

PRESIDENT OF INDIA LAUNCHES THE FOURTH KRISHI ROAD MAP OF BIHAR

**NewDelhi,(KCN):**The President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu launched the fourth Krishi Road Map (2023-2028) of Bihar at Patna today (October 18, 2023). Speaking on the occasion, the President said that agriculture is an important part of the folk culture of Bihar. It is the basis of Bihar's economy. Agriculture and allied sectors not only employ almost half of the state's workforce but also contribute significantly to the state's GDP. Therefore, all round development of the agriculture sector is very important. She was happy to note that the Government of Bihar has been implementing the Agriculture Road Map since 2008. She noted that as a result of the implementation of the

last three agricultural road maps, the productivity of paddy, wheat and maize in the state has almost doubled. Bihar has also become a leading state in the production of mushroom, honey, makhana and fish. She said that the launch of the fourth Agriculture Road Map is an important step towards taking this effort forward. The President said that the farmers of Bihar are known for striving and adopting new experiments in farming. This is the reason why a Nobel Prize winner economist called the farmers of Nalanda "greater than scientists". She was happy to note that despite adopting modern farming methods, the farmers of Bihar have preserved the traditional methods of



agriculture and varieties of grains. She described it as a good example of the harmony of tradition with modernity. The President urged farmers of Bihar to take advantage of the rising demand for organic products. She said that

organic farming is helpful in reducing the cost of agriculture and environment conservation. It is also capable of increasing the farmers' income and providing nutritious food to the people. She was happy to note that the

Government of Bihar has created an organic corridor in the districts along the banks of Ganga to boost organic farming. The President said that global warming and climate change are a crisis for the existence of entire humanity. But

these affect the poor the most. She noted that Bihar has received very little rainfall in recent years. She said that Bihar has been considered a water-rich state, rivers and ponds have been the identity of this state. To maintain this identity, it is

very important to pay attention to water conservation. She stated that Climate Resilient Agriculture can play an important role in dealing with the challenge of climate change. By bringing changes in the current farming pattern, bio-diversity can be promoted, exploitation of water resources can be reduced, soil fertility can be conserved, and above all, balanced food can be delivered to the plates of people. The President was happy to note that ethanol is being produced from maize, a major crop of Bihar. She said that it is an important step towards reducing dependence on fossil fuels, environmental protection and energy security of the country. The President said that

the contribution of Bihar is very important in fulfilling the dream of developed India. But to turn this dream into reality, we have to come out of man-made narrow-mindedness. There is no option other than holistic development to make Bihar a developed state. The policy-makers and people of Bihar have to set a road map for the progress of the state and follow it. She said that it is a matter of satisfaction that the agriculture road map is being implemented in Bihar. But, she would be more happy when Bihar is seen continuously moving on the path of progress by making a road map on every parameter of development - be it health, education, per capita income or Happiness Index.

CM Inaugurates OPTCL TECH Tower



**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik inaugurated the OPTCL Tech Tower today at Saheed Nagar in Bhubaneswar. This Rs 55 Crore worth multi-storeyed building will function as Corporate Office of Odisha Power Transmission Corporation Ltd. Secretary to CM (5T) Shri VK Pandian was

present. The building has been constructed with modern architecture and technology to ensure the safety of the workspace and the building is an energy-efficient building. It is worth mentioning here that Odisha Power Transmission Corporation Limited is engaged in providing uninterrupted and quality

Justice Dr S Muralidhar, before his retirement in August this year, served as the Chief Justice of Orissa High Court between January 2021 and August 2023. During his 17-year-long tenure, he also served as a judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court and Delhi High Court.

# That Pretty Woman

I have not visited Nayagarh for the last three decades. Whenever I think of Nayagarh, its delicious cheese cake ( Cheena Poda) and wit of Poet Jadumani comes to my mind. Jadumani was a famous poet and narrator from Odisha.Ingenious humour and Satire was the specialty of his writing. Though he was born in Athagara village in Ganjam District, yet he left his birth place during his adolescence and resided permanently at Itamati Village of Nayagarh , then a princely state. He was popularly known as an extraordinarily talented poet, intellectual and orator. Spontaneous poetic talent and sharp wit was filled within him. He was able to acquire in-depth knowledge in Oriya and Sanskrit language with self determination and hard endeavour. Through jokes, humours and satire, ridicule, he used to face the truth and unmasked dishonesty, illegitimacy and untruthfulness. Many of his humorous poetic exclamations are used as idioms in day to day activities even current day society. Jadumani was a gifted child of Goddess Saraswati. It is natural that he would not be blessed with goddess Lakshmi. A poet as such is worshipped

far and wide in his own country as well as in other countries, but in his house dies out of hunger. Most of his days are spent in scarcity and sorrow. Whatever he received from the court by praising the King was not sufficient for sustaining his whole family. Once there was no grain or paddy in the house. Jadumani finished up his daily activities and went to the court taking some Tiffin. He was supposed to bring some rice and vegetables while returning from the court. His wife was waiting for him. Jadumani returned from the court at the usual time. Being absent minded he couldn't know when he reached home. The poets are like this. They go on singing even in acute hunger. He remembered everything when he reached home. He had not brought anything. He felt helpless and sad thinking what his wife will say. His wife however was very clever. Totally husband oriented. She consoled him. Said, "There is no point in being so thoughtful. I know all the poets are like this. I have already cooked whatever grain was there in the house. Wash your hands and face and eat." Jadumani changed his clothes and sat for dinner. His wife sat beside him. Very hesitantly she spoke, "will you keep a request of mine?" "Say what" "I am saying this for our well being. Think for a while and see. Then you do what you realise to be the better. We have nothing as our property. We don't have

a proper house to stay in. We are just lying in this broken hut. Somehow we are managing with the meager amount that you get by writing poems in praise of the King. Had we had some land then we could have sustained ourselves by cultivating it. I think if you ask for a cultivable land from the King he will not deny you. He will certainly give. But ask for it in the right time." Jadumani accepted his wife's request and promised to ask for a land to the king next day. The couple then went to sleep that night. The next day while being to the court jadumani's wife reminded him about the land. Jadumani reached the court early and sat silently making a remorseful face. The king entered the court. Still then he didn't get up to greet him. The king immediately asked, "Jadumani what happened? Are you not well or sad for any reason?" Jadumani pressed his stomach hard and said my health and mind is ok but my stomach is paining out of hunger. All sorts of drama on this earth are only for this small stomach. If one's stomach is full then only he can do something. If His Highness grants a land for me then...." The king realized that the poet is saying the right thing. If he gets a land then he can sustain his family by cultivating the same. There will be no poverty in his family. He immediately called for the land dispersing officer and ordered him to handover a good land to Jadumani as soon as possible as a gift. Jadumani

met the officer after the meeting of the court was over. The dispersing noble thought this man is carpenter by profession. Writing one or two mere lines of poem this poet is misguiding the king and now is going to get a land as gift! He will not let this happen. So he said to Jadumani, "O' the intellectual, give me some time. I will find a very good land so that you will remember me all through your life. There are chances of being cheated in haste." Jadumani agreed with him. Time passed gradually, one year was over. Jadumani didn't get a land. One day he met the noble and queried if he is not interested to give a land. The noble thought if Jadumani will get angry then he will immediately tell everything to the King. So he instantly handed over Jadumani the papers of a land. Jadumani returned home happily. The next day when he saw the land his heart became cold. That was such a stoney land where no crop can be cultivated. It was a rocky barren land. Cultivating crops are far cry; even a grass has not sprouted on that land inspite of heavy rains. He went to the court. There was no happiness in his mind. He was sitting with a heavy heart. As soon as the king arrived he asked about his well being. Instead of saying anything he wrote a poem and gave it to the king. The King read - 'Whatever his highness gave out of pleasure To get it took one full year Selected carefully a land

that is so barren Even coconut will break in the rainy season Such a land Even 'Chakunda' seeds will not show a strand.' The King understood everything. He immediately summoned for the land dispersing noble and rebutted him like anything. He also suspended the noble from his job for some days. He then gifted Jadumani a very fertile land. Nayagarh has always remained a pretty woman for me as I have always seen it in the midnight either when going or coming back from Umerkote where I was a School Headmaster for three years in 1980s. My younger brother like Arindam Dakua once invited me in early 2000s for inaugurating a Book Fair he organised when he was appointed as its Collector after it became a district, but I could not make it. I have two more young friends from there, Bibhuti Jena and Sarat Acharya. Of late my student Ajeet Kumar Mishra joined Nayagarh College as a Lecturer in English. Nayagarh College and my School Utkal Hindi Vidyapith were contemporaries, both were established in early 1960s. Eminent poets Devdas Chhotaray and Haraprasad Das were lecturers there before joining civil services. Prof Ganeswar Mishra was also there before joining Utkal University. Poet Harihar Mishra ,!Essayist Parikshit Nanda and fiction writer Nimai Pattanayak was also there. The kings of Nayagarh were patrons of literature for centuries. Poet

Laureate Upendra Bhanja was in his court beside Sadananda Kavisurya Brahma. It was a dream of artists in the medieval period to get an invitation from Nayagarh Royal Court to showcase their talent. Pandit Binayak Mishra who succeeded Pandit Nilakantha Dash as a Professor in Calcutta University, was also from Nayagarh, my teacher Dr Bijoy Kumar Nanda too. I had two more personal connections with Nayagarh at one point of time. My father had three cousins. One of my aunts was from Nayagarh. Her brothers were at times visiting us at Puri. My own uncle was teasing them by saying that since they are from an underdeveloped princely state, visiting Puri for them is like visiting Bombay city ! One of my closest colleagues at Umerkote Prafulla Kumar Sahoo, PET, was also from Nayagarh. He gave me shelter in his quarters when I joined there. At that time I was just a stranger for him. Nayagarh is very close to my heart. But, nobody has called me to visit Nayagarh for the last three decades and I don't visit uninvited to the house of a pretty !

## Revitalizing Healthcare in Odisha: A Path to Progress and Prosperity



India's healthcare landscape has witnessed significant reforms in recent years, with initiatives like the National Health Mission (NHM), Pradhan Mantri Jan Aarogya Yojana (PMJAY), Health and Wellness Center (HWC) Programs, and the National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) aiming to strengthen the country's healthcare infrastructure. While these reforms have undoubtedly expanded healthcare access, India continues to face multifaceted challenges in achieving comprehensive health system outcomes. These challenges include ensuring financial risk protection, affordable and equitable access to quality healthcare, efficient service delivery, and enhancing citizen satisfaction. India's healthcare reforms have been instrumental in expanding access to healthcare services across the country. The

NHM, launched in 2005, has been pivotal in strengthening healthcare infrastructure, particularly in rural areas. PMJAY, often referred to as Ayushman Bharat, introduced the world's largest government-funded health insurance program, providing financial protection to millions of vulnerable families. The HWC Programs aimed to transform sub-health centers into comprehensive primary healthcare centers, bringing essential services closer to communities. The NDHM, with its digital health initiatives, seeks to revolutionize healthcare delivery and improve health information management. In this context, Odisha, a vibrant state in eastern India, home to around forty million people, over the years has witnessed a gradual improvement in the health and well-being of its population, thanks to various developmental, educational, and economic initiatives, along with advancements in healthcare services. The state of Odisha holds immense potential for increased healthcare spending. In recent years, health expenditure has

represented a modest 0.57 percent of the total gross state domestic product. A substantial portion of these funds is channeled into the tertiary sector, focused on diagnosing and



treating diseases, leaving limited resources for building a robust healthcare infrastructure. While Odisha has made strides in improving healthcare, substantial progress is still needed. Mortality rates in the state remain higher, and life expectancy is lower than national averages. Alarming figures such as infant mortality rates close to sixty-five and under-five mortality rates at eighty-one per thousand live births highlight the urgency of addressing child health issues. To combat these challenges, Odisha has developed a comprehensive child health plan under the National Health Mission. However,

immunization rates, though improving, are still suboptimal, with just seventy-one percent of one-year-old children fully immunized. Common

ailments like diarrhea, gastroenteritis, anemia, and jaundice continue to account for a significant portion of childhood mortality. Reducing maternal mortality is another priority, requiring greater institutional deliveries. Unfortunately, only forty-four percent of deliveries in Odisha occur in healthcare facilities. Strengthening healthcare infrastructure and ensuring access to skilled healthcare personnel for maternal, neonatal, and postnatal care are imperative. Malaria control and efforts to combat HIV and AIDS have shown positive results, reflecting the state's commitment to addressing health challenges. The

establishment of new subcenters, primary health centers, and community health centers has been pivotal in improving health indicators in Odisha.

State-driven reforms aimed at distributing healthcare resources more equitably across rural and urban areas, including incentives for doctors to serve in remote regions, have yielded mixed results. With just 120 doctors per one million people and fewer than four beds per ten thousand people, further progress is essential. The Orissa State Integrated Health Policy recommends that public expenditure on healthcare reach two percent of the state's gross domestic product and five to six percent of the state budget. This policy envisions a fair allocation of resources across primary, secondary, and tertiary care, as well as among different regions and healthcare systems.

However, health financing in Odisha remains fragmented. Out-of-pocket spending by households constitutes the largest funding source, accounting for a staggering eighty percent of total health expenditure, surpassing the national average of seventy-one percent. Medications contribute significantly to these out-of-pocket expenses, especially in public hospitals. The state government, financed through general tax revenues, supports free or subsidized public health services, including programs like the National Health Mission. Government-sponsored health insurance programs aimed at the poor further diversify funding sources. These programs have had notable success in covering a substantial portion of the below-poverty-line population. Coordination among implementing agencies needs improvement to enhance the effectiveness of healthcare programs. Accessibility issues persist in tribal and hilly areas, where healthcare providers and skilled professionals remain scarce. Acute staff shortages, low salaries, and morale issues pose significant hurdles to healthcare delivery.

While information technology innovations show promise, their impact on healthcare quality needs evaluation. The burden of out-of-pocket spending, particularly on medications, disproportionately affects those seeking care at higher-tier facilities due to a weak referral system. Collaborations with NGOs and greater community involvement can improve healthcare access. Fiscal devolution provides communities with opportunities for greater awareness and transparency. Tailored communication strategies can overcome barriers associated with low literacy and limited media access. To revitalize healthcare in Odisha, the following recommendations should be considered: Diversify funding sources such as exploring private sector investments and donor agency support to reduce reliance on out-of-pocket expenditures. To boost efficiency, systematically allocate budgets for greater efficiency, exemplified by initiatives like the Odisha State Medical Corporation Ltd. Shift from vertical programs and Integrate disease-

specific programs into the general healthcare system for cost-effectiveness and increased impact. To ensure quality health care services, enforce standard treatment guidelines and referral protocols to guarantee high-quality healthcare. Odisha's healthcare system stands at the crossroads of transformation. Investments in health technology, coupled with a commitment to evidence-based decision-making, are paving the way for a more efficient and accessible system. Nevertheless, challenges like high out-of-pocket expenditures and unequal access to quality healthcare persist, particularly in remote areas. Private sector investment holds immense potential but must be complemented by robust regulation. As Odisha continues its journey towards a healthier future, it offers a promising landscape for stakeholders to collaborate, innovate, and make impactful investments. The goal is clear: to ensure that every citizen, regardless of location or economic status, has access to quality healthcare services, ultimately leading to a healthier, more prosperous Odisha.

## Jammu And Kashmir Forms Panel To Identify Foreigners Staying Illegally

**Jammu (KCN):** The Jammu and Kashmir administration has set up a six-member committee to identify foreign nationals who are illegally staying in the Union Territory since January 2011. The home department in an order stated that the committee will prepare a monthly report and submit it by the seventh day of every month to the Union home ministry.

The financial commissioner-cum-additional chief secretary of the home department will be the chairperson of the panel which was constituted in response to a November 26, 2020, communication by the home ministry, the order



read. The members of the committee include the Foreigners Regional Registration Officer (FRRO) of Punjab, senior superintendents of police (SSPs), the Jammu and Kashmir Police's Criminal

Investigation Department (Special Branch) of both Jammu and Srinagar, and all SSPs and SPs (Foreigners Registration Office). In 2021, the Jammu and Kashmir Police had launched a major

crackdown against illegal immigrants and detained over 270 Rohingyas from Myanmar, including 74 women and 70 children, at the sub-jail in Kathua district's Hiranagar. The jail was eventually turned into a holding

centre for foreigners staying illegally in the Union Territory.

Rohingyas are a Bengali-dialect speaking Muslim minority in Myanmar. Following persecution in their country, many of them entered India illegally through Bangladesh and took shelter in Jammu and other parts of the country.

More than 13,700 foreigners, including Rohingya Muslims and Bangladeshi nationals, are settled in Jammu and Samba districts of Jammu and Kashmir, where their population has increased by more than 6,000 between 2008 and 2016, according to government data.

# Scripting the new Orange era, with Edwards and Cook

**New Delhi:** Rarely do you see Scott Edwards not sporting a smile, whether it is practice, doing the drills, walking out for the toss, interacting with his teammates, speaking to the opposition members, sitting in the dressing room, or speaking to journalists.

"I'm probably not the loudest captain going around," Edwards tells Cricbuzz, again with a smile. Even during the tense moments of their World Cup Qualifiers campaign, he was "reasonably calm" whilst his side pulled off remarkable victories en route to India. "I sort of had the feeling that we were going to get the job done. We may not have got the job done but I was pretty relaxed... if it was meant to be then we would win those games,

and if it wasn't then yeah, it wasn't meant to be," he puts it simply.

This sort of calmness and quiet confidence are traits usually associated with an experienced leader. Edwards, all of 27, only got the role a year back, and that too because Pieter Seelaar's troublesome back forced him into retirement. He was the vice-captain at that time when Edwards was thrust into the role midway during the ODI series against a rampaging England side. It wasn't the ideal initiation for Edwards with England registering thumping victories. But it was a learning experience nevertheless, one that would hold him in good stead in the months to come.

A couple of months before Edwards took the captaincy seat, there was another change in the



leadership structure as Ryan Cook was named interim head coach after regular coach Ryan Campbell suffered a cardiac episode during a family holiday in England. Campbell later stepped down from the role and Cook became the full-time head coach, with the Cook-Edwards partnership heralding a

new journey for the Netherlands cricket team.

"It was quite a sudden thing that happened with Pieter Sielaar, and there were a lot of people involved in the decision to get Scott involved as the captain. At that time, I was still serving in the interim. We discussed it between Ryan, myself

and other coaches. One, we felt he was a willing leader. Two, he was very able. He came in with a bit of baptism of fire with the England series which was a tough one for us. But leading into the Qualifiers, we started to bring in his own flavour and how he wanted to run things," recalls Cook in a chat with Cricbuzz.

"That equation between him and I developed over time. I've learned a lot about him, a lot from him. He is a very intelligent cricketer, has incredibly intel on the game and how he wants to play it. He is an incredibly authentic human, he is very believable to his charges and that makes him very credible because he shows up for his team when they need him. He has an incredible work rate and sets an incredible example. He is willing to walk the talk wherever needed." Walk the talk, he did on Tuesday.

After two losses to kickstart their 2023 World Cup campaign, the Edwards-led Netherlands were up against South Africa in Dharamsala. While there was a ray of hope that they could repeat the giant-killing act they pulled off in the

T20 World Cup in 2022, that slipped away quickly when the Dutch slipped to 140/7 in the 34th over in a game reduced to 43 overs per side. Edwards, who was on 33 off 41 at that stage, had the belief that his team could finish with a good total and also had the confidence in his lower-order team-mates. Roelof van der Merwe and Aryan Dutt reciprocated that with blazing 20s while the skipper himself got to 78 not out off 69 as the Netherlands posted a challenging 245/8 on the board. Despite lacking experience in mainstream captaincy, Edwards comes across as an assured leader. One of the important attributes is to be able to gain the trust of his team-mates. "I feel I got a good understanding of what it took on the field.

It's probably the off-field sort of things that you are probably not ready for. You just take it as it comes, and now I'm loving the captaincy role," says Edwards, before he reflects on his understanding of his players and how they have aided in his growth as a skipper.

"I think I've got a good understanding of the players we've got in our group, so it's just fine-tuning the way to get the best out of those guys is pretty much my main role. How can I get the best out of everyone? I think it's probably bits and pieces I've picked up along the way but like I said, I'd like to lean on other guys who've got plenty of experience in the setup. Plenty of guys have captained in county cricket, in different parts of the world. So I've got plenty of that experience."

## Pakistan squad faces minor health scare

**New Delhi:** The Pakistan team at the World Cup has been hit by a minor health issue with a few of their players afflicted by fever. Ace fast bowler Shaheen Afridi is believed to be among those affected.

According to a statement from the Pakistan team management, some of the players who had been suffering from fever are now on the path to recovery, while others are still recuperating. "Some players got fever in the past few days and most of them have fully recovered from it. Those who are in the stage of recovery remain under the team medical panel's observation," a spokesman for the Babar Azam-led team said. The names of those under the weather have not been disclosed but it is understood that the players who are unwell



include Shaheen, Abdullah Shafique, Mohammad Rizwan, Salman Ali Agha, Mohammad Haris and Zaman Khan. "There is no viral infection or disease. A few players had a fever and most have already recovered," the statement said without disclosing the names.

## 'Strategically we got things wrong' - Rob Walter on South Africa's Dutch defeat

**New Delhi:** How could a team that played so well to beat Sri Lanka and Australia perform so poorly against the Netherlands? Rob Walter seemed to appreciate the enquiry, even if the faltering team under discussion was his own.

"That's a hell of a good question; I guess that's why we love sport," Walter said after South Africa crashed to a difficult-to-imagine defeat, by 38 runs, against the Dutch in their men's World Cup match in Dharamsala on Tuesday. "Four days ago we played outstandingly well [to beat Australia by 134 runs, their heaviest ever World Cup defeat, in Lucknow], today not well. We weren't good enough, particularly at the end of their innings and at the start of our innings."

The game turned on the last nine overs of the Netherlands' innings, when they scored 104 runs, and the first 11.2 of South Africa's reply, when they shambled to 44/4. Call it 122 balls of unscripted mayhem. Or call it what Walter did: a cautionary tale that there are no minnows at the World Cup. "If you're not switched on at key moments you're going to find yourself on the wrong side of the result," he said. And how. South Africa reduced the Dutch to 82/5, then 112/6, then 140/7. Then they let them off the hook, but the 245/8 the Netherlands made - 32 of them extras, among those 21 wides - in their 43 overs in the rain-affected match should have been within reach of the South Africans' powerful batting line-up. Instead, the big guns jammed and Walter's

team were dismissed for 207 in 42.5.

"Strategically we might have got a few things wrong," he said. "Maybe I got our ratios wrong in terms of the slower ball versus hard length and on-pace deliveries. That's definitely more extras than we would want to bowl. At 140/7 you're in control of the game, so to not be able to close out the innings at the death is disappointing. The momentum shifted then, but we back ourselves to chase 240. But we got off to a very poor start and that put us on the back foot."

"It takes everyone to win the game and the competition, so you can't rely on any one aspect. You've got to do it all and you've got to do it consistently well. We were inconsistent from the last game to this game, and we got a couple of things wrong



that we normally would get right. It takes batting, bowling and fielding to win games." Walter was not yet South Africa's white-ball coach when the Dutch beat them by 13 runs in Adelaide in November in their last group match at the T20 World Cup, which eliminated Temba Bavuma's team from the race for the semifinals. Tuesday's setback came in the South Africans' third league game of

this tournament, so they have six matches left to repair the damage.

But they are under pressure to fix things quickly, what with them taking on England and Bangladesh in Mumbai on Saturday and next Tuesday and Pakistan in Chennai next Friday. That's seven days that could shake South Africa's world - in good or bad ways - nevermind their World Cup.

"We'll do a proper

dissection of the game, but it's really what you take from this game that makes you better in the next game," Walter said. "That's ultimately the question we ask ourselves after every game. Win or lose, what are the lessons that we take and how do we use those to be better next time round? And, to be honest, we could probably chat for quite long this time. There's a lot to learn, good and bad. I don't need to point

out the obvious; the numbers tell us that. The learnings are there. It's about us being open enough to be able to take them on board and move forward."

Scott Edwards was one of eight players in the Dutch XI that shining day in Adelaide in November and again in Dharamsala on Tuesday. He was anything but surprised at his team's latest feat: "It's just about playing our best brand of cricket, and we feel like if we play well enough on the day we can beat any side." Even so they had to earn the right to be in India by reaching the final of the qualifiers in Zimbabwe in July. Tuesday's knockout blow must have made it all worthwhile. "After qualifying we were pretty quick to set our minds to what we wanted to do at

this tournament," Edwards said. "We weren't coming here just to have fun and enjoy it. We're here to win games of cricket and give ourselves the best chance to make that next [semifinal] stage. If we want to be amongst it we've got to beat sides like this." The Netherlands lost to Pakistan and New Zealand before Tuesday's triumph. But those unhappinesses are receding at breakneck speed in the Dutch's review mirror: what matters is now. They next play fellow qualifiers Sri Lanka in Lucknow on Saturday. The Lankans, who have already gone down to South Africa, Pakistan and Australia, have - you would hope - been warned.
