Odisha Gets New Sainik School

New Delhi(KCN): Odisha gets a new Sainik School with the Ministry of Defence (MoD) has approved setting up of such a School in Dhenkanal in partnership with private school. The new Sainik School will be set up in partnership with the Sanskar Public School (Abakash Foundation), sources said. The Ministry has approved a total of 21 new

youth to become responsible citizens of tomorrow, the ministry said.

Out of the total news approved schools, 17 of these schools are Brownfield running schools and 4 are Greenfield schools to be operational shortly.

While NGOs, Trusts and Societies have a share of 12 approved new schools, 6 private Schools and 3 State Government owned schools find place in the list of such approved new Sainik Schools.

Unlike existing Sainik Schools which are purely residential in nature, 7 new Sainik Schools are Day School and 14 such new approved schools have residential arrangements. These new Sainik Schools, besides their affiliation to respective education boards, will function under the aegis of Sainik Schools Society and will follow the Rules and Regulations for new Sainik schools in partnership mode prescribed by the Society.

In addition to their regular affiliated board curriculum, they will also impart education of Academic PLUS curriculum to the students of Sainik school pattern. Details pertaining to the modalities of operation of these schools are available at www.sainikschool.ncog.gov.in. Willing students and parents are invited to visit the web portal and take advantage of this novel opportunity.

The admission into the new Sainik School pattern in these schools will be at class VI level only on the following lines.

At least 40 percent of intake in class VI will be from candidates who have qualified the All-India Sainik School Entrance Examination conducted by NTA through E-Counselling. Upto 60 percent intake will be from students enrolled in the same school and desirous of taking admission under this vertical of new Sainik Schools through a qualifying test, notification for which will be issued separately.



Sainik Schools including the one in Odisha, in partnership with NGOs, Private schools and State Governments.

These schools will be set up in the initial round of the Government's initiative of setting up of 100 new Sainik schools across the country in partnership mode. They will be distinct from the existing Sainik Schools, the Ministry said in a statement on Saturday.

The objectives behind setting up of 100 new Sainik Schools is to provide quality education to the students in tune with National Education Policy and give them better career opportunities, including joining the Armed Forces.

Odisha civic polls: 110 sensitive booths in Bhubaneswar

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Around 7.25 lakh voters will exercise their franchise in the elections to Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) to decide the fate of 12 mayor candidates and 289 corporator candidates in 67 wards. The State Election Commission has stressed on security arrangements at 110 sensitive booths identified in the city and its periphery. According to Commissionerate Police, out of 705 booths where polling will take place, around 15 per cent are sensitive booths where security arrangements have been tightened.

Following the pre-poll violence in Laxmisagar, security measures have been beefed up in some of the polling stations in wards 32 and 33. Apart from 30 platoons police force and 55 mobile patrolling units, around 500 additional police personnel will be deployed in the city to maintain law and order. Sulochana Das is the Mayor face of BJD, while Suniti Mund is contesting for the post for BJP. Congress has fielded Madhusmita Acharya. Meanwhile, the Khurda administration announced closure of all educational institutions in the district on Thursday.

On the career front, Kajal is keenly looking forward to the release of "Paris Paris", the Tamil remake of Kangana Ranaut's "Queen".

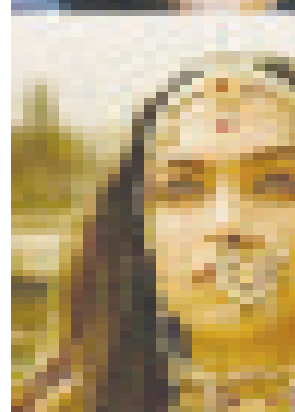
"Paris Paris" will be Kajal's first release of 2019.

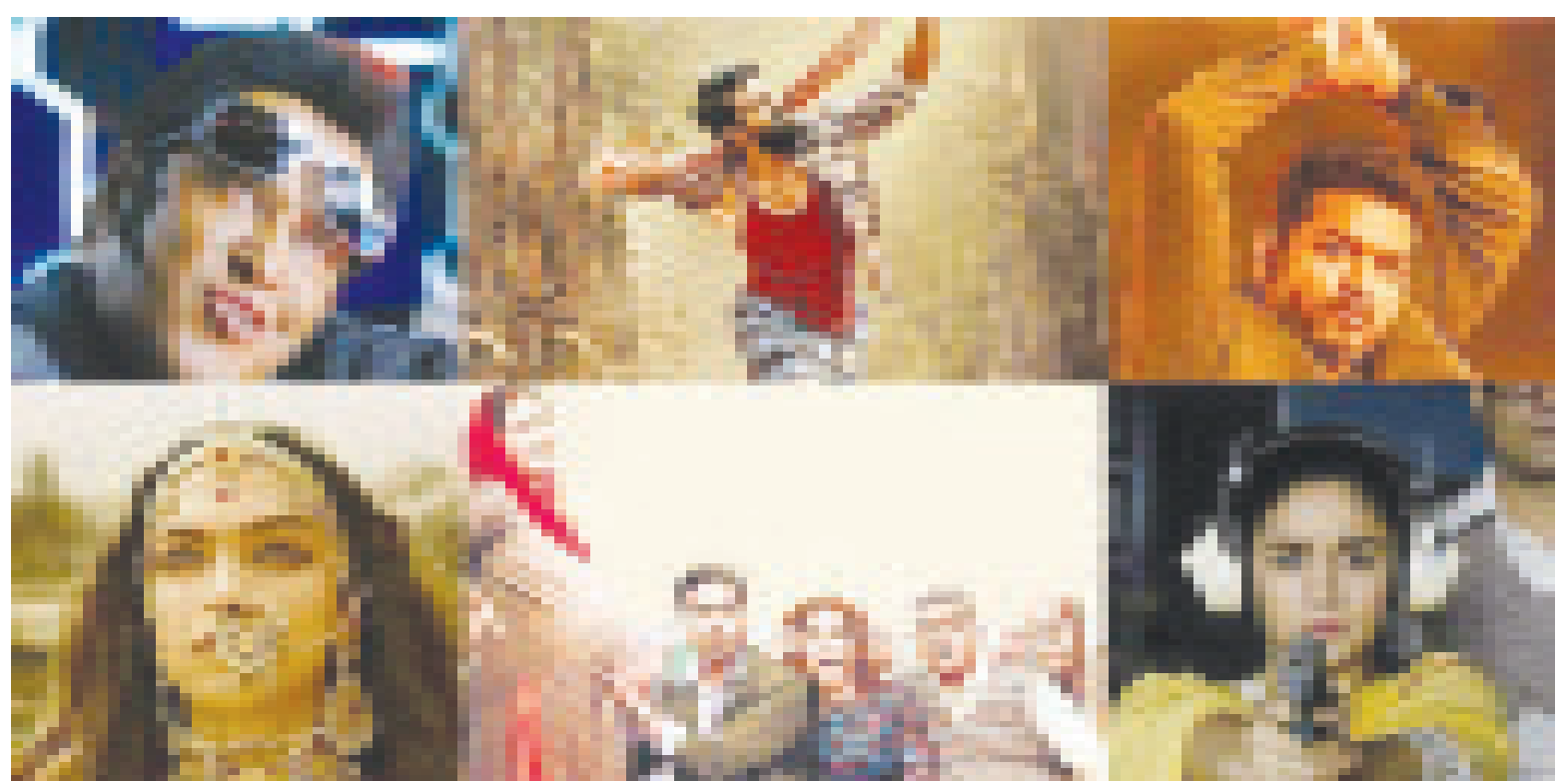
Just 'normal' to exclude women in decision making process: Adil Hussain

Relevance of Digital Evidence in Income Tax: Part 1

1. Introduction:

The Income tax department has started Faceless assessments and Faceless appeals as announced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister. Already lost of the taxpayers are required to furnish their Income Tax Return as well as Tax Audit Reports electronically. The appeal before the CIT (Appeals) is also required to be e-filed. The Notices are issued by Income Tax Department by email and such Notices are



considered as valid service of Notice. In Income tax Search also gathering of Digital evidence is becoming powerful tool for the Income Tax Department in its efforts against tax-evasion.

Digital evidence helps to lay hands on past activity & transactions and also help in gathering evidence of illegal and unlawful activity. However, the steps should be taken to maintain integrity of the data so that digital evidence collected may be admissible in Courts. Digital evidence, which is ephemeral, also poses problems in course of survey, search and seizure. Problems are posed in recovery of deleted data are the challenges which law enforcement agencies tackle with help of experts. Digital evidence are credible evidences similar to paper documents/evidences. As these are of diverse and hi-tech nature and available in different form of software and programmed form, these are generally stored in various digital storage devices like Harddisks, CD & DVD Media, USB Pen-drives, Flash drives, USB i-Pods, USB MP3 players, Floppy Media, Mobile SIM cards, Memory Card as well as internal memory of devices.

2. Definition of Books of accounts include books maintained/kept in electronic or digital form[Section 2(12A)] as modified by the Finance Bill, 2022 (as passed by Lok Sabha):

Section 2(12A) of Income-tax Act defines the meaning of 'books or books of account'. It includes ledgers, day-books, cash books, account books and other books, whether kept in the written form or as print-outs of data stored in: a) Floppy, b) Disc,

c) Tape; or d) In any other form of electro-magnetic data storage device.

The Finance Bill has amended this definition to include books of account kept in electronic form or in digital forms as well. This will now cover books of account maintained and stored in software installed on a computer or maintained and stored on a cloud or website. The amended definition is having larger scope now.

3. What is Digital Evidence:

Digital evidence or Electronic Evidence is any probative information stored or transmitted in digital form that may be used before the Income-tax authorities and Courts.

Section 79A of the Information Technology

(Amendment) Act 2008 defines electronic form of evidence as "any information of probative value that is either stored or transmitted in electronic form and includes computer evidence, digital audio, digital video, cell phones, digital fax machines" The main characteristics of the digital evidences are:

- It is latent as fingerprints and DNA
- Can transcend national borders with ease and speed
- Highly fragile and can be easily altered, damaged or destroyed and also time sensitive. For these reasons, special precautions should be taken to collect, preserve and examine such evidence.

4. Relevance of Digital Evidence for the purpose of Income Tax:

As far as Income-tax Act, 1961 is concerned, it has been amended thrice by way of Finance Act, 2001, Finance Act, 2002 and Finance Act, 2009 respectively. By way of first amendment by the Finance Act, 2001, provisions of section 2(12A) was inserted to give legal recognition to the books of account maintained on computer and section 2(22A) was inserted to provide definition of 'document' which now includes- electronic record as defined under Information Technology Act 2000.

5. Digital Devices:

Sources for Digital Evidences The use of digital devices in day to day life has increased tremendously. Accordingly, we may come across a wide range of the digital evidence which include E-mail word processing documents, data base tables, files saved from accounting programmes, digital photographs, ATM transaction logs, instant message histories, internet browser histories, the contents of computer memory, computer back-up, global positioning system tracks, digital video or sound files, data stored in mobile telephones and the data stored in all types memory storage devices.

For easy understanding, a compilation of various devices and the potential evidences, these devices may contain, is provided below:

- Desktop Computer:** The device contains all the files and folders stored including deleted files and information which may not be seen normally. Analysis of key document files like word documents, excel files, email's, tally data may help in unearthing potential evidences. Retrieval of deleted files using Cyber Forensics can help get key evidences that have been destroyed.
- Pen Drives:** The pen drive stores many files and may be hidden easily. In many cases the parallel books of accounts maintained as tally data or excel sheets are kept in Pen Drives that can be easily hidden

c) Hard Drives

The device stores many files and may be hidden

easily. Backup of earlier years may be kept and may be easily hidden.

d) Mobile Phones (Smart Phones), Electronic Organizer, IPAD, Personal Digital Assistant and other Handheld Devices:

Much information can be obtained from the devices like Address Book, Appointment calendars/information, documents, emails, phone book, messages (Text and Voice), video recording, email passwords etc. Many applications like CHAT, Whatsapp application can store many crucial conversations important for the investigations. Remittances and transactions are done by fund transfer through mobile phone service providers utilizing money deposited with the latter bypassing banking channels. A person may do all his business through a mobile phone without any computer or laptop or warehouse for his inventory – as example, online business platform www.amazon.com maintains huge warehouse at several places in India where online traders can store their merchandise. In such cases the trader may make all transactions through mobile phone and store in small external microchips making detection difficult.

e) Smart cards, Dongles and Biometric Scanners: The device itself enables to understand the user level access to various information and places.

f) Display Monitor (CRT/LCD/TFT etc), Screens of Mobile Phones (if switched on): All the graphics and files that are open and visible on the screen in the switched on systems can be noted as electronic evidence. This evidence can be captured only in video, photographs and through description to be noted in seizure memos

g) Answering Machines: The device can store voice messages and sometimes, the time and date information about when the message was left. It may have details such as last number called, memos, phone numbers and names, caller identification information and also deleted messages.

h) Local Area Networks (LAN) Card or Network Interface Cards: The device itself is a digital evidence and may contain crucial evidences.

i) Modems, Routers, Hubs and Switches: The device may contain details of IP addresses, where the actual data is stored.

j) Servers: These contains crucial data on business related applications like SAP, ERP, CRM, Mail Servers. The device is a potential evidence for pulling out audit logs using forensic analysis. Analysis of emails of key persons from Mail Servers can help in finding crucial evidences required for the case.

k) Removable storage devices like SD Cards

in Mobile phones: All new generation phones use these and store files in which evidence can be found.

l) Scanners and Copiers: The device itself, having the capability to scan may help prove illegal activity like making bogus bills etc. Copiers may also contain stored data which can be used as crucial evidences.

m) Digital Cameras: The device can be looked for images, videos, sounds, removable cartridges, time and date stamps.

n) CD/DVDs : The device stores many files which may contain the evidence

o) Fax Machines: The device stores some documents, phone numbers, send/receive logs that can contain the evidence.

p) Pagers: The device can be looked for address information, Text message and phone numbers

q) Global Positioning Systems (GPS): The device may provide travel logs, home location, previous destinations etc which may be crucial in finding places where evidences may be stored.

r) Cloud Data Servers: The device is available on all smart phones and tablets. The Cloud may be used to store hidden data where crucial evidences may be stored. Some enterprises offer service for storage of commercial data in servers located in foreign countries and business data are stored there through internet – which can be accessed as per terms and conditions.

From the digital devices, two types of evidences may be gathered, one is persistent evidence and other is volatile evidence:

i) Persistent evidence is the data that is stored on a local hard drive and is preserved when the computer is turned off. For example, Documents (word, slide, sheet, pdf etc.), Images, Chat log, Browser history, Registry, Audio / Video, Application, Email, SMS / MMS, Phone book, Call log etc.

ii) Volatile evidences: It may include any data that is stored in memory, or exists in transit, that will be lost when the computer loses power or is turned off. For example, Memory, Network status and connection, Process running, Time information. It is to be noted that in certain cases, where volatile evidence is crucial, switching off a switched on system may result in destruction of volatile evidence. (Contd.)

The fading Trinity

leadership knows it is frequently biting dust in every election. Not only with the BJP but its fights against the regional parties have also been hitting its prospects hard. The party began to shrink into its delicate self, unable to withstand the consistent electoral debacles. It is important for the Congress leadership to take its last shot from the quiver to cure the party before it takes its last breath. You may call this situation the party's existential crisis. It must be unthinkable for the party which ruled India for decades, falling into the level of a complete insignificance and oblivion. Everything started in 2014 and the Congress had the harshest of the falls that it ever had. The Modi juggernaut was the blow that left it with broken bones and bleeding skin giving it nightmares on a daily basis. The Congress is still unable to scale the unfathomable depth into which it has fallen. Its complete dependence on the trinity from the dynasty for years remains a bitter reality. It probably sees nothing but darkness without the dynasty. The trinity understands the party's compulsions and the leadership circling the orbit of servitude around the trinity also understands it well.

Don't get misguided by the use of the word trinity here multiple times. It is the mother and children representing the Nehru-Gandhi dynasty that the Congress is destined to lean on. The party's headquarters at the 24 Akbar Road in New Delhi these days is gloomy and remorseful for various reasons. Every election brings the party a reason to recollect, recompose and regret. The main reason is its failure but its inability to find the reality behind its rigidity must be driving its leadership crazy. The

party establishment is trying to knock on the doors of political strategists like Prashant Kishor to find a calculable and viable solution in the direction of its revival. Spending most of her life between the walls of her residence, Sonia Gandhi began to assume a role in political life after the death of her husband Rajiv Gandhi. Her stint as the party president from April 1998 was full of political experiments and expectations. No doubt, the lady with limited idea about the impulses that India was, managed to pull her party a long way through ups and downs. More than two decades of her presidency was accepted and appreciated at times and critically put for evaluation. She could metaphorically make the historic sacrifice that she is reported to have made denouncing the chair of the country's prime minister. For an enthralled Congress leadership, she was the incarnation of divinity in its femininity capable of transforming the party's destiny unchallenged, unparalleled and unbreakable. The dynasty's pursuit of finding an heir apparent to hold the heaviness of the grand old party naturally directed its fingers on Rahul Gandhi. A natural choice for the party, the young and dynamic Rahul Gandhi, with his visibly scanty maturity to run a complexity such as Congress had trembled, stumbled and mumbled while experiencing the storm that the people of the country described- the saffron tide.

It was not only Modi that Rahul Gandhi and the trinity had to take on. The gigantic Sangh Parivar, with its ideological intricacies essentially confusing and complicated to the dynasts, stretched its wings everywhere. Still unable to fathom the depth and veracity of the narratives that the Parivar scripted

against the party, the trinity frequently convulsed in confusion. The second innings of Modi could shatter the influence of the Sonia, Rahul and Priyanka trinity almost completely. The recently held elections in the five states came as a testimony for the Congress and its unquestionable trinity coming face to face seeking answers to the uncomfortable questions that the G-23 has been asking. The dynasty, habituated to swallow praises in full length from the planets surrounding it in the orbits of servitude and surrender, began to see irritable goose bumps giving it itchy tickles. Without wasting time, unconventional to the principle of the dynasty, it offered to make a 'sacrifice' of the highest order in the form of resignation which the planets in the CWC rejected outrightly. The unquestionable dominance of the Nehru-Gandhi family remained for decades and the Congress is still running the train on the same track consecrated by the dynasts. The party's experiment in Uttar Pradesh with the third person in the dynasty, Priyanka Vadra had an unpleasant ending. It collapsed in all seats except in two where it managed to gain a skinny majority. The Congress and the dynasty waited for long before they decided to bring the Vadra brand to the forefront. As of now the party and the trinity are convinced to the extent of realizing that the revival of the Congress is an uphill task and there is no presentable face except those sunken three in the dynasty that could do anything to satisfy the party's withering hopes. Now the party is left with no choice but to compulsively repose its faith in the family after every defeat with no murmur of discontent. Though there are demands for a reliable titivation inside the party, its leadership is clueless as to what should be the strategy in case of it nosedives in the coming elections. The BJP, with its massive political machinery, is all set to win the 2024 general elections and the state elections that are due including the one in Gujarat. The Congress on the other hand is banking on its fading trinity.

Nasi-1 and 2 islands of 5 km is an ideal nesting strip for the turtles because of no presence of predators and human habitation. The mass nesting would continue for a week, as the eggs normally take 45 days to hatch. Then the tiny hatchlings make their way to the sea, the forest officer explained.

The forest officer informed that about 30 forest officials including forest guards are guarding

the beach to protect turtles and their eggs. The state government imposed a ban order on fishing activities inside the Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary from Nov 1 to May 31 to protect the turtles. Gahirmatha was declared a marine sanctuary covering 1435 square kilometers from Dhamra mouth to Hukitola island in 1997 by the government.

4 lakh voters stayed away from elections in Bhubaneswar

BHUBANESWAR: Over four lakh voters abstained from exercising their franchise in the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) polls. While the State Election Commission (SEC) had informed on Thursday that

While political observers said the voter turnout was poor due to less participation of middle and upper class, educated and elite sections, Opposition BJP and Congress blamed the ruling dispensation for the low turnout.

BJP Bhubaneswar president Babu Singh alleged that the goof-up in preparation of the voters list in which names of members of most of the families were split to different wards resulted in the poor turnout. "This was done by the BJD government deliberately to discourage voters from exercising their franchise," Singh said.

Congress leaders also raised the same issue. Both BJP and Congress claimed that poor arrangements for the voters in booths was another reason behind low voter turnout.

BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty, however, rubbished the Opposition claims and said though some voters faced the inconvenience in the process of finalisation of the voters list, both BJP and Congress are deliberately trying to politicise the issue as they are aware of losing the elections. "It is an attempt on their part to justify the loss they are going to face in the ULB polls," Mohanty said.



the polling in the BMC elections was around 50 per cent, it revised the turnout to 43.30 per cent, almost the same compared to the previous ULB polls in 2013, on Friday.

As per the statistics shared by the officials, out of 7,25,765 eligible voters in BMC jurisdiction, only 3,14,268 turned up for voting. The statistics suggest that 43.33 per cent male, 43.55 per cent female and 11.30 per cent voters of transgender community exercised their franchise. Ward 4 recorded the highest voter turnout of 70.09 per cent.

After panchayats, BJD does an encore in urban areas

BHUBANESWAR: It's been a yet another BJD show across the urban landscape of Odisha. After the landslide win in panchayat elections, the ruling party has done an encore in the municipal elections, winning one urban local body after another.

In Mayurbhanj district, it captured three chairman posts while one went to BJP. Ruling party's Krishna and Mohanty won the Baripada chairman post by 9,609 votes, defeating BJP's Kavibishnu Narayan Satpathy. In Udala Notified Area Council (NAC), BJP chairman candidate Pramila Panda won by 866 votes defeating Ranjita Banerjee

PSU disinvestment: SEBI proposes relaxing provisions for open offer price determination

NEW DELHI: Markets watchdog Sebi also come against the backdrop of the government's such developments", it noted. sory Committee. Now, the regulator



has proposed changes to the mechanism for determining open offer price with respect to disinvestment of public sector undertakings. Issuing a consultation paper on review of the determination of offer price in case of disinvestment of public sector undertakings (PSUs), the regulator said the move is aimed at relaxing certain provisions, including doing away with the requirement of taking into account 60 days' volume-weighted average market price for calculating the offer price. Comments from the public have been sought on the consultation paper till April 15.

The proposal to amend the provisions

government planning to sell stakes in more companies.

Noting that strategic disinvestment of PSUs is at variance with privately executed agreements, Sebi in the consultation paper said the announcement of private transactions is made only upon execution of binding agreements and thus there is not much impact on the traded price of such target companies.

In the case of PSUs' strategic disinvestment, "Information comes in the public domain at the time of Cabinet approval and subsequent announcements are also made at different stages and thus the market price of the PSU concerned gets highly susceptible to

For such stake sales, the acquirer will be identified only after the shortlisting of bidders, which may be months or years late since the date when the information was first in the public domain.

As a result, "the prospective acquirer shall be chasing a moving open offer price as the market price tends to rise pursuant to announcement of the divestment and various stages thereafter and thus its liability for open offer obligations may constantly increase till the execution of agreement of the PSU with the acquirer," the consultation paper issued on Friday said.

The issue was discussed by Sebi's Primary Market Advi-

has proposed that "in case of disinvestment of PSU companies, the requirement of 60 days' volume-weighted average market price-based parameter for calculation of offer price, may be dispensed with".

In case such PSU companies have stakes in other companies and due to such disinvestments an indirect acquisition is triggered, the requirement of 60 days' volume-weighted average market price-based parameter can also be dispensed with, as per Sebi.

"The acquirer shall disclose upfront the negotiated price for both direct acquisition as well for indirect acquisition," it added.

Fuel price hike: FM 'invokes' Nehru

NEW DELHI: Under attack from the opposition over increase in fuel prices, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman 'invoked' the country's first prime minister Jawahar Lal Nehru to justify the hikes.

Sitharaman read Nehru's speech from the 1950s in Hindi, where the former prime minister had blamed the Korean War for inflation in the country. She argued that if Nehru could blame war in Korea for the rise in prices in the 1950s, when India was not as well connected with the world as now, why would the Russia-Ukraine war not impact prices today.

The finance minister was responding to debates over the Finance Bill 2022 in Lok Sabha. The FM, however, hinted that the government has no role in increasing fuel prices and it is up to the oil marketing companies to decide the hike in price. She said that OMCs take a call on fuel price based on their 15-day average price.

After keeping prices of petrol and diesel on hold for four months, the fuel re-

tailers have increased cumulatively Rs 2.40 in the country in the past one week. The price of petrol and diesel was on halt be-



tween 4 November 2021 and 21, March 2022 in the country despite high crude prices in the international market.

Responding to the discussion on the Finance Bill, the FM refuted the opposition allegation that the government is increasing the tax burden on the common man. Taking a dig at Congress, the FM said it was the Indira Gandhi government in 1970 that had increased the marginal income tax rate to 93.5%.

cured majority in 95 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). Of the 108 ULBs, including the Municipal Corporation of Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Berhampur, the regional party got 76 chairpersons and mayor posts followed by BJP with 16 posts, Congress 7 and Independents in 9 places.

As this time there was direct elections for the posts of Chairpersons and Mayors following amendment in the municipal laws, the party could win 76 ULBs.

But practically, the regional political party candidates contesting for the post of Councilors and Corporators won a large number in 95 of the 108 ULBs.

In the panchayat elections held last month, the BJD had also captured 90% seats in Zilla Parishads.

Though the State Election Commission (SEC) had conducted elections for 109 ULBs on March 24, the results of 105 municipalities/notified area councils (NACs) and three municipal corporations of Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Berhampur were declared on Saturday. The counting of votes could not be held at Dhamnagar Notified Area Council (NAC) due to some reason, sources said.

Similarly, out of 1,716 councillor seats in the 105 municipalities and NACs, the BJD has won 1,175 seats, BJP got 288, Congress — 134, BSP — 1, CPI — 1, and Independent — 117.

Out of 67 Corporator seats in the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC), the BJD won 48, BJP got 10 and the Congress is in third position with 9.

During the 2021-22 financial year, over 18 crore person-days of works have been achieved till February. Over Rs 700 crore was spent under MUKTA scheme.

Around 31 lakh pucca houses have been completed since 2014-15 with an expenditure of Rs 31,000 crore while 12.25 lakh eligible households have been identified for coverage under different rural housing schemes. The system of incentive to the beneficiaries has set an example for other states to emulate.

In its target to achieve universal coverage of tap-water connections, as many as 63 civic bodies have already achieved 100% household connections in the state while Bhubaneswar and Cuttack have achieved 100% household connections in the entire country.

Besides, Puri is the only city in India to have achieved the distinction of joining the prestigious league of international cities like New York, London, Singapore and Tokyo of ensuring 24x7 supply of directly drinkable water rom tap under the Sujal plan.

Under slum upgradation and delisting activities, around 1.70 lakh families have already been granted land rights certificates and eight cities have already achieved slum free status. The state government has also planned a new programme—Biju Adarsh Colony programme that aims transforming slums to model colonies. Petrol, diesel price up by 80 p each; 3rd hike in a week

NEW DELHI: Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) on Friday again hiked prices of petrol and diesel by 80 paise each for the third time in a week. Following the hike on Friday, petrol will now cost Rs 97.81 and diesel will be available at Rs 89.07 per litre in the national capital region (NCR).

In the last one week, the fuel retailers have increased cumulatively Rs 2.40 in the country. The price of petrol and diesel was on halt between 4th November 2021 and 21st March 2022 in the country despite high crude prices in the International market.

During this period, the Brent Crude Future, the benchmark of global crude price, even touched the highest

\$139 per barrel on 7 March 2022. The prices were then revised by the fuel retailers on both diesel and petrol by 80 paise per litre on 21 March and by the same amount again on 22 March.

Moody's Investors Service in its study highlighted that Oil



Marketing Companies have lost around \$2.25 billion in revenues from 5th November to 21st March. This is the period when these retailers stopped revising fuel prices despite high crude prices in the international mar-

ket. Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) are incurring around \$70 million in daily losses on petrol and diesel sales. Thus, experts

believe that the hike on transport fuel is on expected lines and, in fact, more hikes are expected. "Retail fuel prices of petrol and diesel have been kept unchanged since November 2021, whereas global crude

oil prices rose by close to \$30 per barrel during this period. The pass-through of rising crude oil prices to domestic fuel prices is, therefore, inevitable, and further hikes can also be expected," said Dipti Deshpande, Principal Economist, CRISIL.

Salah's turn as Egypt beats Senegal in 1st leg of WC playoff

CAPE TOWN: Mohamed Salah had his say this time as Egypt beat Sadio Mané's Senegal 1-0 in the first leg of their World Cup playoff. Salah's early shot in Cairo on Friday cannoned off the crossbar, hit Senegal, defender, Saliou Ciss, and went in to give Egypt a slim advantage over the newly crowned African champion to take to the second leg in Senegal on Tuesday. The Salah-Mané international rivalry continued six weeks after the Liverpool teammates met in the final of the African Cup of Nations in Cameroon. Then, Mané hit the winning penalty in a shootout to give Senegal its first major title as Salah watched on helpless. Egypt started the playoff at breakneck speed at Cairo International Stadium and the own goal from Ciss came in the fourth minute. Salah sprinted away after it went in and was mobbed in the celebration by just about every player from the Egypt bench.

There was a redemption of sorts for Algeria, too. The Algerians returned to the same stadium where they were dumped out of the African Cup in the group stage as defending champion to clinch a crucial 1-0 away win over Cameroon in the



first leg of their playoff. Striker Islam Slimani scored with a header in the first half at Japoma Stadium in Douala, justifying his promotion to the starting lineup. Cameroon goalkeeper André Onana got a hand to the header but pushed it only onto the crossbar and watched the ball drop into the goal behind him. Arsenal's Kieran Tierney, left, and Liverpool's Sadio Mane battle for the

ball during the English Premier League soccer match between Arsenal and Liverpool at Emirates Stadium in London. (Photo | AP) Cameroon was playing its first game under a new coach and former national captain Rigobert Song,

who was brought in to replace Toni Conceicao despite Conceicao leading Cameroon to a fairly impressive third place at the African Cup. The debut didn't go according to plan for Song, and Cameroon must come from behind in the second leg in Blida to reach the World Cup in Qatar and extend its African record to eight World Cup appearances. Algeria hardly ever loses at home. The playoffs will decide

the five African teams to play at the World Cup in Qatar and could erase those painful African Cup memories for Egypt and Algeria. Tunisia claimed a crucial 1-0 away win over Mali in scorching hot Bamako to give it the advantage in their tie. That victory came largely thanks to a dire personal performance from Mali defender Moussa Sissako, who gave Tunisia its winner with a calamitous own goal in the 36th minute. Sissako's attempted pass back was nowhere near goalkeeper Ibrahim Mounkoro and bounced over the goal-line as Sissako watched his error with hands-on head. Sissako then made Mali's task almost impossible when he was sent off four minutes later. Morocco's 1-1 draw in Congo made it a strong night for the North African challengers, although it would have been even better for the Moroccans if Ryan Mmaee hadn't fired a

second-half penalty way over the crossbar. Tarik Tissoudali ultimately equalized for Morocco with a fierce first-time shot after forward Yoane Wissa scored an early opener for Congo, which is trying to qualify for the World Cup for the first time since its only previous appearance as Zaire in 1974. Defender Ngonda Muzinga was sent off for Congo late in the game. Ghana and Nigeria drew 0-0 in Ghana. The second legs are all on Tuesday.

Swiatek clinches No1 ranking, wins debut at Miami Open

MIAMI GARDENS: Iga Swiatek started her week by deciding that she wanted to set her sights on becoming the No 1 player in the world, without knowing how long that quest would take. A few days and one surprising retirement later, mission accomplished. Women's tennis has a new name atop its rankings, a 20-year-old who — now that Ashleigh Barty has retired and asked to vacate her No 1 spot on the world list — becomes the first Polish player to hold that distinction. Swiatek's ascension was clinched Friday night with a 6-2, 6-0 win over Viktorija Golubic of Switzerland in the second round of the Miami Open. Swiatek becomes the 28th different woman to hold the No 1 ranking since the computerized system debuted in November 1975. Her rise has been steady and constant; she ended 2016 ranked No 903, cracked the top 500 for the first time in 2018, ended 2020 ranked No. 17, then was No 9 when last year ended. Barty revealed her retirement decision on Wednesday, and as part of that said she wanted to be removed from the rankings. Swiatek and Badosa bucked a

wild trend in Miami — where seeded women's players have had serious struggles. There were 32 seeds entering the tournament, and more than half of them are gone before the third round even gets started. Coco Gauff is one of the few exceptions. The 14th-seeded American, whose home is about a 45-minute drive north from where she's playing this event, got past Wang Qiang of China 7-5, 6-4 on Friday — avenging a first-round loss to her in the Australian Open earlier this year. "I feel like playing at a home crowd you either can get nervous playing in front of your family,
