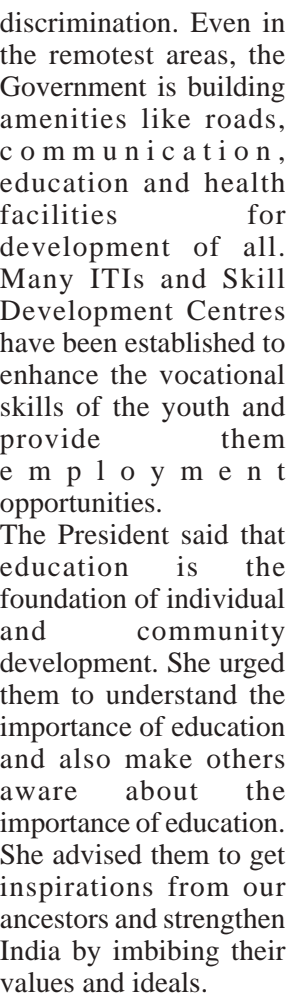


# India crush South Africa by 243 runs, extend winning streak to eight matches in ODI World Cup

**Kolkata, (KCN):** India's Virat Kohli equalled Sachin Tendulkar's record of 49 one-day international hundreds as unbeaten World Cup hosts India thrashed fellow semi-finalists South Africa by 243 runs in a pool match on Sunday.

Kohli's 101 not out was the centrepiece of India's 326-5 before they skittled out South Africa -- the second-placed side in the 10-team event -- for just 83, with spinner Ravindra Jadeja taking 5-33.

It was South Africa's lowest total made at any World Cup.

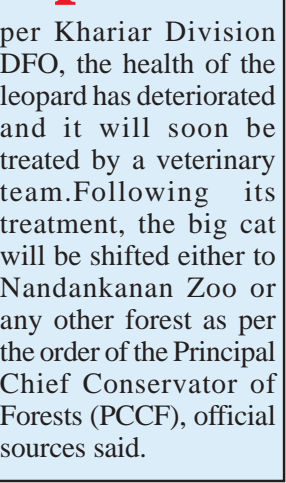
Birthday boy Virat Kohli hit a record-equalling 49th ODI century while Ravindra Jadeja took a five-wicket haul as India crushed South Africa by 243 runs to record their eighth World Cup win here on Sunday.

Kohli, who turned 35 on Sunday, struck 101 not out off 121 balls -- which put him at par with Sachin Tendulkar -- and shared a 134-run partnership with Shreyas Iyer (77) to take India to an imposing 326 for five.

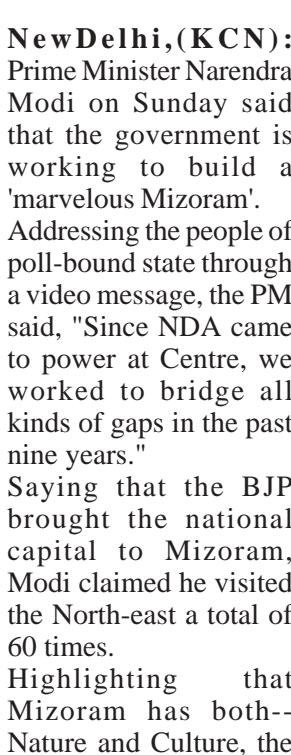
Then Jadeja (5/33), Mohammed Shami (2/18), and Kuldeep Yadav (2/7) bowled superb spells to dismiss the Proteas for 83 in 27.1 overs.

Earlier, openers Rohit Sharma (40 off 24 balls) and Shubman Gill (23) gave India a good start with a 62-run stand after the hosts elected to bat. The flurry of shots from Rohit's bat saw India complete 50 runs in just 4.3 overs as the skipper smashed two sixes and six boundaries during his entertaining innings. Once Kohli and Iyer came together, following Rohit and Gill's departure they smashed the Proteas bowlers all around the ground. Jadeja played a cameo unbeaten 29-run innings off 15 balls to guide India to a big total. Both India and South Africa have already secured their place in the semifinals.

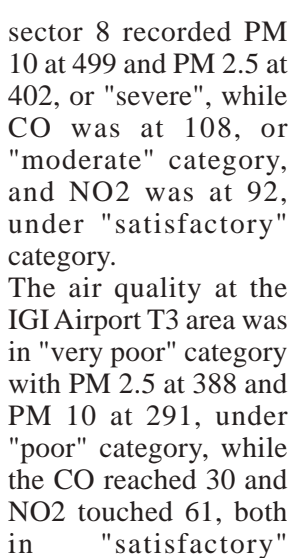

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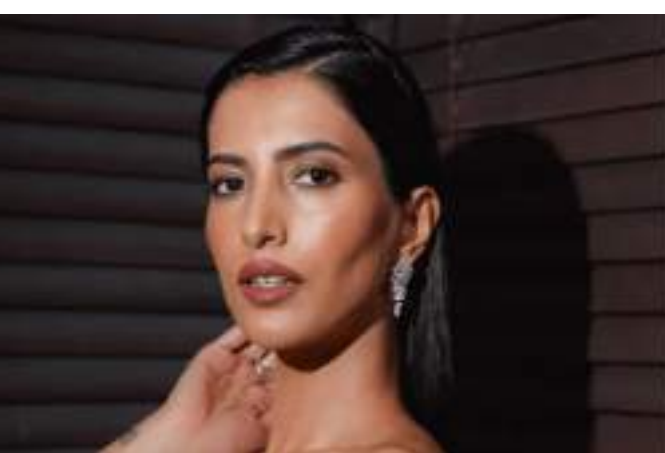
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## Wildcard Manasvi Mamgai Gets Evicted From Salman Khan's Show

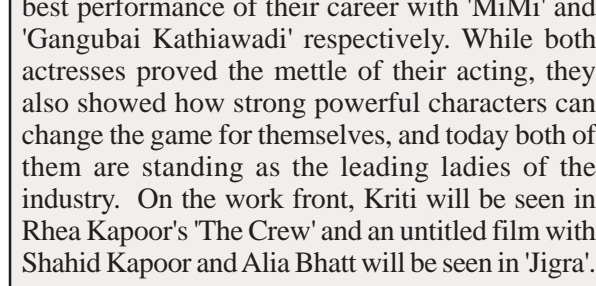
actor Varun Dhawan.

20. Rights of the person against whom the search is conducted: As per the ground rules framed for search and seizure by Union Government, the following are the rights of the person to be searched:

a. To see the warrant of authorisation duly signed and sealed by the issuing authority.

b. To verify the identity of each member of search party.

c. To have at least 2 respectable and independent residents of the locality as witnesses.

d. To have personal search of all members of the party before the start of the search and after conclusion of the search.

e. To insist on a personal search of a female by another female only with strict regard to decency.

f. To have a copy of the Panchnama together with all the annexures.

g. To put his own seals on the packages containing the seized assets.

h. Women having the occupancy of an apartment to be searched, have right to withdraw before the search party enters, if

according to custom, they do not appear in public.

i. To call a medical practitioner, if he or any family member is not well.

j. To have his children permitted to go to school after the examination of their bags.

k. To inspect the seals placed on various receptacles sealed in course of search and subsequently when re-opened by continuation of the search.

l. To have the facilities of having meals etc. at the normal time.

m. To have a copy of any statement before it is used against him in an assessment or prosecution proceeding.

n. To have inspection of the books of account etc. seized or to take extracts therefrom in the presence of any of the Authorised Officers or any other person empowered by him.

o. Income Tax authorities have no power of arrest.

p. To object by way of filing a petition to the approval given by the CIT for Retention of Books and Documents beyond 180 days from the date of seizure.

21. In addition to above, the person raided

has also the following rights:

a) Right of presence: He is entitled to be present during search - rule 112(8)

b) Right to worship: He is entitled to observance of his worship at the usual time even if a search takes place during the time of such worship.

c) Right to leave the spot of search: One is entitled to attend to his normal business or profession but this is subject to the fact that the assessee has to be present during the course of search for furnishing information or replying to questions regarding the acquisitions of the articles or the books of account found during the course of the search. After answering such questions or making his statement one can leave the spot of search. However, in some cases, the refusal to permit the assessee to leave the premises has been the subject of a major controversy. The decision in the case of L.R. Gupta v. Union of India and others [1992] 194 ITR 32 (Delhi) is quite relevant in this context. In fact, in the case of L.R. Gupta, Delhi High Court observed that not permitting the assessee

to attend the court amounts to confinement in the house or arrest of a person for which there is no provision under the Income-tax Act. SLP has been granted by the Supreme Court and reported in [1992] 194 ITR (St.) 239.

In this context, the recommendations of The Chelliah Committee was as follows: "Since the Income Tax Department does not have the power to arrest and the ground rules announced on the floor of the Parliament in 1987 specifically lay down that the income tax authorities shall have no power to arrest, the general practice of the search party preventing an assessee whose premises are searched from leaving the building to attend to his work must be discontinued. After the person has made the statement required, he should be allowed to leave" [Para 10.79(c)].

d) Right to have his statement recorded properly: The searched person has a right to insist on recording in his statement u/s 132(4) that a particular asset or a document, whether seized or not, was found in a particular room or almirah or a container normally used, either by him or a particular

member of the family and about the ownership of the articles. If the statement is not properly recorded, he may state his qualifications at the place where he is asked to sign. If such an opportunity is not given to him by the officers at that time, he may, at the earliest, after the search, bring it to the notice of Authorising Officer and Assessing Officer so as to safeguard his position for the purpose of explaining the assets etc., in course of assessment. The raided person may also decline or object to the recording of the statement at a late hour of the night or in the early morning, on health grounds or on grounds of mental and physical exhaustion as, under such condition, he may not be able to recollect facts or furnish categorical replies. In spite of objection if a statement is recorded, he may insist on recording his objection. If a statement recorded in respect of a particular event from somebody else is put to him, he has a right to insist for a copy of that statement before he furnishes his reply. In this connection the observations of the Supreme Court in the case of Suraj Mall Mohta & Co. v. A. V.

Visvanatha Sastri & another [1954] 26 ITR 1 (SC) are quite relevant. In this context it may be noted that the Task Force on Direct Taxes chaired by Dr. Vijay Kelkar in para 3.27 of its final report had recommended that:

(i) The CBDT must issue immediate instructions to the effect that no raiding party should obtain any surrender whatsoever.

(ii) Where, a taxpayer desires to voluntarily make a disclosure, he should be advised to make so after the search.

(iii) All cases where surrender is obtained during the course of the search in violation of the Instructions of the CBDT, the leader of the raiding party be subjected to vigilance enquiry.

(iv) All statements recorded during the search should be video recorded.

22. Duties of the person against whom the search is conducted: The following are the duties of the person against whom the search is conducted:

a) To allow authorised person, free and unhindered entrance into the premises.

b) To identify all receptacles in which

assets or books of account and documents are kept and to hand over keys to such receptacles to the Authorised Officer.

c) To identify and explain the ownership of the assets, books of account and documents found in the premises.

d) To identify every individual in the premises and to explain their relationship to the person being searched.

e) Not to allow or encourage the entry of any unauthorised person into the premises.

f) Not to remove any article from place of investigation without notice or knowledge of the Authorised Officer.

g) To ensure that peace is maintained throughout the duration of the search, and to co-operate with the Investigating Officers in all respects so that the search action is concluded at the earliest and in a peaceful manner.

h) Co-operation should be extended even after the search action is over, so as to enable the Authorised Officer to complete necessary follow-up investigation at the earliest.

23. Whether date of signing of authorisation will be date of initiation of search or the date of

commencement and conducting of initial search in the premises of assessee:

The expression 'search initiated' had to be interpreted to mean the commencement and conducting of the initial search, i.e. the first search in the case and not the date on which the authorizations were signed by concerned authorities or any other date prior to the initial date of search - CIT v. Wipro Finance Ltd. [2010] 323 ITR 467 (Kar).

24. Search warrant whether required to be shown or served: Search warrant is required to be shown to the person being searched and his signature is obtained confirming the fact that it has been shown to him. The search warrant is not required to be served on the person being searched - Subir Roy v. S.K. Chattopadhyay [1986] 158 ITR 472 (Kolkata), Southern Herbals Ltd. v. DIT (Investigation) [1994] 207 ITR 55 (Kerala).

# Stroke has become a prevalent health concern in India

## The average stroke incidence rate in India is 145 per 100,000 population, three Indians suffer a stroke every minute



World Stroke Day 2023, each October 29th marks World Stroke Day, a dedicated occasion shedding light on the gravity and prevalent occurrence of strokes. This day serves to enhance understanding about stroke prevention and treatments, aiming to make this vital information more accessible to everyone. Given that stroke has become a prevalent health concern in India, with a staggering 100 percent increase in incidence, it holds significant importance. Globally, brain stroke stands as the second leading cause of death and the third leading cause of disability. Annually, around 1.8 million people experience a stroke. Notably, low and middle-income countries, including India, have seen a staggering 100 percent increase in stroke cases, while developed nations have witnessed a significant 42 percent

decrease. In India, the average stroke incidence rate is 145 per 100,000 population, with researchers estimating that three Indians suffer a stroke every minute. While brain strokes are more commonly associated with the elderly, they can strike individuals of any age. Recognizing risk factors and symptoms is crucial for stroke prevention, and receiving early diagnosis and treatment substantially improves the chances of complete recovery. There are two primary types of strokes. Firstly, an Ischaemic stroke occurs when a clot, originating either from the heart or elsewhere, travels to the brain, blocking an artery and reducing blood supply to that area. Ischemia refers to a decreased blood supply. The second type is a haemorrhagic stroke, where an excess of blood in the brain can cause a blood vessel to burst, resulting in the accumulation of blood. Distinguishing between the two can be challenging, as they share similar symptoms such as tingling in the hands or

legs, body imbalance, and facial drooling. Metabolic risks (high systolic blood pressure (SBP), high body-mass index (BMI), high fasting plasma glucose (FPG), high total cholesterol, and low glomerular filtration rate) account for 71.0% (64.6–77.1) of stroke burden. Behavioural factors (smoking, poor diet, and low physical activity) account for 47.0% [41.3 to 54.4] of stroke burden, and environmental risks (air pollution and lead exposure) 37.8% [35.0 to 41.0]. Globally, high systolic blood pressure is the largest single risk for stroke (contributing 79.6 million DALYs [67.7-90.8]; or 55.5% of total stroke DALYs [48.2-62.0]), high body-mass index (BMI) (34.9 million [22.3-48.6]; 24.4% [15.7-33.2]), high fasting plasma glucose (28.9 million [19.8-41.5]; 20.2% [13.8-29.1]), ambient particulate matter (PM2.5) pollution (28.7 million [23.4-33.4]; 20.1% [16.6-23.0]), and smoking (25.3 million [22.6-28.2]; 17.7% [16.4-19.0]). All risk factors combined account for 87.0% (84.2-89.8) of the global stroke

burden. Stroke Risk Factors you can't control:

1. Age - Your chances of having a stroke go up as you get older. Two thirds of strokes occur among people over 65. After age 55, the risk of stroke doubles every 10 years.

2. Gender - Men have a slightly higher stroke risk than women. However, more women than men die from strokes because they tend to live longer than men.

3. Family history - Your risk is higher if your immediate family members (grandparents, parents or siblings) had a stroke before they were 65.

4. Prior stroke or mini-stroke (transient ischemic attack/TIA) - Up to a third of people who survive a first stroke or mini-stroke (TIA) have another

stroke within 5 years. A stroke survivor has a 20 per cent chance of having another stroke within two years.

Stroke Risk Factors you can control:

1. High blood pressure - accounts for 35-50% of stroke risk. Almost 20% of Canadians have high blood pressure.

2. High blood cholesterol - The link between high cholesterol and stroke isn't as clear as the link between high cholesterol and heart attacks. However, researchers believe that high blood cholesterol can play a part in blocking the arteries leading to the brain.

3. Irregular heartbeat (Atrial Fibrillation/AF) - those with AF are 5 times more likely to have a stroke and about

15% of stroke patients have AF.

4. Diabetes - patients with diabetes are 2 to 3 times more likely to develop stroke. Almost 20% of people who have a stroke are diabetic.

5. Drug Abuse - The use of illicit drugs such as cocaine and crack cocaine can cause a stroke. These drugs can cause narrowing of blood vessels resulting in less blood flow to the brain. Cocaine also affects the heart, causing abnormal heart rhythm and rapid heart rate that can lead to the formation of blood clots. Strokes caused by drug abuse are often seen in a younger population.

6. Overweight - particularly those who have "central obesity" where extra weight is carried around the hips. Men with waist

circumference of 40 inches or more and women with waist circumference of 35 inches or higher are at particularly high risk of stroke.

7. Physical inactivity - people who exercise 5 or more times per week have a reduced stroke risk.

8. Alcohol consumption - the link to stroke is not entirely clear however, in some studies, excessive alcohol consumption has been negatively linked to stroke.

9. Smoking - doubles the risk of stroke. Quitting will significantly reduce the risk within two years. Within five years, your risk will be the same as someone who never smoked.

10. Diet - eating a heart-healthy diet can reduce your risk of heart disease or stroke by 80%.

11. Sleep Apnea - People with sleep apnea are approximately 1.6-2.7 times more at risk to have a stroke. Several studies have shown a link between people with sleep apnea who go on to have a stroke and also those people who have had a stroke that show a higher incidence of sleep apnea after the

stroke. There is also evidence that stroke patients with obstructive sleep apnea appear to have increased risk of death if the sleep apnea is untreated.

12. Stress / Depression - There is a growing body of research showing a link between stress and stroke. Stress is linked with stroke risk factors including, high blood pressure, smoking and being overweight. Research is also showing that depression is associated with a significantly increased risk of stroke morbidity and mortality.

As far as recovery is concerned of every 100 people who have a stroke: 15 die (15%), 40 are left with a moderate to severe impairment (40%), 10 are so severely disabled they require long-term care (10%), 25 recover with a minor impairment or disability (25%), and 10 recover completely (10%).

## West Bengal Government face problem to get road tax from premium car owners

**Kolkata, (Ambar Mukherjee):** Kolkata: Owners of premium cars with price range between Rs 60 lakh and Rs 1.15 crore have become a headache for the cash-strapped West Bengal government as they are reluctant to clear road tax dues.

According to records available with the transport department, road tax for such 1,931 high-end vehicles to the tune of Rs 70 crore has been lying unpaid as the owners show "no interest" to comply with the rule-book despite repeated reminders. The

list of defaulters includes actors, reputed doctors, entrepreneurs and lawyers and the brand of vehicles owned by them are Land Rover, Range Rover, BMW, Audi, Porsche and Jaguar.

Sources in the transport department said Nabanna, the state secretariat, had recently sought the names of the owners of premium luxury vehicles who have not paid road tax for long. "Such owners are riding their vehicles without paying road tax since past five to 10 years. Owners of normal vehicles are found to be

more law-abiding than these rich people. But now, we have decided to initiate a special drive to recover the huge dues of road tax," said an officer of the transport department.

Citing an example, an official at Nabanna said a vehicle owned by a popular actress of Bengali film industry was intercepted at the Ruby crossing on EM Bypass one month ago. "A total of Rs 12 lakh is due from her under the head of road tax. She was given several reminders. We confiscated the vehicle which has been

lying at the transport department's Kasba office. The owner did not bother to clear her dues as she has other cars to ride," said the officer.

An inspector of motor vehicles department said traffic police and officers of the transport department hesitate to intercept the premium vehicles. "But the defaulters

Will not be allowed to take this advantage anymore. The state transport authorities will send notice to all the defaulters and after issuing three such notices, stern action will

be taken. We will use the legal provisions of the West Bengal Public Demand Recovery Act to get the dues from the defaulters," said another officer of the transport department.

The officer also said the state government is planning to make it mandatory that a buyer will have to pay road tax for 15 years at the time of buying a premium car. "If the owners of luxury premium cars do not clear the dues, we will have no other option left other than collecting road taxes for 15 years," he added.

## "They Come During Elections And Return...": Rajnath Singh Jabs Opposition

**Naryawali, Madhya Pradesh (KCN):** Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Sunday described parties like the SP, the BSP and the AAP as "electoral birds" (chunavi chidiya), saying they come during elections and return to Delhi and Uttar Pradesh at the end of the polls. Addressing an election rally in this assembly segment, Mr Singh said unlike many other parties, the focus of BJP's politics is not just on winning elections and forming a government but its main aim is to take the country on the path of growth and development.

"At the time of elections, parties like SP, BSP and AAP come as electoral birds and as soon as the elections are over, they return back to Delhi and Uttar Pradesh," Mr Singh said in Hindi.

"We do not do vote-bank politics. We do not just do politics to form a government but do politics to build the country and society," he said.

The elections to 230 assembly constituencies in Madhya Pradesh will be held on November 17 and the counting of votes will take place on December 3. The ruling BJP is trying hard to retain power in the state.



In his address, Mr Singh also highlighted various welfare schemes of the Narendra Modi government. "Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana, free ration is being given to the poor in the country for the last three years. Our Prime Minister Modi ji has said that this scheme will be extended for the next five years," Mr Singh said.

"Earlier there were potholes in roads in Madhya Pradesh. Today villages are connected by roads. We are providing tap water to every house," he said. The defence minister

also exuded confidence that BJP will retain power in the state.

"When assembly elections were announced in five states, there was talk of a close fight in Madhya Pradesh. I had said in the beginning itself that Shivraj ji (Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan) is Dhoni. Whatever be the start, we will give a good finish and lead the BJP to victory," he said.

"The BJP is going to win here. Earlier, 92 per cent of mobiles in the country were imported, today more than 90 per cent of mobiles are being made in India and by the hands of Indians," he said.

Funding will be sources from Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA). Palm trees have multiple benefits. It acts as a lightning arrester alongside securing the forest block boundaries. It



will also provide fodder to wild animals, especially elephants, said Sri Sahu, Additional Chief Secretary, FE&CC and Special Relief Commissioner, Odisha. It was decided in the recently held State level DFO Conference in the presence of

FE&CC Minister Pradip Kumar Amat after thorough discussions. The human-elephant conflict will be lowered after the completion of plantation drive. There are 4479 notified forest blocks with 39,671 Sq. Km of boundary lines.

The total number of boundary pillars in these forest blocks comes to 4,80,207.

It is proposed to plant four Palm trees near each boundary pillar along the forest block boundary.

Around 19 lakhs Palm trees will be planted with cost of nearly Rs.7.5 crores.

## After a decade, ASI begins excavation of Barabati Fort again

**CUTTACK(KCN):** After a gap of 16 years, the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) restarted the excavation of Barabati Fort at Cuttack on Monday.


On the day, a broken structural fragment was found. Built by the Ganga dynasty on the banks of the Mahanadi River, the fort was declared an ASI-protected monument in 1915 and excavation at the site began in 1989. The fort was last excavated in 2007. The digging work this time, ASI (Puri circle head) Dibishida Gadnayak said, is aimed at tracing the link between Odisha and Southeast Asian countries. A trench has been created in the



northeast direction of the remains of the pillared hall of the fort. During the excavation of the trench on the day, a broken part of a sculpture was found which could date back to the 13th to 14th century if the style of the fragment is taken into consideration, Gadnayak said. The trench appears to have two to three metres of deposits and the sculptural fragment was dug from the spot, he

added. Four areas in the fort have been identified for excavation. The previous excavations of the site were carried out to establish the cultural chronology of the fortified fort. In these digs, some of the important antiquity finds included a seated goddess, lion-head, lamp fragment, balls and pot fragments of stone, sling balls, fragments of animal figurines of terracotta and axe and a stylus made of iron. The

pottery finds comprised storage jars, spouted vessels, lamps, knobbed lids, miniature pots, dishes and bowls, the final portion of a hukkah and pieces of Chinese porcelain. During the 1989 excavation, the central mound area of the fort revealed the remains of a palace, a pavilion and foundation blocks made of rhodolite. Eighteen massive pillar bases, aligned in four rows at regular intervals, were exposed in the southern area.

## Doctors at HCG Panda Cancer Hospital successfully treated 33-year-old suffering from a rare case of Salivary Gland Cancer

**Bhubaneswar/Cuttack:** Doctors at HCG Panda Cancer Hospital, Cuttack, treated 33-year-old Reema (name changed), hailing from Western Odisha, from Parotid Gland Carcinoma, a rare form of cancer that occurs in the salivary glands situated right below the ear lobes. The cancerous gland was resected by conducting an advanced form of Total Parotidectomy Surgery on the patient while preserving her facial nerves, which are responsible for facial expressions. This incredible feat was achieved by Dr Manjunath NML, Senior consultant Surgical Oncologist and his team at HCG Panda Cancer Hospital Cuttack.

Reema suffered from unexplained excruciating pain continuously on the face and earlobes for a period of 8 months. In order to get relief from the pain, she visited neurological specialists and physicians from multiple hospital where she was misdiagnosed for other neurological diseases and was treated with analgesics, as they failed to diagnose her actual condition. She consulted the doctors at HCG Panda Cancer Hospital, who discovered a vague swelling near the earlobes and with suspicion of a tumour. Imaging of the parotid gland was conducted to check for any malignancy and it was discovered that she had

a parotid lobe tumour in the junction between the superficial lobe and the deep lobe, right behind the mandible or the lower jaw bone. Nerve sparing total parotidectomy was conducted using advanced form of equipments such as surgical loupes, nerves monitoring devices and Vessel Sealer, which helped surgeons achieve an absolute haemostasis or minimal blood loss during the surgery. This four- and half-hour surgical procedure was conducted by preserving the facial nerves that passes through the superficial lobe and deep lobe and any implication on the facial nerves would lead to disfigurement of the face, paralysis on one

side of the face, lack of expressing emotions, inability to close the eyes and move the eyebrows. Elaborating the complexities of the surgery, Dr Manjunath NML said, "This is a unique and a rare case among young women, where we usually witness just one or two cases per year. This was one challenging case, as the cancer tumours were adjacent to the facial nerve and we had to carefully dissect them without causing any hinderance or impact to the nerve. # Australia edge closer to semifinal with fifth straight win

**NewDelhi:**They'd been huffing and puffing for a while but Australia took England off the life support and sent them crashing out of the World Cup, drawing the curtains on a glorious eight-year chapter in white-ball cricket history. And fittingly, any remnants of England's hopes were extinguished at Ahmedabad, the very place their defence of the crown had begun to slip a month ago. If any fears about an ill-prepared and unbalanced line-up seemed unfounded then, the need for the double world-champions to reboot and start afresh was laid bare by Australia's all-round show on Saturday (November 4).

Nothing exemplified this dismal title defence than Jos Buttler's dismissal for a seven-ball 1 in England's chase of 286. The skipper walked out after an 84-run platform set by the third-wicket pair of Dawid Malan and Ben Stokes. The dew had

set in and Buttler sought to stamp his authority on the lead opposition spinner, Adam Zampa. He stepped out and hit the ball straight down long-off's throat. The legspinner finished with frankly remarkable figures of 3 for 21, finishing the night atop the wicket charts. Relatively, this was a better batting show from England after two miserable outings despite losing Jonny Bairstow off the first ball of the chase and Joe Root in the fifth over. Malan and Stokes kept their inner bees and butterflies under wraps to score half-centuries and put the chase back on target. But all that circumspection seemed un-England like and eventually the cracks were out on display once more when Pat Cummins had Malan heaving one to square leg right after the England opener had got to 50. There was still hope as long as Stokes remained at the crease but the



trouble for England in this campaign had been that Stokes hadn't been at the crease long enough when he was available to play. Today, there were flashes of the old when he belted Travis Head over his head for a six or when he picked a length delivery from Mitchell Starc and sent it soaring over deep square leg for six. But having taken 90 balls for his 64, he attempted to sweep Zampa only to

find the fielder at short-fine for a soft dismissal. The rest of the line-up didn't have the wherewithal to mount a successful chase in the backdrop of a mounting asking rate although there were handy knocks from Moeen Ali (42) and Chris Woakes (32), that helped to keep the margin of defeat to a narrow 33 runs. The Champions Trophy berth, however, had slipped away further

from England than it had been at the start of the day. Where England slipped to their sixth defeat in seven games, this was Australia's fifth win on the bounce after an equally shaky start themselves. The win, which put them on the cusp of sealing qualification to the semifinals, was achieved through several important performances, not least

that of Zampa's efforts with the ball. Marnus Labuschagne scored a vital 71 and Cam Green, Steve Smith and Stoinis added significant little contributions to add heft to the total. Put into bat, they got off to an unusually slow start after Woakes prized out both Travis Head and David Warner inside the PowerPlay. England gambled after a 48-run PowerPlay by bringing in their fifth bowling combination of Liam Livingstone and Moeen Ali ahead of lead spinner Adil Rashid and that was an invitation for the rebuilding pair of Smith and Labuschagne to transfer the pressure back onto the bowling side. Both Smith and Labuschagne picked up a boundary each of Moeen's first over and moved into the 30s forcing Rashid's introduction. The legspinner, one of the team's brightest prospects in a forgettable campaign, struck in just

his second over when Smith went chasing after a cleverly floated up delivery outside off-stump. Smith fell six short of a half-century and Rashid quickly added the wicket of Josh Inglis in the next over to force Australia into another period of rebuilding. Cameron Green and Labuschagne provided just that while picking up the regular boundary against the fifth bowler. Green even got two boundaries off a Mark Wood over to before the fast bowler hit back in his next over to break the stand by nipping a pacy delivery back into Labuschagne. Australia's No.4 had done his job with a crafty 71 off 83 but took back a review with him. Another period of rebuilding followed as Green and Marcus Stoinis took the team to 220/5 at the 40th over. But Australia's launch had to be delayed as Green fell immediately

thereafter to the returning David Willey, who slipped a full delivery under his attempted slog sweep. When Stoinis fell for 35 right after hitting Livingstone for a six and a four in the 44th over, Australia faced the prospect of folding well below the 50th over. But a key cameo from Zampa (29 off 19) ensured they missed out on only three balls of their available quota to finish with a solid total against a struggling opponent, who had chased only two scores about 250 in their World Cup history. Today wasn't a day to add to that list.

selection panel as well with David Mutendra remaining convenor. Former skipper Elton Chigumbura has also been added as the third member of the panel. Blessing Ngondo has been named the new chairman of the Cricket Committee with Hamilton Masakadza, Kenyon Ziehl, Russell

Tiffin, Julia Chibhabha, Houghton and Chigumbura being the other members. Even though there are no changes made to the women's cricket setup, the board has announced that there will be a review after the ICC Women's T20 World Cup Africa Qualifier.

## All round Amelia Kerr helps Heat return to winning ways

**NewDelhi :**Amelia Kerr starred with both bat and ball in her first appearance of the season to help Brisbane Heat return to winning ways. Kerr first picked two wickets as Hobart Hurricanes were restricted to just 120/8. And then in the run chase, the New Zealander hit a fluent 59 off just 43 balls to star in the run chase as Heat reclaimed their top spot. Hurricanes made a disastrous start when Lizelle Lee was dismissed for just 1. While Elyse Villani stood firm at one end, wickets kept tumbling

at the other. Among the top six, three batters were dismissed for single-digit scores before Ruth Johnston joined forces with Villani to stem the rot. From 44/5, they helped their team recover briefly before Heat fought back. Villani was left stranded on 58\* but with almost no support at the other end, Hurricanes posted a below par total. Molly Strano did give her side a dream start with the ball to raise Hurricanes' hopes. Georgia Redmayne also departed in the powerplay and that did put a bit of pressure on the batting side before

## Fakhar times it right

**NewDelhi:**A dense cloud cover had been building up for close to an hour. And when the rain finally arrived, interrupting play at 21.3 overs in Pakistan's chase, Babar Azam patted Fakhar Zaman all the way back to the pavilion. For a man who watched most of Pakistan's rollercoaster of a campaign unfold sitting in the dugout, with a constant chatter of both form and confidence deserting him, the opener embraced the challenge of an exorbitant chase with a statement hundred. A redemption, if you will. Pakistan's strategy to know at all times exactly what was required of them to stay alive in the 2023 World Cup semis race was evident from the moment they risked

putting New Zealand in to bat on a flat track. Maybe 400 wasn't exactly what they had planned on conceding then, but to their credit, the track barely had any assistance for any category of bowlers. Now with the over-by-over calculations in their pockets and rain threat overhead, the intent and execution part of the plan was down to the batters. Although, up until 10 minutes into their defense of 401, the Kiwis were comfortably pegged the favourites - what with the scoreboard pressure they built and an early strike to boot. Fakhar Zaman had other plans. The southpaw led the chase in his typically aggressive way, turning it into a 20-over shootout with the obvious first target of

taking a lead on the DLS par score. The first message arrived with the captain himself, at the fall of Abdullah Shafique's wicket in the second over. "If you play 15 overs, we'll be ahead," Babar told him in a brief mid-pitch meetup before taking guard. Zaman followed it to the tee, and then some. Enroute a 63-ball century - the fastest by a Pakistani batter in ODI World Cups - he rained 11 sixes and eight boundary fours as he cut loose in retaliation. After "surviving" the first four overs and getting a lay of the land, the Pakistan opener teed off against a Trent Boult hit-me loosener by swatting it over midwicket to the fence and hacked the following legside freebie into deep square



leg stand. Tim Southee was dished out similar treatment next, in that order. When he was done punishing the experienced, Zaman mauled offspin - an oft-exposed chink in his armour otherwise.

Encouraged by the only maiden the run-fest Chinnaswamy witnessed on Saturday, Kane Williamson decided to persist with Glenn Phillips but the left-hander instead took

him to the cleaners, pinching 36 off the next 15 balls he faced from the part-timer. The credit for this turnaround - especially the domination over offspin - was duly

given in the most heartfelt way to another offspinner who identified the shortcomings and offered generous help. "At this level in international cricket, there are always ups and downs," he said of the poor patch of 11 fifty-less innings in the lead-up to the World Cup century. "The Asia Cup didn't go well for me. I had a highest of 30 maybe? It wasn't a good time for me. "I did not rest though. I got home for a couple of days but then I went over to Peshawar to work with our fielding coach Aftab Khan at his academy. He'd spotted my weakness against offspin and since he'd been an offspinner himself, I worked a lot with him during that

phase. He then often would come back with me, from Peshawar, to work more on it at the academy near my home. "Today's century I would like to dedicate to Aftab Khan and a guy named Ibrahim at his academy, because... The things he's shared with me, the time he's given me - not many people give you that kind of focus. You need such people around. If you end up performing, your hard work gets noticed. And when you can't, no one values that hard work. "Here too, with the batting coach, we get 30 minutes and I was there ahead of time to put in the hard yards. Now that I have scored runs, it's easy to say it was all my hardwork but at this level everyone works hard and tried to push the limits.
