itself for the trial Court, the fact-finding authority, and the appellate Court, the High Court.

I am constrained to make the above comparison in the light of the judgment of the Supreme Court in the Maradu case ordering demolition of four buildings for alleged violation of CRZ-III. If the Supreme Court was acting upon as a Court of appeal against the decision of the Maradu Panchayat ordering demolition of the buildings, which had become final, authoritative and binding inasmuch as all the authorities below, namely, the Tribunal, the Single Judge and the Division Bench of the Kerala High Court confirming the order of demolition, then it would have been well within the province of the Supreme Court to order demolition because the Court is free to err within its jurisdiction. It is said res judicata facit ex albo nigrum, ex nigro album, ex curvo rectum, ex recto curvum – a thing adjudged makes what was white, black; what was black, white; what was crooked straight; what was straight, crooked.

That res judicata pro veritate accipitur – a judgment is always taken for truth – otherwise there would be no finality of litigation and it is in public interest to end all litigations. On the other hand, supposing that no trial was conducted, no

and adjudicated should be accepted as true – is a fundamental principle of law. Stated in simple words, a judicial decision, whether right or wrong, is final and binding between the parties to the lis or res inter alios acta alteri nocere non debet – things done between strangers ought not to injure those who are not parties to them – a decision in a case between A and B will not bind C and D who were not parties to it. Even the concept of judgment in rem, namely, a judgment binding on all persons, whether they are parties to those proceedings or not, and a judgment in personam, meaning a judgment binding only between the parties to the lis only, has a limited application in the sense that whether a judgment of a Court has altered the status of a party to the proceeding, that will be binding on the rest of the world, for instance, where a suit between husband and wife seeking divorce is rejected, such a judgment is a judgment in personam binding only between the parties thereto and in a case where divorce is granted, the parties can enter into a marriage with A and B whose marriage the Court has dissolved. In the SLP before the Supreme Court in the Maradu case, none of the home buyers was a party. If the Supreme Court were to allow the plea of the Kerala Government against the order of the Kerala High Court quashing the show cause notice issued by the Municipality, all that it could have done within the framework of law was to allow the Municipality to proceed in furtherance of the show cause notice which it had issued. But the Court, instead, ordered demolition of the flats/buildings, which meant the flat owners being thrown out of their homes and their homes being reduced to rubble.

The Supreme Court has no jurisdiction to

pass such an order because in the appeal before it the only controversy involved was whether or not the Corporation/Municipality was right or wrong in issuing the show cause notice alleging violation of CRZ. I am told that the Court probably noticed this aspect and even had suggested remanding the matter to the High Court to determine the issue after affording an opportunity of hearing to the flat owners. What made the Court to deviate from this judicial procedure, which it is bound to follow, was the Kerala floods of 2018. With utmost respect, I beg to submit that the Court was swayed by emotion. It went on to assume that the unprecedented flood of 2018 was because of structures which have been built in violation of CRZ norms, a total misconception.

It is unfair to blame the Court, except to say that the Court allowed itself to be swayed by considerations of environmental concerns, knowing not and not being told the ground reality that the buildings in question have nothing to do with the 2018 floods. At Maradu, where the buildings are situated, the water level did not rise even by an inch during the floods. On the contrary, these buildings provided shelter and rehabilitation to thousands of people whose houses were sunk or swept away in the floods. The floods could be due to climate change, but nobody knows the exact reason for certain. Even if it is due to climate change, that is because the Americans, Europeans and Chinese use fossil fuel because millions and millions of evergreen forests in Brazil and Africa are destroyed for farming. It is said, in the days of Noah (Bible) there were unprecedented floods in which almost the entire lives were perished. About

100 years before, according to Malayalam calendar era in 1099, there was yet another unprecedented flood with the Munnar town at 5,000 feet above sea level being entirely washed away. (In the said flood) The Periyar River changed its course resulting in the death of hundreds and thousands of people. The Supreme Court cannot be blamed for proceeding on such a misconception, something entirely extraneous in the adjudication of the appeal before it wherein only one issue fell for consideration, namely, whether or not the High Court was right in quashing the show cause notice. Nobody told the Court that it has no jurisdiction to substitute itself for the fact-finding or appellate authorities under the Municipality Act, the appellate authority contemplated being a judicial Tribunal.

In a constitutional democracy as ours, people are sovereign. The sovereign power of the people to frame policies and enact laws for the implementation of the policies is executed through their elected representatives. The executive Government is accountable to the people through their elected representatives. The function of the judiciary is to adjudicate the disputes between citizens and citizens, citizens and State and State and State; it has no power to legislate; the province of the judiciary is to declare/interpret law and not to make it, except in the interstice, to fill in gaps. By its judgment and order dated 8th May, 2019 the Supreme Court ordered demolition of the buildings, entertaining a Writ Petition by the affected parties a Vacation Bench of the Court stayed

operation of the said judgment, directing the case to be listed before the Bench headed by Hon'ble Shri Justice Arun Misra. The Bench headed by Hon'ble Shri Justice Arun Misra did not take kindly the action on the part of the affected parties moving before the Vacation Court and securing an interim order. It did not mince words and by order dated 6.9.2019 directed the Chief Secretary of the State to remain present in the Court to explain as to why the flats/buildings were not demolished. On 23rd September, 2019 Shri Harish Salve represented the State Government. The Bench, in manifest conflict with the fundamental principle that the province of the Court is that of an adjudicator (a Judge) and not an actor or executive, demanded why its orders were not complied with. Neither the Chief Secretary nor Shri Harish Salve uttered a word, which they could have in all humility and with utmost respect to the Court, that enforcement of the provisions of the Municipal Act, which would also take within its ambit compliance of the CRZ norms, is in the exclusive province of the Government. They failed to bring to the notice of the Court, for, none did it before even in the curative petition settled by 'eminent' lawyers, that Section 406 of the Kerala Municipality Act, which empowers its Secretary to order demolition and also provides for the person aggrieved to seek regularization, it is open to the Government to regularize and in case it declines to do so, the party aggrieved can challenge the said order before the judicial Tribunal created under the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act. It appears that the Chief Secretary was mortally afraid of being hauled up for contempt and wanted to save his

skin. He accordingly undertook to come forward with a plan of action on demolition. The case was accordingly adjourned for further hearing to 27th September, 2019. The Court, it seems, was under the erroneous impression that demolition of the buildings, which suffer from no structural or other defects, is for securing the lives and limbs of the flat owners. However, the Chief Secretary and Shri Salve failed to bring to the notice of the Court that no threat to the lives and limbs of the residents could even be remotely thought of; that the buildings are sound and safe and that their demolition would mean waste of valuable assets, in the construction of which tons of cement, sand, steel, wood, marble and great amount of human labour have been utilized, the destruction of which would cause enormous environmental damage, health hazard, mental agony and air pollution to thousands of people in and around the buildings, literally to every sane and right-thinking people of the State, except those who are sadistic, destructive and negative in their approach. Neither the chief secretary nor Shri Salve brought it to the notice of the Court that the people of Kerala in social media and otherwise compare the demolition of the buildings as the act of the mythical Naranathu Branhan (a person with least mental balance, a character in Malayalam folklore, who was considered to be a divine person, who pretended to be mad. His chief activity consisted of rolling a big stone up a hill and then letting it fall back down). They believe that the structures could be utilized for medical

college, educational institutions or housing for thousands of people who are rendered homeless in the natural calamities occurred in the State of Kerala continuously for two years or for thousands of migrant labourers who live in extremely inhuman conditions. To allow the demolition to happen, which comes close on the heels of the decision of the Supreme Court in Sabarimala case, which has caused enormous pain and agony to millions of devotees of Lord Ayyappa living in different parts of the world, and in the factional fight between the Patriarch faction and the Orthodox faction where the Patriarch faction is on the roads, would certainly lead to erosion of the faith and esteem of the Keralites in the Supreme Court as the ultimate Temple of Justice.

To err is human and Judges are humans. Keralites, the most literate people of the country and generally at least one member of their family is settled abroad, though are deeply pained by the decision of the Supreme Court in the Maradu case, still repose their utmost faith in the institution of judiciary. They hope, pray and trust that the Supreme Court will hear the flat owners, undo the injustice caused and render them justice. With utmost respect, nobody can brush aside the grievance that the flat owners are denied a patient hearing because the review petitions were all heard and dismissed in Chambers and when the case was listed for hearing on 27th September, 2019 the Court, with utmost respect, showed little patience to hear them.

The court on Monday asked the Centre whether the jailed person will be provided with an opportunity to appoint the advocate of his choice in an appeal and would the government help him in this regard.

It has also sought information on the jurisdiction of the local laws in Saudi Arabia and whether the investigation report from India can be submitted to courts there. The court further asked whether an Indian diplomatic request to postpone the hearing of the appeal in Saudi Arabia till the police investigation in India is completed can be

made. The hearing of the petition was adjourned to August 8. Shailesh, from Mangaluru, has been convicted and imprisoned in Saudi Arabia, where he was working, for alleged derogatory posts against the king and Islam. His wife, Kavitha, has petitioned the High Court claiming that the posts, made on February 12 and 13, 2020, were made from a fake profile on Facebook and the local police had failed to provide proof to Saudi Arabian authorities. I just personally feel like five is great for him and the impact he can have at five is much more than what he can probably do at three, at the moment.

"I'm not saying he won't be a good No.3 I just feel right now for the team it's probably best that I go three. I do enjoy batting three, the challenge of batting three. I think for the team right now it's the best thing. I'm looking forward to playing against these guys and getting challenged. I



know it's not easy because they are obviously very good." The 36-year-old also admitted that England have fought well in the series so far against the top-ranked side and the current World Test champions even though they are trailing 2-1. "I think I think we've challenged the number one team in the world and we've gone toe to toe with them," he said. "At crucial times they've managed to win that battle but I don't think we're far off. All the games have been fantastic but the belief in the changing room is that we can win this series, 3-2 and there's no doubt we have that."

Sachin Tendulkar Applauds Carlos Alcaraz, Compares Him To Roger Federer



New Delhi: Cricket legend Sachin Tendulkar was all praise for 2023 Wimbledon champion Carlos Alcaraz and drew a striking resemblance between him and the 20-time Grand Slam winner, Roger Federer. Tendulkar even hailed Alcaraz as the tennis world's next superstar. The young Spanish talent was mighty impressive as he secured his second Grand Slam title in a thrilling five-set victory over Novak Djokovic. After witnessing Alcaraz's remarkable win, Tendulkar was all praise for the young man and even acknowledged the rise of a future tennis icon. He said that he will now closely follow Alcaraz's career for the

next decade. "What a fantastic final to watch! Excellent tennis by both these athletes! We're witnessing the rise of the next superstar of tennis. I'll be following Carlos' career for the next 10-12 years just like I did with @Rogerfederer. Many congratulations @carlosalcaraz!," Tendulkar posted on Twitter. Carlos Alcaraz beat Novak Djokovic in the final, 1-6, 7-6, 6-1, 3-6, 6-4. It was a match that was fiercely contested and the Spaniard showed indomitable spirit to bounce back from one set down.

At just 20 years old, Carlos Alcaraz became the youngest player to

conquer both the US Open and Wimbledon. He was dominant with his first serve and this was one of the key talking points of the game. The match itself was a generational battle, as Alcaraz became only the third youngest male player to clinch victory at Wimbledon. This feat comes behind tennis legends Boris Becker (17 years old in 1985) and Bjorn Borg (20 years old in 1976).

Apart from this, Carlos Alcaraz also achieved a rare feat by becoming the first player after more than a decade to beat Novak Djokovic at the Wimbledon Centre Court. The last loss for the Serbian came against Andy Murray in 2013. Carlos Alcaraz's Wimbledon victory was the first time since 2002 that a player other than Roger Federer, Djokovic, Rafael Nadal, or Andy Murray had won the title. This feat has solidified Alcaraz's position as the world number 1 player — an extraordinary accomplishment for a player who has taken part in only 10 Grand Slams. He has won 2 Grand Slams so far.

Both of them fell cheaply, as Taskin got rid

of them, giving the hosts early breakthroughs - Afghanistan never really got going in the series-deciding second game of the two-match T20I series.

It was the same story in the opening game as well, considering Afghans never got the flying start that they wanted from the talented Gurbaz - who hasn't scored a fifty in last 13 T20Is innings, despite his phenomenal ODI form.

The loss of Gurbaz certainly puts a toll on the other batsmen that eventually have an impact on their powerplay batting, considering he is the one



who is expected to give them a flying start. Trott certainly felt that they need to fix their powerplay batting issues in T20Is, as it has been major concern for them. "I think there is a stat showing we are slowest scoring side in the powerplay, and we need to improve that," Trott told reporters following their defeat in the series-concluding game at the Sylhet International Cricket Stadium.

"I think our power-play batting, we didn't get enough. I think they were 50 without loss after five overs (54-0 in six overs) and I think we were 21-2 after five overs (34-2 in

six overs)," he said. "So it's a huge gap of almost 30 runs and obviously two more wickets in hand. I thought we did well to get ourselves back in the contest, and then we scrapped."

Trott said that they need to fix their problem, but admitted that it is a reality check for the Afghans.

"Every time you lose, it's a reality check. You should stop and reflect as a side, not just pointing finger. It's the team's responsibility. You win as a team and you lose as a team. It's not an individual reality check but a reality check as a side" he concluded.

Bazball reduces the fast bowlers' workload - Hazlewood



Londan: Josh Hazlewood, whose fitness has been a concern in the recent past, has expressed that he is rejuvenated and raring to go in the fourth Test of the ongoing Men's Ashes series in England. Hazlewood, who missed a part of the IPL, the World Test Championship Final, and the third Test at Headingley, is back to peak fitness at the business end of the Test series.

"I obviously sat the last game out and I feel better for it. Having a rest and getting a bit of strength back has helped me in getting ready for this game," said the Australian pacer.

Hazlewood also recalled Australia's fond memories from the 2019 Ashes in Manchester, where they stormed to a 185-run win, to which Hazlewood contributed handsomely with six wickets across two innings.

However, Hazlewood provided an indirect insight into the effect of England's novel Bazball style of play, revealing that the attacking, more risky style of play, reduces the workload for the fast bowlers, as they are required to bowl fewer overs. However, he emphasized that in retrospect, he did not regret missing the Headingley Test despite his initial disappointment.

"I felt pretty good to be

honest. We haven't bowled a lot of overs in terms of what Test matches usually look like for us. The way

England play, it gets us in the field for a little less in terms of workload. I felt pretty good going into the game. It was probably the right call now I can sit back and look at the big picture," Hazlewood said, reflecting on his emotions when he was left out of the third Test. "I was desperate to play, which is

and, potentially, the Ashes urn.

"I was probably a little bit underdone for that World Test Championship (Final) and then got ready for the first game. I didn't seem too rusty when I was out there in the middle. Once you get that big day of workload underneath you, you feel a lot better. Hopefully after that little break, I'll come out firing again.

"Missing Headingley is probably the reason to set me up for the last two games. I know they're back-to-back, but we haven't bowled a lot of overs. Hopefully with that work behind me now, I'm in a better position than I was a month ago. That sort of puts me in a good place to hopefully get through those last two games and play my role and do what I usually do."

The fourth Ashes Test begins in Old Trafford, Manchester on Wednesday (July 19), with Australia leading the five-match series 2-1, and needing no more than a draw to retain the urn.
