KYIV(KCN): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has accused Russia of engaging in "energy terrorism" after Russian strikes on Ukraine's energy network left millions of residents without power. About 4.5



million people were without electricity across the country, Zelenskyy said in his nightly address Thursday.

Kyiv Mayor Vitali Klitschko said 450,000 apartments in the capital alone did not have electricity on Friday. "I appeal to all residents of the capital: save electricity as much as possible because the situation remains difficult!" the mayor wrote on Telegram. Stateowned grid operator Ukrenergo reported on Friday that emergency blackouts would take place across Kyiv.

Russia has repeatedly carried out missile and



drone attacks on Ukrainian power facilities, particularly in recent weeks. In his address, Zelenskyy described the targeting of energy infrastructure as a sign of weakness. "The very fact that Russia is resorting to energy terrorism shows the weakness of our enemy,

he said. "They cannot beat Ukraine on the battlefield, so they try to break our people this way."

The Kremlin-installed regional administration already has moved tens of thousands of civilians out of the city, citing the threat of increased shelling as Ukraine's army pursues a counteroffensive to reclaim the region. Authorities removed the Russian flag from the Kherson administration building on Thursday, a week after the regional government moved out.

Ukraine's southern military spokeswoman, Natalia Humeniuk, said the flag's removal could be a ruse "and we should not hurry to rejoice." She told Ukrainian television that some Russian military personnel are disguising themselves as civilians. Neither side's claims could be independently verified.



Bhubaneswar(KCN): In order to decrease the cases of fatality due to road traffic accidents, and in pursuance to the observations of Hon'ble Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety, Government in Department of Health & Family Welfare (DoHFW) have strengthened the Trauma Care Facilities (TCF) in



Secretary Health & Family Welfare, Shalini Pandit has reviewed the TCF arrangement in the State with senior officials of the DOHFW.

To start with by the support of Government of India few Trauma Care Facilities were strengthened during the 11th Finance Year Plan and 12th Finance Year Plan, Such TCF are SCB MCH Cuttack, MKCG MCH Brahmapur, VIMSAR Burla, DHS Khurda, Bhadrak, Balasore and RGH Rourkela.

Subsequently 33 TCFs are notified out of which 3

are Level I type, 4 are level II type and rest 26 are level III type.

To strengthen more, and to provide cashless treatment in 1st 48 hours of trauma, a scheme Free Treatment for Trauma Fund has been rolled out in 2019. As on today11 private level I type trauma facilities have been empanelled.

For support to these TCFs, schemes have been made like "New Casualty and Trauma Care" and "Free Treatment for Trauma Fund"

For further strengthening and to reduce the fatality due to Road Traffic Accidents, 7 more private hospitals with trauma care facility of level I type have been approved.

A standard operating procedure has been formulated. The MoU with the new facilities shall be signed soon. The scheme is supervised by Additional DMET Odisha as State Nodal Officer.

The Trauma Facilities where free treatment can be available under the scheme are Ashwini Trauma Centre, Cuttack, AMRI Hospitals, Bhubaneswar, KIMS, Bhubaneswar, Hi-Tech Medical college & Hospital, Bhubaneswar, Kalinga Hospital, Bhubaneswar, Utkal Institute of Medical Science, Bhubaneswar. Medicover Vishakhapatnam, Rama Krishna Care Hospital, Raipur, JP Hospital, Rourkela, IMS & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar, SUM Ultimate, Bhubaneswar, Sunshine Hospital, Bhubaneswar, Care Hospital, Bhubaneswar, Blue Wheel Hospital, Bhubaneswar, Padmini Care, DRIEMS, Tangi, Cuttack, SashiBhusan Memorial Hospital, Cuttack, Sun Hospital, Cuttack, Trisha Hospital, Cuttack.

As all the hospitals have Level I trauma Care facility, this will be of immense help to the trauma victims according to H&FW department.

Orissa HC tells state govt told to explore option of non-motorised boats in Chilika lake

CUTTACK: The Orissa High Court on Thursday asked the state government to explore the possibility of operating solar/battery powered or sail boats in Mangaljodi area of Chilika Lake instead of motor boats which cause both

and air pollution. The division bench of Chief Justice S Muralidhar and Justice Murahari Sri Raman said, "An affidavit in this regard to be filed by the state government before the next date (December 19).'

The court was hearing the petition filed by

Debakar Behera, a resident of the area alleging that the operation of the motorised fishing boats was posing a threat to the safe haven for migratory birds at Mangaljodi.

It issued the order taking into consideration an affidavit filed by Director of Fisheries Smruti Ranjan Pradhan in reply to the petition. The Director of Fisheries had opposed the ban on operating motorised fishing boats in the channels and sub-channels of Mangaljodi, claiming that their movement does not affect the population of the migratory birds to the spot.

He claimed in the affidavit that the number of migratory birds coming to Mangaljodi had increased from 1,05,462 in 2018 to 2,25,500 in 2022. Such increase in numbers is due to reduced poaching and involvement of local community who are traditional fishermen.

"Any restriction on movement of motorised boats would adversely affect the livelihood of traditional fishermen, not only of the



Mangaljodi area but also adjoining area. Besides, there is need for co-existence of traditional fishermen for their livelihood and conservation of migratory birds in Chilika lake. The locals, who are involved in conservation of the migratory birds and its ecosystems also belong to the fishermen households," Pradhan further stated.

According to the affidavit, fishermen of the Mangaljodi area use both motorised and nonmotorised traditional fishing boats for fishing. Such traditional fishing boats are being duly registered since the enactment of the Orissa Marine Fishing Regulation (OMFR) Act in 1981. About 189 motorised and 128 non-motorised fishing boats are registered under the Act are operating in the area.

The politics behind Imran blaming Pakistan government and military for his shooting

Pakistan (KCN): Imran Khan is not the first politician to be shot at in Pakistan. Nor will he be the last. The nation's political history is filled with stories of bloodbath, chaos, and loss of lives of prominent political figures in terror attacks, through judicial pronouncement or regime changes imposed through military takeovers. Every time such an incident occurs, one party becomes the beneficiary and another gets to play the victim card. Unfortunately, Pakistani politics has been like this by and large. It is one of the prime reasons the country has not been privileged enough to have even one premier who could complete their five years in office as Prime

mileage from it by issuing a video message from the hospital bed, asking people to come out onto the streets for a 'tabdili march' (march for a change). It played a substantial part in propelling Imran Khan to the country's premiership.

In the latest incident in Gujranwala, an assassination attempt was made on Imran while he was leading another anti-government long march from Lahore to Islamabad. The chain of events before and after the incident certainly hints at another attempt to capitalise on the incident. It could help him metamorphise from a mere political opponent or establishment pariah into an absolute

hero without compe-

Soon after Imran got shot in the foot, he ensured that his close aide Asad Umar released a statement accusing Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Federal Minister of Interior Rana Sanaullah, and senior intelligence officers and Director General of Rangers Sindh

Major-General Faisal Naseer as the ones responsible for the assassination attempt on him. There was a demand to immediately remove all three men from their positions. Imran also threatened continued countrywide protests by his political party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), until the demand is

This seems another flashback of past instances when the country's politicians played games of optics and, more often than not, were successful in coming into power thanks to their narratives.

Even though the assassination attempt directly questions the efficacy of security arrangements by the Punjab provincial government under Chief Minister Pervaiz Elahi -he became CM after becoming Imran's candidate - the latter 'shielded' him and pointed fingers at the federal government's top leadership and the military establishment. The only reason for this is that Imran seeks 'national' opponents, like the federal government and the military. He has repeatedly slammed the military establishment for allegedly colluding with political parties opposed to him and who, according to him, became part of the conspiracy of the US-led regimechange maneuver to oust his government. Since his ouster, Imran Khan has pursued his anti-US and anti-establishment narrative,

which has been well-received by the masses and the public. His public speeches are full of name-calling, taunting, and accusations against the military establishment for backing the current coalition government of political parties, who he says are slaves of the west and, specifically, the United States.

This anti-establishment, anti-US and regimechange narrative is not new to the country.

lic protest cannot be heard and felt if it is peaceful and a movement cannot trigger major reactions from the corridors of power until blood is spilled. This is backed by the belief that a political leader cannot become successful in the country until he has the support of a powerful military establishment. Îmran Khan has triggered unprecedented landmark changes in Pakistani politics through



Before Imran, his rivals also peddled the same narrative and mocked his government for being "selected" by the establishment. However, such political narratives have always beencoupled with a bloody incident, either in the form of a terror attack, assassination, or, as in the current scenario, an assassina-

tion attempt on a popular political leader.

Soon after the latest assassination attempt, PTI's supporters came out onto the streets of Pakistan and protested angrily. And like any other political narrative building under the pillars of bloodshed, the protests were aimed at slamming the federal government and, more importantly, the military leadership, with people openly lashing out with abuses and angry slogans against the military for threatening to push the country towards civil war. The purely strategic message of their political messiah Imran Khan was enough for them to act in this manner.

Political campaigners in Pakistan have often deliberately opted for the notion that a pubwidespread public polarisation. His is a politics of absolute hate against his opponents to the extent that they are openly called traitors. The military establishment is slammed openly for not intervening and coming to his support for his political reinstatement. He has used the latest opportunity to convince the military that the tide might turn in his favour. He possibly thinks the assassination attempt may create a sympathy wave that can catapult him out of his current political mess and signal the military to take him seriously.

It again underlines how politics in Pakistan is being run on populist narratives and not on the strength of genuine people's support. It is also unfortunate that the success of the political exercise to come to power through the prevalent democratic set-up is entirely dependent on the intervention, inclination, and support of the military establishment. As a result, the political leaders will leave no stone unturned to convince the establishment that they are candidates worthy of power.

One way or the other, strings have been stretched or cut to replace them and deem them unfit to run the country.

All of this has made Pakistan a fertile ground for accusations and counter-accusations. Terror group Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) claimed responsibility for assassinat-

ing Pakistan's first woman prime minister Benazir Bhutto in 2007. But still, Bhutto's Pakistan People's Party (PPP) accused then-President Parvez Musharraf of being involved in the assassination. The PPP narrative caught the people's imagination, bringing the party back to power. Eventually, Benazir's husband. Asif Ali Zardari, even became the president of Pakistan.

Imran himself has led his share of crusades built around narratives he wished to be wo-

In 2014, the cricketing hero turned politician led a 126-day-long march as part of his antigovernment political campaign. He was by far the most popular leader of the time and was challenging the political might of Pakistan Muslim League – Nawaz (PML-N) and the PPP -- with his strong show of power.

Curiously, in a smaller protest march in Lahore in 2013, Imran fell off the container he was standing on and got injured. Though that was an accident, he derived political

He sought personal intervention of the Chief Minister in addressing emerging issues in the border villages in South Odisha, namely Kotia



Gram Group of villages in Pottangi Block in Koraput District and Manikapatna in Gangabada GP of Rayagada Block in Gajapati

"As you would be aware, administrative outreach by Andhra Pradesh Government in these villages has been reported in the past few days. This illegitimate and unfortunate outreach by Andhra Pradesh Government is now not only confined to Kotia but is also gradually spreading to other villages in South Odisha," Mr. Pradhan said.

Reportedly, 21 such villages have been included in the newly carved Parvatipuram Manyam district, with changed nomenclature, with its headquarters just 40 km away from various villages of Kotia, he said.

Union Minister said that Andhra Pradesh has been proactively implementing different schemes and developmental activities in these villages luring these residents to be a part of Andhra Pradesh.

He said the State Government needs to be proactive on the ground, thereby bringing the Government and administration closer to the residents of these border villages.

"Being far away from the district headquarter, people may find the Andhra Pradesh administration more accessible. The neighbouring state may use the same to alienate these citizens from Odisha, and thereby sever their age-old socio-cultural umbilical cord with their motherland," the Union Min-

ister said.

Andhra Pradesh is strategically trying to sway these border villagers by offering ration cards, healthcare, education and other facilities, he observed.

To counter this, Mr.Pradhan said, Odisha should take the local population and organization into confidence and address multiple developmental issues by ensuring people staying in bordering villages are not lured by Andhra Pradesh Gov-

ernment facilities and, expediting the swift implementation of developmental activities of the Odisha Government.

Such administrative face-offs and disputes will not only create a disharmonious environment for the people of these areas but also hinder the development of these villages, he

It will also derail the ongoing development process which goes against the socio-political objectives of both States, and sow seeds for anti-establishment sentiments to take root in this region.

Despite his best attempt over the years, these issues have remained the same as earlier, the BJP leader said.

Bhubaneswar: The demand for employment in Odisha is expected to increase from 175 lakh in the year 2011-12 to 2.10 crore during 2026-27, with incremental demand of 35.8 lakh by 2026-27. 27. This was projected by a study conducted by National Institute of Labour Economic Research and Development (NILERD), an autonomous institute under NITI Aayog, Government of India.

After conducting the study, the institute has submitted its report to the State Government with recommendations.

The study uses both primary survey information of the institutions, establishments and households and secondary data from various ministries, and uses



suitable econometric tools for projections of man-power over the said period to develop a skill de-

velopment eco-system in the State.

Under the baseline scenario, the demand for employment in the State may reach 2.10 crore by 2026-27. Out of which, demand for employment in the agriculture sector would decline from 95.5 lakh in 2011-12 to 89.6 lakh in 2026-27. On the other hand, the demand for employment is expected to increase both in industry and services from 41.7 and 37.8 lakh in 2011-12 to 69.3 and 51.8 lakh in 2026-27, respectively. The manpower demand for the disaggregated sector shows that within industry, higher demand is expected to come from the construction sector (21 lakh in 2011-12 to 43.7 lakh in 2026-27) followed by manufacturing (17.1

lakh in 2011-12 to 19.4 lakh in 2026-27)

Within the service sector, the demand is expected to be highest in sectors like trade, hotel and restaurants, transport, storage and communication, other services (education, health etc.), and banking and insurance. Under the optimistic scenario, the man-power demand may touch 215.5 lakh by 2026-27 from 175.0 lakh in 2011-12 with an incremental demand of 40.6 lakh by 2026-27.

In contrast, manpower demand is expected to remain low under a pessimistic scenario from 175.0 lakh in 2011-12 to 206.7 lakh in 2026-27 with an incremental demand of 31.8 lakh till 2026-27, the

study report says. The study found that roughly 0.45 million people join the labour force every year in the State of Odisha. While the demand for skilled jobs in the State may touch 13 million by the end of 2026-27, the supply of skilled labour force is lagging behind, leading to the shortage of a whopping 11 million

skilled labour force by then.
For the age group 15-59, the supply of manpower is expected to touch 198.1 lakh in 2026-27 from around 176.3 lakh in 2016-17. Therefore, the demand-supply gap of manpower may increase from 4.1 lakh in 2011-12 to 6.3 lakh in 2016-17 and further to 6.5 lakh in 2026-27.

The study also says that the demand for skilled jobs The study also says that the demand for skilled jobs for all age groups may increase to 93.7 lakh in 2016-17 to 131.3 lakh in 2026-27. Across sectors, highest demand for skilled jobs is expected to come from industry (40.7 lakh in 2016-17 to 61.5 lakh in 2026-27) followed by services sector (34.0 lakh in 2016-17 to 46.0 lakh in 2026-27). The skill gap in all three sectors such as agriculture

sector, industry and services is expected to increase over the years. Services sector, driven largely by travel and tourism, retail services, ICT, infrastruc-ture, banking and insurance and other services (education and health) are expected to face higher skill gaps due to more demand for skilled personnel in the future. "The skill gap for the potential sectors such as metal based industries, food processing, textile, travel and tourism, retail sector and ICT are found as 0.92, 0.42, 0.22, 5.61, 3.04, 3.82 lakh respectively by 2026-27," it said. The study has suggested actionable policy plans at the sectoral level to improve the supply situation of skilled manpower and at the same time to create more dopower and at the same time to create more domestic demand to absorb the skilled labour force.

However, fuel prices and exchange rates have adversely impacted our financial performance. We are on a steady path to recovery, benefiting from enormous opportunity both in domestic and

to accommodate this strong demand," he said. In the September quarter, the airline said its capacity increased by 75 per cent and the passenger numbers rose by 75.9 per cent to 1.97 crore.

Gov. Valentyn Reznichenko said eight drones were shot down in the Nikopol area, which was also subjected to artillery shelling. Another drone was shot down over the western Lviv region, Gov. Maksym Kozytskyy said. The commander of Ukraine's armed forces, Valeriy Zaluzhny, said Thursday night that Russian forces had "tripled the intensity of hostilities on certain areas of the front" and were carrying out "up to 80 attacks every day."

Zelenskyy's office said Friday that at least nine civilians were killed and 16 wounded in Ukraine over the past 24 hours. The Russian army attacked four cities close to the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant with drones and heavy artillery. Governor of the Dnipropetrovsk province Valentvn Reznichenko said Friday that houses, cars and a gas pipeline had been damaged overnight in Chervonohryhorivka and that the town was without electricity.

Donetsk province governor Pavlo Kyrylenko said 12 towns and villages were shelled, including Bakhmut and Avdiivka, which have been particularly hard hit in recent weeks.

In occupied Kherson province, the Ukrainian army shelled Russian bases and logistics facilities, destroying two ammunition warehouses, Ukrainian army officials said. Russia illegally annexed the Kherson, Donetsk, Luhansk and Zaporizhzhia regions of Ukraine in late September and subsequently martial law in the four provinces. The Russian military said it struck the rocket engine manufacturing facilities of a factory in the Dnipropetrovsk province city of Pavlohrad, as well as a factory producing Russian families bemoan Ukraine

The Ukrainian Armed Forces also said that the grain corridors in the Black sea were "functioning according to plan." Russia agreed Wednesday to rejoin a wartime agreement brokered by the United Nations and Turkey allowing Ukrainian grain and other commodities to be shipped to world markets. Moscow had suspended its participation in the grain deal over the weekend, citing an alleged drone attack against its Black Sea fleet in Crimea.

As one condition for returning to the deal, Russia demanded the grain be sent to poorer countries, arguing that most of it were currently ending up in richer nations. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said Friday he had discussed the issue of prioritizing less developed countries for grain shipments during a call with U.N. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres.

Erdogan said he also discussed the possibility of sending the grain to nations facing famine for free, during a recent call with Russian President Vladimir Putin. Erdogan said Putin proposed sending free grain to countries such as Somalia, Djibouti and Sudan. The two leaders planned to hold further talks on the topic at a Group of 20 meeting in Bali later this month, Erdogan said. "Should we send this grain and fertilizer to developed countries, or to underdeveloped, poor countries?" Erdogan said during a Friday speech to a business group. "Let's give this support to less developed, down and out countries."
