

WASHINGTON(KCN): The United States will soon be unable to provide Ukraine with certain types of ammunition that are essential to Kyiv's battle against Russia's invasion, as supplies are being used

SCB MCH plans SOP to check newborn theft incidents

CUTTACK(KCN): After coming under severe criticism over alleged theft of a newborn baby from Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU) recently, a highly restricted area of SCB Medical College and Hospital, embarrassed authorities are planning to come up with a standard operating procedure (SOP) to check reoccurrence of such incident.

A couple of Pratap Nagari locality under Cuttack Sadar police station were recently arrested for kidnapping a newborn girl by showing fake discharge certificate and gate pass to security personnel at SNCU. Following the incident, the SCB MCH authorities have planned to issue special gate pass made of plastic instead

of paper.

"We found that the paper SNCU gate pass was forged by miscreants in the recent case. Hence, we are planning to issue plastic gate pass which cannot be forged or tampered easily. We are also planning to come up with a SOP for SNCU management to check the reoccurrence of the incident," said SCB MCH administrative officer Abinash Rout.

As per the planning, apart from deployment of more security personnel, steps will be taken for thorough checking of gate pass by security personnel before a newborn baby is taken into SNCU. The nursing staff will also have the responsibility to check the pass.

tion of Land Encroachment Act have been cancelled for procedural lapses after the appellate authority disposed of the cases. Of the 43 appeals made in the Sub-Collector's court, 39 were disposed of and four are pending in the Orissa High Court.

A massive scam involving illegal settlement of government land in favour of contractors, businessmen and politicians had come to the fore in Kalimela block in 2021. A revenue inspector (RI) and a clerk of Kalimela tehsil office were suspended by the then Malkangiri Collector Vijay Yedulla for their involvement in the irregularities.

The scam surfaced after the Governor's Secretariat, in a letlector to look into the issue on December 17 in 2020 and submit a report.

On the other hand, locals have sought a high-level probe into the scam and dismissal of Anugulia from service. They alleged that several senior officials are involved in the irregularities and demanded action against the then Sub-Collector and ADM of Malkangiri.

'Was difficult to play an 18-year-old': Aamir Khan on 'Laal Singh Chaddha'

Gump, of which it is an adaptation?

We have tried to make it as close to Forrest Gump as possible, but it's an Indianised version. Atul Kulkarni (scriptwriter) and Advait Chandan (director) have made a few changes, and we hope the audience loves it. The Hollywood version had a few adult scenes, but since we wanted to make a family film, we decided to do away with them. We wanted to retain the innocence of the character from the original version.

Did you actually grow a beard for the role?



I grew my beard six inches long. It took me almost six months. I met a Sardar at my gym and liked his look. I told him I wanted to have this look for my next film. I did grow a beard but also used extensions.

Your son Junaid gave screen tests for the film. What happened?

Junaid studied theatre at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and did plays for a year. I told Advait to shoot a few test scenes with him for the film to see if he could handle it. We made him Laal Singh Chaddha and he shot for two weeks. That helped us gauge what Junaid had learnt at school. He was so good as the character that I was in a dilemma if Junaid should do the film. I showed (the tests) to all my close friends who don't give any leeway to my work. Only two people said no--Atul (Kulkarni) and Aditya Chopra. They said that since it was an episodic film, a newcomer should not do it. It's a star vehicle, which is why it was Tom Hanks who played the role in the original.

How did you convince yourself for the role? I prepped for the film, but it stayed in my mind out life and that innocence does not remain.

How close is Laal Singh Chaddha to Forrest role. I got the cue from his screen tests as auditioned for the Gujarati play. Laal.

> You are 57 and the character's age spans from 18 to 50. What was the toughest part about it?

There were challenges during the run sequences. There were a lot of locations and I travelled a lot for one and half months. I don't look 18, but the technical team has done an amazing job with deageing. What was difficult was to mentally prepare as an 18-year-old. You made Kareena Kapoor Khan, who you

are working with after 12 years, audition for her role. Why so, and how was it working together again?

I watched her for the first time in Kabhie Khushi Kabhie Gham and I loved her. Then I did 3 Idiots and Talaash with her. She gets into the character completely and is a fantastic actor. She has never given a screen test, but she agreed for this one because we wanted to see how she would look in the film. After we did a reading with her, both Advait and I realised that she was perfect for the role.

What qualities of Laal have impressed you? He is innocent, doesn't complain, and knows how to leave the past behind. If anyone speaks ill of him, he keeps quiet. He knows that you can't rewind the past. A lot of us don't accept that. Even if he feels bad, he just moves on with life. His mother has taught him that. My relationship with my Ammi has been the same. That's why I could relate to the film. I have learnt a lot in life because of her.

Are you doing Kiran Rao's next film, Lapata

I gave a screen test for it, but she rejected me. Both of us felt that I was not the right fit for the role. I was also busy with Laal, so we decided that if she cannot find anyone, I will be there as a backup.





many good changes and people started cultiviating few good habits. In order to keep our mental helth and sustain it life long, one should engage their mind always in positive activities. We should always be in touch with



Putin's vision of a resurgent Russia: An uphil task

Vladimir Putin, the Russian President seems to have bogged down in a quagmire by invading Ukraine on February 24,2022. His overconfidence to annex Ukraine within a



short time not only backfired ,but also put him in an awkward situation. The February and October Revolution of 1917 under the leadership of Vladimir Lenin

overthrew the authoritarian regime of Czar Nicholas –II and paved the way for the transition of the Russia from monarchy to socialism. At first a socialist state known as the Russian Soviet Federative Socialist Republic (RSFSR) was established on July 10,1918. Then, the Bolsheviks led by Lenin could ultimately form the Union Of Soviet Socialist Republic (USSR) on December 30,1922. The Soviet Republics that had been established by 1922 such as Ukraine, Byelorussia and Transcaucasia joined together to form the USSR or the Soviet Union. After the death of its founder Lenin in 1924, the mantle of leadership fell on Joseph Stalin who turned the Soviet Union into a leading industrial country of Eurasia. The Soviet Union consisted of 15 Soviet Socialist Republics until its dissolution on December 26,1991. The disintegration of the Soviet Union can

be attributed to the policy of Perestroika (Restructuring) and Glasnost (Openness) adopted by Mikhael Gorbachev, its last President. Moreover, though Article 74 of the 1977 Constitution specifically declared the USSR and the 15 Soviet Republics as single entity, Article.72 had granted the constituent units the right to secede away from the Union. Thus, when on December 8,1991 the Belovezh Accord was signed between Russia, Ukraine and Byelorussia to dissolve the Soviet union, it was end of the great super power that was on the same footing as another super power, the USA. In a chain reaction the other 12 Soviet Republics seceded from the Soviet Union and formed the Commonwealth

of Independent States (CIS). The new truncated Russia came into being on April 17,1991 and projected itself as the same USSR that was lost in oblivion. Ever since Vladimir Putin, a former KGB Chief (USSR's overseas Intelligence Agency) got elected as the President of Russia on March 4,2012 he wanted to retrieve the glorious heritage of the past of the Soviet Union. He was looked upon as a strong leader like Stalin who stood for a united and powerful USSR. Putin got elected for the second time as the

new kind of USSR as a global power.

invasion is putting a stop to NATO (North

Atlantic Treaty Organisation)'s expansion.

Another cause that irked Putin was the secret

Biden and Ukrainian President Volodimir Zelensky in January, 2021 for the inclusion of Ukraine as a member country of NATO. Russia's war with Ukraine has taken a heavy toll of innocent lives. The cities of Kyiv, Cherkasy, Kharkiev, Kherson, Mykolaiv, Potlava have been reduced to rubble and civilian life has been disrupted. According to a report by United Nations Human Rights Commission 14,844 civilian casualties in Ukraine have been officially recorded. However, it is believed that the death toll figure may be higher than it. On the other hand, Russia is stated to have lost more than 60,000 troops in this unnecessary war. Since, Russia is hell-bent on defeating Ukraine, it is alleged to follow a scorch earth policy and in a retaliatory move the latter is said to have destroyed the Crimea Bridge linking Crimean Peninsula with Russia, with an act of sabotage, so as to disrupt the military supply line of Russia. 

Grief and outrage in Gambia over cough syrup deaths

BANJUL: When Wuri Bailo Keita's two-year-old daughter Fatoumatta developed a fever, he took her to hospital where she was diagnosed with malaria and sent home with a prescription for a paracetamol syrup.

Less than a week later she was dead. The infant is just one of 69 Gambian children to die of acute kidney failure since July in a series of cases linked to four Indian-made cough syrups.

The widening scandal has highlighted flaws in the tiny West African nation's healthcare system, in turn raising questions about potential loopholes in world pharmaceutical trade.

President Adama Barrow made a nationwide address on Saturday after the police launched an inquiry and health authorities were told to suspend the import licence of a suspected company.

Barrow also promised to update drugs-related laws and praised the work of the health ministry in preventing further deaths. But fear and anger are mounting, and the death toll is still rising.

"President Barrow should sack the health minister, but instead of sacking him, he was praising the minister," said Keita, the grieving father. "We want justice for these children."

Social media has been swamped by criticism of the healthcare system and by photos of the children who have died, most of whom were aged

"It's time for the government to step up and stop these products," Mariama Kuyateh, a 30-year-old mother who lost her son Musa in September, told

"If they don't, and other syrups enter the country, it will be terrible."

No test lab

The deaths were catapulted to global prominence last Wednesday when the UN's World Health Organization (WHO) issued an alert over four syrups made by Maiden Pharmaceuticals of India.

Lab tests found "unacceptable amounts" of diethylene glycol and ethylene glycol, the WHO said. The toxic impact from these substances includes "acute kidney injury which may lead to death," the

The Gambian health authorities, after launching their own investigation in July, on September 23 ordered a recall of all medicines containing paracetamol or promethazine syrup. They have cited E.coli bacteria as a possible cause of the deaths.

India's health ministry said late Thursday it had been informed of the WHO's findings last month and was awaiting the results of its own lab tests on the four

Maiden Pharmaceuticals was not licensed to distribute the four products in India and had only manufactured and exported them to The Gambia, it said. "It is a usual practice that the importing country tests these imported products on quality parameters, and satisfies itself as to the quality of the products," the ministry said.

But The Gambia has no national laboratory to test for drug quality and food safety -- a lack that Barrow on Saturday vowed to redress.

Maiden Pharmaceuticals did not respond to AFP requests for comment after the WHO alert.

'Failed miserably'

Domestic critics accuse Barrow of having failed to protect the public and standing by watchdogs who should have been sacked.

The opposition United Democratic Party (UDP) criticised Barrow's "five-minute

address" to a "traumatised nation left to wonder what other pharmaceuticals are on the market that may be fake or unsafe for use."

Nancy Jallow, of an NGO called Global Bridges, said she was appalled that top officials such as Health Minister Ahmadou Lamin Samateh and the head of the Medicines Control Agency, Markieu Janneh Kaira, were still in their jobs.

"We signed a social contract with Adama Barrow and his number one role is to protect the most vulnerable, and he has failed miserably," she told AFP. She also called for a total halt to pharmaceutical imports "until Gambia's government can build a facility that can test medications."

Others voices, including the Gambia Bar Association, have insisted that the inquiry be conducted by independent experts.

Weak healthcare

Behind the political row is the reality of a country deep in poverty lacking many of the safeguards that elsewhere are taken for granted.

The Gambia is the smallest country in continental Africa, and nearly half of its population lives below the poverty line, according to the World Bank.

The country ranks a mere 174th out of 191 countries on the UN Human Development Index. Its already weak health institutions were hit hard

by Covid, with a 2020 UN assessment saying the pandemic had "exposed the shortcomings in the nation's healthcare system".

The UN flagged limited expertise, a shortage of basic equipment and a chronic lack of health pro-

According to World Bank data, The Gambia in 2019 had just 0.1 physicians per 1,000 people -less than a twentieth of the numbers in Canada.

The Gambia's under-five mortality rate is 49.4 deaths per 1,000 live births, according to UNICEF, compared to 3.7 deaths in Germany and 4.4 in

which was dormant for many years.

AICC general secretary Jairam Ramesh, one of the key drivers of the exercise, sees the yatra as a psychological boost for the party. "I think what the yatra has done is show to the Congress party that we can do it. We are on the roads, on the streets, we are fighting the BJP. We are taking the battle to their camps. We are raising fundamental issues. We are not reactive. In fact, now the BJP is reacting to us and that I think is the greatest contribution of the yatra. It is psychological rather than electoral," Ramesh said.

He expressed confidence that the gains would consolidate as 117 Bharat Yatris traverse the entire 12-state route.

Congress strategists claim that the principal aim is to connect with the masses and raise their issues, as decided at the Udaipur Chintan Shivir where both Congress president Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi acknowledged that the party was disconnected from the ground. Leaders say Rahul Gandhi has met more than 550 people individually while walking during the yatra, and interacted with several pressure groups with specific concerns.

"This is for the first time in many years that the Congress is being discussed in remote areas, villages, and people are in awe of the fact that Rahul Gandhi is walking all the way," former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Digvijay Singh, who heads the yatra organising committee, said.

In many ways, the yatra is shaping up as the former Congress president's personal image building exercise, with senior party leaders repeatedly claiming that India will see a new Rahul Gandhi after the journey.

The party's social media department has been careful to project the affectionate side of their leader -- tying his mother's shoelaces, playing with children, hugging an elderly woman, and so on. The idea is to fight the BJP's narrative of "Rahul Gandhi being a reluctant leader and a tourist politician who takes many holidays".

"This is a transformational moment for Rahul Gandhi. His endurance and clarity of thought are emerging in the yatra," said Jairam Ramesh, adding that the yatra has seen three impromptu press conferences by the Congress scion, who has taken two clear ideological lines.

One, he has said the Congress does not differentiate between minority and majority communalism and will fight both. Two, he has clarified that the Congress is against monopolies and not industrialists.

These positions bring some clarity to the party's otherwise hazy lines on secularism and economics, and could be significant in

the wake of the party aligning with radical forces in the last Assembly elections in West Bengal and Kerala.

The Congress drew a blank in Bengal, while in Kerala, the Left Democratic Front stormed to power bucking anti-incumbency trends in a record win.

In BJP-ruled Karnataka, the party views public response as "phenomenal".

Karnataka Congress leaders, however, feel the yatra should have covered more Assembly segments rather than just the 20 constituencies it will enter and the 50 it will touch out of the 224 constituencies.

The Congress has 70 MLAs in the state after 14 left the party in the recent past.

Party general secretary in-charge of Karnataka Randeep Surjewala said three more yatras would be held across the state starting next month.

"The ongoing yatra has activated the party cadre in every assembly segment and has unified the state leadership due to the bonhomie created by it," Surjewala told PTI.

He said it has also helped highlight major issues of corruption, price rise and unemployment, and has given an opportunity to Rahul Gandhi to interact with non-political seg-

'The BJP is now on the defensive and is resorting to copycat syndrome by planning similar meetings, but they have not picked up the gauntlet of walking 511 km through the state," Surjewala added.

While the journey continues, it remains to be seen if it will impact the Congress' flailing electoral fortunes.

Interestingly, the yatra doesn't cover pollbound Himachal Pradesh and Gujarat.

Also, the absence of opposition leaders from the yatra is a matter of debate though the Congress claims the exercise was never aimed at forging opposition unity.

The party had, however, at the start of the yatra appealed to leaders to participate. The only participation from the opposition so far has been that of DMK chief and Tamil Nadu chief minister MK Stalin, who flagged off the yatra from Kanyakumari along with Rahul Gandhi. The Congress maintains it invited only Stalin and no one else officially.

As it appears, the grand old party views Bharat Jodo Yatra as a tool for self renewal and hopes to land at the centre of opposition space by the end of the journey early next year.

US ammunition supplies dwindle as Ukraine war drains stockpiles

Stinger anti-aircraft missiles, which have not been made since 2020.

Some US-provided equipment has become emblematic of the war in Ukraine, such as Javelin antitank weapons that were widely used by Kyiv's forces to blunt the Russian advance on the capital, and the Himars, a precision rocket system now playing a key role in counter-offensives against Moscow's troops in the east and south.

'No alternatives'

But US stocks of ammunition for Himars -whichfires GPS-guided rockets known as GMLRS, with a range of more than 80 kilometers (50 miles) -- are dwindling.

"If the United States sent one-third of that inventory to Ukraine (as has been the case with Javelin and Stinger), Ukraine would receive 8,000 to 10,000 rockets. That inventory would likely last several months, but, when the inventory is exhausted, there are no alternatives," said Cancian, who previously worked on weapons procurement for the US government.

"Production is about 5,000 a year. Although the United States is working to increase that amount, and money has recently been allocated for that purpose, it will take years," he said, adding that older equipment could help fill the gap.

The United States has provided some 8,500 Javelin missiles to Kyiv, but production of a weapon that has become a symbol of Ukrainian resistance is only about 1,000 per year.

'As long as it takes'

The US government ordered \$350 million worthof the missiles in May, but it will again take several years before stockpiles are replenished.

The United States has also supplied more than 800,000 NATO standard 155 mm artillery shells to Kyiv -- three-quarters of the total amount delivered by all Western countries, according to official Pentagon statistics.

The amount of shells Washington has provided "is probably close to the limit that the United States is willing to give without risk to its own warfighting capabilities," Cancian said.

US production of these shells currently stands at 14,000 per month, but the Pentagon has announced that it aims to increase that figure to 36,000 within three years. That would still only bring annual production to 432,000 -- less than half of what has been provided to Ukraine in seven months.

And the US defense industry production is speeding up, Laura Cooper, a senior defense department official responsible for Russia and Ukraine, said Tuesday.

"The United States will continue to stand with the Ukrainian people and provide them with the security assistance they need to defend themselves for as long as it takes," she said.

When the HC took up the plea for stay on the conviction order, the State Vigilance sought time. But Acharya pressed for urgent hearing on the matter taking into consideration the seriousness of the consequences of the conviction.

Justice Routray fixed October 13 for further consideration of the matter. On September 29, Moquim, a first-time MLA, had got instant relief and was not sent to jail after being sentenced for three years. As per law, a trial court that sentences a person to three years imprisonment can give him/her instant bail.

According to case records Moquim representing the Metro Group as the MD, had applied for a Rs 1.5 crore term loan from the ORHDC in June 2000 for an apartment project in Nayapalli area. Kumar was then the MD of ORHDC. Kumar neither placed the loan application before the board of directors nor the loan committee for approval. Kumar allegedly showed undue favours to the

real estate company and illegally disbursed the loan between July and August 2000. The Vigilance department registered a case on March 30, 2005. During investigation, the Vigilance purportedly found that the real estate company did not repay the entire loan amount. As on July 31, 2007, the company's outstanding loan amount reached Rs 6.2 crore.

The Vigilance also came to know that the firm had availed loans from the ORHDC before and turned a defaulter once. But Moquim has claimed that he had repaid a substantial amount of the loan.
