Cong banks on anti-incumbency, Virbhadra's legacy in HP polls

NEW DELHI(KCN): Riding on the anti-incumbency factor and raising issues like price rise and unemployment, the Congress in Himachal Pradesh is banking on the legacy of Virbhadra Singh to stage a comeback in the hill state.



The grand old party is, however, faced with internal rumblings and defections of some of its old timers in the recent past

that may affect its performance at the hustings.

Though the party has fielded some young leaders, including former chief minister Virbhadra Singh's son Vikramaditya and ex-minister B D Bali's son Raghubir Bali, it failed to field some of its Youth Congress leaders in the November 12 assembly polls. Besides, the presence of a tall leader like Virbhadra Singh, who has steered the party to many a victory, is missing this time, even though the party is banking on his legacy as his wife Pratibha Singh is leading the charge currently.

The party has also made a host of promises to woo the voters in the state.

These include restoration of old pension scheme, 300 units of free power, payment of Rs 1,500 to women and government jobs to all those working on outsourced employment, which are catching the attention of voters so far.

Himachal has seen alternate governments of the BJP and the Congress for many decades now and that is what the Congress has pinned its hopes on.

Cyclone to cross Bangladesh coast on Tuesday, says IMD

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): The cyclone brewing over the Bay of Bengal will cross Bangladesh coast in the wee hours of Tuesday. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Saturday said the system will intensify into a cyclonic storm over central Bay of Bengal by Monday morning.

"It will continue to track north-northeastwards and cross Bangladesh coast between Tin Kona and Sandwip Islands in the wee hours of Tuesday," said Director of Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre HR Biswas. Coastal

and interior districts will experience rainfall under the influence of the system on Monday, he



added. The IMD said that the system will intensify into a severe cyclonic storm but it may weaken during the landfall.

Director of Centre for Environment and Climate (CEC) of SOA

University Sarat Chandra Sahu said the storm will move parallel to Odisha's coast main-

taining a distance of more than 150 km. The wind speed may not be very high and may vary from 60 km/ph to 80 km/ph over Odisha coast, he added. On the day, the well-marked low pressure

area concentrated into a depression which moved northwestwards at a speed of 18 km per hour in last six hours and lay centered at 5.30 pm, about 860 km south-southeast of Sagar Island and 940 km south of Barisal in Bangladesh. The IMD said squally wind speed reaching 45 km to 55 km per hour and gusting up to 65 km is likely to prevail along and off Odisha coast on Monday. Fishermen have been advised against venturing into deep sea area along and off Odisha coast between Sunday and Tuesday.

Decks clear for display of Biju Babu's iconic Dakota at Bhubaneswar airport

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): With the Airport Authority of India (AAI) finally agreeing to hand over land, decks are cleared for the iconic Dakota aircraft of former Chief Minister Biju Patnaik to adorn the city airport named after the legendary leader.

For public display of the DC3 aircraft in front of the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA), the AAI has agreed to hand over 1.1

acre of land for the purpose. The aircraft, which Patnaik had used to rescue erstwhile Indonesian Vice President Muhammad Hatta and Prime Minister Sutan Sjahrir from their enemies in

July 1947, is currently lying in a decrepit condition at Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport, Kolkata.

Although the State government had initiated efforts to shift the 20-metre long aircraft having a wingspan of 29 metre to Odisha in 2020 and floated a tender for its transportation, the process was delayed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Director of BPIA Prasanna Pradhan said the AAI has given its nod to hand over the land outside Terminal 1 for display of the aircraft as a mark of tribute to the legendary leader. "As per plan, the aircraft will be dismantled and transported from Kolkata to Bhubaneswar before being assembled here for public view.



A memorial will be built for placing the aircraft," he said.

Known for his daredevilry and piloting acumen, Patnaik had formed Kalinga Airline which had 15 Dakota planes at its headquarters at Kolkata. The airplanes were being used by the Army for transporting jawans deployed in Kashmir and dropping supplies at north-eastern area of the country.

"The tender floated for transportation of the aircraft has been finalised. The aircraft will be brought back on road after it is dismantled. The work order will be awarded once the land is handed over by AAI. Hopefully, the process will be completed soon and the aircraft will be finally placed as a memorial for public viewing," said a government official.

Initially, it was decided to get back the aircraft following a communication from the AAI in 2018 and put it on display as a relic associated with Patnaik as part of the museum developed at his ancestral house 'Anand Bhavan' in Cuttack. It did not work out due to lack of follow up action by the Culture department.

Heritage researcher and member of INTACH Anil Dhir had written to CM Naveen Patnaik to take steps for getting back the Dakota aircraft.

Naveen to inaugurate Suando heritage village on Jan 26

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik will inaugurate the project for the transformation of Suando village in Puri district on January 26, the birth place of Utkalmani Gopabandhu Das.


Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra on Tuesday visited Suando and reviewed the progress of different segments of the work. The project implemented at a cost of Rs 25.25 crore includes renovation of the Loknath Deb temple, the ancestral house of Utkalmani, temple of Radha Binod Behari, development of

the village pond, park and a museum.

He also reviewed the work on the expansion of the road from Pattanaikia Chhak along the national highway connecting the village. The Chief Secretary asked the concerned officials to complete the work by December.

Besides, he visited Satyabadi and took stock of the progress of work of Odia university. He also visited Sakhigopal temple and Bakul Bana at Satyabadi, where renovation work will start soon.

BHUBANESWAR(KCN): Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Saturday distributed appointment letters to 239 youths of the State here as part of the Rojgar Mela launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Pradhan attended the 'Rojgar Mela' at the Rail auditorium here and said that steps taken by the Prime Minister will strengthen the job scenario in the country. There will be enthusiasm



and positive thought among the youths, he said. Pradhan said a new age has started under the leadership of Prime Minister to make the youths self-dependent through Rojgar Melas. Creation of employment opportunities for the youths was a major issue in 2014 when the country was passing through an economic crisis, he said.

Stating that the Centre is implementing several welfare programmes to bring fundamental change in the life of poorest of the poor people, Pradhan said the entire world is now following the Indian model. Those given appointment letters included 89 in department of Posts, 61 in IIT-Bhubaneswar, 15 in Income Tax department, 27 in Employees' State Insurance Corporation, 21 in different banks, five in CRPF, three in CWC and one in BSF.

Meanwhile, Pradhan demanded that the State government should bring out a white paper on the status of vacancies in Education and Health departments. Pradhan requested Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik that the white paper should have details about the vacancies in these two department and how many of these will be filled up.

Pradhan told mediapersons that the decision of the State government to abolish contractual appointment has created confusion. Stating that there is nothing new in the decision as the date of regularisation is always mentioned in the appointment letters of contractual employees, he asked why recruitment was not done to fill up the existing vacancies.

Biju Dakota Soon to Reach

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Bishnupada Sethi, Principal Secretary Commerce & Transport is coordinating the efforts to bring the Iconic Dakota aircraft of Legandary Statesman Biju Patnaik, which will reach soon at Bhubaneswar from Kolkata. As the Airport Authority of India (AAI) has agreed to hand over 1.1 acre land on the premises of the Biju Patnaik International Airport here for the purpose, the process to bring back Dakota is being geared up. Efforts to transport the aircraft to Odisha were made in the last two years, too, and tender was also floated for the initiative, but the COVID-19 pandemic stalled

the plan, a senior official said. "The State Administration is now all set to complete the process as the AAI, at its recent board meeting, accepted the state government's proposal to lease out 1.1 acre of land for setting up a memorial, where the aircraft will be put up for display," said a senior official. Official sources said, the aircraft, which is 64 feet and 8 inches long, with its wings stretching to 95 feet, will be dismantled for transportation by road to Bhubaneswar from the Kolkata airport. The parts will then be reassembled here after necessary repairs, said sources.

After Naveen who?

Bhubaneswar(KCN): "The BJD has definite plans on my succession", this one line statement of Odisha's five-time Chief Minister and BJD President has set the speculation engines booming even though politicians were oblivious of the issue. Naveen made this statement in an interview with a national magazine. This single-liner has whipped up the rumour mill to find an answer to the all-important question, "After Naveen who?". Though Naveen, a bachelor, avers that the people of Odisha will choose his successor, his recent statement has added sufficient fuel to the speculation. He has categorically said that the BJD has a "definite plan" on this. Interestingly, none in the ruling party, senior

However, the manner in which the BJD fielded the chairperson of the Tihidi block, Abanti Das, for Dhamnagar by-poll, questions are raised whether Naveen will hand over the baton to any woman, mostly to the members of Mission Shakti.

Naveen has already reserved 50 per cent seats for women in rural and panchayat elections and also distributed 30 percent Lok Sabha election tickets to women in 2019. One should not wonder if Naveen allotted 50 per



cent of the party ticket to women in the ensuing Assembly elections in the state. If women constitute 50 per cent of the BJD's MLAs, then it will not be out of place for a woman to be the successor of the BJD Supremo.

With Senior BJD leader and Minister Naba Kishore Das advocating for women leadership in the state, and some others echoing this sentiment, it appeared that the BJD people may not oppose the idea of supporting a woman as their leader. Though Pranab Prakash Das is often projected as the "Number Two" in the party, nobody knows he too may be replaced by Women Self Help Group Leadership, pointed out a senior leader adding that none could read Naveen's mind during his 22 years of regime in Odisha. The people in politics including those in the opposition also admit that the women are the strength of Naveen and they actually ensured five consecutive victories of the BJD government in the state. Therefore, Naveen may decide to handover the baton to some woman as he picked up a WSHG member from Aska in Ganjam district Pramila Bisoyi to become a Lok Sabha MP.

It is interesting to note that usually Naveen Patnaik likes to talk to those who like them. Recently he is meeting Women SHG Members more frequently. Like RSS is the backbone of BJP, now it seems WSHG is the internal strength of the governing party. The Department of Mission Shakti has taken WSHG to the next level and they are gaining huge strength and great influence in the political arena. Naturally BJD insiders feel Mission Shakti may provide the alternative. Party insiders, however, say that the present situation will continue as it is. A fit and blooming Naveen is moving with full spirit to attract investments for the state. And as usual he will seek votes in the next elections and ensure victory of the party. Some changes may be seen only after a BJD Government is installed for the sixth consecutive time. Naveen is likely to create history and thereafter only time will tell.

However, the party leaders are confused, and discuss whether the lucky person to succeed Naveen to inherit the BJD empire would be a woman. Confusion still persists and people across the state are eager to know what Naveen's succession plan is, and who will succeed him and when. "But nobody can read Naveen Patnaik mind", rued a BJD veteran.

Many people in the party also witnessed that BJD's general secretary (organization) Pranab Prakash Das has been taking lead in party programmes and he also chaired the party's training programme for youths and students

75K Get Appointment

New Delhi(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched Rozgar Mela – the recruitment drive for 10 lakh personnel via video conferencing today. During the ceremony, appointment letters were handed over to 75,000 newly inducted appointees. Addressing the appointees, the Prime Minister started with greetings and best wishes for Dhanteras. "Today marks the day when a new link in the form of Rozgar Mela is being anchored to the employment and self-employment campaigns in the country that are going on for the last 8 years", he said.

The Prime Minister said that keeping in mind the 75 years of independence, the central government is giving appointment letters to 75,000 youngsters under a programme. "We decided that a tradition of giving appointment letters in one go should be started so that a collective temperament of completing projects in a time-bound way develops in departments", he said explaining the rationale of the Rozgar Mela. In the coming days also, candidates will get their appointment letters from the government from time to time. "I am happy that many NDA-ruled and BJP-ruled states along with the Union Territories will also organise similar Melas", he added.

Welcoming and underlining the significance of the timing of their induction, the Prime Minister told the new appointees that in the Amrit Kaal, for the fulfilment of the resolve of a developed India, we are marching ahead on the path of a self-reliant India. The Prime Minister remarked that the innovators, entrepreneurs, industrialists, farmers and people from the field of manufacturing and services have a crucial role in taking India to the path of self-reliance. Highlighting the importance of Sabka Prayas, the Prime Minister said that everyone's efforts are critical in this journey and this feeling of Sabka Prayas is possible only when all the important amenities reach everyone.

He said that completion of the process of selection for the lakhs of vacancies in a few months and issuing appointment letters is an indication of the change that the government system has undergone in the last 7-8 years. "Today, work culture is changing", he said. "The efficiency of government departments has increased due to the efforts of our Karmayogis",

he added. He recalled the days when applying for government jobs was a cumbersome process and favouritism and corruption were rampant in selections. He said that the steps during the initial years of his government, like self-attestation and abolition of interviews in Group C and Group D posts of the Central Government, have helped the youth. Today, India is the 5th biggest economy. This feat has been achieved because of the reforms undertaken in the last 8 years. We have, the Prime Minister pointed out, leapt forward from the 10th to 5th position in the last 7-8 years. While acknowledging the enormity of the economic challenges that the country faces, the Prime Minister said that India could manage to contain the negative repercussions to a great degree. "This has been made possible because in the last 8 years we got rid of those shortcomings of the country's economy which created hindrances", he said.

Emphasising the most job-intensive sectors like agriculture, private sector and MSME, the Prime Minister highlighted the importance of skilling India's youth for a brighter future. "Today we are emphasising the most on skill development of youth. Under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana, a huge campaign is going on to train the youth according to the needs of the industries of the country", he said. 1.25 crore young people have been trained under Skill India Abhiyan. Kaushal Vikas Kendras all over the country and hundreds of higher education institutes have been opened, he informed. The Prime Minister also said that initiatives like liberalising drone policy, opening up space policy, and 20 Lakh crore rupees worth of loans under Mudra Yojana have taken the process further. "Never before a self-employment program of this magnitude was implemented in the country", he said. Apart from self-help groups, he continued, Khadi and village industry are the prime examples of employment generation in the villages. For the first time in the country, the worth of Khadi and Village Industries has crossed Rs 4 lakh crore and more than 4 crore jobs have been created in Khadi and Village Industries. "A large number of our sisters have a huge stake in this," he said. The Start-Up India campaign, the Prime Minister pointed out, has established the potential of the youth of the country all over the world. Similarly, MSMEs were supported in a big way during the pandemic, protecting about 1.5 crore jobs. MGNREGA amounts to jobs for 7 crore people in the country, he added.

6. Use Tact:

In one of his speeches, famous lawyer Mr. Y.P. Trivedi told about the three important criteria for winning a case in Court, which he listed as **“Tact the first, Tact the second and Tact the third”**.



When you are in Tribunal or Court or even an I.T. authority, you are arguing before a human being and not before a robot. **You must know how the Judge reacts to your argument.** You are just not entering a debating Hall and you are not

trying to impress the audience but you have to win over the mind of the concerned Judge/authority.

We often witness **busy lawyers rushing to the Tribunal at the last moment**, which should be avoided. There is a story about a lawyer who rushed to the Court and started arguing for the opponent of his client. After about half an hour when his Junior whispered to him that he was arguing with a wrong brief, he immediately turned around and said **this is the case of the opponent at its best and I will now proceed to demolish it.** This shows the degree of tact, which the lawyer had.

7. Don't lose temper, keep calm even in difficult situations:

One must never lose temper while representing before the Court, Tribunal or any IT authority. **If one becomes angry, then the case is half lost.** Some ITAT Member or Appellate Authority or A.O. may like to interrupt time and again and may not permit a lawyer or Chartered Accountant to put his submissions in his own way. This may be unfair on the part of the authority, but it does not help the case. If one gets angry, or sarcastic in the Court or before any other authority, they may feel annoyed. Anger is always a precursor of assured defeat in all intellectual conflicts. There is a story of an overbearing Judge who tried to belittle an Advocate who was short in stature by telling him that **“I can put you in my pocket”**. The Advocate replied **“My Lord**

then there will be more law in your pocket than in your Lordship's mind”. This is good as a story, but not beneficial while making representation before authorities or Tribunal or Court.

Again, when the Member of ITAT or an appellate authority or A.O. is making a point, it is always advisable to **listen carefully without interrupting**, because if you interrupt repeatedly, his ego may hurt and the most important thing is to understand the psychology of the authority. It is not advisable to rub his psychology. One has to be fair to the authority, and must try to understand his viewpoint and to meet his doubts. It is important that one has to be fair to authority and the other side as well. **Winning the case may be important, because very often for a professional winning the case is winning the fees, but in the long run, the reputation of a lawyer or a Chartered Accountant will depend largely upon his behaviour in the Tribunal which should be impeccable.** One must remember that primarily duty of a professional in Tribunal is to assist the Court.

8. Keeping cool:

A person who keeps cool is in a better position to command the situation. **The best in lawyer comes out when he does not act on impulsive and emotion, but solely on reason.**

One may find on some of the occasions that some Members or authorities can at times become very difficult or may try to go out of their way to run down lawyers or chartered accountants. One may feel disgruntled, but one should not lose one's cool. **One should be polite to the Tribunal as well as I.T. authorities.** Of course you may be firm in your expression. In such situations, one should keep in mind the psychological aspect. As Edward Carson mentioned **“A much talking Judge can become like an ill-tuned cymbal (i.e. producing a ringing or clashing sound). Even in those circumstances, one should use one's utmost skill, use simple language without being bombastic and slowly try to put one's viewpoints without entering into any confrontation.**

If you feel like **passing remarks**, preserve them when you retire to the Bar Room/Library.

It is a trite saying that even though the Judge gives his judgment everyday, the final judgment on him is passed at the time of his retirement. But it is only half-truth. **Everyday when the lawyers and chartered accountants assemble in the Bar Room/Library, judgments are passed on the quality and behaviour of the ITAT Member/I.T. authorities.**

One should not get upset if one loses a case, because advocacy ultimately is the art of possible. **You cannot win all the cases** and one should not get over-identified with the client or the case. One should be little philosophical on this issue and after all, if one loses a case, there is always an appeal provided in law.

When Justice Holmes went to take his oath of office in Supreme Court, his driver told him **“Sir do justice”**. Justice Holmes turned around and told him **“My dear fellow, I am not here to do justice, I am here to administer law”**.

There is some difference between **justice according to law** and **abstract justice**. In Court, justice has to be administered as per law. Hence, **one need not get bewildered if sometimes justice as anticipated by one is not done.** One should not behave like a young enthusiastic lawyer who when he received a judgment against him shouted in the Court **“I am shocked to see this judgment”**. The Judge threatened him with **contempt** proceedings. It was at that stage that a senior lawyer came to his rescue by apologising for the young lawyer by saying that he is inexperienced and if he had been practising for a longer period in the Court, then he would not have been half as shocked as he was.

9. Be Courteous:

The person making the representation must be persuasive and not aggressive. The utmost courtesy to ITAT Members, CIT (Appeals) and other I.T. authorities must be shown. There is an ancient proverb that **all doors are open to courtesy**. In some cases it is seen that the appellate authorities sometimes require unnecessary information which provokes the representative to question such requirement.

In such cases, the representative should try to overcome that situation by pandering such irrelevant inquiries as the first appellate authority is bound to realize his mistake sooner or later on his own. However, even the Indian Evidence Act, 1872 provides that judge can ask irrelevant questions. **Section 165 of the Indian Evidence Act, 1872, recognizes power of the presiding judge to “ask any question as he pleases, in any form, at any time of witness or of the parties, about any fact, relevant or irrelevant”** (emphasis supplied). **Any attempt to decline any information on the ground that it is irrelevant even otherwise, is bound to create resistance, which is unnecessary.**

The person representing must remember that **Departmental Representative (D.R.) or Counsel for the opposite party or the A.O. is not an enemy** and in any judicial forum certain norms of behaviour are expected. While arguing the case, the person must show respect for the law and the adjudicator of such law. **It is not merely a question of adjudicating but one of innate sincerity, which provides a better chance of success than browbeating.** It is an accepted precept that **a lawyer should bear self control as a court of mail.**

10. It pays to have good sense of humour:

One of the important ingredients for success in Tribunal and before other appellate authorities as well as AOs is to have a good sense of humour. We spend considerable part of our active life dealing with I.T. authorities and in Tribunal and a little smile can always make your stay in the department and Tribunal more enjoyable. Humour can add spice to life. Therefore, **one should be humorous in Court, but only to certain extent.** One should **not persist on making jokes, but a little wit here and there can enliven the Tribunal or departmental offices** and make the boring proceedings lively. Once Mr. C. K. Daftary, while arguing the famous prohibition case in Bombay High Court had said **“We are now a Republic and what is a Republic without a pub?”, it is only a relic”**. That was a good example of sense of humour. (Contd.)

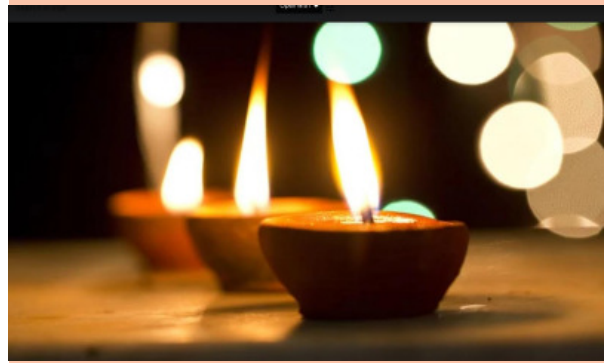

The Story behind celebrating Dhanteras

Dhanteras, also known as 'Dhanatrayodash' is a festival celebrated by Hindus. On this day, people purchase utensils and jewellery to bring good luck. The word is derived from 'Dhan' meaning wealth and 'Teras' which means thirteen. Dhanteras is a major Hindu festival celebrated two days prior to the main Diwali festival. PM Modi kicks off 'Rozgar Mela'; hands out 75,000 job appointments

New Delhi: On Dhanteras, Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched "Rozgar Mela", the recruitment drive that will provide jobs to 10-lakh people in the coming days. During the ceremony, appointment letters were handed over to 75,000 newly inducted appointees at various levels in 38 ministries of the Government of India. This is the first tranche of appointment letters from the government after the PM in June announced that his government will provide 10 lakh jobs in the next 1.5 years. Since then, all ministries have been asked to fill up all vacancies expeditiously. Addressing the Rozgar Mela, the PM said his government is working towards softening the blow of economic issues that several countries, including

favouritism and corruption were rampant in selections. He said that the steps during the initial years of his government, like self-attestation and the abolition of interviews in Group C and Group D posts of the Central government, have helped the youth. The PM said that the Central government is working simultaneously on many fronts to create more jobs in the country. These include having largescale projects in infrastructure, manufacturing and tourism sectors, as these have huge employment potential. Processes are also being simplified for companies from all over the world to come to India and set up their factories, which will lead to top job creation.

BJP president J.P. Nadda also attended the Rozgar



India, are facing due to the Covid-19 pandemic. "It is a fact that the global situation is not very good. Several large economies are struggling. In several countries, problems such as high inflation and unemployment are at their peak. The side effects of the once-in-a-century pandemic will not go away in 100 days. But despite this crisis faced the world over, the impact of which is being felt everywhere, India is taking new initiatives and some risks to save our country from being affected by these problems. Mr Modi said that the completion of the process of selection for the lakhs of vacancies in a few months and issuing appointment letters is an indication of the change that the government system has undergone in the last 7-8 years. He recalled the days when applying for government jobs was a cumbersome process and

Mela in Gurugram, where he handed over appointment letters to many.

Addressing the gathering, Mr Nadda said the Modi government has taken many measures for the country to become self-reliant and also asked the youth to engage in this endeavour led by the PM. The BJP president said that under PM Modi's leadership, India is walking on a new path of development, while noting that India is now the fifth largest economy. Citing the problems faced by the country during the Covid lockdown, Mr Nadda said 80-crore people are being provided food by the Centre since then. The Rozgar Mela appointees will join the government at various levels, such as Group A and Group B (gazetted), Group B (non-gazetted) and Group C. The posts on which appointments are being made include Central armed force personnel, sub inspectors, constables, LDCs, stenographers, PAs, income tax inspectors, and MTS, among others. These recruitments are being done in mission mode by the ministries and departments either by themselves or through recruiting agencies such as UPSC, SSC, Railway Recruitment Board etc. Selection processes have been simplified and made tech-enabled for expeditious recruitment.

Kerala govt gives written assurance to meet demands of activist Daya Bai

Thiruvananthapuram: The Kerala government has given a written assurance of meeting the demands of social activist Daya Bai, who is on a hunger strike seeking justice for Endosulfan victims of Kasaragod district. This comes a day after State ministers R

Endosulfan, an organochlorine insecticide and acaricide was used widely on crops like cashew, cotton, tea, paddy, fruits and others until 2011 in Kerala, when the apex court banned its production and distribution. Endosulfan's toxic effects on humans and related health hazards are well-known. Daya Bai is on strike to ensure proper and better healthcare facilities in the Kasaragod district, where there are a maximum number of victims.

Ministers explained to her the steps taken to meet all the demands of the victims. They said Kasaragod medical college and a speciality hospital at Kanhangad were nearing completion.

The social activist was shifted to a hospital on October 4 after her health deteriorated. On October 8, Leader of Opposition, V D Satheesan, visited Daya Bai and pledged his support to her.

The social activist had sought to ensure better healthcare facilities in the Kasaragod district and also demanded that an All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) be set up there.

The Supreme Court had on May 13 pulled up the Kerala government for not paying the compensation of Rs five lakh to each of the victims of toxic pesticide Endosulfan and directed the Chief Secretary to hold monthly meetings and ensure necessary medical help to them.

The top court had in January 2017 directed the CPI(M)-led government to disburse compensation and rehabilitation package for endosulfan pesticide victims.

The court had ordered the government to provide a compensation of Rs five lakh each to the next of kin of those who died following exposure to the pesticide and those who became bed-ridden or mentally challenged.

Earlier, the state government had prepared a list of 5,837 victims. A monthly pension was being given to 4,376 affected people.

"I Support Ayurveda"

New Delhi(KCN): The 7th Ayurveda Day was celebrated today on a magnificent scale in India and at international level. This year's 7th Ayurveda Day was celebrated with the theme "Har Din Har Ghar Ayurveda" so as to propagate benefits of Ayurveda to larger and grass root community.

The six-week long celebration saw huge participation from across the country, more than 5000 events were organized by Ministry of Ayush institutes/ councils with support of more than 26 ministries of Government of India and Ministry of External Affairs India missions and embassies.

Addressing the gathering, Sarbananda Sonowal, said, that Ayurveda is a science of prevention of disease. MELBOURNE: A Virat Kohli blitzkrieg helped India defeat Pakistan in the ICC T20 World Cup 2022 match at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in Melbourne on Sunday. India needed 16 of the last 5 balls and 5 of 3 balls. Finally, it was 2 of 2 balls when Dinesh Karthik was stumped by Rizwan. With 14 needed off three balls, Nawaz's juicy full-toss was dispatched for a six over square leg and it was called a no-ball after deliberation by on-field umpires.

Nawaz, the hero of Pakistan's Super 4 victory in the Asia Cup, by then had lost his nerves.

After Karthik was stumped by an alert Mohammed Rizwan, Nawaz bowled a wide and Ravichandran Ashwin scored the most important boundary of his career.

'Chak De India' reverberating around the MCG never sounded sweeter and Kohli seemed numb.

What is Muhurat trading and when does it happen?

NEW DELHI: Muhurat trading is a one-off activity which happens at the Indian stock

market during Diwali. It is between 6:15 and 7:15 on the evening of Diwali. It is one of the traditions which has maintained links of the trading community, which mostly used to be Gujarati community, with its rich past. Before this session starts, investors place token orders and buy stocks for their children, which are held for the long-term and sometimes never sold. During the Muhurat session, these traders normally book their intraday profits, however small they may be.



that Goddess Lakshmi comes and resides at the place of puja which is why traders and shopkeepers stay awake with all decorative lights.

Stock brokers perform 'Lakshmi Puja' at the exchange and the customary Muhurat trading takes place. It is believed that on the night of Lakshmi Puja, the Goddess comes to reside at the place of the puja during which the traders and shopkeepers stay awake with lights burning all night.

How did it start? The tradition started with the first traders in the country. A puja is performed, new accounts are opened and new shares are bought on Diwali, marking the start of the Hindu New Year. It is believed that this would begin the new year on a right note.

However, this trading has a flip side because it is highly volatile during this session. The Muhurat trading session is an excellent time to buy or sell stocks since the trading volumes are high.

Hyderabad: Congress' Bharat Jodo Yatra led by party leader Rahul Gandhi entered Telangana on Sunday, after completing the Karnataka leg of the nationwide foot march. Gandhi was accorded a grand welcome at the Telangana-Karnataka border by Telangana Congress leaders when the yatra entered the state.



Congress Lok Sabha member and in-charge of party affairs in Telangana Manickam Tagore, state Congress president A Revanth Reddy, and a number of party leaders welcomed Gandhi. Scores of activists were present at a bridge on Krishna river at the border when the yatra marched into Telangana.

The Wayanad MP walked briefly in Telangana and took a halt at Gudebellur in Narayanpet district of the state. He left for Hyderabad by a chopper and will later fly to Delhi, Congress sources said.

After entering the state, Rahul said that the yatra is fight against hatred.

Briefly addressing the crowd at Gudebellur, Rahul said that he will be listening to the problems of farmers, women and youth in Telangana. While emphasising that the yatra is against the policies of BJP government, he affirmed that it was aimed against hatred, besides the major issues engulfing the nation, the price rise and unemployment.

He alleged that the BJP and RSS are spreading hatred in the country, and said the Bharat Jodo Yatra aims to promote harmony and brotherhood.

The foot march will also raise the issues of price rise and unemployment, he said.

Rupee falls 7 paise to close at 82.37 against US dollar

MUMBAI: The rupee pared its initial gains to close 7 paise down at 82.37 (provisional) against the US dollar in a restricted trade on Tuesday.

At the interbank forex market, the local unit opened at 82.21 against the greenback. It witnessed an intra-day high of 82.02 and a low of 82.37 against the American currency during the session.

It finally ended at 82.37 against the US dollar, down 7 paise from its previous close of 82.30.

The dollar index, which measures the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.18 per cent to 112.24.

The focus will be on the industrial production number from the US and better-than-expected data could support the dollar, Somaiya said, adding that "we expect the USDINR (Spot) to quote in the range of 82.20 and 82.80."

On the domestic equity market front, the BSE Sensex ended 549.62 points or 0.94 per cent higher at 58,960.60 points, while the broader NSE Nifty gained 175.15 points or 1.01 per cent to 17,486.95.

Taylor Fritz reaches top 10, seeks more in breakthrough year

Taylor Fritz is in the midst of a breakthrough season, reaching his first Grand Slam quarterfinal, winning three tour titles and recently becoming the first US man to make his debut in the top 10 of the ATP rankings since 2017.

A son of two ex-pros, Fritz first picked up a racket at age 2, so he's known the sport nearly all of his life — he turns 25 next Friday — but that doesn't mean it's what consumes him. "I guess I wouldn't necessarily say what I love is playing tennis. What I love is competing," Fritz said in a telephone interview ahead of

500-level Tokyo Open this month (Fritz is No. 9 this week). That came after Fritz flew to Japan on the day of his first match because he tested positive for COVID-19 while in South Korea and needed to quarantine for a week in his hotel room there.

"Most players, you'd be surprised if they were able to even play the match and not get injured, let alone find a way to win," Russell said. "Taylor was saying the whole time, 'I'm going to win. It doesn't matter that I haven't hit a ball in seven days. I did some fitness in the room and I trust my hand-eye coordina-



tion and my timing and I'm going to prove to everyone that I can win this tournament even without any preparation.' And he did."

Fritz is 41-17 this year and raised his career title count to four.

One came in June on grass courts in Eastbourne, England. One arrived in March on hard courts at the Masters 1000 in Indian Wells, California, with a victory over a then-unbeaten Rafael Nadal in the final. "That just gave Taylor so much belief going into tournaments that he could be the last man standing. He actually believed it. One thing is saying it, but another is actually believing

it, deep down inside. That's what's changed," Russell said.

"He's started to play more aggressive in the pressure situations and not just waiting for his opponents to give him matches, which is kind of the mentality he had in the past." At the majors, Fritz made it to the fourth round at the Australian Open in January, then the quarterfinals at Wimbledon in July. "I definitely have had the confidence all year that I feel like just my regular level, my regular game, is top-10 material," Fritz said. "I worked really hard, for a really long time, to get to this point. I've had a really good year. And now I set my next goal — top five — and we go from there. "The end goal is to try to be No. 1 in the world. I'm definitely not satisfied."



Fritz's coach, former player Michael Russell, understands how the intensity translates.

"He's very stubborn, which great athletes are because they know what they want and they'll do what they know will get it," said Russell, Fritz's full-time coach for a year.

"Taylor definitely falls in that category." Entering 2022, Fritz was ranked outside the top 20. He never had been past the third round at a Grand Slam tournament. Never had been past the semifinals at a Masters 1000. Never had won an ATP 500. So much has changed.

He moved up to a career-best No. 8 by beating another 24-year-old American, U.S. Open semifinalist Frances Tiafoe, in the final of the
