


Semiliguda BJD Jan sampark Yatra held

Maintenance of Books of account for whom -Part 2

(Contd from 2nd Oct 2023)

13. For how many years the books of account are required to be preserved: As per Rule 6F(5), the books of account and other documents are to be kept for at least 6 years (w.e.f. 4.2.2002) from the end of the relevant assessment year after the amendment vide Notification No. 21/2002 - F. No. - 142/3/2002 - TPL. Prior to this the books of account and other documents were to be kept for at least 8 years from the end of the relevant asst. year. The cash book and ledger, however, were required to be preserved for 16 years. But w.e.f. 4.2.2002 these are also required to be kept only for 6 years from the end of the relevant asst. year. That means now, i.e. after 31st March, 2013, one needs to keep accounts for years ended 31.3.2007 and onwards and not for earlier years. However going by the time limit for reopening of assessments, i.e. within 6 years from the end of assessment year, the department may reopen the assessment for asst. year 2007-08 if we consider the reopening during FY 2013-14 and the income which has escaped

assessment amounts to Rs.1 Lakh or more for that year. However in case the income relates to any asset (including financial interest in any entity) located outside India, chargeable to tax has escaped assessment, then assessment can be re-opened within 16 years from the end of assessment year. Where the assessment in relation to any asst. year has been reopened u/s 147 within the time limit u/s 149, in such case all the books of account and other documents shall continue to be kept till the assessment so reopened has been completed. It is advisable to retain books of account and relevant documents for those years also, for which any appeal or other proceeding is pending.

14. Assessee maintains records of bank transactions, sundry debtors, creditors, investments and withdrawals and draws Balance Sheet. He declares income by comparing assets over those in the last year. In such circumstances whether such assessee can be penalised for non-maintenance of books of account: Similar facts came before the Delhi Bench of ITAT in the

case of Smt. Rajani v. ITO 91 TTJ (Del.) 23 wherein it has been held that when the assessee is maintaining record of bank transactions, sundry debtors and creditors, investments and withdrawals from which Balance Sheet is drawn and is declaring income by comparing increase of assets over those in last year and no form of keeping/ maintaining accounts having been prescribed for persons engaged in business, penalty u/s 271A could not be sustained.

15. Can bank statement or bank passbook be treated as books of account maintained by the assessee: Section 2(12A) defines books of account as under: "books or books of account" includes ledgers, day-books, cash books, account-books and other books, whether kept in the written form or as print-outs of data stored in a floppy, disc, tape or any other form of electro-magnetic data storage device. In view of the definition, it has been held that the pass book or the bank statement supplied by the bank to the assessee cannot be regarded as the books of account maintained by the

assessee or under his instructions. The relationship between the bank and account holder is that of debtor and creditor, the bank is not the trustee of the account holder, as such the accounts maintained by the bank cannot be said to be maintained by the account holder - CIT, Poona v. Bhaichand H. Gandhi 141 ITR 67 (Bom.), Mehl V. Vyas v. ITO [2017] 80 taxmann.com 311 (Mumbai - Trib.), Smt. Manasi Mahendra Pitkar v. ITO [2016] 73 taxmann.com 68 (Mumbai - Trib.)/ [2016] 160 ITD 605 (Mumbai - Trib.), Smt. Madhu Raitani v. Asstt. CIT [2011] 10 taxmann.com 206/45 SOT 231 (Gau.) (TM), ITO v. Kamal Kumar Mishra [2013] 33 taxmann.com 610/143 ITD 686 (Luck. - Trib.), Smt. Ramilaben B. Patel v. ITO [2018] 100 taxmann.com 325 (Ahmedabad - Trib.), Amitabh Bansal v. ITO [2019] 102 taxmann.com 229 (Delhi - Trib.). Similarly, the accounts maintained by a firm cannot be said to be the books of account of the partner - Smt. Shanta Devi v. CIT [1998] 171 ITR 532 (P&H).

16. Assessee, a medical professional carrying out

x-ray and pathology tests maintains books of account as required u/s 44AA read with rule 6F. Can A.O. reject the books on the ground that the assessee has not maintained any account to co-relate total number of films consumed with total receipts: On similar facts the Allahabad High Court in the case of CIT v. Rajni Kant Dave [2006] 281 ITR 6 (All.) held that once the Board in respect of a particular profession has prescribed maintenance of certain books of account vide rule 6F, it is not open to the A.O. to desire some other books to be maintained over and above the prescribed books. Therefore, provisions of section 145(1) are not to be invoked in the given case.

17. Consequence for failure to maintain books of account: Failure to maintain books of account and other documents or to retain them as required u/s 44AA attracts penalty of Rs. 25,000 (w.e.f. 1.6.2001) u/s 271A. The penalty can be imposed by the A.O. or CIT (Appeal). 18. In what circumstances penalty u/s 271A for non-maintenance of Books of Account can be waived on the basis of

reasonable cause: In the following circumstances, the penalty was waived on the basis of reasonable cause:

(a) Where the assessee is running poultry farm in a remote village, lack of knowledge and lack of manpower has been held to the reasonable cause - C.T. Chacko v. ITO 20 ITR (Trib) 125 (Coch).

(b) Where assessee is running a poultry farm and has maintained cash book, ledger and purchase vouchers but has not maintained stock register, penalty was deleted on the ground that stock register has not been specifically required to be maintained over and above the prescribed books.

Since my income has been very low and now I am unable to afford the cost of postage to foreign countries, presently I am writing to the professors, vice-chancellors and other high dignitaries of different universities", he replied very normally. I became more curious to know the contents of his writings. With every politeness, I just asked, "If you don't take it otherwise, may I know the theme of your writings to such high dignitaries?" He was worried, I marked and in a hurry to leave the post office. I told, "If you have any objection or if you don't want to share, then you may not discuss."

"That is not the issue, Sir", he replied. "I have come here finishing all the morning works in the hotel. My work will again start from 10AM. If I will be late, my owner may drive me away from the job". Immediately, I changed the topic and requested him to attend his job. "We may talk on some other day", I told. "No Sir", since you have

Some have even handed over me to police and ordered me not to enter their premises. Nobody has ever tried to understand me". I marked drops of tears in his eyes. I



also became sentimental. Tightly holding his palms, I requested him to continue. He started, "While I was a student in MPC College, Baripada in the district of Mayurbhanj during 1983, I became associated with the Hindu spiritual movement of Brahma Kumaries which teaches a form of meditation that focuses on identity as souls, as opposed to bodies. I was greatly inspired by their teachings to transcend labels associated with the body, such as race, nationality, religion and gender which aspire to establish a global culture based on what it calls Soul-consciousness. Sir, I had an ambition to be a teacher and to educate people of the world for bringing spiritual consciousness. But

unfortunately, I am now working in a roadside hotel from dawn to dusk to feed my belly." In a sensitive mood he continued, "Finding no other alternative to share my knowledge what I have gained from the Brahma Kumaries, I took the shelter of your post cards and inland letter cards, Sir."

Gladly he said, "The post card is my best friend now. It is the poor man's best medium of communication. I use the same for sharing the ethics of Brahma Kumaries to achieve the goal of establishing a new world full of peace through postcards. It compelled me to remind the statement of Lord Dalhousie, the father of India Post in his Minute dated 30th December, 1851. "It makes the Post Office what under any other system it never can be the unrestricted means of diffusing knowledge, extending commerce and promoting in every way the social and intellectual improvement of the people."

The entire world celebrates the World Post Day on 9th October every year to mark the anniversary of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) creation in 1874 (9th

October, 1874) with a purpose to bring awareness to the Post's role in the everyday lives of people and businesses as well as its contribution to global social and economic development. India Post, the largest postal network in the world having 159251 post offices is still providing cheap and efficient postal services to the poor nationals from Kashmir to

Kanyakumari despite all challenges through a postcard @ Re.0.50, an inland-letter-card @ Rs.2.50 and an envelope @ Rs.5/- only. Due to advancement of Information and Communication Technology and larger use of eMail and social media like facebook, twiter, instagram, WhatsApp etc., the quantum of handwritten ordinary letters through postcards, inland-letter-cards and envelopes which are the body and soul of the Posts has been reduced drastically. Illustratively, during last 30 years, the quantum of unregistered mails has been reduced from 3123 crores in 1991-92 to 388.29 crores (12.43%) in 2021-22 which is a serious concern for India Post. During celebration of National Postal Week, priority may be given to motivate the members public towards handwritten letters which carry the love, emotion, agony, ecstasy from person to person and help the Posts to stay relevant as a trustworthy and impactful organization. 18,000 Indians Stuck As Gun Battles Rage In Israeli Towns, On Highways

New Delhi: Israel is battling the worst escalation in its conflict with Palestinian group Hamas which has claimed nearly 1,000 lives and women thousands more on each side. Hamas launched its massive surprise attack on Israel with a barrage of rockets and a large-scale ground assault on Saturday. Thousands of Israeli forces were deployed to battle Hamas fighters in the south and the air force again pounded targets in the Gaza Strip. As gun battles are raging in towns and on highways, nearly 18,000 citizens are stuck in Israel. The majority of them are caregivers, IT professionals and

students. There are many agencies in Israel which hire caregivers from India for the elderly population there. There are about 85,000 Jews of Indian-origin in Israel. NDTV also spoke to two Indian students who are currently in the Israeli city of Bersheva. They said the situation currently is "very unpredictable". "We are one hour away from the Gaza Strip. Right now, there are no attacks here but we have been hearing about other students in the southern part of Israel which is under attack," Shweta, an Indian student in the city of Bersheva, told NDTV.

"The situation is very



unpredictable. But the city is safer than the other parts of Israel as of now," said another student. Immigration of Indians to Israel started between 1950s-60s. In recent years, Jews from Mizoram, Manipur have migrated to Israel. The Indian embassy at Jerusalem and the Representative Office of India in Palestine on

Saturday issued advisories asking Indian nationals in respective countries to "remain vigilant" and "directly contact the Office" in case of emergency as a full-fledged war broke out between the ruling Hamas group in the Gaza Strip and Israel. Gunmen from the Hamas rampaged through Israeli towns on Saturday,

killing and escaping with dozens of hostages in by far the deadliest day of violence in Israel since the Yom Kippur war 50 years ago. Listen to the latest songs, only on JioSaavn.com Bodies of Israeli civilians were strewn across the streets of Sderot in southern Israel, near Gaza, surrounded by broken glass, reported news agency Reuters.

The escalation comes against a backdrop of surging violence between Israel and Palestinian terrorists in the Israeli-occupied West Bank, where a Palestinian authority exercises limited self-rule, opposed by Hamas that wants Israel destroyed.

Defunct solar drinking water project irks residents

KENDRAPARA: A solar drinking water supply scheme, powered by a 10 horsepower (HP) pump at Chata gram panchayat in Derabishi block of Kendrapara district has been lying defunct for the last three years much to the disappointment of villagers.

The drinking water project was inaugurated by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on March 5, 2016. The Rural Water Supply and Sanitation (RWSS) department had

spent ₹1.20 crore to construct the project which is powered by solar energy. The 10 HP solar pump helped lift water up to a height of 29 metre. It took two-and-a-half hours to fill an overhead water tank with a capacity of one lakh litre.

The solar water pump project pumped water from the borewell to the overhead tank. The water was then supplied from the tank to houses. The solar pump works automatically and is

activated by a sensor whenever the water level in the overhead tank depletes. However it became defunct three years back due to some technical snag.

Owing to negligence of officials, it is yet to be repaired as a result of which large number of residents of Chatara, Chakoda, Chata and other villagers are facing problems, alleged sarpanch of Chata Mamata Rout. Assistant engineer of RWSS department Bibhudata Das said, "We have written to

Fearlessness stands out in South Africa's batting machinery

New Delhi: Bishan Singh Bedi has given cricket so much, and still his gifts keep coming. On Saturday the stand that bears his name and curves along the western boundary at the ground formerly known as the Kotla bequeathed a generous pool of shade that spread and deepened as the sun sank behind it. The spectators gathered there would have been relieved to escape the sharp end of the 38-degree heat. But they still had to breathe air rated, forebodingly, as "very unhealthy". It stained the sky the colour of a bedraggled dish towel, which had holes ripped into it by Delhi's famous swooping and swirling black kites. Not that Sri Lanka had time or opportunity for bird-watching, even though they spent much of the afternoon looking upward. They did so in search of the ball that South Africa's batters

had sent booming boundaryward. The Lankans couldn't hide from the heat, and their increasingly heaving gasps as they chased leather meant they took in more of the dirty air than anyone else.

Except, perhaps, for Quinton de Kock, Rassie van der Dussen and Aiden Markram, who spent an accumulated 405 minutes - verging on seven hours - batting in the soupy stickiness. They scored 100, 108 and 106 to propel South Africa to 428/5, the highest total in all 440 games played in men's World Cup history.

How long did Markram think that would be the benchmark? "The way batters are playing nowadays you wouldn't be surprised if that record is broken in this competition," he said, a startling admission for someone whose ton had come off 49 balls. That made it the fastest



of all the 201 centuries in the tournament's annals, while the 204 De Kock and Van der Dussen shared off 174 is South Africa's biggest stand for any wicket in their 81 ODIs against the Lankans.

How much of the way the South Africans batted was plotted and how much is what happens when a team's innings grows wings bigger and stronger than a black

kite's? "You do a lot of planning before the game," Markram said. "It's natural for teams to speculate about conditions, especially for South Africans coming over to India. You're not always 100% sure how it's going to play. "Then you get out there and the wicket starts playing really well. It's initially a big sigh of relief, and secondly your

instinct takes over and it becomes a see-ball, hit-ball mentality. Marrying the two of them is crucial."

Markram, one of the more demure players in the game, let loose a mighty yawn when he reached his century. De Kock and Van der Dussen, too, didn't try to stave off animated celebrations. They gave rise to images of three bottles of freshly

uncorked champagne. "It's quite strange; you almost get this thing that takes over your body at certain moments," Markram said. "There's a lot of passion in this team to give our absolute all at this World Cup and see how far it can get us. "We've been known to start slowly so we put a lot of emphasis on today's game, to start well and play the same cricket we've been playing to manage to sneak into this competition. All of those emotions mixed up and building up comes out." In fact South Africa have won six of their eight opening matches at a World Cup. But the two they lost became attached to memories they would prefer not to have: at home in 2003, when they crashed out of the tournament in the pool stage, and in England in 2019, when they slumped to their worst performance in the

deliveries skidded on, which was how Temba Bavuma was trapped in front by Dilshan Madushanka in the third. But the effects of the sun, the air, the flattening pitch and the small, fast outfield mounted, and the South Africans escaped the leash in the 23rd. With De Kock hitting Dhananjay de Silva for four through the covers and six over long-on, the over went for a dozen runs and took South Africa's runrate for the innings into double figures. They never looked back. Even Bedi might have struggled to reel them in. That Sri Lanka fielded judiciously told its own story. How many more runs would they have haemorrhaged had they been sloppy? The crowd of 15,496 would have swelled the stands and grass banks in most of South Africa's major grounds, but in Delhi they amounted to little more than a third of capacity.

Mehidy wants to replicate U19 success on biggest stage

New Delhi: Bangladesh's Mehidy Hasan said on Saturday that he dreams of replicating his 2016 Under-19 World Cup performance on the big stage.

Mehidy came into the spotlight by grabbing the Player-of-the-Tournament award in the biggest age-level global event, making 242 runs and picking 12 wickets. However, with time, he became the leading off-spinner of his country. His potential with the bat took a back seat, but lately he has developed his batting to such an extent that he can surely be considered a full-fledged all-rounder. He looks set to make a mark, leading both with bat and ball with an all-round performance against the Afghans in their tournament opener in Dharamsala.

"If I can perform all-round in a big tournament, it will be a huge achievement for me



and for the team as well. I certainly have that dream of translating the performance of the 2016 Under-19 World Cup," Mehidy told reporters at the post-match. Mehidy, who was recently promoted to number three after making two fifties in the warm-ups against Sri Lanka and England, added that he has been preparing mentally since the India series to score runs regularly. "I am scoring runs from

always score runs because you have fewer balls to face. But I prepared mentally in such a way that if I get an opportunity, I could give my hundred percent and am always thinking about what to do," he said.

"In different positions, the situation is different, and what I feel is that because I have been given an opportunity, I should seize it. It is better to bat anywhere up in the order than to come down and bat at eight because I believe that I can bat. Certainly, there are problems, but I don't take that to my head. I have to perform for the team at any position because at the end of the day, we play for our team, and today everyone in Bangladesh is happy because we won the game. Mehidy revealed that skipper Shakib al Hasan's advice during the drinks break helped him get his bowling back on track.

"I didn't bowl well in the

first over and gave away nine runs, and at that point, I was a bit nervous. Shakib bhai told me not to bowl with a negative mindset; that I have to have a positive mind. In this kind of big tournament, you have to have a positive mindset, and there is no problem if I leak runs, but the batters need to charge me and try to score runs. These little things help a lot," he said.

Shoriful Islam echoed Mehidy's sentiment on replicating U19 success on the biggest stage but reminded of what's different in senior men's cricket. "That was U-19s... now it is the ODI World Cup, the main World Cup. The difference is that there are world-class batsmen here. The U-19s also has good batsmen, but not like this. Every batsman here is very good; they charge at the ball when the bowler doesn't bowl the correct length here."

New Delhi: The condition of the outfield at the HPCA stadium in Dharamsala was once again called into question in what was its first game of the 2023 World Cup. The outfield had looked patchy and devoid of enough grass cover even on the eve of the game, and nearly led to an injury in Saturday's fixture. Afghanistan's Mujeeb Ur-Rahman attempted a dive at deep backward square leg but ended up jamming his knee into the hard ground and fell awkwardly as some of the mud kicked up on impact.

A member of the Afghanistan team management told Cricbuzz that in the current condition, the venue isn't ready for international cricket. "Yeah, it is sad to see. It is a beautiful place to play cricket... it [outfield] is not ready for international cricket. Not okay. Right now it is not

good for international cricket. Maybe it is because of rain... but yeah it is not ready now," he said. "The curator says lots of rain happened but if it continues like this, someone will get injured on the ground. No one wants to dive or slide and in cricket you should be able to do that," he added.

This isn't the first time the outfield has been under the scanner. Earlier this year, the third Test between India and Australia was shifted out owing to the 'lack of grass density' in the outfield.

In mid-September, there was reported to have been a fungus infestation on the outfield that had to be sorted out quickly. Afghanistan head coach Jonathan Trott revealed that the conditions were such that players were unsure of whether they could dive, and that Mujeeb was lucky to get away without a serious injury. "If you've got players unsure of whether they can dive..." Trott said in the post-match press conference. "We see the product of cricket all around the world where players are taught and encouraged to improve their fielding. Then when you've got players worried about getting injured... we're lucky Mujeeb hasn't got a serious knee injury towards the end."

"Yes he probably shouldn't have dived with his knee but I think it was Devon Conway earlier from New Zealand... It's something for them [organisers] to look at. I'm definitely not putting any blame on that, but that's something to keep an eye on for the future," he said.

In just two more days' time, the next game at this venue - between Bangladesh and England - will take place while India will play New Zealand here on October 22.

Shakeel finds opportunity amidst adversity

New Delhi: There'll probably be better days in Saud Shakeel's career when he doesn't have to find ways to 'fit in'. He would hope his knock in Pakistan's World Cup opener against Netherlands - a 52-ball 68 - would be the start of that. Despite an 81-run win to kickstart their World Cup campaign on Friday, it was a far-from-perfect show for Pakistan, especially with the bat. They were restricted to 286, which Mohammad Rizwan claims the team was confident was going to be a winning total. However, given the scores around the range of 350 being

notched up at the same venue over the two warm-up matches in the last week, it was well below par and one that made their opponents feel quite happy with their bowling performance. Shakeel walked out to bat when Pakistan were in dire straits. Fakhar Zaman had yet again fallen to the full, swinging delivery - this time chipping the ball back to the bowler. I am a m-u-l-Haq registered another low score, while Babar Azam pulled Colin Ackerman's innocuous delivery straight to the mid-wicket fielder, reducing the side to 38 for 3 in the 10th over.

For Shakeel, batting at No.5, the opportunity presented itself - to make an impression when the team was in trouble, with ample overs to play. Despite a nervy start, he led Pakistan's revival with a counter-attacking half-century and a 120-run stand for the fourth wicket with Mohammad Rizwan which set the base for Pakistan's total of 287. "There were nerves. But I was lucky that I found a few odd boundaries, it makes it easier for you. I was clear in my mind that I wanted to attack and play positive cricket.

Rizwan bhai's role was to go long but my plan was simple. I had focused on a few bowlers of the Netherlands. If I had to hit from above, I would take a chance. I did that. I took a chance. I was trying to stay positive and kept attacking the bowlers I had targeted," Shakeel said about his knock. In the recently concluded Asia Cup, he was used primarily as a back-up for Agha Salman, who offered additional bowling skills. However, he made a strong impression with a classy 53-ball 75 in Pakistan's first World Cup warm-up clash against New Zealand.

With Pakistan fielding five frontline bowlers already in the XI and the additional part-time option of Iftikhar Ahmed to use, they opted to go for Shakeel ahead of Salman even though the former didn't get a chance to play the second warm-up. However, he admits, "I knew sometime back

that I would play this match. I played a warm-up match and I had good batting there."

A free-flowing left-hander, the 28-year-old southpaw's limited overs career has not really taken off. Having made his debut more than two years ago, he had managed to feature in only six ODIs before the World Cup. His selection in the 50-over side itself had come at the back of his impressive form in Test cricket, as a means to fix the middle order woes. But a switch in format necessitated a bit of batting evolution.

"I think it [Test cricket] is the most difficult format, you know that. So, when you perform well there, you gain a lot of confidence," Shakeel said after his match-winning performance on Friday. "I think I performed very well in the Test matches, so my confidence level was very high. "But at the same time, I was focusing a lot on my white-ball cricket. I was focusing a lot on my game. I could see that my numbers for playing for Pakistan were 5-6 (batting order). Babar Azam plays at 3 and Rizwan plays at 4. I tried to develop my game and worked hard for it.
