Kremlin responds to Erdogan, says Putin 'open to negotiating' with Ukraine

MOSCOW(KCN): Russian President Vladimir Putin has been open for negotiations with Ukraine "from the very beginning," and "nothing has changed" in that respect, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters on Friday, commenting on remarks made by Turkish president Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

"If you remember, President Putin tried to initiate talks with both NATO and the United States even before the special military operation," Peskov said, referring to Russia's aggression against Ukraine that started almost eight months ago.

"Putin was open to negotiations when a document was almost agreed on between Russian and Ukrainian (negotiators). So in that respect, nothing has changed. The position of the Ukrainian side has changed.



Ukrainian law now prohibits any negotiations." This comes after Erdogan had earlier said that Putin appeared to be "much softer and more open to negotiations" than

in the past. "We are not without hope," he said of the possibility of negotiations to end the conflict.

The Turkish leader, who has held meetings with Putin during the war, says he is optimistic that a U.N.- and Turkish-brokered deal that allowed the shipment of millions of tons of Ukrainian grain to world markets can be extended. Erdogan told a group of journalists that he had discussed extending the grain corridor deal with both Putin and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Meanwhile, Russian officials have repeatedly said they will not negotiate the return of the four Ukrainian regions Moscow illegally annexed last month. After the land grab, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy ruled out any talks with Moscow as long as Putin remains president.

Haphazard parking of trucks at leads to accident In Barbil -Joda area

Barbil (**KCN**) The stretch of State Highway from Bhadra sahi to Nalda area in Keonjhar district has doubled up as an illegal terminus for trucks and container lorries, much to the chagrin of locals, who call it a death trap.



Despite repeated complaints to every authority possible - the police, the Regional Transport Office (RTO), remains clogged with heavy vehicles, with hundreds of trucks parked on both side of the road round the clock say locals

Residents claim that at least four people have died in road accidents caused directly or indirectly by the parked trucks, and countless others have been injured, over the past one



year, but the authorities are somehow still allowing this public nuisance to go unchecked," said some residents, who lives nearby. Being a mining area, apart from interstate vehicles, trucks from all over country also halt, adding to the confusion on the busy stretch.

An interactive meeting between the Geological Survey of India (GSI) and Geoscience Australia (GA) under the MoU was also held through video-conferencing to discuss the modalities of the implementation of the recently signed Term of Reference (TOR).

DG, GSI Shri S Raju extended warm welcome to GA team on the behalf of GSI and briefed about existing collaboration with Geo-science Australia, particularly for evaluating the potentiality of deep seated and concealed deposits in the country as well as implementation of RMT projects. He expressed his pleasure for signing of components of ToR will be executed in a time bound manner. He further elaborated about GSI's thrust areas of collaboration, viz. DSRS and MT surveys, establishment of digital drill core library, creation of retrievable data of critical minerals, where technical assistance is required from GA. He wanted to know from the GA team about the type of Geochronological techniques adopted by GA for R&D purpose and Ore genesis as well as total coverage of area in Australia by various surveys like DSRS, MT and drilling.



remain eclipsed and indignantly undermined, if he continued in his present party. The ripple of political movements the Congress has presently come up with has seriously made the party once again a well meaningful subject of political discourse even though it is out of power. Electing an octogenarian as its new president from outside the Gandhi family, the eligible votary in the party has indirectly endorsed its reluctance to give the grand old party a chance to metamorphose into a fresh avatar under a younger and intelligent Tharoor.

Tharoor could not win the presidency but his candidature should be seen as an announcement of an open dissent that has been visible and the effect of a quest that some of the insiders of the party cherished while plotting their rebellion. Tharoor may change his mind and prefer a decent exit from Congress before the general elections approach as he claimed that the entire electoral endeavour for the presidential election was stage-managed and sheepishly rigged. Though his candidacy was a public display of democratic disagreement inside the party, the leadership of the party projected this as an act of amiability and freedom rather than anarchy and acrimony in its democratic structure.

The essential eligibility irrespective of his old age, Mr. Kharge was supported for was his family proximity that the party family endorsed and staged the election drama for. Being powerful Gandhi has consistently maintained his dominance in Congress. His longest walk intended to recapture the lost glory of the party has fundamentally added to the complexity that the Congress establishment is. An intelligent manoeuvre to stay away from the potential pitfalls such as the future political debacles; he has once again managed to stay in limelight without any visible responsibility. The party with its behavioural ethos to stay under the protective shadow of a family has almost

shattered its hopes and dreams must be giving nightmares to the Congress even today. The Modi factor, the winning strategy that the BJP is banking on, had been a profound hindrance for the Congress from gaining influence.

The Bharat Jodo Yatra by Rahul Gandhi and the coronation of Mallikarjun Kharge, a family loyalist as the President of the party, gives the Congress a chance to set up a parallel party structure that the BJP enjoys. There, it is Narendra Modi the supreme leader and a party president probably taking his orders. This can also be seen as an overall experiment put in place well before the general elections 2024, in which, if consensus could be built to project a new Rahul Gandhi, totally reinvigorated after the yatra, emerging with a well knitted acceptance across party lines as a serious contender to Modi. The BJP must be counting this as a win-win situation. The Tharoor factor being crumbled from becoming instrumental in the Congress party's constitutionally structural build-up, the new elected president does not seem to have the mettle to bring about an increased vigour among its cadre; the only personality who would attempt to flex his muscles to take on the Modi juggernaut is Rahul Gandhi alone. Since that being the case the BJP does not have to do so many somersaults to retain its previous tally.

The present scenario in the Congress is a true replica of renunciation that the Sonia era espoused in 2004. She was eulogised and hysterically beatified by the same loyalists in the party for her without any power in the party, Rahul renouncing the post of the Prime Minister. Rahul Gandhi also for whatever reasons decided not to embrace the responsibility of the president and has certainly been extolled by the same loyalists for turning himself a renunciate. A frenzied party cadre thronging to his yatra in states where the Congress has little significance echoed this view decisively. For them, the yatra would definitely transform the family scion of the party into its ultimate saviour. His 'no' to the presidency and his excitement to take a long march,

which indeed, if completed as per the plan, would turn out to be a thrilling achievement for him in his personal pursuit of political relevance. Walking through the entire stretch of the dryness of his political career, as a leader, the Rahul factor is all set to gain prominence. Interestingly, after Modi, in India he is the only leader who enjoys a great deal of celebrity status in politics. From 7 September to the distance that he should be inching closer to its culmination is expected to galvanise pro-Congress sentiments. But to counter a pan-India Modi impact, the entire stretch of distance he decided to walk is not enough. But unpredictability is the master when politics begins to play its tricky games. If the Rahul yatra helps the Congress to embellish its presence with little eminence, it can also garner more political support from unexpected areas. Areas where the crowd sat to hear him throughout the rain are indicative to the attention that the electorate rewarded him for his newborn maturity.

With brand Modi's USP intact, the BJP is all set to focus on the upcoming state elections. The Congress is yet to make any noteworthy start. A repeat of the saffron surge in its strong turf is predicted and undoubtedly this election does not bring any slippery moment for the BJP in Gujarat. But in Karnataka, with the tussle and fuss in the leadership of both the parties, the state elections are far from a viable prediction. The repeat of a BJP sweep and Congress decline would further damage the prospects of the party and the effect of its historic yatra would not refurbish on the celebrated Rahul makeover and his prospects in the national elections would be grimmer. But the Kharge coronation will ultimately pull the Rahul Gandhi factor into a visible sphere of recognition as a serious leader and he should be aware of the genuine challenge that the Bharat Jodo Yatra throws at him. He needs to establish his organisational popularity with meaning and purpose. In case of his party's losing mandate in the upcoming state elections, his reformer's image and saviour's prerogatives would crumble.

of November 1934 (Kishoregunj, now Bangladesh). He completed his MBBS from Calcutta Medical College and qualified as a Paediatrician from England. He joined the International Center of Johns Hopkins University at the Beleghata Infectious Disease Hospital, Kolkata in 1964 and initiated research on Oral Rehydration Therapy with the participants being the cholera patients treated there. Later, after his monumental victory over the cholera epidemic of 1971, Dr Mahalonabis was associated with the World Health Organization's Diarrhoeal Disease Control programme. He also had a stint as the Director of Clinical Science at the International Center for Diarrheal Disease Research in Bangladesh. He was hugely clinically invested in the Institute of Child Health, Park Circus Kolkata and contributed his life's savings there. Dr Dilip Mahalonabis in 1991 founded the 'Society for Applied Studies' to inculcate field working and hands-on research.

Recipient of numerous notable accolades, he was also awarded in 2002 the Pollin prize, considered the apex award in Paediatrics by Columbia University Dr Mahalonabis, aged 87, passed away on the 16th of October 2022 in Kolkata.

His timely and brave scientific contribution during a dark humanitarian crisis must be honoured in our deeds and memories for eternity.



Former Pakistan PM Imran Khan facing politics ban over gifts case

ISLAMABAD(KCN): Former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan could be barred from political office Friday when the election commission rules on charges he misled officials about gifts he received from foreign leaders while in power.

The case is another twist in political wrangling that began even before Khan's April ouster, and is one allowed to keep those below a certain value. More expensive items must go to Toshakhana, but in some cases the recipient can buy them back at around 50 per cent of their value -- a discount Khan raised from 20 per cent while in office.

Pakistan newspapers have for months carried lurid stories alleging Khan and his wife received lavish

Pakistan's courts are often used to tie up lawmakers in lengthy proceedings that rights monitors criticise for stifling political opposition, but the commission's involvement in this case stems from the obligation of elected officials to declare all their

"In our opinion the Election Commission of Pakistan is not a court, therefore they can't give a declaration to disqualify anyone," PTI senator Syed Ali Zafar, a barrister representing Khan, told a press conference Friday ahead of the ruling.

The case centres on a government department known as "Toshakhana", which during the Mughal era referred to the "treasure houses" kept by the subcontinent's princely rulers to store and display gifts lavished on them.

Government officials must declare all gifts, but are

gifts worth millions during trips abroad.

They included luxury watches, jewellery, designer handbags and perfumes.

Khan is accused of failing to declare some gifts or the profit made from selling them.

The complaint to the election commission was first brought when Khan was still in office by the Pakistan Democratic Movement, a coalition whose members now make up the government.

At the time Khan said he had not made public some gifts on national security grounds, but in a written submission admitted buying items worth nearly 22 million rupees (\$100,000), and later selling them for more than twice that amount.

He says the valuation was done through proper channels. If the commission does rule against Khan, he could face punishment ranging from suspension to being banned from public office, but extreme rulings are usually challenged in court and frequently overturned.

Ukraine warns Russia planning to destroy hydro dam

KYIV: Kyiv accused Russia of planning to destroy a hydroelectric dam in the eastern Kherson region, of Iranians taking a direct role in the war, helping ing and Moscow-installed authorities have begun

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Russian forces had mined the Kakhovka hydroelectric power plant with the intent of blowing it up, in what would amount to a "catastrophe on a grand scale." Hundreds of thousands of people around the lower Dnipro River would be in danger of rapid flooding if the dam was destroyed, Zelensky warned in a speech

Thursday to European leaders. He said cutting water supplies to the south could also impact the cooling systems of the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant, Europe's largest.

And the North Crimean canal, which provides a crucial water supply to Crimea -- occupied since 2014

by Russia -- could be destroyed. Russia's goal is to halt the Ukrainian advance in the region and protect Russian troops, according to

Zelensky's adviser, Mykhailo Podolyak. - Energy battlefield-Cities across Ukraine began curbing electricity con-

sumption ahead of winter Thursday as authorities warned that heavy damage to the country's energy grid by Russian attacks would spark a new wave of refugees from the country.

"Russia's leadership has given the order to turn the energy system itself into a battlefield. The consequences of this are very dangerous, again for all of us in Europe," Zelensky said in an address to the EU

Energy-saving measures were put in place across the country after Russian missile and drone strike destroyed at least 30 per cent of the country's power stations in a week, according to authorities.

Following blackouts in parts of Kyiv overnight, the city's mayor Vitali Klitschko urged businesses to limit screens and signage lights "as much as possible."

"Even small savings and a reduction in electricity consumption in every home will help stabilise the operation of the national energy system," he said. Ukrainians responded defiantly

"It's not going to change our attitude, maybe we will only hate them more," said Olga, a resident of Dnipro in central Ukraine who declined to give her last name. "I would rather sit in the cold with no water and

electricity than be in Russia," she said. People were rushing to buy auxiliary power supplies like generators and batteries, according to Kyrylo, an electronics vendor.

Speaking of the coming winter, he said: "I think that there will be nothing that we cannot survive."

"There will be some kind of heating in any case, and the fact that it will be 16 (degrees Celsius, or 61 Fahrenheit) instead of 20 doesn't matter much. Just put on a thermal and socks," he said.

cede the city back to the Ukrainians. "Remember, nobody is going to give up Kherson,"

But Ukrainians said the exit of civilians from the area was in fact forced deportations to Russia. The US-based Institute for the Study of War, in its daily analysis, said that as Ukrainian forces continue to close in on Kherson city, Russian authorities "are likely setting information conditions to justify planned Russian retreats and significant territorial losses.

Shivraj Patil's jihad remarks attempt to 'insult' Hindutva: BJP; Cong calls the comments 'unacceptable'

NEW DELHI: The BJP on Friday stepped up its attack against the Congress over its leader Shivraj Patil's claim that Bhagavad Gita also spoke of jihad, saying that this is one more attempt to smear Hindutva by the opposition party, which disassociated itself from the remarks, terming them as "unacceptable".

The Congress also said the former governor and

former Union home minister has clarified his comments and asserted that Bhagavad Gita is a key foundational pillar of Indian civilization.

Attacking the Congress, BJP spokesperson and Rajya Sabha MP Sudhanshu Trivedi demanded that Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge or its leader Sonia Gandhi should respond to Patil's com-

He noted that Mahatma Gandhi in his commentary on the Hindu epic had described it as a source of 'Anasakti Yoga' (selfless action) while Bal Gangadhar Tilak expounded his philosophy of 'Karma Yoga' through his study of Gita and added that Congress leaders now see jihad in it.

BJP national spokesperson Prem Shukla alleged that Congress has long been involved in the conspiracy to "insult Hindu, Hindutva and Hindustan" and Patil's remarks are yet another chapter towards this. Congress leaders in the past have drawn a parallel between Hindutva with terror organisations like Boko Haram and Taliban, he alleged.



Gita is the philosophy of humanity, Shukla asserted. The BJP also accused the Congress party of playing vote bank politics.

lead to me, 'it says. It is because of this universality that it has found favour with all classes and schools.' Patil on Thursday claimed that the concept of jihad was not just in Islam but also in Bhagavad Gita and Christianity.

Speaking at the launch of Congress veteran and former Union minister Mohsina Kidwai's biography, Patil, also a former Lok Sabha Speaker, said it is said there is a lot of discussion of jihad in the religion of Islam. The concept comes to the fore when despite having the right intentions and doing the right thing, nobody understands or reciprocates, then it is said one can use force, he said.

"It is not just in Quran, but in Mahabharata also, the part in Gita, Shri Krishna also talks of jihad to Arjun and this thing is not just in Quran or Gita but also in Christianity," he claimed in his remarks in Hindi.

Reacting to Patil's comments, BJP spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla on Thursday tweeted, "after AAP's Gopal Italia & Rajendra Pal, not to be outdone in Hindu hatred & vote bank politics, Congress' Shivraj Patil says Shri Krishna taught 'Jihad' to Arjun! Ghaziabad: Woman who levelled 'fabricated' gang-rape charge booked along with 3 others

GHAZIABAD(KCN): Police have registered a case against a woman and three others after she allegedly levelled a "fabricated" gang-rape charge in an attempt to grab property.

Delhi Commission for Women chief Swati Maliwal

on Wednesday had said that the 36-year-old woman was found wrapped in a jute bag, with her hands and legs tied, and an iron rod was inserted in her private parts.

However, the Ghaziabad police on Thursday dismissed as "fabricated" the Delhi woman's claim that she had been raped and brutalised by five men

and that a had been hatched over a dispute over a "small" property.

The National Commission for Women has also said that contradictory statements were made by the woman and her family members.

On Friday, Circle Officer (City-2) Alok Dubey said that the woman and her accomplices Azad, Afzal and Gaurav have been booked under Indian Penal Code sections 420 (cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), 467 (forgery of valuable security), 468 (forgery for purpose of cheating) and 471 (fraudulently or dishonestly using as genuine any document which the person knows or has reason to believe to be forged).

Of the initial five suspects, the Ghaziabad police on Wednesday had said that four people had been taken into custody following the allegation of the

During a press conference on Thursday, when asked if a clean chit will be given to the four of them, Inspector General, Meerut, Praveen Kumar, said, "We have not got any evidence against them. Prima facie, in this case, no such incident has taken place. So, there is no question of getting evidence.'

On the women's claim that she was kidnapped, the officer had said," No. She had gone to a designated place of her own will."

Chats analysed by police also show that money was also paid to individuals to publicise the case, he had said. The woman had claimed that she was raped by five men for two days.

DCW chief Maliwal had said the incident reminded her of the Nirbhaya case.

She was referring to the brutal gang-rape and assault of a 23-year-old paramedic student on the



intervening night of December 16-17, 2012 inside a moving bus in south Delhi by six people before being thrown out on the road.

The DCW had also issued a notice to Ghaziabad police in connection with the case.

On Thursday, Inspector General Kumar had also said that during investigation, it was found that Azad's phone was switched off around the time the woman purportedly disappeared.

On the property dispute, he said the dispute was about a "small" property.

"A woman named Sameena gave the property to Azad in 2021 who in turn gave its power of attorney to a man named Deepak Joshi. There was talk about giving this property to the Delhi woman. The case regarding this was going on in the court," the officer said.

Authorities at the Guru Teg Bahadur Hospital had on Wednesday said the woman's condition is stable and no internal injury has been found yet.

Nipun Agarwal, Superintendent of Police (City-I) Ghaziabad, on Wednesday had said the victim claimed that after raping her, the accused had inserted an iron rod in her private part but when the police tried to get her medically examined at a Meerut hospital, she refused.

"Doctors then referred her to the Meerut Medical College for treatment but she refused to go there as well. The woman was then taken to a Delhi hospital," the SP had said.

Cabinet Nods 125 OAS Posts

Bhubaneswar: In view of increasing workload in revenue administration specifically in districts and sub-divisions, the State Cabinet on Friday decided to create additional 125 posts in OAS Gr.A(JB)



With the creation of additional 125 posts, the total OAS cadre strength was enhanced to 1313 in the state, said Chief Secretary S.C. Mahapatra.

While two posts of Deputy Collector in each district (total 60 posts) have been created four Under Secretary, Board of Revenue, Odisha, Cuttack has also been created. Similarly, the Cabinet has decided to create one post of Deputy Collector in each Sub-Collector's Office (total 58 posts), three Deputy Collector posts at the office of ADM, Bhubaneswar, Paradeep and Rourkela.

The State Cabinet has also decided to return 206.685 acres of land in Kalipalli village of Ganjam district to the original land owners or to the legal heirs as per the provision of Rule 20 of Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (Compensation, Rehabilitation and Resettlement and Development Plan) Rules, 2015.

The land was acquired two decades ago for Tata Steel. However, the land remained unutilised and farmers are now cultivating in the land, Mr, Mahapatra said.

So, for a larger public interest, the Cabinet has decided to return it to the original land owners. The compensation amount paid to the land owners has been waived, he said.

The Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik led panel also decided to pay the due to L&T for the work strengthening & widening of Sambalpur-Rourkela road out of ADB assistance.

After exhausting all the legal remedies, it was decided for payment of decretal dues amounting to Rs.100.06 crore to Larsen & Toubro Ltd. for compliance of the arbitral award of Arbitration Tribunal, the Chief Secretary said.

Similarly, the Cabinet has decided to amend the Odisha Pani Panchayat Act, 2002.

Now, mega lift irrigation projects have been included under the Act. Spouses of the water users, who are land holders in the area of a Pani Panchayat, can become members of the Panchayat. The tenure of Chak Committee and Executive Committee of the Pani Panchayats has been increased to five years.

State Eyes Revenue Growth

Bhubaneswar: With sustained improvement in collection of own tax and own non tax revenue it is expected that State's own revenues are to register 'Moderate Growth' in Financial Year 2023-24.

According to officials of the Department of Finance, the recovery of the economy post pandemic as well as high inflationary regime has resulted in higher realization of direct and

2.7 percent in 2023. RBI has projected India's economy to grow around 7.2 percent during this fiscal and will have a growth of 6.5 percent during 2023-24.

In the case of Odisha, the economy is projected to register higher growth of about 8 percent in 2022-23 as well as in 2023-24, informed a senior official of the Finance



indirect taxes at national and sub-national level during the current year.

Fall of iron ore prices will partially affect the revenue from the mining sector during the FY 2022-23. However, the State would be able to realize revenue at the level of Budget Estimate by compensating the shortfall through higher tax revenue, the officials said.

State's own revenues are expected to register moderate growth in FY 2023- 24. Besides, the grant-in-aid from Government of India projected to fall in 2022-23 and 2023-24 due to cessation of GST compensation to the States, they said.

Considering all these factors, there is a need for higher capital spending. So, the total Government expenditure is expected to increase by about 12 percent in FY 2023-24 over the current year's revised estimates.

The Capital Outlay is budgeted at Rs.38, 732crore (5.4% of Gross State Domestic Product) in 2022-23 Budget Estimate.

As per the latest IMF projection, the worldeconomy is expected to grow 3.2 percent this year, before slowing further to a The Odisha FRBM Act, 2005 mandates to maintain revenue balance and contain the fiscal deficit within 3 percent of GSDP. Additional annual borrowing space of 0.5 percent of GSDP would be available during the four-year period from 2021-22 to 2024-25 as per recommendation of 15th Finance Commission subject to fulfillment of sectoral reforms prescribed by Government of India from time to time.

Provision for carrying forward of unused borrowing space to successive financial years would also be available for the State till FY 2024-25.

The requirement of higher Capital Expenditure is contingent upon generation of higher revenue surplus by rationalization and prioritization of revenue expenditure.

Thus, the State Government would try to adhere to FRBM requirements for Revised Estimates, 2022-23 and Budget Estimates, 2023-24 with containing the fiscal deficit within 3 percent of GSDP.

Following the approval of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, Revenue and Disaster Management ACS Satyabrata Sahu has asked RDC Central Division, Cuttack to take steps in this regard.

"Government have been pleased to accord inprinciple approval for addition in Rehabilitation and Resettlement Policy for "Re-Development of SCB Medical College

& Hospital, Cuttack" & "Improvement of Road on both left & right Embankment of Taladanda Canal from Ranihat Chhak to Biribati" as proposed by Collector, Cuttack and recommended by you," Mr.Sahu said in his letter.

During land acquisition, the Cuttack District Administration found that some of the persons losing their land and building for

the aforesaid project are not willing to accept the compensation under the existing R&R packages and are demanding land in lieu for their land and value of the structure being calculated without depreciation.

It is noticed that under the above mentioned provision, the extent of land of equal value is too small for a person to construct a house for dwelling purposes. Hence, the Government has decided to allot 2000 sq ft of land to the losers against their compensation.

In case the land loser is interested to acquire land in lieu of land for dwelling house purposes, he/she depending on availability may be allotted a maximum of 2000 sq. ft. of Government land on Rayati basis for homestead purpose, sources said.

The value of the land being allotted will be adjusted against the total amount of respect of the land and building being acquired from him/ her.

In case the amount of compensation is more than the value of the plot to be allotted, after adjustment towards the value of the said plot, the balance amount of compensation will be paid to the land loser.

On the contrary if the amount of compensation payable to the land loser is lesser than the value of the plot to be allotted, the land loser can secure its allotment by paying the balance amount in addition to the total amount of compensation due to him, they said.



As a part of the 5T initiative, the State Government had announced plans for the revamping and modernizing of the SCB Medical College and Hospital in November 2019. Asked at his pre-match press conference whether Ronaldo had refused to come on a substitute against Spurs, Ten Hag said: "Yes."

Ten Hag said: "What (happened in) the talk is between Cristiano and me. The (club)

But the Dutch manager, in his first season at Old Trafford, said Ronaldo "remains an important part of the squad."

The forward was also among those that left Old Trafford early in July's pre-season friendly against Rayo Vallecano, leading

Ten Hag to underline the importance of players staying to support their teammates.

Asked how he deals with the situation, the Dutchman said on Friday: "How we did. I am the manager. I am responsible for the top sport culture here

and I have to set standards and values and I have to control them.

"We are in a team, so we have standards, we have values and I have to control that. After Rayo Vallecano, I told (you) it was unacceptable but he wasn't the only one. That is for everyone.

"When it's the second time, that will have consequences. That is what we did. We miss him tomorrow. That is a miss for us. For the squad it's a miss.

"But I think it's important for the attitude and mentality from the group. Now we have to focus on Chelsea and that is the most important."

Ronaldo responded to his omission from

the squad by saying he had acted in the heat of the moment.

"I've always tried to set the example myself for the youngsters that grew in all the teams that I've represented," he posted on Instagram on Thursday. "Unfortunately that's not always possible and sometimes the heat of the moment gets the best of

"Right now, I just feel that I have to keep working hard in Carrington, support my teammates and be ready for everything in any given game.

"Giving in to the pressure is not an option. It never was. This is Manchester United, and united we must stand. Soon we'll be together again."

The former Real Madrid and Juventus star scored 24 goals in all competitions in 2021/22 in his first season back at Old Trafford, where he made his name as a global star.

But, disappointed by United's failure to qualify for the Champions League, he has tried and failed to engineer a move away from Old Trafford.

Odisha's Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) PK Jena appealed to the people not to panic as the cyclone is likely to be 200 km away from the state's coast at Dhamra Port in Bhadrak district when it will head towards West Bengal-Bangladesh coasts. "The Odisha government is in touch with the NDRF, Indian Navy and Coast Guard in view of the forecast. Odisha coast may experience maximum 50 to 60 kmph wind speed when the weather system crosses parallel to the state's coast," he said.

The IMD in its forecast said that the low-pressure area over Andaman Sea is likely to move westnorthwestwards and concentrate into a depression, and deep depression thereafter on October 23.

The system is very likely to recurve northwards subsequently and intensify into a cyclonic storm over westcentral and adjoining eastcentral Bay of Bengal by October 24, the Met said.

"Thereafter, it is likely to move north-northeastwards and reach near West Bengal-Bangladesh coasts on October 25, skirting Odisha coast," the Met department said in its forecast.

The Northeast, including south Assam, east Meghalaya, Nagaland, Mizoram, Manipur and Tripura, will receive rainfall on October 24, 25 and 26 under the impact of the system, it said.

Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea from October 23 until further notice. The cyclonic storm is expected to be christened 'Sitrang', as suggested by Thailand.
