



No proof to link Netflix's '13 Reasons Why' to high US suicide rates: Study

CN): Contrary to the findings of a 2019 study that associated the Netflix series "13 Reasons Why" with an increase in monthly suicide rates among youth after the show's release, a new

on the show having an effect on boys,' said study author Dan Romer and research director of the Annenberg Public Centre Policy (APPC) from the University of Pennsylvania in the US. The reanalysis found that the increase in the suicide rate for boys observed in the original study by Jeffrey Bridge and colleagues for three months after the series' release was no longer evident after controlling for the

ongoing trend in ado-

lescent suicide.

In addition, the increase seen during the first month of the release began the month prior to the release, making it difficult to attribute the rise to the show. The reanalysis found no effects in the subsequent months of that year.

The original time-series analysis of suicide rates found an additional 195 suicide deaths among boys ages 10 to 17 during the nine months following the series' release, on March 31, 2017, but did not find a similar result among adolescent girls.

Romer said he questioned that finding for two reasons: "First, contagion would be expected to be stronger for girls than boys because this show focuses on the suicide of a high school girl. Second, the prior analysis didn't take into account strong secular trends in suicide, especially in boys from 2016-2017."

When the first season of the Netflix show appeared in 2017, it created widespread concern that its graphic portrayal of a teenage girl's suicide

would lead to imitation among vulnerable young people, especially adolescent girls.

The first such study found evidence of a jump in suicides among boys ages 10 to 17 in the three months following the show's release, but no effect for girls.

Romer said that analysis relied on a forecasting method to project the likely trend in suicide for 2017. But that forecast failed to anticipate the actual trend. A second study by different researchers, published in JAMA

Psychiatry had a similar problem, Romer said.

That study found an effect in boys and girls 10 to 19 years old in the three months following the series' release.

But it similarly failed to control for the secular trend in suicide, again making it difficult to separate the effects of the show from the trend. APPC's reanalysis did find a modest rise in the suicide rate among adolescent girls during the first month following the release of "13 Reasons Why," but it was not statistically reliable, the researchers

Places of Worship Act, 1991 must remain untouched

Despite the short and succinct Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991, (PWA), the Supreme Court has refused



to stay a survey done by Hindu radicals of the Gyanvapi mosque in the holiest of cities, Varanasi also known as Benares. The controversy over the Gyanvapi mosque-Kashi

Vishwanath temple has been raked up to divert the attention of the people from the fact that the number of jobs created cannot accommodate a burgeoning workforce.

In 2019, the Allahabad high court ordered a stay on an ASI survey sought by the votaries of the temple dedicated to Lord Shiva because the PWA specifically excluded the Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid controversy. This law was enacted in 1991 by the Congress government soon after the rathyatra started on September 25, 1990 and culminated at Ayodhya on October 30, 1990, fueling religious passions throughout the country.

This concise law with just eight sections forms part of the basic structure of the Constitution as it is a product of secularism as declared in the preamble. Nevertheless, it has been challenged in the apex court on the grounds that it violates the fundamental right to profess, practice and propagate religionunder Article 25 which is a fundamental right available to aliens as well as the citizens of India. Interestingly, the Supreme Court has admitted the petition filed by former BJP spokesperson, AshwiniUpadhyay, who practices law in the Supreme Court and directed the Centre to file its response This two-judge bench of Justices There are two million temples distributed to the challenge.

Such decisions which do not interpret the law by enunciating a principle on which the decision is given are not reported in the law journals and should normally not be treated as a precedent. Media reports claim the Allahabad high court has recently admitted petitions challenging the "religious character" of mosques which allegedly have remnants of ancient temples within their premises or in the vicinity.

Such media reports must be verified. Assuming there is some truth, this would contravene sub-section 2 of section 4 of the PWA which preserves the religious character of all places of worship within India as they existed on August 15, 1947. And there can be no doubt that the PWA is a product of the basic features of the Constitution as it emanates from Article 25.

BEIJING: A surprised and agitated Beijing on Monday denounced President Joe Biden's assertion that the US would intervene militarily along with Japan if China invaded self-ruled Taiwan, which effectively jeopardises Chinese President Xi Jinping's plan of national inte-

Taiwan's integration with the Chinese mainland is the major political plank of Xi, 68, who is widely expected to be endorsed for an unprecedented third term in power this year by a once-in-a-five-year congress of the ruling Communist Party scheduled to meet in the next few months.

So far successive US administrations maintained what was officially termed as strategic shadow over Xi's oft-repeated forceful assertions to integrate the estranged island with the mainland.

Xi, who enjoys the status of the ruling Communist Party founder Mao Zedong, is currently bracing for an unprecedented third term, doing away with the two-five-year-terms convention followed by all his predecessors.

Reports from Taipei quoted Taiwan's Foreign Ministry welcoming Biden's comments for "reaffirming" Washington's "firm commitment to Taiwan" and would deepen cooperation with countries including the US and Japan. "The challenges China poses to the security

of the Taiwan Strait have aroused great concern to the international community," a

Significantly, Biden outlined the US new policy in Tokyo while addressing a joint press conference with the Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida saying that America will stand with Japan and other nations to not let China forcibly take over Taiwan.

Wang reiterated that "Taiwan is an inalienable part of the Chinese territory and the Taiwan question is purely China's internal affair, which brooks no foreign interference."

"On issues bearing on China's core interests including its sovereignty and territorial integrity there is no room for compromise or concession", he said and warned that "China will take firm actions to safeguard its sovereignty and security interests. We will be true to our

He urged the US to earnestly abide by the "One China policy", recognising Taiwan as part of the Chinese mainland and refrain from sending a wrong message to Taiwan's independence forces.

Wang also took exception to Biden comparing any action by China to forcibly take over Taiwan similar to Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

"The Taiwan question and the Ukraine issue are fundamentally different. To compare those two is absurd", he said.

Observers say Biden's stand to militarily defend Taiwan against Chinese aggression will strengthen pro-independent forces led by Taiwanese President Tsai Ing-wen and cast a



spokesperson of Taiwan's Foreign Ministry

"Our government's firm determination to defend Taiwan's freedom, democracy and security has never changed," the spokesperson said.

In the video clips of Biden's press conference, the US leader struck a nuanced stand on Washington's policy on Taiwan, post-Russian invasion of Ukraine where America was not militarily involved.

Biden said "if there is no rapprochement between Ukraine and Russia and sanctions are not sustained in many ways, then what signal does it send to China about attempting to take Taiwan by force".

"They are already flirting with danger by flying so close and all the manoeuvres they are undertaking", he said referring to frequent attempts by Beijing to send hundreds of military aircraft into Taiwan's airspace to intimi-

"The US made the commitment, we support the One China policy that does not mean China has the jurisdiction to use force to take over Taiwan", Biden said.

"We stand firmly with Japan and other nations to not let that happen. I expect it will not happen, it will not be attempted", he said.

"My expectation is a lot of it depends on how strongly the world makes it clear that this kind of action is going to result in long-term disapprobation by the rest of the community" Biden said.

When asked if the US is willing to get involved militarily to defend Taiwan, Biden said "yes". "That is the commitment we made. Here is the situation: we agree with the One China policy. We signed on to it and all the attendant agreements made from there".

"But the idea that it can be taken by force is just not appropriate, it will dislocate the entire region and be another action similar to what happened in Ukraine. So, it is a burden that is even stronger", he said.

Biden launches Indo-Pacific trade deal, warns over inflation

TOKYO: President Joe Biden on Monday launched a new trade deal with 12 Indo-Pacific nations aimed at strengthening their economies as he warned Americans worried about high inflation that it was "going to be a haul" before they feel relief. The president said he does not believe an economic recession is inevitable in the US Biden, speaking at a news conference after holding talks with Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, acknowledged the U.S. economy has "problems" but said they world "less consequential than the rest of the world

He added: "This is going to be a haul. This is going to take some time," even as he rejected the idea a recession in the US was inevitable.

The comments came just before Biden's launch of the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework, a new trade deal his administration designed to signal US dedication to the contested economic sphere and to address the need for stability in commerce after disruptions caused by the pandemic and Russia's invasion of Ukraine.
Nations joining the U.S. in the Indo-Pacific

Economic Framework are Australia, Brunei, India, Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, the Philippines, Singapore, Thai-

Russia. The White House announced plans to build the economic framework in October as a replacement for the Trans-Pacific Partnership, which the U.S. dropped out of in 2017 under then-President Donald Trump.


Kishida, while welcoming the new Biden trade pact, said he hoped Biden would reconsider the Jnited States' position on TPP.

"Our position remains unchanged," Kishida said. "We think it's desirable for the United States to return to the TPP.

The new pact comes at a moment when the administration believes it has the edge in its competition with Beijing. Bloomberg Economics published a report last week projecting U.S. GDP growth at about 2.8% in 2022 compared to 2% for China, which has been trying to contain the coronavirus through strict lockdowns while also dealing with a property bust. The slowdown has undermined assumptions that China would automatically supplant the U.S. as

the world's leading economy.

"The fact that the United States will grow faster than China this year, for the first time since 1976, is a quite striking example of how countries in this region should be looking at the question of trends and trajectories," said the White House



land and Vietnam. Along with the United States, they represent 40% of world GDP.

The countries said in a joint statement that the pact will help them collectively "prepare our economies for the future" following disruptions caused by the coronavirus pandemic and the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

Biden and Kishida were joined by Indian PrimeMinister Narendra Modi while represen-tatives from the other countries appeared by video to help launch the pact. Modi was in To-kyo for Tuesday's meeting of the Quad, a security grouping that also includes the US, Japan

and Australia. The White House said the framework will help the United States and Asian economies work more closely on issues including supply chains, digital trade, clean energy, worker protections and anti-corruption efforts. The details still need to be negotiated among the member countries, making it difficult for the administration to say how this agreement would fulfill the promise of helping U.S. workers and businesses while

also meeting global needs. Critics say the framework has gaping shortcomings. It doesn't offer incentives to prospective partners by lowering tariffs or providing signatories with greater access to US. markets. Those limitations may not make the US framework an attractive alternative to the Trans-Pacific Partnership, which still moved forward after the U.S. bailed out. China, the largest trading partner for many in the region, is also seeking to join TPP. "I think a lot of partners are going to look at that list and say: 'That's a good list of issues. I'm happy to be involved,'" said Matthew Goodman, a former director for international economics on the National Security Council during President Barack Obama's administration. But he said they also may ask, "Are we going to get any tangible benefits out of participating in this framework?"

Kishida hosted a formal state welcome for Biden at Akasaka Palace, including a white-clad military honor guard and band in the front plaza. Reviewing the assembled troops, Biden placed his hand over his heart as he passed the American flag and bowed slightly as he passed the

Kishida said at their meeting that he was "absolutely delighted" to welcome Biden to Tokyo on the first Asia trip of his presidency. Along with Biden, he drove a tough line against Russia over its invasion of Ukraine, saying it "undermines the foundation of global order.

Biden, who is in the midst of a five-day visit to South Korea and Japan, called the U.S.-Japanese alliance a "cornerstone of peace and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific" and thanked Japan for its "strong leadership" in standing up to national security adviser Jake Sullivan.

The two leaders were also set to meet with families of Japanese citizens abducted by North Korea decades ago. The Japanese premier took office last fall and is looking to strengthen ties with the U.S. and build a personal relationship with Biden. He'll host the president at a restaurant for dinner.

The launch of the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework, also known as IPEF, has been billed by the White House as one of the bigger moments of Biden's Asia trip and of his ongoing effort to bolster ties with Pacific allies. Through it all, administration officials have kept a close eye on China's growing economic and military might in the region.

In September the U.S. announced a new partnership with Australia and Britain called AUKUS that is aimed and deepening security, diplomatic and defense cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region. Through that AUKUS partnership, Australia will purchase nuclear-powered submarines, and the U.S. is to increase rotational force deployments to Australia.

The U.S. president has also devoted great attention to the informal alliance known as the Quad, formed during the response to the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami that killed some 230,000 people. Biden and fellow leaders from the alliance are set to gather in Tokyo for their second in-person meeting in less than a year. The leaders have also held two video calls since Biden

And earlier this month, Biden gathered representatives from nine of the 10 members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations in Washington for a summit. Biden announced at the summit the U.S. would invest some \$150 million in clean energy and infrastructure initiatives in ASEAN nations.

Taiwan — which had sought membership in the IPEF framework— isn't among the governments that will be included. Participation of the self-ruled island of Taiwan, which China claims

as its own, would have irked Beijing. Sullivan said the U.S. wants to deepen its economic partnership with Taiwan, including on high technology issues and semiconductor supply on a one-to-one basis.

Biden also issued a stern warning to China over Taiwan, saying the U.S. would respond militarily if China were to invade the self-ruled island. "That's the commitment we made," Biden said. The U.S. recognizes Beijing as the one government of China and doesn't have diplomatic relations with Taiwan. However, it maintains unofficial contacts with Taiwan, including a de facto embassy in Taipei, the capital, and supplies military equipment to the island for its de-

Biden's comments were likely to draw a sharp response from China, which has claimed Taiwan to be a rogue province.

A White House official said Biden's comments did not reflect a policy shift.

Economic growth may have slowed to 3.5 per cent in Q4 FY22: Report

MUMBAI: The economic growth may have slowed to 3.5 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2021-22 from 5.4 per cent in the previous three-month period due to the impact of higher commodity prices on margins, the decline in wheat yields and on higher base, Icra Ratings said on Monday.

The agency said the hiccups in the recovery of the contact-intensive services attributable to the third wave of Covid-19 in the country



may have also affected the economic growth in the quarter.

Even the gross value added (GVA) at basic prices (at constant 2011-12 prices) in Q4 FY2022 seems to have eased to 2.7 per cent from 4.7 per cent in Q3 FY2022, it said.

The National Statistical Office (NSO) will release the fourth quarter numbers of fiscal 2022 on May 31.

Icra's Chief Economist Aditi Nayar said Q4 was a challenging quarter, with the Omicronfuelled third wave of Covid-19 arresting the momentum in contact-intensive services and pervasive pressure on margins from higher commodity prices. Moreover, the heatwave adversely affected wheat output in March 2022.

"We are apprehensive that both agriculture and industry will post a sub-1 per cent GVA growth in Q4 FY2022, whereas services growth will print at around 5.4 per cent," Nayar said.

The agency further said that the recent cut in excise duties on petrol and diesel will help boost sentiments and improve consumers' disposable incomes, while simultaneously cooling the CPI inflation.

Last week, the government had cut excise duty on petrol by a record Rs 8 per litre and that on diesel by Rs 6 per litre to give relief to consumers battered under high fuel prices that have also pushed inflation to a multi-year high. Retail inflation, as measured by consumer price-based inflation (CPI), accelerated to an eight-year high of 7.79 per cent in April.

"We are enthused by the recent excise duty cut on petrol and diesel, which has been complemented by VAT cuts by some states. This will bolster sentiment and create some cushion within stretched household budgets to undertake non-essential spending," Nayar

At World Health Assembly, India expresses dismay over WHO's excess mortality report

methodology of the World Health Organization (WHO) on its excess mortality report.

In a report released on May 5, the WHO estimated that nearly 15 million people were killed globally either by the coronavirus or by its impact on overwhelmed health systems in the past two years, more than double the official death count of six million.

Most of the fatalities were in Southeast Asia, Europe and the Americas.

According to the report, there were 4.7 million Covid deaths in India -- 10 times the official figure and almost a third of Covid deaths globally.

"India would like to express its disappointment over the manner in which the report by WHO on all-cause mortality was prepared and published ignoring the concerns expressed by India and other countries over the methodology and sources of data, setting aside the country specific authentic data from the statutory authority of India," Mandaviya said in his address at the 75th session of the World Health Assembly at the WHO headquarters in Geneva.

Mandaviya exhorted India's commitment to build a more resilient global health security

"As highlighted by India's Prime Minister, there is a need to build a resilient global supply chain to enable equitable access to vaccines and medicines, streamlining WHO's approval process for vaccines and therapeutics and strengthen WHO to build a more resilient global health security architecture," he said. As a responsible member of the global community, India is ready to play a key role in these efforts, he added.

The minister noted, "India believes that this year's theme linking peace and health, is timely and pertinent because there can be no sustainable development and universal health and wellbeing without peace."

Last week, the SC appointed a three-member Committee of Administrators (CoA) to run the AIFF, virtually revoking the powers of its governing body headed by Patel while opening up the possibility of a FIFA ban for "external interference".

The three-member panel has been mandated to oversee the day-to-day affairs of the AIFF until elections are held under a new constitution.

"I would also like to point out that the Supreme Court has expressed a sense of urgency in resolving all the issues by July 2022. I request the AFC (Asian Football Confederation) and FIFA to not impose a suspension at this stage, but instead to consider this important aspect of the Supreme Court order and enter into a dialogue with the CoA to receive a commitment that the said timelines laid down by the Supreme Court would be respected and strictly followed without allowing for delays on any account," Patel said in his letter to Infantino.

A FIFA ban at this stage would mean the under-17 women's World Cup, scheduled from October 11-30, will be taken away from India.
