

PM lays foundation stone and dedicates to nation several railway projects worth more than Rs 8000 crores in Odisha Flags off Vande Bharat Express between Puri and Howrah

Puri: The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone and dedicated to the nation, several railway projects worth more than Rs 8000 crores in Odisha via video conferencing today. The projects include flagging off the Vande Bharat Express between Puri and Howrah, laying the foundation stone for the redevelopment of Puri and Cuttack railway stations, dedication of 100% electrification of the rail network in Odisha, doubling of the Sambalpur-Titlagarh rail line, a new broad gauge rail line between Angul-Sukinda; the third line connecting Manoharpur - Rourkela - Jharsuguda - Jamga and a new broad-gauge line between Bichhupali - Jhartarba. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister remarked that the people of Odisha and West Bengal are being presented the Vande Bharat Express today which is a symbol of modern and aspirational India. "India's speed and progress can be seen whenever a Vande Bharat Train runs from one place to another", the Prime Minister said as he noted that this pace can



now be witnessed in the states of Odisha and West Bengal. The Prime Minister said that this will entirely change the meaning of development along with the experience of traveling for the passengers. Be it traveling from Kolkata to Puri for darshan or the other way round, the Prime Minister informed that the travel time will now be reduced to only six and half hours, thereby saving time, giving rise to business opportunities and providing new opportunities for the youth. The Prime Minister noted that the railway is the first choice and priority for any citizen who wishes to travel afar and mentioned the other railway development projects whose foundation stone has been laid today including the redevelopment and modernization of Puri and Cuttack Railway Stations, along with the dedication of doubling of rail lines in the region and 100 percent electrification of rail lines in Odisha. Referring to the era of Azadi Ka Amrit Kaal, the Prime Minister emphasized the need to

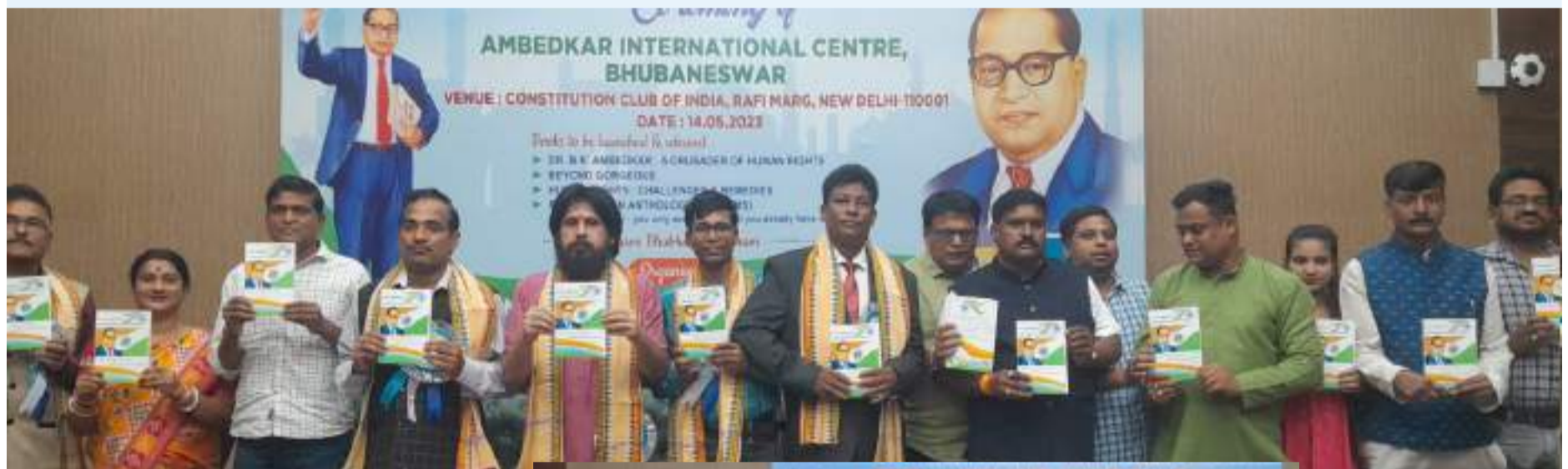
strengthen the unity and integrity of the country and said that the collective capabilities of the country can reach the pinnacle if the country remains totally united. He remarked that the Vande Bharat Express is a reflection of such belief where it is becoming the engine of development for the country while forwarding the spirit of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'. "The Indian Railway connects and weaves everyone together in a thread and the Vande Bharat Express will also move forward with the same idea and thought", the Prime Minister said. He further added that the train will strengthen the spiritual and cultural connection between Puri and Howrah. The Prime Minister informed that fifteen Vande Bharat Trains are already running in various states of the country giving a push to the economy of the country. The Prime Minister said that in recent times India has maintained the speed of its development despite extremely adverse circumstances. Shri Modi credited the participation of every state in this journey and said that the country is moving forward taking every state along. The Prime Minister said that, unlike earlier times, New India is creating technology indigenously and also taking that to every nook and corner of the country. Referring to the indigenous origins of Vande Bharat Trains, the Prime Minister mentioned that India has

developed technology like 5G and vaccines during the pandemic. He underlined that these innovations never remained limited to one state or city but were taken throughout the country in an equal manner. Similarly, He said Vande Bharat is touching all corners of the country. The Prime Minister said that this policy of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas is benefitting those states, which lagged behind in development. He said that the budget for railway schemes in Odisha has increased significantly. He informed that in 10 years before 2014, only 20 km of Railway Lines were laid annually in the state, while in the year 2022-23, 120 km long lines were laid in just one year. He said long pending projects like the Khurda Bolangir line, and the Haridaspur-Paradip line, are being completed rapidly. "Odisha is one of those states in the country where 100 percent electrification of rail lines has been achieved", the Prime Minister remarked as he informed that work is underway at a fast pace to achieve the same feat in West Bengal. This, the Prime Minister said, has resulted in the overall increase in the speed of trains as well as saved time for freight trains. He noted that the mineral-rich state of Odisha will greatly benefit from the electrification of rail lines where pollution emanating from diesel engines will be significantly reduced and help in the industrial development of the state. The Prime Minister also touched upon another aspect of building infrastructure which is not talked about as much. He said that infrastructure not only makes people's lives easier but also empowers society. "The development of the people lags behind when there is a lack of infrastructure. When infrastructure is developed, the rapid development of the people takes place simultaneously", the Prime Minister said. Highlighting the development initiatives, the Prime Minister gave the example of PM Saubhagya Yojana where the Government has provided free electricity connections to more than 2.5 crore households including about 25 lakh houses in Odisha and 7.25 lakh houses in West Bengal. Informing that the number of airports in the country increased from 75 to 150 today, the Prime Minister drew attention to the various photographs and videos on social media where ordinary citizens of the country can be seen sharing their air travel experience. The Prime Minister said that India's achievements in the field of infrastructure are the subject of studies today. He said when 10 lakh crores are allocated for infrastructure, that creates lakhs of jobs and railway and highway connectivity goes beyond ease of travel and connects farmers with new markets, tourists with new attractions and students with their preferred colleges. The Prime Minister said that the country is moving with the spirit of 'Jan Seva hi Prabhu Seva' - Service of people is the service of god. He mentioned Temples like Jagannath and places of pilgrimage like Puri where Prasad has been distributed for centuries and thousands of poor people are fed. Governor of Odisha, Shri Ganeshi Lal, Chief Minister of Odisha, Shri Naveen Patnaik, Union Minister for Railways, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, and Union Minister of Education and Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan were present on the occasion among others.

KISS Students Excel In Class X Board Exams With 100% result



Bhubaneswar, May 18: Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) has posted a hundred per cent result in the Class X Board Examination conducted by the Board of Secondary Education (BSE), Odisha, the result of which were declared today. The overall pass percentage in the state stood at 96.40 per cent. As many as 1880 students from KISS appeared for the exam

this year, the highest for any school in the State, out of whom 45 per cent students secured first division and 50 per cent students secured second division marks. The overall pass percentage stood at 100 percent. Makara Murmu from Mayurbhanj (Santal) topped the School with 92.17 per cent (553 marks), while Digij Tudu from Jharkhand (Santal)

and Dinesh Hembram from Mayurbhanj (Santal) scored 90.33 percent (542) each. Similarly, Namita Oram from Sundargarh (Oraon) and Rasmita Swansi from Kendujhar (Santal) scored 90 percent marks (540) each. KISS is a residential school offering free education and boarding facilities to tribal children. For over 21 years, the

school has achieved almost 100 percent results in the Board Exams. Congratulating the students and teachers, KIIT & KISS Founder Dr. Achyuta Samanta said the continued success of KISS students year after year has been possible only due to the sustained effort of teachers, staff, and the sincere dedication of students of KISS.

Property List not yet submitted

Ranchi (KCN): Despite the orders of the Ministry of Home Affairs, many IAS and IPSOs of Jharkhand have not given the details of their personal movable and immovable assets under the Immovable Property Return (IPR). However, the ED of the IAS and IPSOs should check their movable and immovable properties, otherwise, Jharkhand information against the ED. Right platform to agitate widely will work. a dearth, honest investigation has been done against these IAS and IPS officers and today the time has come that all such corrupt IAS and IPS officers' private business should be investigated. Immovable properties should be investigated by ED and all their illegal private movable and immovable properties should be confiscated so that in the coming days, IAS and IPS officers in Jharkhand take a lesson and before committing corruption, they are forced to think thousands of times, not millions, before looting the wealth of Jharkhand.

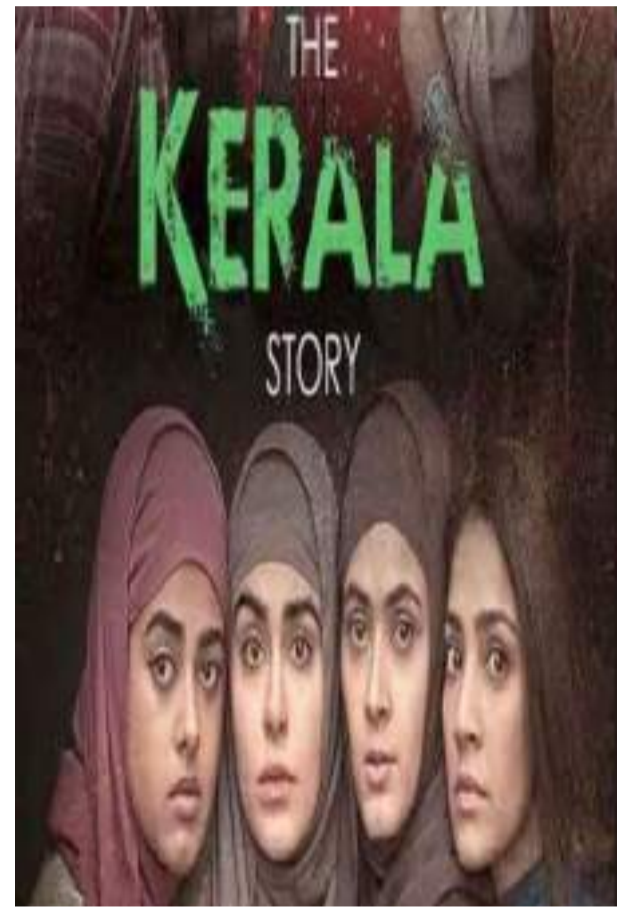

SC Stays West Bengal Government's Order Banning 'The Kerala Story' In State, Asks Tamil Nadu To Provide Security To Moviegoers

The Supreme Court on Thursday stayed the West Bengal government's order banning the screening of the film 'The Kerala Story' and asked Tamil Nadu to ensure the safety of moviegoers after theatre owners decided to stop screening the film due to security concerns.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud also directed the producer to put a disclaimer in the movie by 5 pm on May 20 on the claim that 32,000 Hindu and Christian women were converted to Islam. According to the apex court, the disclaimer should say that 'there is no authenticated data to back up the suggestion on figure of conversion and the film represents the fictionalised version'. The bench, also comprising Justices P S Narasimha and J B Pardiwala, said it would like to watch the movie



before proceeding to decide the pleas challenging the grant of CBFC certification. It said the petitions will be heard in the second week of July.

The bench also took note of submissions that there was no ban on the film in Tamil Nadu and asked the state government to ensure the safety and security of moviegoers.

During the hearing, it said that statutory provisions cannot be used to 'put a premium on public intolerance'. The bench said it is the duty of the state government to maintain law and order as the film has been granted certification by the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC).

"Bad films bomb at the box office," the bench said. "The legal provision cannot be used to put a premium on public intolerance. Otherwise, all films will find themselves in this spot," the bench, also comprising justices P S Narasimha and J B Pardiwala, said during the hearing.

The states cannot sit in appeal over the grant of certification to the movie, said senior advocate Harish Salve appearing for the producer of the movie.

West Bengal Congress rejected the proposal of Trinamul Congress supremo

Kolkata, (Ambar Mukherjee): The West Bengal state Congress leadership has rejected the ruling Trinamul Congress (TMC) supremo and state chief minister Mamata Banerjee's proposal to the Grand Old Party that the TMC will support Congress in those states where it is strong provided it reciprocates this in Bengal. After the landslide victory of the Congress party in Karnataka, Mamata giving her reaction to the party's achievement had recently come up with a proposal assuring extending support to Congress in the states where they are already strong, but on condition that Congress would support Trinamul Congress in Bengal and other regional parties wherever they are stronger than Congress. The West Bengal state Congress president Adhir Chowdhury, however, has made it clear that they are not ready to accept the Trinamul Congress supremo's offer. Ignoring Mamata Banerjee's "one-on-fight" in the Lok Sabha elections, Chowdhury said the Trinamul's support is not required as his party's is

support base is consistently increasing in Bengal. Chowdhury, the Lok Sabha member from Behrampur in Bengal expressed displeasure with the way Mamata had maintained her silence on Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra and he also came down heavily against the Bengal chief minister for her stand on not supporting the Congress in the Karnataka assembly elections. Chowdhury, also the Congress leader in the Lok Sabha said his party will emerge as the only alternative to the BJP everywhere even in Bengal and the Trinamul Congress will be washed out from the political scenario of anti-BJP forces, also from Bengal. The veteran Congress leader said that after the victory of Congress in Karnataka, Mamata Banerjee did not even congratulate Rahul Gandhi or Sonia Gandhi for the party's success. It is to be mentioned that the Trinamul Congress had nominated their own candidates in Goa, Tripura and Meghalaya and fought against Congress during the states' assembly elections. "What Didi (Mamata)

tried to do in Goa, Tripura and Meghalaya is now exposed. She is saying her party would support Congress where they are strong. We don't believe this. She has not even supported our party in the just concluded Karnataka assembly elections," said state Congress leader Chowdhury. Congress in Bengal had aligned with CPIM and the two parties had been fighting against Trinamul Congress in different elections. The Congress in Bengal had no MLA in the state Assembly till the recently held by-election in Sagardighi in Murshidabad district in Bengal when the Congress nominee Bayron Biswas won in the seat defeating its rival candidate of the Trinamul Congress. After the victory in the Sagardighi by-election, the Congress got its first MLA in the legislative assembly. "The two successive victories have given tremendous impetus to the rank and file of the party and we are confident that in the ensuing panchayat body elections, we will give a strong fight against the ruling Trinamul Congress," said a state Congress leader.

Intense competition for finisher's role pleases Shakib

Dhaka: Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan feels that there are several candidates lined up to grab the number seven spot in ODIs ahead of the World Cup, scheduled in India from October. Bangladesh are currently trying Mehedy Hasan at number seven in 50-over format since the home series against Ireland in May and the team management appear to be keen in giving him the finisher spot.

Afif and Mahmudullah, who failed to retain their places in ODIs, had been often discussed as leading candidates to fill the role. Meanwhile, the team management also carried Yasir Ali to England for the just concluded three-match series against Ireland but failed to give him a place in the playing XI. In the recent past, Bangladesh's ODI

skipper Tamim Iqbal had spoken about a few spots being up for grabs and the number slot is one of them. While expressing joy at the intense competition, particularly for number seven spot, Shakib feels that it is a problem of plenty for the selectors.

"I am neither the selector nor part of decision making so it is difficult for me to say but I am happy with the team and I feel whoever will be in the team they will be representing 17 Crores people and will try to give the best," Shakib told reporters on Monday (May 15) in England while attending a private program.

"From personal point of view the competition is not only about one guy there are many guys for it (number seven position). Everyone is performing there and if you see domestic cricket



there is Afif (Hossain), Mossadek (Hossain), Sohan (Nurul) while Riyad (Mahmudullah) bhai is playing brilliantly. There is Rabbi with the team while Miraj is batting at seven," he said.

"So there are six to seven options for one place and so the decision is not easy to make. I am sure

keeping the World Cup into mind the coach, selector and captain will take the right decision," he said.

Bangladesh have tried several players for the finisher's role in the past with no real success. On his part, Mehedy has begun reasonably in the number seven spot. From five innings, the all-

rounder averages 37 with a strike rate of 92. While the numbers, especially the strike-rate, can improve further, Mehedy has certainly shown the spunk needed for the task. Afif Hossain got the longest rope among the others with 12 innings under his belt but his strike rate at 74 was considerably below the

accepted levels in the modern-day cricket. The likes of Yasir Ali and Nurul Hasan featured just for the odd game or two.

Shakib hoped that the spot would be sealed before the Asia Cup and underlined the importance of backing the selected player and the management's decision irrespective of the results. Bangladesh are slated to play three ODIs against Afghanistan before the Asia Cup that still looks doubtful under the present situation but the team management need to fix the number seven position sooner than later.

"Now we are in the primary stage and whatever wrong or right we are doing I think everything will be all right from the World Cup or the Asia Cup. We don't have too many

international matches and I am certain that the coaches and the captain are recognizing in which areas we need to do well to earn better result. I am sure no leader of a team or a nation wants badly for his team. They don't have bad intentions it can be right or wrong," said Shakib.

"Basically we talk after the result and at that point it looks like a wrong decision. The decision is taken before the result. I am sure the selectors coach and decision makers will think good for the team," he said.

"We will have our right combination when we go to the World Cup and it will depend on opposition and condition. In some grounds four pacers might play while there will grounds where you will have to pace bowler. In some field you need

six bowlers while in some places we will need five bowlers. When the decision is taken you have to take lot of things into consideration. Now we are just having trials," he said adding that they need to make sure they don't repeat similar mistakes that prevented them from going far in the previous World Cup. "The condition is always fair in ICC tournament and it is even for every team. We have to do well in all the departments if we want to do well. In the last World Cup we had a good chance but couldn't capitalise on it due to some small mistakes. We must make sure that we don't repeat those mistakes. Certainly other teams are improving in their respective areas but we have to improve if we want to compete with them," he concluded.

Bairstow returns, Archer ruled out as England name squad for Ireland Test

London: England pacer Jofra Archer has been ruled out for the rest of the summer after recurrence of his stress fracture, but wicketkeeper-bat Jonny Bairstow has recovered from his leg injury and will be making his national comeback in the one-off Test against Ireland.

Archer returned home midway through the ongoing IPL 2023 and recent scans revealed he has sustained a recurrence of a stress fracture to his right elbow. The pacer will now spend time with the England and Sussex medical teams, who are in charge of his injury management.

"It has been a frustrating and upsetting period for Jofra Archer," ECB Managing Director for



England Men's Cricket, Rob Key, said. "He was making good progress until a recurrence of the elbow injury, which kept him out for an extended period previously. We wish him the best of luck with his recovery. I'm sure we will see Jofra back to his best and winning games for England, whatever the format. Hopefully, sooner rather than later. Meanwhile, Bairstow is set for a comeback

following a broken left leg and dislocated ankle episode, and will be in action for the first time since last August. He comes in at the expense of Ben Foakes. "It was a seriously tough decision to leave Ben Foakes out of the squad. He has been excellent for England in the last year, but Jonny Bairstow is one of the best players in the world whose performances last summer epitomised what

we are about," Key noted.

Also returning to the national fold is seamer Chris Woakes, for the first time since March 2022. If picked in the 11, it'll be Woakes's first Test appearance on home soil since August 2020. Mark Wood, who took a break from the New Zealand tour, has also been included in the 15-member squad.

England have also named batter Ollie Pope as Ben Stokes's deputy with immediate effect. New Delhi: Afghanistan will kickstart their upcoming tour of Bangladesh with a one-off Test at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Dhaka. According to the draft itinerary obtained by Cricbuzz, the visitors are scheduled to reach Bangladesh on June 10 and will play the Test in the capital from June 14-18.

Following the red-ball assignment, Afghanistan will depart for India for a white-ball series on June 19 and will return to the country again on July 1 to complete the remaining part of the series, which includes three ODIs and two T20Is running until July



17. The 50-over games will all be played in Chattogram on July 5, 8 and 11 respectively. Later, both the teams will move to Sylhet to play the two T20Is that will be played on July 14 and 16. Meanwhile, most of the

Bangladesh's squad that toured England for the ODIs against Ireland have returned home while some leading cricketers have stayed back for a break. BCB officials told Cricbuzz that they are expected to start the

camp for the upcoming home series against Afghanistan from May 25 or 26. They are expecting their foreign coaching staffs, who are also enjoying the break, to be available before the start of the preparation camp.

UEFA Champions League 2023: Manchester City Hammer Real Madrid 4-0 To Storm Into Final

New Delhi: Manchester City is three games away from making history. And after the stunning rout of Real Madrid in the Champions League semifinals on Wednesday, Pep Guardiola's march toward a treble of trophies feels unstoppable. "We are there. We can think about it, can visualize it," the City manager said after his team's 4-0 win at Etihad Stadium.

After drawing the first leg 1-1, Madrid's undisputed kings of Europe were humbled and, except for the efforts of goalkeeper Thibaut Courtois, the score line could have been so much worse for the 14-time champions.

City feels like an irresistible force as it closes in on the Premier League, Champions League 2023 and FA Cup titles. It was certainly too hot for Madrid to handle as Bernardo Silva scored twice in the first half, Eder Militao scored an own goal after the break and substitute Julian Alvarez struck in time added on to seal a 5-1 aggregate win. Madrid has fought its way back from the brink on numerous occasions over the past two seasons, but this was too great a challenge. After overrunning the defending European champions, City will be favored to do the same to Inter Milan in the final in Istanbul

on June 10. A win against Chelsea on Sunday would secure a third straight league title and Manchester United stands in its way in the FA Cup final. United is the only English team to win the three main trophies in one season — doing so in 1999. City has already overtaken its Manchester rival as the dominant force in English soccer and can now emulate its greatest achievement. "We are close and of course we are going to try," Guardiola said. City is going in search of its first Champions League title, while Guardiola is aiming to win it for a third time as a coach. At times, it has seemed



as though the pressure on Europe's biggest stage was too big for a team that has been serial winners in domestic competition. While City's quality has rarely been in question over Guardiola's seven years in charge, its temperament in the Champions League has been.

On too many occasions it has fallen short when the heat was on — losing to underdogs such as Monaco, Lyon and Tottenham. It was in command for almost the entirety of the two-legged semifinal against Madrid last year, but still managed to lose after blowing a two-goal lead in the last few

minutes at the Santiago Bernabeu. That never looked likely on this occasion, however, as City provided further evidence that it is finally ready to lift the one trophy that has eluded it. "After 10 or 15 minutes I had the feeling that all the pain we had in one season, one year, what happened last season,

was there today," Guardiola said. "It was really tough to lose the way we lose and I think we had to swallow poison. Football always gives you another chance." Carlo Ancelotti had described Madrid as a team with a "special power to stay alive." "We played against an opponent who deserved to win," Ancelotti said. "They played with more intensity, more quality up front and they took their chances. They were better than us today, we were better last year."

Having been dominated for long periods by Madrid in the first leg last week, City took control from the start in front

of its own fans. Erling Haaland had two clear chances to score before Bernardo's opening goal — twice seeing headers saved by Courtois. With the crowd roaring on every City challenge, it felt like a matter of time before the home team would find a breakthrough — and it came in the 23rd minute. After denying Haaland twice, Courtois could not keep out Bernardo, who raced onto Kevin de Bruyne's pass before firing in at the near post. The sense of relief was unmistakable — from Guardiola as much as anyone else in the stadium as he turned to the crowd, double fist-pumped and blew kisses toward the supporters.
