

# Vice President of Dominican Republic Calls on The President

**NewDelhi,(KCN):**The Vice President of Dominican Republic, H.E. Ms Raquel Peña Rodríguez called on the President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan today (October 3, 2023). Welcoming the Vice President on her first visit to India, the President said that the timing of this visit is very apt as India and Dominican Republic are marking the 25th anniversary of their diplomatic relations. She noted that bilateral relations between the two countries are warm and friendly, anchored on the strong foundation



of shared values of democracy, and a broad convergence of views on global issues. The President noted that the Dominican Republic is India's 8th largest

trading partner in Latin America. She was confident that there is potential to further diversify the trade basket. She said there is scope for working

together and exchanging our experience and expertise in the areas such as pharmaceutical products, marine science, meteorology, disaster resilient

infrastructure and digital payments technologies. The President said that capacity building is one of the central pillars of India - Dominican Republic cooperation. She was happy to note that recently, India has organized two Special ITEC training courses for Dominican Republic officials, in the critical fields of cyber security and remote sensing. The two leaders agreed that continued exchanges and contacts between India and Dominican Republic would further strengthen our bilateral ties.

# BJP To Contest On Own Strength

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Senior BJP leader and Union Minister Anurag Thakur today said that Bharatiya Janata Party will contest elections on its own strength. "BJP will contest the election on the strength of its workers. BJP has the most popular leader Narendra Modi to fight the election and will come out with flying colours", said he. Shri Thakur strongly denounced the remark made by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik dubbing the BJP as anti-people and anti-development. Addressing a press conference here, Shri Thakur said, "If we were anti people and anti-development, the people would not have voted us to power both in 2014 and 2019 elections with a comfortable margin." "It does not matter what the Chief Minister has said.....we believe in the strength of the people who will decide who is anti-people and anti-development", he said. "Sabka Saath Sabka Bikash" of Prime Minister Narendra Modi cannot be an anti-people or anti-development, he



further said. The Union Minister further said that the Modi Government never discriminated against Odisha in the development of the State. "Infact Odisha had received huge funds during the NDA regime under various welfare measures and central schemes in comparison to what was released by the previous UPA Government," he claimed. Shri Thakur said Odisha had received only Rs 2,63,243 crore during the UPA Government while the NDA Government had released Rs

18,83,654 crore to the State during the last nine years. During the G20 more than 200 meetings were held in 60 cities in different States and union territories showcasing the art and tradition of the country which will boost the tourism sector. Odisha will also be benefitted from the economic corridor connecting Europe through Arab countries, Thakur asserted. The Union Minister told the Media that India is doing well in every sector under the Modi Government. During the G20 meeting the Konark

wheel on the backdrop of PM Narendra Modi became a point of discussion around the Globe. He also claimed the tax collection in Odisha increased following the enactment of GST by the Modi Government. The Information and Broadcasting Minister has urged the State Government to ensure speedy and better implementation of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JMM) scheme that can bring significant changes in the lives of women folk. "I would like to request the State Government speedy and proper implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission scheme," Shri Thakur said in the presser. Shri Thakur emphasised that by passing the Nari Shakti Vandan bill Modi Government has delivered 33 percent reservation to the women in parliament and state assemblies ensuring the empowerment of women leadership in the country. Referring to the allegations of corruption and irregularities in the implementation of various central schemes in the

State, Shri Thakur said, "We will examine these and issue notice to the state if found any irregularities as is being done in case of West Bengal." He, however, asked the Odisha Government to ensure that all the central schemes are implemented properly so that the poor people will be benefited out of these schemes and programmes. When asked whether the BJP will contest the election on its own in Odisha or will have any alliance with others the Union Minister said, "BJP will contest the election on the strength of its workers. BJP has the most popular leader Narendra Modi to fight the election and will come out with flying colours." Reacting to Shri Thakur's statement on alleged irregularities in execution of Central schemes in Odisha, senior BJD MLA Debi Prasad Mishra said, "If the Union Minister has any proof, let him show it and take action against those responsible for it. He might be making such baseless allegations in view of the election."

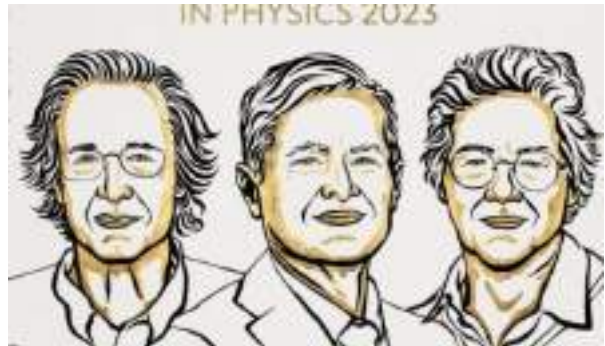

# 2023 Nobel Prize In Physics To Pierre Agostini, Ferenc Krausz And Anne L'Huillier For Study Of Electron Dynamics

**Stockholm(KCN):** The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences on Tuesday awarded the 2023 Physics Nobel Prize to Pierre Agostini, Ferenc Krausz and Anne L'Huillier "for experimental methods that generate attosecond pulses of light for the study of electron dynamics in matter." The prizes carry a cash award of 11 million Swedish kronor (\$1 million) drawn from a bequest left by the prize's creator, Swedish inventor Alfred Nobel, who died in 1896. The prize money was raised by 1 million kronor this year because of the plunging value of the Swedish currency. The laureates are invited



to receive their awards at ceremonies on Dec. 10, the anniversary of Nobel's death. The prestigious peace prize is handed out in Oslo, according to his wishes, while the other award ceremony is held in Stockholm. Physics is the second Nobel to be awarded this week after Hungarian scientist Katalin Kariko and U.S. colleague Drew Weissman won

the medicine prize for making mRNA molecule discoveries that paved the way for COVID-19 vaccines. Created in the will of dynamite inventor and businessman Alfred Nobel, the prizes for achievements in science, literature and peace have been awarded since 1901 with a few interruptions, becoming the arguably highest honour for scientists eve

# Kendrapara's Famous 'Rasabali' Gets GI Tag

**Kendrapara(KCN):** The famous sweet dish 'Rasabali' of Kendrapara district has been accorded GI (Geographical Indication) on Tuesday (Oct 3). The 'Rasabali Nirmata Sangha' in Kendrapara was the first to

demand GI tag for the delicacy in 2021. Later, a delegation from Odisha, led by Rajya Sabha MP Subhash Singh along with Munna Khan and Mamata Mohanta met Union Minister Piyush Goyal and submitted a

memorandum demanding GI tag for 'Rasabali'. The memorandum had mentioned the history and present status of the dessert and claimed that according GI tag to it will boost the economic growth in Kendrapara district.

# Cancer Hospital Foundation Laid

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today laid the foundation for Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital and Research Centre at NISER Campus in Jatni. The State-of-the-Art facility and research centre will be a global standard Cancer Care, Research and Innovation centre. It will be a 200-bedded cancer hospital and will be fully commissioned by December 2025. Tata Steel Foundation will build the hospital at a cost of Rs 250 crore and donate it to Tata Memorial Centre, Department of Atomic Energy for running the hospital.

The Department of Atomic Energy has sanctioned Rs. 400 crore to purchase equipment, construct the Dharmashala, residential complex, and hire human resources. The hospital will be fully commissioned by December 2025 and will have the facility to house the latest cancer treatment technology, including radiation therapy, advanced surgery, chemotherapy, targeted therapies, and stem cell transplant ensuring best possible care to the patients. It will be a hub for cancer research, fostering innovation and breakthroughs in cancer

treatment and prevention, Shri Patnaik said. The Chief Minister said this facility will be a great boost for people of Odisha in treatment of cancer. People will not have to go to Mumbai or other big cities for treatment, he added. The Chief Minister expressed confidence that it will save people from financial and mental distress to a great extent. Apart from Odisha, cancer patients of the neighboring states like Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal and Chhattisgarh will also be benefited, he stated. Thanking the department of Atomic Energy

support for establishment of this facility, Patnaik said the State Government will provide wide access

road, direct transport support through Mo Bus facility along with top class bus stops and a dedicated Fire Station in

close proximity to the Cancer Hospital. The hospital will also be empanelled under Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY) for providing free healthcare to patients of Odisha. An Aahar kendra will also be set up in the premises of the Cancer Hospital. The State Government has provided over 65 acres of land and financial assistance of Rs 150 crore for establishment of a Medical Cyclotron facility which will be the most advanced Research Level Cyclotron in Asia, Shri Patnaik said. Stating that healthcare

is a top priority of his government, the CM said Odisha is witnessing a massive transformation in the health care sector. The Government had signed an MoU with Tata Memorial Center Mumbai in September 2022 for establishment of a 200 bedded state-of-the-art Cancer Hospital by TMC, Mumbai in the campus of NISER at Jatni. Among others, Health & Family Welfare Minister Niranjan Pujari, Jatni MLA Suresh Kumar Routray, Secretary Department of Atomic Energy Ajit Mohanty and Director of Tata Steel Foundation also spoke on the occasion.

## Mission Raniganj: All You Need To Know About 1989's Frightening Incident At West Bengal's Coal Mine

Akshay Kumar's 'Mission Raniganj', is based on the life of Jaswant Singh Gill, who played a significant role in rescuing miners trapped inside a flooded coal mine in November 1989. In 1989, a frightening incident unfolded in Raniganj, West Bengal. Over 200 coal miners faced a terrifying situation deep within the earth.

Dating back to 1774, the Raniganj Coal Mine holds a significant place in India's history as it was the nation's first coal mine. Late one night, as 220 dedicated coal miners were at work, the



mine was hit with a disaster. A blast in the coal wall shattered the underground water table, leaving the miners trapped.

Engineer Jaswant Singh Gill, Chief Mining Engineer of Coal India Limited, took it upon himself to enter the mine voluntarily. His courage and determination were the driving force behind the mission's success. He

stayed in the mine until the very last worker was safely brought out.

Jaswant Singh Gill's selfless act did not go unnoticed. He was honoured with the Sarvottam Jeevan Raksha Padak and Bhagat Puran Award for his exceptional service to humanity. The Raniganj coal mine incident serves as a testament to human resilience and the unbeatable spirit in the face of adversity. It reminds us of the heroes who appear in the darkest of times, like Engineer Jaswant Singh Gill, whose courage saved many lives.

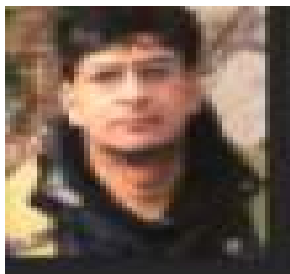

Recent Developments in Environmental Philosophy Reflects Paradigm Shift In Our Understanding of the Environment



Environmental philosophy is a branch of philosophy that explores the ethical, metaphysical, and epistemological aspects of our relationship with the natural world. It addresses questions about the value of nature, our moral obligations towards the environment, and the foundations of environmental ethics. Environmental philosophy is important for several reasons: Ethical Guidance: It helps us develop a moral framework for our actions towards the environment. By exploring concepts like intrinsic value in nature and our ethical responsibilities, it guides us in making decisions that respect and protect

the environment. Environmental Policy: Environmental philosophy can inform the development of environmental policies and regulations. It provides a theoretical foundation for decisions on resource management, conservation, and sustainability. Critical Thinking: It encourages critical thinking about our relationship with nature and challenges anthropocentric views that prioritize human interests above all else. This critical perspective can lead to more thoughtful and responsible environmental practices. Interdisciplinary Approach: Environmental philosophy bridges the gap between philosophy and science, fostering collaboration and dialogue between experts in different fields. This interdisciplinary approach is crucial for addressing complex environmental issues. Long-Term Perspective: It encourages us to consider the long-term consequences of our actions on the environment, helping us make decisions that prioritize the well-being of future generations. Cultural and Social

Values: Environmental philosophy explores how cultural and social values influence our perception of nature. This can lead to a deeper understanding of the cultural factors that



contribute to environmental problems. Personal Reflection: It invites individuals to reflect on their own values, beliefs, and attitudes towards the environment, fostering a sense of environmental stewardship and responsibility. In its true essence, environmental philosophy provides the intellectual tools and ethical foundations necessary for addressing environmental challenges and shaping a more sustainable and harmonious relationship between humanity and the natural world. As members of this society

we need to remember that concisely. The impact of our nature and environment is absolutely calming and serene. We always need to marvel at the unique complexity and diversity difference between molecular minorities of educated urban masses and huge majority of rural people suffering in agony. This is mainly due to deliberate governmental policies for political gains so as to exploit the ordinary citizens with the the help of corrupt bureaucrats and industrialists and business personnel for short financial gains. Environmental philosophy, while valuable, does have limitations in its action and discourse. Environmental philosophy often deals with abstract concepts and ethical theories, which can be disconnected from practical solutions to environmental problems. This abstract nature can limit its direct impact on addressing real-world issues. There is no single,

universally accepted environmental philosophy. Different philosophers and schools of thought hold varying views on our ethical responsibilities to the environment. This lack of consensus can hinder effective decision-making and action. While it can inform environmental policy, environmental philosophy alone may not directly influence government decisions or corporate practices. Policymakers often prioritize economic and political considerations over philosophical arguments. Environmental philosophy can be influenced by cultural and regional perspectives, which may not apply universally. What is considered ethically sound in one cultural context may not be in another, making it challenging to develop a global environmental ethics. Environmental philosophy is primarily an academic discipline, and its discourse often occurs within academic circles. This can limit its reach and practical impact beyond the academic community. Some philosophical ideals, such as deep ecology's call for a radical shift in human values and lifestyles, may be seen as

impractical or utopian by some, making it challenging to implement in the real world. While interdisciplinary collaboration is crucial, environmental philosophy can sometimes become disconnected from empirical environmental science, which is essential for understanding and addressing complex ecological issues. Philosophical discussions can sometimes lead to a sense of powerlessness or paralysis in the face of environmental challenges. People may feel that addressing these issues requires systemic change beyond their control. Despite these limitations, environmental philosophy remains a valuable field for generating ethical insights, fostering critical thinking, and providing a foundation for broader environmental discussions and actions. Its impact is often indirect but plays a role in shaping attitudes and influencing decision-makers over the long term.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT- WHAT IS BEYOND LEGISLATION?

As he prepares for his third resounding comeback, the prime minister's pleasant surprise for the women in India in its maiden legislation in the new parliament building would undoubtedly open avenues for them from across the country. This is going to give his brand value a push and its impact is bound to reflect in 2024 as well. The opposition's outcry on the timing of the proclamation is a debatable subject. But the impact of the move made by the government was so profound that the bill was passed with a booming support from all parties. And the voice of disagreement was too low to be heard. A longstanding demand by half of the country's population has been shelved for mere political reasons and it was evocative of the hammering impact of the highhandedness of a particular gender and its dominance in lawmaking. Criticisms apart, the bill and its alluring connotations would further sharpen the prospects of women in a democracy. But don't forget, the wounds of Manipur and Bengal and other parts of the country are yet to heal. Though the bill is passed,

would the condition of the ordinary women in India change? Will it make their life safer and less vulnerable to bigotry? Suspicion to that effect keeps mounting and the governments need to have answers. The Modi Government's Nari Shakti Vandan Abhiyan is purely a logical attempt to refurbish the feminine energy for the welfare of the country. This has also been in a way connecting to what we can call India's civilizational understanding. As an ancient civilization this land had indicated on various occasions through the marvels of its scriptures that women have never been a folk that its societies have kept under suppression. With its varying color of societal depiction of diversity, the socio-spiritual progress of this landscape was considered incomplete without the women being taken on board. Amid a cascade of criticism on the timing of the bill's introduction, the country celebrated its smooth passage in both the houses of the parliament. With its absolute majority the Modi government could give the bill an easy and unhurt mobility and the element of compulsion with which its opposition had to act was probably speculated and preconceived. Almost certainly, with this firm conviction the government decided to convene the special session of the parliament.

As the national elections are eight months away, no party, with the least commonsense would dare to topple such a bill of unquestionable importance and the Modi government once again exhibited its ability to take tough strides. Independent India has witnessed multiple attempts being made to provide reservation to women in the parliament. Starting with the Deve Gowda regime in 1996, attempts to introduce the bill were made by almost every government. In 1998 when A.B.Vajpayee occupied the high office, the National Democratic Alliance under his leadership attempted a smooth sailing for the bill. On failing in the first attempt the Vajpayee government reintroduced the bill in 1999, 2002 and 2003 as well, but the bill failed the majority test always. During the Manmohan Singh regime the bill was tabled in the Rajya Sabha on March 9, 2010 and was passed but the government did not take it up in the Lok Sabha. Modi and his party entered the electoral fray with its 33 per cent quota promise for women in 2014 and repeated the same in their manifesto in 2019 as well. But the government shelved it until now, probably aiming for a momentous electoral harvest. By increasing the number of women in parliament, the meaning of India being the largest democracy will deepen. This would further intensify aspects

supporting gender equality and meaningfully chisel out prospects for gender receptivity. It was almost a century ago in 1920, America; the oldest democracy granted its women the right to vote. But for non-white women it was again barricaded with barriers keeping them away from the democratic processes. Black men and women were finally granted the right to vote in 1965 but the discrimination in the name of color still continues. India from the very first day of its democratic electoral process took the women of the country along. The course of its modern political history tells us stories of women holding respectable positions in the government and the judiciary and the country's defense sectors. At present, in almost every sector women power is a principal component. And for Narendra Modi, entrusting more women with key portfolios in his government was an unprecedented decision. This has also exemplified the fact that the women in the country hold equal abilities and courage that of the men and what they were devoid of were opportunities. Ancient India, from the days of Vedas held opportunities galore for women. We need to understand that a period did truly exist in India's civilizational chronology wherein neither child marriage nor sati system prevailed. And the Vedic

period for that is known as the golden period of gender equality witnessed women scholars teaching and propagating the Vedic wisdom. Vedic prophetesses of those days mediated philosophical dialogues and controlled schools that carried Vedic studies. Women in the Vedic era enjoyed equal liberty and freedom as that of the men and the prominent Hindu concept of "Shakti" was a depiction of pure feminine energy which they believed without which social upbringing was impossible. India has its unique spiritual identity that recognizes the feminine power in the form of goddess. When male-centric religions across the globe believed in one muscular God, India, starting from the Vedic period or beyond held this golden view of respecting the Nari Shakti in its absolute spiritual disposition. Its temples and religious rituals were equally embedded with the power of both the masculine and feminine. The reason why Sita is equally respectable like Rama in Indian society is our understanding-recognition of the power of the feminine energy. Undoubtedly, this is the case with other spiritual characters and deities too. This was never the case with other religions. Even today there is an unbelievable lopsidedness maintained between men and women in religions that are mainly male-centric. The social unrest in Iran and the oppression of women

in Afghanistan turning their life a hazardous prerogative, give us real instances of horror and medieval barbarity even today with gender discrimination being activated to satiate the instinct of male domination. To make a reference from the most prominent Catholic theology, the turbulence and dissatisfaction among its women members is the result of a patriarchal system which is based on the conviction that the man is predestined to command and the woman to obey him. The Roman Catholic Church male-dominated for centuries, has recently declared reforms enabling religious sisters with voting rights at the synod, which is a papal advisory body. The Pope's decision to give the women of the church access to its high-flying administrative bodies should be seen as a cleansing process that would at least at a minimal level eradicate certain anomalies. In India, the Modi government would be undoubtedly known as a government of real change. This should aptly work for the government, a description that would go for decades to remind the polity about its unprecedented determination for decision making.

Surgeons of the University of Maryland School of Medicine , United States have carried out the world's second transplant of a genetically modified pig's heart to a human being. The surgery was carried out on Lawrence Faucette, a 58-year-old patient who had terminal heart disease. In 2022, the Maryland team had performed the world's first transplant of a genetically modified pig's heart into another dying man, David Bennett who died just two months after the procedure. The pig heart transplanted in the second operation has 10 genetic modifications, knocking out some pig genes and adding some human ones to make it more acceptable to the human immune system. Both the operations termed as a giant leap in the medical world and a boon in the life of humans is truly a 'marvellous medical feat' . Firstly, this Xeno transplantation could in the near future help solve the chronic shortage of organ donations. These experiments though just the beginning could be the turning point, a milestone in medical history to save the lives of patients and a big solution to organ shortage because of which thousands of patients lose their precious lives. Further scientific researches regarding longevity and safety of the porcine heart and kidney have to be made and once this clinical xeno transplantation becomes fully successful it can put an end to non-availability of organs and will be a blessing to patients in the long list waiting to receive organs.

## India's Growth to Remain Resilient Despite Global Challenges

**NEW DELHI, (KCN):**India continues to show resilience against the backdrop of a challenging global environment, according to World Bank's latest India Development Update (IDU). The IDU, the Bank's flagship half yearly report on the Indian economy, observes that despite significant global challenges, India was one of the fastest-growing major economies in FY22/23 at 7.2%. India's growth rate was the second highest among G20 countries and almost twice the average for emerging market economies. This resilience was underpinned by robust domestic demand, strong public infrastructure investment and a strengthening financial sector. Bank credit growth increased to

15.8% in the first quarter of FY23/24 compared with 13.3% in the first quarter of FY22/23. The IDU expects that global headwinds will continue to persist and intensify due to high global interest rates, geopolitical tensions, and sluggish global demand. As a result, global economic growth is also set to slow down over the medium term against a background of these combined factors. In this context, the World Bank forecasts India's GDP growth for FY23/24 to be at 6.3%. The expected moderation is mainly due to challenging external conditions and waning pent-up demand. However, service sector activity is expected to remain strong with growth of 7.4% and investment growth is also projected to remain

robust at 8.9%. "An adverse global environment will continue to pose challenges in the short-term," said Auguste Tano Kouame, World Bank's Country Director in India. "Tapping public spending that crowds in more private investments will create more favorable conditions for India to seize global opportunities in the future and thus achieve higher growth." Adverse weather conditions contributed to a spike in inflation in recent months. Headline inflation rose to 7.8% in July due to a surge in prices of food items like wheat and rice. Inflation is expected to decrease gradually as food prices normalize and government measures increase the supply of key commodities. "While the spike in

headline inflation may temporarily constrain consumption, we project a moderation. Overall conditions will remain conducive for private investment," said Dhruv Sharma, Senior Economist, World Bank, and lead author of the report. "The volume of foreign direct investment is also likely to grow in India as rebalancing of the global value chain continues." The World Bank expects fiscal consolidation to continue in FY23/24 with the central government fiscal deficit projected to continue to decline from 6.4% to 5.9% of GDP. Public debt is expected to stabilize at 83% of GDP. On the external front, the current account deficit is expected to narrow to 1.4% of GDP, and it will be adequately financed by foreign investment flows and supported by large foreign reserves.

Premadasa Stadium in Colombo, marking a fiery end to a sodden Asia Cup. In his inimitable droll, the winning Indian captain stopped his answer to quip, 'Arre, World Cup jeetne ke baad phodo yaar ye sab' (Save the fireworks for when we win the World Cup). The appetite for major silverware whetted, Rohit and head coach Rahul Dravid turn to the World Cup, each coveting the one missing item from their otherwise impressive CVs. In their two-year run, both have endeavoured to get the team playing a more dynamic brand of white-ball cricket. They will know, however, that nothing other than being anointed World Champions would

constitute a successful campaign. For India have been the nearly-men at ICC events for a decade now, a truly ludicrous stretch for a team of their talent and resources. The optimism would seem justifiable this time. Notwithstanding the associated pressure, it is a home event and the hosts have won each of the last three men's ODI World Cups. Then there's the case of their pieces seemingly falling into place while other contenders are losing theirs. Most notable has been the rust-free comebacks of Jasprit Bumrah, KL Rahul and Shreyas Iyer, who in the last year, have offered up enough material for a weighty book; much of whose contents would resemble a soap opera, but recent chapters bring hope of a happy resolution. India have form and flair with the bat, and variety and options with the ball.

Where can they be caught out, then? In two very distinct types of games. In helpful bowling conditions where their right-heavy top-order matches up poorly against left-armers. Or, on a featherbed when they can't quite shed their conservatism with the bat at a crucial phase of the match. Rohit and Dravid have encountered both such games in the build-up and have spent a good part of their tenure preparing for those contingencies so as to not let '45 minutes of cricket' end up defining their journey. Squad: Rohit Sharma (c), Hardik Pandya (vc), Shubman Gill, Virat Kohli, Shreyas Iyer, KL Rahul (wk), Ishan Kishan (wk), Suryakumar Yadav, Ravindra Jadeja, Ravichandran Ashwin, Kuldeep Yadav, Shardul Thakur, Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Shami,

In Rohit, Gill and Kohli, India once again possess a dominating top-three, who now also offer the promise of a faster

tempo. This time they'll also have one of their more reassuring middle-order batters to follow those three. They can call upon Ishan Kishan for a left-handed tactical option or Suryakumar Yadav for additional oomph and x-factor. With the ball, they'll have six options including a key point of difference in the rejuvenated Kuldeep Yadav's left-arm wrist

spin. Rohit wants his side to bat more positively but doesn't necessarily have the batting depth to completely unshackle his dreamy top-order. That also means he will think twice about fielding all three of Bumrah, Siraj and Shami together and risk a very long tail. Shardul will thus remain the first-choice No.8 and will swap out for Ashwin

on pitches aiding spin or against opponents with a considerable number of lefties in the line-up. Keep an eye on: Jasprit Bumrah. It could be argued that India played last year's T20 World Cup with an arm-tied behind their back with their bowling talisman out and still made semifinals. It's only been five ODI innings of bowling -- and only two in which he's sent down 10 overs -- but Bumrah has returned as the arrowhead of the team's attack without any noticeable loss of zing. With the new ball, he has a pronounced outswinger to the right-hander to go with his induckers. He will bowl a couple of overs through the middle phase in case India seek some control and return once more to close out opposition innings at the death with his assortment of tricks. Marquee match: That

one on October 14. 90,293 people turned up at the MCG last year when India played Pakistan at the T20 World Cup. The Narendra Modi stadium claims to have room for at least 20,000 more. If booking sites are to be believed, each one of those seats and most of the hotel rooms in Ahmedabad have already been reserved. One way or the other, a spectacle is guaranteed. Potential Banana Peel: Since the events of Port of Spain, 2007, India - Bangladesh fixtures in World Cups have had an edge to them. It wouldn't be imprudent to expect more of it in Pune this time around where Bangladesh will arrive with a 3-1 record in their last four ODIs against India. With a little assistance from the pitch, their spinners could poke at a few insecurities in an otherwise indomitable looking top-order.

Kenjige joined Sheikh in the 11th over in what seemed like a dead end, a complete lost cause. Refusing to capitulate just yet, the pair counter-attacked. Sheikh made his intentions clear with a lofted drive off Abdullah Gazi before bludgeoning two sixes off Sunny Patel in the following over. On a wicket that had his more illustrious teammates at sea, Sheikh batted like a breath of fresh air, totally in command of the

situation and his shot selection. Sheikh showed the spunk. "Obviously there was a lot of pressure in this big game, but I just backed my natural game and went out there with a clear mind. I just backed myself to play my shots and backed myself that if I play till the 18th-20th over, the team will get to a respectable total," said Sheikh. Sheikh's flair and Kenjige's street smarts propelled the Mustangs to 121 at the end of their 20 overs as the duo shared a 56-run stand. While the Sheikh and Kenjige's rearguard action had brought some element of respectability to their ask, it was the Cavaliers' game to lose with the batting firepower they possessed in the form of Kennar Lewis, Gajanand Singh and Shawn Findlay. Keeping true to his reputation, Lewis went hell for leather with a brisk 27 off 18 deliveries. Former Pakistan international Rumman Raees pinned Lewis in front in the final over of the power play with the Cavaliers in the driver's seat at 44 for 1 after 5.2 overs.

Mustangs introduced Kenjige and Hammad Azam after the power play. In the most remarkable turn of events, Kenjige and Azam had the Cavaliers on the mat as the Cavaliers made to run the gauntlet for every possible run out there. The pair applied the perfect squeeze to choke the life out of the Cavaliers batsmen, as they mustered 6 runs off the next 6 overs losing 4 wickets in the process. Kenjige and Azam returned figures of 3 for 9 and 2 for 3 respectively off their 4 overs, shooting down the Cavaliers for 77. Apart from his batting and bowling, the live-wire Kenjige made a real impact on the field with a stunning direct hit to catch the inform Gajanand Singh short of his ground without facing a ball, reminiscent of his run out effort in the MLC against the Washington Freedom that turned the tide towards MI New York at a crucial juncture. "I think it was a massive opportunity in our hometown Dallas. I think when we found out

that the finals and the playoffs would happen in Dallas, we were all pumped up to get the trophy back home. We always had a good team and it was just about all of us staying together and playing as a team. And then when we did well in the playoffs we knew we're going to play the finals in front of the home crowd. And you can ask for a better setting. The crowds were in. It was a beautiful weekend. Beautiful outfields I think you all pumped and then we were just happy to win the trophy in front of our home fans" said Kenjige. The 2023 American cricket summer has seen a windfall rise in Kenjige's stock. His exploits with the ball in MLC, his superlative fitness and work ethics earned him the respect of MI bigwigs as they wasted no time to further sign him up for the ILT20 to give him his first taste of top level franchise cricket outside the US. The Mustangs were left without the services of their talisman Corey Anderson for the super 8s and the final, as a senior member of the side Kenjige led by example on and off the field not only to fill Anderson's void. While he played perfect cameos in MI New York's championship journey, at Dallas Mustangs he was bestowed with more responsibilities as a senior member and subsequently played a pivotal role throughout the season to script a fairytale end to what he describes a surreal summer, a summer that has given birth to a new American cricketing star.

## England eke out tricky win over Bangladesh in rain-hit game

**New Delhi:** England warmed up for the World Cup with a tricky win over Bangladesh in Guwahati. In what turned out to be a rain-curtailed encounter, England prevailed by four wickets. Tanzid Hasan gave Bangladesh a strong start even though Reece Topley sent back Litton Das and Najmul Shanto early. But once Mark Wood castled Tanzid for 44, Bangladesh were on the backfoot before rain arrived. At that point, Bangladesh were 153/5 after 30 overs. Once play resumed, the game was reduced to 37 overs per side. Bangladesh faltered from thereon with only Mehidy Hasan making an impact by scoring a crucial 74. With the Asian side finishing with 188/9, England were asked to chase down 197 as per the DLS rule. Even though Dawid Malan fell in the very first over, England made a blistering start in typical fashion. Jonny Bairstow took on Hasan Mahmud for a hat-trick of boundaries and then took on Mustafizur Rahman as well as he raced to 34 off just 20 balls. England had already knocked off 51 runs off just four overs but Bangladesh were not making it easy for their opponents. Mustafizur got his revenge against Bairstow and Hasan castled Harry Brook. Joe Root was watchful at one end as Jos Buttler now took charge to hammer 30 off just 15 but Bangladesh struck again with back-to-back wickets to reduce England to 114/5. With 83 still needed for victory, the onus was now on Moeen Ali and Root to get the job done. Battling poor form in the format, Root



was content on being subdued but Moeen took on Bangladesh after a watchful start. One six off Mahedi Hasan kickstarted his rampage as he cleared the ropes five more times to race to a quick half-century. Even though he fell for 56 towards the end, Root completed the formalities. Brief scores: Bangladesh 188/9 in 37 overs (Mehidy Hasan Miraz 74, Tanzid Hasan 45; Reece Topley 3-23) lost to England 197/6 in 24.1 overs (Moeen Ali 56, Jonny Bairstow 34; Mustafizur Rahman 2/23) by 4 wickets (DLS method) **New Zealand vs South Africa** Rain had the final say in what was turning out to be a potential thriller in Thiruvananthapuram between New Zealand and South Africa, giving the former a seven-run victory as per DLS method. New Zealand, who kickstarted their World Cup warm-up by smashing Pakistan in a high-scorer, opted to test themselves at setting a target by choosing to bat. Devon Conway led

the way with a 73-ball 78 while Tom Latham and Glenn Phillips made vital contributions in the middle. New Zealand were carried ahead by the middle and lower order as they posted 321/6 in 50 overs. Marco Jansen and Lungi Ngidi picked three wickets each for South Africa. In response, South Africa surged via Quinton de Kock who looked sharp in his unbeaten 84 off 89. Trent Boult dismissed Reeza Hendricks in the first over of the chase but Rassie van der Dussen walked in and forged a second-wicket alliance with the keeper-batter for 72 runs. Mitchell Santner and Ish Sodhi struck in the space of less than five overs to reduce the chasing side to 111 for 3, but out walked Heinrich Klaasen to wield his willow against the spinners yet again. Thanks to Klaasen's game against the spinners, New Zealand went from 111/3 in the 20th over to 166/3 in 28, prompting the return

of Boult. The left-arm pacer saw the back of Klaasen with his round the wicket angle as the South African nicked one to the keeper. Yet South Africa weren't out of the bounds in chase. David Miller walked in and began to stitch a meaningful partnership with de Kock when showers came down and refused to let the players back on the field. When the players went off, South Africa were on 211/4 in 37 overs, needing 111 runs to win in 13 overs with de Kock still going strong. However, they were found to be seven runs behind the par score and ended up on the wrong side of the result.
