

Odisha Bakes Under Intense Heatwave; Sambalpur Hottest With 46 Degree C

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha continued to real under intense heatwave condition as maximum temperature crossed 40 degree Celsius at 22 places across the state on Sunday. The mercury crossed 45 degree C at seven places in Odisha, said the IMD in its evening weather bulletin. Western Odisha city of Sambalpur recorded the day's highest maximum temperature of 46 degree C followed by Sonepur (45.8), added the IMD. Hirakud and Boudh both recorded the maximum temperature of 45.5 degree C followed by Jharsuguda (45.2).



Sundargarh and Bolangir both recorded the maximum temperature of 45 degree C. The maximum temperature was 44.2 degree C at Bargarh; 43.5 at Titlagarh and Rourkela; 43.4 at

Nayagarh and 43 degree C at Talcher, Deogarh and Nuapada, said the IMD. Angul recorded the maximum temperature of 42.7 degree C followed by Bhawanipatna (42).

The mercury hovered around 41 degree C at Bhubaneswar, Keonjhar and Phulbani.

Three places in Odisha—Cuttack, Paralakhemundi and Kendrapara—recorded the maximum temperature in between 40 and 41 degree C, said the MeT department.

“No large change in maximum temperature across the state during the next two days. However, the maximum temperature is likely to fall by 3-5 degree C in the subsequent days,” said the IMD in its weather forecast.

Odisha Police Issues Traffic Advisory For Puri Ratha Jatra-2023

Puri(KCN): In view of possible huge crowd and influx of devotees from across the country as well as overseas to witness divine Ratha Jatra of Lord Jagannath in Puri, Odisha Police issued traffic advisory for smooth traffic movement for Ratha Jatra, scheduled on June 20. With a motto 'minimum restriction maximum regulation', following traffic advisory has been issued in public interest: All the inter-state tourist buses and local tourist

buses will stop and park at Malatipatpur Bus Stand. All the regular passenger carrying buses will be allowed up to Talabania Temporary Bus Stand via Malatipatpur ROB, Toshali Sands, Grid Station Chhak and Bhudan Chhaka. Puri Town Shuttle Buses/ Auto Rickshaw will be allowed from Talabania to Zilla School Chhaka via Sunara Gouranga Chhaka, BNR Hotel Chhaka, Youth Hostel Chhaka and Nilachala Urban Hata. Their return will be via Zilla school

Chhaka to Helipad via Ghodabazar, Rama Mandir, Odisha Bakery, Sadar Block office for Buses and via Mangala temple for Auto rickshaw. Another shuttle services will be available from Malatipatpur Bus Stand to Atharanala in a to-and-from basis. Two wheelers will avail parking at Jagannath Ballav, Masanichandi, Matitota Parking, Nilachala Ashok and Blue Flag beach. All vehicles will be diverted accordingly. All LMV/Cars/SUVs

will avail parking facilities at the parking places at Indoor Stadium, Helipad, Sanskrit University Parking, ITI College Parking, Nalfield and Yatrika. They will be diverted as per availability of space in parking places accordingly. For smooth darshan of the Lords by devotees, some shuttle services have been implemented from Talabania to Zilla school Chhaka and From Malatipatpur to Atharanala.

Focus On Lok Sabha

MINISTER OF RAILWAYS TO VISIT ODISHA

Bhubaneswar(KCN): As the general elections to the twin polls of Lok Sabha and Odisha Legislative Assembly are less than a year, both the Governing BJD and Opposition BJP have already started their preparation for the mega event. Keeping focus on Lok Sabha seats, both are busy in making strategies for the ensuing polls. While the Governing BJD this time focused on the Lok Sabha seats, the Opposition BJP too eye on more seats in the Lower House of the Parliament. The BJP right now has eight Lok Sabha Members and they are mostly in the western region of the state. The BJD's fort remains the coastal and southern Odisha as always.

Though the BJP could easily get 8 Lok Sabha seats in 2019 general elections, this time it may face a herculean task to retain its seats as the BJD was determined to increase its tally in the Lower House of the Parliament. The BJP right now has Lok Sabha seats like Bhubaneswar, Balasore (coastal), Mayurbhanj (north), Kalahandi, Sambalpur,

Bargarh, Bolangir and Sundergarh (all west). This indicates that the BJP has advantage in the western region of the state while the BJD wins the confidence of people in coastal areas. The Congress has won only one seat in Koraput (south). Of the 21 Lok Sabha seats, the BJD has 12, BJP 8 and Congress-1.

However, in the previous 2014 elections, the BJP had only one seat in Sundergarh while the remaining 20 seats were with the BJD. In the changed circumstances where the Odisha BJP has accelerated its activities and emerged as a strong opposition, the BJD has apparently decided to repeat the 2014 election results. The party has everything including a solid vote base, strong workers' network and above all no dearth of money. Still, the regional party lost seven seats to the BJP in the last elections and the factor could be Prime Minister Narendra Modi's popularity.

The people in Odisha last time in 2019 elections indulged in split voting. The people



who voted the BJD for the assembly elections, preferred the lotus symbol in Lok Sabha polls. This was a new trend and the saffron party could gain effectively by winning in 8 Lok Sabha seats.

This time round, the strategy makers of the BJD are in a dilemma over how to contain the BJP in western region of the state. The ruling party has taken several steps to appease the voters of western region. However, despite the BJP's all out efforts, the four by-polls in Jharsuguda, Padampur, Brajrajnagar and Bijepur have gone in favour of

BJD. Naveen Patnaik's party has also performed exceptionally well in panchayat and urban polls in western region in 2022, which was held after the 2019 general elections. Still, the party seems uncertain of the people's mood and their split voting attitude which was seen last time. The opposition BJP is of the view that they (BJD) may win by-polls and panchayat polls, the people will vote for the saffron party in the Lok Sabha elections as they did last time.

Keeping in view the next Lok Sabha polls, the BJP has organized mass rallies of stalwarts like

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP President J P Nadda, Union Minister Rajnath Singh and others. The BJP's objective is to woo the voters for the Lok Sabha polls, though they appeal for a double engine government in Odisha. In a bid to attract people's attention, the BJP government in the Centre made arrangements of free rice for the BPL families and attempted to get credit over the Naveen Patnaik's government's Rs 1 a kg rice. Later, the BJP also sanctioned 9.5 lakh units of houses under the Pradhan

Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) for the poor people of Odisha. The BJP people have also decided to reach all the households across the state and inform the people about the welfare activities of the NDA government and the alleged misrule of the BJD in the state.

This time, BJP sources said that Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, who was elected to the Rajya Sabha from Madhya Pradesh, is asked to contest the Lok Sabha elections in Odisha. Shri Pradhan is likely to contest from Dhenkanal seat or he may opt for Sambalpur seat. Shri Pradhan has been taking stock of the situation before choosing Dhenkanal or Sambalpur. Though Dhanakanal is his home seat, he is not confident to become a candidate from there keeping in view the BJD's influence in grass root level. At the last moment he may opt for Sambalpur as he will genuine the support of Leader of Opposition and BJP stalwart Jaynarayan Mishra.

Similarly, the BJP may field Railway Minister

Ashwini Vaishnaw from Cuttack or Balasore seat. Shri Vaishnaw was Collector at both the Districts.

Similarly, BJP is likely to repeat its MP Aparajita Sarangi in Bhubaneswar from where she won the election by a margin of 23,839 votes. Meanwhile, Aparajita has created more base within her party and outside. However her direct attack on Naveen's close aide and questions on governance style has irked the BJD

Anyway, both the BJD and BJP this time are more serious about the Lok Sabha polls. This is because the BJD is confident of winning the Assembly elections though its number of seats may decline to certain extent. But the regional party will certainly put all its efforts to win more Lok Sabha seats so that the BJD would be in a better position to bargain the BJP during the formation of government at the centre after the 2024 general elections. It is in fact a do or die situation for both the BJD and the BJP to win the Lok Sabha seats in Odisha.

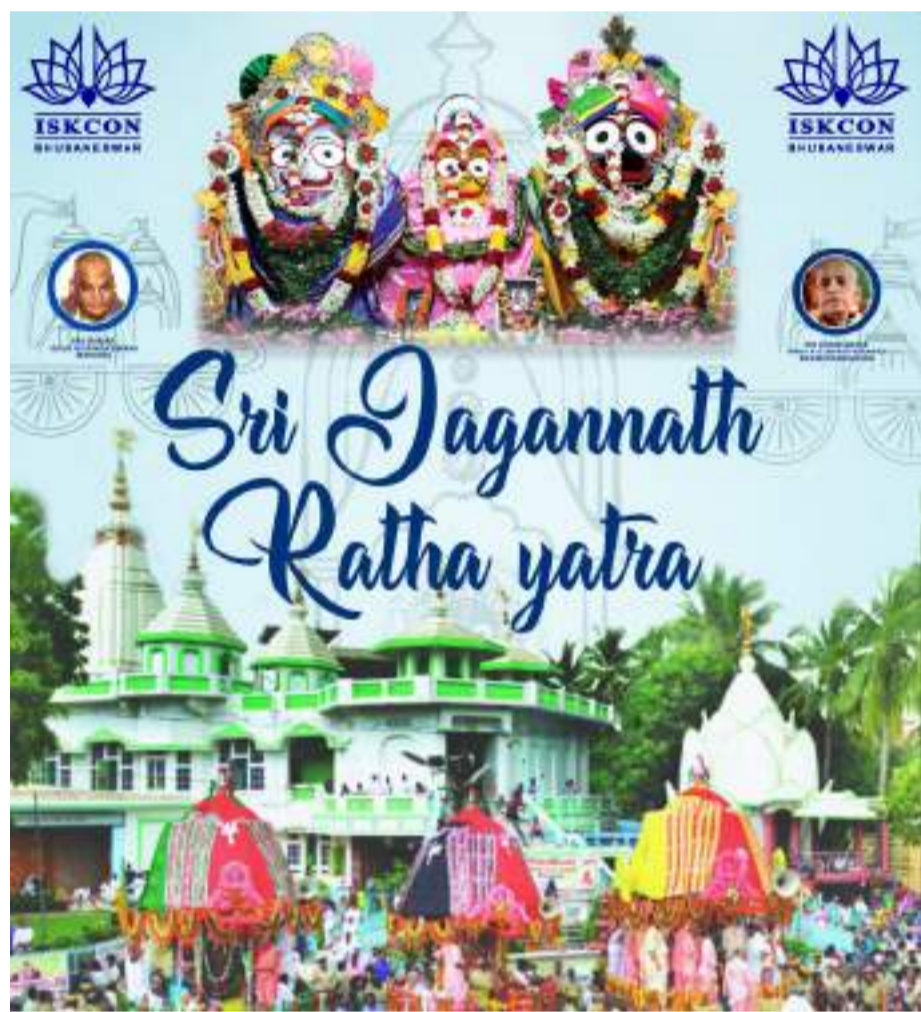

Grammys Reduce Nominees From 10 to 8 In Top 4 Award Categories

Grammys has announced to reduce the number of nominees in four of its award categories - Album, Song, Record of the Year, and Best New Artist - from 10 to 8, Variety reported on Friday. An announcement in this regard was made after the Recording Academy updated its rules and guidelines following its semiannual board of trustees meeting.

The number of nominees for those categories was increased from eight to ten in November 2021, just before the nominees for 2022 were announced -- a surprising and perplexing turn of events, given that such changes usually occur after the annual board meetings, Variety reported. While three new award categories were announced earlier this week, the reduction in the number of nominees in four award categories was announced on Friday. An Artificial Intelligence (AI)-related rule was also introduced, effectively stating that only human creators are eligible for awards; however, as with all things AI, the vast possibilities that the technology makes possible in this still-developing area necessitate an extensive series of caveats, Variety further reported. While Recording Academy CEO Harvey Mason Jr. stated at the time that the change was "an incredible opportunity for us to honour more artists and shine a light on more great music, and potentially offer a greater chance for more genres of music to be honoured", some speculated that it was done to ensure Taylor Swift received a best new album nomination for her album 'Evermore' and thus increase the chance that she would appear on the show and boost its rating, as reported by Variety.

Changes in Reassessment and Rectification provisions by Finance Act 2023

We are giving here details of changes in Reassessment and Rectification provisions by Finance Act 2023. Also incorporating amended provisions in respect of Modified Income Tax Returns in case of Business Reorganisation.

1. REASSESSMENT

1.1 Period of 3 months provided to file return under sec. 148: W.e.f. 1.4.2023, a return in response to notice under section 148 is to be furnished within 3 months from the end of the month in which such notice is issued, or within such further time as may be allowed by the Assessing Officer on a request made by the assessee.

In case the assessee furnishes the return of income beyond the time allowed, it shall not be treated as a return under section 139 and as such notice under section 143(2) will not be required to be issued in such cases

1.2 For search or survey conducted after 15 March of financial year, 15 days grace period allowed for issuing notice under section 148 or 148A(b): Where a search under section 132 is initiated or last of the authorisation is executed or requisition made under section 132A after 15 March of a financial year, the notice under section 148 may be issued by 15 April and it shall be deemed to have been issued on 31 March.

Where the information as referred to in Explanation 1 to section 148 emanates from a statement recorded or documents impounded under section 131 or section 133A, on or before 31 March of a financial year, in consequence of a search under section 132 which is initiated or a search under section 132 for which last of authorisation is executed or requisition made under sec 132A, after 15 March of a financial year, the

notice under sec 148A(b) may be issued by 15 April and it shall be deemed to have been issued on 31 March.

1.3 Chief Commissioner of Income Tax can also grant approval for the purpose of sec 148 or sec 148A even if Principle Chief Commissioner of Income Tax or Principal Director General of Income Tax exists [sec 151]: W.e.f. 1.4.2023, Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Principal Director General of Income Tax and Director General of Income Tax are specified authorities for granting approval for issuing of notices or passing of order under sec 148A(b), 148A(d) or sec 148 where notice is issued after the expiry of 3 years.

Prior to the amendment Principle Chief Commissioner of Income Tax or Principal Director General of Income Tax were the specified authorities. CCIT or DGIT were specified authorities where these officials did not exist.

For computing the period of 3 years, the period for which the time

limit has been extended under third, fourth, fifth and sixth proviso to sec 149(1) shall be excluded.

1.4 Time limit for completion of assessment or reassessment including assessment in case of updated return increased to 12 months from 9 months [Sec 153(1)/(3)/(3A)/(5)/(6)]: The time limit for competition of assessment for the assessment year 2022-23 or any subsequent year shall be 12 months from the end of the relevant assessment year in which the income is first assessable (For the assessment year 2021-22, the time limit for competition of assessment was 9 months).

With effect from 01-04-2023 the time limit for completion of assessment in case of an updated return under section 139(8A) shall expire on the end of 12 months from the end of the financial year in which updated return is furnished. Prior to the amendment time limit was 9 months from the end of the financial year in which updated return was furnished.

With effect from 01-04-2023, Section 153(3A) has been inserted which provides that if an assessment or

reassessment or an assessment of updated return is pending on the date of initiation of search under section 132 or making of requisition under section 132A then the time limit for competition of such assessment or reassessment or an assessment of an updated return shall be extended by 12 months.

With effect from 01-04-2023 the time limit prescribed for competition of order in pursuance of an order of Commissioner of Income Tax or Principal Commissioner of Income Tax passed under section 263 or 264, shall also apply for passing order in pursuance of order passed by Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax or Chief Commissioner of Income Tax under section 263 or 264.

2. RECTIFICATION

2.1 Order of Joint Commissioner (Appeals) can also be rectified under section 154: With effect from 01-04-2023 an order passed by Joint Commissioner (Appeals) can also be rectified under section 154.

2.2 Assessing Officer empowered to rectify an order to allow deduction under section 10AA for

delayed remittance under Section 155(11A): With effect from Assessment Year 2024-25 Assessing Officer can rectify an order to allow as deduction u/s 10AA in a case where export proceedings are remitted after the expiry of 6 months. Such rectification can be made within 4 years from the end of the financial year in which such remittance is received in India.

2.3 Assessing Officer empowered to allow deduction of final cane price for Assessment year prior to 2015-16 [Section 155(19)]: With effect from 01-04-2023 to 31-03-2027, Assessing Officer can allow deduction to sugar mill co-operative claimed on account of Final Cane price for the assessment year 2015-16 or earlier years.

3. PROVISIONS FOR MODIFIED RETURN IN CASE OF BUSINESS REORGANISATION AMENDED -Section 170A:

With effect from Assessment Year 2023-24 modified return scheme introduced by Finance Act 2022 has been amended. The amended provisions are as under -

a) There should be a business reorganisation.

b) The assessee should have furnished its return of income and after furnishing such return the High Court or Tribunal or an Adjudicating Authority [as defined in section 5(1) of Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016] has passed an order pertaining to business reorganisation.

c) The successor can furnish modified return in Form ITR-A electronically with digital signature within 6 months from the end of the month in which order of reorganisation by High Court, Tribunal or adjudicating authority is received.

d) If the proceedings of assessment or reassessment for the relevant assessment year have been completed on the date of furnishing of the aforesaid modified return, the Assessing Officer shall pass an order modifying the total income of the relevant assessment year in accordance with the order of the business reorganisation and considering the modified return so furnished. Where, however, the proceedings of

assessment or reassessment for the relevant assessment year are pending on the date of furnishing of the modified return, the Assessing Officer shall pass an order to assess or reassess the total income of the relevant assessment year in accordance with the order of the business reorganisation and taking into account the modified return so furnished. For such proceedings, all provisions of the Income tax Act shall apply and the tax shall be chargeable at the rate applicable to such assessment year

For this purpose "Business reorganisation" means: The reorganisation of business involving the amalgamation or demerger or merger of business of one or more persons.

"Successor" means: All resulting companies in a business reorganisation, whether or not the company was in existence prior to such business reorganisation.

NEED TO PROTECT TRIBAL SOCIOCULTURAL VALUE SYSTEMS OF INDIA

The terms 'culture,' 'values,' and 'customs' are often used interchangeably, each is actually a distinct piece of the bigger picture. A custom is a ritual or other tradition that is an outward sign of the group's cultural values. The group's values aren't always obvious right away - they run deep! Cultural values can be pieced together by observing the various customs that the people have passed down for generations. Culture is defined as all of a group's guiding values and outward signs and symbols are taken together as one big whole. The cultural value that the tribal man believes is to respect your ancestors and your gods. One of the customs that acts as an outward sign of this value is to allow cows to have a natural death, rather than slaughtering them. This custom, taken with all of the other customs that his community practices, represents a larger picture of tribe culture. "These are the prevailing values of our society, which change with time, and either coincide or not with our family or personal values. They constitute a complex mix of different

values, and at times they contradict one another, or pose a dilemma".

A social value of the tribe represents varied customs prevalent among them like that of tattooing, birth and death rituals. These social values are stretched in different states of India like Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and Jharkhand. They follow different types of social values that are different from other tribes. The tradition of folk medicine as a social value is still followed by the tribes. The tribes are experts having in-depth knowledge about medicines. Various parts of plants are used as herbal medicines. For any type of body ailments like body pain, headache, cough, stomach pain, cold, fever, cut or small accident, etc, they treat them with their own medicines. There are certain rituals attached to the birth and death of the tribe from which various social-cultural values arise.

The lifestyle, culture & customs of tribes mostly resemble the Hindu religion though they still strongly believe in orthodox traditions. Two types of social values one is individual values and other is collective values:- Individual values are the values which are related to the development of human personality or individual norms of recognition and protection of the human personality such as honesty, loyalty, veracity, and honour. On the other

hand, Collective values are values connected with the solidarity of the community or collective norms of equality, justice, solidarity, and suitableness are known as collective values.

Every tribe has a specific and unique society, culture, and lifestyle. They have their own social and cultural values which are related to their traditions, customs, beliefs, and folk. The main characteristic of the tribe is their high superstition, unique socio-culture, expertise in medicine and priest work, and unique lifestyle. They struggle from English time for their existence and development where they succeed but exploited by civil society. At present, they have faced the problem of their livelihood and keeping safe of their exclusive socio-culture values. In their societies, marriage proposal first comes from the parents of the bride, however, in some places; the girls are not allowed to select husbands themselves. Usually, three ceremonies precede marriage ceremonies. Some tribal society allows divorce but a divorced woman is not allowed to remarry without the permission of the Panchayat. Polygamy is also allowed in these tribal societies. They also observe several births and funeral rites. There are certain rituals attached to the birth and death of the tribes from which various social-cultural values arise. After the birth of a child, a woman is

considered to be impure for a month. A purification ceremony is organized where the child's name is also finalized. Among the dead people are buried but the aged people are burnt as a sign of honour. Bodies are laid naked with their head pointing in the south direction. A person of importance is buried with two; three rupees or cigarettes and tobacco are kept. In some instances, a rupee is thrust into the mouth of the dead person which is later recovered by the man's daughter or sister who wears it in her amulet.

Social-cultural importance of Tattoo is gaining momentum now a days. Although, body tattooing is becoming a fashion around the world, still it has some cultural significance in the tribal world. Body tattooing is very much essential and a community marker for some of the tribal groups of central India. It is related to their religion, belief system, health care practice, body decoration, social status, wealth, etc. Religion, belief system and Tattoo in the tribes of central India usually like to tattoo various symbols related to their totem, God, and goddess. It is a common belief among them that, these deities and ancestors protect them from different natural calamities, evil spirits, black magic, enemies, wild animals, etc. For example, the Bags female tattooed the symbol of the triangle at the sole of the right foot. For the magical purpose which earth and protect

woman's foot from being bruised and cut when she walks about barefoot; Oval shape with a series of dots at the sole of the left foot for protection; Five dots and a line at the upper part of the foot, one dot on each toe and line from big toe to the little toe and it is believed that these symbols on feet will enable them to bear weight.

Tattooing in some specific parts of the body has some medicinal value and it is believed this tattoo helps them to cure some typical diseases. An example may be cited, the tattooing of the image of a cobra by a Baiga lady at face below to the mouth to protect them from the effects of eating any poisonous thing. Tattoo is the symbol of social status e.g., Tattoo as a Wealth and Ornament. The tattoo is treated as the wealth and ornament of the tribal. The ornaments made of metal, plastic, wood, and grass are temporary in nature and can be broken or removed at any stage of time or there is a possibility of theft. Besides, these are costly which is always not possible to afford by an economically poor tribe. On the other hand, the tattoo is not comparatively less costly than the jewels made of the above materials and is permanent in nature which does not leave the body even after death. Therefore, the tribal people treat it as wealth and like to adorn their bodies with various types of tattoo marks. The Tattoos are used for

Sexual Expression too. Tattooing is one of the important modes to provoke sexual desire which is clear from the statement of According to them; the tattooing of body parts for sexual expression has a long history. At the time of describing the tattooing of different body parts for the said purpose, they have mentioned that "We have only to follow the fashion trends for women of Europe and North America during the past 300 years, with their history of pinched waists, ballooned hips, bustled rumps, exaggerated breasts, painted faces, and exposed bosoms, to realize the significance of body adornment for sexual provocation. Why some societies emphasize erotic adornment of women and others emphasize it in men is not yet understood". Thus, the tribal groups were using their traditional method and handmade colour for this purpose, but nowadays, this tradition has been changed. Presently, it does not confine within the people of the tribal and folk communities, it enters into the life and cultures of the urban people and it becomes their important fashion which is present in their dress and body. Like any other country, India is also a signatory to "Universal declaration of Human Rights" in 1948. The tribal rights can be seen as a part of the larger human rights discourse. India during post-independence period was engaged in

developmental works like industrialization, urbanization, Dams for Hydro-electric projects and irrigation, mining's etc., which resulted in displacement of millions of people and more affected were the rural poor tribals. In most part of the country, the tribal habited places are rich in minerals. Hence, the tribals are displaced more in numbers. They have lost their homes and livelihood. The Government has failed to pay the compensation to the displaced tribals. They were shifted to resettlement colonies without sufficient amenities of life. Some tribals have been moved to remote jungles in search of agriculture land. The displacement has taken them back to some more years to develop. Thus, their rights are ignored by government. The country is developing in the cost of rural poor tribals. Violation of human rights creates many economic and emotional problems. It affects the nature and welfare of human beings, and creates many disorders. It is possible to imagine the life chances of Tribal communities improving through the implementation of practical measures along with considering the rights accorded. However, silence on rights will always carry with it the danger of a return to paternalism and the treatment of an identifiable group of people as a problem

'worthy of charity, not as a group of human beings to whom society has responsibilities and duties.

The constitutional guarantee, which governs and protects the rights and sovereignty of Tribal communities, need an immediate implementation. Otherwise, this would lead to a disappearance of the various tribal communities from the human picture. The Tribal communities 'sovereignty is also at stake by the intervention of non-tribes in their area. Tribes help to protect our environment, fight climate change and build resilience to natural disasters. However, they are the most disadvantaged and vulnerable groups of people in the world and they had been oppressed and exploited and misused by the outsiders. We need to safeguard them and also our government must continue its commitment for uplifting the present standard of the tribal people.

Over 100 Houses Damaged In Multiple Landslides In Sikkim

Gangtok: Multiple landslides induced by heavy rainfall have damaged over a hundred houses in West Sikkim district. The incessant rain has caused extensive damage to infrastructure and property in the state. As a result of the heavy rain, several rivers are flowing above the danger level.

According to reports, the road connecting Uttarey to Sopakha, which includes two bridges, was completely swept away. Nearby trout fish and poultry farms were also washed away. Similarly, the road connecting Dentam with Pelling and Gyalshing was completely washed away by River Kalaz.



One kaccha house, one cement building, two crematory sheds, and an excavator were also swept away by the rising water level of the river. In Sombaria, a house belonging to Dawa

Sangay Sherpa at Lower Okhrey was on the verge of collapsing due to the incessant rainfall. All the occupants have been shifted to a safer location. No casualties have been

reported so far. The increase in the volume of River Ramam has damaged all the temporary bridges at border areas connecting West Bengal. Heavy rains hit Lachen,

Lachung, and Chungthang valleys on Friday leading to the road from the North Sikkim district headquarters of Mangan to Chungthang being blocked at Pegong Supply Khola, disrupting traffic. Around 3,500 tourists were stranded in North Sikkim due to landslides and roadblocks before being rescued by the army. Evacuation, Trimming Of Trees: What Made Biparjoy Pass Without Any Deaths

New Delhi: When Biparjoy - the strongest cyclone in the Arabian Sea after Tauktae, according to both the weather office and Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC) - was all set to make a fierce landfall in Gujarat on Wednesday, the Centre and state were mindful of the trail of devastation it will lead to. Memories of the devastating cyclone that hit Gujarat in June 1998 that led to the death of 10,000 people and the total destruction of Kandla port were still fresh in many minds. A coordinated effort involving at least nine ministers and nine bureaucrats was put in place a week earlier to monitor the evacuation of at least one lakh people from at least nine high-risk districts ensuring the provision of essentials to them, including restoration of transmission and communication lines. It was also to monitor the safety of cattle in Kutch and other coastal areas. Experts note that in the satellite era (since 1982),



Cyclone Biparjoy - with a maximum sustained wind speed of 125-135 kmph gusting to 150 kmph - is the fourth longest-lived cyclone during the pre-monsoon season in the Arabian Sea. All the efforts were centred around the target of “zero deaths” and the Gujarat government has credited accurate predictions and early preparedness for the cyclone resulting in no deaths. The record of no causality is an achievement for the state and Centre, particularly during the

cyclone of this magnitude. Prime Minister Narendra Modi made a mention of this in his radio programme, Mann Ki Baat, this morning. He said the strength of disaster management that India has developed over the years is becoming an example today and that even though Cyclone Biparjoy caused great damage in Kachchh, people of the state faced it with full courage and preparedness and will come out of it successfully. Preparations started as

soon as the IMD predictions came about, and on June 11, the Gujarat government deputed one minister of the state to each district. Once the magnitude of the cyclone becoming extremely severe was clearer, Central ministers were deputed to camp in the most-affected areas in and around Saurashtra's Gir-Somnath, Porbandar, Junagadh, Jamnagar and Kutch districts. Health minister Mansukh Mandaviya was sent to the worst-affected Kutch while

Parshottam Rupala, minister for fisheries and dairy, was deployed in Dwarka, IT Mos Devusinh Chauhan was sent to Jamnagar, while MoS for railways Darshan Jardosh was sent to Porbandar, and Mahendra Mujnarpura who is MoS, women and child development was asked to be Gir-Somnath. PM Modi himself reviewed the preparations and also spoke with Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel a number of times to ensure preparations for the safety of not just the people, but also cattle and the lions of Gir. Mr Mandaviya was also among the ministers who were rushed to Balasore to be part of the relief and rescue efforts in the aftermath of the triple-train tragedy that led to 175 deaths. He was particularly given the responsibility of ensuring the embalming of the dead bodies and their preservation as relatives took time to travel from remote areas to claim them.

Domestic season 2023-24: Ranji Trophy to commence on January 5

New Delhi: The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has released the schedule for the upcoming domestic cricket season (2023-24), and the premier first-class competition, the Ranji Trophy, will commence on January 5, 2024. Spanning 70 days, the tournament will conclude on March 14, with the league stage ending on February 19 and the knockout matches commencing on February 23.

The season will begin with the Duleep Trophy, from June 28 to July 16, followed by the Deodhar Trophy, as reported by Cricbuzz, taking place from July 24 to August 4. The traditional Irani Cup, featuring the Ranji champions (Saurashtra) and Rest of India, is

scheduled for October 1-5. According to the circulated schedule, the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 competition will be held from October 16 to November 6, followed by the Vijay Hazare Trophy 50-over championship from November 23 to December 15. Both white-ball tournaments will feature two divisions: Elite and Plate. The premier division will consist of three groups of eight teams, while the lower division will comprise two groups of seven teams. The competition will progress through two pre-quarterfinals, four quarterfinals, two semifinals, and culminate in the final.

The top two teams from each of the five groups will



qualify for the knockout stage. The group toppers will directly advance to the quarterfinals and will be ranked 1-5 based on their points, wins, and net run rate (NRR). The second-placed teams will be ranked 6-10 using the same criteria. The team ranked sixth will secure a direct spot in the quarterfinals, alongside the group toppers, while the teams ranked 7-10 will compete in the pre-quarterfinals. In the Ranji Trophy, there will also be two divisions, Elite and Plate, with four groups of eight teams in the Elite division and one group of six teams in the Plate division. An Elite team will have the opportunity to play up to 10 multi-day matches: seven league games, followed by the quarterfinals, semifinal,

and the final. Unlike the white-ball competitions, there will be no integration of Elite and Plate teams during the Ranji Trophy knockout stage.

The top two teams from each of the four Elite groups will directly qualify for the quarterfinals, based on the matchups: A1 vs. C2, B1 vs. D2, C1 vs. A2, and D1 vs. B2. In the Plate division, the top four teams will compete in the semifinals using the traditional format of No. 1 vs. No. 4 and No. 2 vs. No. 3. Notably, the finalists in the Plate group will be promoted to the Elite Group in the following 2024-25 season, while the bottom two teams from all the Elite Groups (A/B/C/D & E) combined, based on points, bonus points, wins, and quotient, will be relegated to the Plate Group.

Broad cherishes hard work on 'one of the slowest' England pitches

New Delhi: Stuart Broad's two wickets in two balls at the start of the day was hardly a bellwether for what was to follow. It was instead a hard grind for him and other England bowlers on a flat Edgbaston pitch, which Broad later called "one of the slowest" he's bowled on in England. He hoped that "soulless" pitches don't become a trend for the series.

"It felt slow from length, it felt like a lot of the energy got sapped from the ball," Broad told Sky Sports after the second day's play in Birmingham. "It's been pretty characterless so far. A bit soulless, but ultimately you can only judge it towards the end of a Test match and see how it develops."

"It's certainly one of the slowest pitches I can



remember bowling on in England. I think there was a stat that for the Aussies in the first 10 overs, it moved the least-ever recorded. It has certainly been hard work for the seamers... Hopefully it's not a trend for the whole series.

"Ultimately, we're looking to entertain and have fun and get the crowd jumping, and it's quite a difficult pitch to get plays-and-misses on and nicks to slip and stuff. These sorts of pitches are your worst nightmare when Steve

Smith walks to the crease, to be honest." Broad also looked back on the no-ball off which he had bowled a well-set Usman Khawaja. "It's really frustrating," Broad told Test Match Special. "I got tight to the line and it was a close

decision.

"We did create enough chances to probably bowl Australia out today, but also, really it doesn't strike me as a sort of pitch on day two where you would be looking to get 10 wickets in a day."

Despite the missed chances, which included a missed stumping and a couple of dropped catches, Broad feels that England are in a good position going in to Day 3. "We had a really good day," Broad said. "The game is nicely poised. We are 82 runs ahead, one or two wickets away from the tail."

"It has been a hard gruelling day on a pitch that offered very little but being in this position is a really positive place to be."

UEFA Euro Qualifiers: Harry Kane Extends Scoring Record As England Thrash Malta 4-0

New Delhi: Harry Kane scored a record-extending 56th goal for England as they routed Malta 4-0 in European Championship qualifying. The striker became England's outright leading scorer in March when he surpassed Wayne Rooney's total of 53, struck his 50th in competitive games and Gareth Southgate's team maintained its 100% start to Euro 2024 qualifying. Kane scored from the penalty spot in the 31st minute to give England a 3-0 halftime lead at Ta' Qali National Stadium after Ferdinand Apap's own goal and a stunning strike from Trent Alexander-Arnold.

Callum Wilson slotted the second penalty of the game to round off the scoring.

England has won its opening three games in Group C, which also contains defending European champion Italy. England was always expected to win



comfortably against a team ranked 172nd in the world and was on course for victory from as early as the eighth minute when Ferdinand Apap put the ball into his own net with Kane threatening. Alexander-Arnold doubled the lead with a strike worthy of the No. 10 he wore on his back after being tried out in a midfield role.

Southgate had said he would deploy the defender in a more advanced position in the absence of Jude Bellingham, who has just completed a move to Real Madrid. Alexander-Arnold collected the ball

25 yards out and whipped a shot beyond Malta goalkeeper Henry Bonello. It was his first competitive goal for his country. "It's somewhere I can see myself playing," Alexander-Arnold said. "I want to make sure I am regularly on the team sheet and today was a good foundation to build on." Kane was brought down by Matthew Guillaumier in the box and coolly converted the spot kick. Another penalty was awarded late after Wilson's cross struck Steve Borg, and the substitute striker converted.

'We missed Rashid' - Hashmatullah Shahidi after heavy loss

Dhaka: Afghanistan skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi admitted on Saturday (June 17) that they missed the services of their talismanic player Rashid Khan in the one-off Test against Bangladesh. Rashid, who was rested for the game in order to manage his workload, played the most crucial role in their historic victory over Bangladesh in Chattogram four years ago.

The leg-spinner claimed 11 wickets in that contest as the visitors clinched a massive 224-run win during their first meeting with Bangladesh in this format.

"Of course, we missed him. He is our superstar bowler," skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi told reporters after they suffered a massive 546-run on the fourth day. "In the last game we played against Bangladesh and won, Rashid took 11 wickets. So he had a lot



of impact on our team. "But still, he is an important guy for us. We have two big tournaments coming up, the Asia Cup and the World Cup. He had a bit niggle at his back and we wanted him to have a rest in this game and prepare for the ODIs," said Shahidi, who was replaced by Bahir Shah

as a concussion substitute in the second innings. Shahidi added that he was expecting more from left-arm chinaman bowler Zahir Khan and left-arm spinner Amir Hamza while adding that he was disappointed with the bowling effort over the course of the game. "As I said earlier, we

played after 28 months. These bowlers were playing first-class cricket but I think there is different between playing Test and first-class cricket. We have to play more Test cricket and also I was expecting more especially from Zahir and Hamza. But they couldn't do more," said Shahidi. "I don't know. However,

in this kind of level, it's not acceptable to bowl so many no balls. In this game, we were not disciplined right from the beginning. Bowlers didn't hit good areas and they also bowled many no balls," he said, adding that he was surprised to see green-top wickets at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium. "It was the first time I have seen such wickets in Bangladesh. It was more difficult for batting. There were some balls that were bouncing and some balls went low. It was disappointing (to lose in this manner). Still, there are some areas to improve and work on. We know the points we need to work on to improve in future and we definitely will work on that. We will bounce back hopefully. This game is now history. We will prepare for that (white-ball series) to come back stronger."

Meet The Next 'The Great Khali', Arif Saleem Bohru, Who Is First Professional Wrestler From Jammu & Kashmir
