

# Metro Rail Stone On 1 Jan37 Dead As Express Train Collides With Stationary Passenger Train In Andhra

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Foundation stone for the much hyped Metro Rail Project to be laid on New Year day. Chairman 5T & Nabina Odisha V K Pandian along with senior officials reviewed the work of the proposed Metro Rail Project early this morning. The mass public transport project will connect the twin city of Bhubaneswar & Cuttack. The Phase I of the Metro Rail project will connect Bhubaneswar Airport with Trisulia Square, via Chandrasekharpur, Jaydev Vihar, Vani Vihar, Master Canteen and Rajmahal Square. Shri Pandian discussed and facilitated decisions for timely commencement of the construction of Metro Rail project. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had announced the project on Odisha Dibas on 1st April 2023 for which the Detailed Project Report has been approved by the Government. A Master Plan for extending the Metro Rail



service to other areas of Bhubaneswar and to Khordha, Puri and Cuttack towns is being developed through Delhi Metro Rail Corporation Ltd. Trisulia is going to emerge as a major traffic hub to serve Bhubaneswar and Cuttack cities as well as emerge as gateway to the Twin city from Banki and Athgarh side. The Central Depot of the Metro Rail project will be located near Trisulia Square where the Command & Control Centre as well as the maintenance and stabling facilities for the Metro trains will be constructed. A New Bus Stand is being constructed at Trisulia Square, which will be

further expanded and integrated with the metro station. Chairman 5T and Nabin Odisha expressed satisfaction on the progress made by various departments and agencies and directed officials to complete the preparatory work in time ahead of the foundation stone for the project to be laid by the Chief Minister on January 1, 2024. He instructed that the works must be monitored very closely, observing principles of 5T to ensure timely completion of the project within a four years schedule. He also asked officials to ensure that the project realizes the vision of the Chief Minister of a world class urban transport

system for the aspirational Odisha. Shri Pandian advised that the metro system should leverage the latest technologies and most advanced equipment to provide an efficient mobility solution to passengers. He asked officials to ensure that other modes of transport are aligned with metro rail stoppages for the seamless movement of passengers. He also advised officials to ensure that the project planning should be done in such a way so that it has enough room for long term future expansions. Meanwhile, Shri Pandian made a surprise visit to the newly constructed Cuttack

Netaji Bus Terminal (CNBT) to get feedback from people and see the cleanliness at the state of the art terminal. He interacted with passengers, vendors, service providers, bus operators and other staff members. He asked officials to further strengthen the integrated information management system which will enhance the passenger experience and hassle free movement of passengers. The officials also visited the transformed Taladanda Canal. He advised that the visual aesthetics along the canal should be maintained so it continues to be a recreational hub for the people of Cuttack city. 5T Chief was accompanied by Anu Garg, Development Commissioner, Manoj Kumar Mishra, Principal Secretary, E&IT Department, senior officials of Cuttack District Administration, Bhubaneswar Metro Rail Corporation and Works Department.

**NewDelhi(KCN):** At least 7 people were killed on Sunday when an Express Train rammed a stationary passenger train in Andhra Pradesh, months after the horrific three-train collision in Odisha that killed over 280. The passenger train was going from Visakhapatnam to Rayagada. It stopped due to a break in overhead cable. The incoming train, Palasa Express, is said to have run into the stationary train derailing three coaches. Pictures from the site showed the derailed coaches and people crowding around. Andhra Chief Minister Jagan Reddy has consoled the loss of lives



in the accident. "The CM expressed deep shock over the Katakapalli train accident incident in Vizianagaram district. He ordered the officials to take quick relief measures and ensure that the injured get prompt medical services," the Chief Minister's office posted on social media.

"The Chief Minister advised to send as many ambulances as possible from the nearby districts of Visakhapatnam and Anakapalli and make all kinds of arrangements to provide medical treatment in the nearby hospitals. The details regarding the incident should be reported to him from time to time," it added.

## Minimum temp drops to 13°C in Phulbani; IMD predicts rain in some Odisha districts from Nov 1

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Several parts of Odisha on Sunday experienced early morning chill with a considerable drop in the minimum or night temperature. Phulbani and G. Udayagiri recorded the lowest minimum temperature of 13 degrees Celsius on Sunday. The mercury dipped to below 20 degrees for the first time this October in Bhubaneswar while Cuttack recorded a minimum temperature of 20.2 degree Celsius. The residents of Koraput also welcomed the winter on the first day of Kartik month. Several parts of the district also experienced dense fog. It is for the



second day that dense fog was experienced in Koraput. This caused inconvenience for the commuters following a sharp drop in visibility on roads. Despite this, a huge rush was observed at major religious institutions during the wee hours today. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) informed that the

maximum temperature observed a fall at one or two places over the districts of North Coastal Odisha while no large change was observed in other parts of the state. As per IMD, there will be no overall change in the weather conditions in the next couple of days. However, some parts of the state are likely to experience light rainfall for a period of three days from November 1, 2023.

## Holy Month Of Kartika Begins; Thousands Of Devotees Gather In Puri

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** The month of Kartika is considered to be the most auspicious time in the Odia calendar. Starting on Kumar Purnima and culminating on Kartika Purnima, this month (also known as the month of Damodar i.e., Krishna) is that time of the year when a few distinct annual rituals are observed, quintessential of the Odia culture. The Holy month of



Kartika has started from today that is October 29. The Habishyalis will observe the month of Kartik Brata starting today. The district

administration has prepared accommodation, food and health and safety arrangements for more

than 3 thousand devotees in 5 Habishyali centers in Puri. Various voluntary organizations of Puri have also joined offering their services and support. Apart from security personnel, 2 additional SPs, 7 DSPs, 10 inspectors, 44 SIs and ASIs, 70 constables and 18 platoon forces have been deployed to maintain law and order during this month. Arrangements have been

made by the administration for the darshan of Lord Jagannath, distribution of Maha Prasad, listening to Kartik Mahatma and performing Bhajan Kirtan in the temple. More than 3 thousand Habishyalis will benefit from the government's scheme. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik will inaugurate Habishyalis Sibira virtually via video conferencing today.

# 2K CR For Disaster Resilient Infra

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Moving a step forward in management of natural disasters especially cyclones, the State Government has decided to spend more than Rs 2,000 crore to create disaster-resilient infrastructure. He also praised the local community volunteers, ODRAF, Fire Services, NDRF and the District Administration for their work during the Bahanaga Train Accident. The theme for Odisha Disaster Preparedness Day 2023 was 'Empowering Community for Resilient

Odisha'. Sudam Mamdi, Minister, Revenue and Disaster Management (R&DM), Chief Secretary Pradeep Jena, ACS Revenue & Disaster Management and SRC, Satyabrata Sahu addressed the gathering. Response Forces and other stakeholders like NDRF, ODRAF, F&ES, Inter Agency Group, IRCS, Dept. of Health and Family Welfare, Department of School and Mass Education, Civil Defence, Cyclone Shelter Maintenance and Management Committees, PPL, etc. participated in the state level exhibition. # Income Tax search in what circumstances- Part 3

(Contd from 23 Oct 2023)

11. Present practice for deciding the cases for conducting search: As per the present practice, the searches are to be conducted keeping in view the recent CBDT Instruction No. 7/2003, dated 30.07.2003, the contents of which are summarised hereunder -

“1. With a view to focus on high revenue yielding cases and to make the optimum use of manpower, the Board has decided that officers deployed in the Investigation Wing should restructure their activities. They should henceforth strictly adhere to the following guidelines : (i) Searches should be carried out only in cases where there is credible evidence to indicate substantial unaccounted income/ assets in relation to tax normally paid by the assessee or where expected concealment is more than Rs. 1 crore; (ii) Search operation will also be mounted when there is evidence of hidden unaccounted assets arising out of a conspiracy to cause public harm, terrorism, smuggling, narcotics, fraud, gangsterism, fake currency, fake stamp papers and such other manifestations; (iii) Tax payers

who are professionals of excellence should not be searched without there being compelling evidence and confirmation of substantial tax evasion.

2. Henceforth, search operations shall be authorized only by the concerned DGIT (Inv.), who will be accountable for the action initiated by the officers working under him. He should also ensure that all the work relating to search & seizure, like post-search inquiries, preparation of appraisal report and handing over of seized books of account etc., should be completed by the Investigation Wing within a period of 60 days from the date on which the last of the authorizations for search was executed.

3. DGsIT (Inv.) are requested to ensure that officers of competence and proven integrity are taken in the Investigation Wing. The officers posted in the Investigation Wing will be trained at NADT in a special course for which arrangements will be separately made....”

12. It may be mentioned that the Task Force on Direct Taxes chaired by Dr. Vijay Kelkar had stated in para 3.25 of its final report as follows -

“ 3.25 Search and seizure has a limited role, in the Income tax

proceedings. Search and seizure is not a substitute for investigation. It is only a tool for investigation. It is not an end in itself. Search and seizure cannot be a way of life for any civilised society. Search and seizure should be used in rarest of rare cases, when it is a must and where alternative measures of investigation have failed. And once it is used, it should have its full impact as a deterrent. The tax evader should suffer the penal consequences of interest, penalty and prosecution in respect of the concealed income detected as a result of the search.”

13. Furnishing of the reasons recorded for initiating search or requisition of books of account and other documents u/s 132A to assessee: As per explanation inserted in sec. 132(1) amended by the Finance Act, 2017 with retrospective effect from asst. year 1962-63 and similar explanations inserted in sec. 132(1A) and sec. 132A (w.e.f. 1.10.1975), the reason to believe, as recorded by the income-tax authority for initiating search proceedings or requisition of books of account, shall not be disclosed to any person or any authority or the Appellate Tribunal. In this connection the

decision of the Supreme Court in the case of DGIT (Inv.) v. Spacewood Furnishers Pvt. Ltd. [2015] 374 ITR 0595 (SC) may be referred to, wherein the apex court held that reasons recorded prior to authorizing search need not to be disclosed or communicated to the person against whom the warrant of authorization is issued. No right is conferred on taxpayer of inspection of documents or to a communication of the reasons for the belief at the stage of issuing of the authorization. The Supreme Court observed: “Any such view would be counterproductive of the entire exercise contemplated by Section 132 of the Act” and material may be disclosed only at the stage of commencement of the assessment after search is completed. Further, the amendment has nullified the decision of ITAT Jodhpur Bench in the case of Shri Parma Ram Bhakar [TS-515-ITAT-2013(JODH)], wherein it was held that search conducted without recording reasons to believe is invalid and quashed the assessment framed in pursuance of invalid search. It has been held by

Apex Court in the case of Ess Dee Aluminium Ltd. and Etc. [TS-625-SC-2016], that “if the assessment order which is based on the search operations is under challenge, the validity of the search proceedings can also be gone into by the CIT (Appeals).

14. Whether non-production of information, records and documents by a assessee despite constant direction of revenue can be a reason for invoking provisions of sec. 132: It has been held that where assessee fails to produce information, records or documents despite constant direction of the revenue, it shall form the reasons to believe for the purpose of initiating a search u/s 132 - Aditya Narayan Mahasupakar v. CCIT [2017] 79 taxmann.com 111 (Orissa).

15. Whether information from CBI that a particular person possesses money and according to CBI the money is undisclosed, constitute information for the purpose of search u/s 132: For a valid search there should be information which provides reason for believing that the person concerned is in possession of money or other assets representing, either wholly or partly

income which has not been disclosed by such person and in the absence of such information search cannot be validity authorised.

Mere intimation by CBI that money was found in the possession of a person, which according to CBI was undisclosed, without something more did not constitute “information” within the meaning of section 132, on the basis of which a search warrant could be issued, and the search conducted on the basis of such information and the block assessment made pursuant to such search was not valid - UOI v. Ajit Jain & Another [2003] 260 ITR 80(SC): 129 Taxman 74 (SC) : 181 CTR (SC) 22.

16. Whether information that documents, papers, undisclosed cash, jewellery and other assets is likely to be found, can form reason to believe so as to authorise a search u/s 132: Since the exercise of power u/s 132 is a serious invasion upon the rights, privacy and freedom of the assessee, the power must be exercised strictly in accordance with law and only for the purpose for which the law authorised it to be exercised. The Commissioner or the Director of Investigation must

have, in consequence of information, reason to believe that the statutory conditions for exercise of the power to order search exist. The condition precedent for search and seizure is “reason to believe” u/s 132 of the Act which cannot be equated with “reason to suspect”. The information that documents, papers undisclosed cash, jewellery and other assets were likely to be found at the residence of the assessee can at best be a “reason to suspect” but does not form any “reason to believe”. Therefore no valid search warrant under such circumstances can be initiated - Spacewood Furnishers (P) Ltd. & Others v. DGIT (Inv.) & Others [2012] 340 ITR 393 (Bom); Madhu Gupta v. DIT (Inv.) [2013] 350 ITR 598 (Del).

17. Whether a single Search warrant can be issued for search against a group of persons or for two or more individuals: There is no bar in authorizing search of a group of concerns by a single warrant issued u/s 132 - Jose Cyriac v. CIT [2012] 20 taxmann.com 738 (Kerala), Embassy Classic (P.) Ltd. v. ACIT [2012] 20 taxmann.com 291 (Bangalore).

18. Where search warrant is issued in

the name of a person, can other member residing in the same premises be also searched: Where warrant of authorisation indicated premises where search and seizure operation was to be conducted and said premises had not been partitioned by metes and bounds, while searching said premises, search of portions occupied by other person can also be made even though their names were not mentioned in authorisation of search- Harbhajan Singh Chadha v. DIT [2015] 58 taxmann.com 21 (Allahabad).

19. Whether multiple premises of a person can be searched on a single search warrant: Separate search warrant for separate premises is required. Since, the address of the place to be searched is required to be mentioned on the search warrant therefore no search can be conducted on the premises whose address is not mentioned in the search warrant.

# Sans motorable roads, going gets tough for Mayurbhanj villagers

BARIPADA(KCN): Even after 77 years of Independence, the villages within the Kalamgad and Ramchandrapur gram panchayats (GPs) in Kaptipada sub-division of Mayurbhanj district, bordering Mayurbhanj-Balasore districts, are deprived of motorable roads affecting their communication between Mayurbhanj and Balasore districts. They have been demanding a 5-km motorable road from Ramchandrapur to Kupari in Balasore district since long. While these villages receive government

benefits from Mayurbhanj district, they heavily rely on Kupari, Agarpada, Soro, Kaspia, Kaintaga, Patrakhunta, Kobar, and Kalakanta in both Balasore and Bhadrak districts for jobs, medical services, marketing facilities and education. However, with the onset of the rains, their mobility becomes severely hindered due to the lack of a motorable road. While a narrow morrum road connects these villages to towns in Balasore, the motorable roads extend only into Bhadrak district. However, in absence of roads, even



ambulances fail to reach the needy. Members of Sarat Bikash Manch, a social outfit, Rimil Singh Gamay, Goipai Dumbi Singh Baipai, Dularam Singh Banara, Ladura Haiburu said they have submitted numerous memorandums to Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik through collectors of both Mayurbhanj and Balasore districts, urging construction of a motorable. However, their pleas have remained unheard. Even during medical emergency, the villagers depend on Kupari and the Balasore district

headquarters hospital, both of which are within 10 to 15 km distance. But the Kaptipada sub-divisional hospital in Mayurbhanj district is situated over 25 km away from their villages, making their commute challenging. The villagers have also apprised their grievance through memoranda to minister Basanti Hembram, minister of Women and Child Development, Mission Shakti, and MoSarkar ST on August 31, urging allocation of funds for motorable road from Ramchandrapur in Mayurbhanj district to Kupari in Balasore district.

## Advise On Timely Spending

Bhubaneswar: Ace Financial Analyst, Rajib Sekhar Sahoo said that the State Government in a major boost for infrastructure spending in its Annual Budget aiming to provide a 'strong impetus' for job creation and strengthen critical infrastructure system, has thrown a challenge for the system to perform in a timely manner. Shri Sahoo was speaking to Media on huge infrastructure arrangement in Annual Budget of Odisha Government, which has allocated Rs.51000 Crore from Infrastructure Development. On the line of Union Government Budget for 2023-24, which allocated Rs.10 Lakh Crore for Infrastructure Sector, the State Government has decided to pump in more



resources to improve its roads, schools, hospitals, water supply, irrigation, connectivity and other infrastructure, a major boost has been given for infrastructure sector. However, spending funds in a time bound manner is an issue as the State Administration has to spend in 12 months

time in 2023-24. Rigorous Monitoring and Continuous Review by the Senior Officials of the Development Departments is required, said Shri Sahoo, who has been auditing the financial dealings of the Central PSUs and State PSEs for long years. While the State

Government has identified crucial infrastructure projects for implementation in both Social and Development Sector, close monitoring is needed, said Shri Sahoo. Top Financial Consultant strongly feel that the State System has to take steps to further increase the pace of expenditure for revival of the economy and employment generation. While special emphasis has been given to increase CAPEX, Infrastructure and Social Sectors spending needs to be increased to achieve the desired results enshrined in the Annual Budget.. Shri Sahoo has advised that high impact new Capital Projects may also be worked out for funding in medium term, which will have impact on economy.

# Marengo CIMS Hospital, Ahmedabad performsthe first bloodless heart transplant in Asia

# Nothing too crazy by Netherlands

**NewDelhi:**It isn't quite as "warm and humid" as Bas de Leede found it but it's certainly not pleasant. Definitely not for Bangladesh in the middle at 80/6. The conditions are difficult for batting, with some deliveries turning sharply and some not so much. Some deliveries taking off and some not so much. There's this delivery that Aryan Dutt bowls in the middle of all this. A delivery that curves away from the batter, entices him into extending hands into a drive, and then spins in sharply. The best Mahmudullah could do was skew the drive off the inside edge to mid-wicket. There was nothing mysterious about the delivery; that's what offbreaks do but it was the drift on this 87 kph delivery that did the batter in. There was no wind blowing across the Eden Gardens to help Dutt -- the many flags, sweat-clad faces and the weather vane on top of the old scoreboard bear

witness -- so it was mostly the revs on the ball that did the magic. Fifteen minutes later, Logan van Beek is bowling to Mahmudullah from the other end. He's allowed four men outside the ring and he's placed all of them behind square: at third man, deep point, fine leg and deep square leg. As you can tell, it's a slow pitch and the ball is holding up. There's no dew. Again, there's this delivery that van Beek bowls in the middle of all this. A delivery dug halfway into the pitch at 136 kph, which keeps gaining height and zooms past Mahmudullah's ear. Luckily, the batter makes the right decision to pull out of the hook shot at the last minute. The two deliveries tell a story. The conditions might be favourable but it takes a lot more than that to challenge good batters - skills, planning and execution, all of which the Netherlands had in plenty on the



night. These weren't alien conditions for Mahmudullah, as testing as they may be. He's played 60 Test matches, 32 of which are in the subcontinent. And he was facing Dutt, a 20-year-old from a country that doesn't play enough cricket, let alone First-

Class cricket. To then come a cropper, especially when in form and with a hundred behind him, must then be against some really good bowling. Dutt was a delight to watch, putting enough work into the ball, playing with his pace, cutting different angles

at the crease, and on occasions even getting past the outside edge of the right-hander. On a pitch taking turn, that takes special effort. In fact, 14 of the 26 runs he conceded came in one over; that's how consistent he was, with the new ball and the old. For pacers, it was about

bowling odd short balls. Just like van Beek. The other seamers in the side, Paul van Meekeren and Bas de Leede, also played with the hard lengths and used the grass in the middle areas of the pitch to extract extra zip and bounce. To that effect, Tanzid Hasan, Shakib Al Hasan and

Taskin Ahmed fell to short deliveries whereas Mushfiquir fell after being softened by a short delivery on the previous ball. But it wasn't a wholesale plan, where they came in, bowled two bouncers per over to whoever was batting and hoped for the best. To Najmul Hossain Shanto, the plan was different. "Shanto is great on the short ball, so we try and keep it away from him but to other [Bangladesh] players yeah, we did try and use it to take wickets with it," de Leede said after the game. And then there was the fielding from the Netherlands. The dives and slides inside the 30-yard circle to stop the runs and defend a small total. From Shariz Ahmad at cover and midwicket to Sybrand Engelbrecht at backward point. There were more players putting in the dive but making a list here is not the point. That the ground fielding also made a difference, is.

Of course not everyone stayed back to watch those dives and slides from the Netherlands. More than half of the Bangladesh supporters had left by 9 pm. But de Leede hoped someone more important was watching. "We want to try and get the ICC's attention, [so that they] start looking at us as a potentially bigger nation in the coming years. Definitely every win helps," de Leede said. "Every win we get is going to be big for us and for cricket in the Netherlands. We want to inspire young kids to take up the game." There's nothing big planned in the dressing room. Sing the team song, maybe down a couple of beers and watch the Rugby World Cup. That's how the Netherlands are going to celebrate their win over Bangladesh according to Bas de Leede. "Nothing too crazy," de Leede emphasizes. Just like the nature of their win over Bangladesh.

## 'We are a better team than our performance' - Shakib

**NewDelhi:**Bangladesh skipper Shakib Al Hasan said on Saturday that their performances in the ongoing ICC World Cup can be termed as their worst in the recent past. Bangladesh earned their fifth successive loss in the tournament as Netherlands embarrassed them by 87 runs to pretty much end their hopes of going beyond the group stage. Leading up to the World Cup, Bangladesh were eyeing something special in the tournament but after winning their opening game against Afghanistan, they

haven't won any. Bangladesh won three games in every World Cup since 2007 but that streak could end now as they are lined up to face Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Australia in their last three games. "You can say that (it is Bangladesh's worst World Cup performance) without any doubt," Shakib told reporters after their disappointing loss to Netherlands at the Eden Gardens on Saturday. "I don't have an answer to "why" we played this way," he said. "I don't want to blame anyone. We are a better



team than our performance. We were disappointing in this tournament, something that the whole dressing room would agree," he said adding that he is still searching what went wrong for them. "It is a hard question to answer (where we have

gone wrong). You have asked the wrong person. From my point of view, we need to change a lot of things. But it is not the time to talk about these things. It is disappointing that we haven't played in the semifinals in 24 years. The way our people focus about cricket, we should have done better. "I don't know what's going on. As a batting unit, if you ask me to summarize our six matches with the bat. We were very poor other than Mahmudullah and Mushfiquir Rahim. All other batters were not up

to the mark. I thought we were well short of confidence in both departments. We couldn't meet up with our high expectations. I thought we bowled really well after losing the toss. We were sloppy in the field. We could have restricted them to 170-180 but we should have chased 230 total," he added. Bangladesh's decision to demote Mahmudullah at number seven against Netherlands despite him scoring a century in the last game against South Africa raised quite a few eyebrows.

## BCCI's Strict Policy To Fight Age And Domicile Fraud In Domestic Cricket In Wake Of Ban On Vanshaj Sharma

**NewDelhi:**The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has slapped a Jammu and Kashmir cricketer named Vanshaj Sharma with a two-year-ban after he was caught with multiple birth certificates with different dates. The Jammu-born cricketer had reportedly shifted base to Bihar to play U-23 tournament and applied with a fake birth certificate. As a result, the cricketer now faces a two-year ban. He can return to play in senior men's cricket matches but won't be ever allowed to play age-group cricket in India, said the

Jammu and Kashmir Cricket Association. In the year 2020 when Sourav Ganguly came in as president of the BCCI and Jay Shah as secretary, the board introduced a set of rules and regulations pertaining to age verification and player conduct in various age group tournaments. These rules are designed to maintain the integrity of age-based competition and ensure fair play. Voluntary Disclosure Scheme (VDS): Players who previously manipulated their date of birth using fake

documents can avoid suspension by voluntarily revealing their actual date of birth before a set date. Failure to disclose may result in a 2-year ban from age group tournaments. Fake/Tampered Birth Certificates: Starting from the 2020-21 season, any player found submitting fake or tampered birth certificates will face a 2-year suspension from all BCCI and State Unit cricket matches. After the suspension, participation in age group tournaments is prohibited.

# Head makes a mark on return in Dharamsala photo-finish

**NewDelhi:**Travis Head's stunning comeback hundred trumped Rachin Ravindra's second century of the 2023 World Cup as New Zealand went down to their Trans-Tasman rivals by five runs in a nail-biting thriller in Dharamsala. Returning from a hand injury, Head (109) combined with David Warner (81) for a punishing 175-run opening stand and lower-order cameos further propelled Australia to an imposing 388 despite New Zealand's brief middle-overs recovery courtesy Glenn Phillips' career-best 3-37. In pursuit of a record total, Ravindra's well-paced 77-ball ton - New Zealand's quickest in World Cups - and a James Neesham blitzkrieg kept them in the hunt until the penultimate ball, only for it to end

in a heartbreak. New Zealand's chase was off to a promising start with Devon Conway leading the way. He went after a wayward Mitchell Starc, as well as the pace of Josh Hazlewood and Pat Cummins to lay the base with a flurry of boundaries while Will Young took his time to get up to speed. However, a screamer from diving Starc at short fine leg ended Conway's cameo on 28 off 17. The Hazlewood-Starc combo was at it again when Young nicked an outside edge to short third man, leaving New Zealand at 73/2 after the Powerplay. Australia managed to cut back the runs a tad with the part-time spin of Glenn Maxwell despite Daryl Mitchell's attacking intent. He kept the scoreboard ticking and found the odd



boundary even as Ravindra didn't start off at his very best. Using his feet to good effect, Mitchell unsettled Adam Zampa early with a four and six and even welcomed Starc back into the attack with back-to-back boundaries to curb the shooting asking rate. However, after a 42-ball fifty, just as he seemed set to accelerate, Mitchell miscued one to long-

on giving the spinner his first wicket and Starc his third catch. Ravindra stepped up then, bringing up a fourth fifty of the tourney with a six to welcome Starc back into the attack and later meted out similar treatment to Mitch Marsh. Amidst the tall ask, the southpaw responded by taking only 28 more deliveries to convert it into his second World

Cup hundred - reaching the milestone with a slog-sweep into deep midwicket stands again. Even as Ravindra kept the fight going at one end, Australia had managed to break every significant partnership he built at crucial junctures to rob them of a flow. First it was Tom Latham, who top-edged an attempted reverse

sweep off Zampa in order to up the ante and later Phillips chipped a regulation catch to mid-off to give Maxwell his only scalp. And just as the youngster's counterattack seemed to have whittled down the equation to 97 required off the final 10 overs, Cummins returned to lend a crucial blow to New Zealand's hopes. Ravindra was done in by a slower delivery from the Australia captain that he tried to loft but instead picked out long-off, walking back for a gutsy 116. Having lost a set batter, Neesham (58 off 39) took centerstage then. He took the attack to the Australian pacers at the death with a few lusty blows, keeping them on their toes and bringing the equation down to a manageable 19 off the final over. More drama ensued when Starc conceded five wides off the second ball to help

opposition's case. But some excellent boundary-line fielding from Australia saved a couple of definite boundaries. Desperate to regain strike, Neesham's dash for a non-existent second run off the penultimate ball ultimately brought curtains down on New Zealand's fight. Put in to bat, Head debuted at the World Cup with a spectacular century to lay the groundwork for Australia's crucial win. The assault on New Zealand's wayward bowling with the new ball was from both ends in fact, with the openers posting a 175-run stand in just 19 overs. Head made his intentions clear from the get go - with a four over Trent Boult's head - and never took his foot off the pedal. He tore into Matt Henry in his second over, with sixes off consecutive balls to put New Zealand under

pressure right away. Returning from a fractured left hand, Head got to his fifty in just 25 deliveries - joint fastest this World Cup. He got a life on 70 and 75, and went on to bring up his maiden World Cup hundred in just 59 balls - the third quickest of this edition. Coming into the game on the back of consecutive centuries, Warner too notched up a brisk 28-ball fifty en route his 81, the highlight of which was a fiery 154kmph thunderbolt from Lockie Ferguson that he effortlessly muscled into the stands. So relentless was the carnage that New Zealand had failed to squeeze in a boundary-less over until the 14th, bowled by Phillips. Spin in tandem in the middle overs brought some relief for New Zealand, dragging down their scoring rate to single digits.
