Monsoon Reaches Odisha

Bhubaneswar(KCN):

The people of Odisha now get relief from heatwave as southwest monsoon has set in over the State today.

The monsoon has covered most parts of Malkangiri, some parts of Koraput and Gajapati districts on the first day, said India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Conditions are favorable for further advance of southwest monsoon over remaining parts of Odisha, during next two days, the IMD forecast said.

Meanwhile, heavy downpours lashed the twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack and parts of coastal Odisha on



Thursday afternoon bringing in the much-desired relief from the scorching heat.

In view of advancement of south Monsoon and current meteorological situations, fairly widespread to widespread rain/

thundershower with isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall and also lightning activity very likely to occur across the state during next 4 to 5 days.

Heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts

of Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Puri, Ganjam, Kandhamal, Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati, N a b a r a n g p u r , Kalahandi, Bolangir, Cuttack, Jajpur, Bhadrak, Balasore, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, and Dhenkanal on

Friday. Under its influence temporarily water logging is likely in some low lying areas and traffic congestion in urban areas. So, the IMD advised people to follow traffic advisory for movement and initiate preparations for sowing of paddy crops & precautionary measures for lightning strikes while working in fields may be taken. The Met department said a cyclonic circulation over west-central and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal off north Andhra Pradesh- south Odisha coasts lies between 3.1 & 5.8 km above mean sea level, tilting southwards with height.

Odisha Health Secy's Plea For Opening Aahaar Centres At 93 More Hospitals

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Health and Family Welfare department Commissioner-cum-Secretary Shalini Pandit today urged the state government to open Aahaar (cheap meal) centres at 93 hospitals across Odisha that are being developed as 'Ama Hospitals' under the 5T initiative. Pandit urged the Housing and Urban Development (H&UD) department to run Aahaar centres at these hospitals for all days in a week. government has so far opened as many as 158 Aahaar centres at various places across Odisha, including many Sub-Divisional Hospitals and District Headquarters Hospitals and medical colleges, to provide subsidized food to the poor people. The scheme was launched in 2015. At present, the state government is providing meal at Rs 5 at Aahaar centres.

In a related development,

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today sanctioned Rs 20 crore for the Odisha State Aahaar Society functioning under the H&UD department. The money has been sanctioned from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF). The Odisha State Aahaar Society has been sanctioned Rs 228.76 crore from the CMRF in several phases till 2021-22 financial year, added the official.

Odisha CM Sanctions Rs 2.49 Crore For Redevelopment Of Bahanaga High School

Bhubaneswar: The Bahanaga High School in Balasore district of Odisha will be redeveloped under the 5T initiative of the state government. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has sanctioned Rs 2.49 crore from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF) for the high school redevelopment work, said a senior official today.

As per the direction of the Chief Minister, 5T Secretary VK Pandian had held discussions with the students of Bahanaga High School, teachers, managing committee members, local representatives and Balasore Collector on various issues.

Notably, Bahanaga High School had served as a temporary mortuary for the victims of a major train accident in the locality on June 2. More than 250 bodies of the train accident victims were kept at the school for two days, sources said.

The state government was forced to demolish a portion of the school and rebuild it after many parents expressed their reluctance to send their children to the institute.

The school was reopened yesterday after the completion of summer vacation. However, only 112 students out of the total 556 studying in Class I to X attended the classes.

IAS Reshuffle: Smruti Ranjan Pradhan Appointed As Collector Of Gajapati District

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Government today effected a brief reshuffle in the IAS cadre. Accordingly, Smruti Ranjan Pradhan was appointed as Collector and District Magistrate of Gajapati. "No.GAD-SER1-ESTT-0001-2016-17979/AIS.I, Shri Smruti Ranjan Pradhan, IAS (NSCS-2012), Director of Fisheries, Odisha, Cuttack with the additional charge of Managing Director,

Odisha Pisciculture Development Corporation Ltd, Bhubaneswar is appointed as Collector and District Magistrate, Gajapati vice Shri Lingaraj Panda, IAS transferred," a notification issued by General Administration and Public Grievance Department in this regard mentioned. "In exercise of the powers conferred under Section 20(1) of the Code of Criminal

Procedure 1973 (Act II of 1974), the State Government do hereby appoint Shri Smruti Ranjan Pradhan, IAS as the District Magistrate in the district of Gajapati," the notification read. Similarly, the present Collector and District Magistrate of Gajapati Lingraj Panda was appointed as Director of the Social Welfare, Women & Child Development department.

BJP President JP Nadda Arrives At Jharsuguda On 2-Day Odisha Visit



Jharsuguda(KCN): BJP's national president JP Nadda arrived in Jharsuguda on Thursday on his two-day visit to Odisha as part of the party's "Maha Jan Sampark Abhiyan".

Several BJP leaders including state president Manmohan Samal and Bargarh MP Suresh Pujari accorded a warm welcome to Nadda on his arrival at Veer Surendra Sai airport in the evening.

From the airport, the BJP president straight went to inaugurate the newly constructed Jharsuguda district BJP office. From there, he proceeded to Bargarh district unit office of the party.

According to BJP sources, Nadda will hold discussion with principal office-bearers, party leaders and workers of Bargarh Lok Sabha constituency and make a night halt at MCL guest house in Burla.

On Friday, the BJP president will travel to Bhawanipatna and pay his obeisance to the presiding deity at Maa Manikeswari temple in the town. He will then address a rally at Lal Bahadur Shastri Stadium there.

Since the BJP has launched Maha Jan Sampark Abhiyan on the completion of nine years of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led NDA government at the

Centre, Nadda will present the report card of the government at the meeting.

After the Samabesh, he will meet prominent persons of the district and hold discussions with party's principal office-bearers of Kalahandi Lok Sabha constituency before flying back to Delhi from Jharsuguda in the afternoon.

It may be noted that Nadda had last visited Odisha in December last year and addressed public meetings at Tumudibandha under Baliguda Assembly constituency of Kandhamal district and Banpur under Chilika Assembly seat.

Sops For TG People

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The State Government has decided to provide financial assistance for hostel facilities to the transgender (TG) students and to pursue their economic activities under the Sweekruti scheme. The Social Security and Empowerment of PwD Department has moved a step ahead for the security and welfare of transgender persons. Transgender persons are facing challenges in moving to places for education, training and employment as they don't have the access to existing boys and girls hostels due to their limitations after acquiring self-perceived gender. They are also not preferred as tenants by house owners. To overcome this barrier,

the Government will provide assistance for hostel facilities for them. One-time non-recurring grant of Rs. 15,000 per inmate at the time of commencement of the hostel for purchase of furniture and furnishings will be provided, said SSEPD Minister Ashok Chandra Panda on Thursday. The TG students pursuing education and staying in hostels will be given stipend towards meeting their hostel expenses at Rs. 3,000 per month each for the period of their education, subject to submission of recommendation of concerned educational institutions, he said. The Minister said individual entrepreneurship for generating self-employment-based



income including production, marketing, service centres etc. will be promoted by the registered transgender persons. Projects not exceeding one time investment of Rs.10 lakh will be considered. Group endeavour for generating self-employment based individual income will

also be encouraged, he pointed out. However, the projects must ensure the object of providing individual income to the members of the group while projects not exceeding one time investment of Rs. 20 lakh will be considered. Self Help Groups (SHGs) formed by

transgender persons will be given one-time assistance of Rs.1.25 lakh for initial activities support and Startup Capital. Concerned District Social Security Officers will assist the TG people in getting benefits of these financial assistance. Panda said that the Government recognises that transgender persons are valuable human resources for the society and seeks to create an environment that provides them equal opportunities, protection of their rights and meaningful participation in society. The Sweekruti scheme for the welfare of transgender persons is now strengthened with provision of above Government assistance for their hostel facilities and economic activities, he added.

Woman 'killed' for Rs 2 lakh in dowry in Odisha, husband detained

Nayagarh: A woman was allegedly murdered for dowry by her husband and in-laws at Itamati village in Nayagarh district. The deceased has been identified as Phina Pradhan, daughter of Panchu Pradhan of Itamati village and wife of Rocky Pradhan of the same village. According to sources, Phina was married off to Rocky in 2015. At the time of the marriage, her family members met the demands of her in-laws. Some years later, her in-laws allegedly mounted pressure on her to bring more



dowries and due to this, Phina and Rocky often had fights. Her family members alleged that she was killed on June 19; and without informing them, her in-laws took her to the cremation ground and performed the last rites in haste with an intention to do away with the proof. Meanwhile, they have lodged a complaint at

Itamati police station. They along with the villagers demanded arrest of those who are involved in the crime. Acting on the complaint, police detained Rocky for interrogation. "They had asked her to bring Rs 2 lakh from her family. When she denied it, she was beaten to death. Upon getting information, I

reached her house and fainted after seeing her body. When I regained my sense, I found her final rites had already been performed," alleged Panchu Pradhan, deceased's father. "Panchu Pradhan, the complainant, has alleged that his daughter was burnt after murdering her. Acting on the complaint, we registered a case and have launched an investigation. In this connection, we have detained one and soon will apprehend others if their involvement is proved," informed Snehasish Sahoo, SDPO, Nayagarh.

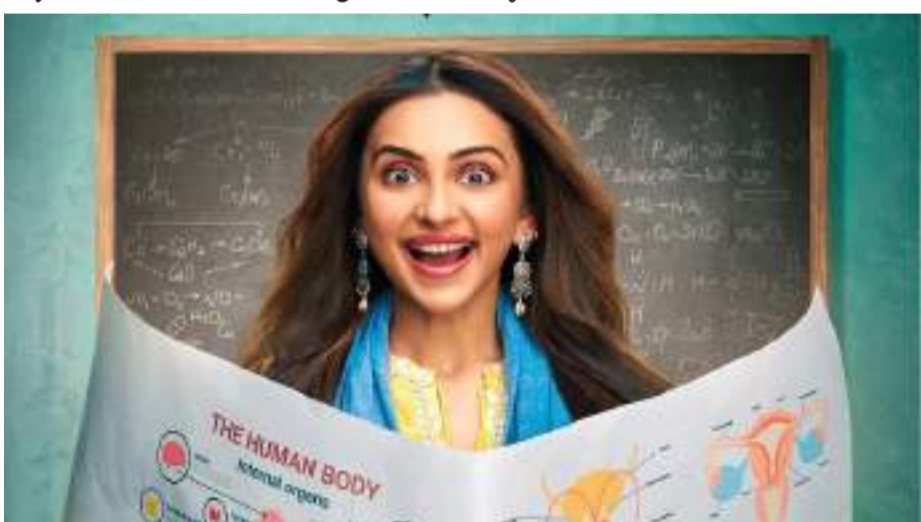

Go first is formerly known as Go Air Lines is an ultra-low-cost carrier (ULCC) started from 2005, which network has spread across globe. Basically, the major income comes from services to the passengers in airlines industry, even the Go Air fails to generate or cover the break-even from last several years. Now the story is the company is fails to pay the debt and trapped into the cash management. The company voluntarily moved to the National Company Law and Tribunal (NCLT) under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) and filed voluntary insolvency under section 10. Moreover, IBC has been passed in 2016 by government of India to address the issues related to insolvency and bankruptcy of individuals, partnership and corporate entity. In addition, IBC code section 10 outlined that the company can submit insolvency resolution process, when it faces the financial difficulties or fails to meet financial obligations, rather than bodies like creditors, rating agency, and other bodies. After receiving application form from the company, the NCLT decides whether the case will be accepts or rejects by appointing interim professionals. It facilitates to the company to take the proactive action to avoid the negative impact of insolvency of their stakeholders as well as shareholders. In case of Go first, the application has been reserved for protection under moratorium by NCLT and lessors are demanding their aircraft by terminating the lease in the other hand.

Go for a water-based foundation, adding a drop or two of water for a lighter coverage. The trend is towards the natural look, with less blush-on. A faint flush would be suitable. Powder blushers are easier to apply and are best for humid weather. Apply on the cheekbones and slightly below it. You can use your fingertips to dot the area with a blusher. Then, blend with the brush, outwards and slightly upwards, making sure there are no harsh lines or a blotchy effect. Using waterproof eye makeup basics (liner, kohl, and mascara) are recommended in rainy

weather to save your makeup from dripping away. First apply a light shadow over the eyelid and a dark one in the crease of the eyes. Light grey on the eyelid would look glamorous. Apply a line of black waterproof eyeliner close to the lashes on the upper lid. Extend the liner

The Centre is in Process of Continuously Upgrading KAVACH system, States Railway Minister

Kolkata, (KCN): After the NDA Government assumes the power in 2014, this is the first time, when such a massive work towards Automatic Train Protection (ATP) or KAVACH system is going on, stated the Railway Minister Shri Aswini Vaishnaw today while interacting with the media at Howrah Maidan Metro station. Shri Vaishnaw was in the city today to inspect the Howrah Maidan to Esplanade stretch of the East-West Metro (Green Line). Shri Vaishnaw added, the ATP is not a technology which can be installed in a day. It requires development. There is a certificate called Safety Integrity Level (SIL)-SIL1, 2, 3 & 4. SIL 4 is the highest order of safety, he pointed out. According to Shri Vaishnaw, KAVACH system was developed in 2016. For developing this system, it requires a



perfect eco-system among the manufacturing of the system including installation, the complexities of the design work- according to the terrains of the country and the suppliers and the like. In 2016, when the KAVACH system was finally approved and tested, the perfect eco-system for developing KAVACH became available. In the beginning, the capacity was 40 kms, per year. And now, the Railways have the capacity of installing for about 2,000 kms. The target is, in the coming few years; we should take this capacity to about 6,000

kms per year, said the minister. The Railway Minister also stated that the capacity of KAVACH is being upgraded continuously. New suppliers, new capabilities are being added, The Railway engineers have to do route radio surveys for ascertaining places where radio signals may be received at the best and also ascertain the locations of the towers. He mentioned that close to 10,000 kms route radio survey is in progress, out of which, 4,000 kms route has already reached the level for designing of detailed project report (DPR) on the basis of which, the installation process may be started. The Union Government is fully committed regarding this, Shri Vaishnaw said, so far as developing the state-of-the-art KAVACH system is concerned.

The Ashes opener saw Australia play the long game with the bat and set defensive fields for England as the hosts undertook risk-prone attacking batting and some bold captaincy calls, which included declaring when Joe Root was well set and unbeaten on 118 on a very flat first-day pitch. "We don't worry too much about the opposition," McCullum said. "I had a bit of an inkling they might try and put some sweepers out, and it's hard to

argue because they won the Test match, right? I'm sure they'll stick solid to that strategy, which I think is great because we'll go a little harder and I think it makes for a really entertaining next few Test matches. "Obviously you'd rather have won the game. But the way that we played, I think it validated our style of play. If we'd have got a little bit of the rub of the green then we might have been on the other side of it. I'm really proud of the boys to be honest. "I thought their application to how we want to play right throughout was superb. A couple of things didn't quite go our way at times... that's the nature of the game, but



we firmly believe, the skipper and I, that this gives us our greatest

chance. "I would be very surprised if there were

too many people who disagree with how we go about playing

because everyone was left entertained. You're not always going to win

and we understand that. We want to keep getting up and throwing punches as a team, and I'm really proud of the way the guys played." McCullum also spoke about Jonny Bairstow, who wasn't at his best behind the wickets during the Test match, but reassured that England aren't looking any other way when it comes to their wicketkeeper. "They were pretty tough mistakes," McCullum said. "I've kept over here before, it's not the easiest place to keep. I actually thought Jonny kept really well right throughout. If you look at the way he progressed throughout the game, he found a natural rhythm.

"We know what he offers with the bat, him coming in at seven is a real weapon for us." On Moeen Ali's finger blister, McCullum was confident that the longish gap between the two Tests will provide enough healing time for the offspinner. "He [Moeen] did a fabulous job," said McCullum. "He's loving being back playing Test cricket... credit to Stokesy and all the boys for making the environment one that you want to be a part of. "Hopefully he'll come right for the next one. I'm pretty confident that over the next few days we can get on top of Mo's finger and that'll give us an opportunity to select him in the next game."

Sunil Chhetri Becomes 2nd Highest Goal-Scorer In Asia After Hat-trick Against Pakistan In SAFF Cup

New Delhi: Indian football team captain and talismanic striker Sunil Chhetri is now the second highest goal-scorer in Asia and fourth highest in international football after his hat-trick against Pakistan in the SAFF Championship tournament opening match in Bengaluru on Wednesday. Chhetri's three goals took his tally to 90 goals from 138 matches and only former Iran footballer Ali Daei has more goals, coming from Asian region, with 109 goals in 148 matches. Chhetri surpassed Mokhtar Dahari of Malaysia (with 89 goals)

to climb to the fourth spot among the highest goal-scorers in international football. Argentina FIFA World Cup-winning legend Lionel Messi (103 goals), Iran's retired player Ali Daei (109 goals) and legendary Portugal striker Cristiano Ronaldo (123) are above Chhetri in the goal-scoring list. Among the active players, Chhetri has the third-most goals by an international player, with only Messi (103 goals) and Cristiano Ronaldo (123 goals) ahead of him. The Indian men's football team ran roughshod over arch-



rivals Pakistan in their opening game of the SAFF Championship 2023, putting four goals past a hapless rival defence at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium in Bengaluru on Wednesday.

Indian skipper Sunil Chhetri led from the front, scoring a hat-trick (10', 16' and 73') followed by Udanta Singh Kumam's goal in the 81st minute. With this win, India has maintained the seventh straight clean sheet against their traditional rivals. India positioned themselves at the top of the points table in Group A, having a better goal difference than Kuwait, who, earlier on Wednesday defeated Nepal 3-1 in the tournament opener. India came into this tournament on the back of its title-winning campaign at the Intercontinental Cup

2023. They are currently placed at 101 in the FIFA rankings. India got off to a fast start and demonstrated their aggressive intent against 195th-ranked Pakistan. India scored their first goal within 10 minutes of the game after Pakistan goalkeeper Saqib Hanif blundered in front of the goal. Saqib Hanif failed to clear the ball quickly after receiving a back-pass and played it into the path of a rushing Sunil Chhetri. The Indian skipper took advantage of the mistake and scored to put India up 1-0.

Rejuvenated England look to be "disruptors" in search of Ashes glory

New Delhi: Two days from one of the most absorbing Ashes contests, the women will be out to script history when Heather Knight & Co. take on Alyssa Healy-led Australia in the first-ever five-day Test at the Trent Bridge in Nottingham to get the Women's Ashes underway. In the absence of Australia's talismanic captain Meg Lanning, who pulled out of the tour due to an undisclosed medical recovery, England will fancy their chances of reclaiming the prestigious trophy, in home conditions, for the first-time since their away triumph on the 2013-14 tour. Since India and South Africa's return to the Test fold, nearly every game played in the last five years has seen precious sessions lost to weather interruptions, forcing draws in some of the most gripping contests in women's limited red-ball rivalry. Taking cognisance, ECB prompted a change making way

for the more conventional five-day Ashes Test. Not just that, the hosts have ditched the traditional Kookaburra ball too, in favour of the Dukes, probably lending a bit of an advantage to England who are yet to beat Australia in any format since the dead-rubber final T20I match of the 2019 Ashes. The focus as such shifts to the personnel. It's not just Australia who have suffered a telling blow before a ball has been sent their way. England are ushering in a whole new era after the retirements of Anya Shrubsole and Katherine Sciver-Brunt over the last 18 months. The inexperienced pace attack will now be spearheaded by Kate Cross, and sharing the new-ball duties with her could be debutant Lauren Filer, who is known to have impressed with her ability to swing the Dukes ball and therefore made the cut ahead of Issy Wong in England's XI



announced on the eve of the game. White-ball veteran Danni Wyatt is all set for Test debut, though it remains to be seen if she gets to open or a middle-order slot. More in focus though will be a rejuvenated England's 'aggressive brand of cricket' under new head coach Jon Lewis, who took charge last December. In an

interview with ECB, on the sidelines of the first men's Ashes Test in Birmingham, Knight admitted to the talks around 'Bazball' in their team setup and taking inspiration from the men's team's approach. Or rather, "Jonball" as Knight put it, insisting that England will have to be the "disruptors" to end Australia's continued dominance.

It may not have exactly worked out for them in the 2023 T20 World Cup, where they were knocked out by hosts South Africa in the semifinal, but England remain committed to their rebranded style of play, breathing new life into this upcoming showdown against 'serial winners'.

Healy, who has worked closely with Lewis at UP Warriorz in the inaugural Women's Premier League earlier this year, would know exactly what the hosts can dish out. She ain't new to captaincy at all, but on this first high-profile assignment in order to manage her workload better - alongside captaincy

and wicketkeeping duties - Healy has hinted at relinquishing the opener's role. The slot could well go to teenage batting sensation Phoebe Litchfield, who is primed to make her Test debut for Australia on the tour. On the other hand, Beth Mooney, with a brilliant hundred in the drawn warm-up game, has locked in the honours as well. Also in line for her Australia debut would be ex-Irish star Kim Garth, while Georgia Wareham could potentially be making her comeback to the multi-day format after the injury-forced gap of two years. The multi-format series will see the historic Test, starting Thursday (June 22), followed by three ODIs, the points from which will also be counted towards the ongoing 2022-25 Women's ODI Championship (IWC) and as many T20Is,

which will lay the groundwork for the next year's World Cup in Bangladesh. Collectively, the points of these seven games will decide whether Australia - the current holders of every trophy/medal imaginable in women's circuit - can go on to retain the trophy for a fifth successive time.
