

## Train Tragedy Toll 288 **Suriname Honors Prez Murmu**

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** After compiling detailed death figures of different hospitals and districts, the final death toll in the Bahanaga train tragedy stood at 288, Chief Secretary Pradeep Kumar Jena said here on Tuesday. Speaking to reporters, Shri Jena said, "We have asked the Balasore Collector to compile the details of bodies recovered from the tracks, who died in the hospitals and the storage houses. After compiling all, the Collector today informed us that the final death toll is 288." Death reports have been collected from the districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur Cuttack, Khurda (Bhubaneswar). Besides, combing was undertaken on 200 feet of both sides of the tracks along the accident site. After that, the final death toll was revised to 288, CS Shri Jena said.



Out of 288 bodies, 193 bodies have been brought to Bhubaneswar through 96 ambulances while 94 bodies have been handed over to the next of kin after proper identification in Balasore itself, he said. Similarly, Shri Jena said, another person who was succumbed to his injuries in Bhadrak hospital has also been handed to his family members at the

hospital. Of the 193 bodies brought to Bhubaneswar, 110 have been identified and handed over to the next of kin so far, he informed. The Chief Secretary said, a total of 205 bodies were identified and handed over till now while the remaining 83 bodies are under the process of identification. As the bodies are in very

bad shape, people are facing difficulty in identifying the bodies. So, body embalming and DNA sampling is being carried out in AIIMS Bhubaneswar so that the family members can get bodies of their loved ones, he added. The state government is providing all kinds of support including free transportation to the victims and their relatives and the expenditure is met from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF), Shri Jena said.

Out of the total deaths, 39 persons have been found to be from Odisha. The Chief Minister has sanctioned Rs 1.95 crore ex-gratia to the next of kin of the deceased persons; Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said. The CMO said 8 people from Bhadrak district, 2 from Jajpur, 14 from Balasore, 9 from

Mayurbhanj, 2 from Khurda, 3 from Cuttack and one person from Keonjhar were killed in the accident. The government has provided Rs 5 lakh ex-gratia from CMRF to the family members of each deceased person. Meanwhile, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) registered a case on Tuesday in connection with the train mishap, after receiving consent from the Odisha government. The case has been registered on the request of the Ministry of Railways, consent of the Odisha Government, and further orders from the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), after the train accident involving Coromandel Express, Yesvantpur-Howrah Express and a goods train at Bahanaga Bazar on June 2, 2023, the CBI informed.

## Balasore Train Tragedy FIR Provides For A Maximum Five-Year Jail Term

**New Delhi:** The FIR filed in the Balasore train tragedy by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) provides a maximum sentence of five years. The FIR has been lodged under sections 337, 338, 304A, and 34 of the IPC and sections 153, 154, and 175 of the Railway Act. Out of all these sections, only Section 153 of the Railway Act provides a maximum sentence of five years, while the other sections have provisions for two years or less of punishment.

The FIR was earlier lodged by the Odisha police but now the probe into the mishap has been taken over by the CBI. "On June 2, at 6:55 p.m. due to collision between Train No-12841 Howrah-Channel Coromandal Express and Train No-12864 Yesbantapur-Howrah Express, the

read the FIR. A CBI team is already present at the train mishap site. It reached Odisha on Monday night. In one of the most horrific train mishap, at least 275 people died while over 800 were injured when 21 coaches of the Coromandel Express, SMVP-Howrah Superfast Express, and a goods train collided and derailed on Friday evening near Bahanaga Bazar Railway station in Balasore, Odisha.

## Odisha Train Tragedy: Culpability Of Railway Staff Not Been Ascertained In FIR, Says CBI

**New Delhi:** The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) said on Tuesday that it has accessed a copy of the FIR lodged in connection with the Balasore train accident that left 275 people dead. The FIR states that the culpability of specific railway employees has not been ascertained at present, and it will be determined during the course of the investigation.

The FIR was filed after a written complaint was submitted by Ranjeet Nayak, OPS SDRPO, Cuttack.

The FIR states that at 6:55 p.m. on June 2, due to a collision between Train No-12841 Howrah-Channel Coromandal Express and Train No-12864 Yesvantpur-Howrah Express, the carriages of both the trains capsized, causing the death hundreds of passengers.

"The bodies of the deceased and injured persons were shifted to DHH Balasore, DHH Bhadrak, CHC Soro, and other hospitals, while rescue operations are still ongoing. Based on this report, which reveals a cognizable case, an FIR has been filed under Sections 337, 338, 304A, and 34 of the IPC and Sections 153, 154, and 175 of the Railway Act," the FIR read.

The FIR also mentions that the specific culpability of railway employees has not yet been determined and it will be established during the course of the investigation. The CBI said that it has registered a case upon the request of the Ministry of Railways and with the consent of the Odisha government.

## Odisha Train Crash: Mamata Banerjee Meets Injured Passengers In Cuttack

**Cuttack:** West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday visited injured passengers of the ill-fated Coromandel Express who are currently admitted in different hospitals in Cuttack. She visited the eye and surgery department of SCB Medical College and Hospital and interacted with the patients and assured them of all possible help. "We are trying to help the injured passengers in all possible ways and had already dispatched teams of doctors, nurses and officers to take care of the injured passengers on the night of the accident on June 2," she told

reporters here. Ms Banerjee said there are 57 injured passengers from West Bengal in SCB Medical College. "Some have lost their limbs, some of them have lost their eyes. It's such a tragedy that cannot be described through words," she told reporters. The Bengal Chief Minister said 103 bodies of passengers from West Bengal who died have so far been identified while 30 were still missing. "I have already announced an ex gratia of ₹ 5 lakh for the next of kin of the deceased and ₹ 1 lakh for the critically injured. Around 900 people who were travelling in the train and



are going through mental and physical stress will be given ₹ 10,000," she said

Ms Banerjee said that she wants the truth behind the crash to come out. "I want to be with

the people. Many lives have been lost and it is very important that the truth comes out," she

added. Ms Banerjee was accompanied by Women and Child Development

minister Shashi Panja and Finance Minister Chandrima Bhattacharjee. Both the ministers visited injured passengers admitted in AIIMS Bhubaneswar. Meanwhile, West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose visited Basanti in South 24-Parganas to meet families of the passengers who died in the triple train accident on June 2. "It is an extremely sad situation. It is a case of human misery. This is the time when one should stand for all and all for one," he told reporters. He said both the State and Central

governments have announced compensations for the victims of the tragedy. The Coromandel Express crashed into a stationary goods train, derailing most of its coaches at 7 pm on June 2. In all some 287 people died in the accident and more than 1200 were injured. A few coaches of Coromandel toppled over the last few coaches of the Bengaluru-Howrah Express which was passing by at the same time. Investigators are looking into possible human error, signal failure and other possible causes behind the three-train crash.

Films like *Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai* or *Kahaani 2* portray horrific tragedies which not only give shivers but also open floodgates to discussions and debates. These films paint a realistic picture of the justice process. Although loaded with repulsive scenes, they act as a powerful tool for social change providing relief to the victims and their families. While POCSO act safeguards the interest of minors, films like these justify the provisions of the act creating awareness about under-reported crimes and abuse. Let's have a look at such films which bring forward the POCSO act and reign supreme due to their unapologetic storytelling:

1. *Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai* [ZEE5] Inspired by true events, 'Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai' is a courtroom drama directed by Apoorv Singh Karki, starring Manoj Bajpayee in and as lawyer P.C Solanki. It is the story of an ordinary man - a high court lawyer who single-handedly fought an extraordinary case against the country's biggest god man and successfully ended up prosecuting him for the rape of a minor under the POCSO act. The film educates the audience about the POCSO [Protection Of Children from Sexual Offenses] act while the trial for justice continues in the courtroom. Through Nu's case of sexual assault, it highlights the key features of the act and the legal framework. *Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai* will surely make you aware of a few facts that were not known to you.
2. *Kahaani 2: Durga Rani Singh* [ZEE5] *Kahaani 2* revolves around a woman named Vidya Sinha and her daughter Mini. Vidya works as a school librarian in a small town and leads a seemingly ordinary life. However, their lives take a dark turn when Mini goes missing. As the investigation unfolds, it is revealed that Mini has been kidnapped and is being held captive. Vidya, determined to find her daughter, teams up with a police officer, Inderjeet Singh. As they dig deeper into the case, they uncover a shocking truth - Mini has been sexually assaulted. It has layers such as media sensationalism, a dishonest defense lawyer and the rapist Aman's father trying to brush off the matter. The story raises ethical questions about why the survivor must pay the price and is a momentous expression of hope for society. The film explores the legalities of a minor rape victim's right to abortion and the POCSO act.
4. *Mardaani 2* [Amazon Prime Video] *Mardaani 2* is set in Kota, Rajasthan where a series of brutal rapes and murders shake the city. It revolves around Superintendent of Police Shivani Shivaji Roy who takes on a challenging case of finding a serial rapist targeting young girls. The film tackles the issue of brutal crimes against women as Shivani is determined to catch the perpetrator and bring him to justice. She faces various hurdles in her pursuit including societal apathy and the

challenging nature of the case. The film serves as a wake-up call, urging society to be vigilant and proactive in protecting children from sexual offences while highlighting the provisions under the POCSO act.

#### WHAT IS INFLATION

Inflation is the rate of increase in prices over a given period of time. Inflation is typically a broad measure, such as the overall increase in prices or the increase in the cost of living in a country. But it can also be more narrowly calculated—for certain goods, such as food, or for services, such as a haircut, for example. Whatever the context, inflation represents how much more expensive the relevant set of goods and/or services has become over a certain period, most commonly a year

#### WHAT IS 'DEFLATION'

Deflation, which is the opposite of inflation, is mainly caused by shifts in supply and demand. When the overall price level decreases so that the inflation rate becomes negative, it is called deflation. It is the opposite of the often-encountered inflation.

Description: A reduction in money supply or credit availability is the reason for deflation

in most cases. Reduced investment spending by the government or individuals may also lead to this situation. Deflation leads to a problem of increased unemployment due to slack in demand.

Central banks aim to keep the overall price level stable by avoiding situations of severe deflation/inflation. They may infuse a higher money supply into the economy to counter-balance the deflationary impact. In most cases, depression occurs when the supply of goods is more than that of money.

#### WHAT IS HYPERDEFLATION

Hyperdeflation refers to extremely large decreases in the general prices of goods in an economy—or, correspondingly large increases in a money's purchasing power. Hyperdeflation is very rare, with perhaps the only example being Bitcoin's quick and meteoric rise in price in a short span of time.

#### WHAT IS DISINFLATION

Disinflation is a temporary slowing of the pace of price inflation and is used to describe instances when the inflation rate has reduced

marginally over the short term. Unlike inflation and deflation, which refer to the direction of prices, disinflation refers to the rate of change in the rate of inflation. Deflation is a decrease in general price levels throughout an economy, while disinflation is what happens when price inflation slows down temporarily. Deflation, which is the opposite of inflation, is mainly caused by shifts in supply and demand.

#### WHAT IS REFLATION

Reflation is a fiscal or monetary policy designed to expand output, stimulate spending, and curb the effects of deflation, which usually occurs after a period of economic uncertainty or a recession. The term may also be used to describe the first phase of economic recovery after a period of contraction. Reflation aims to stop deflation—the general decline in prices for goods and services that occurs when inflation falls below 0%.

Reflation policies typically include: Reducing taxes, lowering interest rates, Changing the money supply. When central banks boost the amount of

currency and other liquid instruments in the banking system the cost of money falls, generating more investment and putting more money in the hands of consumers.

#### WHAT IS STAGFLATION?

Stagflation is an economic cycle characterized by slow growth and a high unemployment rate accompanied by inflation. Economic policymakers find this combination particularly difficult to handle, as attempting to correct one of the factors can exacerbate another. Once thought by economists to be impossible, stagflation has occurred repeatedly in the developed world since the 1970s oil crisis.

#### WHAT IS THE MEANING OF AGFLATION?

Agflation describes the phenomenon when food prices rise more rapidly than the prices of other goods and services, due to the growing demand for crops as both food and for use in biofuels. 1. The word is a portmanteau of the words "agriculture" and "inflation."

It is quite sad to mention that they do not even get minimal wages for backbreaking labour work and minimal medical facilities including any critical care necessary for their survival. Furthermore, due to poor economic condition they are unable to look for private treatment in the adjoining towns and cities, since this is beyond their affordability.

such communities have suffered four decades and very few of the people sitting in administration and coveted places of political interest has listened their unimaginable pain and suffering that they endure everyday of their life. Duties urgent need for developing primary schools, health centres and job skill facilities for the unemployed real youth both male and female in the remote rural villages to provide them some medical support and employment opportunities for these unfortunate communities.

We do talk and discuss and spend hours deliberating on creation of a hunger field world. since you have been working tirelessly for a hunger, free world. However, very little has been achieved for these unfortunate communities, located and isolated in rural pockets across the nation. It is necessary to provide boat financial in medical support for these downtrodden people. Many of these resulting in both deaths and destructive of government and public properties.

Today, however, there is no such traits operating in the area, but the poverty, hunger, and the pain of the downtrodden, and the subalterns continue to hunt these communities. As a citizen of the country, we should feel shy to look into their eyes because as an individual we have failed them. It is time for us to do something for this poor communities as our own community member to help build his country from inside out. Contributions of even a small amount through proper channel via government and non-government agencies can help them sustain in this remote areas far away from the major cities and towns with absolutely zero medical support, poor employment opportunities and any sustainable economic future.

How can you take care of yourself? The day after the attacks, I felt, in this critic situation almost all scribes will stand with me-their senior colleagues and help me to lead me up to justice. Reason: the severity of attacks on a senior journalists like Sagar Suraj in broad day light and his selfless contributions to the society and nation being a journalist in India's national news paper for last 30 years. Locals journalists staged sit-ins on 30th may, 2023 with the rush of social activists and common citizens demanding arresting of assailants. The recent stories "illegal vegetable markets" being operated in Chatauni localities- is supposed to be the reason behind this murderous attack on Sagar Suraj. We demanded only to crack the stories behind the attack after filling a police case against unknown miscreants. One of suspect in the case had old enmity with Sagar Suraj family but he can't claim whether he is involved in the incident or not. Got police assurances to identify culprits, 10 days lapsed but police is still clueless. We have found the images of assailants from CCTV footage but they are yet to be located.

## Kolkata Man Shouts "Bomb" In Plane, Father Called, Says He's Unsound: Report



Kolkata: All passengers were brought down from a plane at the Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata after a man started shouting before take-off that there was a "bomb in the aircraft", airport sources said today. The Qatar Airways flight

to London from Kolkata via Doha with 541 passengers on board was getting ready for take-off at 3:29 am today when one passenger started shouting that there was a "bomb in the plane", the sources told Press Trust of India. All the passengers were brought down from the plane and the aircraft was thoroughly searched by police with sniffer dogs but nothing was found, the sources told Press Trust of India. The CISF detained the passenger who shouted "bomb in the aircraft" and questioned him. During interrogation, the man said that another passenger on the plane told him that there was a "bomb in the plane". The father of the detained man was called to the Airport police station. The father showed some medical documents to police which stated that his son was undergoing treatment for mental illness.

## Tiger population in Sunderban has increased beyond average population

Kolkata (Ambar Mukherjee): The density of tiger population in West Bengal's Sunderbans forests has increased beyond the average population as per square kilometre habitat of the feline, according to a preliminary report of the Wildlife Institute of India (WII). The report says that the carrying capacity is three to five tigers per 100 square km in the hostile terrain. But in multiple blocks of the impenetrable jungles the density has been found to be more than five. The saturation of the population are forcing young adults tigers to move out in search of new territories and weaker ones are moving out to look for a new home with easier hunting skill. The census conducted by the state forest department in 2020-

2021 found 96 tigers in the world's largest mangrove delta. The results of the national tiger census of 2018 had pegged the number of big cats in the Sunderbans at 88. In the 2014 national census, 76 tigers were traced in the zone. The 2022 national census started in the first week of December and still in process. Sources in the state forest department said that the WII report is being prepared on the basis of recent tiger census held by the Bengal forest department. The WII has been engaged for preparing the report following recent incidents of human-wildlife conflict in the zone. An official of the state forest department said at least eight tigers have strayed near the villages in Sunderbans since December last year and all of them

were captured and released in the forest. The WII has advised the state forest department to ensure that the strayed tigers that are captured get released in those parts of the forest that have comparatively low density of the tiger population. The Sunderbans, which houses home for Royal Bengal Tigers, is spread across 10,000 sq km. A little above 4,000sq km is in West Bengal and the rest is in Bangladesh. The Indian Sunderbans is split between the tiger reserve and populated pockets of South 24 Parganas. In Bengal part, around 1,500sq km of Bengal's mangrove delta covers populated areas. The preparation of the final report of the WII will take a couple of months. "Based on the WII's advice, we have released three tigers captured recently in a forest block called Chamta inside the National Park East range of Sunderbans Tiger Reserve. The WII identified the block as a forest compartment with low density of tiger population," said an official of Sunderbans Tiger Reserve. The peak density of tiger population depends on several parameters like prey base, human interference, and male-female ratio of the tigers in a forest, said a forest department official. "The mangrove delta has been ravaged by multiple storms. The pandemic has multiplied manifold of the human interference in the forest because of joblessness of migrant labourers from Sunderbans. # State Care Saves 1200 Lives

Bhubaneswar: Once again Team Odisha, which is working under the 5T Charter's guiding principle, has proved that they can quickly respond and manage any kind of disaster, irrespective of time, size and scope. Within just few hours after the devastated triple train tragedy occurred at Bahanaga, a rural area of Balasore district, entire State Administration starting from the top, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik to the Block and Village-level officials came to swing and saved life of at least 1200 persons who were injured in the mishap. The locals of Bahanga area are the first ones who responded to the accident and started a massive rescue operation without waiting for anyone. This shows how the people of Odisha came together to help others, who are totally unknown to them. This shows a successful story of Odisha Government's community participation

initiatives in Disaster Management. When the news flashed in different media, no one had a clue that such a massive accident would have happened. As a preliminary measure, Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) Satyabrata Sahu quickly ordered the local ORDAF team stationed at Balasore and the local Fire Service team to rush to the spot and join hands in the rescue operation. After receiving information, IGP Eastern Range, Himansu Kumar Lal, Balasore District Magistrate, Dattatraya Bhausaheb Shinde, Superintendent of Police Sagarika Nath and other officials rushed to spot to supervise the rescue operation. They all worked in tandem and saved the situation, said a senior officer of Indian Railways, adding IGP Shri Lal provided the leadership in crucial hours. When the larger picture of the accident came to

notice, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik asked Revenue Minister Pramila Mallik and Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) Satyabrata Sahu to proceed towards the accident spot. Principal Secretary Industries, Hemant Sharma, OMC MD, Balwant Singh, Director Rural Development, Arvind Agarwal, Fire Service DG Sudhanshu Sarangi rushed to the spot and carried out the entire rescue operation throughout the night. Chief Secretary Pradeep Kumar Jena has been closely monitoring the situation from State Headquarters with coordination with all line departments and agencies. A proper supply chain and management structure has been established immediately in the night. The Control Room at the SRC office started functioning with full capacity. All required logistics

like ambulances, flood light, gas cutters, cranes, DG sets, doctors, medicines, stretchers, etc made available quickly at the accident spot. Not only the District Administration of Balasore and Bhadrak engaged in the operation, all other neighboring districts including Mayurbhanj, Jajpur, Cuttack and Khurda came to the rescue of the victims. Sharing details of the massive operation, SRC Shri Sahu said he got information about the accident around 7.55 PM. As he was out of town, he reached the accident site at 11.30 PM. Other Senior officers also rushed to the spot at that time. The Revenue Minister, who was in Jajpur, reached a little early, said sources. "By 12 at night, almost all injured persons, around 1200, had been rescued by local people, ODRAF teams and Fire Service officials. Then, NDRF teams also

reached there and recovered the dead bodies," ACS Shri Sahu said. Within golden hours, the injured persons have been rescued and admitted in hospitals, he said, adding, the most challenging part was to carry out the rescue in the night. Immediately, flood lights were arranged and the entire area was lit, SRC, Shri Sahu said. "Due to a complete team efforts of Administrators, Police, Fire Services, we were able to save 1200 precious lives," the ACS Shri Sahu said. Expressing deep grief over the death of 275 persons in the accident, Principal Secretary Hemant Sharma said, "This was an unfortunate incident. But the death toll could have been much higher, if the Government of Odisha would not have intervened on time." As the ODRAF and Fire Service teams equipped

with all required equipment have reached the accident spot on time, the lives of 1200 people have been saved, he said. "Within the shortest time, we have made all advance arrangements like mobilization of adequate doctors, ambulances, medicines and other essential items. That's why the local hospitals have been able to handle such a huge number of injured persons at one time," the Principal Secretary Shri Sharma said. The State Government did not stop after the rescue operation and admitted the injured in the hospitals. The State Government is now in a mission mode to handover the bodies to their family members and send them home safely and free of cost. The state government will bear the transportation cost of bodies of the triple train accident victims to different states, Chief Secretary Pradeep

Kumar Jena said, Monday. He said 170 bodies out of 275 have so far been identified in Balasore and Bhubaneswar. Shri Jena said, "Arrangements for free transportation of the bodies by hearses to various destinations will be done to help the bereaved families." He added that death certificates will be provided at the earliest and will be sent electronically or through Speed Post to the families of the deceased. The State Government has announced two toll-free numbers - 18003450061/1929 - to help those looking for their missing relatives who were travelling in the ill-fated Coromandel Express June 2. He said people from across the country can dial the numbers to know about the deceased and injured. People coming to Bhubaneswar in connection with the train

accident are being helped by officials at the airport and railway station. Photographs of dead passengers have been uploaded on [srcodisha.nic.in](http://srcodisha.nic.in), [bmc.gov.in](http://bmc.gov.in) and [osdma.org](http://osdma.org) for identification. Also 5 large containers with 40 capacity of each storage are kept standby at AIIMS. Already 3 containers have arrived on the campus of the national institute, he added. The State Government has set up help desks at each hospital and each mortuary and officials are extending all required help to the victims and their family members, said Development Commissioner Anu Garg. "We are showing them pictures of bodies and also a list of passengers undergoing treatment in different hospitals. If someone found their loved one is under treatment in a hospital, we take them to the concerned hospital."

## Medical Devices Policy Approved

Bhubaneswar: The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, today approved the National Medical Devices Policy, 2023. The medical devices sector in India is an essential and integral constituent of the Indian healthcare sector. The Indian medical devices sector's contribution has become even more prominent as India supported the domestic and global battle against COVID-19 pandemic through the large scale production of medical devices & diagnostic kits, such as Ventilators, Rapid Antigen Test kits, Real-Time Reverse Transcription Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) kits, Infrared (IR) Thermometers, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Kits & N-95 masks. The medical devices sector in India is a sunrise sector which is growing at a fast pace. The market size of the medical devices sector in India is estimated to be \$11 billion (approximately, ₹90,000

Cr) in 2020 and its share in the global medical device market is estimated to be 1.5%. The Indian medical devices sector is on a growth track and has an enormous potential to become self-reliant and to contribute towards the goal of universal health care. The Government of India has already initiated implementation of PLI Scheme for medical devices and support for setting up of 4 Medical Devices Parks in the States of Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. Under the PLI scheme for Medical Devices, till now, a total of 26 projects have been approved, with a committed investment of Rs.1206 Cr and out of this, so far, an investment of Rs.714 Cr has been achieved. Under the PLI scheme, total of 14 projects producing 37 products have been commissioned and domestic manufacturing of high-end medical devices has started which include Linear Accelerator, MRI Scan, CT-Scan, Mammogram, C-Arm, MRI Coils, high end X-ray tubes, etc.

Remaining 12 products will be commissioned in near future. Five projects out of total 26 projects have been approved recently, under Category B, for domestic manufacturing of 87 products / product components. Building upon these measures, a holistic policy framework to accelerate this growth and fulfil the potential of the sector is the need of the hour. While various Departments of the Government have undertaken programmatic interventions to encourage the sector, the current policy aims to put in place a comprehensive set of focus areas for growth of the sector in a coordinated manner. Secondly, in view of the diversity and multi-disciplinary nature of the sector, the regulations, skilling trade promotion of medical device industry are spread over several departments in the Government both at the Centre and State levels. There is a need to bring together the range of

interventions in a coherent manner that would facilitate focused and efficient support and facilitation for the sector by the respective agencies. The National Medical Devices Policy, 2023 is expected to facilitate an orderly growth of the medical device sector to meet the public health objectives of access, affordability, quality and innovation. This sector is expected to realize its full potential, with the strategies viz, building an enabling ecosystem for manufacturing along with a focus on innovation, creating a robust and streamlined regulatory framework, providing support in training and capacity building programs and promoting higher education to foster talent and skilled resources in line with the industry requirements. Encouraging domestic investments and production of medical devices complements the Government's 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' and 'Make in India' programs.

## Direct Flights From Bhubaneswar To Singapore, Bangkok

Bhubaneswar: IndiGo airline will operate direct flights from Bhubaneswar to Singapore and Bangkok from June 3, reports said. The airline has provided the schedule to the Biju Patnaik International Airport here for two flights a week to each destination. The state government has agreed to bear the costs of unsold tickets, with total ticket costs estimated to be around Rs 120 crore per year. The international



terminal building at the airport is currently undergoing renovation, with all necessary infrastructure in place. While the old conveyor

belt will initially be used for luggage, a new one will replace it in due course. Immigration and customs facilities are already in place.

The direct flights are expected to greatly benefit Odisha's tourism and create business opportunities, particularly in Southeast Asian countries.

## Smith 'slightly concerned' about Test cricket's future

**New Delhi:** Steve Smith has said that he is "slightly concerned" about the future of Test cricket amidst expanding footprint for franchise-based leagues around the world and urged the cricket boards to keep the format at the forefront.

Speaking in the lead-up to the World Test Championship final, ICC's biennial showpiece event for red-ball cricket, the Australia batter said that he still thinks that Test cricket is in a "good place" at the moment but hoped the format stayed alive and kicking in the time to come.

"Yeah, I am slightly concerned," Smith said. "But yeah, hopefully Test Cricket still stays alive and well. I think it's in a good place at the moment. In terms of some of the games we've seen recently have been pretty amazing. So, yeah, for me as a, I suppose, a traditionalist,



someone that loves Test cricket, I hope it still remains at the front of all the board's minds and stays alive and well for some time to come."

Smith also spoke about how important this WTC final is to him and his team, and how it adds a bit of "relevance" to the format.

"Oh, I mean it's really important. I think the World Test

Championship now, having the two best teams play in a final. I think that's great. It adds a little bit more relevance, I suppose, to Test cricket. So it's what we all work towards for a couple of years. And this week should be an exciting one and yeah the guys are looking forward to it."

## Stokes impressed with Tongue's versatility

**London:** Ben Stokes seemed a happy man while talking about England's latest debutant Josh Tongue who had a fine start to international cricket with a fifer in the second innings. Tongue was a surprise addition to the squad as Stokes and the management stressed on the need for a pace-ful enforcer in the seam attack. The 25-year-old's methods with the ball at different stages in the game have certainly gone down well with Stokes.

"I told him the role that I saw him playing in this team as our third seamer, and used him in a way to get different types of spells out of one bowler," Stokes added.

"His first spell, he came on and bowled really well pitching the ball up. Then we looked to use his pace to use him as the aggressor when we needed to and the wicket got a bit flat. For him to show he's more than one type of bowler does us the world of good as a team going forward, knowing we've found someone else who can fulfil the role of the guys with the extra pace"

With Jofra Archer ruled out for the immediate future and Mark Wood battling fitness concerns, England have been on the lookout for a fast bowler with extra pace, particularly given the sameness of their pace attack

otherwise. In short, they've needed an enforcer who'd add the cutting edge to their bowling attack, particularly when the surfaces aren't offering much for the batters.

While a Test match in England isn't the right sample to judge this, Tongue did do the basics well. Apart from having good pace, Tongue is also blessed with workhorse-like qualities as he has the fitness to bowl long spells. It is a quality that's seldom found with genuine pacers and Stokes was lavish in his praise for the debutant.

"Bowling the long spell yesterday and two long spells today, I wasn't quite sure of



how to manage him so early on," said Stokes. "But I was very, very impressed with the way he just said yes to the plans I wanted him to operate under."

While Tongue's form in the County Championship this season has been underwhelming, he's always been a pacer who has made the

England management sit up and take notice. There is one big achievement that Tongue unlocked during the domestic season, one that

bowlers across the world will envy him for - getting the wicket of Steve Smith.

With the Ashes around the corner, this is a definite boost to his CV, although he surely wasn't picked in the XI for that alone. With a tall frame to work with, Tongue has the ability to generate extra bounce, that too at high pace and it is a combination that can pose a threat for the best of players. However, the first innings didn't exactly go to plan for Tongue who was justly rewarded in the second essay.

"He was very unlucky not to get a wicket in the first

innings but he definitely reaped the rewards [in the second]," Stokes said. "The way he bowled contributed to the five wickets he got in that innings because they were already on the back foot against him, knowing he's got that extra bit of pace. He can bowl 90mph full and short, so he was sort of one step ahead in the second innings already because of how he bowled in the first innings."

"I kept it simple," Stokes said. "I told him to just run in and do what you do - and then I'll worry about the rest of the stuff. Let the lad go out and bowl in the way that's got him here in the first place."
