Kolkata (Ambar Mukherjee): EMAMI Limited’s consolidated revenues at Rs. 865 crore grew by 6% for the quarter and half year ended 30th September 2023. Protecting the right to education for migrants and refugees, regardless of their identification documents or residence status, is a crucial moral and legal imperative in today's interconnected world. Discriminatory barriers, explicitly prohibited by international legal and political agreements, must be eradicated through unequivocal legal measures. Furthermore, governments should take proactive steps to ensure that migrant and displaced families are aware of their rights and provided with information on registering and progressing in school. Timely access to education is essential to minimize the duration children spend out of school to no more than three months. Therefore, it is imperative to include displaced people in national education systems, allocate

sufficient resources, and address the unique challenges faced by migrants and refugees. Eliminating Discriminatory Barriers Discriminatory barriers to education should have no place in any society. International agreements have unequivocally condemned discrimination based on nationality or residence status, and these principles should be enshrined in national law. Regulations must be drafted precisely, leaving no room for misinterpretation or arbitrary decisions by individual officers. Legal frameworks must protect the right to education for all, irrespective of immigration or refugee status. The objective is to provide equal opportunities to every child, fostering social cohesion and preventing marginalization. Raising Awareness and Minimising Educational Disruption Awareness is the first step toward ensuring the right to education for migrants and displaced families. Authorities should actively disseminate information about

registration procedures, available resources, and the importance of education. This can help dispel misinformation and fears that often hinder enrollment. Besides, minimizing the time spent away from studying is crucial. The aim should be to have children out of school for up to three months. This requires streamlined registration processes and support mechanisms to address language barriers, cultural differences, and the trauma often experienced by displaced children. Schools should offer counselling services to help students and their families cope with the emotional challenges of migration and displacement. Inclusion in National Education Systems A cornerstone of ensuring the right to education for migrants and refugees is their inclusion in national education systems. This inclusion should be achieved through multiyear education sector planning with adequate budgetary provisions. Given that most displaced people are hosted in low or middle-income countries, wealthier

nations should step up and provide the necessary financial and technical support to ensure accessible education within a few months of displacement. While exceptional circumstances may temporarily hinder full inclusion, governments must work diligently to minimize the time spent in schools that do not follow the national curriculum or do not lead to recognized certificates. This is essential to safeguard the educational trajectories of migrant and displaced children, ensuring that their learning is not compromised. Supporting Education in Humanitarian and Development Aid Nine out of 10 refugees find refuge in low and middle-income countries that often lack the resources to provide adequate education services. Meeting the educational needs of migrants and displaced individuals necessitates a significant increase in the allocation of resources. Education's share of humanitarian aid should be raised substantially to meet these requirements.

However, humanitarian aid alone cannot suffice. There is a pressing need for humanitarian and development donors to coordinate efforts. Education should be integral to a broader package of solutions, including shelter, nutrition, water, sanitation, and social protection. This comprehensive approach recognizes that education enhances individual lives and contributes to social stability and economic development. Mitigating Educational Disparities in Slum Settings Migrants in slum settings often face disproportionately fewer educational opportunities. The out-of-school rate of primary and secondary school-age children in slums can be significantly higher than in other urban areas. Therefore, public authorities must prioritize public education in slum settings and ensure that schools are easily accessible to these marginalized communities. Seasonal employers, such as construction and agricultural companies, should

collaborate with governments and NGOs to guarantee that education is provided to children of seasonal migrant workers. This includes developing strategies to accommodate the mobility of these populations while ensuring that educational progress is not disrupted. Bridging Language Barriers and Cultural Adaptation Providing school places for migrants and refugees is just the beginning. Schools must adapt to and support their diverse student populations' unique needs. Many migrants may find themselves in an educational environment with a language of instruction different from their mother tongue. In such cases, bridging programs with qualified teachers are essential to help students gain proficiency in the new language. Language proficiency is essential for academic progress and socialization, relationship-building, and a sense of belonging. A lack of proficiency can increase the risk of discrimination, bullying, and low self-esteem among migrant

students. Therefore, inclusive education must prioritize language acquisition and cultural adaptation. Conclusion The plight of migrants and refugees is a global humanitarian concern, and addressing their unique challenges is paramount. At the heart of this endeavour lies the provision of education. Education is not merely a privilege; it is a fundamental right that can be the key to rebuilding lives shattered by conflict, persecution, or displacement. By affording migrants and refugees access to quality education, we empower them to overcome adversity and contribute positively to the societies they join. Governments, international organizations, and donors must prioritize inclusive policies that make education accessible to displaced populations. Some Buddhists also celebrate the festival to honour their Emperor Ashoka's decision to convert to Buddhism and follow a path of peace and enlightenment. Says Maqsood Ahmed, a teacher in famous Anglo Arabic School, Delhi, "I feel honoured that we celebrate so many festivals in India. India-Canada Ties In "Deep Crisis, CMRI hosted plastic surgeon's meet at Kolkata Its Worst Ever": Experts

New Delhi: Mending frayed diplomatic relations between India and Canada will be a long process after each side adopted maximalist positions, despite New Delhi's surprise move to ease some visa curbs on Canadians, officials and experts say. India recently decided to partially restore visa services, weeks after suspending them in anger at Ottawa's claim that Indian agents may have been involved in the murder of a Khalistani terrorist from Punjab. Mutual recriminations since that accusation, which India strongly denies, have strained ties between the two countries - close for almost a century and with extensive links through the Sikh community - to their worst in memory. And while India's relaxation on visas may have raised some expectations of improved relations, it was not a breakthrough, as neither side has much incentive to hasten a return to normalcy, officials and experts in both countries said. Neither New Delhi nor Ottawa looks likely to take dramatic steps to reconcile soon as Canada's murder investigation proceeds and Prime Minister Narendra Modi prepares for Indian national elections by May. "The relationship is in deep crisis, perhaps its worst ever," said Michael Kugelman, director of



the South Asia Institute at the Wilson Center in Washington. "Each side may have a strong interest in the crisis not getting completely out of control, but that doesn't mean there are strong incentives to resolve the crisis." Ajay Bisaria, India's ambassador to Canada from 2020 to 2022, said the relationship is in a "de-escalation phase" following "quiet diplomacy". Even with the reprieve, the visa curbs are expected to hinder the movement of tens of thousands of Indians and people of Indian origin who live in Canada or plan to study there. Although both governments have spared business and trade links, the acrimony has delayed discussions on a free-trade deal and threatens Group of Seven member Canada's Indo-Pacific plans, where New Delhi is critical to efforts to check an increasingly

assertive China. On Sept. 18 Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said Canada was "actively pursuing credible allegations" linking Indian government agents to the June killing in a Vancouver suburb of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, 45, who had advocated the fringe position seeking to carve an independent Sikh homeland of Khalistan out of India. Canada expelled India's intelligence chief in Ottawa. India quickly responded by halting 13 categories of visas for Canadians and cutting Canada's diplomatic presence in India, a move Ottawa said violated the Vienna Conventions. Then on Oct. 25, New Delhi said it would resume issuing visas under four categories, a measure Indian officials said aims to help people of Indian origin travel to India during the wedding season beginning this month.

"This is not a thaw," an Indian foreign ministry official told Reuters. "People can read whatever they want into it." Ottawa triggered the crisis and must take the first step towards climbing down from its position, another official said. A senior Canadian government source said that while Ottawa's ultimate goal was to return to where things were, unpredictability in coming months over the murder investigation and trial, as well as India's elections, could interfere. "This is a difficult moment, but Canada is not abandoning its Indo-Pacific strategy," the source said. Officials in India and Canada spoke on condition of anonymity as they were not authorised to speak on the subject. The Indian foreign ministry did not respond to a request for comment.

Canada's foreign ministry pointed to comments made by Foreign Minister Melanie Jolie on Oct. 30. "We have a long-term approach when it comes to India because this is a relationship that has spanned decades, and we all know that we have very strong people-to-people ties with the country," Jolie said, adding she continued to talk to her Indian counterpart. Canada has the largest Sikh population outside Punjab, with 770,000 people reporting Sikhism as their religion in the 2021 census. India is by far Canada's largest source of foreign students, accounting for 40% of study permit holders - a vital source for Canada's fast-growing international education business, contributing over C\$20 billion (\$15 billion) to the economy annually. India-Canada tensions over Sikh separatism have haunted the relationship since the 1980s. PM Modi, who heads a Hindu-nationalist party and cultivates a strongman image, is unlikely to be seen backing down, especially before the elections. Despite the "modest de-escalation" over visas, Kugelman said most of the retaliatory measures remain "and there's still a lot of anger on both sides. So we shouldn't overstate the de-escalatory potential here".

Arvind Kejriwal To "Work From Jail" If Arrested? What AAP Said

New Delhi(KCN): The Aam Aadmi Party has said it will seek the court's permission to have Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal working from jail in case he is arrested by the Enforcement Directorate. At a meeting today, the party MLAs have told Mr Kejriwal that even if the Central agency arrests him, he should run the government from jail. "We are going among the people. The people are saying that atrocities are being committed against the Aam Aadmi Party and Arvind Kejriwal. That is why, all the MLAs requested the Chief Minister today that

even if he goes to jail, he should remain the CM. The people of Delhi have elected him as CM and he should remain the CM," said Delhi minister Aatishi. "We will go to court and seek permission to hold the cabinet meeting in the jail itself," she added. Mr Kejriwal was summoned for questioning by the Enforcement Directorate, which is probing the alleged money laundering angle in the liquor scam, on November 2. He skipped the questioning, and predicted that he would be arrested soon. He has earlier been questioned by the Central Bureau of

Investigation or CBI. Mr Kejriwal's former Deputy, Manish Sisodia, had stepped down from the cabinet post after his arrest in February. He is still in jail. Last week, the Supreme Court turned down his bail petition, saying tentative evidence has been established by the investigating agencies. In a 41-page order, the court accepted the argument of the CBI that there is a "carefully hatched conspiracy" to ensure that a select few make windfall gains. The policy "facilitated getting bribes" from wholesale distributors who are "assured of exorbitant profits".

"Until We Win": Israel Steps Up Assault, Says Gaza Strip "Cut Into Two"

NewDelhi:Tel Aviv, Israel: Israel said Sunday it was pounding Gaza with "significant" strikes after cutting it in two, as America's top diplomat pressed a Middle East tour focused on humanitarian aid for the Palestinians. Israeli forces "have encircled Gaza City... Now there exists a south Gaza and a north Gaza," army spokesman Daniel Hagari said. He spoke after US Secretary of State visited the occupied West Bank, Iraq and Cyprus Sunday on a whirlwind tour with the focus on aid for beleaguered civilians in Gaza and preventing attacks by Iran-backed groups on American troops in response to Israel's Gaza war. Blinken met Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas who denounced what he called "genocide" in Gaza, where the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory said at least 9,770 people, mostly civilians, had been killed in more than four weeks of war.

With telecommunications in Gaza cut for a third time, Washington rebuffed calls for a ceasefire and backed Israel's goal of crushing Hamas who staged the worst attack in

the country's history on October 7, killing more than 1,400 people, also mostly civilians, and taking over 240 hostages, according to Israeli officials. Global concern has soared over the spiralling Gaza death toll, but Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu again vowed that "there won't be a ceasefire until the hostages are returned". "Let them remove this from their lexicon. We are saying this to our enemies and to our friends," the veteran right-wing premier said after meeting troops at an air force base. "We will simply continue until we win. We have no alternative." Soldiers engaged in house-to-house combat on Sunday as tanks and armoured bulldozers churned through the sand in footage released by the army. "This strike is like an earthquake," Gaza City resident Alaa Abu Hasera said in a devastated area where entire blocks have been reduced to rubble. Blinken, in his talks with Abbas, said Palestinians in Gaza "must not be forcibly displaced", a US State Department spokesman said. Israel has distributed



leaflets and sent text messages urging Palestinian civilians in northern Gaza to head south, but a US official said Saturday at least 350,000 civilians remained in what is now an urban war zone. Abbas denounced "the genocide and destruction suffered by our Palestinian people in Gaza at the hands of Israel's war machine, with no regard for the principles of international law," the official Palestinian news agency Wafa said. "Stop extremist violence" Israel has relentlessly pounded Gaza in its battle to destroy Hamas, levelling entire city blocks. "Right now, parents in Gaza do not know whether they can feed their children today and

whether they will even survive to see tomorrow," said Cindy McCain, head of the World Food Programme. Blinken last week told a Senate hearing Abbas's Palestinian Authority (PA) should retake control of Gaza after the war. It currently exercises only limited autonomy in parts of the West Bank and Netanyahu has long sought to sideline it. Abbas said Sunday the PA could return to power in Gaza in the future only if a "comprehensive political solution" is found for the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Washington has said it backs a Palestinian state alongside Israel, but Netanyahu's hard-right government has been implacably opposed. The war has exacerbated

tensions in the West Bank, where more than 150 Palestinians have been killed in clashes with Israeli forces and in settler attacks, according to the Palestinian health ministry. Blinken and Abbas discussed "the need to stop extremist violence against Palestinians" in the West Bank, the State Department said. Since Israel sent ground forces into the north of Gaza late last month, "over 2,500 terror targets have been struck" by "ground, air and naval forces", the army said Sunday. Phone and internet connections were down for the third time during the war, according to Paltel, the last remaining major operator. Shortly after the blackout, the Israeli army launched

its intense bombardment on Gaza City and other nearby zones in the territory's north. Some explosions were so powerful they could be heard in Rafah in the far south, an AFP journalist said. Hamas said Israel was carrying out "intense bombings" around several hospitals in northern Gaza. Images showed civilians heading south away from the fighting, though military spokesman Hagari told foreign reporters Hamas was using roadblocks to try to prevent them from fleeing. "We saw dead bodies in the streets," Suhad Zorob said as she fled south. "We saw the tanks... only one street away from us." The Gaza health ministry said Israeli bombing of Al-Maghazi refugee camp late Saturday killed 45 people, with an eyewitness reporting children dead and homes smashed. "An Israeli air strike targeted my neighbours' house in Al-Maghazi camp, my house next door partially collapsed," said Mohammed Alaloul, 37, a journalist working for the Turkish Anadolu Agency. He told AFP the bombing killed four of his children, four of his brothers and

several of his nieces and nephews. The Israeli military has said it is looking into whether its forces were operating in the area at the time of the bombing. Blinken faced a rising tide of anger in meetings with Arab foreign ministers in Jordan on Saturday, where he reaffirmed US support for "humanitarian pauses" rather than a ceasefire. The new US ambassador to Israel, Jack Lew, said Sunday the October 7 Hamas attack was "a stain on humanity that cannot happen again". After visiting the West Bank, Blinken made a brief stop in Cyprus, the nearest EU member state, which has said it is working towards establishing a maritime corridor for aid to Gaza. He then flew to Baghdad and met Prime Minister Mohamed Shia al-Sudani. "I made very clear that attacks or threats coming from militias that are aligned with Iran are totally unacceptable," Blinken said in Baghdad. Later Blinken was expected in Turkey, whose President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has held Netanyahu personally responsible for Gaza's growing civilian death count. Turkey on Saturday said

it was recalling its ambassador to Israel and breaking off contacts with Netanyahu. International concern mounted over the suffering. French Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna, visiting Qatar, called for "an immediate, durable and observed humanitarian truce" that could "lead to a ceasefire". Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry of Egypt, which has been acting as the sole conduit for foreigners to escape Gaza and for aid to get in, on Saturday called for an "immediate and comprehensive ceasefire". That call was echoed by thousands of protesters in Washington in solidarity with Palestinians, one of multiple rallies held from Indonesia to Iran, as well as in European cities. Thousands also demonstrated in Israel on Saturday as pressure mounts on Netanyahu over his government's lack of preparedness for the October 7 attacks and its handling of the hostage crisis. Hundreds outside Netanyahu's Jerusalem residence calling on him to resign, while in Tel Aviv relatives and friends of some of the hostages chanted "bring them home now".

Walter believes 'outskilled' SA can still turn the tables on India

New Delhi: Rob Walter brings many attributes to his position as South Africa's head coach. An oversized ego is not among them, which helps when you're lumped with explaining a record defeat. There was no better candidate to do so in the wake of India's thundering 243-run win in a men's World Cup match at Eden Gardens on Sunday. The game was a top-of-table clash between teams who had lost only one of their combined 14 matches in the tournament. But there was just one side in it throughout as India piled up 326/5 with Virat Kohli scoring 101 not out to equal Sachin Tendulkar's ODI world record of 49 centuries. Then Ravindra Jadeja took 5/33 as South Africa crashed to 83 all out in 27.1 overs to seal their

heaviest ever loss by runs in the format. India made more runs in their powerplay - 91 - than the South Africans in their entire innings. How had things gone so badly wrong? "Good question and an understatement altogether," Walter said. "It was just a day where we were outskilled. They got off to a flyer and we pulled it back nicely. [India's total] was too much on that deck, and then from a bowling point of view they put us under pressure from the word go. We couldn't claw our way back in." South Africa's XI bristled with Quinton de Kock, Rassie van der Dussen, Aiden Markram and Heinrich Klaasen, who scored eight centuries between them in their team's first seven games. On Sunday none of them made more than

Klaasen's 13, and they made 28 runs combined. Marco Jansen arrived at Eden Gardens as the World Cup's most dangerous new-ball bowler, having taken 18 wickets in the powerplay. After his first four overs on Sunday he had been hit for 43 runs. He finished with a career-worst 1/94 at an economy rate of 9.72. Walter didn't think that chastening experience would damage Jansen's confidence: "It's a gift, isn't it, being able to run out in front of thousands in a game like today and with so many learning opportunities out there? He struggled today but he's got the skill-set to bounce back and be effective the next time around. What he has now is the value of having competed and felt what it's like to be in a cauldron with so many



people cheering against you. That experience is invaluable. You can't get that anywhere else but here." As both teams had qualified for the semifinals before Sunday, not much was riding on the match. But South Africa could meet the Indians again in the

knockouts. How did that make Walter feel? "You have to believe that on the day, if you execute your skills, you've also got a chance. We didn't get that right from the word go today. "But you get taught new lessons every day and get surprised every day. So it wouldn't surprise me if

the tables were turned the next time around. The beauty of it is that there may well be another shot for us." At least, South Africa's supporters will say to each other, their team didn't beat themselves. Instead, they fell victim to vastly better opponents. Walter concurred: "The

scoreboard will tell you everything you need to know. India were far superior, there are no two ways about that. "Just like we've been far superior to other teams that, on paper, we have looked evenly matched with or are potentially superior to us. "Once you get your nose in front in international cricket, I believe anyone can beat anyone. And today the Indian side got their nose in front. We weren't able to get back into the game." That didn't mean the South Africans would wear their defeat lightly: "If you walk into that changing room now you're going to find a group of guys highly disappointed that we weren't able to pay tribute to what was an awesome occasion and a great opportunity to showcase our skills. We've played

so well throughout this World Cup and we would have wanted nothing more than for this to be a great contest." Walter's team will have to regroup in time for a potentially challenging last league match against Afghanistan in Ahmedabad on Friday. "As far as the next four days go, for us it's about doing what we've done the whole time, using the time available to us to get ready for the next fixture, and then it's into a semi-final. Nothing changes. "The guys have worked incredibly hard on their game and we have invested a huge amount of time into our preparation. Now it's about recovering mentally and physically and being ready to compete like we have the whole tournament." But not, he didn't have to say, like they failed to do on Sunday.

To equal my hero's record in ODIs is a huge honour: Virat Kohli

Kolkata: Sachin Tendulkar has a wish. That Virat Kohli goes from "49 to 50" much sooner than the 365 days it took him to turn a year older. On Sunday, Kohli got to the '49' - the record-equalling number of ODI centuries with Sachin Tendulkar. India's batting superstar referred to his feat as "stuff of dreams" and opened up how just equalling his "hero's record" was a "very emotional moment" for him. "Every opportunity to play for India is a big one. To be able to ton up on my birthday is stuff of dreams," Kohli said in the innings break at the iconic Eden Gardens, immediately after his record feat. "Grateful to God that I've blessed with such moments." After India sealed a massive victory over South Africa by 243 runs, Kohli was a bit more open about his feelings around the hundred that put him at par with Tendulkar in the ODI format.



"To equal my hero's record in ODIs is something that is a huge honour for me," he said during the post-match presentation ceremony. "I know that people like comparisons but I am never going to be as good as him [Sachin]. There's a reason why we've all looked up to him. He's perfection when it comes to batting... he's always going to be my hero regardless of what happens. It's a very emotional moment for me. I know where I come from, I know the days that I've watched him

play on TV, so just to stand here and get this appreciation from someone like him means a lot to me." Did he have a sense that playing another top team on his birthday, and at the Eden Gardens in front of about 65,000 people, would be special? "First things first, it was a big game. Probably playing the toughest team in the tournament we've played so far, to be very honest. They played some amazing cricket so there was this motivation of wanting to do well for the team. Because it

happened to be my birthday obviously it becomes a bit more special. People made it a bit more special for me. "I had this sense of... it's going to be something more than one more game in the World Cup. I did wake up with that excitement," Kohli revealed. After a few years of low returns, Kohli is back to his usual run-scoring ways but he's more grateful for being able to enjoy the game, a feeling he admitted to having lost somewhere in the middle of playing all the cricket. "I would say I am enjoying myself playing cricket all over again. That to me is more special than thinking about phases [in my career] as such. I think in a phase when things are not working well, you're not enjoying yourself, that's what I take out of it. You're still able to score runs because of your experience, but being out there even for those 50-60 runs is not as enjoyable as it is right now.

New Delhi: West Indies spinner Sunil Narine has called time on his international career. The 35-year-old revealed his decision via a post on his instagram page while also re-affirming that he will continue to play franchise cricket around the world. Narine broke into the limelight during the 2011 Champions League T20 and made his international debut in the same year for West Indies. While he played only six Tests, with his last appearance in the format coming almost a decade ago, he played a prominent role in West Indies winning the World T20 in 2012. Narine also took the IPL by storm in his very first season in 2012 when he was named the Player of the Tournament, helping Kolkata Knight Riders win the title. While he continued his merry ways for two more seasons, he was suspended from bowling in international cricket in November 2015.



He was cleared to bowl again in April 2016 but post that, he managed to play only a handful of games for West Indies, with his most recent appearance coming in August 2019 in a T20I. Later on, despite showcasing form in the IPL, Narine wasn't considered by West Indies for the T20 World Cup in 2021 after failing to meet the required fitness standards. Overall, the 35-year-old has picked 165 wickets across formats in international cricket. "I appreciate it has been

over four years since I last played for West Indies but today I am announcing my retirement from international cricket," Narine said. "Publicly I am a man of few words but privately there are a few people who have given me unwavering support throughout my career and helped me realise my dream of representing West Indies and to you I express my deepest gratitude. "I would like to acknowledge and thank Cricket West Indies, the

coaching staff, passionate West Indies fans and of course my teammates who enabled me play at the highest level, in all formats and with some memorable successes." Narine also confirmed that the ongoing Super50 Cup will be his final tournament in List A cricket. "Winning this current Super50 Cup will be the perfect send-off," he said. "Needless to say, outside of this it will continue to be business as usual for me in the franchise world in the foreseeable future."

World Cup Semi-final Scenarios For All 6 Teams In Contention Explained

New Delhi: With India and South Africa having already qualified for the World Cup semifinals and following Pakistan and Australia winning their respective matches in the World Cup on Saturday, here is how the qualification scenario looks like for the other teams in the competition: Australia (10 points): With two more ties to go for the Kangaroos, currently placed third, they need to win one more fixture to ensure a spot in the semis. Afghanistan and Bangladesh are their upcoming opponents. If they lose both their games, they will have

to depend on favourable results in other matches. New Zealand (8 points): The BlackCaps, currently fourth, don't have much of a choice now and need to prevail in their only remaining match against Sri Lanka. However, a victory in that encounter would not guarantee them their place in the semis, as they will also have to expect Pakistan and Afghanistan to lose their remaining games. If New Zealand lose, they will have to rely on Pakistan, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka and the Netherlands to lose their remaining



contests, and that too by huge margins. Pakistan (8 points): The Men in Green are currently placed fifth

and in a similar situation as New Zealand. While they will also have to win their remaining contest

against England, they will also have to ensure that they win by a big margin to better their net run rate (0.036)

compared to the Kiwis (0.398). If they lose to the Three Lions, they would hope that NZ, Afghanistan, Lanka and the Netherlands also lose by big margins. Sri Lanka (4 points): The Lions, currently placed seventh, play Bangladesh and New Zealand next. Besides winning the two contests by significant margins, they must pray for the above-mentioned teams to lose their remaining games and that too by considerable margins to have an outside chance of making it to the semis.
